### CAS issues official statement on Vinesh Phogat's appeal, confirms decision will be issued 'before end of Olympic Games'

New Delhi, Aug 09: The CAS has issued a statement on Vinesh Phogat's appeal, confirming that a decision will be issued before the end of Paris Olympics. Indian wrestler Vinesh Phogat's hopes for an Olympic silver medal remains alive after the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) accepted her appeal following a disqualification that occurred just before the gold medal bout in the women's 50kg category at the Paris Olympics. Vinesh was ruled out of the final after being found overweight by a mere 100 grams during the weigh-in, a technicality that not only cost her a shot at gold but also meant she would return home without a medal, as disqualified ath-



letes are typically ineligible for a medal. Following her disqualification, Vinesh swiftly filed an appeal with CAS, seeking to overturn the decision. On Friday, CAS issued an official statement acknowledging the appeal and outlining the next steps. While CAS clarified that it could not accommodate Vinesh's request for a second weigh-in or reinstate her in the gold medal match, the organization did agree to hear her case regarding the possibility of awarding her a joint silver medal. This move keeps Vinesh's hopes of an Olympic podium finish alive as the legal process unfolds. "An application was filed at the CAS Ad hoc Division at 16:45 CEST on 7 August 2024 by Indian wrestler Vinesh Phogat (the Applicant) in relation to the decision taken by United World Wrestling (UWW) to replace her, because of her failed second weigh-in, before the gold medal match of the Women's Freestyle 50kg competition at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 that was due to commence at 18:15 CEST the same day (the Challenged Decision)," the statement from the CAS, issued on Friday, read.

### Modi govt formed committee to monitor current situation along Indo-Bangla border: Amit Shah

New Delhi, Aug. 9: The Narendra Modi government on Friday constituted a high-level committee, headed by a top Border Security Force



(BSF) official, to monitor the situation along the Indo-Bangladesh border in wake of the ongoing state of affairs in the neighbouring country, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said. Shah said the committee would be in touch with counterpart authorities in Bangladesh to ensure the safety and security of Indian nationals, Hindus and other minority communities living there. "In the wake of the ongoing situation in

Bangladesh, the Modi government has constituted a committee to monitor the current situation on the Indo-Bangladesh Border (IBB). The committee will maintain communication channels with their counterpart authorities in Bangladesh to ensure the safety and security of Indian nationals, Hindus, and other minority communities living there. The committee will be headed by the ADG (Additional Director General), Border Security Force, Eastern Command." Shah said in a post on X. Apart from the BSF ADG, the four other members of the committee are the BSF's Inspector General of Police (IGP) for the South Bengal frontier, the IGP for the Tripura frontier, member (planning and development) of the Land Ports Authority of India (LPAI), and secretary of the LPAI.

## Manish Sisodia walks out of Tihar jail

New Delhi, August 9: Noting that right to speedy trial is a fundamental right of an accused, the Supreme Court on Friday granted bail to senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia in corruption and money laundering cases linked to the Delhi excise policy 'scam' even as it wondered how long it will take to complete the trial in the case. "We find that on account of long incarceration running around 17 months and trial having not been commenced, the appellant has been deprived of the right to speedy trial...A citizen cannot be made to run from pillar to post for personal liberty," said a Bench of Justice BR Gavai and Justice KV Viswanathan - which had reserved its verdict on Sisodia's bail pleas on August 6. Ordering his release on a personal bail bond of Rs 10 lakh and two sureties in the like amount, the Bench asked him not to influence witnesses and tamper with evidence and report to the police every week. The top court rejected the preliminary objection raised by the CBI and the ED which contended that the accused should approach the trial court. Sending the former Delhi deputy chief minister again to the trial

court and then to the high court and then only allowing him to approach the top court will amount to playing "snake and ladder game" with him, Justice Gavai said, pronounc-



ing the verdict. The liberty granted by its June 4 order to Sisodia to revive his bail pleas should be construed as a liberty to file a petition in the Supreme Court itself, the Bench said, rejecting the preliminary objections of the probe agencies. Pointing out that he has been in jail for 17 months and the trial hasn't commenced, the Bench said it amounted to

violation of his fundamental right to speedy trial guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution which applied to all cases, irrespective of the nature of allegations. The court said there was "not even remotest possibility of concluding the trial" in near future in view of the fact that around 500 witnesses and thousands of pages of documents were to be examined. The CBI and the ED had opposed senior AAP leader Manish Sisodia's bail pleas before the Supreme Court in corruption and money laundering cases linked to the excise policy scam, saying documents showed his neck-deep involvement in the scam. "Sisodia is not an innocent person picked up for political reasons... He is neck deep in the scam," the ASG had said on behalf of the probe agencies. Sisodia's petition for revival of his bail pleas was "not maintainable" and that he should go to the trial court for bail, he had said. On behalf of the former Delhi deputy chief minister, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi had contended

that Sisodia has already undergone half of the minimum sentence and there was no evidence against him. The matter relates to alleged corruption and money laundering in the formulation and execution of the Delhi government's excise policy for 2021-22 which now stands scrapped. Sisodia was arrested by the CBI on February 26, 2023 for his alleged role in the 'scam' and he resigned from the Delhi cabinet two days later. The ED arrested him in a money-laundering case related to the scam on March 9, 2023 after questioning him in Tihar Jail. The former Delhi Deputy CM - who has been denied bail by the top court in the past - has sought to revive his petitions in the excise policy scam-related corruption and money laundering cases. He has sought bail contending that he has been in custody for 16 months and the trial against him has not made any progress since October 2023. Holding that the possibility of evidence-tampering by him can't be ruled out, the Delhi High Court had on May 21 dismissed Sisodia's bail pleas. Sisodia challenged the high court's order but the Supreme Court on June 4 refused to entertain his bail pleas in corruption and money laundering cases lodged by the CBI and the ED in connection with the excise policy scam.

### Face-off between Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar and Jaya Bachchan in Rajya Sabha

New Delhi, August 9: Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar and actor-politician Jaya Bachchan were involved in a face-off on Friday after Bachchan raised objection to his "tone" while giving her floor to speak and the former asserting that even a celebrity like her needs to follow decorum. Opposition parties also staged a walkout following the exchanges between Dhankhar and Bachchan, a Samajwadi Party MP. Later, while talking to reporters in the Parliament complex, Bachchan said she was upset with the tone of the Chairman, and also the way the mic of Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge was switched off when he stood up to speak in the House. The trouble started when the SP member wanted to make a point on an ongoing heated discussion between Opposition parties and the Chairman in the Rajya Sabha over certain remarks made by BJP MP Ghanshyam Tiwari on Kharge a few days ago. Dhankhar allowed her saying, "Jaya Amitabh Bachchan, make your point." Bachchan rose to say: "I, Jaya Amitabh Bachchan, want to say I am an artist. I understand body language and expressions. Forgive me but your tone is not acceptable. We are colleagues, sir.

## Was just pushing myself due to Olympics, have to take decision on surgery now: Neeraj Chopra

Paris, August 9: India javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra opened up about his injury woes after clinching a silver medal in the Olympics, revealing that he might have to undergo a surgery soon after having pushed himself extremely hard to compete here while battling a constant fear of breaking down. Chopra was dealing with a nagging adductor niggle (a problem related to muscles in the thigh) in the run up to the Paris Games. But he managed a season's best effort of 89.45m to secure a silver medal, making him the first track-and-field athlete from India to have two Olympic medals, the first being an unprecedented gold in Tokyo. Chopra finished behind Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem, who stole the show with an Olympic record-shattering throw of 92.97m to become the first individual Olympic gold-medallist from his country. "I have a lot on my

mind. When I am throwing, my 60-70 per cent focus is on the injury. I don't want to get injured. Whenever I go for a throw, you will see that my speed is low. I am pushing myself," he said. "The doctor told me to go for surgery but I didn't



have that much time to take a decision before the world championship or after the world championship because it takes a lot of time to prepare for the Olympics," he added, referring to the

2023 world championship. The 26-year-old, despite not being at his best here, became only the third Indian to win back-to-back Olympic medals after PV Sindhu and Sushil Kumar. "I am still pushing myself," he said with a hint of frustration. "It's not good in sport, to push and continue. If you want to run a long career, then you have to be fit and healthy but there are competitions where you can't make a decision. Now we will work on this and the technique," he added. Chopra said he will talk to his team and then "take a decision". He also detailed how the last seven years have been tough for him as far as fitness is concerned. "I felt this in 2017. After that, I got a lot of treatments. But I will have to take a big decision for this," he said. Won't find peace till I get a big throw He didn't mention the 90m mark but Chopra said he has potential to achieve bigger throws. Chopra's career-best remains 89.94m which was achieved back in 2022.

## SC refuses to postpone NEET-PG exam, emphasises certainty in medical education

New Delhi, Aug 09: The petitioners, represented by senior advocate Sanjay Hegde, argued that they were not seeking a blanket postponement but were instead raising concerns about the allocation of test centres and the normalisation process for the exam New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Friday refused to postpone or reschedule the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Postgraduate) or NEET-PG 2024 exam, scheduled for August 11, asserting the importance of maintaining certainty in

the medical education system in the country. Rejecting the plea brought forward by a small group of candidates, a bench, led by Chief Justice of India Dhananjaya Y Chandrachud, underscored the potential adverse impact on the careers of nearly two lakh students if the exam were to be rescheduled. During the proceedings, the bench, also comprising justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, made it clear that the interests of a few petitioners could not outweigh the broader concerns of the vast majority of students and their fami-

lies. "Let there be some lighted the significant dis-



ruption that would result from a last-minute postponement, emphasising that such a decision would affect not just students but also their families. The petitioners, represented by

senior advocate Sanjay Hegde, argued that they were not seeking a blanket postponement but were instead raising concerns about the allocation of test centres and the normalisation process for the exam, which is to be held in two batches. However, the bench remained unmoved. "For five petitioners, you stay the exam for two lakh students? We aren't going to reschedule this exam. There are two lakh students and close to four lakh parents who will weep over the weekend. At

the behest of five students, we can't put the career of two lakh students in jeopardy," it stated. The court also acknowledged the complexities involved in organising such a large-scale examination and deferred to the expertise of the authorities responsible for its conduct. "It's not a perfect world. We aren't experts. These are decisions taken by experts," the bench noted, underscoring the limitations of judicial intervention in technical matters of educational administration.

### Yasin Malik to Delhi High Court on NIA plea seeking death penalty for him

New Delhi, August 9: Turning down the court's suggestion to appoint a lawyer on his behalf, separatist leader Yasin Malik on Friday told the Delhi High Court he wished to argue in-person against a National Investigation Agency (NIA) plea seeking death penalty for him in a terror funding case. The Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front chief was virtually present for the court proceedings from Tihar jail where he is serving a life term in the case. A bench headed by Justice Suresh Kumar Kait listed the matter for hearing on September 19 and said Malik "may think again" about having legal representation in the case. The court also gave him time to think about either filing a reply or written submission. "He has the right to contest in individual capacity but any litigant must be equipped with legal assistance," the bench, also comprising Justice Girish Kathpalia, said while asserting that there should be fairness in the proceedings. "We would prefer appointing an amicus so that he can keep a watch on his interest also... You may argue in-person. Simultaneously, a good advocate from criminal side can be appointed as amicus to argue from your side," it told Malik. Malik also objected to being produced through virtual mode, saying he was physically produced in the trial court and there was never any law and order problem. "I was produced physically in trial court until conviction. They don't want to give me a fair trial.

## Owner Of Dog, That Fell On Girl From 5th Floor And Killed Her, Arrested



**Thane.** Police have arrested the owner of the pet dog that fell on a four-year-old girl from the fifth floor of a building in Maharashtra's Thane, which resulted in her death, officials have said.

The police arrested the accused on Thursday night and also registered an offence against him and three other persons in connection with the incident that occurred around 4.30 pm on Tuesday in Mumbai area of Thane city. "The police have arrested the owner of the pet dog that fell from the fifth floor on the girl, who was walking on the road below with a woman on August 6. The child suffered grievous injuries and was rushed to a hospital where doctors declared her dead on the same day," an official of the Mumbai police station said.

A case was registered against the owner of the dog and three others under sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) for culpable homicide not amounting to murder, death by negligence, negligent conduct with respect to animals and acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention, he said. The police had initially registered a case of accidental death, the official said.

## Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee's Body To Be Donated To Hospital For Research

**Kolkata.** The mortal remains of former West Bengal chief minister Buddhadeb Bhattacharjee will be handed over to state government-run NRS Medical College and Hospital for research work, a CPI(M) official.

The body of Bhattacharjee, wrapped with the CPI(M)'s red flag, was taken out of his frugal two-room residence at Palm Avenue in south Kolkata on way to mortuary Peace World on Thursday. Earlier, Governor CV Ananda Bose, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, Left Front chairman Biman Bose, CPI(M) state secretary Md Salim visited the Bhattacharjee residence.

Bhattacharjee's wife Mira, in tears, walked along with the hearse carrying the mortal remains along with party leaders and hundreds of admirers cutting across political lines and members of the general public, before boarding a car.

The mortal remains of Bhattacharjee will be taken to the West Bengal Assembly today, from where it will be taken to CPI(M) state headquarters Muzaffar Ahmed Bhavan, where leaders and the public will be able to pay their last respects to the departed leader, the party official said on Thursday.

The body will be thereafter taken to the state headquarters of DYFI, the CPI(M)'s youth wing, following which the last journey of the mortal remains will be undertaken. The body will then be handed over to NRS Medical College and Hospital here for research, he said.

## Man Pushes Girl To Death In Front Of Train For Rejecting Proposal, Arrested

**Udaipur.** The Rajasthan Police have arrested a man for killing a 15-year-old girl by pushing her in front of a train after she rejected his friendship proposal on Friendship Day in Udaipur, officials have said. The accused has been identified as Shourveer Singh, son of Ram Singh.

Udaipur's Superintendent of Police (SP) Yogesh Goyal said that the father of the 15-year-old minor girl lodged a missing report at Pratap Nagar Police Station in Udaipur on the night of August 2. The girl's father claimed that his daughter, who left for computer class, had not yet returned home. Subsequently, an investigation and search were launched.

A police team received information that the body of a girl was lying on a railway track. On receiving the information, the team reached the spot. The girl's family members, who were also called for the identification of the girl, confirmed that she was their daughter. The team started an investigation into the incident with the help of intelligence and technical support. The suspect, Shourveer Singh, was detained and during interrogation, the accused confessed the crime. After which the accused was arrested, police said.

According to police, the accused during interrogation said that "since the girl did not befriend him, he lured the girl and called her to the railway track, Debari, on the pretext of a meeting. When the girl refused to befriend the accused, he killed her by pushing her in front of a train coming on the track".

## Cabinet gives nod to lease out prime South Mumbai plot to NGO despite Finance department objection

**The plot has been leased to the Jain International Organisation (JIO) for school purposes. According to the cabinet note, the finance department raised its objection and highlighted that a number of government offices are being shifted to suburban areas and other places and are being taken on rent.**

**Mumbai.** The Maharashtra Cabinet on Wednesday approved a proposal to lease a prime land in South Mumbai near Mantralaya that measures 2,995.75 square metres to a non-profit organisation for a period of 30 years to build a primary and secondary school. The approval was given despite the finance department raising strong objections to the decision and had instead recommended using it to construct government offices.

The plot has been leased to the Jain International Organisation (JIO) for school purposes. According to the cabinet note, the finance department raised its objection and highlighted that a number of government offices are being shifted to suburban areas and other places and are being taken on rent.

"It will not be appropriate to give the land to a private organisation at a time when the government itself needs land to build its offices. Hence, the proposal should not be given nod. A number of important government offices from Mantralaya have been transferred to nearby places due to lack of space and the government is spending crores of rupees on rent. In such a scenario, the prime plot cannot be given for any reason," the finance department said and added, "The land should be acquired for government offices at the earliest."

The revenue department accepted the remarks made by finance and stated, "While the circumstances are as mentioned by the finance department, the state has a policy to give land at concessional / lease rates to non-

profit organisations to build education, health and social service related facilities."

The JIO will have to pay a lease amount of 25 per cent of the market rate of the plot as per the MCLR rate and it will be updated every five years.

The plot in Colaba in South Mumbai was with the Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation Limited for a temporary construction yard for Mumbai Metro - 3. In 2013, the Mumbai city district collector handed over the plot to Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) in a bid to protect it from encroachment.

In 2015, the collector asked the MMRDA to temporarily hand over the plot to MMRCL for constructing yard of the Mumbai Metro -

3. In July 2023, the MMRCL informed the city collector that the work on the plot was over. However, it was kept with the MMRCL to avoid further encroachment by appointing a security guard. At present, the land was being used as a parking lot. The document presented in front of the state cabinet said that in 2019, the "parking" reservation on the same was changed to "school".

In March 2024, the state cabinet had approved to give 1.02 lakh square feet plot for running Jain Gymkhana on a 30-year lease. It was earlier occupied by Wilson College Gymkhana and the decision was opposed by the student and alumni association. The case is in the Bombay High Court.

## Accused received at least Rs 85 L to increase hoarding size: Police on Ghatkopar Hoarding collapse

**MUMBAI.** Police has said that at least Rs 85 lakhs was received by accused Arshad Khan from directors of Ego Media Pvt Ltd for permission to increase the size of the hoarding, which collapsed on May 13, killing 17 people and injuring 80 others. The Special Investigation Team (SIT) has made the submission before the sessions court, while opposing the anticipatory bail application of Khan, a partner in Mahpara Garments Pvt Ltd. The court has reserved the plea for orders, which is likely to be pronounced next week on August 12.

The reply states that while the directors of Ego Media were aware that the hoarding required permission of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), Khan told them that since the hoarding stood on land belonging to Indian Railways, only the permission of GRP would be required. The reply claims that Khan then helped obtain the permission from the GRP. The police have claimed that their probe had revealed that over Rs 1 crore was received by Khan and hence looked into the bank transactions of the companies. It claimed that between July 2021 to December 2023, Rs 85 lakh from the accounts of Ego Media and Guju Ads Pvt Ltd were transferred to 18 bank accounts. The police said the transactions were on behalf of the then directors of the company and accused Bhavesh Bhide and Janhavi Marathe.

"When inquired with the account holders in which these transactions were made, they said that they were given cheques by Khan



and they were instructed by him to withdraw and hand it over to him. The account holders had no connection with Ego Media or Guju Ads. These account holders were either acquainted with Khan or were living in the same vicinity as him," the Mumbai police reply said. The police have also claimed that Khan in his statement recorded on June 14 did not give a satisfactory response to these. It was also alleged that money was sent into accounts of Khan's relatives, including his wife, brother and brother-in-law. One of the transactions showed Rs 7 lakh sent to the account of Khan's wife from among the 18 bank accounts.

The police, meanwhile, have said that Khan

had given designer shoes and sunglasses to Bhide. The reply also states that a probe is on into Khan's partnership with the firm, Mahpara Garments, along with Sumanna Quaiser Khalid, the wife of IPS officer Quaiser Khalid, the then Government Railway Police (GRP) commissioner. The police reply said that a probe about his partnership in the firm is ongoing.

Khan has said in his anticipatory bail that he has not been named in the chargesheet nor has the police shown any links of him with the permissions for the hoarding. Khan has also denied the allegations of any transactions linked to getting permission for the hoarding.

## Chennai motorists face bumpy ride as speed breaker panel on snooze mode

**CHENNAI.** The committee to standardise speed breakers in Chennai, headed by the city traffic police and comprising various departments, has only met once since its inception in March and is now inactive. Speed breakers, on the other hand, continue to pop up by the day across the city, posing risk to motorists.

The committee, formed by the traffic police in coordination with the corporation, MTC, highways department, and CMDA, aims to standardise speed breakers as per Indian Road Congress specifications. It was established after the death of a 34-year-old man near Chitlapakkam owing to an illegal speed breaker in February. It held its first review meeting on March 20.

Even officials within the traffic department are unaware of such a committee. "We are not aware of any such committee. Until now, we have been sending requests to the respective departments based on the road location for issues regarding speed breakers. We sometimes paint the speed breakers ourselves, but it often fades within a few

days," said a traffic police officer, speaking on condition of anonymity.

During a visit to various locations across the city, observed numerous speed breakers that violate IRC guidelines. The IRC recommends a rounded 11m radius hump of 3m width and 10cm height to achieve the desired speed of 20 km/h. However, many speed breakers, especially arterial roads, do not comply with these specifications.

For instance, the speed breaker on TH Road near Ellaiaimman Kovil is in poor shape and lacks any marking. also visited locations including KK Nagar, Ashok Nagar, T Nagar, Koyembedu, Thiruvottiyur, Royapuram, and Saligramam. The speed breakers in these areas vary significantly in their specifications.

On Mannar Mudali Street in Vadapalani, the road is only 20ft wide but has six-speed breakers. "As a long-time resident, I know



where they are and slow down, but others face sudden jumps due to poor visibility and may lose control," said D Murali, a 44-year-old auto driver from Vadapalani.

The speed humps on the roads near KK Nagar roundana are broken, while on Anna Main Road they are uneven. On interior roads, there are even speed breakers with manholes in the middle of it.

When the committee was formed, it was announced that speed breakers could only be installed after obtaining clearance from the

committee and that any speed breaker deviating from norms would be removed.

However, activists claim it is difficult to identify illegal speed breakers due to the absence of a list of authorised speed breakers in the city. "When I approached the respective official to get the list of sanctioned speed breakers in the city, I was informed that no such list exists. 'Only the non-standardised speed breakers

were noted, and action will be taken' was the reply, which does not seem to be happening anyway," an activist told.

"The committee became inactive due to the parliamentary elections. However, we will ensure that the committee is revitalised. In the meantime, the corporation will conduct an internal audit to address non-standard speed breakers across the city," said Corporation commissioner J Kumaragurubaran.

**CHENNAI.** Food Safety Department officials seized a whopping 800 kg of decomposed meat from a beef shop in Shenoy Nagar on Thursday. The shop was sealed citing unhygienic maintenance and suspected unauthorised beef slaughter. Designated Food Safety Officer for Chennai Dr P Satheshkumar said they suspected that the shop staff had been dumping meat waste in the Cooum river that was flowing alongside the shop. Samples of the meat were sent to the veterinary

college for tests, and the rest of it was handed over to the city corporation for destroying. Food safety officials conducted the raid along with corporation officials. The vendor allegedly evaded questions regarding where he received the meat from and who were his frequent customers. He said slaughtered animals was not carried out at the shop. Officials suspect that the shop catered to roadside eateries. They sealed the shop and seized the owner's mobile phone.

## 4 firms to be hired for maintenance, operations of streetlights in Gurgaon

GURGAON: MCG will hire four private agencies for operations and maintenance of streetlights as the current contract with existing agencies is set to expire on Oct 31. The project, which is estimated to cost Rs 13.7 crore, will cover the entire city for a period of two years. MCG has issued tenders to engage one agency for each of the four zones to undertake maintenance work for next two years. According to officials, any complaints on streetlights will be sent to the respective firms, which will be required to tackle the issues. "After termination of the contract with the previous firm, we had hired two companies, one each for two zones. However, their contract will expire on Oct 31. We won't be able to initiate the tender process as the model code of conduct is implemented ahead of assembly elections. We have initiated the process and floated the tender to hire firms so that the residents won't have to suffer any inconvenience. The firms, however, will start working from Nov 1," said Parveen Dalal, MCG executive engineer (electrical).

For zone 1, the project cost is Rs 3.91 crore, Rs 4.23 crore for zone 2, Rs 2.55 crore for zone 3 and Rs 3.01 crore for zone 4. The concessionaire ended its agreement with MCG for streetlights and their upkeep in the city in Sept 2023, citing alleged non-payment of Rs 30 crore dues. In July 2023, MCG had also imposed a penalty of Rs 45 lakh on its concessionaire for failing to repair streetlights despite being instructed to do so.

However, residents said the tender documents for operation and maintenance should be well-prepared with detailed specifications. "The previous agencies were substituting non-functional lights with household tubelights of 20 watts, which is ineffective. Therefore, when issuing tenders for new agencies, it is crucial to clearly define specifications of lights and their wattage for operation and maintenance purposes. Furthermore, agencies often decline to perform cable work, claiming it falls outside their scope of work. MCG should carefully prepare the tender proposal, explicitly stating that the agencies will be responsible for executing the cable work as well," said Chaitali Mandhotra, a resident of Ardee city and co-convenor of United Gurugram RWA.

## GMDA conducts demolition drive to remove illegal structures in Gurgaon

GURGAON: The enforcement wing of GMDA on Thursday carried out a two-day demolition drive to clear illegal structures and encroachments along green belts and master roads of sectors off Southern Peripheral Road (SPR). During the drive, encroachments, including illegal shops and shanties, were cleared from the 3.7-km stretch. Action was taken against unlicensed street vendors operating along the road and green belts without proper permission from MCG. The demolition drive, which spanned two days, resulted in removal of 48 shanties, 14 vendors, 25 plant nurseries, 3 shops, 42 temporary shops, 7 building material shops, and 5 car workshops. Additionally, 8 illegal accesses made by car showrooms and repair shops on the main road were blocked by the enforcement wing.

## Haryana: Man handed 20 year rigorous imprisonment for abducting & raping minor

GURGAON: A youth was awarded 20 years of rigorous imprisonment (RI) by a Panipat court on Tuesday for kidnapping and raping a minor girl two years ago. The court also imposed a fine of Rs 75,000 on the convict.

The accused abducted the girl, who was then 17 years old, from her house in Jan 2022 and kept her in captivity for months at different places in Punjab and Haryana. She managed to escape and reach home after three months. The minor was found to be pregnant as a result of the sexual assault. On the recommendation of doctors, the pregnancy was terminated. During the trial, the court considered the statement given by the survivor and the medical report as key evidence and found the accused guilty. On Jan 8, 2022, the girl's mother filed a missing person's complaint. She said she had left home for some work and when she returned, her daughter was missing. A case was filed. Public prose-ctor Kuldeep Dhull said the mother reached the police station along with her daughter on March 12 and recorded their statement. The minor told cops she was kidnapped, kept in captivity, and raped multiple times.

Police arrested Praveen Sharma on May 30 and his brother Anil alias Ajay - the main accused - on April 1. The minor, in her statement before the court, said Anil coaxed her to leave home with him on Jan 7 by promising to marry her. He took her to Praveen's accommodation in Panipat, where she was sexually assaulted for the first time. Later, she was taken to Ludhiana in Punjab and the accused confined her at different rented accommodations.

# Gurgaon cops turn heat on underage drivers; most fined in July

GURGAON: At a time when underage driving has become a growing concern, traffic cops began an enforcement drive and issued challans to 234 minors found at the wheel on city roads over July.

Police said they impounded 18 vehicles, among them two-wheelers as well.

"Underage driving is a serious issue," DCP (traffic) Virender Vij said, adding: "Our campaign in July targeted young drivers who were flouting traffic rules, resulting in a significant number of challans and vehicle impoundments." With a penalty of Rs 5,000 under the Motor Vehicles Act, at least Rs 11 lakh of the total challans worth Rs 20 lakh issued in July stemmed from underage driving, the DCP said. "Most of the minors found at the wheel were students who were using two-wheelers to get to school," Vij said. Other common violations were wrong-side driving, wrong-side parking, driving without helmets and seat belts. Underage driving became a talking point after a 17-year-old boy driving a Porsche ran his father's car over two bike riders in Pune. He was



suspected to be inebriated at the time. In 2020, senior finance executive Alok Gupta died in Gurgaon when an Ecosport being driven by a minor jumped across the road divider and barreled into Gupta's bike. His family and friends campaigned against underage driving on the streets of the NCR city while calling for a change in law to ensure strict punishment for drunk and underage drivers. Still, the offence has been ignored for long. Before the campaign in July, traffic police did not

issue any challans for underage driving in 2024. Till Wednesday, cops had issued a total of 240 penalties for the offence. Gurgaon police in 2019 decided to follow in the footsteps of cops in Hyderabad to start punishing the parents of minors found driving. Parents were to be called on the spot to pay the fine and a case was to be registered against them under the MV Act. ut, till date, no parent or guardian has been charged in the city for allowing minors to drive. In its campaign, Gurgaon police also held 60 awareness sessions in schools across the city. They said around 6,000 students were told about the dangers and ramifications of underage driving to instil a sense of responsibility. "Parents who allow their underage children to drive are not only breaking the law but also endangering the lives of others. Underage driving is a serious matter that requires immediate attention and responsible action from the community," DCP Vij said.

## Streetlights soon on key SPR links in new Gurgaon sectors

GURGAON: Seven key arterial stretches in new sectors along the Southern Peripheral Road (SPR) will soon be illuminated as GMDA plans to install 770 smart streetlights in the second phase of their project. The second phase, covering a length of 11.5 km, will see smart streetlights installed along seven sector roads, including those in sectors 70A, 71 to 74, 75A-76, outer 77, 78-79, outer road 79, and 79B. GMDA officials have said that the estimated cost for the second phase is Rs 6.59 crore, and a tender inviting bids for the project has been floated. "These smart streetlights are equipped with advanced features such as automatic dimming, remote monitoring, and energy-saving capabilities.

They will make the roads safer for both pedestrians and vehicles during the night," an official said. The smart streetlights will be remotely managed through a cloud-based application that will be connected to the Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC). Officials will have complete control over the functioning of these lights, including mapping their GPS coordinates,



monitoring their health, and tracking them in real time. "These lights can automatically adjust their brightness based on the presence of pedestrians or vehicles, reducing energy consumption during periods of low activity. In the event of a malfunction or instance of vandalism, an alarm will be raised to support quick detection and redressal of any issues on

the ground," explained a senior official from GMDA's electrical wing. Meanwhile, the first phase of smart streetlight installation is underway. Approximately 835 smart streetlights are being installed in sectors 68 to 80 along the master roads dividing the sectors. Residents have expressed that the installation of streetlights is long overdue.

## Gurgaon hits brakes again as key NH8 stretches flooded after 1.5-hour rain

GURGAON: Several areas across the city witnessed light to moderate rainfall on Wednesday, which brought some much-needed respite from the heat. By 5.30pm, the city recorded 10.4mm rainfall, most of it between 6.30am and 8am. The downpour led to waterlogging in some areas in the morning. Commuters faced a tough time as traffic came to a crawl in key areas such as Kapashera, Hero Honda Chowk, Rajiv Chowk, Khandasa Chowk, Sector 52, Medanta Road and Narsinghpur along NH-8 for around two hours. While these areas reported snarls till around 10.30am, no significant rainfall was seen later in the day, resulting in smooth commutes in the afternoon. "Waterlogging is a persistent problem in Gurgaon. MCG and GMDA have consistently claimed that water will be drained within 15 minutes, even during heavy rains, but the reality is different," said Gopal Pradhan, a resident of Sector 90 who was stuck in Narsinghpur for around 45 minutes. "Vehicles get damaged during waterlogging. I was stuck in traffic for an hour during the morning rush," said Ankit Sharma, who commutes to his office in Udyog Vihar 5 daily. The local authorities said they have implemented several measures to mitigate the waterlogging and alleviate traffic congestion, due to which the accumulated rainwater was drained out soon after. "While there were jams for some time in the morning, vehicular movement was restored to normal in some time," a traffic police officer said. At 30 degrees Celsius, the city's minimum temperature on Wednesday was 2.5 degrees above Tuesday's 27.5 degrees. The maximum temperature, however, saw a dip at 33.4 degrees Celsius from the previous day's 34.1 degrees Celsius. After the rain ceased and the sun returned, the high humidity level - 97% - made outdoors uncomfortable. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted more showers in the coming days. "More episodes of light to moderate rainfall will bring the mercury down and reduce humidity. The maximum temperature is expected to hover between 33 and 35 degrees Celsius, while the minimum will be around 29 to 30 degrees Celsius. Thunderstorms and lightning are likely at isolated locations in Haryana over the next five days," an IMD official said. Meanwhile, several parts of Delhi got moderate to heavy showers on Wednesday morning. Safdarjung, the base station, logged 27mm of rainfall till 8.30am. In the same duration, Pusa and Pitampura reported heavy rain - 80mm and 73 mm, respectively. This marked the second instance of heavy rainfall in parts of the city since the arrival of the monsoon. The intense rain happened because the monsoon trough was close to Delhi and additional moisture from a western disturbance also came in. Several areas in Delhi

## S+4 floor policy rolled out again despite ongoing case: Plea in Haryana high court

GURGAON: Hearing a plea against allowing construction of still-plus-four floors on residential plots in the city, the Punjab and Haryana high court was told by govt on Tuesday that it will not give approvals till the next date of hearing on Aug 22, the petitioner's counsel said. The bench of justices Arun Palli and Vikram Aggarwal was hearing a petition by Gurgaon Citizens Council, which had sought a stay on govt's policy allowing S+4 construction in the NCR city. The petitioner told HC on Tuesday that it had first filed the plea against permitting S+4 houses in 2021. Two years later, in 2023, the department of town and country planning (DTCP) told the court that it had suspended the policy and appointed an expert committee to recommend if S+4 construction should be allowed. Before Tuesday's hearing, the last time that HC took up the petition was on May 30 this year, when DTCP submitted an affidavit, saying that the expert committee's report was under consideration.

US, Qatar and Egypt call for talks with Israel and Hamas on August 15

**Cairo.** Leaders of the United States, Egypt and Qatar on Thursday called on Israel and Hamas to meet for negotiations on Aug. 15 in order to finalize a Gaza ceasefire and hostage release deal. The three countries, which have been trying to mediate a deal, said in a joint statement the talks could take place in either Doha or Cairo. "A framework agreement is now on the table with only the details of implementation left to conclude," they said. "There is no further time to waste nor excuses from any party for further delay. It is time to release the hostages, begin the ceasefire, and implement this agreement." Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said Israeli negotiators would be there. The aim, he said, was "to finalize the details and implement the framework agreement." There was no immediate comment from Hamas. The war in Gaza was triggered by Hamas' Oct. 7 attack on southern Israel, in which 1,200 people were killed and 250 taken hostage to Gaza, according to Israeli tallies. At least 39,699 Palestinians have been killed in the Israeli military campaign in Gaza, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between fighters and civilians.

Britain is on alert for further unrest even after anti-racism campaigners faced down the far right

**LONDON.** British authorities said Thursday they were preparing for the possibility of further unrest, even as they applauded the efforts of anti-racism campaigners and police officers who largely stifled a threatened wave of far-right demonstrations overnight. Prime Minister Keir Starmer sounded the note of caution after a week of anti-immigrant violence that has scarred communities from Northern Ireland to the south coast of England. Starmer spoke to reporters at a mosque in Solihull, near Birmingham, where demonstrators shut down a shopping center on Sunday. "It's important that we don't let up here," Starmer said. At an emergency meeting with law enforcement officers at his office, Starmer said on Thursday evening that police need to remain on "high alert." Britain's Press Association reported. He credited strategic police staffing and swift justice for rioters in the courts for creating a deterrent that kept trouble at a minimum the night before. Police across the United Kingdom had braced for widespread disorder on Wednesday, after far-right activists circulated a list of more than 100 sites they planned to target, including the offices of immigration lawyers and others offering services to migrants. But those demonstrations failed to materialize as police and counter-protesters filled the streets. Carrying signs saying "Refugees Welcome" and chanting "Whose streets? Our streets," people turned out in force to protect asylum service centers and the offices of immigration attorneys. The government also declared a national critical incident, putting 6,000 specially trained police on standby to respond to any disorder. Police said that protests and counter-protests were largely peaceful, though a small number of arrests were made.

'Victory closer': Ukraine residents welcome offensive on Russia's Kursk region

**KYIV.** As Ukraine's major assault on the Russian border region of Kursk entered its third day, residents in the capital, Kyiv, praised the offensive as "bringing victory closer." The cross-border incursion appears to be Ukraine's most serious since Russia's invasion began in February 2022 and may involve up to 1,000 troops, according to Moscow's estimates. "To be honest, I feel proud of our guys and happy," said Tetiana Kravchuk, a financier in the Ukrainian capital. "I believe that it was a prepared operation and maybe personnel reserves were used, but it was prepared well," she added. Ukraine has not officially taken responsibility for the operation, which began on Tuesday morning, but officials have blamed Moscow for inciting the attack. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that "Russia brought the war to our land and should feel what it has done." Russian President Vladimir Putin has called it a "large-scale provocation" by Kyiv and Russia's top general vowed on Wednesday to crush the incursion. "With these actions, Ukraine is strengthening its defence capabilities and its ability to defend itself," said Anastasia Volkova, a cultural manager in the Ukrainian capital. "This is a success of our military, including in the most difficult areas of the front line." The independent US-based Institute for the Study of War (ISW) said Ukraine had made significant territorial gains in the first two days of the incursion. The Russian defence ministry said its troops were "continuing to destroy" armed Ukrainian units and were using air strikes, rockets, and artillery fire to try to push them back. Show them 'what war is' Many residents praised the attack as payback for Russia's invasion, now in its third year. A local resident in Kyiv, Rita Simon, told AFP that the Kursk region operation was "necessary" to show Russia the consequences of war.

Donald Trump agrees to another debate with Kamala Harris

**Palm Beach.** Donald Trump gave an hour-long news conference Wednesday in which he recommitted to debating Vice President Kamala Harris and taunted her while also repeating old falsehoods and lashing out at questions about the enthusiasm her campaign is receiving. As Trump addressed reporters at his Palm Beach, Florida, estate, ABC announced that Trump and Harris, the Democratic nominee, have agreed to a September 10 presidential debate, setting up a widely anticipated faceoff in an already unparalleled presidential election. Trump said he had proposed three presidential debates with three television networks in September. Trump again insisted there had been a "peaceful transfer of power" in 2021 and renewed attacks on Republican rivals like Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp, whom Trump has harshly criticised since Kemp refused to go along with his false theories of election fraud. In taking more than a dozen questions from reporters, however, Trump tried to draw a contrast with Harris, who has not held a news conference since she became the likely Democratic nominee following President Joe Biden's withdrawal from the race.

ANOTHER KEY MOMENT IN THE ELECTION IS SET

Trump's decision to go on ABC, days after posting on his social media account that he would not appear on the network, sets up a highly anticipated moment in an election where Biden's catastrophic performance in the last debate set in motion his withdrawal. "I think it's very important to have debates," Trump said Thursday. "I look forward to the debates because I think we have to set the record straight." The Harris campaign had no immediate comment. Thursday's event was Trump's first public appearance since Harris selected Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz as her running mate. Trump called Walz a "radical left man." "Between her and him, there's never been anything like this," Trump said. "There's certainly never been anybody so liberal like these two." He repeatedly suggested Harris was not intelligent enough to debate him. Harris, for her part, has tried to goad Trump into debating and told an audience in Atlanta recently that if he had anything to say about her, he should "say it to my face." Trump grew visibly perturbed when pressed on Harris' crowds and newfound Democratic enthusiasm, dismissing a question about his lighter campaign schedule as stupid. Trump says he has not "recalibrated" his campaign despite facing a new opponent, a dynamic some Republican strategists have quietly complained about. When asked what assets Harris possessed, Trump said: "She's a woman. She represents certain groups of people." Trump has repeatedly — and falsely — accused Harris, the daughter of Jamaican and Indian immigrants, of previously downplaying that she is Black.



**TRUMP TAKES QUESTIONS ABOUT ABORTION** Trump suggested abortion will not be a major issue in the campaign and the outcome in November. He insisted that the matter "has

become much less of an issue" since the Supreme Court ended the federal constitutional right to abortion services and returned control of the matter to state governments. But the issue is widely seen as a general election liability, and Trump named states such as Ohio and Kansas that have since voted to protect abortion rights. Trump also said he expected Florida "will go in a little more liberal way than people thought" when it votes to repeal an abortion ban later this year, but he did not respond to questions asking how he would vote. Trump argued that Democrats, Republicans and "everybody" are pleased with the results of the 2022 ruling that overturned the 1973 Roe v. Wade decision. Trump's actions within the GOP, however, suggest he knows that Democrats already have capitalized on Republican opposition to abortion rights and could do so again this fall. Trump single-handedly ensured that the Republican Party platform adopted at the 2024 convention in Milwaukee does not call for a national ban on abortion, and he has said repeatedly that hardliners in the party could cost the GOP in November.

Venezuela blocks access to X for 10 days amid post-election protests, violence

**Caracas.** Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro on Thursday said he had signed a decree to block access to social media platform X for 10 days, after earlier saying social media was used to incite violence following the country's presidential election. Maduro has frequently railed against X owner Elon Musk since the July 28 election which the opposition says it won, a claim backed by an increasing number of Western governments. Maduro said he signed a decree presented by regulator Conatel which "has decided to take social network X, formerly known as Twitter, out of circulation for 10 days." X got out of Venezuela for 10 days," he said in a speech which was broadcast on state television. Maduro and Venezuela's electoral authority have said that the president won a third term in the election, though the opposition claims victory and says it has the vote counts to prove it. Neither Maduro nor the electoral body



have released detailed vote tallies. In the days after the vote, protests from Venezuelans across the country and abroad broke out demanding Maduro step down and to honour a win by opposition candidate Edmundo Gonzalez. The protests were largely promoted on social media. The leftist President earlier this week had asked his supporters to also abandon messaging application WhatsApp in favour of Telegram or

WeChat, saying the app was being used to threaten the families of soldiers and police officers. Maduro has also clashed publicly with Musk since the election. As well as banning the social network for 10 days, Maduro accused Musk of inciting hate, civil war, and death. The social network did not immediately respond to requests for comment. Earlier, the foreign ministers of Mexico, Colombia and Brazil reiterated calls for Venezuela's electoral authority to publish the vote tallies in a joint statement. The statement followed comments by Venezuelan opposition leader Maria Corina Machado on Thursday calling on Mexico's President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador to impress upon Maduro that his best option is to negotiate with the country's opposition.

Veteran human rights advocate freed in prisoner swap says Russia is sliding back toward Stalinist times

**BERLIN.** A human rights activist since the 1980s, Oleg Orlov thought Russia had turned a corner when the Soviet Union collapsed and a democratically elected president became leader. But then Vladimir Putin rose to power, crushing dissent and launching a full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Finally, the 71-year-old Orlov was himself thrown in prison for opposing the war. Freed last week in the largest East-West prisoner swap since the Cold War, he was forced into exile — just like the Soviet dissidents of his youth. In an interview with The Associated Press on Thursday in Berlin, Orlov decried the scale and severity of repressions under Putin, with people imprisoned for merely criticizing the authorities, something unseen since the days of dictator Josef Stalin. And he's vowing to continue his work to free the many political prisoners in Russia and keep their names in the spotlight. "We're sliding somewhere into Stalin times," said Orlov, who at times showed signs of fatigue from a hectic schedule of media interviews in the week since his release. He was sentenced to 2½ years in prison in February for writing an anti-war article. When he was unexpectedly moved last month from a jail in central Russia for what eventually led to the Aug. 1 prisoner swap, he was waiting to be transferred to a penal colony after losing an appeal. The move came as a complete surprise, he told AP. First, he was told to write a request for clemency addressed to Putin — something he said he flatly refused. Days later, he was put in a van and driven, to his astonishment, to an airport in Samara and flown to Moscow. "To find yourself on a plane, among free people, straight from a prison — a very weird feeling," Orlov said. He more days followed in Moscow's notorious Lefortovo Prison, isolated in his cell, where he wrote a complaint that he was denied access to his lawyer. Then, he was shown a document saying he had been pardoned. He was put on a plane again, this time out of Russia, with other freed dissidents, and was greeted in Germany by Chancellor Olaf Scholz.

Death toll from 6 weeks of monsoon rains jumps to 154 in Pakistan

**ISLAMABAD.** The death toll from nearly six weeks of monsoon rains and floods across Pakistan has risen to 154, officials said Thursday, as downpours continued in much of the country, inundating some villages. More than 1,500 homes have been damaged since July 1, when the monsoon rains began, the National Disaster Management Authority said. Orchards in remote areas of the southwestern Baluchistan province were damaged, and rains flooded many streets in the eastern city of Lahore. The Pakistan-administered portion of the disputed Himalayan region of Kashmir

has also been battered by rains, causing landslides. Many of the 154 deaths occurred in the eastern Punjab and northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa provinces, according to the disaster agency and provincial authorities. Currently, more than 2,000 people are in relief camps in rain-affected areas in the southern Sindh province, officials said. On Thursday, the aid group International Rescue Committee said it is preparing to scale up its response in Pakistan with looming rains posing a threat to the lives and livelihoods of millions. "Our priority is to ensure that

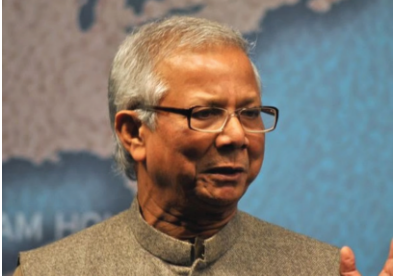
affected communities receive timely and adequate support to prevent this humanitarian crisis from deepening," the group's director in Pakistan, Shabnam Baloch, said in a statement. Pakistan is in the middle of the annual monsoon season, which runs from July through September. Scientists and weather forecasters blame climate change for heavy rains in recent years. So far this year, Pakistan has received less rain than in 2022, when climate-induced downpours swelled rivers and inundated at one point one-third of the country, killing 1,739 people and s

Interim leader Muhammad Yunus takes the helm in Bangladesh, to seek peace and prepare elections

**DHAKA.** Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus took the oath of office as head of Bangladesh's interim government Thursday after protests forced out former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina this week. The key tasks for Yunus now are restoring peace in Bangladesh and preparing for new elections following the ouster of Hasina, who fled to India after weeks of student protests over job quotas grew into an uprising against her increasingly autocratic 15-year rule. The figurehead President Mohammed Shahabuddin administered the oath to Yunus for his role as chief adviser, which is the equivalent to a prime minister, in the presence of diplomats, civil society members, top businessmen and members of the former opposition party at the presidential palace in Dhaka. No representatives of Hasina's

party were present. The 16 other members of the interim Cabinet were drawn mainly from civil society and include two of the student protest leaders. The Cabinet members were chosen in discussions this week among student leaders, civil society representatives and the military. The protests began in July against a quota system for government jobs that critics said favored people with connections to Hasina's party. But she resigned and fled to India on Monday after the protests coalesced into a movement against her government and more than 300 people including students and police officers were killed in the spiraling violence. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi sent his best wishes to Yunus in a statement on social media platform X, and alluded to reports that Hindus in Muslim-majority Bangladesh had



been targeted during the violence. "We hope for an early return to normalcy, ensuring the safety and protection of Hindus and all other minority communities," Modi said. "India remains committed to working with Bangladesh to fulfill the shared aspirations of both our peoples for peace, security and development." Yunus, who was awarded the 2006 Nobel Peace Prize for his work

developing microcredit markets, was in Paris for the Olympics when he was chosen for the interim role. He called for calm and an end to partisan violence before he returned home earlier Thursday. In his first comments after his arrival, he told a news briefing that his priority would be to restore order. "Bangladesh is a family. We have to unite it," Yunus said, flanked by student leaders. "It has immense possibility." Yunus has been a longtime opponent of Hasina, who had called him a "bloodsucker" allegedly for using force to extract loan repayments from rural poor, mainly women. Yunus has denied the allegations. On Wednesday, a tribunal in Dhaka acquitted Yunus in a labor law violation case involving a telecommunication company he founded, in which he was convicted and sentenced to six months in jail.

Iran is accelerating cyber activity that appears meant to influence the US election, Microsoft says

**NEW YORK.** Iran is ramping up online activity that appears intended to influence the upcoming U.S. election, in one case targeting a presidential campaign with an email phishing attack, Microsoft said Friday. Iranian actors also have spent recent months creating fake news sites and impersonating activists, laying the groundwork to stoke division and potentially sway American voters this fall, especially in swing states, the technology giant found. The findings in Microsoft's newest threat intelligence report show how Iran, which has been active in recent U.S. campaign cycles, is evolving its tactics for another election that's likely to have global implications. The report goes a step beyond anything U.S. intelligence officials have disclosed, giving specific examples of Iranian groups and the actions they have taken so far. Iran's United Nations mission denied it had plans to interfere or

launch cyberattacks in the U.S. presidential election. The report doesn't specify Iran's intentions besides sowing chaos in the United States, though U.S. officials have previously hinted that Iran particularly opposes former President Donald Trump. U.S. officials also have expressed alarm about Tehran's efforts to seek retaliation for a 2020 strike on an Iranian general that was ordered by Trump. This week, the Justice Department unsealed criminal charges against a Pakistani man with ties to Iran who's alleged to have hatched assassination plots targeting multiple officials, potentially including Trump. The report also reveals how Russia and China are exploiting U.S. political polarization to advance their own divisive messaging in a consequential election year. Microsoft's report identified four examples of recent Iranian activity that the company expects to increase as

November's election draws closer. First, a group linked to Iran's Revolutionary Guard in June targeted a high-ranking U.S. presidential campaign official with a phishing email, a form of cyberattack often used to gather sensitive information, according to the report, which didn't identify which campaign was targeted. The group concealed the email's origins by sending it from the hacked email account of a former senior adviser, Microsoft said. Days later, the Iranian group tried to log into an account that belonged to a former presidential candidate, but wasn't successful, Microsoft's report said. The company notified those who were targeted. In a separate example, an Iranian group has been creating websites that pose as U.S.-based news sites targeted to voters on opposite sides of the political spectrum, the report said. One fake news site that lends itself to a

left-leaning audience insults Trump by calling him "raving mad" and suggests he uses drugs, the report said. Another site meant to appeal to Republican readers centers on LGBTQ issues and gender-affirming surgery. A third example Microsoft cited found that Iranian groups are impersonating U.S. activists, potentially laying the groundwork for influence operations closer to the election. Finally, another Iranian group in May compromised an account owned by a government employee in a swing state, the report said. It was unclear whether that cyberattack was related to election interference efforts. Iran's UN mission sent The Associated Press an emailed statement: "Iran has been the victim of numerous offensive cyber operations targeting its infrastructure, public service centers, and industries. Iran's cyber capabilities are defensive and

Temporary staff of Palluruthy relief centre languish without six-month pay

**KOCHI.** Nearly 20 contract staff of the Palluruthy Relief Settlement Centre, functioning under the Kochi corporation, have been suffering without salary for the past six months. The Relief Settlement Centre is home to 140 people, mostly elderly citizens found abandoned on the streets and having psychiatric issues.

"Already there is a shortage of staff here. Key posts like the junior health inspector have been lying vacant for over a year. We're struggling to make ends meet and we are forced to take up other jobs to sustain the family," said a staffer on condition of anonymity. While the contract staff are languishing without wages, the three permanent staff, the superintendent, clerk and office assistant, are getting their salaries on time. "The temporary staff are appointed on a one-year contract basis. The wages are paid from the corporation's fund, which has to be approved by the council with the nod of the LSG department. The same got delayed due to the Model Code of Conduct in force," said an official. Meanwhile, corporation additional secretary J Muhammed Shafi said the payment would be made in a week. "The issue was discussed in the council three days ago. The file has been sent for the LSGD approval.

Four STPs to prevent sewage flows into Hyderabad reservoirs

**HYDERABAD.** To prevent sewage from contaminating the Osmansagar and Himayatsagar reservoirs, the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply & Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) has initiated measures to build four Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) with a capacity of 20MLD.

The HMWSSB will oversee the construction of two STPs with capacities of four and five MLDs for Osmansagar and two STPs with capacities of five and six MLDs for Himayatsagar. The proposed STPs will include interception weirs, inlet and distribution (I&D) structures and the laying of diversion trunk sewers to reduce sewage pollution in the reservoirs.

A four MLD capacity STP for the Bulkapur and Janwada zones will be built at Janwada, a five MLD STP for the Himayatsagar and Chilkur zones at Himayatsagar for the Osmansagar reservoir, a five MLD capacity STP for Aziznagar at Bangaliguda and Nagireddyguda zones at Nagireddyguda, and a six MLD capacity STP for the Kothwalguda, Shamshabad and Kavaguda zones at the Kamuni nala confluence point.

Last year, the HMWSSB developed a comprehensive plan to eliminate sewage pollution in the reservoirs by managing the sewage generated in the catchment areas of these waterbodies, taking into account the projected population growth for the next 30 years.



To protect these reservoirs, which are over 100 years old, from pollution, the authorities proposed building four STPs and creating diversion channels to transport treated water downstream. The Water Board has requested bids for these projects, which will cost Rs 65.05 crore.

For the Osmansagar reservoir, a four MLD STP plant for the Bulkapur and Janwada zones will be built at Janwada at an estimated cost of around Rs 11.42 crore. At an estimated cost of Rs 14.27 crore, five MLD STPs will be constructed in Himayatsagar and Chilkur zones at Himayatsagar. An I&D structure and

collection chamber with pumping arrangements will also be built in Chilkur and Himayatsagar for Rs 1.24 crore.

A six-MLD STP for Kothwalguda, Shamshabad, and Kavaguda zones will be built at the Kamuni nala confluence point at an estimated cost of Rs 15.48 crore. The project includes constructing an I&D structure with pumping arrangements at Kothwalguda, Kavaguda, and Kamuni nala confluence point (Rs 99.89 lakh) and laying a conveying main from Kothwalguda and Kavaguda collection chambers to STP (Rs 85.81 lakh).

Fake RPF recruitment interviews held at hotel near Ernakulam, investigation begins

20 job aspirants attended sham interviews held by 3-member gang posing as RPF officials

**KOCHI.** As job aspirants eagerly await the recruitment examination of the Indian Railways and Railway Protection Force (RPF), it seems fraudsters are also actively tapping into the opportunity. A three-member gang posing as RPF personnel conducted interviews, and certificate verifications of youngsters after promising the job of RPF constable. The sham interviews were held at a hotel near Ernakulam South railway station last week.

Around 20 job aspirants who have applied for the RPF constable recruitment examination were at the hotel to attend the interviews and certificate verification held on July 27. A youth from

Thiruvananthapuram, who attended the interview, had paid Rs 75,000 to get the job. "I came to know about the interview through one of my close friends," he said. "My financial situation is in an awful state and I borrowed money to give it to my friend. The interview was conducted by a woman and around 20 people from various parts of the state attended it."

He said the scammers directed them to attend the RPF examination that was supposed to be held next month. "They gave us reading materials to prepare for the examination. Then they told us that we just had to attend the examination and the rest of the recruitment procedures would be handled by them. After getting

the job, we were supposed to pay '1.5 lakh," he said. The incident came to light after the hotel owner approached RPF personnel saying that the rent for the rooms taken for the interview was not paid.

Thus, the RPF launched a probe into the incident and passed on the information to the police. Based on records collected from the hotel, the police contacted the interview attendees. "I realised I was cheated after the police and RPF officials contacted me. Soon, I spoke to the friend to whom I had paid money to attend the interview. Knowing my financial condition, he paid me the amount out of his own pocket."

Odisha launches first grain ATM in Bhubaneswar

**BHUBANESWAR.** Odisha government on Thursday piloted a Grain ATM in the city, the first-of-its-kind in the state, to dispense ration through automated teller machines to beneficiaries covered under the national food security programme.

Minister of Food Supplies and Consumer Welfare Krushna Chandra Patra unveiled the Grain ATM at Mancheswar set up under the Annapurthi initiative of the central government in collaboration with World Food Programme (WFP), in presence of Deputy Country Director, WFP Nozomi Hashimoto.

"This is a significant initiative in partnership with the WFP to achieve nutritional security in the state. The ATMs



will be set up across Odisha to provide foodgrains to beneficiaries with 24/7 access under the National Food Security Act," the minister said.

On the occasion, Hashimoto said, "WFP and Odisha have been partners for six decades.

Odisha presents a success story with global relevance. We are humbled to see the Annapurthi solution, a Made-in-India globally-awarded solution operational in many states, evolving to add more functionalities and features based on a year-long pilot and testing."

Grain ATM, Annapurthi is an automated multi-commodity dispensing solution that provides fast, clean and precise access to commodities (rice, wheat, grains) to beneficiaries, post biometric authentication.

**THIRUVANANTHAPURAM :** Under the warm golden light, sitting on a comfy chair with a cup of hot tea while turning the pages of the current read like it's the most important thing in the world — nothing short of absolute bliss. That's the magic of spaces like this, like secret portals that whisk you away from reality and drop you straight into another world.

Choosing the right book is just the beginning of a perfect reading experience. Equally important is finding the ideal place to immerse yourself in its pages. However, not everyone has the luxury of a quiet spot at this age. That's where café-bookshops come in. The Café Bookmark is a place like that. Tucked away in the corner of a heritage building within VJT Ayyankali Hall at Palayam lies Café Bookmark. With its vintage charm and quiet ambience, it is an ideal place to retreat to enjoy a favourite book and a delicious cup of coffee.

The café is the dream project of Abraham Mathew, a writer and the secretary of Kerala State Bookmark, under the Department of Culture. "Bookmark, until now, had been exclusively engaged in book distribution and sales. However, this traditional approach is no longer viable, leading to losses," he says. To counteract this downturn, Café Bookmark was conceived as a new strategy. "We know that in foreign countries, many discussions and dialogues occur in such coffee shops. In Kerala, similar gatherings used to happen at village tea shops and Indian Coffee Houses, where people would sit together, read newspapers, and engage in conversations about various topics. Nowadays, such public spaces are becoming scarce. Café Bookmark aims to provide a space for free thinkers to gather, read, and discuss ideas inspired by foreign models," he explains. The Café, which opened its doors on June 19, operates daily from 9am to 9pm. As one walks down the steps inside the café, a compact space opens up but the interior does not feel cramped or cluttered mainly thanks to the ample lighting. Two stabbed to death over parking dispute in Bhubaneswar



**BHUBANESWAR.** Two young men were allegedly stabbed to death by three to four assailants over a parking dispute in the state capital on Wednesday evening.

As per police, the incident occurred at Kalyan Plaza Apartment in Kuha village within Airfield police limits. One of the victims, Rashmi Sethi, who owned a meat shop and the accused were at loggerheads with each other, said police.

"A heated exchange broke out between Sethi and the goons over parking of the former's vehicle in the apartment following he and his friend, Sambit Rout of Rajnagar in Kendrapara district, were stabbed to death," said DCP Prateek Singh.

Police said one of the accused owns a flat in the apartment where the crime took place. After the incident, Singh visited the spot for investigation. The accused are absconding and police have launched a manhunt to nab them.

GIS survey to map properties for better services, not to hike taxes: GHMC Commissioner

Property owners were also informed that they need not give personal information like Aadhaar or PAN details during the GIS survey.

**HYDERABAD.** GHMC Commissioner Amrapali Kata on Thursday gave voice to the despair of lakhs of citizens of Hyderabad who suffer in silence by saying that sometimes garbage is not lifted from her residence too by the civic body. She also tried to reassure property owners that there was no imminent hike in property tax by saying that the comprehensive integrated Geographic Information System (GIS) survey being undertaken by the GHMC was merely to map all properties and utilities within the civic body limits to improve municipal services, including sanitation. "There are no such proposals to increase property tax following this survey," the civic body commissioner said. She appealed to citizens to participate in the survey and provide accurate information during the door-to-door visits. SHGs and Residents Welfare Associations (RWAs) will collaborate with GHMC to accelerate the survey and ensure thorough coverage, she told reporters at a press conference here.

Property owners were also informed that they need not give personal information like Aadhaar or PAN details during the GIS survey. "During the mapping survey, we will prioritise the protection of personal information. Our data collection is limited to property-related information, utilities and infrastructure along with essential supporting documents," Kata said.

Property owners need not give Aadhaar or Pan details:

"We will focus solely on enhancing urban planning and resource management. We will not request personal details such as Aadhaar or PAN. Submission of water and electricity bills is optional. Minimal data is being collected and some personal information in the GIS field survey mobile app has been deleted and simplified further," Amrapali Kata said.

Addressing a press conference here, Kata said the GIS survey would cover details of roads, buildings, water bodies, parks

and other features within GHMC limits. All data will be protected and stored in Railtel, owned by the Union government, the GHMC commissioner said. Currently, there are 19.38 lakh assessments, including 2.78 commercial assessments under GHMC's jurisdiction.

Digital address for garbage collection

A unique digital address will be generated for each property to facilitate efficient delivery of services such as garbage collection and emergency response, Kata said. A drone survey covering 158 sq km within GHMC limits has been conducted, and 1,14,020 plots have been digitised. Areas like Hydernagar, Miyapur, Chandanagar, KPHB Colony, Uppal and Hayathnagar have already been surveyed.

Additional areas, including Madhapur, Allwyn Colony, Serilingampally, Vivekananda Nagar Colony, Gajularamaram, Subhash Nagar, Nagole and RC Puram, are being prepared for the survey, she said.

From next month, around 600 teams with two members each will work on the ground to collect information for the GIS survey which is expected to be completed by March 2025.

The GIS mapping will contribute to better city planning, improved services, quicker emergency response, enhanced utility services, infrastructure development, efficient garbage collection, and improved safety and security, Kata said.



Centre's overbearing presence bodes ill for J&K

It would be incorrect and naïve to say that the trend of using one Raj Bhawan/Niwas or the other for partisan reasons began only after 2014. Even earlier, there were many incumbents who conducted themselves in a partisan fashion — rather than having an apolitical stance, which is mandated — especially in politically significant states like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Karnataka. But it is true that many honourable exceptions had refused to kowtow to the Centre. Some Presidents and gubernatorial incumbents bravely took on the Central Government to uphold the independence and dignity of their constitutional offices. But sadly, the last decade has not seen virtually any constitutional office refuse the Centre's political or partisan insistence. Now, with the elections imminent in J&K, sudden steps pertaining to the strengthening of powers of the L-G's office are telling. The Transaction of Business of the Government of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir (Second Amendment) Rules, 2024, empower the L-G to control the police, public order, bureaucracy transfers and postings. They mandate the J&K L-G's approval in those realms and give him the final say on any proposal for the grant of prosecution sanction.

A catch-up flight in run-up to Gaganyaan

ISRO hopeful that the International Space Station experience will benefit India's grand mission

THE Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has nominated one of its four newly trained astronauts, Shubhanshu Shukla, to fly to the International Space Station (ISS). Shukla is in the first batch of four Indians trained in Bengaluru and Russia for India's maiden human space flight, Gaganyaan. While announcing the decision to send Shukla, the space agency used the word Gaganyatri for astronaut, suggesting a possible connection with the Gaganyaan mission. However, Shukla's flight to ISS is an altogether different activity, though ISRO says the experience gained from it would help in the Gaganyaan mission. Ever since humans first landed on the Moon in 1969, most of the human space flights have been to orbiting space stations. Humans fly in spacecraft launched by powerful rockets, dock the spacecraft to a space station, remain there for a few days or weeks, and return to the Earth. The space station era began with the Soviet Salyut and American Skylab in the 1970s. Then came the larger Soviet station, Mir, and finally the ISS jointly built by America, Russia and Europe. China's Tiangong Space Station has been in the making for a decade now (it takes a long time to assemble a station in space), and India has announced its intention to build its space station by 2035. To reach a station orbiting around Earth, one needs powerful rockets and robust spacecraft that can transport humans there and bring them back safely. For this, the Soviets developed the Soyuz spacecraft and the Americans the Space Shuttle for almost 30 years. The Shuttle could lift off vertically like a rocket, glide in space like a spacecraft and land horizontally on the earth like an aeroplane. After the Columbia disaster in 2003 — in which Kalpana Chawla perished — the shuttle programme faltered and was ended in 2011. For a few years after this, NASA used the services of the Russian Soyuz for sending supplies to the ISS and rotate the crew there. For the long term, NASA supported American companies with funds and technology to help them build durable space transportation systems so that it could fully delegate the job of sending cargo and crew missions to ISS to certified private companies. This policy resulted in the emergence of private space players like SpaceX and United Launch Alliance (ULA). After several cargo missions using its Falcon 9 rockets to ISS since 2012, SpaceX launched its first crewed mission in 2020. ULA, too, made several cargo trips to the ISS using its Atlas V rocket. It launched its first crewed module, Starliner, which transported Sunita Williams to ISS in June. It has, however, not been found fit for the return journey due to problems with its thrusters and continues to be docked with the ISS.

For Shukla's flight to ISS, ISRO has signed a contract with a private company, Axiom Space, which has been categorised by NASA as a 'full-service mission provider



to carry out end-to-end commercial astronaut missions.' Axiom does not have a rocket or spacecraft and depends on SpaceX for transportation to and from the ISS. Since May 2021, Axiom has executed three commercial missions to ISS. The one with Shukla will be its fourth mission. It is unclear till now if Shukla is going to fly under a commercial agreement between ISRO and Axiom or under a bilateral deal (with or without service charges) with NASA. Rakesh Sharma's flight to the Salyut station in 1984 was a gesture of friendship from the Soviet Union; India did not have to pay for the ride or the cosmonaut training. Salyut's successor was the Mir on which Russia hosted 104 cosmonauts and astronauts from 13 countries till it was deorbited in 2001, and many of them were paid rides. India missed the ISS bus and did not participate in its assembly or send an Indian astronaut to the space station while it was taking shape in the 1990s and 2000s with the participation of leading space agencies. In the 1990s, the relations between ISRO and NASA were at a low ebb because of the cryogenic controversy and the restrictions imposed by the American government due to fear of knowledge transfer. Second, ISRO was more focused on stabilising its operational satellite programmes and lacked additional resources to join an international venture.

By the time a human flight popped up on ISRO's agenda, the list of visitors to the ISS had considerably grown. In the past 25 years, 280 astronauts from 23 countries have been

to ISS with some of them visiting the station two to four times. For instance, the ongoing visit of Sunita Williams is her third to ISS. The US and Russia account for 220 astronauts to ISS, while the rest came from Japan, Canada, Italy, France, Germany, Denmark, the UK, Belgium, Spain, Sweden, Netherlands, Brazil, Israel, Kazakhstan, Belarus, Malaysia, South Africa, South Korea, Saudi Arabia, Turkey and the UAE. The list includes 13 'private visitors' or space tourists. Axiom's first mission to ISS included four private visitors.

Even when ISRO formally started working on the Gaganyaan mission in 2018, sending an Indian to the ISS was not on the cards. The four astronaut candidates were sent for training at the Yuri Gagarin Space Centre and agreements were signed with Russian agencies for developing other essentials needed for a human space flight. However, the launch deadline set by Prime Minister Narendra Modi — coinciding with the 75th anniversary of Independence in 2022 — was too short to be achieved. A year later, the ISS plan figured in the India-US joint statement during the Prime Minister's visit to America. It would appear the ISS trip of Shukla is not a necessary building block for Gaganyaan, but more of a catch-up step to gain real-time experience of a space flight in preparation for Gaganyaan. To see an Indian on a space station four decades after Rakesh Sharma's space journey would indeed be a moment of national pride.

Far-right extremism

UK must protect vulnerable communities

THE wave of far-right violence in the UK, marked by attacks on immigrants and Muslims, is a disturbing pointer to the persistent undercurrents of xenophobia and misinformation in society. The stabbing of three girls has been exploited by far-right agitators to fuel hatred and incite chaos. The violence has extended beyond mere protests, with shops looted, cars set on fire and mosques and Asian-owned businesses targeted. This alarming trend underscores a deeper malaise. The far-right's hostility towards immigrants is not merely a reaction to isolated events but a symptom of broader social anxieties and political failures. Misguided beliefs about immigration and cultural integration have been stoked by influencers like Tommy Robinson and politicians like Nigel Farage. They spread dangerous misinformation, such as the false claim that the attacker was a Muslim immigrant, to rally support for their divisive agendas.



Prime Minister Keir Starmer's condemnation of the riots as "organised illegal thuggery" is a necessary step, but more must be done. Even as nearly 400 people have been

arrested in a week of violence, including clashes between rioters and the police, concerted efforts must be made to combat the spread of misinformation online, which has proven to be a powerful tool for radicalising individuals and inciting violence. The government must also address the underlying socio-economic issues that far-right groups exploit, such as unemployment and inadequate social services, which often breed resentment towards immigrants.

In this climate of fear, it is crucial to uphold the values of tolerance and unity. The UK needs to ensure the safety and inclusiveness of all its residents, regardless of their background, to prevent such violence from taking root again. The media and political leaders must act responsibly, avoiding inflammatory rhetoric that can incite hatred.

This is not the Bangladesh we stood for in the line of fire

AT 2 pm on August 5, 2024, Bangladesh was freed from an autocrat. It baffles me that I can finally use the word 'autocrat' to describe the fallen Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina because our law made sure we couldn't since 2018. My brother and I rushed to the streets, unable to contain our excitement. The atmosphere was electric. I had never seen so many people on the streets, waving flags. Families carried their children on their shoulders, chanting slogans of victory. Rickshaw pullers saluted students, who stood on rickshaws giving speeches about refusing to live under tyranny, goons, or chandabaa (extortionists). We could breathe a sigh of relief. Hasina's flight from the country meant the end of enforced disappearances of students, journalists and activists, police raids on student protesters and the brutalities of the Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL). Bangladesh was, for now, a country free of censorship. But our joy soon turned to horror as we walked from Motijheel to Shahbagh. At Motijheel, crowds gathered in front of Sonali Bank, ripping off posters of Hasina. We cheered until someone suggested tearing down everything built under the Awami League regime. We dismissed it as extreme views surfacing due to newfound freedom. As we walked towards Shahbagh, our smiles faded. People were carrying army officials on their shoulders, believing they had brought this freedom. They climbed onto armoured vehicles, raised flags and danced. Some in the crowd looked uncomfortable but shrugged it off, thinking it was all part of the celebration. When we crossed Suhrawardy Uddyan, we saw a thick cloud of smoke. Inside, vandals had set large stages on fire, which had been set up for commemorating mourning day by the Awami League. A statue replicating Bangabandhu's historic March 7 speech was also ablaze. We tried to stop the fires, but people gave us looks of disgust. We stumbled upon a crowd beating a BCL-affiliated student with rods. The mob claimed he had weapons. Some students tried to protect him, shouting for him to be handed over to the army. But we were called Chhatra League or Razakar, accused of siding with the enemy. We had seen enough people shot, maimed and killed



during protests. It was ironic how we now took hits from a mob to save someone we were supposed to hate. The mob eventually outnumbered us, and the person was beaten to death. We couldn't verify his identity, fearing for our lives. We asked Army officials at the Shahbagh intersection to intervene and clear the crowd, but they refused. We knew the anarchy we were witnessing was just the beginning. We hadn't yet heard of the communal violence on Hindu communities, temples being torched, and attacks on Awami League-affiliated members and their families, alongside policemen and their families. At the TSC, we saw microbuses set on fire. Vandals warned people not to take videos or photos. Chairs were stolen from the halls and looters from Gono Bhaban, the Prime Minister's residence, were cheered as they brought in the chairs. At 5 pm, I walked from Shahbagh to The Daily Star building. On the way, men on bikes were honking and catcalling women. Mobs targeted TV

news offices which hadn't covered the student protests due to pressure from the authorities. A witchhunt was underway, and I feared for my safety. I felt numb witnessing the horror. What was the point of Abu Sayeed, Mir Mugdho, Farhan Faiyaz, and the deaths of over 200 others if this was the picture of freedom we painted in the first hours of independence? Are we truly free if we ignore the concerns of our minority communities? We are now so vulnerable and afraid that rational people have started believing in endless disinformation. If we find the hanging Hasina's undergarments on fans and displaying them in front of the media funny, then we are setting a dangerous precedent. This rhetoric could be used by religious bigots and radical groups to attack women's empowerment, arguing that empowering women leads to tyrants like Hasina. The politics of the AL regime could be used to justify their hidden agendas. As a nation,

we need to be far more vigilant than we have been during these dark days of lawlessness. I was horrified that the mob justified their vandalism by saying, "They did this to us, so we will do the same to them." No. Students did not sacrifice their lives for vigilante justice. They did it so people, regardless of background, have the right to speak up, claim justice and call out injustice. The movement is called the 'Anti-Discrimination Movement' and we cannot let that rhetoric be politicised or diluted. Many have noticed how the BNP has bandwagoned on the student's right to justice as a movement they always supported. I am proud that the student leaders I trust have called out this violence and set up watch parties. They constantly distinguish that these acts of vandalism are not what we support. I hope they continue this stance. Because when I saw vandals parading with their motorbikes on Manik Mia Avenue, it seemed we had just replaced the Chhatra League with the Chhatra Dal, allowing history to repeat itself. We are at a monumental time in Bangladesh's history to create change. We have an opportunity to redefine the Bangladesh we want without being deterred by the thought that "we will simply never see this in Bangladesh." Civic society has the biggest role to play now. Amidst the vandalism, civic groups made human chains to stop vandals from destroying police stations, helped return stolen items from Gono Bhaban and imams, along with students, joined watch parties outside temples to protect them. This is the Bangladesh I dream of, my grandfather's dream of during the Liberation War and the countless other freedom fighters who took a bullet. This is the time to call out all injustices that hindered our society under an autocracy—not just politicians, but also businessmen who supported the Awami League and now pretend to support our students. It is time for us to be vigilant on all fronts. It is so much harder to protect freedom than to achieve it. If nothing else, what this protest proved is that students have the power to take down an autocrat that everyone feared. We can again take down anyone who stands in the way of building a free Bangladesh for all.





## How about a black & white home?

# Over 7,200 Indian students have returned home from crisis-hit Bangladesh: Centre

**New Delhi.** More than 7,200 Indian students have returned to India in the past couple of weeks ending August 1 in view of the situation in Bangladesh, the Rajya Sabha was informed on Thursday. Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh, in a written response, also said that as per available records, there were about 19,000 Indian citizens, including over 9,000 students, living in Bangladesh. He was asked the total number of Indians living in Bangladesh for the purpose of education or business, the number of people of Gujarat living in Bangladesh, and whether any special campaign has been started to evacuate Indian citizens from the violence-hit neighbouring country.

The minister was also asked about the number of citizens brought back to India so far. Indian students in Bangladesh were from the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, and the states of Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, West Bengal, Tripura, and Assam, among others. State-

wise list is not maintained by our Mission and Posts in Bangladesh, the Union Minister said. The High Commission of India in Dhaka and the Assistant High Commissions in Chittagong, Rajshahi, Sylhet and Khulna have been assisting in the voluntary return of Indian nationals, he said. They were also coordinating with the authorities concerned in Bangladesh for their safety and security during their stay as well as movement to the airports and to land ports along the India-Bangladesh border. "The Ministry of External Affairs has also been coordinating with relevant Indian authorities to ensure a smooth passage for our citizens arriving at land ports and airports. Over 7,200 Indian students have returned to India till August 1, 2024, starting from July 18, 2024," Singh said. State-wise list of Indian nationals who have "voluntarily departed from Bangladesh was not maintained by our mission and posts in Bangladesh", the minister added. In a separate query, he was also asked whether it is a fact that Indian students' intake in



Canadian universities has dipped in recent years due to strained relations with Canada, and if so, the details of students enrolled there during the last three years, year-wise. The Minister of State for External Affairs shared data and said as per information obtained from the website of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), the Indian student intake at Canadian universities has "increased over the last three years". As per the shared data, the corresponding figures were -- 2,16,360 (in

2021), 3,18,380 (in 2022) and 4,27,085 (in 2023).

In a separate question, he was asked whether the government is aware of the "growing Chinese influence" on India's neighbouring countries. Singh, in his written response, said the "government keeps abreast of all activities in India's neighbourhood that impinge on its interests". "Neighbourhood First Policy continues to guide our approach to our neighbouring countries."

It has resulted in outcome-oriented engagements, strong development partnerships, physical, digital and economic connectivity as well as vibrant people-to-people and cultural exchanges. India is an active partner of its neighbours, with extensive education, culture, trade and investment linkages," he said. "Our relations with neighbours stand on their own footing and are independent of the relations of these countries with third countries. The government keeps a vigilant watch on all

developments which have a bearing on India's national security, and takes all necessary measures to safeguard it," he added.

In response to a separate query, he shared data on the number of pilgrims from India who visited Gurdwara Shri Darbar Sahib Kartarpur in Pakistan in the past three years - 10,025 (2021); 86,097 (2022); and 96,555 (2023). He was also asked whether India had taken "any diplomatic initiative to stop the ongoing war between Palestine and Israel".

"India has strongly condemned the terror attacks on Israel on October 7, 2023, and also the loss of civilian lives in the ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict. India has called for a ceasefire and sustained humanitarian assistance to the people of Gaza," the Union minister said. "During the ongoing conflict, India has provided 70 tonnes of humanitarian aid including 16.5 tonnes of medicines and medical supplies. We have also called for the release of the remaining hostages."

## Biker, 29, Killed In Hit-And-Run Case In Maharashtra's Palghar

**New Delhi.** In yet another hit-and-run case in Maharashtra, a man was killed after a car rammed into his two-wheeler in the Palghar district today. The accident took place around 1 am in Palghar's Manor. The accused left the car, a Mahindra Scorpio, and fled after the crash. The police have seized the car. The victim has been identified as 29-year-old Sagar Gajanan Patil. A man, Sachin Suravase, has been taken into police custody. He is said to be the driver and not the car's owner. The victim's family has alleged that the driver has been taken into custody to save the car owner. They had also refused to take the body of the



victim, alleging that the police had refused to file the case. Earlier last month, a 24-year-old son of a Shiv Sena leader ran over an elderly woman with his BMW in Mumbai. During his interrogation, Mihir Shah admitted to the police that he was drunk during the early morning drive.

In another incident, a minor son of a Pune realtor had run over two 24-year-old techies with his Porsche during a late-night drive in May. He, too, was allegedly found drunk.

## Case against lawyer for raping 21-year-old in Delhi court chamber

**New Delhi.** A case has been registered against a Delhi lawyer after a 21-year-old woman alleged that he raped her inside his chamber at Tis Hazari Court on the pretext of giving her a job. The case was registered at Sabji Mandi Police Station after the aunt of the woman lodged a complaint on July 30. In her complaint, the aunt of the woman said her niece was looking for a job, and she gave her the contact of the lawyer. After the woman contacted the lawyer, she was asked to visit his



chamber to show her educational qualifications. The lawyer told the woman that he would look for a job for her in the next 8-10 days. After 10 days, the woman contacted the lawyer again and the two started exchanging texts, as per the complaint. The lawyer also allegedly told the woman that "everyone needs good friends in life".

The woman was again called to the lawyer's chamber on July 27. After speaking for some time, the lawyer forced himself on her and also inserted his finger in her private part, the woman said in the complaint. As the woman started screaming, the lawyer threatened her with dire consequences if she told anyone about the assault. He gave her Rs 1,500 and asked her to leave, the woman's complaint said.

After reaching home, the woman informed her aunt about the incident, who then approached the police. A probe is underway, police said.

A former Solicitor General of India and King's Counsel, Salve has a stellar record of handling high-profile cases -- ranging from defending Indian national Kulbhushan Jadhav at the International Court of Justice to representing Ratan Tata in his battle against Cyrus Mistry. Vinesh Phogat, who became the first Indian woman wrestler to reach an Olympic final, was disqualified by the

organisers after being found 100 gms overweight ahead of her gold medal match on Wednesday. She later

## Study Reveals Priorities Of Indian GenZ's, How Hard They're Willing To Work

**New Delhi.** One in every four GenZ respondents in India is more inclined towards new-age job fields like Artificial Intelligence, cybersecurity and content creation while 43 per cent are willing to sacrifice the work-life balance to succeed in their career, a study has found.

The study, the Quest Report 2024, which unveils Gen Z traits and trends on dreams, careers, and aspirations, also found that only 9 per cent of respondents want to pursue entrepreneurship as they seek stability and security in work life. Gen Z usually refers to those born between 1997 and 2012. "One out of 4 Indian respondents are more inclined towards new-age job fields like content creation, data analysis, AI, and cybersecurity," the study commissioned by iQOO in association

with CyberMedia Research, said. iQOO is a sub-smartphone brand of the vivo group.

"43 per cent of respondents in India and 46 per cent globally are willing to give up work-life balance to succeed in their career," it said, adding that around 62 per cent of the Indian youth are willing to give up their hobbies and other interests to achieve their dreams. "Recent debate on work-life balance due to deliberation on 14-hour work day & 70-hour workweek have stirred conversations amongst the Gen Z," the study noted.

The study of 6,700 Gen Z respondents, aged between 20-24 years, from seven countries including the US, the UK, Malaysia Brazil and India, stated that 19 per cent of Indians surveyed prefer career advancements in big organisations while 84 per cent of

Indian respondents believe their jobs align with their goals, compared to 72 per cent globally. As many as 45 per cent of Questers said that they would take up higher studies to support their quest while 32 per cent believe they should take up relevant jobs to support their dreams.

Around 46 per cent feel financial constraints as a barrier to pursuing their choice of career. However, over 90% are confident in achieving their dream despite the barriers. "2X of women feel gender affects the pursuit of their dreams compared to men," the study said.

The study covered three broad areas- Gen Z Questers' spirit & motivation to fulfil their dreams, obstacles & barriers that disrupt their quest for passion, and career choices that drive their interests.

## 'A bulldozer on Waqf board properties': Congress leader slams reform bill

**New Delhi.** Senior Telangana Congress leader and state Waqf Board Chairman Syed Azmatullah Hussaini strongly criticised the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024, calling it "a bulldozer on Waqf Board properties." His remarks came after the bill was introduced in the Lok Sabha on Thursday by Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju, sparking strong opposition from various parties. "This bill is nothing but a bulldozer on Waqf Board properties," Hussaini stated. "We believe that BJP is doing vendetta politics as they have not received any minority votes."

Hussaini urged the BJP's alliance members, including the Chandrababu Naidu-led TDP and Nitish Kumar's JD(U), to oppose the bill. "We have called for an emergency Waqf Board meeting, where we will decide on our further course of action," he added.

The bill, which has been referred to a joint parliamentary committee (JPC) for further deliberation, proposes significant changes to the existing Waqf Act, including the inclusion of Muslim women and non-Muslims in Waqf bodies and the removal of Section 40, which gives Waqf boards the authority to determine Waqf properties.

The bill has ignited fierce debate, with opposition



parties condemning it as an "attack on the Constitution" and an interference in religious matters. Senior Congress leader K.C. Venugopal labelled the bill as "draconian" and politically motivated, especially with upcoming state elections in Maharashtra and Haryana. Defending the bill, Union Minister Kiren Rijiju argued that the amendments were aimed at broadening the existing law and ensuring justice for those previously denied it. He said the bill seeks to implement reforms recommended by committees from the previous Congress government, assuring that no rights were being taken away nor religious freedoms being curtailed. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla stated that the JPC would be constituted after consulting with leaders from all parties, ensuring that the bill undergoes thorough examination before any further legislative action.

## NIA files chargesheet against four terrorists, including Pakistani handler in Kashmir

**All four accused were involved in the killing of two civilians on the evening of February 7 at Karfali Mohalla in Shala Kadal in Srinagar.**



**New Delhi.** The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Wednesday filed a chargesheet against four terrorists, including one from Pakistan, for killing two people in Kashmir by Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and its offshoot, The Resistance Front in February. The

accused, identified as Adil Manzoor Langoo, Ahran Rasool Dar alias Tota, Dawood, and their Pakistan-based handler Jahangeer alias Peer Sahab, have been booked under various sections of IPC and UAPA. The NIA special court in Jammu, has already issued a non-bailable warrant against absconding accused Jahangir, the agency said in a statement.

All four accused were involved in the killing of two civilians on the evening of February 7 at Karfali Mohalla in Shala Kadal in Srinagar. The NIA took over the case in June, and initial investigations revealed that Adil Manzoor Langoo, who had joined the LeT in 2023, was motivated by his Pakistani handlers to carry out the outfit's activities in Srinagar.

He was also involved in previous attacks in the valley as well. He, along with his close associates Ahran Rasool Dar and Dawood, were working under the direction of Jahangeer and had conspired to kill people at Shala Kadal, the NIA said. Based on Jahangir's directions, Adil and Ahran had received the arms and ammunition which were used subsequently by Adil to commit the crime. Dawood had helped Adil destroy the evidence of the crime. "NIA has been cracking down on terrorist organisations active in Kashmir. LeT, the largest terrorist group in the region, has been working through various offshoots to carry out its operations after it was banned by the Government of India," the agency said in the statement. Further investigation is on, it said. "LeT/TRF has been luring unemployed youth into terrorist activities by using the social media extensively to propagate its dangerous agenda and promote its activities," the probe agency added.

## Trent shares zoom 9% after Q1 net profit jumps to Rs 391 crore

**NEW DELHI.** Shares of Tata Group's Trent Ltd., the operator of Westside and Zudio outlets, soared 9% today. At around 1 pm, shares of the company were trading 8.66% higher at Rs 6,131.20. The company's market capitalisation has once again crossed the Rs 2 lakh crore mark, a milestone it first achieved in July. The strong jump in share price came on the back of the company's impressive Q1 results, which exceeded market expectations. Middle East Tensions Wayanad Landslides Trent reported a net profit of Rs 391.2 crore for the June quarter, a jump from Rs 166.7 crore in the same period last year.

The company's revenue grew by 56.2% year-on-year to Rs 4,104.4 crore, outperforming analysts' expectations of Rs 3,810 crore. Additionally, Trent's EBITDA for the quarter rose by 66.7% to Rs 612.6 crore, slightly above the expected Rs 588 crore. Despite the strong financial performance, the EBITDA margin expanded to 15%, up from 14% last year, though it was marginally below the anticipated 15.4%. The positive results are largely attributed to the expansion of Zudio stores, with the company planning to add 200 more outlets in the current financial year.

## RVNL shares extend losses after Q1 results. Should you buy or sell

**For the quarter ending June 2024, RVNL reported a 34.7% drop in consolidated net profit, falling to Rs 223.92 crore from Rs 343.09 crore in the same quarter last year.**

**NEW DELHI.** Shares of Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL) continued to decline on Friday, falling nearly 3.5% on the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE).

The development comes after shares of the company fell nearly 5% on Thursday after the company reported disappointing earnings for the June 2024 quarter.

In contrast, the broader market saw significant gains, with the BSE Sensex surging almost 1,100 points to 79,980 at the opening bell. For the quarter ending June 2024, RVNL reported a 34.7% drop in consolidated net profit, falling to Rs 223.92 crore from Rs 343.09 crore in the same quarter last year. The company's revenue from operations also took a hit, dropping 26.9% year-on-year to Rs 4,073.80 crore, down from Rs 5,571.57 crore in Q1 FY24. RVNL's stock has had a remarkable run since the start of the financial year 2023-24, soaring to an all-time high of Rs 647 in July 2024, a massive



873% increase from its March 2023 close of Rs 68.60. However, the stock has since experienced some profit-taking and is now trading around 17% lower than its peak. Even then, RVNL shares are still up 341% from their 52-week low of Rs 122.

Buy, hold or sell RVNL?

Despite the recent dip, some market experts believe this could be a buying opportunity for long-term investors. Stock market analysts view RVNL as a company that is likely to benefit from the government's strong focus on infrastructure development. Seema Srivastava, a Research Analyst at SMC Global Securities, who was quoted in a Livemint.com report, expects the company to make a strong recovery. She has advised shareholders to buy the stock on the dips, accumulating shares on every 5-7% dip from current levels.

Analysts have also asked retail investors to avoid buying the stock immediately and wait till it stabilises. Retail investors should note that the stock has been on a losing run since the beginning of this week.

Therefore, once the stock price stabilises, investors can buy-on-dips for long-term gains. Analysts have also pointed out that while RVNL's recent performance has been underwhelming, the company's long-term prospects remain promising.

# Food prices can't be overlooked for inflation targeting, says Das

**The Economic Survey, released prior to the Budget, advocated for a revision of the central bank's inflation targeting framework by excluding food inflation.**

**NEW DELHI.** Contrary to the views expressed in the Economic Survey regarding the exclusion of food from retail inflation calculations, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das on Thursday emphasised that food inflation cannot be overlooked due to its significant contribution to the overall consumption basket. According to Das, at the forefront of RBI's focus is headline

inflation, with food inflation accounting for approximately 46% of the consumer price index (CPI). "...Further, the public at large understands inflation more in terms of food inflation than the other components of headline inflation. Therefore, we cannot and should not become complacent merely because core inflation has fallen considerably," he said.

Das clarified that while the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) might overlook elevated food inflation if it is deemed temporary, the current situation of sustained high food inflation requires the committee to take it seriously. He said that the MPC must stay alert to prevent spillover effects or second-round impacts from ongoing



food inflation to maintain the credibility achieved through the monetary policy efforts. The Economic Survey, released prior to the Budget, advocated for a revision of the central bank's inflation targeting framework by excluding food

inflation. It argued that India's inflation targeting should focus on overall inflation minus food prices, as fluctuations in food prices are frequently driven by supply factors rather than demand. The Survey suggested that it may be beneficial to reconsider whether India's inflation targeting framework should exclude food inflation.

Regarding the weight of food in the CPI, Das said the existing CPI basket and the weight assigned to core, fuel, and food were based on data from 2011.

NSO survey is underway

Shaktikanta Das noted that the NSO survey is currently underway, and a decision will be made in due course based on the data collected, in collaboration with the government and the RBI.

Rs 2 crore instead of the current limit of Rs 5 lakh, which was fixed almost six decades ago. As per the revised list of business of Lok Sabha, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is scheduled to introduce the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024 later in the day. Besides, sources said there are some changes with respect to cooperative banks. In addition, the Bill also seeks to give greater freedom to banks in deciding the remuneration to

be paid to statutory auditors. The Bill also seeks to redefine the reporting dates for banks for regulatory compliance to the 15th and last day of every month instead of the second and fourth Fridays. The Bill, which was approved by the Union Cabinet last Friday, proposes to amend the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, the State Bank of India Act, 1955, the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1970 and the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1980.

The announcement about this was made by the Finance Minister in her 2023-24 Budget speech. "To improve bank governance and enhance investors' protection, certain amendments to the Banking Regulation Act, the Banking Companies Act and the Reserve Bank of India Act are proposed," she had said.

## Bhavish Aggarwal enters billionaire club as Ola Electric shares surge on market debut

**NEW DELHI.** Bhavish Aggarwal entered the billionaire club on Friday after shares of Ola Electric Mobility Ltd surged 20%, marking a huge shift in fortunes for its founder. The stock's performance followed a muted debut on the stock market. As a result, Aggarwal, who held 36.94% of the company's shares, saw his net worth reach Rs 12,104 crore (approximately \$1.44 billion), elevating him into India's billionaire ranks. Aggarwal, aged 38, sold 37,915,211 shares of Ola Electric at Rs 76 each, raising Rs 288 crore. Post-IPO, he retained 1,32,39,60,029 shares, which, at the peak intraday price of Rs 89.25 per share, are valued at Rs 11,816 crore. The Indian billionaire list is led by Mukesh Ambani and Gautam Adani, with net worths of \$109 billion

and \$105 billion, respectively. Globally, other notable Indian billionaires in the Bloomberg Billionaire Index include Mahendra Choksi and family, Rakesh Gangwal, Benu Bangur, Samir Mehta, and Sudhir Mehta. Despite the upbeat stock performance, Prashanth Tapse, Senior Vice President (Research) at Mehta Equities Ltd, cautioned investors.

He said that the IPO's initial success did not necessarily reflect long-term prospects. Tapse pointed out potential risks due to the company's weak financials and possible negative cash flows in the future. He advised that only those willing to take risks should hold onto their shares for a minimum of 2-3 years. Earlier in the day, Ola Electric made a flat listing, debuting at Rs 76, the same as the issue price.

There were initial concerns about a potential discount listing, but the stock listed at a minimal discount of 0.01% on the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE). The IPO, which took place from August 2 to August 6, was priced between Rs 72 and Rs 76 per share. It successfully raised Rs 6,145.56 crore, including a fresh share sale of Rs 5,500 crore and an offer-for-sale (OFS) of up to 8,49,41,997 shares. The issue was 4.27 times subscribed overall. Qualified institutional bidders (QIBs) subscribed 5.31 times, non-institutional investors 2.40 times, and retail investors and employees 3.92 times and 11.99 times, respectively. Founded in 2017, Ola Electric Mobility is based in Bengaluru and focusses on manufacturing electric vehicles and key components such as battery packs.

The Jackson Holes Symposium to be held after next week will also remain in focus, traders said. At



the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 83.95 against the greenback, then touched 83.89, registering a rise of 8 paise over its previous closing price. On Thursday, the rupee consolidated in a narrow range and settled for the day lower by 2 paise at 83.97 against US dollar. Rupee was protected by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) at 83.96 for this week and the local unit is likely to trade in a narrow range of 83.90/84.00 for the day after the

RBI kept key benchmark rates on hold, said Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading 0.03 per cent lower at 103.17. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, advanced 0.15 per cent to USD 79.28 per barrel. Brent oil prices rose to USD 79.22, a 3 per cent weekly

gain, on rising Middle East tensions and better than expected US jobless claims data giving a better outlook on the US economy," Bhansali added. Market analysts said while the rupee seems to be tilting towards a negative bias, but sharp fluctuations are not anticipated. Meanwhile, the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the Reserve Bank kept the benchmark repo rate unchanged at 6.50 per cent. Announcing the bi-monthly monetary policy review RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said Indian rupee remained largely range-bound so far this financial year. Foreign institutional investors (FIIs) were net sellers in the capital markets on Thursday as they offloaded shares worth Rs 2,626.73 crore, according to exchange data.

The 26-year-old Neeraj, who won gold in the Tokyo Olympics, could not defend his crown, but Yuvraj said that even with the silver medal, he was able to bring smiles to the entire nation. Neeraj started with a foul throw but then he pulled off a stunning effort in his second attempt. Yuvraj, who won the Player of the Tournament award in the 2011 Cricket World Cup, praised Neeraj for his "perseverance and pride".

"Golden journey"  
"Proving yet again that his spirit to win is as unbreakable as his javelin's flight. You have not only won a historic silver medal but



have also brought a golden moment for every Indian heart. Here's to the champion who reminds us all that even in silver, there lies a golden journey of perseverance and pride," Yuvraj wrote. Yuvraj also had words of praise for Nadeem, who threw 92.97 metres and finished on top. "Heartiest congratulations to @arshadnadeem29 as well - for scripting history with an incredible 92.97m throw and breaking the Olympic record!" Yuvraj added. Nadeem also broke the Olympic record earlier held by Norway's Andreas Thorkildsen, who threw 90.57 metres in the Beijing Games in 2008. Arshad had butterflies in his stomach as he made a foul throw to begin his campaign. But the second throw shattered all records. He did not stop there and finished with another colossal throw of 91.79 metres in his sixth and final attempt. Having crossed the 90-metre mark, Arshad now intends to get better and go past 95 metres.

India to play day-night practice match to prepare for Adelaide Test vs Australia

New Delhi. India are set to play a two-day warm-up match against the Prime Minister's XI at the Manuka Oval in Canberra from November 30 to December 1 during the upcoming Border-Gavaskar Trophy. The contest has been scheduled to help India prepare for the Day-Night Test against Australia to be held from December 6 at the Adelaide Oval.

India have played three pink-ball Tests until now, against Bangladesh (2019), England (2021) and Sri Lanka (2022) and have won each of them. However, they are yet to play in an overseas Day-Night Test and the upcoming Adelaide Test would be their first on foreign soil. India will also be facing the Prime Minister's XI for the fourth time and the first in 20 years. Steve Waugh captained the PM XI which included current national coach Andrew McDonald against an Indian team led by Rahul Dravid. "We're delighted



to confirm India's involvement in this year's Prime Minister's XI match that emphasises the significance of the fixture on the cricketing calendar," Nick Hockley, the Cricket Australia CEO, was quoted as saying. "The upcoming Border Gavaskar Trophy Series will captivate the cricketing world. Today's confirmation of the Prime Minister's XI match is a terrific result for cricket fans, particularly in the ACT and surrounding regions, and adds to an incredible summer of cricket."

George Bailey, the CA Chair of Selectors, said, "Representing the PMs XI is a tremendous honour for any player given its rich history spanning across eight decades. This year's match also presents an opportunity for players to impress against arguably the strongest side in world cricket. India are scheduled to face Australia in the opening Test, starting November 22 at the Perth Stadium. Brisbane, Melbourne and Sydney will host the third, fourth and fifth Tests respectively. India have won back-to-back Test series in Australia.

de France. Yet again, a sport like javelin managed to reunite the Indians and Pakistanis as they together celebrated Arshad and Neeraj Chopra's podium finish at the Paris Olympics 2024 on August 8. A social media user shared a video where Arshad was running across the stands with Pakistan's flag in his hands. He obliged to stop and click pictures with the Indian fans as they congratulated the Pakistani athlete for his win. Arshad celebrated his win with the Indians, who were also clapping and

Arshad wins historic gold medal  
Arshad Nadeem ended Pakistan's 32-year-long wait for an Olympic medal and became the first athlete from the country to win an Olympic gold. Meanwhile, Neeraj Chopra won the silver medal with his season best throw of 88.94m. Arshad and Neeraj both appreciated each other for winning medals. They both ensured India-Pakistan finished 1-2 for the first time on the Olympic podium in men's javelin, a sport that is traditionally dominated by the Europeans.

PR Sreejesh retires: An ode to a legend who signed off at the top of his game

New Delhi. When the final hooter was sounded on August 8, Thursday in the bronze medal match at the Paris Olympics 2024, the Indian players would erupt in joy before making the run towards their favourite PR Sreejesh. The goalkeeper, however, was simple with his celebration. There were no fist bumps or shouts of joy. It was just a simple moment for the 36-year-old, who bowed down before the goalpost like it was a shrine where his god was living. There was a sense of fulfilment for a man who got his first kit after his father decided to sell their cow. It felt like life had come full circle for a star, who had seen the highs and lows of Indian hockey, coming from Kerala, where the sport has never had a rich history. From the absolute rock-bottom the team hit in the 2012 London Olympics, Sreejesh remained a constant to see the revival of Indian hockey as it won 2 back-to-back Olympic medals for the first time since 1972. However, as fans, you feel like Sreejesh was nowhere close to retirement. It seemed like the Indian star hadn't aged at all, especially during the Paris Olympics 2024



campaign. Nimble on his feet, with reactions showing no sign of any tardiness, Sreejesh lived up to his name of being the wall of Indian hockey. This was perfectly shown in the game against Australia, India's biggest bogey team. Sreejesh was ever present to thwart any attack that was inside the Indian D. The last save he pulled off with just 7 seconds on the clock and close to 7 Australian players in the D, makes you just say he is Indian hockey's 'Thala for a reason.' And just when you thought, he couldn't top things off, in came the Great Britain quarterfinal. In hockey, when you have a red card shown, it's almost like that team is bound to lose. No

one is expected to hold on and not see the opponents score. When Amit Rohidas was given his marching orders, everyone felt India were going out of the competition. But the team scored and eventually the game was 1-1, when Sreejesh decided that it was time for him to be that extra defender for his side. A barrage of close to 11 penalty corners were stopped by Sreejesh and Co as he never stopped being telling his players what to do. He didn't have the captain's armband at that moment, but he was certainly 'Sreejesh bhai' for the entire team. Then came the penalty shootout, where there's almost a sense that when Sreejesh is on the line, the attacker is under pressure. And it was certainly there for everyone to see. Great Britain crumbled under pressure, as they missed two shots and India won 4-2. And in the bronze medal match, the pressure remained on India in the final quarter. Spain had 15 shots and 9 PCs but Sreejesh was up to the task, when it was needed. So then, Sreejesh why retire now?

Noah Lyles reveals being Covid positive after 200m bronze win, withdraws from Olympics

Noah Lyles revealed that he was Covid positive after winning the bronze medal in the 200m race at Paris Olympics 2024 and the sprinter withdrew from the tournament.

New Delhi. USA's Noah Lyles revealed that he tested positive for Covid after a shock third finish in the 200m race at the Paris Olympics 2024. The American said that his Paris Games were over, hours after he needed medical attention and was taken off the track with a wheel-chair on August 8, Thursday. Lyles leaves as an Olympic champion, but an abrupt end to his campaign would be a bitter pill to swallow, as he had set the ambitious goal of winning four golds in Paris, in the

100m, 200m, 4x100m relay and the 4x400m relay. It was also the first time in three years when the triple 200m world champion could not win gold in this category. "I do have Covid," Lyles told the reporters on Thursday. "I tested positive around 5am on Tuesday. I woke up feeling chills, aching, sore throat. Those were a lot of the symptoms I have had before getting Covid. I was like: 'I need to test this one.' It came back positive so we quickly quarantined in a hotel near the village and they got me on as much medication as they legally could to make sure my body was able to keep the momentum going. It means Lyles, the 100m world champion, will play no part when the US quartet attempt to win 4x100m relay gold on Friday. "I still wanted to run, they said it was still possible so we stayed away from everybody and took it round by round. I have definitely had better days but I am walking around again. I was quite light headed after that race and the chest pain was definitely active. After a while I was able to catch my



breath and get my wits about me. I am feeling a lot better now." Noah Lyles withdraws from Paris Olympics Noah participates in 200m race despite Covid Botswana's Letsile Tebogo won gold (19.46) and USA's Kenneth Bednarek bagged silver (19.62) and Lyles reached the finishing line in 19.70 seconds to bag bronze. In a statement, USA Track & Field said: "Our primary commitment is to ensure the safety of Team USA athletes while

upholding their right to compete. After a thorough medical evaluation, Noah chose to compete tonight. We respect his decision and continue to monitor his condition closely." Despite missing out on gold medal, Noah was content with finishing third while being Covid-stricken. "It definitely affected my performance," Lyles said. "I had to take a lot of breaks [to receive] fluid. Ææ To be honest, I'm more proud of myself than anything. Coming out, getting the bronze medal with covid three days ago, it's been a wild Olympics." "The Paris Olympics has no mandatory rules relating to Covid and participation, which meant Lyles was within his rights to take to the start line. "We didn't want everybody to go into a panic. We wanted them to be able to compete," Lyles said. "And then two, we wanted to be able to make this as discreet as possible. You never want to tell your competitors you're sick. Why would you give them an edge over you?"
