Man feared drowned in drain in Gurgaon, his kin allege foul play

Gurgaon.(Agency)

Search is underway for a 40-year-old man, who was feared drowned after falling into an open drain in Daulatabad village on Tuesday night. The family of Arjun, a resident of Firoz Gandhi Colony, has raised doubts over the sequence of events narrated by one of his friends, Rupesh, who is being questioned, police said.

According to police, Arjun went to Daulatabad on Tuesday evening to meet his friends. The group consumed alcohol near the village bus stop. Rupesh told the police that Arjun, who became heavily intoxicated by 9pm, was unable to return home. He booked a Rapido bike to send Arjun back, but when the latter failed to move, he was made to lie down at the bus stop while Rupesh returned home. Later in the night, after Arjun's father called, Rupesh went back to the bus stop to take him home on his bike. He told police that before sitting on the bike, Arjun stood near the bus stop to relieve himself. During this time, he allegedly lost his balance and fell into an open drain running alongside the road. Rupesh claimed that he immediately jumped into the drain in an attempt to rescue Arjun, but could not find him.

4 Nepalese among 5 held in WhatsApp stock scam in Gurgaon

Five people, including four Nepalese nationals who cheated people through WhatsApp groups and fake trading apps by luring them with promises of high returns in the stock market and IPO investments, were arrested on Tuesday. Sher Bahadur Karki, Milan Thapa, Yanjay Ray and Manish, all residents of Nepal, and Virendra Pal Singh, a resident of Patiala in Punjab, were arrested from Gurgaon's Rajendra Park by a team of Cyber Crime (south) police, who seized seven mobile phones, 20 ATM cards, 18 cheque books and four bank passbooks. Police said a case was registered on Nov 1 after a complaint received from a victim, who was duped through WhatsApp groups and fraudulent mobile applications offering assured profits.

Police spokesperson Sandeep Kumar said, "Around Rs 2 lakh from the cheated amount was routed into a bank account of a firm named Tara Logistics Private Limited. The account was fraudulently opened in the firm's name by Milan and Sher and later sold to Manish for Rs 5,000. Manish then sold the account to Virendra for a 5% commission on the money transferred to it. Virendra further passed it on to another person for a 2% commission."

Gang that stole bikes in Noida busted, three arrested

Police have busted a two-wheeler theft gang on Wednesday and arrested three accused, recovering nine stolen motorcycles and several vehicle parts.

Those arrested include the gang leader Phool Singh alias Monu (22) of Sambhal district, and his associates Rajendra alias Chhote and Rajpal alias Bhola, both around 20 years old and residents of Badaun district.

DCP Yamuna Prasad said multiple complaints of motorcycle theft had been received from the Sector 113 area in recent days, following which a special team led by additional DCP Shavya Goyal was formed. Acting on a tip-off, the team intercepted the accused when they returned to the area to commit another theft.

During interrogation, the accused revealed that they conducted reconnaissance during the day in markets, housing societies and sector roads to identify unattended motorcycles. After assessing the vehicle's condition, the gang leader would finalise the target and call the others to the spot. Using specialised tools, they could break a bike lock within two minutes. One accused would flee with the stolen motorcycle, while the others left separately. Police said the gang had links with scrap dealers in Delhi, where stolen motorcycles were dismantled and sold in parts at inflated prices.

The proceeds were shared among the members, with Monu taking a 40% share and the remaining two splitting the rest. Investigations also revealed that the gang carried out thefts on demand.

Bread with no tags seized from outlet in Noida

Over 42 kg of Italian white bread loaves without a mandatory expiry or 'use by' date were seized from a leading fast food chain outlet, renowned for its sandwiches in Sector 121, Noida, after the food safety department intensified inspections across GB Nagar ahead of New Year celebrations.

The assistant commissioner (food), Sarvesh Kumar, said, "The absence of expiry details amounts to a serious violation of food safety norms. A show-cause notice has been issued to the manufacturing unit supplying the bread." He added that food items without proper labelling or expiry details pose a direct risk to consumers and clear information on shelf life is mandatory under the Food Safety and Standards Act. Kumar said the action was part of a coordinated enforcement drive underway ahead of New Year celebrations in the city. Multiple teams from the food safety department inspected and collected samples from restaurants, cafes and fast-food chains across Noida, Greater Noida and the Noida area.

Gurgaon–Faridabad road horror: Woman gang-raped after leaving home post-argument with mother; thrown from van at 90 kmph

A 25-year-old woman, who left her home after a heated argument with her mother over a personal matter and had informed her sister that she was going to a friend's place, was allegedly gang-raped and brutally assaulted inside a moving van before being thrown out on the Gurgaon–Faridabad road. The attack left her with severe facial injuries, requiring 12 stitches. She left the house on Monday night at around 8:30 pm. According to police, the woman had initially planned to return home within a few hours but got delayed. By midnight, with no public transport available, she accepted a lift in a van occupied by two men. Instead of taking her home, the vehicle was allegedly driven towards isolated stretches on the Gurgaon–Faridabad road, beyond the Hanuman temple, as dense fog covered the area. The woman was held captive inside the van for nearly three hours, police said. Despite her



repeated cries for help, the sparse traffic and the cold, foggy conditions meant that no one came to her aid. The victim's

family alleged that the two men took turns raping her during the ordeal. Around 3 am on Tuesday, she was

reportedly pushed out of the moving van near Mula Hotel at Raja Chowk in SGM Nagar. The woman managed to call her sister, who reached the spot and took her to Badshah Khan Civil Hospital. Given the seriousness of her injuries, the doctors advised that the woman be taken to Delhi, but the family admitted her to a private hospital in Faridabad. Police said the woman was driven around through the night and was thrown out of the vehicle, which was moving at a speed of over 90 kmph, near Raja Chowk at around 3 am, according to a PTI report. Following a complaint filed by the woman's family at Kotwali police station, authorities registered an FIR. Police have also arrested two men in connection with the alleged gang rape, and the van used in the crime, a Maruti Suzuki Eeco, has been seized. Police confirmed that the woman had been held against her will as the van traversed deserted stretches of Faridabad.

Gurgaon civic body bars payments to contractors for sewer overflow

In a bid to curb recurring sewer overflows, MCG announced on Wednesday that no payments will be allowed for repeat sewer cleaning caused by contractors' negligence, and the full cost of such works will be recovered from contractors or, in cases of supervisory lapses, from the concerned executive engineers.

The directive, issued by additional commissioner Yash Jaluka, follows repeated instances where temporary blockages placed to stop sewage flow during desilting operations were not removed after work was completed. Officials said such negligence led to clogged sewer lines, overflows, and severe inconvenience to residents, forcing the civic body to undertake repeat cleaning at public expense.

Under the new instructions, if a contractor fails to remove temporary blockages after desilting, the full cost of clearing the sewer line will be recovered from the contractor, and no separate payment will be allowed for rectifying problems arising from their own negligence. The order also directs officers not to entertain or process any bills related to repeat sewer cleaning caused by such lapses.

"In future, if it is found that a contractor fails to remove any temporary blockage after completion of sewer desilting work, the entire cost of clearing the sewer line shall be recovered from the concerned contractor. No separate payment shall be made to the contractor for clearing such blockages arising due to their own negligence,"

read the order issued by Jaluka on Wednesday. Responsibility has also been assigned to the engineering hierarchy. Executive engineers will be personally accountable for ensuring that temporary blockages are removed immediately after work is completed.

If bills are cleared for repeat sewer cleaning due to a contractor's negligence, the expenditure will be recovered from the executive engineer concerned.

Cops reunite mute child with family in one day in Gurgaon

On Dec 26, parents of an 11-year-old boy, both daily-wage labourers, approached the police in panic. The mute child had gone missing while they were away at work. Thanks to inspiring policing that involved civilians, who "helped increase reach and speed", the boy was reunited with his parents within 24 hours, police said. He is healthy and safe. However, the challenge was severe — while the boy could not speak and was unable to communicate his address, identity, or even his parents' names, the family didn't own a mobile phone and had no clear photograph of the child. The only visual clue available to the police was a small, unclear group photograph. Despite these limitations, an FIR was immediately registered and a search operation was launched without delay. The successful

rescue, carried out by Sector 9A police station, highlighted how quick action and community involvement can make a crucial difference in cases involving vulnerable children.

Speaking about the "unusual approach" taken during the search, sub-inspector of Sector 9A Rajesh Pahal said, "People often question what the police really do on the ground. I called four to five of my friends who are civilians and told them — today you will see our work. I asked them to join the operation and help us search for the child." "They know the local lanes, tea stalls and movement of people better. Their support helped us cover more areas quickly and spread the message faster," Pahal added. Under the supervision of the SHO, police teams began patrolling the area using auto-rickshaws fitted with loudspeakers, making announcements

across Sector 9A and nearby localities. The child's photograph was enlarged from the group image and simple posters were printed and pasted on electricity poles, public transport and shops. Teams also visited slum clusters, markets and transit points to gather local inputs. The breakthrough came on Dec 27, when a resident informed the police about a child matching the description in the Gadoli area near Sector 37D. Police immediately reached the spot and found the boy sitting safely at a tea stall. The stall owner noticed the child was alone and unable to speak. He offered him tea and biscuits and kept him there, ensuring the child remained safe until police arrived. After completing legal formalities, the boy was reunited with his parents. The parents thanked the police team emotionally for their swift action.

Dust to waste burning: Gurgaon breathes worst December air in 8 years, records no 'moderate' days

The city's air quality in Dec was the worst in at least eight years, with the average AQI for the month touching 298. This was higher than 2021's average of 295.9 — the previous peak in the 2018–2025 dataset — and a sharp jump from 236 of Dec 2024.

The data shows the city recorded no 'moderate' air days this Dec. Most days stayed in the 'poor' or 'very poor' categories, with at least 13 days registering AQI levels of 300 or above. The worst phase came between Dec 18 and 22, when the AQI ranged from 322 to 364. Dec averages over the years underline the scale of the spike. The city recorded 202.9 in 2018, 263.7 in 2019, 280.5 in 2020, 295.9 in 2021, 276.6 in 2022, 259.9 in 2023 and 236 in 2024, before rising again this winter to 298. According to experts, the increase reflects a combination of winter meteorology and local emission sources

that remain largely unchanged through the year. Centre for Research on Energy and Clean Air (CREA) analyst Manoj Kumar said, "Gurgaon emerged among the worst-polluted cities in the NCR in 2025, with its annual average PM2.5 concentration hovering close to 80 micrograms per cubic metre ($\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$), an analysis of CPCB data shows. That's almost double the national safe limit of 40 $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$ under India's air quality standards and many times higher

than the WHO guideline of 5 $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$. "Winters in north India trap pollutants close to the surface because of low mixing height, weak winds and frequent fog. When this combines with steady local emissions from vehicles, industries, waste burning and dust, the baseline air quality worsens. What we are seeing is a higher concentration build-up than last year," he added.

On many days, all four monitoring stations in the city reported 'poor' to 'very poor' air, with spikes linked to calmer wind conditions. The AQI touched 353 on Dec 28, 318 on Dec 29 and 326 on Dec 31. Earlier in the month, Dec 22 recorded 364, one of the highest readings this winter. Officials said Gurgaon's winter air remains a concern, especially with dust and vehicular emissions acting as major contributors.



Traffic curbs after Noida Sector 18 sees heavy footfall on NYE, Mall of India hits parking capacity early

Several commuters were left stranded due to barricades and restrictions on vehicle entry and exit in Sector 18 and DLF Mall of India due to heavy footfall on New Year's Eve. The heavy congestion in and around the area led to inconvenience for commuters. DLF parking was also found full by 4pm, and staff directed visitors to use the multilevel parking facility in Sector 18.

Suresh Kumar, a goods truck driver, said he was scheduled to deliver goods in Sector 18 but was stopped by the police and denied entry. "My employer will question me for not delivering the goods, but the fact is that the cops are not allowing entry," he said. Sunita, a resident of Noida's Sector 44, said she had visited Sector 18 in the afternoon and was returning home in the evening when she found all entry and exit points blocked. "The cops have blocked all the entry and exit points and I am stuck. I am

feeling unwell and I need to exit," she said.

Following her request, the police temporarily removed the barricades to allow her to leave before reinstalling them, a move that triggered a heated argument between the police and visitors at the spot. A traffic constable stationed at the barricade near the Gurudwara said he had been instructed to restrict both entry and exit. "I am just following orders," he said. Barricades had also been placed at the

entry gate near the Sector 18 metro station.

SK Jain, president of the Sector 18 market association, said that in previous years the traffic police used to hold meetings with the market association to discuss the implementation of restrictions during such occasions. "This year there was no meeting. The barricades will create confusion among commuters and should be placed temporarily only when required. People exiting the

market should not be stopped," he said.

Meanwhile, parking staff at DLF Mall were also deployed outside to guide visitors. Pravin Ranjan Singh, deputy commissioner of police (traffic), said the police had issued an advisory anticipating traffic pressure on New Year's Eve.

"Accordingly, we have placed barricades to restrict the movement of vehicles at some locations. Traffic police personnel have been deployed near Sector 18, DLF Mall and other areas to manage traffic, and teams have been directed to ensure proper traffic management," he said. The traffic pressure also led to jams under the Film City Flyover and at the GIP Mall and Gardens Galleria mall in the evening. Meanwhile, explaining the traffic situation in Greater Noida, Amarjeet Rathore, a resident of Gaur City, said that there was traffic pressure on Gaur Chowk in the

evening. "There are a number of shopping malls and markets nearby, and people visit them for shopping and parties.

Police bust Railway track theft gang in Muzaffarnagar

Muzaffarnagar: Mansurpur police have achieved a major breakthrough in cases related to the theft of pandrol clips from railway tracks in the district. The police have arrested three habitual thieves along with one scrap dealer who used to purchase the stolen material, successfully cracking six cases linked to railway property theft. A large quantity of stolen railway equipment, a tractor-trolley and illegal weapons have been recovered from their possession. Addressing a press conference, Sanjay Kumar Verma said that incidents of pandrol clip theft were reported on December 28 and December 31 from the Dedicated Freight Corridor and railway tracks under Mansurpur police station limits. FIRs were registered and investigations were underway. Acting on a tip-off, police conducted checking on

the night of December 31 on the road leading from NH-58 towards Begrajpur and arrested three

Jadauda village under Mansurpur police station. The scrap dealer has been identified as Praveen



thieves along with a scrap dealer involved in purchasing the stolen goods. The arrested accused have been identified as Mohit, son of Pawan Saini; Rohit, son of Nand Kishore; and Nishu, son of Chandrapal, all residents of

alias Bhura, son of Jile Singh, a resident of Bhora Khurd village under Bhora Kalan police station, Muzaffarnagar, currently residing in Janakpuri, Civil Lines. Police recovered 326 pandrol clips, a Mahindra tractor with trolley, two

illegal .315 bore country-made pistols with live cartridges, and one knife from their possession. During interrogation, the accused admitted that they would first conduct reconnaissance of railway tracks and later steal pandrol clips and metal liners during the night, selling them to scrap dealers. The stolen material was melted and sold further for illegal financial gain. Police investigations also revealed that the gang was involved in similar thefts from railway tracks in the areas of Partapur, Kankerkhera and Jani police stations in Meerut district. Further legal proceedings are underway against all the accused under relevant sections. The press conference was attended by Satyanarayan Prajapati, City SP, and Ram Ashish Yadav, CO Khatauli. The operation was carried out under the leadership of SHO Mansurpur Anand Dev Mishra and SOG Incharge Mohit Kumar.

Cities around the world welcome 2026 with thunderous fireworks and heightened security

From Sydney to Paris to New York City, crowds rang in the new year with exuberant celebrations filled with thunderous fireworks or light shows, while others took a more subdued approach. As the clock struck midnight in Japan, temple bells rang and some climbed mountains to see the year's first sunrise, while a light show with somersaulting jet skis twinkled in Dubai. The countdown to 2026 was projected onto the Arc de Triomphe in Paris, while in Moscow people celebrated in the snow.

In New York City's Times Square, revelers braved frigid temperatures to celebrate with the famed New Year's Eve ball drop. In Rio de Janeiro, revelers packed more than 4 kilometers (2 1/2 miles) of the city's Copacabana Beach for concerts and a 12-minute fireworks show, despite high tides that had both organizers and tourists worried and large waves that rocked barges carrying fireworks. Other events were more subdued. Hong Kong held limited celebrations following a recent fire at an apartment complex that killed 161 people. Australia saluted the new year with defiance less than a month after its worst mass shooting in almost 30 years.

Ball drop in New York City

Crowds bundled up against the chilly temperatures cheered and embraced as the New Year's Eve ball covered in more than 5,000 crystals descended down a pole in Times Square. Revelers wearing tall celebratory hats and light-up necklaces had waited for hours to see the 12,350-pound (5,602-kilograms) ball drop. The festivities also included Tones and I performing John Lennon's "Imagine."

India Surpasses Japan. When It May Overtake Germany As 3rd Largest Economy

Before 2025 ended, India overtook Japan to become the world's fourth-biggest economy, with officials hoping to pass Germany within the next three years, according to the government's end-of-year economic review. Data shows that India's nominal gross domestic product (GDP) has reached \$4.18 trillion, placing it in the fourth spot behind the United States, China and Germany. The official confirmation, however, depends on data due in 2026 when final annual GDP figures are released, with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) figures indicating that India will cross over Japan this year. IMF projections for 2026 put India's economy at \$4.51 trillion, compared with Japan's \$4.46 trillion.

"India is among the world's fastest-growing major economies and is well-positioned to sustain this momentum... With GDP valued at \$4.18 trillion, India has surpassed Japan to become the world's fourth-largest economy and is poised to displace Germany from the third rank in the next two-and-a-half to three years, with a projected GDP of \$7.3 trillion by 2030," the government's recently released report, titled "2025: A Defining Year for India's Growth", said. India's upbeat assessment comes despite economic worries after Washington in August hit New Delhi with huge tariffs over its purchases of Russian oil. The government asserted that India's continued growth reflects its "resilience amid persistent global trade uncertainties."

India became the world's fifth-largest economy in 2022, when its GDP overtook that of former colonial ruler Britain, according to IMF figures.

Bangladesh students party NCP hit by resignations over Jamaat tie-up

Multiple senior leaders of Bangladesh's newly formed National Citizen Party (NCP) have resigned over the past week, deepening an internal crisis triggered by the party's decision to forge an electoral alliance with the Islamist Jamaat-e-Islami ahead of the February 2026 general elections. At least eight prominent NCP leaders have formally stepped down so far, party sources and social media announcements show. Those who resigned include Tasnim Jara (senior joint member secretary), Arif Sohel and Mir Arshadul Haque (joint member secretaries), Azad Khan Bhasani (chief coordinator of the Farmers Wing), Mohammad Abul Kashem (Feni-3 nomination aspirant), Khaled Saifullah (joint convener), and Khan Muhammad Mursalin, who served as joint chief coordinator and secretary of the party's Election Steering Sub-Committee.

The resignations come amid mounting dissent within the student-led party over its tie-up with Jamaat, which was announced as part of a broader 10-party alliance for the 13th general elections. While only a handful have formally quit, nearly 30 NCP leaders, including several women leaders, have publicly opposed the alliance, warning that it contradicts the party's founding principles and the spirit of the July 2024 uprising that led to the fall of former prime minister Sheikh Hasina.

Khan Muhammad Mursalin, who announced his resignation on social media, described the Jamaat alliance as a betrayal of the movement that gave birth to the NCP. He said the party had failed to uphold the purpose of the July uprising, arguing that its "core force" was sidelined and the July Charter diluted. "The charter was compromised, weakening the uprising and forcing concessions to old political stakeholders," he wrote, calling the decision a major setback for Bangladesh's Gen Z political front.

Eight dead in US strikes on alleged drug boats: US military

Taipei, which slammed the two-day war games as "highly provocative and reckless," said the manoeuvre failed to impose a blockade on the island.

The US military said Wednesday that eight people were killed in multiple new strikes on alleged drug boats, bringing the death toll in Washington's campaign against what it says are narcotics traffickers to at least 115. US Southern Command, which is responsible for American forces operating in Central and South America, announced two sets of strikes, which were carried out on Tuesday and Wednesday.

On Tuesday, "three narco-trafficking vessels traveling as a convoy" were targeted in



"international waters," it said in a statement on X. "Three narco-terrorists aboard the first vessel were killed in the first engagement. The remaining narco-terrorists abandoned the other two vessels, jumping overboard and distancing themselves before follow-on engagements sank their respective vessels," it said. Accompanying the statement, posted

on X, was a video showing the vessels traveling together at sea and then hit by a series of explosions.

The exact location of the strikes was not immediately made clear. Previous strikes have taken place in the Caribbean or the eastern Pacific. The military said it had notified the Coast Guard to "activate the Search and Rescue system," without

offering more details about the fate of those aboard the other boats. Hours later, it issued a second statement about strikes on two more vessels conducted on Wednesday, killing five people. Again, it was not clear where the strikes took place.

Since September, the US military has carried out more than 30 such strikes on what it says are boats used to smuggle drugs to the United States, without providing any concrete evidence that the targeted boats are involved in trafficking. International law experts and rights groups say the strikes likely amount to extrajudicial killings as they have apparently targeted civilians who do not pose an immediate threat to the United States.

In recent months, US President Donald Trump has waged a pressure campaign against Venezuela's leftist President Nicolas Maduro, accusing him of running a drug cartel. Maduro denies the allegation and has accused Washington of seeking regime change to gain access to the Latin American country's massive oil reserves.

Taiwan's president pledges to defend island's sovereignty after China's military drills

Taiwanese President Lai Ching-te on Thursday vowed to defend the self-ruled island's sovereignty in the face of China's "expansionist ambitions," days after Beijing wrapped up live-fire military drills around the island. "In the face of China's rising expansionist ambitions, the international community is watching to see whether the Taiwanese people have the resolve to defend themselves," Lai said in his New Year's address. "As president, my stance has always been clear: to firmly safeguard national sovereignty, strengthen national defense and the resilience of the whole society, and comprehensively construct an effective deterrence and democratic defense mechanism," he added. Lai's comments came days after China wrapped up live-fire drills around



new leader's comments that Tokyo could intervene in the event of a Chinese attack on Taiwan. The planned arms sale, valued at more than \$11 billion, is the U.S.'s largest so far to Taiwan. It includes missiles, drones, artillery systems and military software.

The United States is obligated by its own laws to provide Taiwan with the means to defend itself. China claims the self-ruled island as its own territory and threatens to annex it, by force if necessary. China's leader Xi Jinping on Wednesday reiterated those threats in his own televised New Year's address, calling an eventual annexation "unstoppable." Taiwan last year announced a special \$40 billion budget for arms purchases, including to build an air defense system with high-level detection and interception capabilities called the Taiwan Dome.

The budget will be allocated over eight years, from 2026 to 2033, and comes after Lai already pledged to raise defense spending to 5% of the island's GDP, as part of his strategy amid China's threats of invasion. "Facing China's serious military ambitions, Taiwan has no time to wait," Lai said.


Zelensky says deal to end war '10 percent' away

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said Wednesday his country was "10 percent" away from a deal to end the war with Russia, but cautioned that the most important issues were unresolved and warned against rewarding Moscow. US-led efforts to end Europe's deadliest conflict since World War II have gained pace in recent weeks, but both sides remain at odds over the key issue of territory in a post-war settlement. Russia, which occupies around 20 percent of Ukraine, is pushing for full control of the country's eastern Donbas region as part of a deal -- but Kyiv has warned ceding ground will embolden Moscow.

In his New Year's Eve address, Zelensky said his country wanted an end to the war but not at "any cost", and that any agreement needed strong security guarantees to deter Russia from invading again.

"The peace agreement is 90 percent ready. Ten percent remains. And that is far more than just numbers," Zelensky said in the address, posted on his Telegram account. "Those are the 10 percent that will determine



the fate of peace, the fate of Ukraine and Europe," he added. Zelensky's speech came just hours after US officials, including top envoy Steve Witkoff, held a call with Ukrainian and European security advisers on the next steps to end the nearly four-year conflict. The war, now entering its fifth calendar year, has resulted in a tidal wave of destruction that has displaced millions and left entire Ukrainian cities in ruins. Believe in victory! President Vladimir Putin urged Russians to believe in victory in Ukraine during his annual New Year's Eve address, his fourth since the war began. The Russian leader has consistently told his citizens that the military intends to seize the rest of Ukrainian land he has proclaimed as Russian by force if talks fail. Addressing soldiers, whom he called "heroes", Putin said in his address: "We believe in you and our victory." The Kremlin said this week it would "toughen" its negotiating position on ending the war, after accusing Ukraine of launching dozens of drones at Putin's lakeside residence in the Novgorod region between Moscow and Saint Petersburg.

What to know about Trump administration freezing federal child care funds

The Trump administration has said it is freezing child care funds to all states until they provide more verification about the programs in a move fueled by a series of fraud schemes at Minnesota day care centers run by Somali residents. All 50 states will be impacted by the review, but the Republican administration is focusing most of its ire on the blue state of Minnesota and is calling for an audit of some of its centers. Minnesota Democratic Attorney General Keith Ellison said in a statement Wednesday that he was "exploring all our legal options to ensure that critical childcare

services do not get abruptly slashed based on pretext and grandstanding." It is unclear how much more robust the verification process for states will be than it already has been. Deputy Secretary of Health and Human Services Jim O'Neill called the decision a response to "blatant fraud that appears to be rampant in Minnesota and across the country" in a social media post announcing the change on Tuesday. Here are some things to know about these moves: More verification needed for all states to get child care funds. All 50 states will have to provide additional levels of verification and administrative data before they receive

Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz, the 2024 Democratic vice presidential nominee, said in a social media post that fraudsters are a serious issue that the state has spent years cracking down on but that this is a political move that is part of Trump's long game.

Trump joins criticism of Clooney's French passport



US President Donald Trump piled on criticism Wednesday of a decision to grant Hollywood superstar George Clooney French passports after a junior government official in Paris labelled the move a "double standard". An official decree seen by AFP on Monday showed that 64-year-old Oscar winner Clooney, his wife Amal Alamuddin Clooney and their two children had become French citizens. Trump, whose administration has backed anti-immigration parties in Europe, said that Paris was welcome to the "Ocean's Eleven" star, a long-term Democratic supporter, fundraiser and a vocal critic of the president. "Good News! George and Amal Clooney, two of the worst political prognosticators of all time, have officially become citizens of France which is, sadly, in the midst of a major crime problem because of their absolutely horrendous handling of immigration," Trump said on his Truth Social network.

The news of Clooney and his family becoming French comes ahead of language requirements for citizenship being toughened for everyone else under new

immigration rules from January 1. A junior member of President Emmanuel Macron's government had also criticised the decision to award passports despite Clooney speaking poor French. "Personally, I understand the feeling of some French people of a double standard," Marie-Pierre Vedrenne, a junior interior minister, told the France Info radio station. "We need to be careful about the message we're sending." Her boss, Interior Minister Laurent Nunez, and the foreign ministry however defended the decision. The civil code states that "French nationality may be conferred by naturalization, upon the proposal of the minister of foreign affairs, to any French-speaking foreigner who applies for it and who contributes through their distinguished service to France's influence and the prosperity of its international economic relations." But Clooney has admitted that his French remains poor despite hundreds of lessons. Under the new immigration rules from Thursday, applicants will need a certificate

showing they have a level of French that could get them into a French university. They will also have to pass a civic knowledge test. Clooney has a property in southern France and said he has hailed French privacy laws that keep his family



largely protected from international media intrusion. "I love the French culture, your language, even if I'm still bad at it after 400 days of courses," the actor told RTL radio -- in English -- in December.

His wife, an international human rights lawyer and dual UK-Lebanese national,

speaks fluent French. Meets the condition Clooney bought the Domaine du Canadel, a former wine estate, near the Provence town of Brignoles, in 2021. He said it is where his family is "happiest". Nunez, the interior minister, said he was "very happy" with the actor and his family becoming French, saying the country was lucky to have them.

The French foreign ministry said the passport allocation for the Clooneys "meets the conditions set by law" for naturalisation.

The family "followed a rigorous procedure including security investigations, regulatory naturalization interviews at the prefecture, and the payment of tax stamps," the ministry added. It highlighted the Clooneys had a French home and they "contribute through their distinguished service to France's international influence and cultural prestige" through the actor's role in the film industry.

Bridge over Kharicut Canal to close from today for demolition and rebuilding

The bridge over the Kharicut canal in the Machhunagar area of Vatva will be closed from today (January 1) for six months after it was declared "structurally unsafe" and will be demolished.

A notification was issued by the Ahmedabad Police Commissioner G S Malik for traffic diversion in the Vatva GIDC area on Tuesday. The existing 23-metre long bridge will be demolished and a new bridge is set to be built by the Gujarat Industrial Development Corporation (GIDC).

As per the police orders, the 200 metre long stretch from Ramol crossroads and Trikampura Patiya will be completely closed for all types of vehicles during these six months when the construction of the new bridge is underway.

The traffic from Vatva GIDC area will be diverted via Ramol Police Chowki, Hathijan Lal Gebi Circle towards Trikampura through alternate roads. While traffic entering Vatva GIDC from outside will be diverted from Trikampura crossroads towards GIDC using alternate internal roads. As per the notification, the bridge will be closed till June 30, 2026. Shahibaug underpass closed for 8 days

Vadodara Police keep close eye on 2-wheeler, crack down on sale & delivery of intoxicants

SEVERAL SPECIAL units of the Vadodara City Police have trained its hawk eyes on two-wheelers this New Year's Eve and the extended celebrations are expected to run into the weekend. While it may appear to be an initiative for traffic regulation, the police are especially cracking down on illicit sale and delivery of intoxicants through clandestine means.

The Prevention of Crime Branch (PCB), Special Operations Group (SOG) and the Detection of Crime Branch (DCB) on Wednesday evening fanned out in the city, especially check points to keep an eye on two-wheelers suspected to be used to privately deliver liquor and contraband in the city during New Year celebrations. The initiative is part of the police action plan to intercept those indulging in crimes under the Prohibition Law as well as NDPS.

In the past week alone, the city police have registered two offences involving delivery of liquor on two-wheelers as well as one of delivery of contraband on a two-wheeler, earlier in December. The Vadodara SOG had nabbed a man with 459 grams of ganja worth Rs 22,950 on December 6, while attempting to deliver it to a user on a two-wheeler.

On December 28, the PCB lodged a case at Gorwa police station against a person for transporting liquor on a two-wheeler worth Rs 35,120 and a second offence on December 30 at Makarpura police station, in which a suspected two-wheeler driver was intercepted in the Tarsali area and found to be in possession of a bottle of premium rum worth Rs 1,300.

Mumbai wakes up to surprise rain spells on New Year's Day, AQI at moderate level

While areas like Mulund, Andheri, Bandra, Dadar, Lower Parel, and the eastern suburbs woke up to drizzle, parts of South and Central Mumbai witnessed heavy showers for nearly 30 minutes.

Mumbai ushered in the New Year with drizzles as unseasonal showers swept pockets of the city and its neighbouring districts Thursday morning, bringing respite from the haze and suspended dust particles, as the Air Quality Index (AQI) dipped to 116. Several pockets of Mumbai, including Mulund, Andheri, Bandra, Dadar, Lower Parel, and the eastern suburbs, woke up to drizzle. Meanwhile, parts of South and Central Mumbai witnessed heavy showers for nearly 30 minutes. In the neighbouring districts, areas like Thane experienced light



rain. Mumbai has been experiencing a cool spell over the past few days, with daytime temperatures on Thursday dipping below 30

degrees Celsius. While the Santacruz observatory recorded a maximum temperature of 29.5 degree Celsius, the Colaba coastal observatory logged 29.4 degree Celsius.

Meteorologists attributed the ongoing dip in temperatures to northerly winds and an anticyclonic system, which brought cool air.

During the same period, the city also experienced reduced visibility due to slow wind speeds, leading to prolonged suspension of dust particles in the air. Until Wednesday, the AQI in Mumbai hovered around 135.

After UGC orders 'dog-free' campuses following SC warning, Pune universities say 'it is really difficult'

After the University Grants Commission (UGC) directed all higher education institutions across the country to ensure stray dogs are kept off campuses, several universities in and around Pune said that their large open campuses, staff crunch, and people's affinity towards canines make it challenging to implement the order.

In its notice, UGC also directed, in December last year, that the name of the nodal officer responsible for keeping stray dogs away should be prominently displayed at the campus entrance and notified to the local municipal or jurisdictional body.

CBI raids aides of MLA Nagendra in Karnataka's Ballari

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) on Wednesday conducted searches at the Ballari residences of the associates of Ballari Rural MLA and former Karnataka minister B Nagendra in the multi-crore Valmiki Development Corporation scam. According to official sources, a four-member CBI team raided the residence of Vishwanath, said to be a trusted aide of the former minister, on Bengaluru Road in Ballari city. However, Vishwanath was reportedly not present at the house during the search operation. In his absence, CBI officials brought his brother Mahesh to the Bruce Pet Police Station, and questioned him for several hours.

Sources said Vishwanath is part of Nagendra's inner circle and is suspected to have played a role in the alleged financial irregularities linked to the corporation. Investigators are scrutinising financial

transactions, communication records and connections among key individuals to trace the

She saved her children in a deadly crash — and went missing. Two weeks on, her family struggles for answers

Govind Kumar has been wracked with anxiety. For the last two weeks, the 52-year-old labourer from Nauranga in Uttar Pradesh's Hamirpur has been frantically searching for his wife, Parvati Devi (49), who went missing during the deadly 18-vehicle pile-up on the Yamuna Expressway on December 16. Kumar said his wife was heading to Noida on a bus with their two children, Prachi (12) and Sagar (8), when the accident occurred due to dense fog around 4am.

In a matter of minutes, 13 vehicles, including eight buses, erupted into flames. Twenty people were killed, several of them charred beyond recognition.

While the children managed to escape, pushed out by Devi, the family has no idea what happened to her.

The case has been complicated by the fact that all bodies have been identified — Devi was not among them. Her eldest son, Aakash (22), who works as a labourer in Noida, recounted the harrowing ordeal: "My mother, along with my younger brother and sister, were coming to visit me when the accident occurred... She was injured... Thick smoke had filled the bus, making it hard to breathe. She

managed to get Sagar out first, and then Prachi escaped." He said his sister was screaming, pleading with several people to help rescue their mother when the bus suddenly caught fire following an explosion. Govind and Aakash have now been criss-crossing police stations and administrative offices in Mathura, trying to convince officials that Devi was among the passengers on the ill-fated bus.

Aakash said police told the family that the matter is under investigation but have shared no concrete updates. "They called us four times and collected blood samples, hair strands, and nail clippings from Prachi and me for DNA testing. We don't know the results of these

tests," he claimed. "Do haftey key baad bhi hum log latkey huey hai... Gaon waley baatey bana rahey hai. Yeh sab se bachney key liye, sab log Noida mai mere pass reh rahey hai. (It's been two weeks and we have been left hanging... People in the village are spreading rumors. To avoid any kind of public humiliation, my entire family has left the village and is now staying with me in Noida)," he added.

Gaja Marne was arrested by the Pune

city police in connection with the February 19 attack on IT engineer Devendra Jog—also a supporter of Union Minister Murlidhar Mohol—at a Shiv Jayanti procession at Bhelke Nagar in Kothrud. Police have invoked the stringent Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA) against Marne and his gang in the case.


BMC commences scrutiny of 2,516 nominations filed; BJP candidates in wards 211 and 212 fail to submit papers

In a major upset for BJP, its candidates from ward number 211 and 212 -- Shakil Ansari and Mandakini Khamkar respectively -- did not submit their nominations papers with the returning officer.

With the process of filing nominations for the upcoming civic polls coming to a close on Wednesday, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation said that 2,516 nomination papers were filed by candidates vying to contest for 227 electoral wards across the city. On Wednesday, the civic body commenced the process for scrutiny of applications.

In a major upset for BJP, its candidates from ward number 211 and 212 — Shakil Ansari and Mandakini Khamkar respectively — did not submit their nominations papers with the returning officer. Confirming the development, an official privy to the nomination processes said, "In Prabhag number 211 and 212, we did not receive any applications of candidates from the BJP." Data furnished by the BMC showed that



between December 23 and 30 when the nominations were submitted by candidates against 11,391 forms distributed by the

officials during the same period. Records showed that the highest number of applications were filed in M/East ward (Deonar) where 182 forms were filed, followed by 133 papers submitted in K/West ward which encompasses Andheri, Lokhandwala among other pockets.

As the civic body commenced its scrutiny on Wednesday, several hopeful candidates found their forms cancelled over lacunae in filing processes. In the high-profile ward 226 of Colaba, forms of Congress and AAP candidates failed to meet the prerequisites, leaving the BJP candidate Makarand Narwekar in a fight against independent party candidates.

The scrutiny process is slated to continue until January 2, following which the BMC will release the final list of contesting candidates.

Fertile politics, failed debate

On January 5, the Congress party will launch 'save MGNREGA' movement. The rural poor need all the help they can get. MGNREGA was enacted in 2005 and has helped millions. Yet, a generation later, why is that part of India not in reasonable shape? I believe the battle over MGNREGA is, by default, political. The Bharatiya Janata Party seeks to claim another mantle of beneficence, while the Congress refuses to relinquish its legacy. Both are indirectly admitting that they have failed in their mission to improve village life substantively.

The scheme guarantees 100 days of unskilled manual work per year to every rural household. Wages vary by state: Haryana pays the highest daily wage (₹374), while Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh pay the lowest (₹234). Wages are funded entirely by the Centre, with material and administrative costs shared with the states.

Crucially, these wages are not equivalent to state-mandated minimum wages, which are higher. In Kerala, for instance, the minimum wage for construction work can exceed ₹1,000 a day. This explains why the Bilaspur Express arrives weekly in Kerala, crammed with aspirants from Chhattisgarh. This migration persists despite the ever-present risk of violence, as witnessed in the recent lynching of migrant labourer Ram Narayan. The BJP-led government is not formally 'repealing' the scheme—though it may consider excising Mahatma Gandhi from its name for political reasons. The Modi administration prefers to build parallel welfare systems, exemplified by the PM-KISAN, which provides direct cash transfers.

The popular narrative, however, suggests a simple swap is imminent—a misreading. The confusion begins with equating MGNREGA's value with PM-KISAN's ₹6,000 grant. MGNREGA is a wage programme; its annual potential is the state-specific daily wage multiplied by 100 days.

The work, in theory, involves creating public assets like ponds and roads. In practice, it is often meaningless—how many ponds can one village dig? Are new roads being built gratuitously? Are the old ones finished? Is there reliable audit? A misplaced sense of grandiosity prevents us from categorising necessary tasks like caring for the elderly, clearing waste or planting trees as 'work'. So perhaps we end up digging the same ponds.

In contrast, PM-KISAN's ₹6,000, is a fixed annual income supplement for land-owning farmers, not a wage. To mistake it for a substitute is to argue that a *jugaad* is the real thing. MGNREGA primarily serves rural households demanding manual labour. PM-KISAN supports land-owning farmer families. While their clientele overlaps for small farmers, a critical mass of India's poorest—the landless labourer—qualifies for MGNREGA but is excluded from PM-KISAN. Presenting cash transfers as a blanket replacement ignores this demographic chasm. Politically, the discourse has been simplified into a partisan clash. The Congress frames the threat as outright abolition. The BJP's rhetoric dismisses MGNREGA as a monument to Congress-era corruption while touting the 'efficiency' of direct bank transfers.

The true confrontation, however, is subtler. The government is not deleting MGNREGA from the statute books—that would be counterproductive. Instead, it is pursuing a strategy of parallel construction and asphyxiation by neglect. Politically, it pays to slowly choke a Congress-credited scheme rather than execute an immediate beheading. Equally importantly, it allows for the erection of a new welfare edifice stamped with the BJP's lotus symbol—or the face of Narendra Modi. A direct benefit transfer (DBT) means total control over the freebie. This model has administrative elegance: money moves from the treasury directly to a bank account, minimising bureaucratic intermediaries. Simultaneously, MGNREGA is likely to be subjected to budgetary constraints, chronic payment delays, and a narrative that paints it as a wasteful dole. The objective is not *repeat* but gradual marginalisation—making the DBT model so dominant that the work-based alternative seems anachronistic.

DOWN the ages, India has been the target of countless invasions. It was an old civilisation with fabled riches, and kingdoms from Central Asia, Iran, Greece, etc. were forever trying to invade and loot India. The Ghoris, the Ghaznavis, the Abdalis, the Mughals... they came through the Northwest, the Khyber Pass or through Iran and present-day Pakistan. They looted, desecrated, massacred and in general laid waste the land that was full of riches but unable to defend itself. The Mughals went a step further and put down their roots here and ruled for centuries. However, our southern states and kingdoms, thanks to their remoteness, did not suffer these invasions, nor did any come from the sea for a long time. They carried on trade with the Near and Far East; what that trade eventually brought with it was a far more deadly invader in the form of the Europeans.

The northeastern kingdoms of old (Ahom, Meitei, Kachari, Tripuri, etc.) were for long in a constant state of conflict and unrest among themselves. These ancient fault lines were accentuated by the British and the classification they imposed. Added to this was the war and conflict with the Burmese kingdom.

It is the Northeast today which I would like to focus on for it is in this relatively remote corner of the Indian sub-continent that discontent grows which, if not contained, will become a source of

major instability in the region. Nature abhors a vacuum and it is even more so when it comes to filling one of power and authority. What appears as a bushfire today when fanned by the 'elements' can become an uncontrollable blaze that could suck in vast resources and leave us weakened. It was this weakness that brought in invaders for centuries.

Today, the South is still safe except for rampant smuggling across the seas. We have the Coast Guard and the Navy to take care of this problem. The North and the Northwest have the continuing challenge of Pakistan across the Line of Control and China in Ladakh. Here the battle lines are old, and the people and our defence forces are used to the ebb and flow of the troubling tides of the invaders and infiltrators. Not to say that it isn't a dynamically evolving challenge, but one that perhaps

over time has been constant in its presence. Coming to the Northeast, we must recognise the urgent and imminent danger of what we are likely to face on this front. For here today we have an unstable Myanmar as a neighbour, along with Bangladesh, an erstwhile friend but now very hostile to us. Regular statements are being given by senior ministers of the Bangladesh government for the need to isolate the northeastern states in India by fuelling insurgency and taking China's assistance.

established. In the meantime, there have been reports of various ULFA elements moving base from China to Bangladesh and teaming up with other such forces. These elements would also encourage the remnants of such movements in West Bengal, Assam, Mizoram, Manipur and Tripura. We already have internal problems in the states which have aggravated in recent years.

For instance, Manipur has been torn apart due to the historical differences between the Meiteis and the hill tribes — Kukis, Nagas, etc. These hill tribes are also spread out in Mizoram, Meghalaya and Nagaland.

There is incessant violence in Manipur and a huge presence of the Army, paramilitary forces and the police. This problem needs to be resolved, and the forces should be given a clear plan of action. There are refugee camps in Mizoram, Meghalaya and Nagaland, indicating sympathy for the displaced tribes. Adding to the problem is the likelihood of internal insurrections creeping up again with the active help of Pakistan, Bangladesh, China and Myanmar. It should be remembered that these insurrections earlier had the support of the people. Normal political activity remained suspended in these areas for a long time, and it took decades of efforts by the military, diplomatic and civil administrations to bring these under control. Political action was made possible due to the joint efforts of these organisations. There are still some retired Army, civilian and police officers who remember many horror stories of those times. Much blood has already flowed over the decades — blood of our security

personnel and our people living in these states. Let us now bring all our resources of the polity and civil society to bear on this problem lest we have to again take resort to arms. Let us face the enemy resolutely in whatever way is deemed fit, but let us not allow it to build on its mischievous designs.

The linking of Pakistan, Bangladesh, Myanmar and China is a fact and not a figment of the imagination. If not checked now, this will link up with the rebel forces and the situation will become even worse. Let us also remember that the US today pursues its own strategy — whether our interests align or not is of no consequence to the Americans. The time to act is now. Are we willing to recognise the challenge and meet it four-square? As Shakespeare wrote, "There is a tide in the affairs of men, which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune..."



Unnao rape: Onus on Supreme Court to ensure justice

The Tribune Editorial: The Delhi High Court's order suspending Sengar's life term and granting conditional bail — till the pendency of his appeal challenging his conviction and sentence in the rape case — has triggered resentment.

THE Unnao rape survivor has pinned her hopes on the Supreme Court, which is set to hear the CBI's plea against the suspension of ex-MLA Kuldeep Singh Sengar's life sentence. This is not merely a procedural battle — it is a test of whether the justice delivery system can convincingly demonstrate that the rule of law applies equally to the powerful and the powerless. The Delhi High Court's order suspending Sengar's life term and granting conditional bail — till the pendency of his appeal challenging his conviction and sentence in the rape case — has triggered resentment. The CBI has referred to the SC verdict in the LK Advani case (1997), in which the court ruled that anyone who holds a public office, be it an MP or an MLA, would be deemed a public servant. The probe agency has contended that the high court erred by declaring that Sengar, a sitting legislator



when the crime was committed in 2017, was not a public

servant to be prosecuted under certain provisions of the POCSO (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences) Act. The case is intertwined with allegations of intimidation, custodial death and prolonged harassment of the survivor's family. In such circumstances, judicial decisions are not only about legal technicalities but also the message they send to society — especially to victims of sexual violence. The CBI's argument that holders of public office carry heightened responsibility is persuasive, legally as well as morally. A narrow interpretation of the law risks reinforcing the perception that political power can undermine accountability.

Equally troubling is the victim's unending ordeal. Her allegation that the investigating officer colluded with Sengar cannot be brushed aside. A zero-tolerance approach is the way forward for the judiciary, which must prioritise the need to protect rape survivors and uphold public trust.

G-Ram-G Act delivers a body blow to federalism

guarantee could not depend on the fiscal health of individual states. But the new law has conveniently passed the fiscal burden in a 60:40 ratio to the states. Any spending beyond the Centre's fixed allocation will now be borne entirely by states. So, my simple question is — how does the Centre expect poor states to shell out money from their own pockets to finance wages? If states have to fund a sizeable proportion of the remuneration, the most prudent course for them would be to cut the workforce rather than increase it. States will certainly not think of expanding the programme, they will try to limit it instead. MGNREGA was built as a demand-driven, open-ended programme. If a worker demanded employment, the State was legally bound to provide it

within 15 days or pay an unemployment allowance. But now, as per the new law, employment is no longer triggered by demand but by Central notifications and normative allocations, an unjustified and absolute discretion by virtue of which the rulers in Delhi will decide if a rural household in Jharkhand, Odisha or Tamil Nadu deserves to get employment, and for how long. MGNREGA empowered gram panchayats and gram sabhas as it tasked them with the planning and implementation of works. During the UPA rule, local communities were encouraged to participate and choose what works were relevant in their context, but under the new legislation the entire scheme will be monitored by a national council with very elaborate technological tools

such as GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping, biometrics and AI-assisted audits. While technological advancements will significantly improve transparency, limiting local inputs will cripple grassroots governance.

The risk of implementing this scheme is most acute in Punjab due to the severe fiscal strain it is already under. Punjab's outstanding public debt has crossed Rs 4 lakh crore, with a debt-to-GSDP ratio of roughly 45 per cent, making it among the most indebted states in India.

Under MGNREGA, Punjab's ability to provide rural employment was insulated. But now, under the new law, every additional day of work will become a budgetary liability compounding woes for our treasury. When employment generation becomes contingent on a state's borrowing capacity rather than on citizens' needs, the constitutional promise of cooperative federalism is diluted. The introduction of mandatory pauses of up to 60 days during the peak agricultural season to be notified season-wise and area-wise further reduces access precisely when rural households need it.

While the intent may be to avoid labour shortage in agriculture, the blanket imposition of such pauses undermines the flexibility that made MGNREGA responsive to local realities.

The success of MGNREGA was not in its execution but in its ideals — that dignity of work is a right, not a discretionary grant; that the Centre must shoulder responsibility for national guarantees; and that local governments must have a meaningful say in planning and implementation. Any 'upgrade' or 'step up' that undermines such ideals needs careful reconsideration.

A stronger rural employment framework is undoubtedly needed. But strength does not lie in centralisation alone. It lies in trusting states, empowering local institutions and preserving the enforceability of rights. For Punjab, and for India's federal balance, that distinction will make all the difference.

The new rural employment law was a bone of contention during the recent Winter Session of Parliament. While the NDA government is going all guns blazing to claim that the Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission Gramin (VB G-RAM-G) Act is a 'step up' from the two-decade-old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), here's a breakdown of how the new Act is indeed a 'step up' — in terms of uncertainty and delivering a body blow to federalism. Back in 2005, when the Manmohan Singh-led UPA government enacted MGNREGA, it did something that had never happened before in the domain of public policy in India. A welfare promise was made a justiciable right — a rather bold and exemplary move for a developing nation. Employment was not a favour extended by the State, but a legal guarantee that rural citizens could demand whenever they wanted, and the government was mandated to provide it. The VB G-RAM-G Act marks a decisive departure from that philosophy. It is not the citizen but the Centre that decides where, when and how employment will be provided — and to whom.

Among the most vociferous arguments made by the NDA in the new law's favour is the increase in the number of days for which work will be provided. While MGNREGA guaranteed 100 days of work per rural household, the new law promises 125 workdays, translating into 25 per cent increased financial security at first glance. While on paper this looks like an obvious, glossy upgrade, in reality the new Act is a conditional scheme without the same enforceable right. It is a discretionary law that can be expanded or withdrawn at the convenience of the government in power. So, don't be mistaken — there is no guarantee whatsoever. Hence the increase in the number of workdays becomes irrelevant. The old Act ensured that the Centre bore 100 per cent of the wage cost, as it recognised that a national employment

Air India pilot offloaded after smell test just before takeoff in Canada

An Air India flight from Vancouver to Delhi was delayed on December 23, 2025, after Canadian authorities questioned a pilot's fitness for duty. The airline replaced the pilot and launched an investigation, stating safety is its top priority.

New Delhi.(Agency)
An Air India pilot was offloaded before take-off in Vancouver on December 23 after Canadian authorities raised concerns over a suspected "smell," prompting further checks. The incident, which took place on December 23, 2025, resulted in a delay for passengers on board flight AI186. According to reports, a staffer at the Vancouver airport allegedly saw the pilot "sipping on wine" or buying liquor, following which the employee to the authorities. In response, a breathalyser test was conducted, in which he failed, leading to his offloading from the flight. Canadian officials specifically cited concerns over the pilot's ability to perform duties safely, following which the individual was taken for further enquiry.

"In accordance with safety protocols, an alternate pilot was rostered to operate the flight," an airline spokesperson said, adding that process of identifying and assigning a replacement pilot required additional time, contributing to the overall delay of the flight. Despite the inconvenience, the airline reiterated that these steps were necessary to ensure all safety requirements were met before takeoff.

Air India apologised for the inconvenience and affirmed its cooperation with Canadian officials. "Air India regrets the inconvenience caused to its passengers and is fully cooperating with the local authorities," the spokesperson said.

Passengers were provided with refreshments and support during the wait, and the airline assured them that their safety and comfort remained a priority throughout the incident.

Pending the outcome of the ongoing investigation, the pilot has been removed from flying duties, Air India confirmed. "Air India maintains a zero-tolerance policy towards any violation of applicable rules and regulations."

Cigarette, Beedi, Pan Masala To Be Costlier From Feb 1 With New Tax, Cess

The new levies on tobacco and pan masala will be over and above the GST rate, and will replace the compensation cess which is currently being levied on such sin goods.

The government on Wednesday notified February 1 as the date from which additional excise duty will be levied on tobacco products, and a new cess on pan masala. The new levies on tobacco and pan masala will be over and above the GST rate, and will replace the compensation cess which is currently being levied on such sin goods.

From February 1, pan masala, cigarettes, tobacco and similar products will attract a GST rate of 40 per cent, while beedis will attract 18 per cent Goods and Services Tax



(GST), according to a government notification.

On top of this, a Health and National Security Cess will be levied on pan masala, while tobacco and related products will attract additional excise duty.

The Finance Ministry on Wednesday also notified the Chewing Tobacco, Jarda Scented Tobacco and Gutkha Packing Machines (Capacity Determination and Collection of Duty) Rules, 2026.

Parliament had in December approved two Bills allowing levy of the new Health and National Security Cess on pan masala manufacturing and excise duty on tobacco.

India's cleanest city continued to grapple with a contaminated water crisis on New Year's Day after a six-month-old infant died in Madhya Pradesh's Indore. The water contamination crisis in Indore's Bhagirathpura has claimed over seven lives and led to nearly 150 hospitalisations. However, locals claim the toll to be far higher. On Wednesday, Sunil Sahu claimed that his six-month-old son started vomiting and developed symptoms of diarrhoea after consuming milk mixed with contaminated water. Sahu claimed the infant's condition deteriorated, and he died on Thursday despite medical treatment. The incident happened in the Marathi Mohalla. For days, residents have

complained of dirty and foul-smelling water supply.

The family said the child was born after nearly 10 years of medical treatment. Sahu said his



wife, Sadhna, was bedridden during the pregnancy period due to gynaecological complications.

Speaking to India Today, Sadhna said due to

health complications, she was forced to feed the baby packaged milk mixed with water. She claimed that the water was contaminated, which eventually led to the death of her child. The family further alleged that their 10-year-old daughter has also been frequently complaining of stomach pain. "I have lost my child. I don't know how many more children will suffer due to this dirty water," a teary-eyed Sadhna said.

SEWER LEAKAGE BEHIND CRISIS?

The Madhya Pradesh health department said at least 149 people have fallen ill after consuming contaminated water in the area. Chief Minister Mohan Yadav is

scheduled to visit the affected family on Thursday. However, local reports claim more than 1,100 people have been affected in Bhagirathpura. A preliminary probe

suggested that drain water entered the drinking water pipeline due to leakage. Indore draws its water from the River Narmada through pipelines.

"Sewer leakages lead to such incidents, will ensure such negligence will be avoided in future," Chief Minister Yadav said. So far, the state has suspended a zonal officer from the civic body and an assistant engineer in Bhagirathpura. On Thursday, Minister Kailash Vijayvargiya announced a compensation of Rs 2 lakh each to the families of those who have died.

"The number of patients arriving has decreased since yesterday. Since last night, 60 patients have arrived... This is a settlement of economically weaker sections, so we have ensured that no one has to spend money on treatment," he said.

Vijayvargiya said the source of the contaminated water had been identified and urged residents to boil water before consuming.

New Year Celebrations Sweep Across India Amid Tight Security

India welcomed the New Year with grand celebrations, countdown parties and festive gatherings, as state governments across the country stepped up security measures to ensure that the celebrations passed off smoothly and without incident.

In major metropolitan cities, including Delhi and Mumbai, large crowds thronged iconic landmarks such as India Gate, Connaught Place and Marine Drive to usher in the New Year, creating a vibrant and festive atmosphere.

Meanwhile, authorities across the country issued traffic advisories, guidelines for restaurants and hotels, and deployed additional security forces in anticipation of massive footfall in public places.

Despite chilling conditions in Delhi, Connaught Place and Vasant Vihar saw a steady influx of revellers, with families and groups gathering in markets and open spaces ahead of the New Year celebrations.

Speaking to IANS in Connaught Place, a tourist said, "I have come from Punjab to celebrate the New Year here, and I hope this year is good for everyone."

"It is cold, but we are happy to welcome 2026 here with our friends," another said. Officials said that in areas expecting heavy crowds in the national capital, the police put comprehensive security arrangements in place to prevent any untoward incidents and to maintain law and order.

Security arrangements on the ground in Delhi were closely monitored by several senior officials, including six Assistant Commissioners of Police and one Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police. As many as 1,469 police personnel were deployed across Delhi's West District alone to ensure public safety during the celebrations. In Rajasthan, stringent traffic safety measures were also implemented, including the setting up of checkpoints, inspection of vehicles and strict action against those found driving under the influence of alcohol. In Maharashtra, eateries, restaurants, hotels, orchestra bars and pubs were permitted to operate till 5 a.m. on January 1 as part of the New Year celebrations. In Bengaluru, around 20,000 police personnel were deployed to ensure smooth New Year's Eve celebrations, as more than ten lakh people were expected to gather at various locations across the city for the festivities.

Even as people in the eastern parts of the world began bidding farewell to 2025, popular hill destinations such as Shimla and Manali witnessed a huge rush of tourists and revellers, braving the biting cold to ring in the New Year amid the mountains.

Commercial LPG Cylinder Price Hiked By Rs 111, Domestic Rates Unchanged

Following the price hike, the retail sale price of a 19 kg commercial LPG cylinder in Delhi now stands at Rs 1,691.50.

The price of commercial LPG cylinders has been increased with effect from Thursday, January 1, bringing some pressure on costs to hotels, restaurants and other commercial users at the start of the new year. Oil marketing companies have raised the price of the 19 kg commercial LPG gas cylinder by Rs 111 with immediate effect. Following this revision, the retail sale price of a 19 kg commercial LPG cylinder in Delhi now stands at Rs 1,691.50. Along with the increase in commercial LPG rates, the prices of 5 kg Free Trade LPG (FTL) cylinders have also been raised. The cost of the 5 kg FTL cylinder has gone up by Rs 27, effective January 1. However, there is relief for household consumers as there has been no change



in the prices of domestic LPG cylinders. The rates of the 14.2 kg domestic LPG cylinder remain unchanged, providing stability in component of their operating costs. The unchanged domestic LPG prices, meanwhile, ensure that household budgets are not impacted by the latest revision. In August, Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri hailed the Centre's recent decision to pay Rs 30,000 crores to oil companies in 12 parts, which has kept prices of Liquefied Petroleum Gas stable in the country.

The Union Cabinet, on August 8, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved a compensation of Rs 30,000 crore to be paid in twelve parts to oil companies that have kept LPG prices stable despite global uncertainty. The new rates of commercial cylinder are applicable from January 1 and will remain in force until further revision by oil marketing companies.

Centre's Fiscal Deficit Crosses 62% Of Full-Year Budget Target In November

The Centre's fiscal deficit at the end of November stood at Rs 9.76 lakh crore, or 62.3 per cent of the annual budget target for 2025-26, compared to 52.5 per cent in the year-ago period, according to government data released on Wednesday.

The Centre estimates the fiscal deficit (the gap between expenditure and revenue) during 2025-26 at 4.4 per cent of GDP, or Rs 15.69 lakh crore. According to data released by the Controller and Auditor General of India (CAG), the central government received Rs 19.49 lakh crore (55.7 per cent of the corresponding BE 2025-26 of total receipts) up to November 2025.

This comprised Rs 13,93,946 crore of tax revenue (net to Centre), Rs 5,16,366 crore of non-tax revenue and Rs 38,927 crore of non-debt capital receipts.

CGA data showed Rs 9,36,561 crore was transferred to state governments as devolution of share of taxes by the Centre during the period, a rise of Rs 1,24,498 crore year-on-year. The total expenditure incurred by the Centre was Rs 29.26 lakh crore (57.8 per cent of the corresponding BE 2025-26), out of which Rs 22,67,700 crore was on revenue account and Rs 6,58,210 crore on capital account. Out of the total revenue expenditure, Rs 7,45,765 crore was towards interest payments and Rs 2,88,333 crore on account of major subsidies.

Commenting on the data, Aditi Nayar, Chief Economist with Icra, said the rating agency anticipates a shortfall of Rs 1.5 lakh crore in the Centre's gross tax revenues in the current fiscal relative to the FY2025-26 budget estimate (BE).

"Overall, we expect the potential miss on the taxes side to be offset by higher-than-budgeted non-tax revenues and sizeable expenditure savings."

Injured players like Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Tim David are included in the preliminary squad for the tournament. Cummins is currently recovering from a back injury and played only the third Ashes Test in Adelaide. The Test and ODI skipper is set to undergo a scan in January that will determine his availability for the T20 World Cup. David sustained a hamstring injury during a Big Bash League match on Boxing Day, while fast bowler Hazlewood missed the five-match Test series against England due to Achilles soreness after a hamstring injury. "Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Tim David are tracking well and we are confident they will be available for the World Cup. This is a preliminary squad so should changes need to be made they will be ahead of the support period," Chair



of selectors George Bailey said. All-rounder Cooper Connolly has also been included in the squad. He didn't play in the series against South Africa, New Zealand or India in 2025 and featured in just six T20Is. But has made a great start in the BBL for Perth Scorchers, scoring 170 runs at a strike-rate of 166.66 and also taking five wickets with an economy of 7.62. Mitchell Owen and Ben Dwarshuis missed out on the selection, while the selectors have also not included a second wicketkeeper option in the squad. Mitchell Marsh will lead the side, while Adam Zampa, Glenn Maxwell, Matthew Short, Matthew Kuhne, and Cooper Connolly are the spin bowling options. The Aussies will start their World Cup campaign on February 11 against Ireland, followed by group matches against Zimbabwe, Sri Lanka and Oman in Sri Lanka. They are also scheduled to play three T20I matches in Pakistan in late January as preparation for the World Cup.

Lalremsiami nominated for Arjuna Award

However, none of this would have been possible had it not been for the likes of Miss Btei, who trained her at SAI Hockey Centre in Thenzawl, Mizoram. Later, she also trained at the National Hockey Academy in New Delhi. And these days whenever she isn't playing or isn't training in Bengaluru, she tries her best to give back to the community by training the kids in Mizoram.

2026: Sports-heavy year and aspirations

For India, 2026 assumes great significance because two of the most important multi-disciplinary events after the Olympics — Asian and Commonwealth Games — are scheduled in next 10 months. Indraneel Das tries to understand aspirations and expectation from sports federations for 2026...

In sports parlance, there is no respite. The year 2026 is going to be a sports-heavy mind-boggling year that would give fans hardly any time to resuscitate. The year will begin with the Hockey India League (HIL), India Open badminton, T20 Men's World Cup followed by the ever-popular Indian Premier League until summer. This will be followed by planet's most-watched and followed sport — football World Cup in the US, Canada and Mexico. The Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, badminton world championships,

the regular dose of football leagues, the F1, tennis Grand Slams... The list goes on (please see our calendar). It's a heady year. For India, the year 2026 also assumes significance because of two of the most important multi-disciplinary events after the Olympics — Asian and Commonwealth Games. The sports ministry in consultation with the Indian Olympic Association has decided to send a full-fledged team to the Asian Games because there are non-Olympic sports where India can win more medals. There are other reasons too. The truncated Commonwealth Games in Glasgow from July 23 to August 2 would have been just another Games, had it not been for India hosting it in 2030 at Ahmedabad. There will be just 10 disciplines this time because of lack of budget and also time since Glasgow agreed to host after Victoria withdrew and other nations like Malaysia did not show interest. Of the 10 sports — athletics, swimming, basketball (3x3), netball, boxing, gymnastics, lawn bowls, track cycling, weightlifting, and judo (integrated with para-sports) — India are good in select sports. India dominated in weightlifting and won medals in boxing, lawn bowls, athletics and judo.

When it comes to Asian Games, India would want to show their continental supremacy in certain sports. Ahead of the Los Angeles

Games in 2028, the stage would be perfect for players to test themselves and move ahead. For National Sports Federations and the Sports Authority of India, the monitoring and funding agency, it will be the best platform to assess and bring in changes as



required. One medal every event at Asiad for shooters

Shooting has been on an upwards curve and would be the sport to watch out for this year as well. Going by the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI) High Performance Manager Ronak Pandit, at least one medal in every event India participates would be the goal. In fact, shooting was one sport where the country excelled. Ronak says that it is a reflection of the process that has been in place for a while. For 2026, the bar

has been set a bit higher and he hopes by the end of the year at least four shooters qualify for the Olympics. "We have been doing quite well in Asian Games and going by our form in the last year, I would be hoping that India win medals in every event they participate,"

he tells this daily. He says that the trial process for the Asian Games will start from January and will continue till May.

"This is an extremely important year because the Asian Games and the quota competition and World Championships both are in this year (end of the year). But it is very important that in the beginning you have to maintain your form so that you actually qualify to be in the team. First half of the year, you have to be in form to make it to the Asian Games. And second half of the year, you have to actually perform and deliver medals and Olympic quotas." Ronak believes with last year's work, everyone is quite prepared technically. "It's all about trusting whatever you've learnt and stick to a plan and planning is going to be extremely crucial this year," he says. As for his aspiration, he says, "I would like nothing less than a medal in every event in the Asian Games. In most of the Olympic events, we should win two medals in one event, like in the World Cup final and the World Championships also."

Real Madrid's Kylian Mbappe sidelined with knee injury, doubtful for Supercopa

Real Madrid suffered a massive setback on New Year's Eve as French forward Kylian Mbappe was ruled out of the club's LaLiga clash against Real Betis, and is also doubtful for next week's Spanish Supercopa semifinal against Atletico Madrid. Mbappe suffered a sprained left knee in training, and according to the French publication L'Equipe, the forward is expected to be unavailable for at least three weeks. The Los Blancos will travel to Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, for the Supercopa semifinal against Atletico Madrid on January 9, ahead of a potential final against Barcelona or Athletic Club on January 11. Marca also reported that Mbappe might not travel with the team for the Supercopa semifinal in Saudi Arabia. His return for a Copa del Rey Round of 16 match the following week is also in doubt. The French international is currently the top scorer in LaLiga with 18 goals, and has also started in all 18 games of the season, so far.

He missed Madrid's Champions League clash



against Manchester City on December 19, but played for 90 minutes in the next three games leading up to Christmas. Earlier this month, he equalled Cristiano Ronaldo's club record with his 59th goal in the calendar year.

Real Madrid confirm Mbappe's injury

The club also released a statement, confirming that Mbappe suffered a sprain in his left knee and his progress will be monitored. Following tests carried out today by the Real Madrid Medical Services on our player Kylian Mbappé, he has been diagnosed with a sprain in his left knee. His progress will be monitored," the club said in a brief statement on its official website. Mbappe's injury is a massive setback for the Los Blancos as they are currently trailing LaLiga table toppers Barcelona by four points. Madrid have 42 points in 18 matches, while Barcelona have 46 points in 18 LaLiga Games.

Vaishnavi Sharma has the makings of a star

Vaishnavi Sharma made her India debut in the first T20I versus Sri Lanka at Visakhapatnam on December 21, but her first real statement in national colours came on Sunday in Thiruvananthapuram. Two wickets for 24 runs in a match that saw 412 runs scored across 40 overs. On a placid surface and with a wet ball in hand, the 20-year-old left-arm spinner from Gwalior quietly carved a niche for herself. Making an impact in her debut series was perhaps written in the stars for the daughter of an astrologer. In a match where the more celebrated Sree Charan struggled to find her rhythm, conceding 1 for 46 in four overs, Vaishnavi, playing her maiden international series, delivered her best performance so far. Her economical bowling and five wickets in the series has seen her emerge as a potential future star post the women's team's ODI World Cup triumph last month. For her father, Dr Narendra Sharma, also a PhD in psychology, watching from home in Gwalior, his daughter's journey to the Indian team seems predestined. When Vaishnavi was born, Sharma studied her horoscope closely. What he saw then, he

says, shaped her career path. "When Vaishnavi was born, I made her horoscope. In her horoscope, there were strong indications for sports and also for becoming



a doctor," he says. "Had she chosen medicine, the whole city would have known her. But had she chosen sports, the whole world would know her," Sharma told relatives and neighbours made a beeline for the Sharma household to watch Vaishnavi play for India in the four T20 Internationals, two in Visakhapatnam and three in Thiruvananthapuram.

"Neighbours and relatives were around, the house was full. Everyone was happy," Sharma said. India captain Harmanpreet Kaur was eager for Vaishnavi to succeed.

"We were all waiting for that (Vaishnavi's) maiden wicket. Even though in the last game there were a few missed chances, today she bowled a very crucial over and picked up two wickets," Harmanpreet Kaur said this after the win in the second match in Visakhapatnam. After her horoscope showed the way, Sharma decided cricket was the sport for Vaishnavi and her older brother Ashendra. "So when we decided to put her into sports, we chose cricket," Sharma adds. "From the age of four, her mother, her brother, and I started coaching her ourselves. I used to teach my son so that my daughter would feel motivated," he says. When the family lived in Gwalior's Sindhi Colony, Sharma took her to nearby grounds daily. That approach continued even when formal training began. Vaishnavi joined the Tansen Cricket Academy in 2021-22, a decision her father says was taken to provide structure and regular access to facilities.

Lovkesh Chaudhary, the coach at the academy, remembers seeing Vaishnavi when she was seven or eight years old, when her father first brought her to him. The early impression remains vivid.

In the last three men's ICC events, India have been head and shoulders above the chasing pack. While they won two tournaments, staying unbeaten, their only loss in the 2023 home World Cup came in the final. In a month, they will gear up for another World Cup at home, this one in the T20 format. No team has ever before defended the title.

While it speaks about the magnitude of the challenge, India also has a chance to do what no Indian side has done before. For a team that is spoken about as the best, they haven't won two successive World Cups. With a

dominant squad on paper, India have a golden opportunity in their hands to match what West Indies did in the 1970s, and Australia did in the 2000s. Getting to do it at home would make it all the more special.

Building on history

Djokovic puts hopes on modern science. If you don't want Novak Djokovic to win his record 25th Slam in 2026, you can't be a true tennis fan. But can the 38-year-old break the Sinner-Alcaraz duopoly? If you doubt the Serb you can't be a true tennis fan. After a Slam-less year, Djokovic is reconstructing his team to further push his already stretched aging body. Joining it is Dr. Mark Kovacs, a new-age holistic sports coach whose website calls him a "performance expert in the area of optimising human performance through the application of cutting edge, evidence-based information". Djokovic's biggest challenge is to play 7 best-of-five Slam matches. So if modern science can help his body last the distance, the mind can do the rest. The Serb has hinted that the Australian Open could be his last Slam. If you are a true fan, you know those are just mind games.

New GST rates for sin goods from Feb 1! Tobacco & pan masala to attract 40% tax - check details

Tobacco products and pan masala products are set to face a new tax structure from February 1. This comes as the Centre rolls out additional excise duty and a health cess, above the current GST rates. The new structure will replace the compensation cess which is applied on 'sin goods.' Tobacco and allied products will now attract an additional excise duty while pan masala will have a Health and National Security Cess. As per a government notification, pan masala, cigarettes, tobacco and similar products will be taxed at 40% under the Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime. Meanwhile, biris will attract an 18% GST rate. These GST rates will continue, but new levies will now be imposed separately. The finance ministry also notified the Chewing Tobacco, Jarda Scented Tobacco and Gutkha Packing Machines (Capacity Determination and Collection of Duty) Rules, 2026. The rules lay down the framework for determining production capacity and collecting duty from manufacturers of chewing tobacco and related products. The move follows Parliament's approval in December of two Bills that cleared the way for the new cess on pan masala manufacturing and the excise duty on tobacco products.

FIEO welcomes Centre's MAS intervention to boost global market access for exporters

The Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO) on Wednesday welcomed the Government of India's launch of the Market Access Support (MAS) Intervention under the Export Promotion Mission (EPM).

The FIEO stated that the move will strengthen India's export competitiveness by improving structured access to global markets, particularly for MSMEs and first-time exporters.

Approved by the union Cabinet on November 12, the MAS Intervention provides targeted financial and institutional support for buyer-seller meets, international trade fairs and exhibitions, reverse buyer-seller meets in India, and trade delegations to priority and emerging markets. The scheme is being implemented under the NIRYAT DISHA sub-scheme of the Export Promotion Mission.

In a statement, FIEO President S C Ralhan said the initiative marks a shift towards predictable and outcome-oriented export



promotion, addressing long-standing market access challenges faced by smaller exporters.

He noted that the provision of a three-to-five-year advance calendar of international events will improve

planning certainty for exporters and trade bodies, while mandatory MSME participation will help broaden India's export base.

Under the framework, the government has rationalised financial support ceilings and

cost-sharing ratios, with preferential treatment for priority sectors and markets.

Exporters with overseas shipments of up to 775 lakh in the previous year will also be eligible for partial airfare support, aimed at encouraging participation of new and small exporters in overseas trade events.

The scheme is fully digitised through the trade.gov.in portal, enabling online approvals, feedback, lead tracking and outcome measurement.

Industry bodies said this is expected to improve transparency, reduce transaction time and align export promotion activities with measurable business outcomes. FIEO also welcomed the introduction of proof-of-concept and product demonstration support for technology-driven sectors, stating that the MAS Intervention could play a key role in enhancing buyer engagement, market diversification and integration of Indian exporters into global value chains.

Tata Group sells off entire stake in Taj GVK Hotels to promoter shareholder

Tata Group-owned Indian Hotels Company Limited (IHCL), which runs the Taj chain of hotels, has informed the stock exchange in a regulatory filing that it has sold off its entire 25.52% stake in Taj GVK Hotels & Resorts Ltd to its executive director and promoter-shareholder Shalini Bhupal for Rs 592 crore. IHCL stated in its filing that it sold its 25.52% stake, which equals 1.6 crore shares, to Shalini Bhupal for Rs 370 per share, officially ending its ownership relationship with Taj GVK Hotels & Resorts. Following the transaction, a termination agreement was executed between Shalini Bhupal, G Indira Krishna Reddy, Blue Moon Trust, Moonshot Trust, Starlight Trust, IHCL, and IHCL.

Consequently, the amended shareholders' agreement dated November 4, 2011, and the name and trademark license agreement dated November 22, 2007, between the company and IHCL, stand terminated, with all rights and obligations under both agreements cancelled and



annulled. Accordingly, IHCL's nominee directors have stepped down from the board of Taj GVK Hotels & Resorts Ltd, effective December 30, 2025. Taj GVK Hotels & Resorts Ltd will now take necessary steps to change its corporate name by dropping the name 'Taj' from its corporate name in accordance with the termination agreement and adopt a new identity. IHCL clarified that it will continue operating the existing hotels under the current hotel operating agreements already in place. Following the stake sale, IHCL, Shalini Bhupal, members of the GVK promoter family and the company signed a termination agreement. Under this agreement, two key arrangements have been cancelled, the shareholders' agreement signed in 2011 and the name and trademark license agreement signed in 2007. Earlier in December 2025, Tata Group-owned IHCL had announced that it would convert its joint venture with the GVK-Bhupal family into a long-term management model. The GVK-Bhupal family, which holds a 74.99% stake, will continue as the promoter of the company.

These measures will replace the GST compensation cess, which is currently charged at varying rates on sin products. From February 1, pan masala, tobacco and similar products will attract a GST rate of 40

per cent, while biris will be taxed at 18 per cent under the GST framework. In addition to GST, a Health and National Security Cess will be levied on pan masala. Tobacco and tobacco-related products will attract an additional



excise duty, as notified by the Finance Ministry. The Finance Ministry on Wednesday also notified the Chewing Tobacco, Jarda Scented Tobacco and Gutkha Packing Machines (Capacity Determination and Collection of Duty) Rules, 2026. Cigarette Excise Duty Hike: ITC Stock Declines To 21-Month Low On Block Deal, Tariff Rise

New Delhi.(Agency)

Shares of ITC Ltd slipped to their lowest level in nearly two years on Thursday, January 1, weighed down by the government's notification of higher taxation on cigarettes and tobacco products, along with a large block deal in the counter. The decline followed a notification by the Finance Ministry that cigarettes, tobacco and bidis will attract an effective 40% GST from February 1, 2026. This includes the standard 28% GST rate, with excise duty and National Calamity Contingent Duty (NCCD) being subsumed into the new structure. Market participants are now assessing whether the move results in any additional cess or duty and what the overall tax burden on cigarettes will look like once the changes come into force. Sentiment was further hit by a sizeable block deal executed earlier in the session, where more than 4 crore shares of ITC

changed hands. The transaction represented around 0.3% of the company's outstanding equity. Shares were traded at an average price of about Rs 400 apiece, taking the total deal



value to Rs 1,614.5 crore. Cigarettes remain a key profit driver for ITC. In the September quarter, the segment accounted for nearly 48% of the company's total revenue. Cigarette business revenue rose 6.7% year-on-year to Rs 8,722 crore, while volumes

increased 6%, broadly in line with market expectations, which had pegged volume growth in the 5-6% range. The stock was trading 7.95% lower at Rs 370.06 as of 11:05 am on Thursday, January 1, 2026. ITC shares have fallen about 12% in 2025, marking their first year of negative returns since 2020. Thursday's decline pushed the stock back to levels last seen in March 2024 and marked its sharpest single-day fall in more than eight months. Shares of Godfrey Phillips India on Thursday also tumbled nearly 10% to trade at Rs 2,488 apiece on the NSE, as of 10:55 am. Godfrey Phillips India shares fell around 12 percent in the past five days, and around 16 percent in the past six months. The stock however jumped 48 percent in 2025. Its P/E ratio stands at 43.45, and market capitalisation at Rs 38,864 crore.

The new year has begun with a spike in fuel costs, as the government on Wednesday increased the price of 19-kg commercial LPG cylinders by Rs 111, effective January 1. The hike is expected to push up operating costs for hotels, restaurants and small businesses across the country. Following the revision, a 19-kg commercial LPG cylinder in Delhi now costs Rs 1,691.50, up from Rs 1,580.50. Prices have risen to Rs 1,795 in Kolkata from Rs 1,684, while in Mumbai, the rate has gone up to Rs 1,642.50 from Rs 1,531. No Change In Domestic LPG Cylinder Prices There has been no change in the price of 14-kg domestic LPG cylinders, offering some



relief to household consumers. Domestic cooking gas prices remain unchanged across cities, ranging between Rs 850 and Rs 960. Currently, a domestic LPG cylinder costs Rs 853 in Delhi, Rs 852.50 in Mumbai, Rs 890.50 in Lucknow, Rs 860 in Ahmedabad, Rs 905 in Hyderabad, Rs 916.50 in Varanasi, and Rs 951 in Patna.

Revised Commercial LPG Rates In Other Cities

According to Indian Oil's website, the price of a 19-kg commercial LPG cylinder now stands at Rs 1,953.50 in Patna, Rs 1,691 in

Noida, Rs 1,814 in Lucknow, Rs 1,696 in Bhopal, and Rs 1,708.50 in Gurugram.

LPG prices are influenced by multiple factors, including the Import Parity Price (IPP), global fuel rates, the rupee-dollar exchange rate, freight costs, insurance and local taxes. Variations in state-level taxes and logistics costs lead to differences in prices across regions.

Relief For Households: PNG Prices Reduced

Even as commercial LPG prices rise, households have received some relief. Indraprastha Gas Limited (IGL) has announced a reduction in domestic piped natural gas (PNG) prices in Delhi and the National Capital Region. Under the revised rates, domestic PNG will cost Rs 47.89 per SCM in Delhi. In Gurugram, the price has been lowered to Rs 46.70 per SCM, while consumers in Noida, Greater Noida and Ghaziabad will pay Rs 47.76 per SCM.

The revised PNG prices came into effect at the start of 2026 and are expected to ease the burden on household consumers.

The picture, which debuted over the holiday weekend, faced heavy competition from Aditya Dhar's action-packed Dhurandhar and James Cameron's Hollywood sci-fi epic Avatar: Fire and Ash, both of which drew significant audiences. According to preliminary estimates from industry tracker Sacnilk, TMMTMTM collected Rs 1.75 crore on Tuesday, a considerable decrease from its opening day collection of Rs 7.75 crore. The film's total box office revenue is at Rs 27 crore.

The occupancy rate in Hindi circuits was a modest 20.04 per cent, with night shows generating the largest footfall at 28.13 per cent. Evening shows had a 22.35 per cent occupancy rate, afternoon shows 21.73 per cent, and morning shows only 7.96 per cent. The film's performance exemplifies the difficulties romantic dramas face in today's market, particularly when competing with high-profile movies.

Taj Mahal by night

The Taj Mahal is considered by many to possess architectural beauty unsurpassed by any other structure in the world. Constructed over a period of 22 years, employing twenty thousand workers, it was completed in 1648 C.E. and cost a whopping 32 million Rupees. Built entirely of white marble, it almost seems to glow in the moonlight, with the shimmering Jamuna river situated just across. The Muslim emperor Shah Jahan built this monument in the memory of his wife Mumtaz, whose grave is housed within the premises at the lower chamber. The grave of Shah Jahan was added to it later. The Taj stands tall and regal on a raised, square platform, forming an unequal octagon with its four truncated corners. The architecture uses the interlocking arabesque concept, where each element is singular in its entirety, but integrates seamlessly with the whole. The central dome spans 58 feet in diameter and soars to a height of 213 feet. It is flanked on four sides by smaller domed chambers, and four slender minarets rising to a lower height of 162.5 feet. The entire mausoleum is decorated with an inlaid design of flowers and calligraphy using precious gems like agate and jasper, and the main archways are carved with passages from the Holy Qur'an.

Balloon safari

Take a balloon ride for an all-encompassing, bird's eye view of the Taj Mahal, and the surrounding Mughal-era buildings. The tethered helium balloon

safaris operate from sunrise to 8.30 pm, but the best time to take a ride is at sunrise, sunset or in moonlight. The balloons travel to a maximum height of 250 feet and can carry up to 16 passengers.

Taj Nature Walk

This nature walk is a great way to explore the lesser-known side of the city. The tour takes visitors through a green belt located on the right bank of the Yamuna River, around 500 metres away from Taj Mahal's east gate. The nine kilometre trail has grass mounds, watch towers and other viewing points to admire the Taj Mahal. This area is also rich in flora and fauna, and has over 46 varieties of flowers. You can also spot local birds, butterflies and mammals such as jackals, blue bulls, hares, parakeets, kingfishers and hoopoes.

Taj Mahotsav

Started in 1992, this annual festival is both a craft mela and a cultural extravaganza that attracts artisans from all over the country. In the past, the festival has had displays of silk and zari work from Varanasi, paper mache from Kashmir, marble and zardozi from Agra and brassware from Moradabad. The programme also includes classical and folk music and dances performances by artistes from across India. There's also a food festival and a fun fair for children.

Amidst a sea of azure blue, away from the main Indonesian islands, Bali floats peacefully with an exciting culture, wonderful landscapes and amicable people. Bali is also well known for its beautiful temples with exquisite architecture and carvings. With stepped paddy fields, expansive beaches, swaying coconut trees and volcanic hills, Bali is truly a landscape lover's delight. Kuta and Ubud are the major tourist attractions; the former for its nightlife and beach, and the latter for its paintings and art galleries. Being an island, there is no dearth of beaches and the numerous vast white sands are one of the most sought after places on this island. Apart from Kuta, the popular beaches are Sanur, Jimbaran and Nusa Dua. Captivating sunsets, various water sports activities and delectable seafood along with numerous accommodation options, make these beaches a traveller's favourite.

Bali—off the beaten track

Celuk and Mas

Ubud is often referred to as the cultural capital of Bali and this is due to the numerous shops and art galleries here that sells a plethora of wood works, stone arts, silverware and paintings. Both Balinese and Batuan paintings are quite popular. Most of the art works are of Buddha or characters from Ramayana. There are art workshops where visitors can see the making of these on guided tours. Celuk and Mas are the popular places in Ubud where one can witness the artisans in work. Celuk is well known for its silver wares and there are numerous shops which sell them. Also, one can take guided tours where they would be educated about the making of the same. The shops have a huge collection of silverware with very beautiful creations. Mas is a nice little town in Ubud which has numerous shops that sell wood works made by the local artisans. There are also guided tours to the workshops where one can see the artisans in work and also buy the souvenirs.

Kecak and fire dance

This unique Balinese dance performance is quite an interesting watch with absolutely

no music instruments but a huge orchestra of seventy people who create music with their vocals. The vigorous dancers remain in a trance and make communications with ancestors and deities throughout the play. Trance dance is also referred to as 'Sanghyang' dance. The dancer's performance is riveting one and definitely packs a punch. Fire is an integral part and is used extensively during the latter part of the play. The play has five acts in total and the story depicts a portion from the epic, Ramayana. The enactment shows Rama, Lakshmana and Sita in the forest, Ravana kidnapping Sita, Ravana's fight with Garuda, Rama and Lakshmana meeting Hanuman and finally Hanuman flying to Lanka to meet Sita. With an expansive background, as the evening progresses, the lights and fire make the play a gorgeous affair. The dance is played daily evening near Uluwatu Temple, which is also well known for its enchanting sunsets. Make sure to grab your seats early as it gets a huge number of spectators.

Barong and Keris dance

This captivating dance is a form of a play which represents an eternal fight between the good spirit and the evil spirit. Barong (a mythological

animal) represents the good spirit, while Rangda (a mythological monster) represents the evil spirit. The dance has music tones in the background and consists of five different acts which sum up the whole play. The orchestra is huge and has numerous types of instruments being played. The play has reference to mythological Hindu stories, gods, and characters, and has an enthralling performance by the actors. The unique attire and the colourful masks they use are one of a kind. The play has actors dressed as tigers, monkeys, gods and is quite an enactment which keeps the viewers engrossed. One can watch this wonderful dance performance at Jambe Budaya in Batubulan. The play is enacted on a stage inside an auditorium and runs for more than an hour. Viewers are also allowed to go on stage and take photographs with the performers after the play.

Kintamani

Though Bali is known for its ever popular beaches, Kintamani is one of the few hills stations that the island possesses. The warm weather turns cold as the road winds its way to Kintamani past the orange orchards and souvenir shops. From the beaches and paddy fields that Bali is synonymous with, Kintamani in northern Bali is a pleasant surprise with beautiful vistas and cool climate. Mount Batur and Lake Batur are the most popular attractions here. Mount Batur last erupted in 1968 and marks of the overflow black lava are still evident all over the mountain. An ideal way to explore would be go on an early morning trek to the top of this still active volcanic mountain.

Lake Batur lies adjacent to the mountain and looks breathtakingly beautiful with the azure waters. The mountain and the lake make a beautiful landscape frame and is a delight for photographers. There are numerous restaurants with the mountain and lake view which offer authentic Balinese cuisine. Kintamani is an ideal place in Bali where one can take a stroll enjoying the vistas, cuisines and climate.

Tegalalang

The famed terraced paddy fields of Tegalalang are well known for its beautiful vistas. It is located a short drive away from Ubud town, winding roads take you to this beautiful terraced landscape. Along with Pejeng and Campuhan, it forms the paddy field region of Ubud. There are coffee shops, which overlook these fields and visitors can enjoy some Balinese coffee alongside. The landscape is enchanting and is a favourite with photographers and painters. One can opt for organised village tours and walk up the paddy fields or cycle around the fields, which is quite the preferred choice. Tegalalang is an ideal place where one can explore the village life and get to know more about the local farmers and their cultivation. Don't be surprised if any of the farmers invite you home as Balinese people are very warm, hospitable and friendly. There are also numerous souvenir shops in the vicinity which sell a wide range of artifacts and paintings made by local artisans. Evenings and early mornings are the ideal time to visit the terraced paddy fields of Tegalalang.
