# Centre shelves Hosur airport plan after Coimbatore, Madurai metro projects stall; TN accuses bias

This marks the second rejection after Tamil Nadu's requests in June and November 2025, with HAL citing interference to its Bengaluru-area military operations. The planned 30-million-passenger facility on 2,300 acres aimed to boost Hosur's electronics and EV industries, create jobs, and ease Bengaluru airport congestion.

**Chennai .(Agency)**

In a major blow to Tamil Nadu's infrastructure ambitions, the Union government has rejected three high-profile projects—the Hosur greenfield airport and the metro rail systems for Coimbatore and Madurai. The decisions, communicated over the past week, have sparked sharp criticism from the state government and triggered political backlash, with the ruling DMK accusing the Centre of unfairly blocking Tamil Nadu's development.

**Hosur Airport: Defence Ministry Says No**

The proposed international airport at Hosur, planned across 2,300 acres in Sulagiri taluk, has been turned down by the Ministry of Defence, which stated that the airspace is required for Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) operations.

This is the second rejection since June 2025,

despite the state submitting a detailed report in November arguing that the airport could coexist with HAL's activities.

Additionally, the Ministry of Civil Aviation has sought an impact study to assess whether the Hosur airport would affect traffic at Bengaluru or Salem airports. The project also faces a legal hurdle: an agreement between Bengaluru International Airport and the Centre prohibits new airports within a 150 km radius, which Hosur falls within.

**Coimbatore and Madurai Metro: Population and Viability Concerns**

•The Union Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs has returned the Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) for metro rail in Coimbatore



and Madurai, citing non-compliance with the 2017 Metro Rail Policy. Key reasons include:

- Population threshold: As per the 2011 census, Coimbatore's population is 15.84 lakh and Madurai's is 15 lakh, below the policy's requirement of 20 lakh.
- Overestimated ridership: The Centre

questioned Coimbatore's projected daily ridership of 5.9 lakh, noting it exceeds current ridership of Chennai Metro's 55 km Phase-I.

•Engineering feasibility: Narrow roads (7–12 metres) in both cities raised concerns about constructing stations and viaducts without large-scale demolition.

Cost-effectiveness: The Centre suggested that a Bus Rapid Transit System (BRTS) would be more suitable and financially viable for Madurai, as per the state's own Comprehensive Mobility Plan.

**State Government's Response**

Chief Minister M.K. Stalin has written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi urging a review of the rejections. State officials argue that both Coimbatore and Madurai are rapidly growing industrial hubs whose.

## After Hotel Shift, Team Shinde's Fresh Move To Foil Horse-Trading Attempts

**New Delhi .(Agency)**

Determined to prevent defections, Shiv Sena chief Eknath Shinde has decided to complete all paperwork involving the 29 newly elected corporators of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation, who were moved to a five-star hotel in Mumbai soon after their poll win.

According to sources in the Shiv Sena, the leader of the group of Sena corporators is likely to be named today. All documentary work will be completed today to remove all possibilities of defections.Names such as Yamini Jadhav, Trishna Vishwasrao and Amey Ghole -- young but experienced corporators -- are being discussed for top roles.

The BMC polls, held after 2017, saw the Devendra Fadnavis-led BJP and its ally, the Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena, win 89 and 29 seats, respectively. The Thackeray brothers, Uddhav and Raj, who fought in alliance with the NCP's Sharad Pawar faction, have won 72 seats together. While the BJP and Shinde Sena have the numbers to cross the majority



bolster his claim that his faction is the real Shiv Sena. The BJP, on the other hand, will likely want to claim the mayor's post to make a political point, as the BMC has never had a BJP corporator as Mayor.

As for the Opposition, the Shiv Sena (UBT), the Maharashtra Navnirman

mark in the 227-member House, the question of who the mayor will be is likely to dominate the discussions between the allies.

BMC has had a Sena Mayor for decades now, and Shinde, whose mutiny split the Sena, will push for the Mayor post to

"They are Shiv Sainiks, and they do not want a BJP mayor." In a cheeky remark, he added, "No matter how much you confine them, there are many means of communication; messages.

## Thrashed with belts, rods: Bhopal woman alleges assault over parking dispute

**Bhopal.(Agency)**

A college student in Madhya Pradesh's Bhopal has alleged that she and her friends were assaulted by a group of men following a parking-related dispute in the city's Kalpana Nagar area. The incident came to light after the student uploaded a video on social media describing the alleged attack. She has also alleged that even her hair were pulled off during the attack.The student claimed that the altercation began when one of her friends attempted to park a vehicle near a madrasa, a place where they usually park. According to her, some men sitting in an auto objected to the parking and allegedly demanded Rs 1,000, leading to a heated argument.

She alleged that the men then called more people from the locality, after which her friends were allegedly assaulted using rods, belts and other objects. The student further claimed that women who arrived at the spot also assaulted her, pulled her hair and manhandled her.

The student also alleged that during the incident, one of the men raised an objectionable slogan. She said she and her friends immediately called the police, following which they were taken for medical examination. The medical reports

reportedly confirmed injuries caused by assault.



Based on the complaint, police have registered a case under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita against the accused. The student said she has been living away from home for studies since 2019, but this was the first time she felt unsafe.

Meanwhile, residents from the Muslim community in the locality stated that the incident stemmed from a parking dispute and should not be given a communal colour. They said the police have taken the accused into custody

and condemned the assault, particularly the alleged violence against a woman, calling it unacceptable.

## "We Should Be Gradually Made To Retire": Nitin Gadkari Sparks Buzz

Nitin Gadkari said old generation should be gradually made to retire and the responsibility be given to the new generation.

Union minister Nitin Gadkari on Sunday pitched for the next generation taking important responsibilities and the old generation stepping aside when things start running smoothly.Gadkari, 68, was addressing a press conference in Nagpur about the Advantage Vidarbha-Khasdar Audhyogik Mahotsav, conceptualised by him and organised by Ashish Kale, president of the Association for Industrial Development (AID).

Gadkari said Kale has involved the young generation in the Advantage Vidarbha initiative. "I believe that gradually, the generation should also change." "Ashish's father is my friend. Now we should be gradually made to retire and the responsibility be given to the new generation, and when the vehicle starts running smoothly, then we should withdraw and do some other work," Gadkari said.

Gadkari, who is AID's chief mentor, said this is the third year of Advantage Vidarbha expo, being held in Nagpur from February 6 to 8.

There are very good entrepreneurs in Vidarbha region in various sectors, Gadkari said. The objective of the three-day event is to establish Vidarbha as a strong and emerging growth hub on India's industrial map, he added.Gadkari also emphasised on the importance of Industrial sector, agriculture and allied sectors and service sector for the development of any region.

## Presiding officers' meet to stress tech use for legislature

The 86th All-India Presiding Officers Conference (AIPOC) will be held in Lucknow for three days from January 19 to deliberate on legislative traditions and strengthening democratic values. The 62nd Conference of Secretaries of State Legislatures and Legislative Councils will also be held from at the UP legislature.

Presiding officers, secretaries and eminent representatives from legislatures across the country will deliberate on legislative procedures, parliamentary traditions, conduct of the House, good governance and other contemporary legislative issues during the synchronous conferences, officials said.The inaugural address will be delivered by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and UP Governor Smt Anandiben Patel. At

AIPOC, UP Assembly where Speaker Satish Mahana will present the welcome address.

The conference is being held a few days after the conclusion of the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers, which took place at Parliament's Samvidhan Sadan from January 15 to 16 with the participation of more than 60 delegates from across Commonwealth countries. Official sources said UP Legislative Council Chairman Kunwar Manvendra Singh will deliver the vote of thanks at the inaugural session.

Rajya Sabha Deputy Chairman Harivansh and Leader of Opposition in UP Assembly, Mata Prasad Pandey, will also address the gathering. "The topics to be discussed



include leveraging technology for transparent, efficient and citizen-centric legislative processes, capacity building of legislators to enhance efficiency, strengthening democratic governance; and improving the accountability of the legislature to the public," an official statement said.

## Rs 320-crore bonanza in Varuna: CM Siddaramaiah's legacy move or parting signal?

**Mysuru .(Agency)**

Even before presenting the state budget, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has given a pre-budget gift to his home turf Varuna Assembly constituency, triggering intense political debate across the state.

By laying the foundation stone for development works worth over Rs 320 crore, Siddaramaiah has once again placed Varuna at the centre of the state's political discourse raising a crucial question: Is this a parting gift amid leadership speculation, or a calculated move to cement his legacy?

The timing of the mega foundation-laying ceremony is politically significant. With speculation rife over a possible change of guard in the Congress government, Siddaramaiah chose to make a strong statement from the constituency he represents and nurtured for decades. While

Congress leaders in the district see the move as both symbolic and strategic, signalling authority and continuity, his close aides call it a message that governance, not rumours, defines his leadership.

Siddaramaiah, who now holds the record of being the longest-serving chief minister, launched 154 works spanning 15 departments at an event in Kuppaya village coming under Varuna constituency on Sunday. The projects range from infrastructure and urban development to health and social welfare, showcasing a long-term vision rather than short-term optics.

The highlight among the projects is the Rs 100-crore NIMHANS extension and de-addiction centre, a landmark initiative aimed at strengthening mental health services and



tackling alcohol abuse, an issue increasingly affecting rural and urban parts of the state.

Siddaramaiah stressed his emotional bond with Varuna during the event and stated that his responsibility to the people goes beyond electoral cycles. He said in 2024, he had launched a slew of development works worth Rs 501 crore, in 2025, he had launched Rs 1,108-crore worth projects and now even before the budget, Rs 320-crore

work has been taken up, totalling nearly Rs 1,932 crore in the last two-and-a-half years in Varuna constituency alone.

He also said in Mysuru district alone, nearly Rs 10,000 crore worth of welfare and development programmes have been taken and said it is his duty to ensure lasting development in Mysuru.

However, the scale of the announcements, especially before the budget and amid the speculation over change of guard in the state, has sparked a debate in political circles whether Siddaramaiah is preparing the ground for the future, possibly for his family or the next generation of leadership from Varuna, or is this a final flourish amid uncertainty over his continuation as CM.

While Congress leaders say that there is no leadership question, opposition parties argue the move resembles .

## Man gets police uniform stitched, buys SPO card, poses as SI to dodge toll & stay in Gurgaon hotels

**Gurgaon.(Agency)**

A 34-year-old man, who posed as a sub-inspector (SI) to stay in hotels, was arrested on Friday.Mukesh Kumar, who also tried to avoid paying toll tax and flaunted fake authority in public, was arrested by Civil Lines police officials following a complaint lodged by the manager of Gurgaon's Shubham Hotel.Police said the accused drove a rented e-rickshaw in Rajasthan's Khatu and frequently travelled between Jhajjar and Khatu. "To avoid paying toll tax during these journeys and to project influence, he procured a fake special police officer (SPO) identity card from a person in Jhajjar for Rs 500 and got a police uniform stitched from Jharoda Kalan in Delhi for Rs 2,200. He was in an inebriated state when he was arrested," an officersaid.

According to police, the hotel manager approached them on Jan 17 after Mukesh, wearing the Haryana Police SI uniform, checked into the hotel and produced an Aadhaar card as identity proof."The manager grew suspicious when the accused returned later after he paid Rs 600 for the stay and began making unnecessary enquiries about the room. When questioned, the suspect became nervous and attempted to flee but was overpowered by hotel staff and handed over to the police," the officer added.Mukesh, a graduate and resident of Kasni village in Jhajjar district, admitted he posed as the SI to 'intimidate people and gain undue advantages'.A case was registered against him under relevant sections. From his possession, police seized an Aadhaar card, a PAN card, a fake SPO ID card and the uniform. Mukesh was produced before a Gurgaon court on Sunday and was taken for a one-day remand.

## Worker dies in hit-and-run accident in Faridabad

**Gurgaon.(Agency)**

A 20-year-old contract worker died in a hit-and-run accident in Faridabad's Tigaon area on Sundaymorning.Mohit, a resident of Chandpur village, was riding to duty around 7.15am when an unidentified heavy vehicle hit him near Karauli and Badrola Chowk. He was thrown onto the road and suffered critical injuries, while te driver fled. His brother told police that dense fog had reduced visibility at the time.A case has been registered against an unknown vehicle driver under sections 281 (rash driving) and 106 (death by negligence) at Tigaon police station.Mohit's elder brother, Amit Kumar, said his younger sibling worked as a helper and left home for work as usual in the morning. Dense fog at the time of the accident reduced visibility on the stretch, he added.Cops were alerted by the passers-by who spotted Mohit lying injured on the road. When a police team reached the spot, they shifted him to a private hospital, where doctors declared him dead. Mohit was unmarried and the youngest among his siblings, his brother said. "On reaching the spot, the youth was found in a critical condition and was taken to hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries." After the autopsy, the body was handed over to the family. Police said CCTV footage from the area is being scanned to trace the vehicle and its driver.

## Three die in Noida, minor injured after truck rams into bike

**Noida.(Agency)**

Three persons died while a minor boy was injured after a truck hit their bike in the Teela Mod area on Sunday. Police sent the bodies — Lalit Singh (37), a resident of Delhi, his wife Pinky (34) and their son Aarav (10) — for the autopsy, while the couple's younger son, Neerav (7), was admitted to GTB Hospital in Delhi. A large crowd gathered at the scene while local people blocked Loni Road. After police reached the spot, they calmed the angry crowd. A long traffic jam occurred on Loni Road. Police removed the truck, which was carrying LPG cylinders, and the bike from the road to restore traffic flow."We detained the driver — Sanjay Kumar (44), a resident of Loni — and soon police will register an FIR," ACP (Shalimar Garden) Atul Kumar Singh said, adding, "Lalit had tried to overtake the truck and suddenly, he applied brakes after seeing a pothole on the road.

## Noida to roll out cloud-based water monitoring system

**Noida.(Agency)**

To strengthen the city's water supply network, Noida Authority is set to introduce a cloud-based remote monitoring and management system. The project, estimated to cost Rs 1.8 crore, aims to improve oversight of water distribution, quality and infrastructure performance, particularly in areas that frequently report supply-related issues.Officials said the sensor-based system will provide real-time data on key parameters critical to water management. These include the status of water supply, total dissolved solids (TDS) levels, availability of Ganga water, and the functioning of tubewells and rainwells. The data will be consolidated on a centralised digital platform to enable quicker identification of disruptions and faster corrective action. According to tender documents, the scope of work includes the supply, installation, testing and commissioning of a cloud-based monitoring system integrated with energy conservation devices and a programmable logic controller (PLC)-based centralised control system. The platform will allow officials to monitor water flow, pressure and quality across different segments of the distribution network, while also tracking the operational status of critical infrastructure assets.Officials said the tender was floated three times, with applications invited until Jan 6 in the most recent round.

# 'We could see only a thin ray of light': Noida techie's final struggle in abandoned pit; authority cracks whip

Trapped in a flooded pit on a fog-choked night, 27-year-old software engineer Yuvraj Mehta fought for nearly 90 minutes to stay alive — climbing onto the roof of his sinking SUV, calling his father, sharing his location, and flashing his phone's torch again and again through the mist in a desperate bid to be seen.Those at the edge of the pit could hear his cries, but in near-zero visibility, they could only make out "a thin ray of light" before his voice eventually fell silent.The accident occurred around 12.30am in Sector 150 when Mehta, who worked with customer data science company Dunnhumby India in Gurgaon, was on his way home when his Grand Vitara smashed through a damaged boundary wall and plunged into a water-filled excavation dug for a commercial project near ATS Le Grandiose.With no barricading, reflectors or warning lights at the site, the pit — nearly 30 feet deep — was



virtually invisible in dense fog. Mehta, who did not know how to swim, managed to get out of the vehicle and clamber onto its roof as it slowly sank.Within minutes, his father Raj Mehta, a retired SBI director who lives in the same sector, reached the spot after receiving his son's call and WhatsApp location. Police and emergency services were alerted, but rescuers struggled to

locate him in the darkness. Ropes were thrown, a crane was brought in, and ladders were tried — all falling short of reaching him in time.A passerby, Moninder, even jumped into the freezing water and searched for nearly half an hour, but could not find Mehta in the murk.Rescue teams cited thick fog, extreme cold and the depth of the pit as major hurdles. SDRF personnel reached

first but lacked equipment for such a deep rescue; the NDRF was later called in from Ghaziabad, losing crucial time. By around 1.45am, the cries stopped. Mehta's body was recovered at about 4.30am, nearly four hours after the crash.Residents said the excavation had been left open for nearly two years and had already seen a similar accident days earlier, with no corrective action taken.

Police said the site had turned into a lethal hazard, especially during winter fog.Following the incident, an FIR was registered against two builders — MZ Wishtown Planners Pvt Ltd and Lotus Greens Construction Pvt Ltd — under BNS sections related to culpable homicide, causing death by negligence, and acts endangering life.Police said they would also take up the matter with the Noida Authority to address safety lapses across the area.Mehta, who worked with Dunnhumby India in Gurgaon, lived with his father in Sector 150.

## In Gurgaon, buyers protest delay in handover of flats, call for govt intervention

**Gurgaon.(Agency)**

Homebuyers have urged authorities to step in and ensure timely delivery of homes after prolonged delays in construction of a housing project in Sector 37C.Residents said they have been waiting for possession for several years despite having made full payments.According to homebuyers' representatives, who protested on Sunday, bookings for the project , Aashiyara, were made in 2018 under the state's affordable housing policy, and buyers claim the entire cost of their flats was paid more than three years ago. However, a portion of the construction work remains pending, with activity at the site reportedly coming to a standstill over the past year.

Officials in the town and country planning department have acknowledged receiving multiple complaints regarding non-completion of the project. Internal communications from the department indicate that the project site was inspected following representations from allottees and construction was found to be incomplete at the time of inspection. The matter has since been escalated to higher authorities for further directions .Documents show that the project received approval under the Affordable Group Housing Policy and that the developer had applied for an occupation certificate in 2024. However, inspection reports noted that finishing work in several towers was still pending, while labour presence at the site was minimal during the visit. Authorities have advised allottees to approach the real estate regulator for redressal of grievances related to possession delays.Goutam Kumar Maiti, president of the buyer's association, said repeated changes in the proposed completion timeline over the years and assurances given during meetings with officials have yet to translate into visible progress on the ground. Many residents said they are facing financial strain as they continue to service home

## High Court seeks UP, Noida's reply on Supreme Court order on revised land payout

**Noida.(Agency)**

Allahabad High Court has asked UP govt and Noida Authority to clarify whether they have implemented the Supreme Court's July 10, 2024, order to pay landowners compensation under the 2013 land acquisition law.A division bench of Justices Mahesh Chandra Tripathi and Kunal Ravi Singh sought responses on whether compensation was reassessed and released in line with the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013, which generally provides higher payouts through revised market value, solatium and interest.

The land was acquired by the Authority for planned industrial development under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894. A declaration under Section 6(1) was issued in Jan 2015. Landowners had challenged the process, and in Jan 2017, the high court quashed

the Section 6(1) declaration, citing procedural lapses in the hearing of objections under Section 5A of the 1894 Act.The Authority took the matter to the Supreme Court. In its 2024 judgment, the apex court set aside the 2017 high court ruling and upheld the acquisition, holding that the high court erred in annulling the entire process — particularly when "a majority of affected landowners either did not file objections or accepted compensation", and when "large-scale development already took place" on the acquired land.The Supreme Court simultaneously issued binding directions on compensation. It clarified that because the 2013 law came into force while the acquisition proceedings were still pending, landowners were entitled to compensation under Section 24(1) of the 2013 Act, not the repealed 1894 law.The apex court ordered that any land

compensation that was not already paid must be released with statutory interest, and added that receiving compensation would not bar landowners from seeking enhancement under the 2013 law.The court also ordered that the limitation period for such enhancement claims would run from the date of its judgment.The matter has now returned to the high court on the plea that these compensation directions have not been implemented yet on the ground, even though the legality of the acquisition has attained finality.During Tuesday's hearing, the counsel for the state govt as well as the Noida Authority sought time to obtain instructions on compliance with the Supreme Court ruling in question.The high court granted the request, and further directed that the earlier 2017 division bench judgment be placed on record, and listed the matter for further hearing on Feb

## Man handed two life terms for rape & murder of 5-year-old niece in 2019

**Gurgaon.(Agency)**

A special Pocco court of additional sessions judge Neeraj Gautam awarded two life terms to a Muradnagar man for the rape and murder of his five-year-old niece. While the first life term was sentenced under Section 302 of IPC (murder), the other life term, awarded under Section 5/6 (aggravated penetrative sexual assault) will be effective until the end of his natural life.The man was also sentenced under Section 201 (causing disappearance of evidence) and Section 377 (carnal intercourse against the order of nature).The court found the incident did not qualify as a crime under the rarest of rare category and refused to award capital punishment. However, it imposed a fine of Rs 1.3 lakh and ordered that Rs 1 lakh be given to the parents of the child as compensation.The court gave credence to



the testimony of the minor's uncle, who testified as an eyewitness and confirmed seeing the minor with her uncle, the accused.The case dates back to an FIR registered with Muradnagar police on April 8, 2019 by the minor's father.

The girl went missing the previous night and her body was found the next morning in a nearby field.As per medical findings, cops included Section 376A and Section 377

IPC along with Section 302 and Section 201 IPC. The accused was identified from CCTV footage and was arrested the next day. A chargesheet was filed on June 1, the same year, while the court framed charges on March 13 the next year.The prosecution presented 7 witnesses, including the plaintiff, the minor's father; one of her uncles as an eyewitness; the doctor who conducted the post-mortem; and investigators in the case.

The defence, on the other hand, produced 4 witnesses, including the minor's mother, grandfather, and 2 locals.The defence argued that the prosecution did not prove the CCTV footage under Section 65B of the Indian Evidence Act. The court, however, observed that the eyewitness saw the accused going into the forest with the girl before the incident.

# Haryana's Bhindawas wetland logs 9.4k waterbirds, 52 species

**Gurgaon.(Agency)**

Bhindawas Ramsar wetland has recorded 52 species of waterbirds, with a total count of 9,483 birds during Asian Waterbird Census (AWC) 2026.Amid concerns over the wetland's shrinking habitat and delayed winter migration linked to climate change, AWC — conducted on Jan 17 — was jointly organised by Haryana State Biodiversity Board (HSBB) and Rohtak Wildlife Division of Haryana wildlife department, in collaboration with Wetlands International South Asia (WISA).

"Large parts of the wetland dried up. In many areas, the water surface is covered by water hyacinth and increased human intervention is also impacting the habitat. This winter, migration is comparatively lower," said ecologist and ornithologist TK Roy, who led the bird count.

Roy, who is also the AWC state coordinator (Delhi) for WISA, said Bhindawas — one of Haryana's key wetlands and Ramsar site — is witnessing



"visible habitat stress".He added that waterbirds are a key ecological indicator, as wetlands support breeding and wintering populations and provide vital services such as water purification and biodiversity support.

A drop in bird numbers, experts say, often signals pressure on food availability, water quality and habitat integrity.

According to the AWC record, the 2026 count included 27 resident species and 27 winter migratory species, along with three IUCN Red-listed globally threatened species.Among the prominent winter migratory species observed were Northern Shoveler, Common Teal, Gadwall and Greylag Goose, which typically arrive from regions across central and

northern Asia, including Russia and Siberia.Key resident species recorded included Indian Spot-billed Duck, Common Moorhen, and Purple Swamphen.The three globally threatened species recorded during the census were Greater Spotted Eagle (resident), Common Pochard (winter migratory), and Ferruginous Duck (winter migratory). A

wildlife department official said the department regularly monitored the wetland and that steps such as surveillance and periodic field checks are undertaken during.

## A Look At Prince Harry's Legal Battles With British Newspapers

United Kingdom. (Agency)

Prince Harry is to return to London this week for the trial into his claims that a UK newspaper group unlawfully gathered information, in the royal's last case in his long-running crusade against the media. The trial, expected to last up to nine weeks, is scheduled to start at London's High Court on Monday. Prince Harry has had a turbulent relationship with the media and blames the press for the death of his mother Princess Diana, killed in a Paris car crash in 1997 as her car was pursued by paparazzi.

He and his wife Meghan stepped back from royal duties in 2020 and relocated to California, in part blaming relentless media attention.

Here is a breakdown of his legal cases:

Associated Newspapers

Harry along with musician Elton John, actor Elizabeth Hurley and others are suing the publisher of the Daily Mail and The Mail on Sunday newspapers alleging breaches of privacy. They accuse the newspapers of hiring private investigators, tapping phone calls and impersonating individuals to get medical information. Their lawyers said the events took place between 1993 and 2011, but some took place as late as 2018. The firm denies the claims and the trial is set to last nine weeks. Media law expert Mark Stephens told AFP the central question was whether the newspapers "truly stand apart from unlawful news gathering of that era or were they simply never dragged into the limelight" during earlier cases. In a separate case, Harry sued Associated Newspapers for libel in 2022 over a story about a legal battle he was having with the British government over his security arrangements.

The Mail on Sunday published an article suggesting Harry, also known as the Duke of Sussex, had tried to keep the legal challenge secret. The company argued the piece did not cause "serious" reputational harm and expressed an "honest opinion".

Harry lost the first part of the case and The Mail on Sunday later said he had withdrawn the claim before it went to trial.

News Group Newspapers

Harry settled his case against News Group Newspapers -- part of Rupert Murdoch's global media empire -- just before the trial was set to start in January last year.

## CEO Of Iran's 2nd Largest Telecom Firm Fired For Failing To Block Internet

Iran. (Agency)

The chief executive of IranCell, Iran's second-largest mobile phone operator, was dismissed for failing to comply with the government's decision to shut down the internet, the Fars news agency reported Sunday.

In an unprecedented move, Iran cut off all communications on January 8 without warning, as calls intensified for anti-government protests, initially sparked by the economic crisis. Access to the internet has been virtually impossible in Iran since then, although restrictions began to ease Sunday for some foreign websites, such as Google.

"Alireza Raffei was removed from the position of CEO of the company after about a year of activity," Fars reported. "IranCell disobeyed the orders of the decision-making institutions in implementing the announced policies regarding the restriction of internet access in crisis situations," the agency said.

"The relevant institutions decided to dismiss the CEO of IranCell, citing 'failure to comply with the announced rules in crisis situations'," Fars added.

Iranian authorities have announced they are planning to restore internet access "gradually".

On Sunday morning in Tehran, AFP journalists were able to access the global internet, although most internet service providers remained blocked. The reasons for the limited connectivity were not immediately clear. Access to Google was restored on Sunday "via all mobile phone lines and internet service providers", according to state television.

## Counter Of 'Islamic NATO' 'Mediterranean Quad' Could See India Join 3+1, Eyes On UAE

Dubai. (Agency)

United Arab Emirates (UAE) President Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan will visit India today (January 19). The trip comes at a time of turbulence across the region. Concerns are rising over potential US attack on Iran, while Saudi Arabia and the UAE are at odds in Yemen. Pakistan is working with Turkey and Riyadh to form a military alliance along the lines of an Islamic NATO. It has raised strategic concerns for India. According to Eurasian Times, Saudi Arabia and Pakistan signed a defense pact last year. The agreement ensures that any attack on one is considered an attack on the other. Turkey could now join this pact. Meanwhile, India and the UAE are watching developments closely. Both countries may explore new alliances to counterbalance this emerging bloc.

A New 'QUAD' In The Making

Greece, Cyprus and Israel have formalised a trilateral military cooperation plan. The agreement includes joint exercises, unmanned systems, electronic warfare training and sharing expertise on regional stability. India has been invited to join this '3+1' summit and strategic forum. New Delhi already shares close ties with all three countries. The initiative follows a trilateral summit and includes detailed bilateral action plans. The plans point to a stronger security coalition to address shared threats, particularly as a strategic message toward Turkey. India joining Israel, Greece and Cyprus could create a powerful regional bloc.

Saudi, Pakistan And Turkey Alliance

The potential India-led Mediterranean Quad counters the growing influence of the Saudi-Pakistan-Turkey axis.

## CBS investigative show '60 Minutes' airs Trump deportations report a month after being pulled

60 Minutes" on Sunday aired its story about Trump administration deportations that was abruptly pulled from the newsmagazine's lineup a month ago, a move that had triggered an internal battle about political pressure that spilled out into the open. Correspondent Sharyn Alfonsi made no reference to her dispute with CBS News editor-in-chief Bari Weiss in the story about deportees who had been sent to El Salvador's notoriously harsh CECOT prison. When the segment was struck from the Dec. 21 episode on Weiss' orders, Alfonsi told her "60 Minutes" colleagues that it "was not an editorial decision, it was a political one." Weiss had argued that the story did not sufficiently reflect the administration's viewpoint or advance reporting that had been done by other news organizations earlier. The story shown Sunday included no on-camera interviews with Trump administration officials. But it did include statements from the White House and Department of Homeland Security that were not part of what Alfonsi

had used before her story was pulled. Some of statements, which were carried in full on the "60 Minutes" website, were dated prior to Dec. 21. "Since November, '60 Minutes' has made several attempts to interview key Trump administration officials on camera about our story," Alfonsi said. "They declined our requests." Alfonsi did not immediately return a message from The Associated Press on Sunday. She said in her email that the administration's refusal to consent to on-camera interviews was a tactical maneuver designed to kill the story. CBS says it was always going to air the piece. CBS News, in a statement said, that its "leadership has always been committed to airing the '60 Minutes' CECOT piece as soon as it was ready. Tonight, viewers get to see it, along with other important stories, all of which speak to CBS News' independence and the power of our storytelling." Alfonsi's report was the second of three on Sunday's show, with

the lead story being Cecilia Vega's report from Minneapolis about ICE enforcement efforts and the protests to its tactics. The initial decision to sideline Alfonsi's



CECOT story became a flashpoint for critics who said the appointment of Weiss, founder of the Free Press website who had no previous experience in television news,

represented an attempt by the network's new corporate leadership to curry favor with Trump. While pulled from the broadcast in December, Alfonsi's original story mistakenly became available online. CBS News had fed a version of the newsmagazine to Global Television, a network that airs "60 Minutes" in Canada, which posted it on its website before the last-minute switch removing the piece. That enabled sharp-eyed viewers to see what Weiss had rejected, offering the opportunity to compare it to what "60 Minutes" eventually put on the air. The body of the story was unchanged. It included a brief clip of President Donald Trump saying the prison operators "don't play games," and one from White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt saying that "heinous monsters, rapists, murderers, sexual assaulters, predators who have no right to be in this country" were sent there.

## Train collision in Spain kills 21, injures dozens

MADRID. (Agency)

Spain on Monday reeled from a collision between two high-speed trains in the southern region of Andalusia that killed 21 people and injured more than 70, with the prime minister lamenting a "night of deep pain".

The disaster struck on Sunday evening when a service travelling from Malaga to Madrid derailed near Adamuz, crossing onto the other track where it crashed into an oncoming train, which also derailed, Spain's Adif rail network operator posted on X.

A police spokesperson told AFP 21 people had died. Antonio Sanz, the top emergencies official in Andalusia, told a press conference that at least 73 people had been injured. "The situation is likely to see the death toll increase," he said, adding that "a very complicated night awaits us".

Maoist IED blast claims young tribal life in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur

**Bijapur.(Agency)**  
A 20-year-old villager was killed in an improvised explosive device (IED) blast triggered by Maoists in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district on Sunday.  
The incident occurred in Kasturipad village under the Usur police station limits when Ayta Kuharami, a resident, ventured into a nearby forest area. According to police officials, his foot accidentally stepped on a pressure-activated IED planted by Maoists, leading to a powerful explosion that grievously injured both his legs. Despite being rushed for medical treatment, the youth succumbed to his injuries on the way to the hospital.  
Ayta Kuharami, son of Budhra Kuharami, was only 20 years old. His death has plunged the village into mourning and left the family devastated. Residents said such forest routes are routinely used by villagers for daily livelihood activities, making the presence of hidden explosives particularly dangerous. In the aftermath of the blast, security forces launched intensive search and sanitisation operations in the surrounding forested area. Bomb disposal squads have been deployed to detect and neutralise any unexploded devices, amid fears of further threats to civilians.  
Police officials reiterated that Maoists often plant IEDs to target security forces, but innocent villagers are frequently the ones who fall victim. The administration has issued an appeal urging residents to remain extremely cautious while entering forest and interior areas and to immediately report any suspicious objects or movements to the nearest police station or security camp.

Six Maoists, including senior area commander killed in Chhattisgarh

**Bijapur/Raipur.(Agency)**  
Security forces achieved a significant breakthrough in the ongoing anti Maoist campaign in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, with six armed Maoist cadres, including a senior area commander, killed during a sustained two day operation in the forested National Park region. The joint operation, involving the District Reserve Guard (DRG), CoBRA and the Special Task Force (STF), is still in progress, with intensive search operations continuing in the surrounding areas.  
Jitendra Yadav, Bijapur superintendent of police, said that fresh exchanges of fire on Sunday led to the recovery of two more bodies of uniformed Maoists, along with an INSAS rifle and a .303 rifle.  
With this, the total number of Maoists neutralised since the launch of the operation on January 17 has risen to six, including four women cadres. A total of six graded weapons, two AK-47 rifles, one INSAS rifle, one carbine and two .303 rifles, have been seized so far.  
The operation was launched after specific intelligence inputs indicated the presence of heavily armed Maoists belonging to the National Park Area Committee in the northwestern forest and hill tracts of Bijapur. Security teams encountered resistance soon after entering the area, leading to intermittent but intense firefights over the past two days. Preliminary identification has confirmed four of the slain cadres as DVCM Dilip Bedja, a key commander of the National Park Area Committee, ACM Madvi Kosa, ACM Lakhi Madkam, and party member Radha Metta. Identification of the remaining two Maoists is underway.

Accident involving private bus and truck on Malegaon-Manmad road, four dead, 20 injured

**Nasik.(Agency)**  
A horrific accident occurred early on Monday morning on the Malegaon-Manmad Highway, resulting in the death of four people on the spot. Two others are seriously injured, and more than 20 passengers sustained minor injuries. The accident took place near Varhane village in Malegaon taluka around 3 AM.  
A private bus coming from Pune towards Malegaon collided head-on with a pickup truck coming from the opposite direction. The impact was so severe that the pickup truck was completely embedded in the front of the bus, causing extensive damage to the bus's front section. Chaos ensued at the accident site after the collision.  
As per reports, four passengers died on the spot, while two others were seriously injured. In addition, more than 20 passengers in the bus sustained minor injuries. Upon receiving information about the accident, the police and local residents immediately rushed to the spot and rescue operations were launched to extricate the passengers trapped in the wreckage.  
The injured have been shifted to Malegaon General Hospital, and some are reported to be in critical condition. Meanwhile, the police have conducted a preliminary investigation at the scene and have started further investigations to determine the exact cause of the accident. Due to this horrific accident, traffic on the Malegaon-Manmad road was disrupted for some time.

Hot days, chilly nights puzzle Bengalureans as post-Sankranti temperatures fluctuate

**BENGALURU.(Agency)**  
Post Sankranti, the weather is confusing Bengalureans who are switching on fans during the day and pulling on blankets at night. There has been a shift in temperature, with a noticeable rise in mercury in the past three days, leading to hot days but chilly nights. Street vendors and people working outdoors say the heat has made conditions difficult, especially during peak noon hours.  
According to India Meteorological Department (IMD), the rise in daytime temperature is largely due to clear skies and calm wind conditions. "With very little cloud cover and almost no surface wind during the day, the maximum temperature feels higher," said N Puviarasan, head of IMD Bengaluru.  
He explained that earlier, surface winds had provided some cooling effect, but lack of wind has made the heat more noticeable. He added that while daytime temperatures



have increased, night temperatures remain lower due to calm conditions. IMD officials said the current heat spell is temporary and weather conditions are expected to fluctuate in the coming days. Scientists noted that the heat has reduced fog conditions, helping to reduce respiratory-related illnesses, and is also favourable for agricultural activities. Environmentalists, however, warned that urban factors are worsening the impact of rising

temperatures in the city.  
"Large parts of Bengaluru have lost tree cover and are now dominated by concrete, glass and steel, all of which absorb and radiate heat," said Bhargavi S Rao, environmental researcher. She added that changes in building bylaws allowing taller construction on smaller plots have increased heat retention in the city. According to her, communities living in slums with tin or sheet roofs are particularly vulnerable, along with street vendors, waste workers, auto drivers and gig workers who spend long hours outdoors. Street vendors across the city have already begun expressing concern over the heat, pointing out the lack of shade and trees in many areas. While the current conditions are not extreme, experts said the heat is being felt more due to calm winds and urbanisation, and advised residents to take precautions during peak daytime hours.

STP pipeline work halted in Bharyal over forest law violations

**Shimla.(Agency)**  
Even as concerns over smoke emissions from the solid waste treatment plant in Bharyal village were yet to subside, a fresh controversy has erupted over the construction of a sewage treatment plant (STP) in the same area.  
Villagers on Sunday stopped work on the laying of a pipeline for the STP, alleging that the executing company has failed to obtain a mandatory No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Forest Department.  
Bharyal village, located about 10 km from the Shimla-Airport Road, has already been witnessing sustained protests against civic infrastructure projects that residents say are damaging the local ecology.  
Villagers claimed that excavation and pipeline laying were being carried out on forest land without permission. Following complaints, forest officials reached the site and directed that work be stopped until the issue is examined.  
Seema Kumari, a resident, said that when villagers questioned company representatives about the Forest Department NOC, they failed to provide a satisfactory reply.  
"This is a clear violation of the rules. We were forced to intervene; large tracts of forest land could have been damaged," she said.  
After receiving the complaint, the Range Officer deputed a forest guard to the spot and assured villagers that a departmental team would visit the area on Monday to conduct demarcation.  
Officials said the demarcation would determine whether the pipeline passes through forest land and under what conditions the work is being executed.  
Residents from Bharyal, Rampur, Daunti, Badhari, and nearby villages are also opposing the setting up of a liquid waste treatment facility near a rivulet adjoining the landfill site.  
They allege that both the solid and liquid waste treatment plants are being established at the origin of the Gambhar khud, threatening to pollute the entire downstream stretch and violating environmental norms.  
Recently, a media team, accompanied by former Deputy Mayor Tekinder Panwar, visited the site and observed that pipelines were being laid through reserved forest areas without environmental clearance.

Heavy traffic on roads to Chennai as lakhs return after Pongal break

**CHENNAI.(Agency)**  
With lakhs of people returning to Chennai after the Pongal holidays, railway stations and bus terminals witnessed heavy crowds on Sunday. The GST Road between Chengalpattu and Tambaram, and the Bengaluru Bypass stretch from Sriperumbudur to Maduravoyal, faced severe traffic congestion from Saturday midnight.  
The highways saw massive congestion not only due to the Pongal holidays but also because the festival coincided with extended weekend holidays. The city's arterial roads, including ECR and OMR, also experienced bumper-to-



bumper traffic. Trains operating from Madurai, Tiruchy, Tirunelveli, Thoothukudi, Nagercoil, and various parts of Kerala have been operating with full occupancy from Friday. Similarly, government buses from the southern districts were too overcrowded. Meanwhile, private omni bus fares surged by 30-50% compared to regular rates due to high demand. Chennai Egmore and Tambaram

railway stations, Tambaram bus stand, and the Kalaignar Centenary Bus Terminus (KCBT) witnessed a heavy rush of passengers from Sunday morning. Many passengers were forced to spend long hours on railway platforms due to limited train services on Sunday. Similarly, passengers arriving at KCBT had to shell out Rs 500 to Rs 600 for cab services owing to limited bus connectivity to the northern parts of the city. The Tambaram bus stand also saw heavy crowds, with buses from Tiruvannamalai, Tiruchy and other districts bringing hundreds of commuters into Chennai.

Bengaluru Central City Corporation takes up cleanliness drive on 15 major roads

**BENGALURU.(Agency)**  
Bengaluru Central City Corporation carried out a cleanliness drive on 15 major roads within the corporation limits on Sunday, informed Commissioner Rajendra Cholan. The roads are spread across six assembly constituencies.  
In wards 114 and 80 in CV Raman Nagar constituency, work was carried out on Channasandra Main Road, Indiranagar 6th Main, 80 Feet Road, 12th Main, and Kasturinagar 2nd Main. In ward 119 of Chickpet constituency, NR Road, Motinagar, and surrounding areas were cleaned. In ward 111 of Shanthinagar constituency, the drive covered Mother Teresa Road, MG Road, and surrounding roads.  
In ward 120 in Gandhinagar constituency, Shanthala Silk Signal to Cottonpet via Police Road was cleaned. In Chamarajpet constituency, work was carried out



on Chalavadi Palya Main Road and in Balekai Mandi premises. Finally, in Shivajinagar constituency, Church Road, MM Road, and surrounding roads were cleaned.  
The drive included removing unauthorised flexes and banners at the locations. The Forest department joined hands to remove dry branches and twigs from Krishna Rao Park and other areas. Engineers, supervisors, gangmen and pourakarmikas participated in the drive. The Manekshaw Parade Ground was surveyed by chief engineer Suguna ahead of Republic Day celebrations to be held at the venue. She stated that necessary preparations were being made, including levelling the ground using rollers and sprinkling water to prevent dust.

Unexpected record surge of devotees during Mauni Amavasya in Magh Mela ; over 4 crore take dip in Sangam

**Prayagraj.(Agency)**  
The bathing ritual for Mauni Amavasya at the Magh Mela in Prayagraj witnessed record surge of devotees with authorities claiming 40 million people taking bath in Sangam today. Flowers petals were showered on the bathing devotees from a helicopter. The bathing began at 4 AM this morning but as the sun rose, the crowd of devotees also increased rapidly. By 11 AM, one crore people had already taken a dip in the holy waters. Seeing the massive crowd, the police modified their plans, diverting devotees from crowded areas and guiding them to the bathing ghats via alternative routes. The weather also cooperated, with bright sunshine throughout the day. The administration reported that by 5 PM, more than 4 crore people had taken a holy dip. Mauni Amavasya is the biggest bathing festival. The Mela authority had estimated that three to three and a half crore people would bathe today, but by 2 PM, 3 crore people had already taken a dip, indicating that the final number would be even higher. Considering the large crowd, Police Commissioner Jogendra Kumar remained at the ghats from 12 AM

last night, personally supervising the entire arrangement. Special arrangements were made within the city to prevent crowds from gathering in one place. The road from Jonstanganj intersection to the railway station was closed, and barricades were erected on the road from the power house to Civil Lines. Devotees were allowed to proceed on foot towards the Civil Lines railway station side. The traffic plan prepared by Police Commissioner Jogendra Kumar and his team proved very effective; devotees were able to bathe without causing traffic jams in the city. However, controversy arose when Shankaracharya Swami Avimukteshwaranand Maharaj was proceeding towards the bathing area in his chariot amidst the crowd for the Mauni Amavasya bath. The police appealed to him to go on foot instead of in the chariot, which led to an argument between the people accompanying the Shankaracharya and the police, escalating to a scuffle. The commotion continued for some time, after which the police removed their chariot from the road, which angered Shankaracharya and his followers. They then staged a sit-in protest.

Thiruvananthapuram's Sree Chitra hospital's cardiology department marks golden jubilee

# Green outcomes from the red budget folder

Time was when November was one of the most pleasant months in Delhi, with just the whiff of winter in a city of extreme weathers. Not anymore. Foul air has replaced the aroma of roasted peanuts and chhole bhature as conversation starters in the national capital. Citizens have traded their old Celcius talk for a new set of numbers to moan about. Today, the air quality index regularly announced on TV triggers sighs and protests.

Environmental issues have clearly hit India’s political mainstream. Public protests erupted not only on the AQI that reached hazardous levels, but also on a new height-based definition of the Aravalli hills, sparking fears of illegal mining and environmental harm and forcing the government to backtrack despite a qualified Supreme Court sanction. A furore over water contamination deaths in Indore, showcased as India’s cleanest municipal zone, followed.

The environment ministry faced howls as the new year dawned after it amended guidelines to allow forest zones to have commercial plantations by private entities. The death of environment crusader Madhav Gadgil rang a sombre note on the importance of sustainability.As Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman meets various interest groups to craft her annual budget for the new financial year, it is time to ask if environmental outcomes should be highlighted in the budgetary numbers so that we can take note of what the government is doing (or not) for sustainability in the world’s most populous and fastest-growing economy.Green budgeting’ is unheard of in India despite decades of avowed political commitment to environmental issues. It tracks fiscal revenues and expenditure allocations by focusing on schemes and measures that affect the environment and sustainability. For starters, it is a sound way to measure public commitment to environmental goals. The Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development has been promoting green budgeting since 2017, when it launched the Paris Collaborative at its One Planet Summit.

Historically, progressive economists in India have been monitoring health, education and gender issues addressed and outlays allocated as part of their toothcombing of budgetary measures. Such a focused analysis is much needed. But such an effort can invite trouble. The prestigious Delhi School of Economics courted controversy a few weeks ago as the Delhi University’s academic panel objected to its syllabus on ‘Economics of Gender’ that covered some historical and ideological issues.Green budgeting may face similar pitfalls. But there has to be a beginning. Nearly 80 years after independence, India has seen two long spells of economic vision covering roughly 40 years each. The first four decades were a lot about socialist planning and government control, while the following years have seen an obsession with macroeconomic stability and its attendant points: inflation, interest rates and GDP growth. Both these worldviews have unconsciously sidestepped the environmental side effects of growth.We are now looking at a scenario in which one kind of positive numbers results in an unfocused set of negative ones. An agricultural boom in some areas leads to the hazardous burning of stubble. Automobiles driven by a growing middle class result in traffic jams. Mountains of unregulated plastic and other waste pollute the air and water of our cities. The data centres powering the artificial intelligence boom currently under way will also leave a massive environmental footprint because of its humongous energy needs.

# Modi govt’s cultural ambition

THE GREAT GAME: The RSS and the BJP are keen to carve out a special memory in the heart of India

INDIA may be in the throes of a political spat with its most important foreign partner, the US, while the economy, as noted financial journalist TN Ninan pointed out in these columns earlier this week, is more shy than sociable — but the government’s never-say-die ambition to scale the high cultural heights remains. The first gallery of what’s expected to be the world’s largest museum, the Yuge Yugeen Bharat, will open by the end of the year.The scale is certainly formidable. As many as 100,000 artefacts telling the story of India, from the Indus Valley civilisation to the present day, will be showcased across 30 galleries in the North Block and South Block, British Raj buildings that have housed the bureaucratic elite in the heart of Lutyens’ Delhi over the last hundred years.

There’s something about a museum that appeals to the Modi government. Perhaps, like the Bahujan Samaj Party’s Dalit leader Mayawati — whose monuments to herself and her mentors, Kanshi Ram and Babasaheb Ambedkar, are littered around Lucknow and the outskirts of Delhi — Modi understands that you may hate them or love them, but monuments are always going to stand the test of time. (That’s why statues of Lenin and Marx were first attacked by counter-revolutionaries when it was clear the Soviet Union was falling in end-1991.) And that’s why, New Delhi has been slowly rebuilt and reshaped in the last 11 years since Modi became PM.From the Pradhan Mantri Sangrahalaya, or the Prime Ministers’ Museum, where there are galleries to every PM, including Modi — which gets a mention on the public address system of the Shatabdi trains coming into Delhi — to Yuge Yugeen Bharat, the demonstration of the RSS and BJP’s ambition to carve out a special memory in the heart of India is unparalleled.

The impressive fact is that nothing is too small for the BJP. At the Harivallabh music festival in Jalandhar which celebrated its 150th anniversary in the last week of December, Culture Minister Gajendra Shekhawat was unable to show up — so he sent a video message saying the government would be happy to build an auditorium for India’s oldest music festival. The unspoken message that accompanied the loud claps to the video message was that the BJP would do anything to help Punjab recover its diminished heritage — and that it would certainly help if the people of Punjab were to return the favour, by voting them in.That’s why it was surprising to see the scarce attention to detail at the exhibition showcasing the Piprahwa Buddha relics recently inaugurated by the PM in Delhi. For those who came late

to the story, five small caskets containing jewel stones, bone fragments and ashes of Gautam Buddha were discovered in 1898 by William Claxton Peppe, a British colonial engineer who managed several estates south of the Nepal border, including the Birdpur Estate in a village called Piprahwa. Fast-forward to 2025, when the Peppe descendants decided to auction the Buddha relics in their keep in Hong Kong, leading to a nationwide furore, which in turn pushed the Centre to partner with the Godrej Industries Group to buy the jewel relics and bring them back to the motherland.

“It would make every Indian proud that the sacred Piprahwa relics of Bhagwan Buddha have come home



(to India) after 127 long years...” the PM said at the time. Certainly, the ambition to position India as the rightful inheritor of one ancient civilisation, the Indus Valley, and one ancient school of thought, Buddhism, is striking to see.There they are, the magnificent jewels, in a bulletproof case in front of you. Gaze, then, upon the “stars in silver and gold, discs of gold leaf embossed with Buddhist symbols, and numerous pearls of many sizes...drilled beads, stars and flowers cut from red or white cornelian, amethyst, topaz, garnet, coral and crystal” — all this information gleaned from www.piprahwa.com, because it isn’t available at the exhibition, neither regurgitated by the young, blissfully ignorant volunteers present nor offered by Design Factory India (DFI), the company that has put together the show. It may be mentioned here that the DFI’s claim to fame is that it has built a museum in Vadnagar on the town’s Buddhist connection as well as one in Bhuj, memorialising the 2001 earthquake.

The exhibition also contains stunning sculptures

manifesting the Buddha, sourced from collections in the Indian Museum in Kolkata, the National Museum in Delhi and museums elsewhere in the country. Many of these sculptures once came from parts of Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, now in Pakistan, except the word “Pakistan” on the placard has been replaced by “Undivided India.” Some paintings have been “recreated” — meaning, they were in such poor shape in the museum in which they were kept that it was not possible to relocate them.Look closely now at the thousand-year-old sculptures. You know they’ve been cleaned — they have that shiny, polished look, stripped of the accumulated decades of dust and grime. The DFI confirms your hypothesis. You hope the cleaners used good cleaning liquid that does not eat schist — it would be good to know what the process was.

This public-private partnership between Godrej Industries and the government is clearly a model for the future. It’s not clear, though, whether the Godrej folks have donated the jewel relics to the country or the government has bought them off. Whatever it is, they are home.

And so, as the Yuge Yugeen Bharat museum takes shape in the heart of Delhi, a stone’s throw away from the PM’s new home that is being completed, cast your eyes to Ayodhya, where a museum of Indian temple architecture is being built in the shadow of the Ram Mandir. This is an out-and-

out private partnership, but it’s also clear that the government is watching closely. The outstanding design is a brainchild of the Zaha Hadid architectural concern — which lost the contract to build Yuge Yugeen to Debasish Guha’s Arcop consortium and the Los Angeles-based Kulapat Yantrasast — while the funding is being provided by a Tatas’ subsidiary called Ecofirst.

But you are now back home in Chandigarh and so another visit to the Government Museum in Sector 10, which also houses the Buddha Gandhara sculptures — split half-half with the Lahore Museum when India became independent — is essential, if only to see if the spirit of change has travelled to this part of the country. You still inscribe your name in a register, just like if you were visiting an important bureaucrat at the Secretariat — just the museum ticket is not enough. The museum is still desolate. Some exhibits in the miniature gallery have been moved because the roof is being repaired, but work has come to a standstill because funds, seemingly, have run out.

## Maha success: BJP-led Mahayuti shines in local body polls

The Tribune Editorial: The BJP has overwhelmingly eclipsed not only its rivals but also its allies in the BMC polls.

JUST over a year after the BJP-led Mahayuti routed the Opposition in the Maharashtra Assembly elections, the ruling alliance has asserted its dominance in the statewide local body polls as well. The BJP has emerged as the single largest party in the high-stakes Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) polls. The outcome marks a decisive shift in Mumbai’s pecking order; as an undivided party, the Bal Thackeray-founded Shiv Sena ruled India’s financial capital for decades. Now, the Sena faction led by Deputy CM Eknath Shinde will play second fiddle to the saffron party in the BMC, as is the case in the state government. Even the reunion of the Thackeray cousins after two decades failed to stop the Mahayuti juggernaut. Former CM Uddhav Thackeray’s Shiv Sena and Raj Thackeray’s Maharashtra Navnirman Sena found it very hard to translate symbolic unity into electoral success. The desperate alliance between the Nationalist Congress Party



came a cropper in Pune.The BMC matters enormously as it is India’s richest civic body; its budget for 2025-26 is a whopping Rs 74,427 crore, higher even than that of states

such as Himachal Pradesh and Goa. The local body’s new composition will have far-reaching implications for Mumbai’s governance, policy priorities and the political dynamics in Maharashtra. The poll verdict is an endorsement of Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis’ mega development pitch, even as the Thackerays’ “Marathi manooos” card did not find many voters. The Congress, too, was relegated to the sidelines in the big battles, but it did cause a flutter with its allegation that the “indelible” ink used in the polls could be easily erased.The results have put a question mark over the future of the Opposition’s Maha Vikas Aghadi alliance, with its constituents struggling to stay relevant. Maharashtra’s most prominent political families — the Thackerays and the Pawars — are now a pale shadow of their former selves.

The BJP has overwhelmingly eclipsed not only its rivals but also its allies.

# China’s renewed interest in Shaksgam valley

The abrupt attention directed towards the Shaksgam valley coincides with a Chinese delegation’s meeting with the BJP and RSS in Delhi.

The Indian media recently observed the swift development of China’s road network in the Shaksgam valley, which is backed by numerous construction sites, utilising Landsat satellite data from the global land imaging body USGS EROS Center.The abrupt attention directed towards the Shaksgam valley coincides unexpectedly with the Chinese Communist Party delegation’s meeting with the BJP and RSS in New Delhi. Such underhand manoeuvres are not new, having taken place multiple times alongside major occurrences. This represents a shrewd strategy utilised by a group that persistently attempts to hinder a positive normalisation process. Consequently, this is the reason India lacks trust.Chinese construction endeavours in Shaksgam are not a recent phenomenon. The People’s Liberation Army has been monitoring the Shaksgam valley in West Karakoram since its influence expanded in Depsang (East Karakoram) in 2013.India was undoubtedly not informed regarding the development of a new road in the Shaksgam valley trijunction. The past satellite imagery has shown that China’s activities in this area began immediately after the 2017 Doklam tri-junction standoff.Since 2018, China has improved its connectivity to the Aghil Pass. Open-source intelligence satellite images have revealed that China has built a 70-km road in the Aghil Pass area.

China’s main objective regarding Shaksgam has been to shorten the travel from Kashgar to Skardu and Hunza via the G-219 highway, which traverses the Karakoram and the Aghil Pass. The present road is part of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

In 1963, Pakistan formally ceded over 5,400 sq km of the Shaksgam region through a boundary agreement. However, the actual territories transferred to China encompassed the entire Karakoram-Tract, totaling

20,000 sq km in return for approximately 750 sq km. However, according to Article VI of the 1963 Sino-Pak Boundary Agreement, it is stipulated that “The two parties agreed that after the resolution of the Kashmir dispute between Pakistan and India, the relevant sovereign authority will reopen negotiations with the Chinese government regarding the boundary as outlined in Article Two of the current Agreement, to sign a formal Boundary Treaty to replace the existing agreement.” Since 1963, China has regarded the Shaksgam-Karakoram tract as provisional, with sovereignty subject to renegotiation, which should ultimately be resolved between India and Pakistan.

India had the chance to resolve the issue during the conflict in 1972; however, the Simla Agreement signed afterward left the disputes regarding the Siachen Glacier and the Karakoram Tract unresolved. The Simla Treaty did not clarify the final 100 km of the ceasefire line that runs from the end of the Line of Control to the border with China.A decisive military operation in 1972 could have enabled India to reclaim not only the entire Siachen Glacier but also 5,400 sq km of Indian territory in Shaksgam and Karakoram Tract. The second opportunity for India to address the issue arose after the 1999 Kargil war.The theoretical trijunction point of India, Pakistan, and China is presently situated near Indira Col, extending from Sia Kangri Point 7422 to Point 6599, covering a distance of 59 km, where the Actual Ground Position Line (AGPL) between Indian and Pakistani forces intersects with the Chinese border.From NJ 9842, the AGPL delimitation line follows the Saltoro Ridge, which is under Indian control, although Pakistan disputes this and aims to extend the delimitation line eastward from NJ 9842 to connect with the Karakoram Pass.At present, 75 percent

of the territory of India that was transferred by Pakistan to China is incorporated into the Tashkurgan Tajik Autonomous County in Xinjiang, while the remaining 25 percent is situated in Yarkand Yecheng (Kargilik) County.China continues to refer to the Indian Consulate building at Chini Bagh as the Pakistan-India Consulate. Since then, China has been actively engaged in the



extraction of significant quantities of precious metals, gemstones, uranium, gold and copper from the Shaksgam Valley.India has persistently expressed its formal objections to both Chinese and Pakistani officials concerning illegal efforts to change the status quo at the Daulat Beg Oldie-Karakoram Pass. The decision not to open the Karakoram Pass for trade has proven to be a poor strategy, even though the region is not contested and is regarded as an Internal Boundary (IB), rather than the Line of Actual Control (LAC). The conflict has emerged in recent years as the PLA

endeavours to construct a second road through the southern Karakoram range providing the PLA with access to the trijunction point near Siachen.Former Army Chief General Bipin Rawat then dismissed allegations of any Chinese construction in the Shaksgam Valley, claiming that such an endeavour is nearly “impossible” and therefore “not a threat.”

It is also accurate to state that the Indian authorities have been overly preoccupied with perceived threats from the Tibetan front, neglecting the significance of the Eastern Karakoram sector.Nonetheless, the strategic placement of the road along the Teram Sher axis could have profound operational consequences for India in the Siachen, Karakoram Pass, Daulat Beg Oldie, and Depsang regions, potentially escalating tensions with Pakistan.Pakistani military forces, which previously did not have direct access to the Teram Shehr glacier, may now be positioned to cooperate with the Chinese at the trijunction, thereby posing a threat to Indian supply routes to the Siachen Glacier.One possible approach for India might entail military intervention to secure the Teram Shehr glacier. Nevertheless, such a course of action could escalate into a three-front conflict, leading China to initiate additional confrontations in eastern Ladakh.

Over the years, India has significantly enhanced its infrastructure in the Karakoram region. Another alternative for the Indian military is to push beyond the Turtuk Sector to seize the Chorbat Lungpa Valley across the Shyok River and gain control over adjoining villages. This offers a distinctive opportunity to acquire land in Gilgit-Baltistan with minimal demographic impact.



Top 10 fundamentals for

first-time

Some of the most successful people started off peeling stacks (and stacks) of potatoes, skinning chickens, washing dishes and clearing tables. They didn't get disheartened by the work required, as they knew that it was just a stepping-stone onto bigger and better things. As a start, here are the top ten fundamentals that all recruiters want fresh grads to know:

- It's never too early to start researching the company companies you want to work with and for the position you want. Do your background research regarding the company and the requirements for the position you want when you graduate (size, global presence, \$ value, any recent news, follow them on social media, etc.). If possible, try and talk to someone who

already works there; they will be able to give you a much more accurate picture on the company's culture, work environment, etc. so that you have all the information required to make an informed decision.

- Have a professional resume and cover letter. Just ensure that both your resume and cover letter portray an accurate image of you and tell the story that you want them to tell (in the best possible way). Ensure the resume is crisp and highlights the points you want the recruiter to notice. Get second opinions when possible.
- Manage your social media effectively. Think of yourself as a brand and all your social media as advertising your "personal brand". Just as you are going

to be researching the companies/employees where you are applying, they will be doing the same to you. Ensure there isn't anything online that you aren't comfortable sharing with a room full of strangers (aka employers). Where possible have restricted profile access or screen the information you share online. Ensure you have a LinkedIn profile. Even if you don't have any prior work experience, try and highlight internships, leadership positions, how you ranked in your school and your technical skills.

- When you do manage to get an interview with the company/companies that you want, apart from ensuring that your background research on the company itself is updated and accurate, try and gather as much information about the recruiters and the selection criteria process as possible. This will be invaluable in ensuring that you appear well informed and are adequately prepared at the time of the interview.
- Practice, practice, practice. Practice mock interviews with a friend/mentor where they ask you potential interview questions, ranging from predictable ones like, "Tell us about yourself" or "Why do you think you are the right person for this job" to slightly unique ones like "What classes were your favorite and why" or "What's your favorite website" or "Who's your real life hero?" Try and make these mock interview sessions as realistic as possible with quiet locations, appropriate attire and timing the entire process.
- Prior to the interview day, get enough rest (it's not time to celebrate yet). Ensure that you are relaxed and plan to get to the venue a minimum of 30-45 minutes prior to the scheduled time (always allowing for last minute emergencies). Lay out your attire and check that you have all required paperwork,

k, directions to the location and extra copies of your resume handy.

- First impressions matter. When introducing yourself ensure you have the right attitude, smile and a firm handshake. Expect to be evaluated (on body language, grooming, confidence and effective communication skills). Don't hand out your resume or give out all the personal details (place of birth, family background, etc., unless specifically asked).

- During the interview, be prepared with a few relevant questions when given the opportunity to ask them. Expect most interviews to last between 30 to 45 minutes and when possible try and touch upon your internship project or the various organizations that you might have worked for. Also, add the responsibilities you handled and some achievements you had over those roles. Remember to keep the answers brief, to the point and avoid winding answers. Be prepared for them to ask you to stay back longer to meet others in the company.
- Maintain eye contact always (depending upon the number of people in the panels). Prior to leaving, thank them for their time; ask them for their business card as well as the next steps in the interview process. Ensure that you are prompt and respectful in your follow up.
- As a summary, while the hiring criteria may vary depending on company, industry, etc., recruiters are typically looking for graduates who exhibit confidence (not over confidence). They are looking for consistency in your "personal brand". Do your communication skills, overall appearance, attitude and personality match your resume? They're also asking themselves if you really want to work in their company or is it just one of the many open positions that you are applying for? Does your intellect and previous success record match what they envision for this role?



Firms set terms and perks by seniors' personality traits

Companies appear to structure compensation contracts and incentive pay based on seniors' personality traits and not just firm characteristics, a team of US researchers, including an Indian-origin scientist, has found.

Companies offer incentive-heavy compensation contracts to overconfident CEOs to "exploit" their positively biased views of the firms' prospects, the researchers noted.

"There are divergent views on the use of options and stock in CEO compensation contracts: Do they appropriately incentivise managers and enhance shareholder value and if so, why is there much variation in their use across firms?" said Vikram Nanda from Naveen Jindal School of Management in the US.

The notion is that if managers and shareholders -- represented by the board -- have a different take on a firm's prospects and CEO talent, there will be greater use of incentive pay that the managers value highly but the board regards as less costly.

"When you think about incentive contracts, you don't usually think about the personality of the individual being a factor in the contract," Nanda added in the

paper published in the Journal of Financial Economics.

Using the compensation data of CEOs between 1992 and 2011, the researchers identified managers who were exhibiting behaviour that was overconfident compared to other CEOs.

"You don't usually hear about how two profit-sharing agreements are going to look different because the personalities and the beliefs of the individuals are coming into play," Nanda stated.

The team conducted empirical tests to explore the relationship between CEO overconfidence and incentive compensation.

The researchers found that CEO overconfidence increases the proportions of total compensation that comes from both option grants and equity grants, compared to other executives.

Overconfident CEOs receive even greater option and equity intensity in innovative and risky firms.

"Overconfident CEOs are prone to overestimate returns to investments and underestimate risks. They may use extremely positive words in the media or tend to invest more than a typical manager in the industry," Nanda stated.

# Gigged, gagged: Delhi gig workers trapped in endless shifts, algorithmic control, vanishing rights

**As platforms expand, gig workers fight a sorry state and unsafe conditions, while waiting for better days, reports Ifrah Mufti.**

"There are nights when I just stand on the road till morning. No orders, no money. Just waiting," he said. It is 2.30 am. The road is eerily quiet with a flickering streetlight. Ali stands there braving the winter chills near Rajender Nagar, his phone clutched tightly in one hand, waiting for his Zomato app to show orders. It has been over an hour, but no luck. The 24-year-old had come to Delhi six months ago to earn enough to help pay for his sister's wedding in Bihar and to fund the treatment of his elder brother, who has been unwell for over a year. Instead, most of what he earns disappears before it reaches home – lost to penalties, vehicle rent, and deductions he barely understands. Ali works from 6 pm to 9 am, a 15-hour shift that stretches across the city's most unsafe hours. When he first arrived in Delhi, he hoped to continue his bachelor's degree at Delhi University. Family emergencies forced him to abandon his

studies. Today, he rents a small room in the Jama Masjid area for Rs 2,500 per month and survives by stitching together two jobs: delivery rider at night and mobile technician during the day in Karol Bagh. Amid growing protests by gig workers in Delhi, even as unions have written to the Labour Minister and approached the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), alleging exploitative and coercive practices by app-based platforms, the reporter spoke to several gig workers in the capital to know that even when the 10-minute delivery enforcement has been revoked, the other struggles persist. The price of being logged in for six months, Ali has paid penalties worth Rs 1,150 on five separate occasions. His delivery ID has been

blocked multiple times by Zomato. Each time, he has had to deposit additional money just to resume work. "Instead of saving, I keep paying the company. Penalties, deposits, daily EV bike rent – everything is from my pocket," said Ali. Like most gig workers, Ali is not considered an employee. He has no appointment letter, no



salary slip, and no ID card. His proof of employment is limited to a uniform and a series of selfies the app demands at pickup points, delivery locations, and random checkpoints. Miss one, and deactivation follows. "How do I prove to anyone that I work for this company?" Only the app knows because they ask us to send a selfie after reaching the location," he said. **Waiting is also labour** Late-night deliveries bring a different kind of fear. Ali said that thieves often stop him, demanding money. He has narrowly escaped several times. "Standing on the road at night is also work. But nobody pays for waiting," he said. Customers cancel orders midway. Addresses change. Complaints are filed casually. Each incident pushes workers closer to penalties or suspension. There is no hearing, no explanation. The client, he said, is treated as infallible.

## 'Write To Me...': Chief Justice Surya Kant Dismisses Plea On 'Judicial Reforms'

Chief Justice of India Surya Kant on Monday dismissed a 'publicity-seeking' petition that sought the formation of a committee to oversee judicial reforms, including requiring every case to be settled within a 12-month period. "We will not let anyone come here for 'judicial reforms'," the Chief Justice said, "If it is a matter of judicial reforms, I won't allow anyone to come to the court premises. First, put it in writing... whatever it is. Then I will see if it is possible or not. We are all here, we will do it." The Chief Justice told the petitioner to "write a letter" to him with suggestions. "You want change in the country? Don't need to file such a petition... just write a letter and send it to me." "Don't file petitions just to speak in front of the cameramen standing outside." On the plea for more courts to handle the vast number of cases, the Chief Justice said, "Aap keh rahe hai ek saal mein har court faisla kare? Aisi kitne courts chahiye apko?" ("You're saying every court should deliver a judgment within a year? How many such courts do you need?") "Court banva dijiye... court banva dijiye. kaha se banva dijiye?" ("Set up extra courts, set up extra courts. Where do we get these courts from?") Both issues had been erroneously intermingled, the court noted, also noting that the petitioner, if so inclined, may submit a letter on the administrative aspects to the Chief Justice with suggestions, if any, for the purpose of judicial reform. "It goes without saying that any such suggestions are always welcome," the court said.



## Delhi continues to witness severe AQI, cold wave conditions to persist

The national capital woke up to severe air quality again on Sunday, as levels worsened over the past two days, prompting the imposition of GRAP IV restrictions across the NCR on Saturday. Cold wave conditions and dense fog were also observed in the morning hours. The air quality index (AQI) stood at 440 in the 'severe' category as of 4 pm on Sunday, after recording 444 during the morning, data from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) showed. The city's AQI is expected to remain in the 'very poor' range from Monday to January 21 due to a lower



ventilation index of 6,000 units and an average wind speed of 10 kmph, not favorable for dispersing pollutants. For Monday morning, the weather office predicted dense fog at isolated places across the capital, with maximum and minimum temperatures expected around 25°C and 8°C, respectively. On Sunday, the capital recorded a maximum temperature of 22.7°C, 3.1 degrees above the seasonal average, with slightly cloudy conditions after dense morning fog, according to the IMD. The minimum temperature settled at 5.3°C, 2.3 degrees below normal. The Decision Support System assessment indicated that vehicular emissions contributed 12.47 per cent to overall pollution, while industrial emissions accounted for 7.8 per cent.

## Top Renewable Energy-Producing State Rajasthan Needs More Coal Power By 2036

Rajasthan will need 4,400 megawatts of new coal-fired power capacity by 2036 to meet rising electricity demand despite India's top renewable energy-producing state adding more clean energy as it retires some ageing thermal plants, according to a government document. The Central Electricity Authority, a think tank of the federal power ministry, has more than doubled its earlier estimates of 1,900 MW coal-fired power for Rajasthan, according to a letter dated November 27 that was addressed to the state power utility and reviewed by Reuters. Rajasthan is preparing to retire its existing 1,350 MW old coal power projects, the document showed. The Central Electricity Authority did not respond to a Reuters request for

comment on the letter. India, which meets about a third of its power demand through thermal projects, has set a 2070 net-zero goal, which includes more than doubling national renewable capacity to 500 gigawatts.



Power consumption in India is expected to rise as its economy expands, requiring a 40% increase in coal-fired capacity to more than 307 gigawatts by 2035, as per government data. With the upwards revision in the state's

coal-based power needs, Rajasthan's power regulator has decided to review its November decision denying a permit for a new 3,200 MW coal power plant, according to a document posted on the regulator's website. The Rajasthan power utility had asked the regulator to review its decision, according to a separate document reviewed by Reuters. The company said additional coal capacity was needed because solar and wind energy was not available round the clock and battery storage systems were not yet ready. The state gets about 70% of its power from renewable sources. The state utility did not respond to Reuters request for comment. Several other states are also accelerating coal power procurement, citing strong demand and the need for reliable, baseload generation.

## Local crimes, central control make Delhi unsafe

The Delhi Police recently carried out an exercise named Operation Gang Bust claiming they have arrested over 500 criminals. How does that help crime scenario in the national capital. The crimes which occupy bold spaces like the murder of a Residents Welfare Association woman president in chief minister Rekha Gupta's constituency is typical example of policing having gone wrong at local level. Delhi's constitutional status as a Union Territory with an assembly has long produced a governance inconsistency. Citizens elect a government with expectations of safety, order and responsive administration, yet some critical levers of authority like policing remain outside the control of that government. The result is a blurred accountability structure where power and responsibility are misaligned, and where failures in law and order often fall into an institutional no-man's land. Under the current

arrangement, public order and police are vested with the Centre through the MHA, while the elected government is left to manage the consequences like public anger, political fallout and a crisis of confidence. This structural disconnect is increasingly visible in Delhi's everyday crime scenario. To be clear, Delhi today



is not facing any extraordinary security emergency. There is no surge of terror activity or insurgent violence that demands exclusive, centralised micromanagement. The city instead is grappling with

crimes that are local, familiar and deeply personal like murders, extortion, neighbourhood disputes turning violent, and intimidation of community leaders. These are precisely the kinds of offences that require intimate local intelligence, sustained beat policing and swift accountability at the district level. The murder in Shalimar Marg is illustrative of what has gone wrong. Such a crime is not just an individual tragedy; it is a warning signal of eroding community safety. It reflects failures in preventive policing, intelligence gathering and grievance redressal. Such failures that accumulate over time culminate in a crime most foul like murder. Unfortunately when such an incident occurs, the chain of accountability instead of tightening it scatters. For the Delhi Police, administrative control ultimately lies with the Centre. A grave local crime may not ring alarm bells in the distant corridors of North Block or Sewa Sadan with the same urgency it would in the Delhi Secretariat.

## Three Delhi metro phase IV corridors get funding from govt

Aiming to expedite the capital's Metro network, the Delhi government has released its share of funds for the remaining three corridors of Phase IV of the Delhi Metro Rail Transit System (MRTS). Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Sunday said these projects will significantly improve Metro connectivity across the capital and further strengthen Delhi's public transport system. She said the new corridors will provide safe, convenient and time-efficient travel for commuters, reduce dependence on private vehicles and play a key role in controlling pollution. The three corridors are expected to be completed within four years. The three Phase-IV Metro corridors will have a combined length of 47,225 kilometres and are estimated to cost nearly Rs 14,630.80 crore. Of this, the government will contribute Rs 3,386.18 crore, officials said. The first corridor will run from Lajpat Nagar to Saket G-Block and will be 8.385 kilometres long. It will have eight elevated Metro stations. The second

corridor, from Inderlok to Indraprastha, will be 12.377 kilometres long and will include ten stations—one elevated and nine underground. These two corridors have been placed under a combined financial framework with a total project cost of ₹8,399.81 crore, of which the Delhi government's share will be ₹1,987.86 crore, the officials said. The third and longest corridor will connect Rithala to Kundli, extending Metro connectivity to neighbouring Haryana. This 26.463-kilometre-long corridor will have 21 stations and is estimated to cost ₹6,230.99 crore. The Delhi government's share will be Rs 1,398.32 crore, while ₹545.77 crore will be spent in Haryana. Once operational, the Lajpat Nagar–Saket G-Block corridor will pass

through Lajpat Nagar, Andrews Ganj, Greater Kailash-1, Chirag Delhi, Pushp Bhawan, Saket District Centre and Pushp Vihar. The Inderlok–Indraprastha corridor will connect Inderlok, Dayabasti, Sarai Rohilla, Ajmal Khan Park, Jhandewalan, Nabi Karim, New Delhi Railway Station, Delhi Gate and Delhi Secretariat–IG Stadium. The Rithala–Kundli corridor will serve

areas including Rohini sectors, Barwala, Bawana Industrial Area, Narela, Sanoth and Kundli, significantly improving connectivity in north and northwest Delhi.



Officials said the tendering process is underway and basic work has already begun on some stretches. The construction of these corridors will reduce traffic congestion, save commuters' time and promote the use of public transport, helping Delhi move towards a cleaner and more sustainable future. **DMRC rebuilds sub station for Central Vista** The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation has completed the relocation and reconstruction of the Park Street Electric Receiving Sub Station as part of the Central Vista Project, ensuring uninterrupted power supply to key Metro corridors and support upcoming infrastructure in the city.

Usain Bolt hints at return from retirement to play cricket at LA 2028 Olympics

Jamaican sprinting legend Usain Bolt has expressed his desire to return to the Olympic Games in Los Angeles in 2028, this time with ambitions of participating in cricket. The sport is set to make its much-anticipated return to the Olympics after a 128-year absence, taking centre stage at the LA28 Games, scheduled to run from 12 to 29 July 2028.As cricket prepares for its comeback at the quadrennial event, Bolt has revealed his enthusiasm to represent his country with a bat and ball. Growing up in the cricket-mad Caribbean, Bolt was originally an aspiring fast bowler before he went on to become the most recognisable sprinter the world has ever seen.Cricket was, in fact, Bolt’s first sporting love before he was encouraged to try his hand at track and field by his cricket coach during his high school years. That decision ultimately changed the course of sporting



history, but Bolt has never hidden his affection for the game.Speaking to Esquire magazine, Bolt joked that he would be more than willing to answer the call should Jamaican cricket authorities reach out to him.“I am happily retired from professional sport. I haven’t played cricket in a long time, but if they call, I will be ready! [Laughs],” Bolt told Esquire.Bolt is widely regarded as the greatest sprinter of all time, boasting an extraordinary record of eight Olympic gold medals and 11 World Championship gold medals. He retired from athletics in 2017 as the most decorated sprinter in history, having swept the 100 metres and 200 metres titles at three consecutive Olympic Games — Beijing 2008, London 2012 and Rio 2016.Bolt was also named the brand ambassador of the T20 World Cup 2024, which was held in the USA and West Indies. He also played friendly cricket match in India back in 2014 alongside Yuvraj Singh and Harbhajan Singh. Bolt continues to hold the world records in both the 100 metres (9.58 seconds) and the 200 metres (19.19 seconds), which he set at the 2009 World Championships in Berlin — marks that remain untouched more than a decade later.

Midfielder Papa Gueye netted the winner in the 94th minute after Real Madrid midfielder Brahim Diaz squandered the chance to win the title for Morocco by missing a last-gasp penalty after a delay in the game was caused by the Senegal team walking off the field.HOW THE DRAMA UNFOLDED IN AFCON FINAL  
The chaos erupted in the 92nd minute when Senegal thought they had scored, only for the referee to disallow the goal for a foul inside the Morocco box.But there was more drama to follow when Diaz was deemed to



have pulled down to the ground by El Hadji Malick Diouf and Morocco was awarded a penalty.Officials and players were seen going at each other as referee Jean-Jacques Ndala consulted with VAR and gave the spotkick. This caused Senegal coach Pape Bouna Thiaw to order his players to walk off the pitch.The Senegal players made it back to the field only after being convinced by captain Sadio Mane and the game continued almost after 20 minutes.  
But the advantage was with Morocco as the penalty was still standing and Diaz stepped up. However, the madness of the night was set to continue as the midfielder attempted a panenka kick and Edouard Mendy easily saved his effort.The game looked destined to go to penalties but Gueye had other ideas to complete the fairytale for Senegal. In the 94th minute, he stepped up with a solo effort and then a thunderous shot to send the fans into ecstasy.

Ironwoman in a man's world: India's Renee Noronha aims to rewrite history

**In an exclusive chat with India Today, India's youngest female Ironman athlete, Renee Noronha, opens up about her world record aspirations and making a positive change for women in endurance sports.**

When you talk to Renee Noronha you almost feel a sense of calmness around her. The athlete, who recently turned 20 years old, speaks with such poise that you tend to easily forget that she is the youngest Indian woman to complete an Ironman challenge when she was 18 years and 49 days.When talking to India Today exclusively, Renee said that she is a family person off the track and loves spending time with her dog, Sky. A 'Swiftie'

at heart, she says attending a Taylor Swift concert was a dream come true moment for her. When I'm not training or I'm not racing, I love spending time with my family. And I enjoy taking my dog, Sky, for walks. I love playing with him, and I also like listening to music. I listen to a lot of Taylor Swift. And I also attended a concert, and that was like one big moment. It was like a dream come true, and listening to her perform, it was amazing," said Renee. But don't be fooled by her smile and calmness. When she is on the track, Renee never fails to deliver and is always looking to better herself and beat her own timings. Having completed Ironman New Zealand in 2024 and Hamburg last year, Renee's goal is not just to smash a world record but a make a change and inspire more women to enter into the world of triathlons.

**Gymnastics to Triathlons**  
For Renee, the start wasn't actually with running, swimming or even cycling. It was actually with gymnastics. The 20-year-old said she was a livewire as a kid and her parents decided it was best to channel her energy in gymnastics. "I was always a very



active kid. I was constantly doing cartwheels and running around the house. So my parents decided to put me into gymnastics class, and I did that for 10 years," said Renee. But when she was 16, the female Ironman athlete felt she could do more and actually push her limits. "At the age of 16, I felt I could do

more. I wanted to try something different, and that's when I started running. I loved running, and I always felt I could do more, and that's when I started swimming and cycling, and I met my coach, and decided that I want to do an Ironman. And then in 2024, I did my first Ironman," said Renee. While she made the transition sound so easy, it was far from it. The 20-year-old admitted that before she started her swim in Ironman New Zealand, there was a bit of nerves as the weather conditions weren't ideal. "So, before starting the swim. I was a little scared because it was my first time participating in an Ironman challenge. But the swim, it went well, and the biking as well, despite the strong headwinds and the harsh weather conditions. Nothing can really prepare you for race day, cause you, you can't predict what the weather will be like." "A few days before the race, it was nice and sunny, and then on the day of the race, there was like an actual hailstorm, and it was raining. But, during those moments, you just need to trust your training and just keep moving so you keep yourself motivated throughout the whole race," said Renee.

ICC tells Bangladesh to play T20 World Cup in India or be replaced: Sources

NEW DELHI. (Agency)  
“The International Cricket Council has warned Bangladesh Cricket Board to either play in India or risk getting replaced by a lower-ranked team in the T20 World Cup. Sources have told India Today that ICC has given Bangladesh time until January 21 to take a call, beyond which the global cricket body will look to replace Bangladesh. The ultimatum from the ICC comes a day after Bangladesh proposed a radical idea, urging the global body to switch their group in the T20 World Cup so that they can avoid playing in India. The BCB made this stance public, following their meeting with the ICC delegation, which travelled to Bangladesh to discuss the ongoing T20 World Cup crisis. At the heart of the dispute is Bangladesh's refusal – so far – to play its scheduled group-stage matches in India, even though the 2026 Men's T20 World Cup is officially co-hosted by India and Sri Lanka from February 7 to March 8, 2026. Bangladesh's fixtures, as released by the ICC in November, place them in a



group whose matches are slated for Indian venues – Kolkata (Eden Gardens) and Mumbai (Wankhede Stadium). The BCB has publicly framed its position as a security-driven decision, insisting it does not want the team travelling to India for the tournament. The ICC, however, has

signalled it is not inclined to rewrite the tournament plan at short notice. Sources said ICC sees no grounds to relocate those matches. The stalemate has intensified because the tournament is only weeks away, forcing the ICC into direct talks with the BCB to avoid a precedent-setting crisis.

Like Nadal on clay: Meet An Se Young, the badminton star impossible to beat

Ratchanok Intanon was asked following the women's singles semi-final at the India Open on Saturday. She paused. A slow, knowing smile spread across her face – a look that spoke louder than any tactical breakdown. One of the world's most versatile shot-makers and a former World No. 1, Ratchanok found herself unable to answer the most haunting question on the badminton tour. Her 11-21, 7-21 dismantling was her 13th defeat in 14 meetings against the reigning Olympic champion, An Se-young. While the 30-year-old Ratchanok-a legend in her own right-conceded she needs more speed to survive, even the youth and power of World No. 2 Wang Zhi-yi offered no resistance. In Sunday's final, the Chinese star was blown away in a mere 43 minutes, falling 13-21, 11-21. It extended An's dominance over her primary rival to 10-0 since the start of 2025. She is stable at the net and she is fast. She is strong, she is comprehensively good in every aspect," Wang admitted. "She has been one of the strongest opponents for me."



**A CODE NOBODY HAS CRACKED**  
Over the last 14 months, the badminton world has been searching for a glitch in the South Korean's matrix. None exists. The 23-year-old, instantly recognisable by her trademark headband, is dubbed 'Rambo.' She may lack the rugged physique of the cinematic icon, but once she crosses the service line, she is a one-woman demolition crew. The numbers are staggering. In 2025, An Se-young won 73 matches and lost only four. Her 11 titles equalled Kento Momota's all-time record for a single season, while her 94.8% win rate vaulted her into the

realm of the sport's immortals. She has carried that momentum into 2026, sweeping the Malaysia Open and defending her New Delhi crown on January 18-her sixth consecutive title. In the stands on Sunday, the atmosphere was telling. Among the Korean contingent, there were no frayed nerves or desperate cheers-only a quiet, clinical certainty. They watched not with the anxiety of fans, but with the detachment of observers witnessing the inevitable.

**LEAGUE OF ONE**  
In elite sport, top-tier clashes usually imply parity. When Carlos Alcaraz and Jannik Sinner meet on a tennis court, the world prepares for a marathon. Yet, a final between the World No. 1 and No. 2 in badminton now feels like a mismatch. An Se-young isn't just leading the pack; she is light-years ahead. She has perfected a terrifying alchemy of defence, offence, and court coverage. Her footwork allows her to retrieve the "impossible" while remaining eerily composed.



Arjun Erigaisi tried to make a foray against Thai Dai Van Nguyen of Czech Republic but eventually did not succeed in breaking the fortress. The top seeded Indian however remained in joint lead on 1.5 points in the company of Hans Moke Niemann of the United States and Abdusattorov.  
The fourth Indian in the fray Aravindh Chithambaram played out a draw with Yagiz Kaan Erdogmus of Turkey to also take his tally to one point out of a possible two. With three players in front, as many as nine are in closed pursuit a half point behind with local star Anish Giri on 13th spot on a half point just ahead of Pragganandhaa. It was a Queen's Gmabit declined by Pragganandhaa and it did not seem he had any trouble equalising with the black pieces. Rohit-Kohli in Tests, Jadeja in ODIs: Career-killers New Zealand strike again

This loss will sting,” former India cricketer Aakash Chopra said after India surrendered their three-match ODI series against New Zealand on Sunday, January 18. Playing at the Holkar Stadium in Indore, Shubman Gill’s India failed to chase down 338, losing the decider by 41 runs and, with it, the series 2–1, against what was effectively a B-string New Zealand side. The scoreline hurt. But perhaps, the context hurt more. This is the second time in the last year and a half that New Zealand have handed India a sharp reality check. In 2024, Tom Latham’s side walked into India’s backyard and whitewashed them 3–0 in Tests, scripting a first in New Zealand cricket history. That defeat had consequences. It fast-tracked a transition that Indian cricket had been delaying — Rohit Sharma, Virat Kohli and Ravichandran Ashwin exited the Test setup soon after. That series loss forced India to confront uncomfortable truths in red-ball cricket. Fourteen months later, New Zealand have done it again, this time in the

ODI format. Michael Bracewell’s side may not have arrived with their biggest names, but they left with the same effect: by raising some uncomfortable questions. If history is anything to go by, a home series defeat in Indian cricket rarely stays confined to the boundary ropes. Murmurs begin quietly before turning into agenda items in selection meetings and review panels. This loss will be no different. Perhaps even more so, because India do not play another ODI for the next five months — time enough for introspection to harden into decisions. With the road to the 2027 ODI World Cup beginning to take shape, the spotlight will inevitably turn to the senior players first. Transitions, in Indian cricket, are rarely democratic. But who exactly will pay the price?  
**Career Killers New Zealand Strike Again**  
Virat Kohli appears secure for now, having reinvented his batting tempo over the last



three months and adapting to the demands of modern ODI cricket. Rohit Sharma, though, may not escape scrutiny as easily. Against an inexperienced New Zealand attack, he got starts but failed to convert them into the kind of defining innings his reputation demands. There will be those who argue that this was a one-off — after all, Rohit had productive series against South Africa and Australia in

in three consecutive ODIs. With the bat, the returns were no better. On Sunday, in what could only be described as a brain-fade moment, Jadeja threw his wicket away when Kohli needed him to simply hold one end. Harshit Rana, a lower-order batter by role, ended the series with a stronger batting impression.



## Sensex, Nifty Open Sharply Lower Amid Weak Global Cues, Rising Global Trade Tensions

**New Delhi.(Agency)**  
The Indian benchmark indices opened the week in the red zone on Monday, tracking weak global cues after geopolitical trade tensions rose due to US administration's comments of additional tariffs on European countries.

As of 9.30 am, Sensex lost 449 points, or 0.54 per cent to reach 83,120 and Nifty declined 148 points, or 0.58 per cent to 25,546.Main broadcap indices performed in line with benchmark indices, with the Nifty Midcap 100 losing 0.42 per cent, and the Nifty Smallcap 100 easing 0.54 per cent.Among sectors, except Nifty FMCG, all indices were trading in the red. IT, media as well as oil and gas were among major losers, down over 1 per cent each.

Immediate support lies at 25,600 and 25,450 zones, while resistance remained at 25,875 followed by 26,000 and 26,100, market watchers said.

Analysts predicted volatile days for stock markets in the near-term amid heightened geopolitical risks. They highlighted US President Donald Trump's disruptive policies impacting international trade and global economic growth."If President Trump walks his talk and imposes 10 per cent tariffs on the eight European countries on February 1st and follows it up by raising the tariffs to 25 per cent from June 1 onwards, retaliation by the European bloc is almost certain," they said.Asia-Pacific markets traded largely with losses during the morning session as investors parsed key economic data from China along with US President Donald Trump's threats to European countries on additional tariffs for gaining control over Greenland.China's economic growth slowed to its weakest pace in nearly three years in the fourth quarter amid decline in domestic demand.

In Asian markets, China's Shanghai index added 0.13 per cent, and Shenzhen eased 0.01 per cent, Japan's Nikkei declined 1.05 per cent, while Hong Kong's Hang Seng Index lost 1 per cent. South Korea's Kospi advanced 0.85 per cent.The US markets ended in the red in the last trading session as Nasdaq eased 0.06 per cent. The S&P 500 lost 0.06 per cent, and the Dow declined 0.17 per cent.

On January 16, foreign institutional investors (FIIs) sold net equities worth Rs 4,346 crore, while domestic institutional investors (DIIs) were net buyers of equities worth Rs 3,935 crore.

### IT union NITES files complaint with Labour Ministry against Wipro over delayed onboarding, hiring

Pune-based IT and ITES union Nascent Information Technology Employees Senate (NITES) on Monday said it has filed a complaint with the Union Labour Ministry against Wipro Limited over an alleged delay in onboarding fresh graduates and misleading recruitment practices. The union has sought intervention from Minister Mansukh Mandaviya.

NITES President Adv. Harpreet Singh Saluja said, "The affected candidates are fresh graduates selected through campus and off-campus recruitment processes conducted by Wipro Limited, including its Turbo and NextGen Talent hiring programs. Letters of Intent were issued to these candidates around May 2025, confirming their selection and detailing the role, compensation structure and onboarding process. In several cases, the company also issued formal onboarding communications confirming a joining date, work location and completion of documentation formalities."

Recently, Wipro, in a quarterly result announcement, had said that it is planning to recruit fresh graduates for specialised roles.He further said, "Over a period of several months, the affected candidates repeatedly approached the company through official emails, calls and written representations seeking clarity regarding their onboarding status. In response, they either received no reply or were provided vague and automated responses referring to business demand, future batches or tentative timelines that were never honoured. No written explanation, confirmed onboarding date or formal cancellation has been issued to date."He added that over 250 affected candidates from multiple states have approached NITES. NITES is prepared to submit all supporting documents, including Letters of Intent, onboarding communications, background verification records and correspondence exchanged with the company for the Ministry's consideration, it said in the letter.

With such a strong opening, investors are now asking a key question: should they hold the stock or book profits?BCCL was the first mainboard IPO of 2026 and drew massive interest from all investor groups. The public issue was subscribed 143.85 times by the close of bidding.Retail investors subscribed the issue 49.37 times, the non-institutional investor category saw subscription of 240.49 times, and the qualified institutional buyer segment was subscribed 310.81 times, excluding anchor investors. The allotment was finalised on January 14, 2026, ahead of the listing.On listing day, the stock's opening was well above earlier grey market estimates, giving investors sharp gains right from the

start. For those who received allotment, the listing translated into strong notional profits within minutes of the debut.

**MARKET VIEW ON THE LISTING**  
Prashanth Tapse, Senior VP Research at



Mehta Equities Ltd, said BCCL was expected to list at a premium even before the debut. He noted that the stock was likely to list in the range of Rs 32 to Rs 35, implying a 39 to 52% premium over the issue price.According to him, the IPO saw exceptionally strong subscription across QIB, NII, and retail segments,

which clearly reflected investor confidence.He said interest in the issue was driven by the scarcity value of the offering, as it gave investors a rare chance to gain exposure to India's largest and most integrated player in the coking coal value chain. Coking coal is a key input for the domestic steel industry, which added to the appeal.

Tapse said that from a valuation point of view, the issue was priced reasonably, especially for a low-ticket IPO. This helped create an attractive risk-reward balance for investors.He added that the company's dominant position in the coking coal segment and steady demand linked to hit Rs 2,54,000, more than doubling earlier estimates.As these above-ground reserves shrink, holders of physical silver are demanding higher prices, further pushing rates upward.

He also pointed out that structural demand trends in the steel sector could continue to support the business over time, making BCCL more than just a short-term listing play for some investors.

## Could India-US Trade Deal Collapse US Senators Back Hard On India's Pulse Tariffs

**Kolkata.(Agency)**  
Talks on the India-US trade agreement have once again hit a snag. Just as negotiators were nearing a breakthrough, two influential Republican senators urged US President Donald Trump to pressure India to remove tariffs on pulses.While the demand may seem small, it directly affects New Delhi's agricultural policies and its strategic push for self-reliance in pulses. Negotiators now face the risk that prior progress on the deal could be slowed or complicated.Senators Steve Daines of Montana and Kevin Cramer of North Dakota, representing America's largest pulse-producing states, called India's tariffs "unfair" and harmful to US farmers. They said that India is the world's largest consumer of pulses, accounting for roughly 27% of global

demand.They argued that high tariffs prevent American producers from accessing this key market.Their main concern is India's 30% tax on yellow peas announced last October, which



took effect on November 1, 2025. The senators said such measures place US exporters at a disadvantage, even when their products are high-quality. They

urged Trump to make pulses a priority in any future trade deal with India.The senators also recalled raising this issue during Trump's first term in 2020, when the letter they sent was directly delivered to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, helping US producers gain a seat at the negotiating table.

They wrote, "As America works to correct trade imbalances, US farmers are ready to help. They have the capacity to feed and fuel the world if trade opportunities are opened."Equal Tariffs For All Nations

While the senators called the tariffs discriminatory against the United States, India's pulse policy is broader. The government initially exempted yellow peas from tariffs until March 31, 2026.

Group, says the shift in government approach has already started delivering results."India's manufacturing sector witnessed a decisive policy push in FY 2025-26, reinforcing its position as a central engine of economic growth," Mehra says. "The transition from the National Manufacturing Policy to the National Manufacturing Mission marked a clear shift from intent to execution."According to him, this move focused on ease of doing business, scalability and quality-led growth, while also strengthening the foundations of the Make in India programme. "This policy momentum resulted in expanding production hubs across India and helped move the country closer to a self-reliant manufacturing ecosystem," he adds.

**BUDGET 2026 SEEN AS A KEY OPPORTUNITY**  
Looking ahead, Mehra believes manufacturing will play a central role in India's next phase of growth. "As we approach the Union Budget 2026-27, manufacturing stands firmly at the core of India's next growth phase, with the sector projected to contribute close to 25% of

GDP by 2027," he says.He adds that the industry will closely track the government's continued focus on scale, quality and sustainability. "With manufacturing expected to reach the \$1-



trillion milestone, sustained emphasis on reforms such as PLI schemes and Make in India will be critical to deepen domestic value addition, attract investments and create high-quality jobs," Mehra notes.

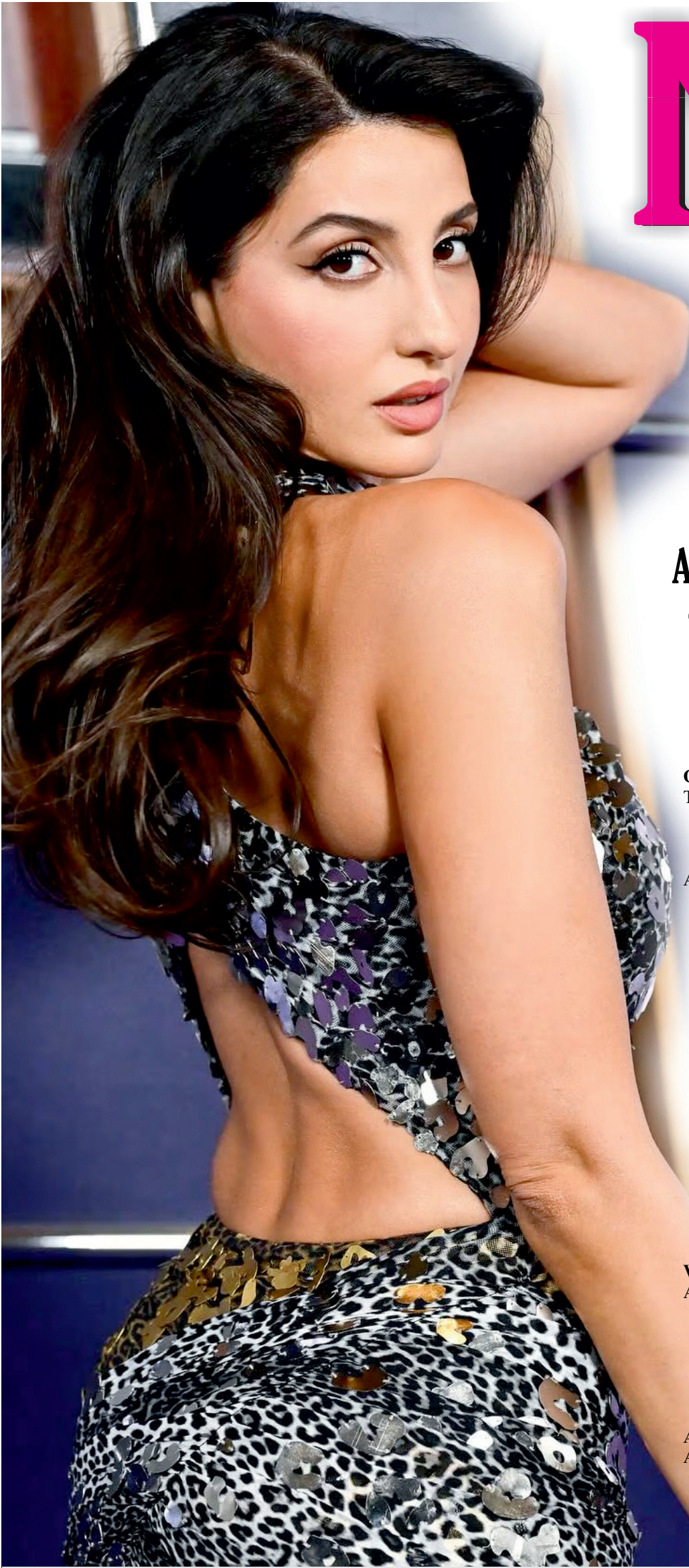
**GLOBAL CHALLENGES REMAIN**  
Despite the positive momentum, experts caution that global uncertainties continue to pose challenges. Jitendra Nenavani, Assistant Professor -Operations, K J Somaiya Institute of Management, says geopolitical tensions and fluctuating raw

material prices are adding pressure on manufacturers.India's manufacturing sector is facing a challenging global environment, marked by geopolitical uncertainty and volatility in the prices of key raw materials," Nenavani says. He adds that these factors could slow growth as the sector works towards long-term targets.

To meet its ambitions, Nenavani believes the sector must move beyond incremental changes. "There is a need to focus on strategic execution in two or three critical areas, while also sharpening the impact of existing initiatives such as PLI, Ease of Doing Business and Make in India," he explains.

**DIGITAL PUSH AND SKILLED WORKFORCE IN FOCUS**  
Digitisation, especially for MSMEs, is one of the most urgent needs, according to Nenavani. "MSMEs form the backbone of India's manufacturing ecosystem," he says. "They must not only adopt advanced technologies but also build the capability to use digital tools such as artificial intelligence and blockchain."

# Women prefer Jobs that have fewer applicants



When applying for a job, women seek positions with fewer applicants than men - a factor that could partly explain why we see fewer of them in the corporate boardrooms, new research suggests. The size of a competition - such as the number of applicants to a particular job or the number of people vying for a monetary reward - shapes who enters the competition. Women prefer smaller competitions,

whereas men seek larger competitions, which are typically associated with higher monetary rewards, the study said. "These patterns of findings can contribute to a better understanding of gender inequality in the workforce," said Kathrin Hanek, the study's lead author from University of Michigan in the US. "The gender difference in preferences may in part explain pay gaps and the

underrepresentation of women in particular fields or at the helm of large organisations," Hanek noted. The findings appeared in the Journal of Applied Psychology. The difference between the genders can be partially attributed to women feeling more comfortable in smaller competitions. The researchers found consistent gender

differences in the preference for smaller versus larger competitions across a variety of different competition contexts. For instance, one study examined women's and men's real decisions to enter a small (10 competitors) or large (100 competitors) word-formation task competition. The results indicated that 53 percent of women but only 41 percent of men preferred

the small competition. "This research by no means blames women for gender inequality but rather uncovers a novel environmental factor that might contribute to inequality, beyond the well-documented effects of gender biases and discrimination," Stephen Garcia, associate professor University of Michigan.

## Fairness at work can boost Employees' health



Fairness at work is likely to bring you positivity as well as good health, says a new research, indicating that an organisation is rated on the basis of the health of its employees. The findings showed that when perceptions of fairness changed, the self-rated health of employees also changed. Those who experienced more fairness on average reported better health.



"Our study provides a thorough examination of how fairness at the workplace and health of employees is related over time," said Constanze Eib, lecturer at Britain's University of East Anglia. Also, fairness at work is a crucial aspect of the psychosocial work environment and that changes towards greater fairness can improve employees' health.

"People who feel fairly treated are not only more likely to be motivated at work and go the extra mile for their organisation, but they are also more likely to be healthy, have an active lifestyle and feel positive," Eib added. Further, the health status of employees may also affect how employees feel treated at work. The results are detailed in the Journal of Work, Environment and Health.

The team investigated whether perceptions of what they call 'procedural justice', such as the processes in place to decide on rewards, pay, promotion and assignments are related to employees' health. The findings can help raise awareness among employers and authorities that fairness at work but also health is important to consider increasing satisfaction, well-being and productivity in the workplace and wider society, the researchers said.

The study, focused on more than 5800 people working in Sweden. Participants were asked to rate their general state of health on a scale from one to five, one being 'very good' and five being 'very poor'.
