"All these employees, in exercise of their duty, are under the control of the Election Commission, so it doesn't matter if they are central or state government employees," the court observed. The court said no further directions were required beyond recording the Election Commission's counsel's statement that the circular would be implemented in "full letter and spirit".

"Article 324 is not a wild horse. You can't do anything you like, whenever you like. They (the Centre) fear possible irregularities, but that's pointing a finger at the state government," said Kapil Sibal, who represented the TMC in the court. Article 324 vests the superintendence, direction and control of elections in the Election Commission. The Election Commission, for its part, told the court it was following its April 13 circular and explained that the arrangement is reciprocal: Where the counting supervisor is from the central government, the counting assistant is drawn from the state government, ensuring at least one state government official is present at each counting table.

POLITICAL TENSIONS IN WEST BENGAL The TMC's move came amid escalating political tensions during the second phase of polling on April 29, with both the TMC and BJP trading allegations of intimidation and interference. Several constituencies witnessed clashes between rival supporters.

New Delhi.(Agency) The Supreme Court on Saturday refused to intervene in the Election Commission of India's decision to appoint only central government and Public Sector Undertaking (PSU) employees as counting supervisors and assistants for the counting of votes in West Bengal on May 4, dealing a setback to the Trinamool Congress. A special two-judge bench of Justices PS Narasimha and Joymalya Bagchi observed that the Election Commission has the right to choose its own officers and that the circular appointing central government employees could not be struck down on those

Leh.(Agency) Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday described the return of sacred relics of Gautama Buddha to Ladakh after 75 years, coinciding with the Buddha Purnima, as a historic reunion.

Addressing a gathering at Jivetsal in Leh during the 2569th Buddha Purnima celebrations, Shah said Ladakh has been a "living land of dharma" that preserved and nurtured Buddhist knowledge for centuries. "Last time when these relics came to Leh, very few could pay their respects due to the lack of connectivity. Today, after 75 years, people from Ladakh, Kargil and even followers of other religions will be able to draw spiritual inspiration from them," he said.

The relics had been brought to Leh in 1950 for an exhibition, after Ngawang Lobzang Thupstan Chognor (popularly known as the 19th Kushok Bakula Rinpoche) requested then Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru to send the relics to Leh to raise the spiritual morale of the people. Shah said the region has, for centuries, remained a centre of spirituality and preservation of Buddhist knowledge. "This land is not merely geographical, but a vibrant laboratory of culture and compassion," he said while referring to the Dalai Lama.

Highlighting Ladakh's role in the transmission of Buddhist thought, Shah said the region served as a key corridor through which teachings originating in India spread to China and beyond. He noted that Kashmir, too, was once a major centre of Buddhist learning, particularly of Mahayana philosophy and art, and facilitated Ladakh's early engagement with Buddhism. He also referred to the role of Emperor Ashoka's envoys and the Silk Route in disseminating Buddhist thought.

"The presence of these relics in Ladakh reminds us that India's civilisation, for thousands of years, has been built on the foundations of peace and coexistence," he said, adding, "Amid conflict and unrest, only the path of peace and compassion can provide solutions."

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Dhaka, Delhi move to resume full-scale visa operations

Efforts for India-Bangladesh political engagements currently underway

Moving to normalise ties after months of turmoil in the recent past, Delhi and Dhaka are taking the first step forward with full-scale resumption of visa services. While Bangladesh has resumed visas for Indian citizens across all categories, India is aiming at gradual resumption of visa operations over the next few weeks, The Indian Express has learnt.

When Bangladesh Foreign Minister Khalilur Rahman was in India last month, visa normalisation was among the key points raised by Dhaka. While all Bangladesh visa centres in India, including the High Commission in New Delhi and consular divisions in Kolkata, Agartala, Mumbai and Chennai, are now functional, Dhaka has sought early reciprocation by Delhi on the visa

issue. Speaking to The Indian Express, Bangladesh High Commissioner Riaz Hamidullah said, "After the visa operations at some of our centres had to be held in abeyance in December last year, they were restored in February."



In February, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri visited Dhaka as part of the Indian delegation led by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to attend the swearing-in of Prime Minister Tarique Rahman.

From the time the new BNP government has taken charge, Delhi and Dhaka have been taking steps to recalibrate ties strained by the hostility of the interim administration led by Muhammad Yunus following the ouster of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in August 2024.

Haryana government approves final leg of Rs 15K crore NCR rapid transit corridor

If all goes as planned, travel time from Gurugram to Noida could drop to 40 minutes, and to Faridabad to just 20 minutes, as Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini's government has approved the final alignment and design of the Rs 15,000-crore Gurugram-Faridabad-Noida Namo Bharat regional rapid transit system (RRTS) corridor.

The project is expected to significantly cut commute times across the National Capital Region (NCR). Sources privy to the matter say that the chief minister has directed the National Capital Region Transport Corporation to immediately finalise a detailed project report (DPR) in this regard. The 64-km corridor is targeted for completion by 2031, with construction likely to begin by December this year.

The corridor will span approximately 64 km, of which 52 km lies in Haryana. It will connect IFFCO Chowk in Gurugram to Surajpur in Greater

Noida, providing a fast, direct link between major business and residential hubs. The line will feature 18 stations—including Sector-29, Millennium City Centre, Sector-52, Wazirabad and Sector-57 in Gurugram—and will function as a



hybrid RRTS-cum-metro system. Trains on this corridor will run at speeds of up to 180 km/h, with a frequency of every five to seven minutes, offering a high-speed commuting option. Designed as a blend of regional rapid transit and metro services, the system will enable fast long-distance travel while also serving local.

'Contractualisation of democracy': Suwendu Adhikari slams TMC over counting staff deployment in Bengal

The Leader of Opposition in the West Bengal Assembly Suwendu Adhikari on Saturday raised concerns over the deployment of contractual employees for vote counting in Pingla and Daspur constituencies, alleging it could compromise the integrity of the electoral process. The BJP leader accused the ruling All India Trinamool Congress of attempting to manipulate the mandate and urged the Election Commission of India to intervene.

In a post on X, Adhikari questioned whether "the fate of democracy" was being handed over to contractual workers, calling it a "grave concern" and a direct assault on the sanctity of the democratic process. He said he was "appalled" by the counting orders issued for 227-Pingla and 230-Daspur Assembly constituencies, where a significant number of contractual and casual employees were assigned key counting duties.

He questioned the deployment of 'Jibika Sebaks,' 'Sahayaks,' and 'Contractual DEOs' for the counting of votes, alleging that they are vulnerable to political pressure.

"How can 'Jibika Sebaks,' 'Sahayaks,' and 'Contractual DEOs' be entrusted with the sensitive task of handling EVMs, VVPATs, and Postal Ballots? These positions are inherently vulnerable to political pressure and lack the institutional accountability required for a process as sacred as the counting of votes. The orders reveal a shocking reliance on non-permanent staff for high-stakes roles: Pingla AC (227): Contractual staff like Bipalendu Bera (JS), Sankar Pahari (JS), and Naba Kumar Apik (BLS) are embedded in the Counting and Compilation teams. Even the "Reserve Tagging" involves staff like Swapna Mitya (BLAAA). Daspur AC (230): The order is littered with Sahayaks, VLEs, and Contractual DEOs across the Compilation Team, EVM Movement, and even the Sealing of EVMs/VVPATs," the BJP leader said.

Amid Bhagwant Mann "Alcohol" Row, AAP's "Congress MLA Land Case" Retort

Punjab Minister Harpal Cheema called the allegations against the chief minister an attempt to distract from a land encroachment case allegedly linked to Congress MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has said the whole ruckus in the assembly due to allegations that targeted him with claims that he came to the house under the influence happened because the Opposition had no real issues to raise. The Congress yesterday demanded that the chief minister should get an "alcohol test" done after the opposition claimed that the ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader came to the assembly "drunk". "They have no issues to raise. What test should be done?" Mann told news agency ANI.

The chief minister's response came following a high drama in the Punjab assembly, with the AAP and Congress duelling over the Opposition's allegation against Mann and their demand. "What should we even do coming to the assembly where the chief minister is in an



inebriated state? What is the purpose of holding a session when the head of the state is completely sozzled? We demand that everyone's test be conducted," Leader of Opposition in the assembly Partap Singh Bajwa said.

BJP leader and Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta also criticised Mann over the allegations, calling it "disgraceful" and a matter of concern for the

country. Shame on you, it's disgraceful. In the temple of democracy, no state head should show up in an inebriated state and bring shame to the entire state. Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has been seen by the world hundreds of times inebriated at public events, but today it crossed all limits when the entire country saw his condition - how he was speaking in the assembly while intoxicated," Gupta alleged.

"How can a person who lives in a drunken stupor save the people of his state from addiction? Does Arvind Kejriwal have any answer? They talk about addiction. Will he run the state with such people..." she said. Punjab Finance Minister Harpal Cheema slammed the Opposition and called the allegations against the chief minister an attempt to distract from a land encroachment case allegedly linked to Congress MLA Sukhpal Singh Khaira.

Section 163 imposed ahead of NEET-UG 2026

A total of 18 examination centres have been designated in the district, where 6,875 candidates will appear for the test. The district administration on Friday announced stringent security and administrative measures for the NEET-UG 2026 examination, scheduled to be held on May 3.

Deputy commissioner Uttam Singh said Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) has been enforced across the district to regulate movement around examination centres and ensure the fair and peaceful conduct of the test. Eighteen examination centres have been designated in the district, where 6,875 candidates will appear for the test. Under the provisions, assembly of people within a 200-metre radius of exam centres has been prohibited. The order also bans carrying weapons, parking vehicles, use of loudspeakers, and operation of Wi-Fi or any electronic devices in the restricted zone. Additionally, photocopy shops and coaching centres located within 500 metres of the centres have been directed to remain closed on the day of the examination. The administration has imposed strict restrictions on items allowed inside examination premises. Mobile phones, Bluetooth devices, earphones, smartwatches, pen scanners, and all other electronic gadgets are completely prohibited. Candidates will also not be permitted to carry bags, purses, belts, jewellery, cameras, calculators, pen drives, or any written material. Only admit cards, a passport-size photograph, valid identity proof, and a transparent water bottle will be allowed.

June 15 takeoff for Noida airport, IndiGo to operate inaugural flight

Noida International Airport will launch commercial flight operations on June 15, ending the wait for a second civil aviation hub in Delhi-NCR. IndiGo will operate the inaugural flight, with Akasa Air and Air India Express to follow shortly.

The announcement comes after the airport cleared a regulatory hurdle that stalled its launch. Last week, expat CEO Christoph Schnellmann was replaced, as rules require an Indian national to head airports. Schnellmann moved to the board as executive vice chairman, and CFO Nitu Samra was appointed interim CEO.

The change enabled the airport to secure approval for its Aerodrome Security Program from the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security on April 28, confirming that its security framework and operating procedures met regulatory requirements. It received the aerodrome licence from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation on March 6 and was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on March 28.

The airport, a greenfield project developed on land acquired from six villages in Jewar, sits around 80 km from Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport and 60 km from Noida City Centre. In its first phase, it will operate one runway and a single passenger terminal with an annual capacity of 12 million passengers.

Officials said initially, the operations will begin with domestic flights. International services are expected to follow after a stabilisation period, with operating hours set to expand progressively towards round-the-clock services as systems are tested. While routes, schedules and passenger service details have not been announced yet, the airport is to connect.

Skywalk held up, Metro commuters forced to pack into pathway to switch from Sec 51 to 52

A single hour of rain on Thursday evening was enough to turn the temporary walkway between Aqua Line's Sector 51 and Blue Line's Sector 52 metro stations into a muddy stretch. Commuters, some carrying children, others lugging baggage, jostled for footing on the narrow walkway as crowds poured out of both stations during the evening rush.

The chaos, captured by commuters and shared widely on X, showed swarms of passengers stranded in the four-metre-wide passage, carefully taking each step to avoid slipping. For daily commuters on this route, the scene was familiar, but only wetter than usual.

At the heart of the problem is a Rs 40-crore skywalk that Noida Authority built and then discovered it could not open. The L-shaped, air-conditioned structure, equipped with travelators and launched in March 2023 with a one-year completion target, was delayed after officials realised a beam at the Sector 51 entry point blocked access. Rather than removing the beam, the Authority has now decided to extend the skywalk by 100 metres to route around it. Excavation has begun, but completion is at least two months away.

The 400-metre interchange is an ordeal on a dry day. Commuters exiting Sector 51 station have to first walk to the rear of the building, take a circuitous route to reach the front, then navigate the uneven, constricted walkway — one metre wide in some places and 3-4 metres wide in others. Midway, the footpath ends, and pedestrians are forced onto the road before turning left towards Sector 52 station. A skywalk pillar stands in the middle of the walkway. Barricading for the skywalk construction lines one side, hoardings for an upcoming commercial store line the other. The temporary shade erected years ago has long since rusted away, leaving only iron bars with no shade from sun or rain.

"The rainfall on Thursday led to waterlogging at this stretch. We were forced to wade through accumulated water, carefully placing each step," said Anmol Kumar, a Sector 52 resident, a B'Tech student in Greater Noida who takes this route daily. "I wonder how long it will take to make the skywalk operational."

Gurgaon launches fever survey amid fears of early dengue, malaria rise

Anticipating a rise in dengue and malaria cases in the coming months, the health department on Friday began a city-wide fever survey that will be conducted from the 1st to the 15th of every month till October, an official said. The survey for the month of May has already begun, he added. The move comes after Gurgaon recorded an unusually wet April this year. The city received 23.8 mm rainfall against the normal 7.7 mm, a 209% surplus, according to IMD. Health officials said the excess pre-monsoon rain, coupled with rising humidity, could create favourable breeding conditions for mosquitoes earlier than usual.

About 102 teams have been deployed for the survey.

"Our teams will be checking all areas and specifically where cases were reported in past years, besides identifying water-holding containers that can act as

breeding grounds for disease-carrying mosquitoes," said district surveillance officer Dr Jai Prakash.

He added that while there is no reason to panic right now, all residents should exercise caution. "At present there is no clustering of fever cases, but people need to be cautious. We have established a centre through which doctors can call their patients daily to check their status in case anyone is found positive," he said.

Officials said apart from house-to-house fever surveillance, all positive larval breeding sites will be geo-tagged to build a database for regular monitoring through the monsoon. These hotspots will be compared with previous years' surveys to identify recurring clusters and potential outbreak intersections. The teams will also intensify checks in

dengue-prone localities and past hotspots to ensure breeding is curbed before peak season.

Dengue cases in Haryana generally begin rising from May onward and intensify



between July and Oct. The state has seen fluctuating but substantial vector-borne disease burdens in recent years. Haryana reported 11,835 dengue cases and 54 malaria cases in 2021, followed by 8,996

dengue and 50 malaria cases in 2022. In 2023, the state logged 8,081 dengue and 85 malaria cases. In 2025, Haryana reported 2,033 dengue cases, indicating that while numbers were lower than peak outbreak years, the disease remained a significant seasonal threat.

In Gurgaon, dengue has remained a recurring concern despite year-to-year variation. The city reported 440 dengue cases in 2022, 276 cases and one death in 2023, 186 cases in 2024, and 64 cases in 2025. Health officials said the lower tally last year should not lead to complacency, particularly given this year's wetter-than-normal pre-monsoon conditions. While malaria outbreaks are relatively uncommon in Gurgaon compared with dengue, surveillance is critical as malaria cases are typically reported between Feb and Sept.

Sharp spike in wheat stubble fires, April incidents jump nearly 2.6 times from last year

Wheat residue burning this April recorded a sharp spike in Haryana, with 1,565 farm fire incidents logged between April 1 and 30 — a 157% increase over the 608 cases recorded during the same period last year, according to Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR).

While the count remains below the 2,033 cases recorded in April 2022, this year's surge signals a rebound in open-field residue burning after two relatively controlled seasons — 266 cases in 2023 and 177 in 2024.

Fire activity remained moderate through most of April before a dramatic late-month spike, particularly after April 24, suggesting accelerated post-harvest field



clearing as wheat harvesting peaked across districts. The steepest escalation came in the final five days, when incidents rose rapidly from around 500 to more than 1,500.

Jind emerged as the biggest hotspot with 264 incidents, followed by Rohtak (241), Jhajjar (183), Sonapat (127), Kaithal

(115), Karnal (114), Sirsa (98), Panipat (85) and Hisar (81).

These districts, largely concentrated in the agrarian belt, accounted for the bulk of the state's fire burden. Mahendragarh reported zero incidents for the fifth straight year, while Panchkula and Rewari remained among the lowest.

The city recorded 19 incidents — higher than zero cases last year but low compared with major farming districts. Faridabad logged 20 cases and Palwal 38. Experts warned that this summer's fire counts surpassing even the 2025 paddy season figures is a significant red flag. "The amount of smoke produced doesn't change with the season, but how our atmosphere handles it does."

Girl (7) run over by her own school bus in Greater Noida as she tries to cross road

A 7-year-old schoolgirl died after she was allegedly run over by her school bus in Greater Noida on Thursday. The child had just deboarded the bus at Roshanpur in Dankaur and was crossing the road in front of it when the driver allegedly moved the vehicle forward, crushing her under the wheels before she could react. She was rushed to a nearby hospital, where doctors declared her dead. The bus driver has been arrested.

Police said the girl was a nursery student of Dhruv Public School in Talda village. Officials said the incident occurred around 11.30 am when the child and several other students were dropped near her home following a half-day at school.

According to police, the girl's grandmother was expected to pick her up but could not reach in time as families were not informed about the early dispersal. While other children moved



behind the bus to cross the road, the girl walked in front of the vehicle.

"There was no helper present to supervise the children. The driver allegedly started the bus while the child was near the front wheel," a police officer at Dankaur station said. The driver, identified as

Charan Singh, a resident of Talda village, allegedly drove off after the incident, continuing to drop other children before parking the bus near the school. Passersby alerted the police through the emergency helpline, while family members rushed the child to hospital.

Police said the bus was later seized and the driver taken into custody around 2 pm. A case has been registered under BNS sections 281 (rash or negligent driving) and 106 (death due to negligence).

Police are also investigating why the bus did not have an attendant, a mandatory safety requirement for school transport. The school did not respond to queries.

Traffic police data show a decline in road accidents in the city, with fatalities falling 13.2% in the first quarter of 2026 compared with the same period last year. However, officials said lapses involving school transport remain a critical area of concern.

Commercial LPG price surge to make eating out, ordering costlier

Eating out and ordering in are likely to get significantly costlier as a sharp rise in commercial LPG cylinder prices squeezes restaurants, street vendors and large-scale food operations alike — with most saying they can only absorb the pressure for so long before passing it on to consumers.

The hike has pushed up operating costs across the board and, coupled with recent minimum wage increases, is compressing margins at both ends. For now, most restaurateurs are holding off on menu revisions and exploring alternatives.

"We will explore electric induction and piped gas connections to mitigate the impact. We don't want to pass on the cost to the customer as of now," said Joy Singh, owner of Raasta Cafe and secretary of National Restaurant Association of India (NRAI). He flagged that availability of commercial LPG cylinders is a persistent problem in itself.

Noida restaurateurs echoed the wait-and-watch approach. "The price of



commercial LPG cylinders has been fluctuating for a while, with one of the most significant hikes seen now. We are not in a position to change menu prices yet — we want to see how far this goes," said Varun Khera, president of NRAI's Noida chapter. He added that reprinting menus is an added cost, and establishments are currently absorbing

the hikes as losses. "The price hike is hurting our pockets. We are running our establishments out of our own pockets right now," he said.

Others are less optimistic about how long that can last. "Margins are shrinking, and if the situation continues, passing costs to consumers will be unavoidable," said another restaurant owner.

Industrial-scale food operations say a price revision is already a given. PFTI chairman PK Gupta, who supplies around 30,000 corporate meals daily, said fuel accounts for 10% of input costs. "Commercial LPG was first raised by Rs 400 in March and now by Rs 993," he said, adding that supply constraints compound the pressure. "We are not getting the required number of cylinders." Haryana's recent minimum wage hike has added another layer of cost.

Street vendors, with the least room to absorb shocks, haven't waited — prices are already up, with another round flagged. "It is becoming difficult to operate under the current situation,"

said Mani, who runs a small restaurant in Sector 14.

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Man held after 40 years on run in 1986 Delhi wife murder case

New Delhi: In a breakthrough in a four-decade-old murder case, the Delhi Police has arrested an 82-year-old man who had allegedly killed his wife in 1986 and been on the run since then, an official said on Thursday. The accused, Chandra Shekhar Prasad, a native of Bihar's Nalanda, was apprehended from a factory storeroom in Nangli Poonia area of outer north Delhi, where he had been living under a false identity, he said. The case dates back to October 19, 1986, when Prasad, then 40, allegedly murdered his wife at their Shakarpur residence in east Delhi by crushing her head with bricks over suspicion of an extramarital affair. "During the incident, he and his accomplices also held a domestic help at gunpoint before fleeing the scene," he said. An FIR under sections 302 (murder) and 34 (crime committed with common intention) of the IPC was registered at Shakarpur police station, but the accused evaded arrest and was declared an absconder by a court in 1987. The case remained

unsolved for nearly 40 years due to a lack of leads and the absence of modern investigative tools at the time. Police said trac-

photographs, Aadhaar data or mobile trails from that era, and his age had advanced from around 40 at the time of the crime to

"Investigators found that his children were settled in Delhi and Bihar, and discreetly monitored suspected mobile numbers linked to the family. Field verification in Nalanda confirmed that Prasad was alive and occasionally visited during family or religious events," the officer said. Acting on inputs about one such visit following a bereavement, police mounted surveillance and tracked his movement to Delhi. On April 22, a trap was laid, and the accused was arrested from a factory premises in Alipur. During interrogation, Prasad confessed to the crime, stating that he frequently quarrelled with his wife over suspicions about her character and killed her in a fit of rage before fleeing. Police said during his decades-long escape, he constantly changed locations, living in Bihar, Punjab, Haryana and Delhi. He worked as a rickshaw puller in Punjab's Patiala and even took shelter at an ashram in Haryana to avoid detection. Further investigation is underway.

Wedding caterer's hands lacerated with grinder over payment dispute in Delhi

New Delhi: A caterer's hands were lacerated with an electric grinder over a financial dispute, police said on Saturday, adding that a man has been arrested and two minors have been apprehended in the case. The incident occurred on Friday evening in Vijay Enclave under the Dabri police station limits. "We got a call at 8:30 pm reporting that a man had been grievously assaulted and his hands had been cut using a grinder. A police team immediately rushed to the spot and found Lokesh Gupta (32), a resident of Vijay Enclave, lying in a severely injured condition, bleeding profusely," a police officer told PTI. Gupta, who works as a confectioner (halwai) and also provides tent services, had recently catered for a wedding function organised by Ajay Pal. The function, held on April 20, had a total bill of Rs 2.5 lakh, out of which nearly Rs 2 lakh remained unpaid, he said. Police said that Gupta had gone to Pal's residence to demand his pending payment when a heated argument broke out. "During the confrontation, Ajay Pal, along with two to three associates, attacked Gupta. They caught hold of him, took him to the roof of the house and inflicted deep cuts on his hands using a power grinder," the officer said. The victim was initially rushed to a nearby private facility, but due to the severity of his injuries, he was referred to AIIMS for advanced treatment. Doctors confirmed that the injuries were grievous and caused by a sharp-edged weapon. Police said they have collected evidence from the scene and recorded the victim's statement. A case has been registered, and further investigation was immediately launched. "Ajay Pal (53) has been arrested in connection with the case, while two juveniles have been detained.

He added that the gap of 70 years has been filled and concerted efforts are being made to carve out a Rangla Punjab. "The AAP government is the first one

in the country to implement the People's Manifesto as all the genuine demands raised by the people are being translated into works," he said. Taking on the Akali leadership, CM Bhagwant Singh Mann said, "Sukhbir Singh Badal is not aware about the ground realities as throughout his life he has lived in a secured environment with luxuries and opulence." He added, "Sukhbir Singh Badal is a convent educated political leader of Punjab who is not aware of the basic topography of the state but wants to attain political power in Punjab." He further said, "Leaving everything aside, the former Deputy Chief Minister cannot even differentiate the basic crops of the state as he has scant knowledge about the basic issues." He added that these leaders remained inaccessible due to which they were ousted by the masses. "People of the state have shown the door to these people who looted them turn by turn," he said, adding that people are no longer getting swayed by misleading propaganda. Continuing, CM Bhagwant Singh Mann said, "These haughty politicians had always taken the people of the state for granted due to which they were ultimately shown the door." He added, "These opportunist leaders are baffled as people are not giving them any sort of response, and their agenda is confined to the welfare of their families rather than that of people." said, "Those who cannot find even five members for constituting a committee of their party are day dreaming to win 117 seats in the state." He added that such leaders patronised gangsters and drug smugglers, inflicting serious damage on Punjab's youth. "Akali Dal is a party of political deadwoods which has been rejected by the people time and again," he said. The Chief Minister stated, "Akali leadership is building castles in the air to mislead the people but Punjabis will not get swayed." He added that people will never forgive them and will teach them a befitting lesson again. "They have repeatedly betrayed the state and misled religion for vested political interests," he said. Taking on the BJP, CM Bhagwant Singh Mann said, "The saffron party is welcome to test its waters in the ensuing assembly polls but it must remember that candidates are required on 117 seats." He added, "As the party does not have enough leaders, it will borrow candidates from other parties." He asserted that people are aware of BJP's track record. "There is a long saga of injustice and step motherly treatment of the party against Punjab and its people," he said. Listing key achievements, CM

Bhagwant Singh Mann said, "For the first time farmers have been provided more than eight hours of power supply during paddy season with 95% supply during daytime." He added, "300 units of free electricity per month are being provided to all domestic consumers and around 90% consumers are receiving zero electricity bills." He further said, "More than 65,000 youngsters have got government jobs and people should enroll under Mukh Mantri Sehat Yojna to avail cashless treatment up to ₹10 lakh." CM Bhagwant Singh Mann said, "This is taxpayers' money and every single penny is being utilized for public welfare, something missing in earlier regimes." He added that earlier parties used to play musical chairs to plunder resources. "Baffled by the unprece-

dent works of the Punjab Government, the opposition is making baseless and irrational statements," he said. Autorickshaw driver killed during robbery in Delhi, 3 held after manhunt

New Delhi: An autorickshaw driver was stabbed to death and his vehicle stolen during a robbery near Minto Road in central Delhi, with police arresting three accused after a manhunt that tracked their movement across Delhi and Haryana, an official said on Thursday. The incident was reported at around 5:30 am on April 5, when a PCR call alerted police about an injured man lying near the Shivaji Park bus stand. A police team rushed to the spot and found an unidentified male lying unconscious in a pool of blood on the roadside, with multiple stab injuries on his neck and chest. The victim was shifted to the LNJP Hospital, where doctors declared him brought dead. A medical examination confirmed multiple stab wounds to the chest and anterior neck region. A case was registered at the Kamla Market police station and a probe launched. A joint team relied on a combination of CCTV footage analysis, technical surveillance and local intelligence to identify and track the accused. "Extensive scrutiny of CCTV cameras revealed that five men had boarded the victim's autorickshaw near the Nizamuddin railway sta-

tion on the intervening night of April 4 and 5. Their movement was traced through multiple locations across Delhi, Faridabad and Palwal," the officer said. Acting on specific inputs, police teams laid a trap for around 12 hours near the Palwal railway station and adjoining areas, leading to the arrest of two accused - Yogesh (25) and Yogesh alias Rocky (24), both residents of Palwal. Based on their disclosure, a third accused, Somesh (25), was later apprehended from a spot near the Sarai Kale Khan bus stand in Delhi. "The robbed autorickshaw and a mobile phone of the victim have been recovered. During sustained interrogation, the accused disclosed that they regularly travelled from Palwal to Delhi by night trains to target commuters near railway stations and bus stands. They admitted to committing robbery and assault to fund their drug addiction. "The accused attacked the driver when he resisted the robbery, stabbed him multiple times and fled with the vehicle and the mobile phone, before returning to Palwal. Efforts are on to apprehend two other accused, Sonu and Vikram," the officer added.

'They want to make a deal, I'm not satisfied with it': Trump on Iran's latest proposal to end war

US President Donald Trump said Friday he was "not satisfied" with Iran's latest proposal in negotiations to end the war between the countries, rejecting the plan almost as soon as it was delivered. Iran handed over its latest proposal for negotiations to mediators in Pakistan on Thursday night, Iran's state-run IRNA news agency reported. "They want to make a deal, I'm not satisfied with it, so we'll see what happen," Trump told reporters Friday at the White House.

A shaky three-week ceasefire between the US and Iran appears to be still holding though both countries have traded accusations of violations.

Trump did not elaborate on what he saw as the latest proposal's shortcomings. "They're asking for things I can't agree to," he said.

Negotiations have continued by phone after Trump called off his envoys' trip to Pakistan last week, the president said. He expressed frustration with Iran's leadership, describing it as fractured. "It's a very disjointed leadership," he said. "They all want to make a deal, but they're all messed up."

While the ceasefire has largely halted fighting in Iran, the US and Iran are locked in a standoff over the Strait of Hormuz, through which a fifth of the world's traded oil and gas passes in peacetime. A U.S. Navy blockade stopping Iran's tankers from getting out to sea has Iran's economy reeling. The world economy is also under pressure as Iran maintains its chokehold on the strait.

US President Donald Trump this week floated a new plan to reopen the critical passageway used by America's Gulf allies to export their oil and gas. Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi held a flurry of calls on Friday with many of his regional counterparts, including from Turkey, Egypt, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Iraq and Azerbaijan, to brief.

US military reaches deals with seven tech companies to use their AI on classified systems

The Pentagon said Friday it has partnered with seven tech companies to tap into their artificial intelligence capabilities using classified systems, allowing the military to boost its use of AI to help it fight wars. Google, Microsoft, Amazon Web Services, Nvidia, OpenAI, Reflection and SpaceX will provide their resources to help "augment warfighter decision-making in complex operational environments," the Defense Department said.

The Defense Department has been rapidly accelerating its use of AI in recent years. The technology can help the military reduce the time it takes to identify and strike targets on the battlefield, while aiding in the organization of weapons maintenance and supply lines, according to a report in March from the Brennan Center for Justice.

But AI has already raised concerns over the possibilities of invading Americans' privacy or allowing machines to choose targets on the battlefield. One of the companies contracting with the Pentagon said its agreement required human oversight in certain situations. Such concerns were raised by a certain situation on the list, Anthropic, and it is now battling the Pentagon in court. The tech company said it wanted assurances in its contract that the military would not use its technology in fully autonomous weapons and the surveillance of Americans.

Donald Trump says Iran war 'terminated' as ceasefire holds, in letter to Congress

US President Donald Trump has told congressional leaders that US hostilities with Iran "have terminated," citing an ongoing ceasefire and no exchange of fire since early April, even as lawmakers press the administration on whether it needs formal authorisation for the conflict.

In letters sent on Friday to House Speaker Mike Johnson and Senate President Pro Tempore Chuck Grassley, Trump said the fighting had effectively ended after a truce first ordered on April 7 was extended.

"On April 7, 2026, I ordered a 2-week ceasefire. The ceasefire has since been extended. There has been no exchange of fire between United States Forces and Iran since April 7, 2026," Trump wrote. "The hostilities that began on February 28, 2026 have terminated."

The written assertion follows remarks by War Secretary Pete Hegseth during a Senate hearing a day earlier, where he faced questions over whether the administration must seek approval from Congress under war powers provisions, as the conflict had crossed the 60-day threshold.

Lawmakers from both parties have raised concerns about the lack of congressional authorisation, arguing that extended military engagement requires legislative approval.

In his letter, Trump acknowledged that "the threat Iran poses to the United States and its military remains significant," but said he would continue to direct US forces under his constitutional authority.

"I will continue to direct United States forces consistent with my responsibilities and pursuant to my constitutional authority to conduct United States foreign relations," he wrote.

Five killed as plane carrying pickleball players crashes in Texas

A Cessna carrying Amarillo pickleball players to a New Braunfels tournament crashed near Wimberley, killing all five on board. The crash shook the tight-knit pickleball community, prompting the tournament's cancellation and a planned prayer.

A small plane carrying pickleball players crashed among trees in Texas Hill Country, killing all five people aboard, authorities said Friday. The crash happened around 11 pm Thursday in Wimberley, a city about 40 miles (64 kilometres) southwest of Austin, the Texas Department of Public Safety said. "The pilot and four passengers on

board were pronounced deceased on scene," Sgt. Billy Ray told reporters.

Names of the victims were not immediately released by authorities, though the Amarillo Pickleball Club in Amarillo, Texas, said they were members who were flying to a tournament. An unidentified woman wiped her eyes and fanned her face with her hands as she stood behind yellow police tape near the crash site Friday afternoon. A man consoled her.

The plane, a Cessna 421C, took off from Amarillo and was headed to New Braunfels National Airport, according to the flight history. Aerial photos posted online by the Austin American-Statesman showed the aircraft destroyed in a wooded area. Ray said federal authorities were leading the investigation.

Stacey Rohr, who lives nearby, said she was in bed when she heard a crash and "felt



everything vibrate." "It was so close I felt like it was the back of my place up in flames," said Rohr, who immediately called her landlord.

The players were heading to a pickleball tournament at the Cranky Pickle in New Braunfels, about 30 miles (48 kilometres) northeast of San Antonio, said Martin Robertson, head pro at the venue.

He said they cancelled the tournament Friday and plan to say a prayer before they start Saturday and honour the players who died.

"We're very heavy-hearted, heartbroken from this," he said. "The pickleball community is very tight-knit. Everybody knows everybody."

Dan Dyer, president of the Amarillo Pickleball Club, said he'd played many games with four of the five people who were killed. "I've handed them medals. They were excellent players. They were out to win some games," Dyer said. "Every weekend there are dozens of tournaments. Some people get the bug; others don't. But once they do, they'll travel for a tournament."

Dyer said a second plane was travelling to the event from Amarillo at the same time.

Authorities said it landed safely at the airport in New Braunfels. "I haven't heard anything from him," the pilot of the second plane said, according to Air Traffic Control audio. A controller responded: "He started to move erratically, and now his track is disappeared from the scope. So we want to make sure everything's all right with him."

US approves military sales of over 8.6 billion to Middle East allies

WASHINGTON. (Agency)

US President Donald Trump's administration has bypassed congressional review to approve military sales totaling over \$8.6 billion to Middle Eastern allies Israel, Qatar, Kuwait and the United Arab Emirates.

The State Department announcements on Friday came as the U.S. and Israel's war against Iran marked nine weeks since its start and more than three weeks since a fragile ceasefire came into effect. The State Department said U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio determined that an emergency existed that required immediate sales to those countries and waived the congressional review requirements for the sales. The announcements included approving military sales to Qatar of Patriot air and missile defense replenishment services costing \$4.01



billion and of Advanced Precision Kill Weapon Systems (APKWS) costing \$992.4 million.

They also included approval of the sale to Kuwait of an integrated battle command system costing \$2.5 billion and to Israel of Advanced Precision Kill Weapon Systems costing \$992.4 million. The State Department approved a sale to the UAE of APKWS for \$147.6 million.

The U.S. and Israel attacked Iran on February 28. Iran responded with its own strikes on Israel and Gulf states

that host U.S. bases. U.S.-Israeli strikes on Iran and Israeli attacks in Lebanon have killed thousands and displaced millions. The principal contractor in the APKWS sales to Qatar, Israel and the UAE was BAE Systems BAES.L., the State Department said.

RTX RTX.N and Lockheed Martin LMT.N were the principal contractors in the integrated battle command system sale to Kuwait and in the Patriot air and missile defense replenishment sale to Qatar, the State Department added. Northrop Grumman was also a principal contractor in the Kuwaiti sale. Over the years, Washington has faced scrutiny for military ties with Kuwait, the UAE and Qatar over those countries' human rights track records that rights advocates say involve restrictions on and reported abuses of minorities, journalists, voices of dissent, the LGBT community and laborers.

14 IRGC personnel killed in blast while clearing war remnants in Iran

Fourteen members of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) were killed and two others wounded in an explosion caused by unexploded ordnance in the country's northwestern Zanjan Province, Iranian media reported. The blast occurred on Friday as IRGC demolition teams were conducting a clearance operation in a contaminated area near the city of Zanjan, according to statements carried by state news agency IRNA. The teams had entered the site to identify and neutralize munitions left behind from recent airstrikes when the explosion happened.

A statement from the IRGC's Ansar al-Mahdi unit in Zanjan said the blast was triggered by an unknown munition.



The report noted that those killed were among the force's most experienced and specialised personnel. The ammunition in the area was believed to include cluster bombs and air-dropped mines used during the conflict.

The incident marks the largest reported loss of IRGC personnel since a ceasefire took effect on April 8, highlighting the ongoing risk posed by remnants of war even after active

fighting has ended. According to the IRGC, its teams have identified and neutralised more than 15,000 unexploded ordnance across affected areas since the conflict.

The war began on February 28 when the United States and Israel launched joint strikes on Iranian cities, including Tehran, prompting retaliatory missile and drone attacks by Iran targeting Israeli territory and US assets in the region. The conflict caused widespread damage and casualties before a ceasefire was announced on April 8. Despite the ceasefire, cleanup operations continue across impacted regions, with authorities warning that unexploded munitions remain a significant threat to both military personnel and civilians.

Court restricts abortion access across US by blocking mailing of mifepristone

A federal appeals court has restricted access to one of the most common means of abortion in the US by blocking the mailing of mifepristone prescriptions.

Friday's unanimous ruling from a three-judge panel of the New Orleans-based 5th US Circuit Court of Appeals is requiring that the abortion pill be distributed only in person and at clinics, overruling regulations set by the federal Food and Drug Administration. The ruling, which is likely to be appealed to the US Supreme Court, is the biggest jolt to abortion policy in the US since the 2022 Supreme Court ruling that overturned Roe v. Wade and allowed states to enforce abortion bans.

In the ruling, Judge Kyle Duncan, who was appointed by President Donald Trump, agreed with the state of Louisiana's contention that allowing the drug to be mailed there makes moot the state's ban on abortion at all stages of pregnancy.

"Every abortion facilitated by FDA's action cancels Louisiana's ban on medical abortions and undermines its policy that 'every unborn child is human being from the moment of conception and is, therefore, a legal person,'" the ruling states.

Mifepristone is involved in most abortions in the US

Mifepristone was approved in 2000 as a safe and effective way to end early pregnancies. It is typically used in combination with a second drug, misoprostol. Surveys have found that the majority of abortions in the US are provided via pills and that about 1 in 4 abortions nationally are prescribed via telehealth. One survey of abortion providers last year estimated that more women in states where abortion is banned obtained abortions that way than by traveling to other states.

Some Democratic-led states have laws that seek to protect providers who prescribe via telehealth to patients in places with bans. That rise in prominence is why abortion opponents have targeted the pills in legislation and litigation.

Elite Iranian family founded crypto exchange used by IRGC to move millions: Report

Reuters found that the founders of Iran's biggest crypto exchange, Nobitex, are sons of the influential Kharrazi family. Nobitex serves as a bridge to global crypto markets and a central node in a parallel financial system used to move funds beyond the reach of Western sanctions. Reuters found. It's used by the Iranian state to route money to allies outside the conventional banking system, according to an analysis of blockchain records by crypto analytic firm Crystal Intelligence and interviews with four private financial investigators.

The sons of a powerful family with close ties to Iran's new supreme leader control the country's largest cryptocurrency exchange, transforming it from a startup into a conduit to the global economy used by both blacklisted state institutions and ordinary citizens. Since Nobitex was founded by the

two brothers under an alternative family name, it has processed between tens and hundreds of millions of dollars in transactions linked to sanctioned groups including Iran's central bank and the powerful Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, a Reuters investigation has found.

The two are members of the Kharrazi family, one of the most influential dynasties in the Islamic Republic. Corporate records show that when the exchange started, the brothers were listed under a surname rarely used by members of the family.

The company rapidly became embedded in Iran's economy. Nobitex claims 11 million users, more than 10% of Iran's population. Locked out of international banking and facing a devalued rial and rampant inflation, ordinary Iranians use the exchange to buy and hold cryptocurrency. While Iran is subject to blanket Western economic sanctions, the exchange has



avoided being designated by the United States and its allies. Reuters could find no indications that anyone in the Kharrazi family has been sanctioned by Western governments, and was unable to determine why Nobitex has been spared the kind of penalties placed on other major Iranian economic players.

The revelation of the elite origins of the Nobitex founders by Reuters comes at a critical moment for Iran and especially the Revolutionary Guards, known as the IRGC. The IRGC has further cemented its

control of Iran's economy and security apparatus since the killing of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei in a February airstrike at the outset of the U.S. and Israeli war in Iran. The brothers are the third Kharrazi generation at the heart of Iran's ruling establishment. Kharrazis have advised supreme leaders and occupied key political, diplomatic and religious posts. The clan is related by marriage to all three supreme leaders of the Islamic Republic: the revolutionary founder Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, the late Khamenei, and Khamenei's son, Mojtaba. Brothers Ali and Mohammad Kharrazi – using the family surname Aghamir – built Nobitex into the country's dominant cryptocurrency provider. It handles an estimated 70% of Iran's crypto transactions. It's not unheard of for some Iranians to have and use alternative family names. But the brothers appear to be the only ones in their immediate family to routinely distance themselves.

Anna University's 'Train-the-Trainer' to upskill faculty members

CHENNAI.(Agency)

As part of efforts to future-proof engineering education, Anna University through its Centre for Academic Courses (CAC) has announced a series of 'Train-the-Trainer' programmes that will upskill faculty members in affiliated colleges to "bring industry practices directly into classrooms". The university expects a wave of proposals seeking introduction of specialised courses in chip design, VLSI, EV systems and related domains. This comes on the back of a significant expansion in engineering education last year, when the total sanctioned intake rose from around 1.80 lakh to over 2.02 lakh seats. Notably, over 1,100 additional seats were added in electronics and allied streams closely linked to semiconductor technologies.

To ensure teaching quality keeps pace with this growth, the university developed the 'Train-the-Trainer' programmes.

One such programme, 'RTL to GDS II VLSI Design Flow Using Open Source EDA Tools' will be held from May 25 to May 30 at the College of Engineering, Guindy campus. It will provide hands-on training in the complete chip design cycle -- from RTL design and synthesis to GDS II generation using tools such as OpenROAD and Magic.

"Faculty members must be trained in end-to-end design methodologies to effectively prepare students for semiconductor careers," a university official said. "These programmes are designed to bring industry practices directly into classrooms," the official added.

Cop sexually harasses woman on beach in Chennai's Besant Nagar,

A police head constable was arrested on Friday for allegedly sexually harassing a 21-year-old woman, who was consuming food with her college friend in a car at the Elliot's beach in Besant Nagar on Wednesday night, and for extorting Rs 8,000 from them.

According to sources, the woman, who is from Adyar and pursuing engineering at a private college in Kelambakkam, was sitting in the car at the beach and consuming food with her college friend from Arumbakkam around 8 pm on Wednesday when Joseph (34) flashed torchlight into the vehicle and entered inside.

Joseph is a head constable attached to the High Court Campus police station. He, however, showed an identity card and told the two that he was part of the Shastri Nagar police and demanded money. He threatened to "disclose" the duo's "relationship" to their parents, book a case against the two and take them to the police station if they failed to pay.

The male student then headed to a nearby ATM to withdraw money. In the meantime, Joseph questioned the woman and sexually abused her. When her male friend returned, the accused took Rs 8,000 from him and rode away on a motorcycle, sources said.

After returning home, the woman narrated the incident to her sister, who, in turn, alerted their parents. Following this, her father lodged a complaint with the Shastri Nagar police on Thursday.

'Modi Tattva', RSS, Hinduism & patriotism in Vadodra

MSU's new Sociology courses

VADODRA.(Agency)

A MODULE on 'Modi Tattva', lessons on RSS fieldwork and a return to Indian knowledge systems — Maharaja Sayajirao (MS) University of Baroda has introduced a new curriculum that is set to study Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership as a concept, integrate indigenous knowledge systems, Hindu religion studies and nationalism in three major courses. These will now be part of the 10 papers of the fourth year of the BA Sociology course as well as the first year of the two-year Masters in Sociology programme.

The modules, 'Sociology of Bharat', 'Hindu Sociology' and 'Sociology of Patriotism', are courses of four credits each, which form part of the restructuring of sociology education at MSU from the forthcoming academic year starting in June, designed to "align academic framework with India's civilisational knowledge, contemporary governance and lived social realities".

Conceptualised by the university's Sociology Department head Dr Virendra Singh, who is chairperson of the Board of Studies of MSU as well as a part of Niti Aayog Project for monitoring public policies and a member of the district administration's 'Vadodra 2047' plan, the approach seeks to build what he called a "practice-oriented, inquiry-driven sociology, rooted in both historical depth and present-day relevance."

Singh told The Indian Express on Friday that 'Modi Tattva' — a part of the Sociology of Patriotism course — is a study of the leadership of the Prime Minister, drawing from German sociologist Max Weber's concept of "charismatic authority".

GBA's pick to draft city master plan awaits government nod

BENGALURU.(Agency)

The Greater Bengaluru Authority (GBA) has finalised an agency through global tenders to draft the first-ever master plan for the city with a 20-year horizon and is likely to have the target set for 2047, officials in the civic body's town planning department said.

The officials said the last approved master plan — RMP 2015 — was drafted in 2005, and the new one will be prepared for 2047 for 686.82 square kilometres of the city, driven by data including the latest developments and the plan laid for the evolving needs of the city.

A senior official of the department told, "Three bidders took part in the tender process for drafting the master plan based



on Geographic Information System (GIS) for Bengaluru, of which two were chosen for the financial bidding. The final bidder has been selected by the GBA and sent to the state government for approval.

"All previous master plans for the city were prepared by the Bangalore Development

Authority (BDA). This is the first time the GBA is drafting the city plan. Earlier, the combined area of Bengaluru — those under the GBA and those under the BDA — was 1,207 square kilometres. With the BDA drafting the master plan for the areas under it, GBA's master plan would cover 686.82 square kilometres," the official said.

While the BDA is drafting Revised Master Plan 2041, the GBA is aiming for 2047. The official said both master plans will be in sync, as geographically there is a boundary but both are aimed at a larger Bengaluru. "Generally, the master plans are prepared for 20 years, and the new one is aimed at 2047. A final decision on the year would be taken at a later stage," the official said.

Around Town: The Chembur jalebi shop built by a Partition family that even the Kapoors loved

MUMBAI.(Agency)

The Jagwani family arrived in Bombay from Sindh, Karachi, with nothing. No place to stay, no shop — only a trade they knew. For years after Partition, they made do with what they had: a home that doubled as a small factory, turning out ladoos, halwa and sugar candy 'lollipops', and selling them wherever someone would buy — on trains, at Irani hotels and coffee houses around the city, wherever there was a customer. It was Magumal Khatumal Jagwani who eventually made the leap to a proper street presence. Not a shop, but a cart. "The kind vegetables are sold from," said Bharat Magumal Jagwani, 62. A modest start for what would become one of Chembur's most enduring sweet shops, now known as Satu's Sweets Snacks and Namkeen.

The business name 'Satu's' was handwritten on a slate in chalk. "It was named after my great-grandfather Satumal Magumal Karachiwala, who had a thriving business in Karachi. My grandfather Khatumal Satumal Jagwani and father also worked there before they had to



upend their lives," said Bharat. That cart was parked near what is now the Crime Branch office in Chembur, shared Bharat's son Krishna, 32, adding that when the establishment came up and the cart had to move, the government gave them a small space to set up shop. It was no more than 10 by 10 feet.

In 1958, Magumal Khatumal Jagwani moved into that shop and formalised the business. "There was no shutter, just a cloth tied across the front at night. One kadhai. One product: jalebi. Alongside it was a tea stall called Satu's Tea and Cold Drink Centre, separated from the sweet

shop by a partition," recalled Bharat.

The jalebi was the reason people came. And it still is. All the celebrities from nearby RK Studio and Homi Wadia's Basant Studio would pack samosa and jalebi from here. "Raj Kapoor would personally come every Sunday to buy jalebis.

My father would make it himself. Even his son Rajiv used to come before he entered the film industry. Randhir and Rishi would also come, as did Dara Singh and Dharmendra," shared Bharat, who joined the business in 1972 after completing his 10th standard. He expanded it. First came Bengali sweets. Then, within a year or two, a full snacks counter — patties, chole bhature, dal pakwan, kachori, vada, dhokla and papda.

Then an entire range of kaju varieties beyond just katli, say mewa bites, mawa jalebi, sitting alongside Sindhi delights like sev barfi, which old Sindhi customers still call singar ki mithai. The shop that began with one pan of jalebi now offers more than 200 varieties of sweets and over 15 kinds of namkeen.

Proposal for directly-elected mayor for Hyderabad civic polls under consideration

HYDERABAD.(Agency)

Will voters directly elect their mayor in the upcoming civic polls across Hyderabad's Core Urban Region (CURE)? While the state government has not announced a decision, the proposal is under active discussion and could shape elections due this year for the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC), Cyberabad Municipal Corporation (CMC) and Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC), each with populations exceeding one million.

The debate has gained traction following a recent report by NITI Aayog titled Moving Towards Effective City Government: A Framework for Million-Plus Cities (2026). It recommends that mayors in large cities be directly elected by citizens and serve fixed five-year terms. The proposal includes a mayor-

in-council system, shifting the role from largely ceremonial to executive, with greater authority over civic administration.

The recommendations aim to improve accountability, continuity and

executive power. Administrative authority largely rests with municipal commissioners, often resulting in blurred responsibilities, weak political oversight and reduced accountability.

Urban policy experts argue that a directly elected mayor could provide clearer leadership, reduce political bargaining and enable faster decisions on core civic services such as sanitation, infrastructure, water supply and transport.

The idea is not entirely new to Hyderabad. Under the former Municipal Corporation of Hyderabad, voters directly elected their mayor in 2002.

Teegala Krishna Reddy won that election, defeating Mir Zulfiqar Ali. The system was later replaced with indirect elections following the formation of GHMC, where alliances among parties, including All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen, have often influenced outcomes.



NIA visits Mumbai Press Club after it suspends three members over Bhima Koregaon accused gathering

Two days after the Mumbai Press Club suspended three members over an event attended by accused persons out on bail in the Bhima Koregaon case, officials of the National Investigation Agency (NIA) visited the club seeking documents related to the gathering, according to a statement issued by the club Friday.

The development pertains to a January 19 event at the Mumbai Press Club that was attended by several accused in the 2018 Bhima Koregaon case — these included Varavara Rao, Vernon Gonsalves, Arun Ferreira, Gautam Navlakha, Anand Teltumbde, Hany Babu, Rona Wilson and Sudhir Dhawale — all of whom are currently out on bail.

The Press Club said the gathering had taken place in the presence of former office-bearers, including former president Gurbir Singh. The club stated that while granting bail, the Supreme Court and the special NIA court had imposed conditions restricting some of the accused from meeting one another while out on bail. According to the club, the January 19 gathering raised questions about a possible violation of those conditions.

Following an internal inquiry based on complaints from two members, the club's managing committee suspended three members — former president Gurbir Singh, senior journalist Bernard D'Mello and Shrikant Modak — stating that they had



organised or facilitated the gathering. In its statement, the club said its inquiry committee reviewed documents, CCTV footage and statements from staff members before concluding that the three had "collectively facilitated a gathering

Man gets life imprisonment for raping minor, her parents booked for perjury

AHMEDABAD.(Agency)

In a rare case wherein parents whose daughter survived rape now face criminal proceedings for perjury, a Porbandar court has ordered legal proceedings against the complainant in a case of rape with a minor girl in the same order in which the accused rapist was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment.

Porbandar's additional district and sessions judge (special POCSO judge) PH Sharma, after considering the oral and documentary evidence presented by the prosecution as well as the arguments presented by both the parties, convicted and sentenced the rape accused to rigorous imprisonment for life and a fine of Rs 2.47 lakh, said the Porbandar police.

Speaking to the Indian Express, Deputy SP Surjeet Mahedu, the investigation officer in the case, said, "The complainant and his wife (mother of the victim) were declared hostile witnesses by the government prosecutor during their testimony before the court. Taking this into consideration, the Special POCSO Court ordered action against the complainant and his wife under CrPC section 344 (perjury)."

The incident dates to October 6, 2023. The survivor and her friend were walking to their tuition class in Porbandar when the accused offered the two a ride to a hospital where, he claimed, the survivor's mother was admitted after falling sick. The survivor, who was a minor then and hails from a Scheduled Caste community, and the convict knew each other from before.

According to the police, the accused was driving the two out of town when the two girls protested. He threatened them to comply with him and claimed that he had a knife on him.

According to the police, the man took the minor girl to a secluded location on the outskirts of the town and forced her to engage in sexual relations with him.

Man sexually assaults minor girl at her residence in Hyderabad; POCSO case registered

HYDERABAD.(Agency)

Goshamahall police arrested a man on Friday for the alleged sexual assault of a minor girl. The incident, which took place on April 28, led to charges under both the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the POCSO Act.

According to the police, the accused, identified as Shailender Singh, allegedly orchestrated a situation to isolate the victim at her residence by sending her younger siblings away to buy tea powder. Once alone, Singh reportedly entered the victim's bedroom and physically assaulted her. The complaint states that the accused used criminal force to silence the girl, covering her mouth so forcefully that she briefly lost consciousness due to a lack of oxygen. The matter came to light on the night of April 30 when the victim, supported by her father and aunt, approached the authorities. Following the incident, Singh allegedly attempted to intimidate the family into dropping the matter.

Upon receiving the complaint on April 30, police immediately registered a case under sections 74, 75, 76 (relating to sexual assault and outraging modesty), 351, and 352 (Criminal Intimidation and Assault) of the BNS and section 7 and 8 (Sexual Assault on a minor) of the POCSO Act. Investigation is underway.

that may have led to violations of bail conditions within the Club premises", exposing the institution to "significant legal and reputational risk".

On April 29, the club said, NIA officials approached its office-bearers after learning about the suspensions through media reports and sought documents related to the incident. "We have been contacted by NIA officials and are extending full cooperation. All relevant documents sought by the agency have been shared and all necessary assistance has been extended in accordance with applicable laws and procedures," the club said in its statement Friday.

Cardio-metabolic diseases: A burden that can't just be sweated off

Richard Doll was a famous British epidemiologist. Along with Richard Peto, a brilliant Oxford statistician, he led a long-term study of thousands of British doctors to identify factors which impacted their health. The study, which started in 1951, carefully documented deaths and analysed them by cause and age. It showed that half of all regular smokers were killed by their tobacco habit. Half of those deaths occurred in middle age. On average, regular smokers lost about 10 years of their life expectancy compared to non-smokers. Deaths occurred mainly from cardiovascular disease and a variety of cancers. Stopping smoking before the age of 30 years averted a majority of these premature deaths.

This study catalysed public policy interventions for tobacco control worldwide. The World Health Organization's Framework Convention on Tobacco Control and India's own tobacco control legislation emerged in 2003. Craving for nicotine, which is as addictive as heroin or cocaine, requires a determined effort for cessation. Such efforts are countered by the tobacco industry, which attempts to retain nicotine addicts in its grasp by luring them with novel products such as e-cigarettes and nicotine pouches. Reducing the risk of avoidable mid-life mortality became a major goal of public health experts, who directed their attention to modifiable risk factors like tobacco consumption (in any form), unhealthy diets, physical inactivity, uncontrolled hypertension and poorly managed diabetes. Doll made the case for impactful public health and clinical interventions which reduce the risk of premature death by succinctly stating, "In old age death is inevitable, but death before old age is not." He lived to be 92, proving his point.

Delaying death should not be the only goal of public health. Death may come late but disease, damage and disability should not come long before. It is, therefore, necessary to adopt a life course approach to promote policies which prevent acquisition of risk at a young age (childhood and adolescence), early detection of risk factors and their effective control in young and middle-aged adults, coupled with clinical care of manifest disease to avert fatal outcomes and reduce disability at all ages.

Cardio-metabolic diseases (CMDs) are presently the leading cause of death, globally and in India. They encompass a cluster of diseases characterised by disordered glucose and lipid metabolism, resulting in damage to blood vessels in different parts of the body and multiple organ dysfunction which can manifest as acute life-threatening emergencies or chronic prolonged deterioration of health. Coronary heart disease (heart attacks) and stroke (paralytic brain attacks) are the most prominent disorders in this group along with diabetes. Peripheral vascular disease (which can lead to gangrene of limbs), fatty-liver disease and vascular dementia are among others now featuring in the expanding cluster of CMDs. For a variety of reasons, Indians are especially vulnerable to such diseases. Physiological adaptation to poor intrauterine and early-childhood malnutrition makes them vulnerable to 'rebound adiposity', as they gain access to more food in later years. Low skeletal muscle mass makes them more insulin resistant and glucose intolerant, leading to many millions affected by diabetes and pre-diabetes. Fat accumulation in and around abdominal organs (visceral adiposity) is especially dangerous, as it stokes rampant inflammation, scorching blood vessels and scarring many organs. Lack of physical activity ensures that the muscles remain insulin resistant. Smoking too increases insulin resistance, as do unhealthy fats in the diet.

Trinco story travels a long way

The Gulf War has at least had one positive effect -- the creation of larger strategic oil reserves. One of the most significant measures is the Trincomalee (Trinco) Oil Tank Farms project in Sri Lanka. Languishing since 1987, the development of the Trinco Energy Hub is now on the anvil, to be connected with multi-purpose pipelines and power grids between the two countries. In a smart diplomatic move, New Delhi sent Vice-President CP Radhakrishnan, who also happens to be Tamilian, to Sri Lanka recently, in what was the first bilateral visit by any Vice President to Sri Lanka, raising the protocol from the customary contact of Foreign Minister Jaishankar who last visited Colombo in December 2025. The Radhakrishnan call was significant for three reasons: it focused on transforming Trinco as an energy hub; it helped revive the "Tamil question"; and it embedded India's strategic stature as first responder in India's neighbourhood. Like the landslide political victory of the Rashtriya Swatantra Party in Nepal, Sri Lanka's left-wing National People's Power party stormed into power in 2024 decimating traditional parties, including the once-strong Tamil bloc.

President Anura Kumara Dissanayake a former Marxist from the Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) party, which in the 1980s had opposed the 1987 India-Sri Lanka Accord, has recognised Delhi's preeminence in the region and highlighted its Neighbourhood First policy by recounting India's crucial interventions: the economic crisis in 2022; the financial lifeline that followed the crisis of debt; and relief during cyclone Dityah. Radhakrishnan said India will stand with Sri Lanka's "successes and struggles like an affectionate elder brother", a term that rebounded in Nepal. In its election manifesto NPP had said: Trinco oil tank farms will be renovated with support of a friendly foreign country. Last month, with Radhakrishnan and Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri flanking him, Sri Lanka Foreign Minister Vijitha Herath called the Trinco project a permanent solution to the developing energy crisis in the Indian subcontinent, whilst referring to the ongoing war in the Persian Gulf. Misri, earlier Deputy High Commissioner in Colombo, briefed the media in Colombo on several bilateral matters, including the Trinco Energy Hub. It will be instructive to recall the strategic importance of Trinco

Harbour and Port as penned by former Sri Lankan Admiral Ravi Wijegunaratne, who noted that the Dutch, French and British colonial powers contested Trincomalee because it was the gateway to the Bay of Bengal. British admiral Lord Nelson described Trinco as "the finest and deepest harbour in the world". In 1935, the British built 100 oil tanks with impregnable Manchester steel, with the capacity to hold 1 mn tonnes of petroleum, long enough for six months of strategic petroleum reserve. For Sri Lanka, Trincomalee is a 'national asset'. In the past, several trade unions and political parties have protested energy cooperation with

The Tamil question over the years has been relegated to 'Tamil aspirations'; this is true even for those in the political doldrums especially after the political mauling of the fractured Tamil parties in the Northern Province, considered a Tamil stronghold for decades. NPP won three of nine seats in Jaffna districts, topping the vote share for the first time; remarkably, a non-Tamil national alliance had won seats in Jaffna. The Tamil National Alliance, which at one time had 16 seats, is today reduced to 12 seats. (Back In 1977, Tamil United Liberation Front was the main opposition party with 18 seats.) Provincial elections have not been held for seven years but there is no indication they will be held anytime soon. While Dissanayake has been telling Tamils that the new Constitution will address the "Tamil question", Radhakrishnan informed Tamil leaders that he had discussed the issue with his Sri Lankan interlocutors.

Certainly, the Tamils have genuine reasons to be upset with Sinhala majority rulers, whether they belong to the Left or the Right. The Tamils point out that the spirit of the India Sri Lanka accord, which was a treaty between two countries -- which guaranteed under a proposed 13th Amendment equality between Tamil and Sinhala, opening the door to a federal model of power sharing and devolution within a 'united, undivided and indivisible Sri Lanka' -- has not been implemented.

The late Tamil leader, R Sambanthan, had said: "India has special duty in ensuring the resolution of the Tamil question". But no longer do Indian leaders even mention the implementation of the 13th Amendment or talk about reconciliation

that followed military excesses during the Eelam war. Admittedly, Colombo has built a memorial to uphold the sacrifices of 1257 Indian Peace Keeping Force soldiers who facilitated the ultimate defeat of LTTE, back in 1990. Traditionally, Sri Lankan leaders used to say: "We look to India for our security and China for economic growth". After the 2022 economic meltdown and debt crisis, the tables have been turned, especially after India provided the \$4 billion financial lifeline.

Still, the Trinco Energy Hub is breaking news. Colombo's Daily Mirror, a premier newspaper, described it as follows on April 22: "It is no longer a matter of strategic vision but how urgently it can be executed".



India, seeing it as a ceding of sovereignty. That's why, despite several agreements and MoUs, none could fructify. The three decade-long Tamil Eelam war didn't help.

In 2003, Indian Oil Corporation signed a 35-year lease to develop 15 oil tanks, with an annual payment of \$ 100,000. Sri Lanka Oil Corporation utilises 16 tanks for fuel storage, offshore bunkering and has rented three to Prima Flour Mill Singapore for water storage. Radhakrishnan discussed the renovation of oil tanks and laying of a multi purpose oil transfer pipeline between Karaikal/Chennai to Trincomalee. A solar power project is also under construction in Sampore in Trinco. The iron is hot for the Trinco Energy hub to be finally executed.

New Zealand trade deal: Positive way forward, address concerns too

MERCHANDISE trade between India and New Zealand stood at a modest \$1.3 billion in 2024-25. India's share in the island country's total import market of \$47.5 billion last year was just 2 per cent. Billed as historic, the free trade agreement (FTA) aims for a dramatic, long-term shift. The push to diversify exports to a high-income market also opens doors for a larger Indian footprint in the Asia-Pacific region. The positives are many. There are concerns too. The deal, once ratified, will cut or remove tariffs on 95 per cent of exports to India. Conversely, since 58 per cent of New Zealand's tariff lines are already duty-free, its offer to fully open up the field for Indian exporters provides an opportunity, but the gains could be limited in a competitive environment. The risks of a trade deficit in the face of rising imports call for domestic reforms that incentivise innovation and good practices. Forestry and



horticulture exporters from New Zealand could gain a foothold in a market that values scale and reliability.

Among fruit growers in Himachal Pradesh as well as Jammu and Kashmir, already reeling under extreme weather patterns, the prospect of cheaper apples or kiwi fruit on sale poses another challenge. New Delhi's quota and time limits may not be enough to assuage apprehensions. A focus on improved crop produce, storage and supply chain strategies is essential. No sweeping liberalisation for milk powder or mass dairy exports comes as a relief, though how it plays out is uncertain. Access across 118 services sectors in New Zealand is an encouraging sign. For Indian students and professionals, more visa pathways and post-study work rights are a huge plus. Even as the possibility of uneven benefits looms, doubling trade by 2031 could just be the momentum the partnership needs.

Building resilience against Mythos brahmastra

The marriage of IoT and AI is a transition that dwarfs the original Internet's impact

In the 'Sauptika Parva' of the Mahabharata, after the war at Kurukshetra, Ashvatthama and Arjuna each unleash the Brahmashirastra, a weapon of such totality that Vyasa himself must intervene. Arjuna, at Krishna's counsel, withdraws his. Ashvatthama cannot, and in bitterness turns his towards the womb of Uttara. The sequence is instructive. Certain divyastras were withheld because their release would unmake the world, and the danger lay not in the weapon alone but in the asymmetry of those who held it. In 2019, OpenAI announced that a large language model it had trained was too dangerous to release. It was GPT-2. It was released within months. Seven years on, the same warning has returned, and this time the warners are harder to dismiss. On April 7, Anthropic—now valued at roughly \$800 billion—declared its latest model, Claude Mythos, "substantially beyond" anything previously trained. CEO Dario Amodei decided against a general release. The UK's AI Security Institute, the only non-US entity granted access, confirmed that Mythos completed a 32-step simulated cyber intrusion no prior model had accomplished. Anthropic claims Mythos has identified severe 'zero-day' security flaws across every major operating system and web browser, including a flaw that had evaded detection for 27 years, and others in Unix-family systems including FreeBSD. CrowdStrike claimed that AI-enabled cyberattacks were up 89 percent in 2025, and the average time between initial access and malicious action has fallen to 29 minutes, a 65 percent acceleration over the 2024 average.

That is the controversy, shorn of dramatisation. A private American firm has built an autonomous agent capable of chaining multi-step intrusions—privilege escalation, lateral movement, exfiltration—against the commodity software stack on which the world's banks, hospitals, power grids and payment systems rest. It has then

decided, unilaterally, who may use it to patch themselves.

Anthropic's Project Glasswing's 40-odd early-access firms include Apple, Microsoft, Google, J P Morgan, Goldman Sachs, Cisco, CrowdStrike and the Linux Foundation. Eleven of the named partners are American. The only non-US door opened has been to the UK. The European Commission has met Anthropic three times and not been given the model. Germany's BSI has received briefings, not access. Canada's finance minister has compared the threat to a closure of the Strait of Hormuz. The Bank of England's governor has said Anthropic may have "cracked the whole cyber-risk world open". India has no seat at this table. India's scheduled commercial banks, NPCI's UPI rails, the core banking stacks of public-sector lenders, GSTN, DigiLocker, FASTag, state load-despatch centres and CBDT servers run on precisely the commodity operating systems and browser runtimes in which Mythos has identified flaws. It was reported on April 22 that the Reserve Bank is reduced to consulting the Federal Reserve and Bank of England about a model it cannot examine. NPCI is attempting to secure early access and is being told that the servers are American and that local-data testing in foreign jurisdictions is not feasible. Britain's worst-case bank-hack modelling, published before Mythos existed, described direct debits failing, rents and wages unpaid, ATMs frozen, point-of-sale payments rejected at petrol stations and a run beginning on rival lenders. The challenges for the Indian government are of three kinds. First, access. The proposition that a private corporation may decide who is permitted to defend themselves is one no sovereign should accept. Second, regulatory scaffolding. The IT Act of 2000 was drafted when broadband penetration in India was below 1 percent. Section 70A of that Act

constitutes the National Critical Information Infrastructure Protection Centre (NCIIPC), but confers no evaluation power over foreign-trained models. The DPDP Act of 2023 addresses personal data, not frontier-



model dual use. CERT-In's directions of April 2022 mandate 6-hour incident reporting, but are silent on pre-incident model evaluation. MeitY's AI advisories are, well, advisory. Third, time. Anthropic itself expects comparable models to proliferate, including to less safety-conscious open-source labs, within 18 months. What is to be done? Several concrete measures, each of them overdue. One, statutory evaluation access. The IT Act should be amended (whether by a new dedicated provision or by an extension of CERT-In's powers under Section 70B) to require any frontier-model developer offering commercial services in India to submit the model for capability and misuse evaluation by a designated national evaluator, on the AI Safety Institute's template. No evaluation, no licence to operate. The UK, a jurisdiction of almost 70 million, secured such access in under two years. India has 1.4 billion, and a payments system processing over 18

billion transactions a month. Two, an Indian AI Safety Institute, with statutory backing and the technical apparatus to conduct independent capability, jailbreak and agentic-behaviour evaluations. Not another advisory body. An institute with teeth.

Three, live red-team capacity at CERT-In and NCIIPC, running frontier-model-generated exploits against the critical information infrastructure sectors already notified (power, banking, telecom, transport, strategic public enterprises) rather than producing compliance checklists. Four, a mandatory Software Bill of Materials (SBOM) for every critical information infrastructure operator, on the lines of US Executive Order 14028 of May 2021, with machine-readable SBOMs deposited with NCIIPC. Without an SBOM, a bank hearing that Mythos has found a FreeBSD zero-day cannot tell whether it runs FreeBSD, and where. Five, revision of the RBI Cyber Security Framework for Banks of June 2016. Video shows Jabalpur cruise boat rocking dangerously, overturning amid strong winds

Over 30 revellers were on board the ill-fated boat when the tragedy struck them at Bargi Dam in the Narmada River backwaters on Thursday, leaving nine people dead and several others missing.

At least nine people lost their lives in a boat capsizing accident in Madhya Pradesh's Jabalpur, raising safety concerns around public amusement facilities and exposing grave administrative and management lapses. Over 30 revellers were on board the ill-fated boat when the tragedy struck them at Bargi Dam in the Narmada River backwaters on Thursday, leaving nine people dead and several others missing. Following the incident, several before and after videos of the capsizing have gone viral on social media, prompting huge public response and grief. One such video shows the boat wildly foundering amid gusty winds and strong river currents as the weather worsened. The clip shows the cruise boat overturning, struggling to

maintain its balance, before finally capsizing as those on the banks of the river filmed the event with their mobile cameras.

The boat completely disappeared and capsized in a matter of a few minutes.

MOMENTS BEFORE TRAGEDY STRUCK

Another video recorded just moments before the cruise boat capsized has also surfaced. The video shows tourists enjoying the cool weather and strong winds. Those on the boat had no idea of the danger looming nearby. In the video, the passengers are seen enjoying the pleasant weather as strong winds blow over the water. The force of the wind can be clearly seen in the footage.

However, within minutes, the weather



suddenly deteriorated, and the boat capsized, killing nine of them.

The footage also shows that none of the passengers were wearing life jackets at the time.

Some later put on life jackets, helping to save many more. Officials estimate that the use of safety equipment eventually resulted in

the survival of around 25 people.

THE JABALPUR CRUISE CAPSIZES

The Jabalpur accident occurred on Thursday evening at the Bargi Dam on the Narmada River, where a sudden storm engulfed the entire area. Caught in the surging waters and strong winds, the boat lost its balance and capsized. The death toll rose to nine after five more bodies were recovered from the capsized boat on Friday.

Rescue continued with teams from the Army, the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) searching the reservoir, while low visibility continued to hamper rescue efforts. Officials feared that more bodies might still be trapped within the wreckage of the boat. According to

eyewitnesses, the weather rapidly deteriorated, and strong winds caused the river to swell.

Several passengers reportedly signalled danger and pleaded with the boat crew to turn back, but their warnings were ignored, and the boat drifted before capsizing. Later, some locals used ropes to rescue passengers wearing life jackets. Following this incident, the state government has banned the operation of other similar cruise boats and launched an investigation into the tragic accident.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep condolences over the incident, announcing financial assistance of Rs 2 lakh to the families of the deceased and Rs 50,000 to the injured from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund (PMNRF).

Madras HC bins plea for case against seven ex-mins, says it will be ED's call

In a significant ruling, the Madras High Court has held that mere registration of an FIR on a predicate offence does not mandate the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to register a case on money laundering but the subjective satisfaction of the authorised officer of the agency is essential for initiating such proceedings.

Dismissing petitions seeking directions to the ED to register Enforcement Case Information Report (ECIR) based on FIRs registered by the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption (DVAC) against seven former AIADMK ministers, the court said the central agency is free to decide on initiating money laundering proceedings under Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) against them.

The ruling was given by the first bench of Chief Justice Sushrut Arvind Dharmadhikari and Justice G Arul Murugan on petitions filed by DMK MP R Girirajan seeking ED action on the ex-ministers for alleged misappropriation of public funds.

"The registration of FIR in a predicate offence does not ipso facto mandate the ED to register an ECIR, but it is only based on the satisfaction of the authorised officer from the predicate case and the materials available. This court cannot substitute the satisfaction of ED, which is to be arrived at from the materials available, in accordance with PMLA," the bench said in a recent order.

GVMC property tax collections jump to Rs 230 crore in April

VISAKHAPATNAM. (Agency)

Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation recorded total property tax collections of Rs 230.13 crore in April 2026, an increase of Rs 66.47 crore compared with Rs 163.66 crore collected in April 2025.

Speaking with the , GVMC Revenue Deputy Commissioner Srinivasa Rao said the rise was driven by increased use of the 50 per cent interest waiver on property tax arrears and the 5 per cent rebate on early payments. He said property owners opted to clear pending dues in lump sum to avail the benefits, which improved collections during the month.

As part of the April inflow, GVMC also received Rs 20.02 crore from Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited's refinery and marketing divisions towards property tax under 5% rebate scheme.

Officials said the scheme encouraged large-scale settlement of dues within GVMC limits. Payments were accepted at Saukaryam Centres and through online services on the GVMC website using assessment numbers.

The April performance comes in the backdrop of overall annual revenue growth for 2025-26. GVMC collected Rs 620.85 crore in total tax revenue during the financial year, up from Rs 510.15 crore in 2024-25, showing an increase of Rs 109.93 crore.

Officials said this represented a 21.5 per cent rise in overall revenue, supported by improved assessment and recovery mechanisms. The corporation also increased property tax demand by about Rs 90 crore during the year and recovered nearly Rs 60 crore from the revised demand. Zone-wise data showed the Visakhapatnam zone contributing Rs 591.27 crore in property tax, Rs 507.08 crore in house tax and Rs 84.19 crore in vacant land tax.

WWII-Era Bomb Found In Assam Village, Army Safely Defuses Device

A World War II-era unexploded bomb triggered panic in Assam's Ledo-Lekhapani area in Tinsukia district after it was found in a residential locality, forcing authorities to launch an urgent safety response.

The rusted device, nearly 12 inches long and 6 inches in diameter, was discovered in a populated zone, prompting the Indian Army to rush in a specialised bomb disposal team, seal off the area and evacuate residents before safely moving and defusing the explosive without damage or injury.

Acting immediately after receiving information, the Indian Army's Red Shield Sappers deployed a specialised Bomb Disposal Team to the site. Army personnel quickly sealed off the

surrounding area, evacuated residents from the danger zone, and enforced strict



safety measures to prevent any mishap. Following a careful assessment, the explosive was safely transported to an

isolated location away from habitation.

Experts then carried out a controlled neutralisation operation, successfully destroying the device without any collateral damage. Officials described the operation as highly coordinated and professionally executed, highlighting the Army's rapid response and technical expertise in handling explosive threats.

The incident also serves as a reminder of the region's historical connection to World War II, where parts of Northeast India once played a strategic role during military operations in the eastern theatre.

The Indian Army reiterated its commitment to ensuring civilian safety and maintaining peace and security across the region through timely and effective action.

It uses advanced Inertial Measurement Unit (IMU) sensors along with GPS technology to continuously monitor track conditions with high accuracy. The system also incorporates event-based camera technology to

detect and analyse track abnormalities in real time. This will enable continuous map-



ping of track defects across the railway network and generate real-time alerts, allowing immediate response to potential safety

risks. The collaboration aims to leverage the research expertise of Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati to develop a scalable and cost-effective solution. It will facilitate predictive and condition-based maintenance, reducing dependence on manual inspections and helping prevent failures before they occur. The initiative will improve operational efficiency, reliability and passenger safety, while supporting the broader vision of data-driven and technology-enabled infrastructure management. The project also promotes the development of indigenous technology through strong collaboration between Indian Railways and academic institutions. The partnership marks an important step by NFR towards modernizing railway infrastructure and strengthening safety systems through innovation and real-time monitoring.

2 Days Before Counting, Bengal Holds Repolling At 15 Booths After Complaints

The voting is being held in 11 polling stations in the Magarhat Paschim assembly constituency and four in Diamond Harbour.

Repolling is being held today in 15 polling stations in West Bengal's South 24 Parganas district, where voting was held on April 29 in the second phase of the assembly elections, after the Election Commission (EC) received complaints of irregularities. The voting is being conducted in 11 polling stations in the Magarhat Paschim assembly constituency and four in Diamond Harbour. The polling began at 7 am and will continue till 6 pm.

The repoll order was based on reports received from returning officers and observers of the two constituencies and "material circumstances". The poll panel had reportedly received 29 complaints of repolling from Diamond Harbour and 13 from Magarhat.

Repolling is generally demanded by political



parties, candidates, polling agents, or even observers, citing specific irregularities such as electronic voting machine (EVM) malfunction, booth capturing, intimidation, or violation of the secrecy of voting.

The decision on a repoll in the Falta constituency in Diamond Harbour would be taken on Saturday as a report from the assembly segment is still awaited, a poll

body official told the news agency PTI.

Politics Over Bengal Repolling

The BJP had alleged rampant electoral malpractices in certain polling stations of both the assembly seats under the Diamond Harbour Lok Sabha constituency, which is represented by Trinamool Congress (TMC) national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee. The EC had deputed its special observer, Subrata Gupta, to fact-check the allegations from the ground.

Trinamool's Kunal Ghosh said that the BJP demanded repolling in Diamond Harbour and Magarhat as it knows it will be "defeated by a big margin". "The mandate is against the BJP, and it will remain the same," Ghosh said.

The BJP's Suwendu Adhikari, who is the leader of the opposition in the Bengal assembly, said there had been

"malpractices in several booths" to "favour" the TMC.

"We are happy with the repoll decision of the poll body," he said.

Record Voter Turnout In Bengal

The two-phase West Bengal assembly polls ended on Wednesday with what the election watchdog said was the state's highest-ever voter turnout of about 92 per cent. Bengal, which has a voter base of 6.81 crore, saw a 93 per cent turnout in phase 1 on April 23, while phase 2 saw a poll participation of 91 per cent. Previously, the highest voter turnout in Bengal was recorded in 2011, when about 84 per cent voters had exercised their franchise. This year, 92 per cent of women voters turned up at the polling stations in the first phase, compared to 90 per cent of men. In Phase II, the participation of women electors was marginally higher compared to men.

Marine fish landings in Andhra Pradesh drop by 13 per cent in 2025

VISAKHAPATNAM. (Agency)

Marine fish landings in Andhra Pradesh dropped to 1.52 lakh tonnes in 2025, recording a decline of 13% compared to 2024, and 20% from 2023, indicating continued pressure on the fisheries sector.

According to the ICAR-Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) Annual Report 2025, the State had recorded 1.75 lakh tonnes in 2024, and 1.90 lakh tonnes in 2023. The decline is mainly linked to weather disturbances.

Cyclone Montha affected fishing operations in late October across Andhra Pradesh and other east coast regions. This was followed by Cyclone Ditwah, which further disrupted fishing activity.

As a result, several coastal regions reported lower fish landings, including Odisha (15%), Andhra Pradesh (13%), Puducherry (3%), and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (26%).

The number of marine species recorded in the State also decreased to 371 in 2025 from 404 in 2024. In 2023, the species count was 383, showing fluctuations in marine diversity.

In terms of major species, lesser sardine landings rose sharply to 15,500 tonnes in 2025 from 9,400 tonnes in 2024, showing a strong increase. Penaeid shrimp also registered a moderate rise, increasing to 13,400 tonnes in 2025 compared to 12,320 tonnes in the previous year.

In contrast, Indian mackerel witnessed a steep decline, dropping to 9,650 tonnes in 2025 from a much higher 32,490 tonnes in 2024. Croaker showed a slight improvement, with landings increasing to 7,810 tonnes from 7,030 tonnes. Ribbonfish, however, recorded a marginal decrease, falling to 7,390 tonnes in 2025 from 8,000 tonnes in 2024. Fishing activity remained dominated by the mechanised boats, which contributed 60% of total landings.

Fish landings highest in Jan-March & July-Sept

The motorised boats accounted for 36%, while the non-motorised boats contributed 4%. Multi-day trawl nets in the mechanised boats recorded a 7% increase in catch, whereas the motorised boats saw a 35% decline. The non-motorised boats, however, showed a notable increase of 49%.

"Central Staff, Give Credence": Top Court To Trinamool Over Plea Against Poll Body

The Supreme Court's observation comes just days after the Calcutta High Court upheld the decision of the Election Commission

The Trinamool Congress's arguments that a central government employee would necessarily go against them has a fallacy, the Supreme Court said today. That fallacy, the court pointed out, is the assumption itself and instead, the Trinamool should "give the government employees some credence".

The Supreme Court's observation comes just days after the Calcutta High Court upheld the decision of the Election Commission (EC) to appoint central government and public sector unit (PSU) employees as counting supervisors and assistants, dismissing a petition filed by the Trinamool.

Senior lawyer Kapil Sibal, representing the party led by Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, referred to a circular issued by the EC and said, "It says there has been apprehension from various quarters regarding discrepancy. They want another

central government nominee. Is this not pointing a finger at the state?"

Justice Joymalya Bagchi replied, "It hardly matters if he is a central government nominee or not. It is to the subjective satisfaction of the EC. Your counting agents will be there and so will others. Then counting assistant, counting supervisor and microobserver who is a central government officer." We cannot hold that this notification is contrary to the regulation since one is a central government officer, but the others are not. To choose wholly from one pool cannot be said to be incorrect," Justice Bagchi said.

Counting in the West Bengal assembly election is scheduled on Monday. Justice PS Narasimha also questioned Sibal's line of reasoning: "What is this proportionate representation concept? All of them are



employees of the government." "But the state government nominee has not been appointed," Sibal said. "So have you written to them. You were challenging the circular and now you are saying to follow it," Justice Narasimha replied. The EC told the Supreme Court that the state

government's apprehensions are wrong because state government officers would also be part of the process and present at the counting booths.

Even in the Calcutta High Court, the observations had said such appointments fell within the exclusive discretion of the EC and did not suffer from any illegality or lack of jurisdiction. Similar to today's Supreme Court's observation, the high court had said there was no restriction mandating selection only from state government employees, and authorities were free to appoint personnel from central or state services, including PSUs. Appearing for the EC, senior lawyer DS Naidu said the returning officer is a state government employee with overarching power to deploy personnel from any pool of government employees.

Centre Gives Contractors Extension, Waives Penalties Amid Middle East War

New Delhi.(Agency)

The Ministry of Finance has said that contractors and suppliers executing contracts with government entities will be given additional time and will not face penalties if their work has been disrupted due to the ongoing Middle East situation, according to an official memorandum. In the Office Memorandum issued by the Department of Expenditure, the government clarified that delays caused due to such disruptions will be treated under the "Force Majeure" clause, which allows relief in extraordinary circumstances beyond human control.

"A Force Majeure (FM) means extraordinary events or circumstances beyond human control... such as a war..." the ministry said, adding that such a clause "frees both parties from contractual liability" when obligations cannot be fulfilled due to such events.

The ministry further stated that in cases where contracts have been impacted due to the prevailing Middle East situation, "the procuring entities may invoke Force Majeure."

The relief applies to contracts with government agencies across goods, services and works, the memorandum indicated, covering suppliers, consultants and contractors engaged in public procurement.

It added that contractors will not face penalties for such delays. "The supplier would not be liable for imposition of any such sanction so long as the delay... is the result of an event covered in the FM clause," the memorandum said. The government also provided clarity on timelines, stating that deadlines for completion of contracts due on or after February 28, 2026, "may be extended for a period of not less than two months and not more than four months without imposition of any cost or penalty." According to the memorandum, such extensions will be decided on a case-by-case basis after examining the validity of claims under the Force Majeure provisions.

Delhi moves to declare leprosy a notifiable disease to strengthen surveillance

New Delhi.(Agency)

The health department has proposed that leprosy be declared a notifiable disease under the Delhi Epidemic Diseases Act. The proposal has been sent for approval, placing Delhi in line with other states that already follow this system.

If approved, clear guidelines will be shared with all healthcare providers—government and private—and they will have to report every new case of leprosy to the District Leprosy Officer. This includes clinics, hospitals, and individual doctors.

The goal is to better track cases, detect the disease early and ensure patients receive proper treatment. The



standard treatment, known as Multi-Drug Therapy, is available free of cost in government facilities.

India had officially eliminated leprosy as a public health problem in 2005, but the country still accounts for nearly 59% of global annual new leprosy cases. A recent pan-India study found that 44.1% of leprosy patients are managed by private health facilities and go unreported to the National Leprosy Eradication Programme. This creates hidden pockets of infection, allowing the disease to spread silently.

Health experts believe that making leprosy notifiable will help solve this problem. It will improve tracking, ensure uniform treatment and reduce the risk of drug resistance. The move is expected to reduce stigma as well.

FTII to conduct nationwide re-exam after Delhi centre disruption in entrance test

The Film and Television Institute of India (FTII) on Friday announced its decision to conduct a nationwide re-examination for its entrance test following disruptions reported at a centre in Delhi on April 26. The institute announced that the decision was taken after reviewing findings from a committee constituted to investigate the incident.

In its official statement, the FTII stated that the re-test would be held for all papers across the country to ensure fairness and maintain the credibility of the examination process. It further noted that concerns over "operational deficiencies" and a major disruption at the Delhi centre had affected the overall perception of integrity, making a uniform re-

examination necessary.

The issue arose at one of the Delhi centres where the exam had to be cancelled in a specific building after a delay in the distribution of



question papers. According to reports, a group of candidates had allegedly entered the strong room, manhandled staff and created a law-and-order situation. Following the incident, an emergency meeting was held involving the examination agency and centre officials, and the

test for candidates in that building was cancelled.

Police personnel and an FTII-appointed observer were present at the site. Later, during the second shift, additional concerns were raised by candidates, prompting the observer to recommend the cancellation of that session as well in the same building.

However the FTII clarified that candidates would not be required to submit fresh applications for the re-examination. Their existing registration details would remain valid. "The institute will release a revised schedule and issue new admit cards through its official website at least one month before the exam date," read the notification.

Difficult to prove 'aggressive sex' by accused: Delhi HC gives bail in murder case

New Delhi.(Agency)

The Delhi High Court has granted bail to a man accused of the killing a sex worker through aggressive sex, saying that merely because her bite mark was on his thumb, it could not be said that it was he, and not two associates, who carried out the aggressive act which turned out to be fatal.

According to the prosecution, the deceased was a sex worker whose services were availed by four accused persons, including the present accused, and in the course of the alleged act, he strangled the woman to death. The four accused then dumped her body.

Justice Girish Kathpalia noted that there was no direct evidence in the case, and regarding circumstantial

evidence also, "there was no witness who had seen the deceased last alive with any of the accused persons." The judge further said that the possible evidence connecting the accused with the "so-called aggressive sex" could have been obtained through forensic examination, but according to FSL, no sexual activity was detected on examination of the body.

"In other words, even if the prosecution's version is assumed to be correct to the effect that the accused persons engaged the services of the deceased for sex and one of them carried out aggressive sex, which turned fatal for the deceased, it cannot be said as to which of the four accused persons was responsible for that," the judge said. The judge noted that the remaining three co-accused had been released on bail, saying there was no reason to detain the present accused further.



Hyderabad weather: IMD predicts rain and drop in temperatures after heatwave

Hyderabad is set for a major weather shift in the first week of May as IMD predicts a significant temperature drop below 40°C and above-normal rainfall, providing much-needed relief after a record-breaking heatwave in April.

After a brutal April where the mercury pushed past 45°C in several districts, the city is finally set to receive some breathing room. On Friday, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) in Hyderabad confirmed that the first week of May is set to bring a welcome shift, marked by a dip in temperatures and above-normal rainfall across Telangana. While the state has been sizzling, the transition to cooler weather will be a gradual process varying from one region to another.

Hyderabad prediction for today

The temperature in the surrounding districts like Medchal-Malkajgiri, Rangareddy, or Sangareddy will witness extreme heat. While the city is expected to see maximum temperatures stabilise comfortably under the 40°C mark.



As per the weather forecast, the temperature is a bit high at 40°C with sunny conditions during the day, transitioning to partly cloudy in the night with a low of 27°C. While the sun will still be out, the oppressive heatwave feel is fading. The residents in Vikarabad and Bhongir can also expect this immediate respite as the peak summer intensity begins to wane.

What to expect in the coming week?

The outlook for the rest of Telangana for the first week of May is looking much wetter and cooler than usual. A cyclonic circulation over interior Maharashtra, combined with a trough stretching down to Tamil Nadu, is expected to trigger rainfall across the region. While Hyderabad gets early relief the northern districts like Adilabad and Nizamabad will have to tough it out for about three more days with temperatures still hovering between 41°C and 44°C.

However, by May 4, the rain is expected to hit these northern pockets too which will bring the mercury down. Overall, the IMD predicts that daytime temperatures throughout the first week of May will remain below the normal average for this time of year, offering a rare and much-needed break from the gruelling summer sun.

Self-enumeration under Census 2027 begins in Delhi

LG and CM complete process on day one as digital exercise rolls out across 250 MCD wards

New Delhi.(Agency)

Self-enumeration under Census 2027 began in the capital on Friday, with many residents, including Delhi Lieutenant Governor Taranjit Singh Sandhu and Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, completing the exercise on the first day.

The CM said that it is simple and completely safe. She urged residents to take part in self-enumeration and data pave the way for correct policies to benefit every needy person.

The L-G, in a post on X, said that the exercise officially began across all Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) wards and urged the residents to take part in the process and support the census. "Your participation plays an important role in shaping the future of our city and nation," he said in the post.

"This digital-first initiative gives citizens the power to directly submit their household details, helping ensure every resident is accurately counted. Reliable data is key to inclusive governance and a stronger, developed nation," the LG added.

The exercise has already been conducted in the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) and Delhi Cantonment areas, where a door-to-door survey is currently underway. All residents of MCD wards, irrespective of their domicile status, can participate in the voluntary self-enumeration exercise by logging on to the Census portal, officials said.

Under self-enumeration, residents will log on to the census portal and fill in information about their households. Only one login per household will be required, and the head of the family or any other member can complete the process using a mobile number. Officials said users will have to select a language at the time of first login, which cannot be changed later. The process will also require respondents to provide the geo-coordinates of their residence, either by selecting the location on a satellite map, searching the address on the portal, or manually entering latitude and longitude.

An 11-digit self-enumeration ID will be generated after details submission, which will be produced by the people to the census enumerators who will visit households door-to-door for recording under Houselisting and Housing.

Riyan Parag unfazed after vapping row, says he does not have to answer his critics

Rajasthan Royals captain Riyan Parag delivered a pointed response to questions around his recent off-field controversy after RR slipped to a seven-wicket defeat against Delhi Capitals in IPL 2026 at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium on Friday.

Parag, who led from the front with a blistering 90 off 50 balls, was asked in the post-match interview whether his innings had helped answer some of the criticism that had followed him in recent days. The RR skipper, however, made it clear that he had little interest in responding to outside noise. "I don't think I need to answer any critics or whoever's talking about it, but at the end of the day, my job is to get two points. So my score, my innings doesn't really matter if we've lost the game," Parag said after the match.

The Royals captain's sharp response came after a week in which scrutiny around him had intensified, both for his form and for events away from the field.

Parag brushes aside recent controversy Parag had come under the scanner earlier this week after being reprimanded for using an e-cigarette in the Rajasthan Royals dressing room during their previous fixture against Punjab Kings in Mullanpur.

The incident drew criticism and prompted disciplinary action, with Parag fined 25 per cent of his match fee. The matter also sparked wider debate, with the BCCI and IPL governing authorities understood to be reviewing whether further action was necessary. The controversy quickly became one of the biggest talking points around the Royals captain, especially given his patchy returns with the bat this season. But Parag offered no interest in engaging with the criticism, insisting his focus remained solely on results and RR's push for points in the closing stages of the league phase.

His post-match remarks reflected that stance, with the 24-year-old making it clear that personal narratives mattered little if the team failed to get over the line.

Mumbai Indians trust Suryakumar Yadav: Coach Jayawardane backs struggling star

Mumbai Indians head coach Mahela Jayawardane has backed Suryakumar Yadav to come good despite his struggles in IPL 2026. Ahead of a crucial clash against Chennai Super Kings, the coach made it clear that the team continues to trust their senior batter to return to form.

Suryakumar's recent dip has been under the spotlight as MI look to turn around their season. Speaking at the pre-match press conference, Jayawardane addressed the concerns around his form.

Australian wicketkeeper-batter Jos Inglis is back in the Indian Premier League and is reported to have joined his new franchise, Lucknow Super Giants (LSG), ahead of their crucial clash against the Mumbai Indians on May 4. LSG currently sit at the bottom of the table alongside MI, with just four points from eight games. There has been no official confirmation from the franchise, but according to an ESPNcricinfo report, the

Australian will be available for selection as LSG look to regain momentum in what has been a difficult campaign so far. The report also states that South African batter Matthew Breetzke has left the squad mid-season due to personal reasons.

"Breetzke, meanwhile, has returned to South Africa. He had left the LSG squad before the April 26 home game against Kolkata Knight Riders, which went down to a Super Over. It is understood Breetzke went back primarily because a close family member on his wife's side passed away recently. There is no information yet on whether Breetzke will return to the tournament," the report added.

WILL INGLIS BRING AN END TO LSG'S WOES?

Inglis, meanwhile, had informed the franchise that he would miss the initial part of the IPL due to wedding-related commitments. The

Australian tied the knot on April 18 in Western Australia. He was bought by LSG for 8.60 crore following an impressive

fire this season. Their overseas star Nicholas Pooran has averaged just 10.25, while openers Aiden Markram (24.12) and Mitchell Marsh (26.50), along with captain Rishabh Pant (27), have been unable to deliver in crucial moments.

This phase of the tournament could prove to be make-or-break for LSG, who can no longer afford slip-ups if they are to remain in contention for a playoff spot. The week ahead is particularly demanding, with three matches lined up:

Monday, May 4 against Mumbai Indians in Mumbai, Thursday, May 7 against Royal Challengers Bengaluru in Lucknow, and Sunday, May 10 against Chennai Super Kings in Chennai.

With Inglis now available, LSG will hope his inclusion injects much-needed energy and consistency into their campaign as they attempt to get their season back on track.

Virat Kohli sells everything from energy drinks to luxury cars. The big names in cricket, tennis and badminton are on billboards, fronting campaigns, signing deals that would make most professionals envious. Fame, in Indian sport, is extraordinarily lucrative. But fame is also extraordinarily rare.

For the vast majority of Indian athletes, there are no billboards. There are no brand deals landing in the inbox. There is just the

training, the competition, the recovery, and the monthly reality of trying to fund all three without a salary, a sponsor or a safety net.



The question of how they survive, financially and professionally, is one that Indian sport has never adequately answered. Niharika Vashisht has found one answer. The triple-jumper is among a select group of

The rearrangements were necessary due to City's progression in domestic cup competitions, but the updated schedule has left them with three matches in seven days between May 13 and May 19. Their season concludes with a home fixture against Aston

Villa on May 24.

City were reportedly unhappy with the timing of the rescheduled fixtures, particularly the Crystal Palace match originally set for March, which they felt could have been moved earlier. However, Guardiola accepted the situation.

"It is what it is," he said. "When we won the treble and quadruple, we always had this kind of calendar. Of course it could be better, but I've never expected help. We'll go game by game. The broadcasters, Premier League, whoever decides. We will be there with 11 players plus people on the bench."

City remain in the title race, trailing Arsenal by three points but holding a game in hand, having five matches left compared to Arsenal's four. The gap could widen before they face Everton on Monday night, but Guardiola insisted the situation does not concern him.

Vaibhav Sooryavanshi send-off costs Jamieson: DC star penalised for RR game flashpoint

Delhi Capitals pacer Kyle Jamieson has landed himself in trouble for the fiery send-off he gave to Vaibhav Sooryavanshi during the game in Jaipur on Friday, May 1. Jamieson was given a warning and one demerit point for breaching Level 1 of the IPL's Code Of Conduct for players and team officials.

The incident took place in the second over of the game, as the RR opener once again showed no fear and took on the New Zealand pacer in the very first delivery he faced against him and got a boundary. Jamieson didn't let the early hit faze him. He held his line and lengths, kept it tight, and struck back almost instantly—nailing a pinpoint yorker that beat Sooryavanshi and cut short the teenager's stay before he could get going.

Clearly pumped after the wicket, Jamieson wheeled around in celebration and locked eyes with Sooryavanshi on his way back, his intense stare adding bite to the early breakthrough.

"Kyle Jamieson, Bowler, Delhi Capitals, has accumulated one Demerit Point and received a warning for breaching Level 1 of the IPL's Code of Conduct for Players and Team Officials during Match No. 43 against Rajasthan Royals (RR) at the Sawai Mansingh Stadium, Jaipur."

"Jamieson was found to have breached Article 2.5 of the IPL's Code of Conduct, which relates to using language, actions or gestures which disparage or which could provoke an aggressive reaction from another player in the match."

"The incident occurred in the second over of the first innings, when, after dismissing Vaibhav Sooryavanshi, Jamieson was found to be close to him in an aggressive manner, which could have provoked an aggressive reaction from the batter," read the statement from IPL.

New NPS fee rules to kick in from July; Tier-II costs, dormant fees in focus

New Delhi.(Agency)

Come July and National Pension System or NPS subscribers will witness a tweaking of account-level charges. It follows the decision of the regulator PFRDA (Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority) to tighten annual maintenance costs especially for Tier-II and dormant accounts.

The matter has been clarified by a circular issued by the PFRDA and it seeks to introduce a more uniform framework across account types. One of the immediate changes that NPS subscribers will face is the alignment of annual maintenance charges for Tier-II accounts with that levied on Tier I accounts within the same sector, government or private. Thus there will no longer be different rates between Tier I and Tier II. PFRDA has also kept a safeguard for accounts with low balance. The government is trying to popularise NPS to create a pan-India pension system.

Charges for dormant account

The regulator has said that dormant accounts will attract reduced but continuing charges. It has also said that an NPS account will be treated as dormant if the subscriber makes no contribution for four consecutive quarters. Once an NPS account becomes dormant, it will face a charge of 10% of the applicable rate and this fee will continue till the account is again activated.

Relief for some accounts

While PFRDA emphasised the fees on the dormant accounts, NPS-Lite accounts and those under Atal Pension Yojana will not face any fees/charges even if the balance is zero. This will ensure that subscriber with low income are not hauled up for their inability to contribute.

India's forex reserves decline \$4.82 bn to \$698.49 bn; gold reserves dip too

On recently, in late February, India's forex reserves reached an all-time high of \$728.49 billion. According to data released by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday, India's foreign exchange reserves declined by \$4.82 billion to \$698.49 billion in the week ending April 24. Foreign currency assets (FCAs), the largest component of the reserves, declined by \$2.84 billion to \$554.62 billion. Gold reserves declined too. It must be noted that India's forex reserves rose by \$2.3 billion to reach \$703.30 billion in the week ended April 17. The quick descent from the all time high only seven weeks earlier is explained by the continuing US-Iran war, which is showing no movement towards lasting peace. The conflict broke out on February 28 and the one of the major fallouts was a downward pressure on the Indian rupee. Due to this downward pressure, the forex reserves in India has come under pressure and declined by as much as 4.11% in these few weeks.

Decline in gold reserves

Gold reserves of India declined too. It went down by \$1.90 billion to touch \$120.24 billion. Special Drawing Rights or SDRs fell by \$67 million to reach \$18.77 billion. It must be mentioned that Special Drawing Rights is not a currency. It was created by the IMF in 1969 and constitutes a potential claim on the freely usable currencies of IMF member countries. It was created to provide financial stability. India's reserve position with the IMF also declined by \$15 million to reach \$4.85 billion.

White-collar hiring in April went up 6% with insurance taking the lead: Report

NEW DELHI.(Agency)

In war-torn April, white-collar hiring increased by 6% compared to that in April a year ago, said a report on May 1. The hiring was nudged up by performance in the insurance, BPO/ITeS and real estate sectors, said the Naukri JobSpeak Index report. The biggest jump in hiring took place in the insurance sector which surged by 21%. Three other sectors registered double digit growth in hiring. These were BPO/ITES with 15%, real estate with 12% and healthcare with 11%. Education also was close to double-digit growth and posted a 9% rise in white collar hiring. Naukri JobSpeak Index publishes a monthly report which tracks the job market and hiring activities in the country.

Sectors which declined

While the five sectors witnessed a surge in hiring, a few declined. Among these were telecom and banking sectors. These Hiring in these sectors have been inching down for four months on the trot said the report. Telecom registered a slide of 11% while banking had a fall of 10% in April. Hiring in the sunrise Global Capability Centres too registered a decline of 4%. Sectors where hiring was flat in the previous month were IT, pharmaceuticals and automobiles.

City-wise hiring activity

Job creation in April was the most prominent in the southern cities. Among the cities that witnessed the highest growth in hiring were Hyderabad, Bangalore and Chennai. Hyderabad emerged on top with 12% growth, while Bengaluru came second with 7% and Chennai emerged third with 6%. The Delhi-NCR was at 3% while Kolkata just managed 1% growth. The financial capital of the country Mumbai happened to be the only metro that recorded a decline of 3%. However, among the bigger cities (tier II) to witness strong hiring activity in April were Jaipur with 12%, Coimbatore with 11% and Ahmedabad with 7%.

Air India to cut international flights till July amid fuel surge, airspace curbs

Air India will reduce its international flight operations through June and July as a sharp rise in aviation turbine fuel (ATF) prices and ongoing airspace restrictions have made several routes unprofitable, according to an internal communication accessed by .Air India CEO and Managing Director Campbell Wilson told staff that the airline has "no choice but to trim schedules in June and July" amid mounting operational challenges. The airline has already reduced some flying in April and May due to the "massive rise in jet fuel prices," combined with airspace closures and longer flying routes.

The move comes days after India's airline industry has sought

urgent government intervention as a sharp rise in jet fuel prices begins to strain operations and push up costs. In a letter to the Civil Aviation Ministry, the Federation of Indian Airlines (FIA), which represents carriers such as Air India, IndiGo and SpiceJet, warned that the sector is facing "extreme stress" due to soaring aviation turbine fuel (ATF) prices.

The surge in ATF prices, driven by the broader impact of the Middle East war, along with adverse currency exchange rates and restricted airspace, has significantly affected Air India's international operations. Many international routes have become unviable, forcing the airline to scale back services.

Aviation fuel, which typically accounts for around 30-40% of



airline costs, has now risen to as much as 55-60% of operating expenses, according to the industry.

Airspace restrictions following the West Asia conflict have compelled Air India to take longer routes for several

international destinations, leading to higher fuel burn and increased costs. Wilson described the situation as "extremely challenging" and said it has left the airline with limited options. While domestic flight profitability has also taken a hit,

government intervention has helped reduce the degree of impact on those operations.

In his message to employees, Wilson sought "continued solidarity" from staff as the airline navigates the crisis. He acknowledged the disruption caused to passengers and crew schedules, expressing hope that the situation in the Middle East stabilises soon and that key routes, including the Strait of Hormuz, reopen.

Air India Group is estimated to have incurred losses of over Rs 22,000 crore in the financial year ending March 31, 2026.

Wilson, who has announced plans to step down later this year, said the airline will aim to return to normal operations once fuel prices ease and airspace constraints are lifted.

India on US priority watch list: Concerns over IP rule mount

India is on the 'priority watch list' of the US in the latest Special 301 Report for 2026, released on April 30, due to persistent differences over intellectual property (IP) rules, especially in the pharmaceutical sector. India has remained on the priority watch list since the 1990s, reflecting long-standing divergences over patent standards and access to medicines.

According to the latest Special 301 Report, India is one of six countries on this list due to ongoing concerns regarding the protection and enforcement of IP rights, especially in the pharmaceutical and digital sectors. The US Trade Representative (USTR) flagged inconsistent progress in India's IP regime, noting steps such as the Patents (Amendment) Rules, 2024 and increased staffing at the patent office. "There continues to be a lack of progress on many long-standing IP concerns raised in prior Special 301 Reports. India remains one of the



world's most challenging major economies with respect to the protection and enforcement of IP," stated the report.

Section 3(d) of India's Patents Act prohibits patenting new forms of known substances unless they demonstrate significantly enhanced therapeutic efficacy.

It prevents evergreening, where companies extend patent terms for minor modifications. According to the USTR, such provisions create uncertainty for innovators. Although,

India's stance is fully compliant with WTO norms.

Flagging the absence of data exclusivity provisions, the US also criticised India's compulsory licensing framework, which allows third parties to produce patented drugs under public interest conditions. The report also noted that India is one of the top countries of origin for counterfeit pharmaceuticals seized at the US border in Fiscal Year 2025 and is also a leading source of counterfeit medicines distributed globally.

The US also flagged high customs duties on IP-intensive products—including information and communications technology (ICT), solar gear, medical devices, pharmaceuticals and capital goods—as a sustained concern. It also questioned whether India has any mechanism in place to prevent unfair commercial use or disclosure of proprietary test data submitted for regulatory approvals in pharmaceuticals and agro-chemicals.

Tata Sons has no way out from listing: InGovern

Markets advocacy group InGovern has said that the Reserve Bank of India's April 10 and 29 directions on upper-layer non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) leave the Tata Group with no option but to go public. It termed Tata Sons' attempt to remain a private entity by seeking to de-register its NBFC licence as "dead on arrival".

Filed in March 2024, the application has now been rendered substantively and procedurally deficient by the evolving regulatory landscape of 2026, the group said in a report. It added that, to uphold the integrity of financial markets and ensure compliance with the 2026 framework, the RBI should issue a definitive public order rejecting Tata Sons' application for de-registration of its NBFC licence at the earliest.

"With these directions from the RBI, the



regulatory landscape has shifted significantly, and there is no remaining legal basis to provide an exemption to an entity of this magnitude. Tata Sons should be issued a clear directive to initiate the listing process as an upper-layer NBFC by the March 2027 deadline, in strict accordance with the latest master directions," the report said.

While the April 10 draft directions

propose a strictly quantitative Rs 1 lakh crore asset threshold for automatic upper-layer classification, the April 29 directions make it amply clear that even indirect exposure to public deposits or credit renders parametric scoring and debt-reduction defences obsolete, the report said. It may be noted that, to circumvent the September 2025 RBI deadline for upper-layer NBFCs to list — issued in October 2022 — Tata Sons retired over Rs22,000 crore of debt by March 2024 and, in the same month, moved an application to the regulator to cancel its NBFC licence.

However, the RBI has neither formally accepted nor rejected the application yet. In its latest upper-layer NBFC list issued in January 2025, the RBI included Tata Sons. This is despite it being a core investment company that does not accept public deposits or have outstanding debt.

GCCs turn to hybrid models as AI push reshapes operations

Industry leaders say the growing reliance on external partners is not a sign of structural weakness, but a deliberate strategy

India's Global Capability Centres (GCCs) are increasingly deepening ties with consulting and IT services firms, as they navigate rapid shifts in artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and global product ownership. The move marks a shift towards hybrid operating models, particularly among mid-sized centres balancing capability-building with speed and cost pressures. Industry leaders say this growing reliance on external partners is not a sign of

structural weakness, but a deliberate strategy.

"GCCs are not structurally dependent on external partners, nor is this a temporary gap," said Arindam Sen, Partner and GCC Sector Lead — Technology, Media & Entertainment and Telecommunications at EY India. "The reliance is often intentional and strategic. GCCs may consciously choose not to insource everything to avoid fixed-cost lock-in, reduce risk, and maintain flexibility." Instead, many GCCs are choosing to keep high-value, complex problem-solving in-house, while tapping external partners for specialised skills and speed. This is particularly visible in fast-evolving areas such as artificial intelligence.

"Areas such as AI are evolving too rapidly across agentic AI, GenAI, and platforms, for it to be efficient or cost-



effective to internalise everything," Sen said. "GCCs may deliberately leverage partner ecosystems to accelerate innovation, access specialist capabilities, and maintain speed and resilience, while retaining strategic ownership and decision-making control in-house."

Shalini Pillay, Partner & India Leader — Global Capability Centres at KPMG in India, described the shift as part of an ongoing evolution rather than a

structural reset.

"Adopting Hybrid Operating Models has been core to the evolution of the model... GCCs have increasingly leveraged third parties to bridge some very fundamental gaps," she said.

According to Pillay, the current phase is being driven by three factors: "1) AI velocity gap 2) infrastructure and speed of adoption and 3) skills asymmetry." She added, "This is not a structural transition but a transition phase driven by the pace of AI adoption and digital transformation."

As global enterprises struggle to prepare for AI at scale, GCCs are increasingly using external partners to build readiness. "They are leveraging third party to get better prepared from a data readiness, process intelligence and hence organisation readiness perspective," Pillay said.

Inflation may shoot above 5%; growth below 6% if crude remains above \$110: Experts

New Delhi.(Agency)

Economists see a severe hit to the economy in terms of growth, inflation and consumption demand if crude oil — which crossed \$126.4 a barrel this week, the highest since March 2022 — continues to trade higher for longer. Analysts predict that if crude remains above the \$110-a-barrel mark for an extended period, FY27 growth may plummet below 6%, the fiscal deficit could widen by 50 basis points, and inflation may shoot past 5%.

ICRA Ratings chief economist Aditi Nayar has mapped three macro scenarios based on crude prices. In the worst-case outcome, she sees growth plunging to around 5% or even lower, with inflation crossing the 5% mark.

"We have worked out three scenarios for FY27 based on crude averaging \$85, \$105 and \$125 a barrel. If crude averages as much as \$125 a barrel in FY27, then growth could fall to 5% or lower, and inflation would exceed 5%," Nayar told.

She added that the impact on inflation would depend on the extent of pass-through to fuel pump prices, which in turn would affect consumption and growth. However, she did not quantify the demand impact, which had picked up following GST rate cuts last September. The economy is likely to close FY26 with 7.5% growth and 2.1% retail inflation, while wholesale price inflation stood at a low 0.7%. The current account deficit (CAD) is expected at 0.9% and the fiscal deficit at 4.5%, when crude averaged \$71.7 a barrel.

In comparison, if crude averages \$85 a barrel, FY27 growth would be around 6.5%. If it averages \$105, growth could slow to 5.8%, Nayar said. Inflation in these scenarios would be 4.5% and 4.8%, respectively, while wholesale inflation could be 3.5%, 4.2% and 5% across the three scenarios. CAD is projected at 1.7%, 2.4% and 3.1%, while the fiscal deficit could widen to 4.6%, 4.8% and 5% of GDP, respectively.

Rajni Sinha, chief economist at Care Ratings, expects growth to moderate to 6.7% in FY27 from a pre-conflict projection of 7.2% in the base case, and to dip below 6% in an extreme scenario. She expects the rupee to average 92-93 in the base case and weaken to around 98 in the extreme scenario.

Social networks cause stress to Children

Scientists believe that the quality and size of the social relationships nurtured in childhood may have important physiological consequences for physical and mental health for youth. Researcher Mark V. Flinn said that cortisol and salivary alpha-amylase are secreted in response to outside pressure or

A lot of research has shown the significance of social relationships in influencing adult human behavior and health, but children's perception of their social networks correlates with stress and how it may influence development is still untapped. A research team from the University of Missouri has determined that children and adolescents physically react to their social networks and the stress those networks may cause.



tension. A part of the autonomic nervous system, release of cortisol in the system is quick, unconscious and can be measured in saliva; therefore, measuring cortisol is a good indicator of stress in the body.

He added that the typical physiological response to stress is the release of hormones like cortisol into the system. In the study, the researchers wanted to explore the association between children's personal social networks, as well as perceived social network size and density with biomarkers like cortisol and alpha-amylase that can indicate levels of stress in youth.

Flinn said that using the data they have collected they found out children who were stressed about the size and density of their perceived social networks had elevated anticipatory cortisol levels and responded by secreting more alpha-amylase.

The study appears in the journal Social Neuroscience.

The capital is clearly feeling the heat, what with a spurt in the number of people being rushed to hospital with exhaustion,



cases of fever and headache linked to increased body temperature.

A doctor said: "Heat cramps and exhaustion are common among labourers or sales executives who are outdoors during the hottest part of the day."

Drinking enough water, the doctors said, could help ward off heat-related illnesses. Also, one should avoid a sudden change in temperature. Dr Anoop Misra, chairman, Fortis C-Doc, said people with pre-existing illnesses, for example diabetes, were highly vulnerable to heat-related ailments as they were already on medications that interfered with body's cooling system. "Hot weather leads to a decrease in blood pressure and a change of medication is required in patients suffering from hypertension, heart disease and diabetes," he added.

Early symptoms of a heat stroke are weakness, dry tongue and cramps.

Sweltering heat can affect the skin too, if precautions, such as appropriate clothing and application of sunscreen, are not followed. Fungal allergies are also common during summer because of excessive sweating.
