New Delhi.(Agency) The opposition parties on Friday launched a sharp attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi after petrol, diesel and CNG prices were hiked, accusing the Centre of burdening the common man soon after the conclusion of elections.

concluded in Assam, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal. The Trinamool Congress slammed the move, calling it "pathetically predictable" that fuel



prices would rise after the polls, and questioned whether the newly sworn-in BJP government in West Bengal would reduce Value Added Tax (VAT) on petrol to ease the burden on people. "First they loot your vote, then they kick you where it

hurts. Pathetically predictable. Diesel and petrol prices hiked. Will Bengal Govt reduce VAT on petrol & diesel now that there's a Delhi-controlled government which doesn't have to worry about funds being blocked by the Centre?" Trinamool MP Derek O'Brien asked. Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav shared a sarcastic post, saying, "If you want to move forward, the bicycle is the only option". He shared a caricature of himself riding a bicycle, along with the caption, "We had already said that we will continue travelling by bicycle!" The bicycle is also the party symbol of the Samajwadi Party. Fuel prices had remained unchanged throughout the polling period despite a sharp surge in international crude oil prices triggered by the conflict in West Asia. The basket of crude oil imported by India averaged around USD 69 per barrel in February, before the outbreak of the war in West Asia. In the months that followed, prices climbed to an average of USD 113-114 per barrel.

Breach in chain of command: Government takes responsibility for NEET leak

Speaking at a press conference on May 15, the Education Minister acknowledged a "breach in the chain of command" and said the government was taking responsibility for the NEET paper leak controversy

New Delhi.(Agency) Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, in a press conference held today, said the NEET re-examination will now be held on June 21 after the government concluded that the original paper had been leaked under the cover of so-called "guess papers". Pradhan in his address said, "despite following the recommendations of the Radhakrishnan committee, there was a breach in command chain. We accept it and take responsibility to improve it." The Union Minister was referring to the high-level committee led by former ISRO Chairman K Radhakrishnan and constituted after the 2024 NEET paper leak. The committee had reportedly made 95 comprehensive recommendations for reforms in the exam process, but those were not followed as per instructions. According to him, the exam was conducted on May 3, but by May 7, the NTA had received complaints that several questions circulating in guess papers matched the actual exam. The Higher Education Department then launched an enquiry and involved central agencies, which worked with state authorities before confirming by May 12 that the real question paper had indeed been compromised. During the press conference, he was asked about the alleged involvement of insiders in the National Testing Agency (NTA), and he responded by saying, "CBI will investigate the matter thoroughly. CBI is a trustworthy agency, and it will probe matter smoothly."



Advisor to PM in race for Bengal Finance Minister's post, via Nandigram

Economist Sanjeev Sanyal has emerged as the leading contender for Bengal's finance portfolio. The buzz has grown amid speculation that the Suvendu Adhikari-led government lacks a strong finance hand to steer Bengal's economy.

New Delhi.(Agency) "The Dark One, Goddess of Time, turns the Wheel of Epochs, slows but surely," popular economist Sanjeev Sanyal posted on May 4, the day the BJP scripted a historic win in the Bengal elections. The cryptic post was seen as a reference to the changing political landscape in Bengal. Some also viewed it as a harbinger of his own probable entry in the state's power circles, amid speculation that the BJP lacked a strong finance hand to steer Bengal's economy. After all, few know that Sanyal himself is a Bengali. So far, only five ministers have taken oath along with Chief Minister Suvendu Adhikari in Bengal. The key finance ministry for now is being

overseen by Suvendu along with Singh Puri. The signs are hard to miss. At Suvendu's swearing-in ceremony, Sanyal was spotted at the venue in a traditional Bengali dhoti-kurta. His wife, Smita Baroah, who is believed to have played a key role in helping



the BJP mobilise support of women voters, was also seen with him. "Witnessed history," he tweeted. Since the election results were declared on May 4, Sanyal has given a spate of interviews and written op-eds for media houses on what he called Bengal's economic decline and how to bring it out of the present stagnation. "Kolkata didn't die, it was murdered, and I am a witness," Sanyal told Republic. He also posted about the murder of Chandranath Rath, Suvendu's PA, and the bomb attack in Bengal that left five BJP workers injured.

AAP's Halla Bol against rising petrol & diesel prices

The Sikh Times CHANDIGARH, 15 May: As petrol prices rose soon after the conclusion of elections in five states, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) launched demonstrations across Ludhiana, Amritsar and Jalandhar, calling out the BJP-led central government for pushing the country deeper into inflation after first increasing gas cylinder prices and now fuel rates. AAP lead-



ers said that after the conclusion of elections in five states, the Central BJP government has continuously increased first the price of gas cylinders and now petrol prices, which has placed an economic burden on the lives of common people. They said that the foreign and domestic policy of the Modi Government has proven to be a failure. During a demonstration in Amritsar, AAP Punjab State Chief Spokesperson and MLA Kuldeep Dhaliwal stated, "Due to inflation, the backbone of the country's people has already been broken, and on top of that, the massive increase in fuel prices has made life extremely difficult for poor and middle-class families. Due to the rise in petrol and diesel prices, the prices of daily-use goods and vegetables have also skyrocketed, for which the pro-corporate policies of the Modi Government are directly responsible." PM Modi On UAE, 4-Nation Europe Tour For Energy, Tech Ties Amid Iran War

New Delhi. (Agency) Prime Minister Narendra Modi began a five-nation tour starting in the United Arab Emirates Friday before heading to Europe - to the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden, and Italy - for a trip overshadowed by energy and supply-chain worries due to the Iran war. Disruptions around Gulf shipping routes and the Strait of Hormuz continue to drive volatility in oil and gas markets, increasing pressure on energy-importing economies, including India. But the trip also reflects India's wider effort to diversify economic and strategic partnerships -- while positioning itself as a major manufacturing and



technology hub. UAE PM Modi will visit the UAE on May 15 to meet UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan. PM Modi has visited the UAE seven times since 2014 and Sheikh Mohamed has visited India five times. His last visit was in January, accompanied by the next generation of UAE leaders, marking the resilience of the bilateral relationship, which has only strengthened across generations. Through the current turmoil, the UAE has remained one of India's most reliable energy partners and continues to be so. With long-term supply agreements in place, India's energy security has been bolstered. Enhancing energy cooperation will be a key agenda of the visit. Sources said two important MoUs in the areas of LPG and Strategic Petroleum Reserves are likely to be concluded during this visit.

BJP seeks details of 'Rahul's undeclared 54 foreign trips' since Congress says 'tactic to divert attention' from setbacks

>The Congress hit back saying the BJP's allegations were a tactic to divert attention from "setback after setback" for the NDA government's foreign policy.

New Delhi.(Agency) TERMING IT a matter of national security, the BJP on Thursday accused Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi of having made undeclared and "secret trips" abroad, and sought to know the reason for the visits and the source of the funds. The Congress hit back saying the BJP's allegations were a tactic to divert attention from "setback after setback" for the NDA government's foreign policy. BJP national spokesperson and Lok Sabha MP Sambit Patra, addressing a press conference at the party headquarters, alleged that Gandhi had made 54 personal foreign trips in 22 years of his public life. Approximately ₹60 crore was spent on his travels while his declared income over the past 10 years was only about ₹11 crore, said the BJP leader. "During his 22 years in public life (2004 to

2026), Rahul Gandhi has undertaken 54 foreign trips to countries such as Italy, United Kingdom, United States, Germany, Vietnam, Cambodia, Singapore, Bahrain, Maldives, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates," Patra said. "According to the available details, in the past 10 years, Rahul Gandhi's total income was ₹11 crore. On one hand, there is an income of ₹11 crore, while on the other hand, ₹60 crore was spent on foreign trips," he said. According to Patra, five "major mismatches" emerged with regard to his foreign trips: financial year 2014-15, when his total income was approximately ₹86 lakh, nearly ₹4.5 crore was spent on a single foreign trip; in 2017-18, his total income was around ₹1.2



crore, while approximately ₹6 crore was spent on foreign travel. Similarly, in 2019-20, Gandhi's income stood around ₹1.29 crore, whereas nearly ₹4.6 crore was spent on foreign travel, in 2021-22, against an approximate income of ₹1.03 crore, around ₹2.6 crore was spent on foreign travel, said Patra. "So far, six of Rahul Gandhi's trips have been described as undeclared, and if the Oman trip is confirmed, it will be the seventh undeclared trip... No public programme related to this trip was announced, no host was disclosed, and it was not revealed who had invited him...No permission letter under FCRA Section 6 has been shown either," Patra alleged. "If Rahul Gandhi went on a foreign trip, he should have written to the Central government and the Ministry of Home Affairs to seek prior permission, because that is the rule for a Member of Parliament. The Congress should make that permission letter public by this evening," he said. Patra sought to know who hosted the visit, whether it was an Indian or a foreign entity, was permission obtained from the Ministry of Home Affairs.

Security guard dies after speeding car overturns auto on Golf Course Road

A 54-year-old security guard died during treatment after the auto-rickshaw he was travelling in overturned following a collision with a speeding car near Sector 42/27 Chowk on Golf Course Road on Tuesday afternoon.

The deceased, Bijendra Singh, had been living with his family in DLF Phase 1 for the past four years. He worked as a security guard at a residence in DLF Aralia, Sector 42. According to a complaint filed by his son, Ritik Singh, the accident took place around 2pm when Bijendra was travelling in an auto-rickshaw from Sikandarpur towards Aralia. Near the U-turn before Sector 42/27 Chowk, a speeding car allegedly overtook the auto and suddenly took a U-turn, colliding with it and causing the vehicle to overturn. The driver fled the spot after the crash.

Police said multiple passengers travelling in the auto sustained injuries. Bijendra and another injured passenger were taken to a private hospital. Due to the severity of his injuries, he was later shifted to Paras Hospital, where he died during treatment.

A forensic team visited the spot and CCTV footage from the area is being examined to identify the accused driver.

An FIR has been registered under relevant sections of the BNS.

Pregnancy termination at illegal clinic sparks foeticide probe

Gurgaon: A 17-week pregnant woman developed severe complications after an illegal abortion at an unauthorised clinic in Rewari, prompting a probe into female foeticide and sex determination practices. A joint team of health department, police and drug control authorities raided a clinic in Chilhah and arrested Sukhbir Singh Yadav, who is accused of illegally operating a medical facility equipped with an operation theatre and equipment used for abortion.

An FIR was registered at Rewari Sadar police station under provisions of BNS, Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act and Indian Medical Council Act. According to the FIR, the woman, identified as Priyanka, was around 17 weeks pregnant and has two daughters. Health officials said her family approached the accused for termination of pregnancy after a sex determination test.

Officials said Priyanka was initially given medicines and was later taken to the clinic, where the abortion was allegedly carried out. Her condition worsened during the procedure, after which she was shifted to Jeevan Jyoti Hospital in Rewari and later referred to another hospital in Jaipur. Officials said she remains on ventilator support.

The complaint was filed by Dr Vidya Sagar, deputy civil surgeon and nodal officer for PCPNDT and MTP, after hospital authorities alerted the health department about the woman's critical condition. "We are investigating the case further. The accused has been sent to judicial custody. The family is in Jaipur at present with the woman who is on ventilator," Dr Sagar told TOI, adding, "It is a case of termination of foetus."

During the raid, conducted around 5.30pm on Tuesday, officials found a facility operating with an operation table, surgical instruments and medicines. Investigators seized several items. Officials said the clinic was not authorised to conduct medical procedures. The health department is also examining if provisions of PCPNDT Act related to sex determination should be invoked during the investigation.

The case has renewed concern over Haryana's declining sex ratio at birth (SRB). Despite enforcement measures launched by the state govt last year to curb suspected gender selection and female foeticide, SRB for the first four months of this year fell to 895 from 925 last year, prompting another govt review. Statements of the woman's family members have been recorded, and further investigation is underway to identify others who may have been involved in the racket.

Audit flags suspected 22L irregularities in Nuh Red Cross accounts

Nuh: A surprise inspection by Haryana Red Cross Society uncovered alleged financial and administrative irregularities worth over Rs 22 lakh at the district Red Cross Society and St John ambulance branch in Nuh, raising suspicions of fund misuse and embezzlement, according to an official report.

The audit team from the state headquarters in Chandigarh found that nearly Rs 20.7 lakh collected during the 2025-26 financial year, including donations, was not deposited into the official bank account for months, with the pending amount rising to Rs 22.33 lakh during the review period.

The findings also placed the branch secretary under scanner, with officials indicating that his role in the alleged irregularities will be examined in detail.

According to the report, Rs 40,000 remained undeposited for 13 months, Rs 2.2 lakh for 10 months and Rs 18.23 lakh for nearly three months. Officials noted that cash deposits totalling around Rs 20.5 lakh were made only in April 2026 after the inspection process began.

The inspection also reviewed the scanning project being run across different tehsils in the district. The audit found that revenue generated through the project was allegedly kept outside official accounts. While most of the amount was later deposited during the 2025-26 financial year, the report said Rs 1.05 lakh is still pending.

Apart from the financial discrepancies, the audit highlighted several administrative violations. Secretary Mahesh Gupta was accused of appointing his son through outsourcing and granting him a salary scale without proper approval. The report also stated that the accountant posted at the Nuh branch was receiving nearly double the salary paid to accountants in other Haryana districts, with recovery of the excess amount reportedly recommended. The inspection team further observed that proper financial records were not maintained regularly. Cash books and ledgers were either incomplete or not updated, while several vouchers lacked supporting documents. The report also mentioned that the accountant was paid separately for writing the cash book despite rules prohibiting such payments. Investigators also flagged possible tampering with receipt records.

Expenditure on vehicle fuel and repairs in Nuh and Palwal also came under scrutiny, with officials directing the branch to provide verified logbooks and supporting records.

Workers protest at 2 factories in Gurgaon over wage hike, overtime

Workers at two factories in the city staged separate protests on Thursday, alleging that Haryana govt's revised minimum wage order was being flouted and that years of experience, skill levels and overtime were being ignored in pay packages. The twin protests — one inside a leather goods unit in Udyog Vihar and the other on the campus of a glass factory in Narsingpur — come barely weeks after wage-related labour unrest turned violent in Noida and Manesar and raised concerns over simmering tension on factory floors again.

At the Udyog Vihar leather unit, around 200 workers went on strike and began a sit-in inside the premises. Their primary allegation was that the management had collapsed all categories — helpers, unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled workers — into one wage bracket and denied them the differentiated pay mandated under the revised structure. Kamlesh Kumar, a worker at the factory,



said employees had repeatedly asked the company management to implement the 35% hike in minimum wages announced by the state, but were ignored. "Officials are telling us to either work on the same pay or leave. How can we leave? We have EMLs and rent to pay," he added.

Others said the dispute goes beyond basic wages. Md Tabrez alleged that labourers were being made to work 12 to 16 hours a day, including Sundays, without overtime being paid at the legal rate. "Unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled workers are all being treated as one

category. Moreover, we are all being paid less than the mandated wages," he added. Karan Kumar said overtime was also being wrongly calculated. "It should be paid at double the regular wage and calculated on the basis of 24 working days in a month. Instead, it is being worked out over 31 days. So, we are losing money," he added. Miraz, another worker, said the protest was continuing inside the factory because employees believed the company was refusing to follow the govt's direction on wages.

At the glass factory in Narsingpur, workers protested outside the gate over similar issues. Deepak Kumar, one of them, said employees with more than 20 years of experience were earning about Rs 15,000 a month, while those with less than five years of service were getting nearly Rs 12,500.

"We have been asking the company to implement the revised minimum wages, but it has refused," he said.

Haryana Class 10 boards: Gurgaon slips to 18th rank, Charkhi Dadri tops state

Haryana Board of School Education (HBSE) on Thursday declared the Class 10 results, with Charkhi Dadri emerging as the top-performing district with a pass percentage of 96%, followed by Jind at 94.6%. Nuh recorded the lowest pass percentage at 68.9%, down from last year's 73.9%.

Gurgaon's performance declined, with the district slipping from 14th position in 2025 to 18th this year. The overall pass percentage dropped from 92.8% last year to 89.4%. "The dip in performance will be analysed and focused academic support and remedial measures will be introduced to improve results in the coming session," an education department official said.

Across the state, girls outperformed boys by 3.95 percentage points. Girls recorded a pass percentage of 91.64%, while boys registered 87.69%. Deepika from

Bhiwani topped the state with 499 out of 500 marks. Ronak from Bhiwani and Khushi from Hisar secured the second position with 498 marks each.

In the Gurgaon district, Durvish emerged as



the topper with 494 marks, followed by Nicki with 493 marks. Durvish, who studied at Devki Kailash Public School in Pataudi, scored 100 marks each in Mathematics and Physical Education, 99 in Sanskrit, 98 in Social Science, 97 in

English and 86 in Hindi.

His father, Anil Sharma, is a priest, while his mother, Chetna Sharma, is a homemaker. Durvish said he focused on regular studies and tuition support, especially in subjects where he needed improvement. He has now taken admission in the Commerce stream in Class 11 at Keshav Vidya School in Pataudi and aims to become a chartered accountant.

Across Haryana, rural students performed better than urban students, recording a pass percentage of 90.25% against 87.94% in urban areas. Private schools recorded a pass percentage of 92.45%, against 89.4% in govt schools.

In the Haryana Open School Class 10 fresh category, 5,772 candidates appeared and 645 passed, resulting in a pass percentage of 11.17%. In the re-appear category, 1,885 out of 3,957 candidates passed, taking the overall pass percentage to 47.64%.

Noida to repair sewage lines in 5 villages

Noida.(Agency)

Noida Authority will lay new sewer lines and set up sewage pumping stations in five villages — Barola, Sarfabad, Wazidpur, Hazipur and Chhijarsi — to address chronic overflow problems. GB Nagar MP Mahesh Sharma and Noida MLA Pankaj Singh joined Authority officials on Thursday to lay foundation stones for the projects.

"We were getting complaints about sewage problems in these areas and have decided to resolve the overflow woes permanently," said RP Singh, general manager, Noida Authority.

The largest outlay is a 10-million-litre-per-day sewage pumping station in Barola at Rs 10 crore. In Chhijarsi, Rs 1.65 crore will go toward maintenance of a 1,280-metre sewer line, pipe replacement and repair work.

Wazidpur will see Rs 1.64 crore spent on a 1,300-metre stretch for similar repairs and replacement of rusted pipes, while Rs 1 crore has been earmarked for maintaining 3,344 metres of sewer

pipeline in Sarfabad.

MLA Singh said residents had flagged the issues and the Authority had acted. The works carry added urgency ahead of the monsoon, when rainfall sharply increases



pressure on underground networks — damaged or undersized lines can cause sewage to mix with rainwater, triggering waterlogging and backflow into homes.

The Authority will also spend Rs 1.65 crore

on maintenance of a 1,280-metre sewer line, replacement of old pipes and other repair work in Chhijarsi village. In addition, it will spend Rs 1.64 crore on maintenance and repair of sewer lines and replacement of old, rusted pipes along a 1,300-metre stretch in Wazidpur. The Authority will spend Rs 1 crore on maintenance of 3,344.10 metres of sewer pipeline in Sarfabad. MLA Pankaj Singh said, "With these projects, the sewer problems will be properly resolved in the villages. We asked the Noida Authority to address these issues after the residents raised these key issues in the past."

Resolving sewer overflow and drainage issues is important as monsoon rainfall sharply increases pressure on underground sewer networks. If damaged or undersized sewer lines are not repaired in advance, rainwater mixes with sewage, leading to overflowing drains, waterlogging and backflow into residential areas.

The board approved 13 agenda items in all. Apart from fire safety, it kept open all three routes — land pooling, mutual consent and acquisition — for procuring 200 hectares for the proposed Aero City project in Morti. It also cleared a framework for a proposed international cricket stadium as a joint venture between GDA and the UP Cricket Association, with both sides as equal stakeholders in land procurement, construction and operations. 'Ghost plantations, bad roads' Fbd corpn officers face stinging rebuke from min

Two days after Union minister and Faridabad MP Krishan Pal Gurjar publicly lashed out at officials of the Municipal Corporation of Faridabad (MCF) during a stormy District Development Coordination and Monitoring Committee (DISHA) meeting, the civic body on Thursday suspended assistant engineer Sanjay Bansal.

MCF has also constituted an inquiry committee headed by additional commissioner Saloni Sharma to investigate the allegations and submit a report within 10 days.

The minister's outburst, captured on video and widely circulated on social media, came amid allegations of poor infrastructure, corruption and misuse of public funds. Gurjar accused senior MCF engineers of allowing roads to deteriorate despite repeated repairs and questioned expenditure running into crores on plantation drives that allegedly showed little visible impact on the ground.

"This is the public's money, you will rot with worms and your children will bear its brunt... Roads are built, they break down. When someone says it broke in 10 days, you say that we will get it repaired. But why did it break in 10 days?" Gurjar said



during the meeting. "The money you are taking is sinfully earned. You have turned the municipal corporation into a den of looting of public money. You want money for everything. God above is watching you," he added. Gurjar also alleged that nearly Rs 10 crore had been spent on plantation work, but officials could not

explain where the trees had actually been planted. He said such irregularities were tarnishing the image of the Haryana govt.

Two BJP MLAs present at the meeting separately raised allegations against the civic body's functioning. Ballabgarh MLA Mool Chand Sharma

accused MCF officials of reconstructing roads that were still under warranty.

NEET 2026: The Exam That Broke A Generation

New Delhi: When the National Testing Agency cancelled NEET-UG 2026 on May 12, nine days after 22 lakh students sat for it across the country, the announcement was clinical and procedural. A few lines, a formal order, and that was it. What it could not capture was the weight of what it meant for the hundreds of thousands of young people who had spent years preparing for exactly that day, and who now had to absorb a cancellation that was not their fault. The facts are not in dispute. A 410-question "guess paper" began circulating in mid-April, weeks before the May 3 examination. It contained all 90 biology questions and all 45 chemistry questions from the actual paper. Questions worth 600 out of 720 marks were accessible to those who paid. The prices tell their own story. Premium clients paid between Rs. 10 and Rs. 25 lakh initially. By May 1, copies were moving for Rs. 5 lakh. By the night before the exam, the price had crashed to Rs. 30,000, meaning the material was spreading across WhatsApp and Telegram faster than any agency could contain it. The network spans Kerala, Rajasthan, Haryana, Maharashtra, and Uttarakhand, involving coaching consultants, PG operators, admission counsellors, and at least one medical admission center in Nashik. A Latur coaching institute administered a mock test con-

taining 42 questions identical to the actual paper. Someone with direct access to the original question bank was feeding material into coaching networks weeks before exam day. This was not a fringe operation. It had roots deep inside the legitimate ecosystem surrounding medical admissions. **The Kids Who Did Nothing Wrong**
The most under-discussed dimension of this scandal is the one that matters most. Over 22 lakh students sat for this examination. The overwhelming majority had no contact with any leaked material. For them, NEET is not just an exam. It is the product of two, sometimes three years of near-total sacrifice. Coaching fees, hostel stays away from family, skipped childhoods, deferred everything. Weekends that disappeared into mock tests. Family events missed. Friendships quietly put on hold. In smaller towns and among economically weaker families, it often represents the single most significant investment a household has made in a generation, financially and emotionally both. The psychological of a cancellation under these circumstances is not something a re-examination date can undo. Mental health professionals who tracked the aftermath of the 2024 NEET controversy documented a measurable spike in anxiety, depression, and in the most tragic cases, far graver outcomes among

aspirants. The uncertainty alone, the weeks between the exam and the cancellation announcement, the not-knowing, carries its own damage. Students who had peaked their preparation around May 3 now face months of sustained pressure all over again, with no guarantee that the system that failed them once has actually been fixed. There is also a class dimension worth naming plainly. Students from privileged backgrounds can afford to reset. They have the resources for another coaching cycle, another year of preparation, another attempt at getting it right. Students from economically vulnerable backgrounds often cannot. A cancellation for them is not a delay. It can be the end of the road entirely. The exam may be rescheduled, but the opportunity cost of another year is not the same for everyone, and any honest conversation about this scandal has to reckon with that gap. **What The Nta Actually Had In Place**
Before the narrative settles entirely into institutional negligence, the record deserves a fair look. The NTA had deployed AI-based CCTV surveillance, GPS tracking for question paper transit, biometric verification at exam centers, and watermarked documents designed to trace any leak to a specific candidate and center. It flagged over 120 Telegram and Instagram

channels before the exam and its reporting portal logged over 1,500 complaints. The agency was not asleep. None of it worked, because the breach happened upstream, almost certainly at the printing or dispatch stage, before any of these controls became relevant. The perimeter was breached from inside, which is a different and far more serious problem than a test center-level irregularity. This distinction matters because the response to each type of failure is different. You fix a test center problem by tightening supervision at exam halls. You fix an upstream breach by auditing every human being and every process that touches a question paper from the moment it is written to the moment it reaches a candidate's desk. These are not the same intervention, and conflating them produces the illusion of action without the substance of reform. **Media Trials And Due Process**
Several arrests have been made and the CBI

has taken over the investigation. Names and faces have been plastered across news cycles within hours of detention. That is worth pausing on. In a case of this magnitude, with public anger entirely justified, the pressure on investigators and courts to deliver visible accountability is enormous. But the same system that failed 22 lakh students is also the one that must now ensure fair trials. Individuals accused of involvement occupy very different positions within the alleged network, and each deserves to be assessed on their specific role and not consumed by the collective outrage the scandal has rightfully generated. The profile of those arrested so far makes this point clearly. A BAMS graduate running an admission counselling center in Nashik sits in a very different position from a student who paid Rs. 30,000 the night before the exam out of panic and desperation. A mid-tier distributor who allegedly bought and resold the paper for profit is not the same as whoever first extracted it from a secure printing facility. Treating all of them as interchangeable faces of

the same crime makes for compelling television. It does not make for accurate justice. Outrage is understandable. It should not substitute for evidence. The courts will have to do the harder, quieter work of separating what actually happened from what the public narrative has already decided. A media trial does not produce a conviction, and in the noise, that distinction tends to disappear. If anything, history shows that cases which begin with maximum public fury and minimum procedural patience are often the ones that unravel the most visibly down the line. That serves nobody, least of all the 22 lakh students who deserve to see genuine accountability, not just the appearance of it. Justice hurried is justice buried. When investigations are conducted under the glare of public fury and the pressure of breaking news cycles, the casualty is not just procedure, it is people. Families are implicated wholesale based on association, not evidence. A father, a son, a brother, all arrested in the same night, their names already on television before any court has

heard a word. How is it possible that a father, brother, and son would be implicated in the same offence, and now where will they go seeking justice? Who will speak up for them against a major investigation agency such as CBI? The rush to be seen doing something produces arrests that will not survive scrutiny, charges that will not hold, and lives that will not recover. The 22 lakh students who were wronged deserve accountability that is real, not accountability that is fast. Speed without substance does not deliver justice, it deliv-

ers the appearance of it, while the actual perpetrators wait quietly for the noise to pass, and then they get political protection. **The Actual Fix**
Arrests satisfy public anger. They do not close the gap through which this paper first escaped. A serious structural audit of how NEET question papers are printed, handled, sealed, and transported is the only thing that actually prevents the next iteration of this. The 2024 controversy produced committees and recommendations. 2026 has happened anyway. At some point, recommendations have to become enforceable accountability at every node in the chain, not just the ones that are easy to photograph and put on television. US brokers between Israel, Lebanon and says progress with China

WASHINGTON. (Agency)

The United States on Thursday sought to extend a shaky ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon as President Donald Trump voiced optimism at China's efforts on Iran. A ceasefire between Lebanon and Israel -- considered to still be in place despite hundreds of deaths in Israeli strikes -- ends on Sunday and violence again flared as the two governments met in Washington. Israel has pounded Lebanon and invaded its south in response to retaliatory fire from Shia movement Hezbollah following Israel's killing of Iran's supreme leader at the start of the war on February 28. Israeli and Lebanese ambassadors held the first of two days of talks at the State Department, with Israel bringing along military officers.

"We had a full day of productive and positive talks," a senior State Department official said, expecting more to say on Friday. A Lebanese official told AFP that the country would seek "the consolidation of the ceasefire" and said: "The first thing is to put an end to the death and destruction." The two sides last met on April 23 at the White House, where Trump announced a three-week ceasefire extension between the countries, which have technically been at war for decades. Trump at the time made the bold prediction that during the three-week extension he would welcome Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Lebanese President Joseph Aoun to Washington for a historic first summit between the countries.

The summit has not happened, with Aoun saying a security deal and an end to Israeli attacks were needed before such a landmark meeting. Israel has vowed to keep pursuing attacks against Hezbollah. The Israeli military said Thursday it struck more than 65 more Hezbollah sites across Lebanon. Lebanon's state-run National News Agency reported Israeli airstrikes on the south and east on Thursday, including an area not mentioned in an earlier Israeli evacuation warning.

Hezbollah said it targeted Israeli troops in northern Israel with a drone. The Israeli military said several Israeli civilians were injured and evacuated for medical treatment. Hezbollah lawmaker Ali Ammar denounced the talks in Washington, calling them "free concessions" to Israel. Israeli attacks since March 2 have killed more than 2,800 people in Lebanon, including at least 200 children, according to Lebanese authorities, a toll Hezbollah says includes its fighters.

Former Oklahoma death row prisoner freed from jail as he awaits retrial in 1997 killing

Former Oklahoma death row prisoner Richard Glossip was released from incarceration for the first time in nearly 30 years Thursday after posting bond while awaiting retrial for a 1997 killing that put him on the brink of execution three separate times. Glossip wore a gray short-sleeved shirt and jeans as he walked out of the jail hand-in-hand with his wife, Lea Glossip.

"I'm just thankful for my wife and my attorneys. Just thankful," he said. "It's overwhelming, but it's amazing at the same time." Earlier Thursday, Judge Natalie Mai issued an order setting bond at \$500,000. Glossip must wear an electronic monitoring device and will not be allowed to travel outside Oklahoma. He also must not contact any witnesses in the case, or consume any drugs or alcohol. His attorney Donald Knight had suggested Glossip was counting on contributions to raise the money. "Mr. Glossip has many supporters and we are hopeful those supporters can afford the bail," Knight said. Last year, the U.S. Supreme Court threw out his conviction, and his longstanding claims of innocence have drawn support from Kim Kardashian and other prominent figures. Glossip had been sentenced to death over the 1997 killing in Oklahoma City of his former boss, motel owner Barry Van Treese, who was beaten with a baseball bat in what prosecutors have alleged was a murder-for-hire scheme. The Supreme Court ruled last year that prosecutors' decision to allow a key witness to give testimony they knew to be false violated Glossip's constitutional right to a fair trial.

Tensions flare near Strait of Hormuz as a ship is seized and another is sunk

A ship anchored off the United Arab Emirates was seized and taken toward Iran and another -- a cargo ship near Oman -- sank after being attacked, authorities said Thursday, as tensions escalated near the Strait of Hormuz. It wasn't immediately clear who was behind these incidents, but they happened as a senior Iranian official reiterated his country's claim of control over the waterway and another said it had a right to seize oil tankers connected to the U.S. The turmoil in the strait, which a fifth of the world's oil passed through before the war, has been a sticking point for weeks in talks between the U.S. and Iran to end the conflict. Iran's grip on the vital waterway has jolted the world economy and spiked fuel prices far beyond the Middle East. The ongoing instability in the region comes as U.S. President Donald Trump met with Chinese leader Xi Jinping in Beijing. The White House said both sides had agreed that the Strait of Hormuz must remain open. Just last week, tensions flared in the strait when U.S. forces fired on and disabled Iranian oil tankers that it said were trying to breach its blockade of Iran's ports.

Seizures and attacks in Hormuz ongoing

The United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations center said it received reports that the ship seized Thursday was taken by unauthorized personnel while anchored 38 nautical miles (70 kilometers).

'Increasing insurgency': Study finds surge in violence followed Trump's USAID cuts in Africa

US President Donald Trump's decision last year to abruptly dissolve the US Agency for International Development -- once a leading global aid donor -- has been followed by a significant increase in violence in several African countries that the agency had supported, according to a study published on Thursday. While the authors did not blame the USAID cuts for the increase in violence, they said the findings demonstrate that "large-scale,

sudden aid cuts can destabilize fragile settings." They, however, added that this is not evidence that more aid reduces conflict, instead it only shows "the effect of a sudden and unexpected disruption."

For many years, USAID had provided crucial support to African countries wrecked by conflict and violence. By eliminating more than 90% of foreign aid contracts, the Trump administration effectively cut some \$60 billion in funding. The study by researchers from several universities in Europe and the United States said the abrupt withdrawal of USAID resources also interrupted contracts, staffing and aid procurement. "The abrupt withdrawal of USAID led to a significant and sustained increase in conflict across Africa's most USAID-dependent regions," said the study, published in the Science journal. The researchers said they examined whether the abrupt shutdown of USAID was followed by an increase in violence in regions of Africa that had historically received the most support and found that there was a correlation. Africa is facing a threat from

jihadis more than any other region in the world, conflict experts say. The Armed Conflict Location & Event Data, or ACLED, said Wednesday in a new report



that jihadis in the region have been more involved in violence across the board and have been increasingly targeting civilians in the last four years. USAID had long been the key funding partner for many African countries, helping to provide funding that helped governments and aid groups respond to multiple crises across different sectors. In Nigeria for example, USAID support had helped victims of the militant Boko Haram group, which emerged in

2002. In Ethiopia's fragile Tigray region, officials relied heavily on US funds as full-scale recovery efforts were yet to start after the war there killed hundreds of thousands.

And in northern Ivory Coast, a front line of the global fight against extremism, USAID had made significant financial commitments to counter the spread of al-Qaida and the Islamic State group. The findings from the study underscore the lasting impact of funding cuts, said Nathaniel Raymond, executive director of the Humanitarian Research Lab at the Yale School of Public Health, who was not among the authors of the study. "The lasting problem with the shuttering of USAID is likely going to be that for much of its conflict prevention work, even if you put back all the money... the experience is gone," Raymond said. Also, some USAID programs may have helped prevent spillover from conflict zones, said Ladd Serwat, senior Africa analyst at ACLED. "We now see increasing insurgency and spillover, so some of those programs may have supported."

Six passengers from hantavirus-hit ship arrive in Australia for three-week quarantine

Six passengers from a cruise ship hit by a hantavirus outbreak arrived Friday in Australia for a quarantine expected to last at least three weeks. The Gulfstream long-range business jet carrying them from the Netherlands landed at RAAF Base Pearce outside the Western Australia state capital, Perth. The passengers and crew were to be moved to the nearby Bullsbrook quarantine facility. Australian Health Minister Mark Butler said Thursday the government would implement "one of the strongest quarantine arrangements in response to this virus outbreak you'll find anywhere in the world." The five Australians and one New Zealand citizen are expected to spend the three-week quarantine

period in the facility that had remained largely unused since it was built in 2022 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A decision had yet to be made on what



precautions should be taken for the remainder of the 42-day period of potential incubation that the World Health Organization had identified, Butler said. Butler said passengers of

the cruise ship MV Hondius who returned to the United States and Britain would spend most of their quarantine periods at home.

The six passengers all tested negative for the virus before they left the Netherlands and none had displayed symptoms, Butler said.

Three people among the 11 cases in the hantavirus outbreak aboard the MV Hondius cruise ship have died.

The ship was on a cruise from Argentina to the Antarctic and then to several isolated islands in the South Atlantic Ocean when the outbreak was identified. With the evacuation of all passengers and many crew members completed, the MV Hondius is now sailing back to the Netherlands, where it will be cleaned and disinfected.

Israel threatens to sue NYT over report on sex abuse of Palestinian inmates

Israel on Thursday threatened to take The New York Times to court over a piece it published denouncing allegedly widespread sexual abuse against Palestinian detainees. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Foreign Minister Gideon Saar have ordered the "initiation of a defamation lawsuit against The New York Times", according to a joint statement issued by their offices. The offices said that the piece by Nicholas Kristof, a prominent opinion columnist, was "one of the most heinous and distorted lies ever published against the State of Israel in the modern press, which also received the backing of the newspaper". Kristof's investigation is based on testimonies gathered in the Israeli-occupied West Bank from 14 men and women who said that they had been sexually assaulted by Israeli settlers or members of the security forces. The report described "a pattern of widespread Israeli sexual violence against men,



women and even children -- by soldiers, settlers, interrogators in the Shin Bet internal security agency and, above all, prison guards". The New York Times responded that any legal claim over the "deeply reported opinion column" lacked merit. "This threat, similar to one made last year, is part of a well-worn political playbook that aims to undermine independent reporting and stifle journalism that does not fit a specific narrative," Danielle Rhoades Ha, a spokesperson for the newspaper, said in a statement.

Kristof's piece said there was no evidence that Israeli leaders ordered rapes. The Israeli foreign ministry alleged that Kristof had based his piece "on unverified sources tied to Hamas-linked networks". It also accused the paper of deliberately timing the publication to "undermine" an independent Israeli report on Hamas sexual violence perpetrated during its October 7, 2023 attack on Israel, which was published on the same day. Israeli forces have detained thousands of Palestinians in the West Bank since Hamas's 2023 attack, which triggered the war in Gaza.

Trump says made 'fantastic trade deals' with Xi

President Donald Trump said he had made "fantastic trade deals" with China's Xi Jinping, as the pair met on Friday at final talks of a superpower summit that according to the US leader has also reaped a Chinese offer to help open the Strait of Hormuz. Trump had arrived in Beijing seeking to seal deals in sectors including agriculture, aviation and artificial intelligence, as well as to contain differences between the two sides in a number of tense geostrategic areas -- not least the Middle East war. Trump's overtures to Xi, whom he described as a "great leader" and "friend", have so far been met with more muted tones by the Chinese leader. But the US leader said "a lot of good" has come out of the visit.

"We've made some fantastic trade deals, great for both countries," he said after a walk with Xi among the rosebushes in the gardens of Zhongnanhai, a central leadership compound next to Beijing's Forbidden City. "We've settled a lot of different problems that other people wouldn't have been able to solve," he added, without providing details. Xi said it was a "milestone visit", and that the

two sides had to date established "a new bilateral relationship, which is a relationship of constructive strategic stability". Help on Hormuz? In an interview with Fox News after the first day of the summit wrapped, Trump said Xi had agreed to several US wishlist points. On the topic of the war in Iran, the US president said Xi had effectively assured his counterpart that China was not preparing to militarily



aid Tehran, which has essentially closed the Strait of Hormuz.

"He said he's not going to give military equipment... he said that strongly," Trump told Fox. "He'd like to see the Hormuz Strait open, and said 'if I can be of any help whatsoever, I would like to help,'" Trump added.

Asked whether the two leaders had discussed Iran, the Chinese foreign ministry on Friday released a statement calling for "a comprehensive and lasting ceasefire".

"Shipping lanes should be reopened as soon as possible in response to the calls of the international community," it added.

Taiwan policy 'unchanged'

The warm handshakes and pomp on Thursday were somewhat overshadowed by a blunt warning from Xi on a much longer standing geopolitical flashpoint, Taiwan.

Shortly after talks started, Chinese state media reported Xi had told Trump that missteps on the sensitive issue of Taiwan could push their two countries into "conflict". The Fox News interview did not touch upon Taiwan, and Trump did not comment to reporters when asked about the matter on Thursday. US

Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent told CNBC the president would say more "in the coming days".

Secretary of State Marco Rubio told NBC on Thursday though that "US policy on the issue of Taiwan is unchanged... as of the meeting".

Russia pummels Kyiv, killing at least 21 and denting peace hopes

Ukrainian emergency services said early Friday that a massive Russian missile and drone attack that pummelled Kyiv the previous day killed at least 21 people, further shredding hopes of a halt to Moscow's grinding invasion. AFP journalists in the capital heard air raid sirens wailing across the city on Thursday before several hours of thunderous explosions and flashes in the sky sent Kyiv residents running to shelter in metro stations. The Ukrainian air force said Russia had launched 675 attack drones and 56 missiles, mainly at Kyiv, adding its air defence units had downed 652 of the drones and 41 missiles. "Everything was burning. People were screaming... people were shouting," Andriy, a Kyiv resident still wearing a nightgown and with blood stains on his shirt, told AFP near a collapsed Soviet-era residential building.

President Volodymyr Zelensky said 20 sites in the capital were damaged, including homes, a school, a veterinary clinic and

other civilian infrastructure.

"Work is still ongoing in Kyiv at the site of the strike on the building -- a Russian missile strike that literally levelled a residential block, from the first to the ninth floor," he said in an evening address.

Twenty-one people including three children were killed in the attacks, Ukraine's emergency service said early Friday, updating a previously announced death toll of 16. Seven bodies were pulled from the rubble of a single destroyed residential building -- three men, three women and a young girl, police said.

Another 45 were wounded.

Ballistic challenge

Russian attacks also wounded people in the southern regions of Odesa and Kherson, and in the eastern region of Kharkiv.

"These are definitely not the actions of those who believe the war is coming to an end. It is important that partners do not remain silent about this strike," Zelensky said.

Ukraine said it shot down 94 percent of all drones and 73 percent of the missiles fired

by Russia. "The most difficult challenge is defending against ballistic missiles," he said. A slew of Ukraine's allies, including the United Kingdom, Estonia, Latvia, Finland, the Netherlands, Moldova and Slovakia, condemned the fatal attacks. "By bombing civilians, Russia demonstrates



less its strength than its weakness: it is running out of solutions on the military front and does not know how to end its war of aggression," French President Emmanuel Macron said. EU chief Ursula von der Leyen said the attacks on Kyiv showed that Russia "openly mocks" efforts

to end the war. Russia, which invaded Ukraine more than four years ago, said the wave of missiles and drones had targeted military-linked sites and energy facilities that support the Ukrainian army.

The conflict is the worst in Europe since World War II and has killed hundreds of thousands of people and displaced millions more.

Chaotic rescue scenes

At daybreak Thursday, AFP journalists witnessed chaotic scenes as rescue workers dug through mounds of debris from a collapsed residential building.

Emergency service workers were seen hauling from the site those wounded and killed in the strikes, and residents cried as they waited for news of loved ones and neighbours. The barrage is the latest setback for efforts to end the conflict after US President Donald Trump raised faint hopes for peace by brokering a three-day ceasefire between Kyiv and Moscow last week. Russia's leader Vladimir Putin also suggested the war could be winding down.

No digging, BWSSB fixes underground pipelines with robotic tech

BENGALURU.(Agency)

The Bengaluru Water Supply and Sewerage Board (BWSSB) has been using advanced robotic technology to inspect underground pipelines at 399 sites over the past six months, instead of going for road excavations that creates traffic gridlocks.

The state-of-the-art technology was launched by Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar in November last year to address pipeline leaks and sewage line faults without the need for ground excavation. The board surveyed over 32 km of infrastructure by sending robotic units directly into the underground networks to inspect, identify and repair critical faults without tearing up the asphalt.

"We understand how frustrating road excavations can be for motorists and the public in a metropolis like Bengaluru. Previously, digging up entire stretches of roads was inevitable to detect pipeline leaks or sewerage faults, leading to massive traffic jams. Following the directives of the DCM, we deployed this robotic technology. These machines travel inside the pipelines and accurately pinpoint faults without the need for surface digging, saving the public from immense hardship," said BWSSB Chairman Dr Ram Prasath Manohar. From November 2025 to May this year, the robotic units scanned 32 km inside the city's pipeline network to conduct precise and scientific inspections, accurately identified 394 specific defects allowing engineers to execute targeted repairs with minimal damage to road infrastructure and resolved 399 of 404 public complaints received during the period.

Sewage and garbage choke major canals of Vijayawada

Vijayawada. (Agency)

The pathetic condition of the three major canals passing through Vijayawada has once again raised serious concerns over public health, environmental safety and civic negligence. The Eluru Canal, Bandar Canal and Ryves Canal have now virtually turned into giant sewage drains and garbage dumping yards.

Every stretch of the canals within city limits presents a horrifying picture. Heaps of plastic waste, household garbage, food waste and floating debris can be seen across the canals, while in several areas black coloured sewage water stagnates for days, spreading an unbearable foul smell across nearby localities.

The canals are now struggling under the burden of unchecked pollution and civic neglect. The Eluru Canal runs for nearly 16 kilometres within Vijayawada city limits, while the Bandar Canal stretches around 12 to 14 kilometres and the Ryves Canal about 6 kilometres. Together, the three canals cover more than 32 kilometres inside the city. Their total network length under the Krishna delta system exceeds 198 kilometres, with the Bandar Canal extending about 77.8 km, the Eluru Canal 63 km and the Ryves Canal around 57.7 km. Despite being important irrigation channels originating from the Prakasam Barrage, the canals today resemble stagnant urban drains rather than freshwater channels. Hundreds of feeder drains, sewage outlets and outfall drains continue to discharge untreated wastewater directly into the canals round the clock. Adding to the crisis, several households located along canal embankments openly release sewage and domestic waste into the water bodies without any monitoring.

Man held for cheating, raping women after marriage promise: Police

Surat.(Agency)

THE VALSAD Rural Police arrested a 27-year-old man who allegedly posed as a tribal and cheated a woman belonging to the scheduled caste community on the pretext of marriage.

On Thursday, another woman contacted the police, alleging that earlier, the accused used the same modus operandi and raped her after falsely promising marriage. She also alleged that she was a minor at the time and gave birth to a child, after which the accused refused to marry her. Earlier in the day, the accused, Arbaz Makrani, was arrested on the basis of a complaint lodged by a woman in her 20s, police said.

She claimed in her complaint that she came in contact with Makrani, who had used a fake ID, on a social media platform in 2025. They later entered into a relationship. A few months later, she found out about his real identity and returned to her home, severing ties with him. The FIR alleges, "The accused posted their private photographs online. The accused also threatened her relatives when they did not allow him to meet her." On Wednesday, several people linked to right-wing organisations gathered at the police station concerned and staged a dharna till late evening.

Orissa HC rejects bail plea of man held for posing as advocate in poll petition

The Orissa High Court has rejected the bail plea of Subash Mohapatra, who was arrested in December 2025 for impersonating as an advocate and conducting an election petition.

Rejecting the petition, the single judge bench of Justice Gourishankar Satapathy observed that the allegations against Mohapatra were serious in nature and amounted to "a crime against society".

According to the prosecution, the High Court had directed registration of an FIR against Mohapatra in an order dated September 12, 2025. The allegation was that despite having no licence issued by any Bar Council, Mohapatra allegedly posed himself as a lawyer and conducted an election petition before the court by impersonating as an advocate. The court recorded that the enrolment number furnished by Mohapatra in the vakalatnama was later found to belong to

one Gitanjali Sharma. "The allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner having no licence issued from any Bar Council to practice in any court has posed himself as a lawyer and conducted an election petition before this court by impersonating himself as an advocate," the order stated.

The bench further observed that despite being given opportunities to produce a valid enrolment number and licence to practice law, Mohapatra failed to do so. Consequently,

the co-ordinate bench had ordered registration of the FIR. During the hearing, the counsel for Mohapatra argued that since the charge sheet had already been filed and the petitioner had spent more than five-and-half months in confinement, his detention should not be prolonged further.

Appearing for the state, the specially-engaged counsel for the case submitted that Mohapatra had "nine criminal antecedents" and, along with his associates, was allegedly instrumental in registering around 80 cases against different persons "for adopting arm twisting method to obtain certain privileges". The court also took note of the petitioner's alleged failure to disclose his criminal antecedents in the bail application, terming it "material suppression". "In the aforesaid facts and circumstances, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner," Justice Satapathy said while rejecting the bail plea.

Marathi signboard crackdown: BMC has collected over Rs 1 crore in fines, 395 shop owners went to court

The BMC has lodged cases against 1,423 establishments for not displaying Marathi signboards since November 2023, collected Rs 1.05 crore in penalties, and sent notices to 3,774 shops. Mumbai has over five lakh shops and establishments. That gap is now at the centre of a political storm.

At a civic law committee meeting on Monday, BJP corporator Tejinder Singh Tiwana accused the BMC of going after small traders while letting large establishments off the hook. "The civic administration is biased in their action against commercial shop owners who have not set up Marathi signboards yet.

They are only penalising and taking action against common shop and business owners while owners of rich hotels and industrial units are not being penalised," he said. Mumbai's Deputy Mayor and Shiv

Sena corporator Sanjay Ghadi responded with a warning that shop owners yet to comply within a month will face "Shiv Sena style action."

following which an action taken report will be submitted to the BMC's law committee," a senior official told.

Fighting back in court

Not everyone has quietly complied. Of the 1,423 establishments against whom cases were lodged, 395 have approached local courts challenging the action taken against them. Another 1,014 have decided to comply.

The process works in stages. The BMC first sends a notice. If the shop doesn't respond, a penalty of Rs 2,000 per registered employee is imposed, with seven days to put up a new board. If the establishment still doesn't comply, the BMC files a case in the local court and seeks suspension of the business until the signboard goes up. "After the cases were lodged, some business owners challenged our decision and the case would continue, while most of them obliged," a BMC official said.



Four charred to death after bus-tanker collision in Surendranagar

Four persons were charred to death and 10 others suffered burns when a bus caught fire after crashing into a tanker near Chotila town in Surendranagar district in the wee hours of Thursday, police said.

The incident occurred between 1:30 am and 2 am near Sangani village on the Chotila-Rajkot National Highway, Surendranagar Deputy Superintendent of Police SS Bhadoriya said. The private luxury bus was going to Jamnagar from Ahmedabad when it collided with an asphalt-laden tanker moving ahead of it.

Police said just before Chotila, the driver of the tanker suddenly applied brakes and the bus crashed

13 passengers managed to escape or were rescued from the burning bus.

The bodies of the four deceased — believed to be a woman and three men including the bus driver — were so badly burned that it will require DNA analysis to identify their remains, said Bhadoriya.

The DySP said that some persons had reported that the truck driver applied brakes following a tyre burst but the matter is under investigation. An FIR has been filed against the absconding driver of the tanker for rash and negligent driving at Chotila police station on the basis of a complaint by one of the surviving passengers of the bus.



No car washes, no garden hoses, and maybe no swimming pools: How Mumbai's housing societies are preparing for the water cut

Locked car wash points. Buckets instead of showers. Gardeners told to water only roots. Swimming pools that may go dry before summer ends. With a 10 per cent water cut kicking in from May 15, housing societies across Mumbai are drawing up emergency conservation plans, some already in effect, others being discussed for the weeks ahead. At Jal Kiran Housing Society in Cuffe Parade, pipeline water for car washing has already been stopped. "We have locked the supply point and asked cleaners to use a single bottle of water and a wet cloth to clean vehicles," said Dr Padmakar Nandekar, secretary of the building and vice-president of the Cuffe Parade Residents' Association (CPRA), a cluster of 81 buildings. Residents have also been advised to use

buckets instead of showers, while gardeners have been instructed to water only plant roots and avoid splashing water on leaves. "These are small changes but they save a lot of water," Nandekar said.

In Mulund's Runwal Chestnut complex, a cluster of three 21-storey buildings, residents are discussing whether to temporarily shut the swimming pool despite the ongoing summer break. "While no immediate closure has been announced, there have been discussions among society members to close the pool and save water," resident Urish Kamath said. At Evershine Towers in Malad's Evershine Nagar, residents say backup reserves built over time may help tide over the immediate crisis. "On a daily basis, there



is always some surplus water left unused, which we have been storing for situations like this," said resident Harish Chaudhary. The reserve currently stands at 5,000 litres and can last about a week. But if the cut continues longer, the society plans to suspend operations of swimming pools, gyms and banquet halls.

Companies on Bengaluru ORR say better public transport key to easing traffic congestion

The Bengaluru Traffic Police (BTP) identified uniform office timings on the Outer Ring Road (ORR) as a major cause of vehicular congestion and pitched carpooling as a solution to mitigate gridlocks on the stretch. But representatives of companies on the ORR contended that behavioural changes alone would not suffice without major improvements in public transport and last-mile connectivity. Speaking to , Manas Das, President, Outer Ring Road Companies Association (ORRCA), said, "ORRCA welcomes the BTP's efforts. However, behavioural changes such as reducing private vehicle use cannot happen without major infrastructure improvements. People work across different time zones, customers and work models."

He added that inadequate public transport, poor road conditions and weak last-mile connectivity would make these sudden shifts in the behaviour of tech park employees unrealistic.

"Smaller BMTC buses that can enter tech parks, round-the-clock bus services, safer bus stops with shelters, pothole-free roads and stronger last-mile infrastructure are critical pieces of this puzzle and need to be addressed urgently before there can be a noticeable impact and shift in employee behaviour," he said.

Krishna Kumar, an industry representative, felt that carpooling, already being practised by some people, has to be promoted company-wise. "Companies must introduce some kind of incentive model for employees to adopt it on a larger scale. We have been asking for staggered office timings from day one, but many major companies on the Outer Ring Road are still not following it.

OAV students post impressive results in CBSE Class XII board examination

Students of science and commerce streams from the Odisha Adarsha Vidyalaya (OAVs) in the state have posted commendable success in the Class XII board examination, whose results were declared by the CBSE on Wednesday. Out of the 4,721 students in the science stream, OAVs recorded an impressive pass percentage of 73.5, an improvement by 1.5 per cent from the previous year's result of 72 per cent. A total of 112 students secured above 90 pc marks in the science stream.

Priyadarshini Behera of OAV-Dhobotota in Kandhamal emerged as the topper in science stream with a score of 97.6 pc. Other achievers in the science stream included Piyush Ranjan Swain (97.2 pc) from OAV-Frezorpur, Bargarh; Shaktivandan Purohit (97.2 pc) from OAV Tetelenga, Boudh; and Lavyansh Meher (96.6 pc) from OAV Bedi, Nuapada. In commerce, 423 students from 31 OAVs appeared for the exam. The pass percentage has increased to 88.9, compared to 77.6 pc the previous year. Around 14 students secured above 90 pc marks. Disha Saha of OAV-Sanmouda, Mayurbhanj secured 96.8 pc and emerged the highest scorer in commerce. Other top performers included Anchal Agarwal (96.2 pc) from OAV Sanmouda, Mayurbhanj; Biswajeeta Prusty (95 pc) from OAV Jamdhar, Jajpur; Ankita Behera (95 pc) from OAV Jamdhar, Jajpur; and Ritik Khurana (95 pc) from OAV Ranibhol, Mayurbhanj.

Modi must tax the rich, not just middle class

Let us begin with some numbers — sadly, we cannot escape them. Since the Iran war began, global crude prices have gone up by 50%. Meanwhile, the rupee has slid from Rs 91 to a dollar to Rs 95.70 at the time of writing these words. Add to this, the fact that Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) are taking their money out at an alarming rate, and you will understand why we are in a right royal mess.

Before the war began, we were all worrying about how AI will eat up jobs, especially white-collar IT jobs that India's middleclass depends on. Now the war has added one more thing for us to worry about. That is what economists call the Current Account Deficit (CAD). That is the difference between what we earn from exports, what Indian companies earn doing business abroad, and Indians living abroad send home, and what we spend on importing goods and services.

There is nothing wrong with running a Current Account Deficit, especially for developing countries like ours. Such economies have to import machines, equipment, energy and other inputs, to build capacities. And, during the development stage, countries like ours, will not be able to match our import bill through exports or income transfers. In our case, a high import bill is also unavoidable, because we import 80% of our crude oil needs. After all, that is what fuels our economic engine. But a big part of our CAD is also because we import a lot of gold. Not just the average Indian, but increasingly also the Reserve Bank of India, which has been trying to reduce its dollar dependence by converting it

Now, unlike other assets, gold has no productive use. People buy it because it has been traditionally seen as a store of value. The demand for gold has shot up in the past couple of years because the rich are worried that other (productive) assets will not give them good returns, and also because the dollar is fast losing its dominance. In India, the benchmark Nifty 50 has given virtually zero return in the past two years; real estate prices have been stagnant for over a year, and in some cases fallen in the past few months; even fixed deposits have left very little on the table after taxes. So, it is but natural for the affluent, to buy gold with their savings.

When we buy gold or crude oil, we spend dollars. Normally, this would not be a problem if FIIs had been flocking to our markets, and flooding our economy with dollars. Right now, the exact opposite is happening — FIIs are steadily selling Indian financial assets. So, there is a double demand for dollars — from Indian importers and from foreign investors selling and exiting India. Naturally, this has driven the rupee drastically down in the past year. Last year, around this time, you could buy one US dollar for Rs 85, now it is on its way to Rs 96. The Iran war has come as a double whammy. Right before the war began, we were buying crude oil at an average price of \$70 to a barrel. And back then, the rupee was trading at Rs 91 to a dollar. So, a barrel of crude cost about Rs 6,370. Today, we are buying crude at \$105 per barrel. At the current exchange rate, it is Rs 10,000 per barrel.

In dollar terms, crude oil costs 50% more, but in rupee terms it has gone up by 57%. So, we are not only facing a higher dollar import bill because of the Iran war, but an even higher rupee import bill, because the rupee is weakening. That is why, economists, including the government's Chief Economic Advisor, V Anantha Nageswaran, are warning that our Current Account Deficit could more than double, from less than 1% of GDP to more than 2% in 2026-27. This is the most severe economic stress test that the Modi government has faced since it first came to power in 2014. What is the solution?.

When incumbent govts misread voters

Hubris never fails to bring overconfident politicians down

IN the recently-held elections to five Assemblies, three sitting governments were ousted — in Kerala, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal — while two, in Assam and Puducherry, saw a strong return to power by the incumbents. Why is it that seemingly entrenched political parties fail to read the growing impatience of the electorate correctly in adequate time to make amends? The more popular a leader today, the more careful he or she should be, since his confidants may have a vested interest in blocking ground-level information from reaching them, more so when toadyism is mistaken for loyalty.

Conversely, when do voters give incumbents yet another term in office? It simply means that the governments have broadly delivered on promises, and additionally not done the things that irritate voters.

In Assam, Himanta Biswa Sarma also tapped into the Assamese Hindu and smaller communities' fears about being deluged by the rising Muslim demographic. The combination worked this time, but it cannot be invoked all the time. In 2031, it may be a different story. After three terms in power, there may be a desire for change.

But how did the incumbents in Kerala, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal fail to read the tea leaves? The Kerala outcome, where the LDF was sent packing after two terms in office, was largely because the state has had a history of alternating governments, with Pinarayi Vijayan's second term being the result of a demoralised Congress party in 2021. The Congress-led UDF merely had to tap into the anti-incumbency sentiment against the LDF. It won handsomely, though the BJP ate into the LDF's Hindu vote this time, making the UDF victory massive. The BJP's rise in the future cannot be ruled out, provided it works out a Kerala-specific strategy that brings three communities together — the Nairs, Ezhavas and some Christian groups. The party has won three seats in the Assembly, with 11.5% of the vote.

That brings us to the main questions: How did the seemingly entrenched Dravidian parties lose to a rank outsider like Joseph Vijay's Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK)? How did a BJP, which failed to capitalise on the growing anti-incumbency against Mamata's Trinamool Congress in 2021, manage to turn the tide this time?

In West Bengal, it was rather easy to start believing that the deletions related to the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls may have been a factor, but one would be wrong. The deletions of people who may be dead or have permanently migrated cannot be seen as invalid

deletions. What matters is the 2.7 million voters whose names were flagged as having "logical discrepancies", which could include some non-citizens who may have been added illegally.

But the actual vote share difference between the BJP and the Trinamool was around 3.2 million, and even if the 2.7 million exclusions were to be added back to benefit only the Trinamool, the BJP could have won. Especially since a large share of the Trinamool vote was in concentrated pockets. The real reasons why Mamata lost are the following: One, she assumed that with 27% of the Muslim vote in the bag even before the counting started, she only needed 20% of the remaining vote to secure victory. It turned out even Muslims were looking for



alternatives. Two, she also believed that she was popular with women, and that most would vote for her. But women were as concerned about safety as they were about cash in the bank. Three, having turned the local media into her fan club, she was unable to see the tide of Hindu resentment and the anti-incumbency wave building against her. She also failed to see how the second centre of power in her party, her nephew Abhishek Banerjee, had managed to alienate many in her own party with his high-handed ways. The worst thing a leader can do is to start believing the hype building around her own personality, happily ratcheted up by a pliant media. We saw this happen at the national level too in 2024, when the media hyped up Narendra Modi's '400-paar' slogan, and ignored the growing internal dissidence in the party in Uttar Pradesh,

Maharashtra and Rajasthan, among others. Hubris never fails to bring overconfident politicians down. The BJP has corrected this fault, but it still may have issues to deal with in the forthcoming Assembly elections in Uttar Pradesh in 2027 and the general election in 2029. In Tamil Nadu, we saw another political earthquake — a totally unexpected one. While West Bengal has been in economic decline, Tamil Nadu is not only the second largest state by gross state domestic product, but has also been topping the growth indices in recent years. Then why did MK Stalin fail to win another term? Corruption and women's safety were said to be big issues for the electorate, but this did not benefit the primary opposition alliance. Tamil Nadu's results are important not only

because the anti-incumbency tide overwhelmed the party in power, but also the party in waiting, the AIADMK-led National Democratic Alliance. This can only be explained as a growing weariness with Dravidianism and anti-North rhetoric, with the voter tiring of ideological rigidity. Vijay's TVK steered clear of these old tropes and appeared different. For someone looking for change, both the DMK and AIADMK seemed like more of the same. The voter was not looking to choose between Tweedledum and Tweedledee when she had a third option.

The lessons for political parties are clear. One, don't fall for your own hype and media willingness to praise you to the skies. The media tends to be kind to those who are in power, and cannot be relied upon to test your own popularity. Two, even if you have a solid base in a state, you should be constantly looking for disruptors

who may challenge the status quo. Just as new technology threatens traditional businesses, new political entrepreneurs can always capture the imagination of voters. Three, no party can afford to be arrogant and take any voter for granted. Elections can be lost even if you have delivered on the economic front, and sometimes the voter may also respond positively to a party that seems to be doing its best even if it hasn't delivered. After demonetisation, which caused lots of hardships to people, the BJP won a huge mandate in Uttar Pradesh because the voters believed that the Modi government was trying to root out corruption. No party can afford complacency at any time. All leaders should worry about personal hubris, which the voter can send crashing down in one day. Leaders must be as wary of naysayers as yeasayers, the acolytes of the boss.

Heads must roll: NEET cancellation demands accountability

Both babus and politicians must be held responsible for the trauma they have caused 22 lakh children

THE first part-cancellation of the NEET-UG exam in 2024 was bad enough. The second, on Tuesday, is criminal. Lakhs of students, after years of relentless preparation, sleepless nights and immense emotional strain, have been told that their career-defining examination stands nullified because the authorities entrusted with safeguarding its integrity failed to protect the sanctity of a "guess paper". Heads must roll for allowing a repetition of this unforgivable scandal. The emotional devastation caused by this fiasco cannot be repaired by announcing revised dates. Every paper leak strengthens criminal syndicates while punishing honest students. There must be transparent investigations, criminal prosecution and administrative accountability. In 2024, NEET was rocked by allegations of paper leaks, inflated ranks and

controversial grace marks. Though the entire exam was not cancelled then, the episode triggered nationwide outrage, judicial scrutiny and promises of reform. The



government assured students that safeguards would be strengthened and lessons had been learnt. Instead, the

rot has deepened. The cancellation of the 2026 exam proves that the authorities hardly treated the earlier crisis with the seriousness it deserved. The National Testing Agency's credibility is in tatters. Nor can Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan escape accountability. Such a monumental failure affecting millions of young citizens calls for an overhauling of the entire system of education. The whole cycle of infamy — from coaching classes which practically hold the student's life to ransom, to large-scale fraud in "guess papers" — must be reimaged.

India needs to break the stranglehold of this magic bullet, three-hour test that decides whether you are worth becoming a doctor or not. The shift to NEET, replacing multiple state and private exams, was intended to create a standardised, merit-based admission process. Clearly, it hasn't worked. Both babus and politicians must be held responsible for the trauma they have caused 22 lakh children.

Hantavirus outbreak is a call to action

Research into emerging and re-emerging viruses should be prioritised, along with surveillance

ON April 1, a group of people boarded a cruise ship, MV Hondius, at Ushuaia in Argentina on a long-distance expedition marketed as the Atlantic Odyssey. The 33-day cruise was designed to bridge the gap between the Antarctic and the Arctic seasons with stops at exotic island locations like South Georgia, Gough Island and Saint Helena, with Praia (Cape Verde) being the final destination. Instead, it ended up in a nightmare for the passengers as some of them reported severe respiratory illness, and three died due to the illness, which was subsequently identified as a result of hantavirus infection. The first death occurred on April 11, but the cause remained unidentified. As more people fell sick with similar symptoms, the outbreak was reported to the World Health Organisation (WHO) on May 2. Although the outbreak has been limited to the ship and the virus involved is not new, it has still raised global concern due to the fact that 147 passengers and crew members onboard came from 23 countries, and 34 of them disembarked before the outbreak was identified as hantavirus. This highlights global vulnerabilities in interconnected travel networks.

So far, 11 cases have been reported, including three deaths. All cases are of passengers or crew on the ship. Nine of the 11 have been confirmed as the Andes strain of hantavirus. There have been no deaths after May 2, when the WHO was first informed of the cluster of cases. The health agency took swift action by sending its experts to the ship and coordinating the evacuation of the passengers in accordance with the International Health Regulations (IHR). Under these rules, the nearest port with sufficient medical capacity must be identified to ensure the safety and dignity of those on board. Tenerife (Spain) met that standard, and the Spanish government permitted passengers to disembark on its shore as per

IHR and EU regulations.

At present, there is no sign that we are seeing the start of a larger outbreak, according to WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus. This is not another Covid-19, he says. The current public health risk from hantavirus remains low, but the situation could change. Given the long incubation period (about 42 days) of the virus, more cases might emerge in the coming weeks.

Each of the countries to which the passengers have been repatriated is responsible for monitoring their health. Two of the crew members are Indians; they have been evacuated to the Netherlands, where the ship proceeded after disembarking all passengers in Tenerife. Both Indians have been reported to be asymptomatic as of now. Hantavirus cardiopulmonary syndrome (HPS) is a viral respiratory disease caused by hantaviruses of the genus Orthohantavirus, in which 20 viral species have been identified. At present, there is no specific antiviral treatment for HPS. Human hantavirus infection is primarily acquired through animal-to-human transmission, mostly through contact with the urine, faeces or saliva of infected rodents or by touching contaminated surfaces. However, the Andes strain is capable of spreading among people, as it has happened on the ship. In the present case, it is suspected that an elderly Dutch couple contracted the virus during a bird-watching tour in Ushuaia before they boarded the cruise ship. The couple may have been exposed to infected rodent droppings or urine at a landfill site during their outing. The hantavirus outbreak has coincided with five years of the deadly second wave of Covid and revived memories of containment measures like quarantine and contact tracing. Since the Covid pandemic, the world has seen several serious outbreaks and public health emergencies of international concern — Mpox, H5N1,

Marburg Virus — and local outbreaks of Nipah virus in India and Bangladesh. The Covid experience has shown that underestimating a virus or its pandemic potential contributes to delayed action. Various studies and models have pointed out that the world remains poorly prepared for pandemics. With environmental changes and greater human mobility, the world is likely to see more outbreaks linked to zoonotic diseases due to



pathogens that originate in wildlife.

Deforestation and other human activities in forested areas are affecting the dynamics of rodent populations, and also modifying transmission rates of rodent-borne zoonotic pathogens such as hantavirus, as found in a 2025 study of rodents in North America. Researchers discovered six new rodent species that host hantavirus, and they consider it an emerging disease of pandemic potential with symptoms that resemble severe Covid

infection. The hantavirus outbreak has once again reminded the world that human health is inseparable from animal and environmental health. Factors like deforestation, fragmentation of ecosystems, climate change and even intensive farming are bringing humans and animals into closer contact, creating opportunities for frequent 'spillover' for viruses.

Conserving forests and biodiversity is the best natural protection against such opportunistic transfer of zoonotic pathogens. Brazilian scientists have specifically studied the presence of rodent species hosting hantavirus in the Brazilian Atlantic Forest, and have found that forest restoration could significantly reduce the risk of hantavirus transmission to human populations living close to the forests. Given factors like rich biodiversity, rapid urbanisation, deforestation and the impact of climate change, India is considered a hotspot for emerging infectious diseases, including zoonotic diseases. In the wake of the Covid pandemic, the government launched the National One Health Mission in 2022, emphasising a unified approach to human and animal health. Subsequently, the National Institute of One Health was conceived to coordinate mission activities. The mission talked about stronger surveillance, early warning systems, research, infrastructure development and the integration of data across human, animal and environmental health.

The progress has been slow, particularly when it comes to research in zoonotic diseases, integrated surveillance of zoonotic and human diseases and risk assessment studies. Research into emerging and re-emerging viruses should be prioritised, along with surveillance on the ground. The hantavirus outbreak is yet another wake-up call.

5 Killed, 23 Injured After Blast At Firecracker Factory In Madhya Pradesh

The death count has risen to five after two more workers, who were severely injured in an explosion at a firecracker factory in Madhya Pradesh's Dewas district on Thursday, died.

The death count has risen to five after two more workers, who were severely injured in an explosion at a firecracker factory in Madhya Pradesh's Dewas district on Thursday, died, while 23 others are undergoing treatment, officials said. Dewas Additional District Magistrate (ADM) Sanjeev Jain told PTI, "Two workers admitted to a private hospital in Dewas succumbed during treatment. This brings the total number of deaths to five." Officials said Anil Malviya, the licensed owner of the firecracker factory operating in the Tonk Kalan area has been arrested under the stringent provisions of the National Security Act (NSA). According to officials, Malviya's firecracker

license has been suspended. Three workers who were injured in the fire have been admitted to the Government Maharaja Yashwantrao Hospital in Indore. Chief Minister Mohan Yadav visited the hospital to enquire about the well-being of the victims. He told reporters, "We have taken action against the owner of the firecracker factory under the National Security Act (NSA). We are conducting a detailed investigation into the incident, and further action will be taken based on the investigation report." The chief minister said, "The state government will not spare anyone guilty in this case. This incident serves as a lesson,



and we hope it will not be repeated." Deputy Chief Minister Jagdish Dewda said that along with the factory owner's arrest, a magisterial inquiry has also been ordered.

Home Department Additional Chief Secretary Sanjay Shukla said that officials from the central government's Petroleum and Explosives Safety Organization (PESO), the State Pollution Control Board, and the Forensic Science Laboratory are investigating the explosion at the firecracker factory. District Magistrate Rituraj Singh said that two licenses for manufacturing and selling firecrackers were issued to factory owner Malviya. He said, "These licenses were first issued on December 23 last year. They were renewed on May 6 this year." According to Singh, the factory had begun manufacturing small firecrackers only 15 days ago.

Meanwhile, state Congress president Jitu Patwari arrived at the scene and criticised the state government over the incident. Patwari said, "This incident shows that the gunpowder mafia, which imports raw materials from China, has established its dominance in the state." He alleged that the owner of the firecracker factory enjoys the patronage of leaders of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Patwari claimed that firecrackers manufactured at the factory were being illegally stored in agricultural produce warehouses and that more than 40 minor boys were working at the factory. He demanded the immediate suspension of the district magistrate for his alleged failure to prevent irregularities at the factory.

Police arrest 10 foreigners for illegally casting votes in Tamil Nadu polls

Chennai. (Agency)
Chennai police arrested 10 foreign nationals – four of them women – for allegedly casting illegal votes using fraudulently obtained identity documents in the recently held Tamil Nadu Assembly elections, officials said on Thursday.

According to a press release, the individuals were intercepted by immigration authorities at Chennai international airport while



attempting to leave the country after the polls, which were held on April 23.

Investigations revealed that despite holding foreign citizenship and not being Indian citizens, the accused had stayed in various parts of the state to allegedly exercise their franchise illegally, the release said.

Following a complaint by immigration officials to the Greater Chennai Police Commissionerate, cases were registered between May 7 and May 14 by the Central Crime Branch and local police units. All the accused were produced before a court for further legal proceedings, the statement added.

Beers, whiskeys get cheaper by 20-25% in Karnataka

Good news for beer lovers! Prices of mild and lager beers in Karnataka have dropped by 20-25 per cent, effective May 11. The Excise department has rolled out the new price list under the Alcohol in Beverage (AiB) policy for beers and spirits, under which the Maximum Retail Price (MRP) of beers, with 5 per cent alcohol v/v has dropped by 20-25 per cent.

As per the new price list, the MRP on 650ml of some of the most popular mild beer brands with 5 per cent alcohol v/v – Kingfisher Premium, Kingfisher Ultra, Budweiser, UB Export, Heineken etc – have been reduced by Rs 75 (KF Premium, Ultra), Rs 70 (Heineken), Rs 25 (UB Export) and Rs 20 (Budweiser Premium). There's a price reduction in premium Scotch whiskeys by 20 per cent as well. The MRP on 750ml bottles of Black Label (43 per cent alcohol v/v) and Chivas Regal (40 per cent alcohol v/v) has come down from Rs 5190 to Rs 4100.

The burden of the new Excise taxation policy will be felt most on the first five Excise slabs (lowest) of Indian Made Liquor (IML), which sells in 180ml (nip) tetra packs. The prices in these slabs have shot up by 20-25 per cent. This is where the AiB policy may hit lower to middle income consumers.

The first five slabs contribute between 75 and 80 per cent towards Excise revenue. The new MRP on the most popular rum brand Old Monk, with 42.8 per cent alcohol v/v, has been revised from Rs 765 to Rs 850. OM falls in the fifth Excise slab. "The final new MRP list of all brands has still not been released. Though the new MRP kicked in on May 11, people are still not aware of the new pricing. We will have to wait and watch the market response," said industry sources, who didn't wish to be named. The AiB has replaced the over six-decade-old taxation policy on bulk litre of alcohol.

To start new life together, UP woman helps lover rob her home of Rs 1.2 crore

Moradabad. (Agency)
A daughter of a brass trader in UP's Moradabad allegedly helped her boyfriend and his associates carry out a robbery at her own house, police said. Five accused, including the trader's daughter and her boyfriend, have been arrested in connection with the case. According to police, the robbery took place in the early hours of May 11 at the residence of brass businessman Mohammad Imran. Armed men allegedly entered the house around 4 am, held family members hostage at gunpoint and fled with nearly Rs 1.2 crore in cash and gold jewellery. The accused also allegedly took away the DVR connected to the CCTV cameras installed at the house before escaping.

At the time of the incident, Imran, his wife

Seema, their two sons and two daughters were present inside the house. Following the robbery, senior police officials reached the spot and formed four teams to



investigate the case. CCTV footage from nearby areas was also examined. Police said investigations revealed that Imran's daughter Ariba had been in a relationship with Amroha resident Arshad

Warsi for the past seven to eight years. Since the two belonged to different castes and could not get married, they allegedly planned to start a new life using the stolen money.

According to police, Ariba informed Arshad about the cash kept inside the house.

Investigators alleged that she had handed over the main gate key to him a month before the robbery and also opened the digital lock from inside on the day of the incident, allowing the accused to enter easily. Police arrested Ariba, Arshad Warsi and three others in the case. They also recovered Rs 47.24 lakh in cash, four country-made pistols, five mobile phones and two cars from the accused. Efforts are underway to recover the remaining cash and trace other possible accused involved in the crime, police said.

MP textbook body chief served notice over 50-vehicle convoy

Bhopal. (Agency)
A major impact of an India Today report has once again been seen in Madhya Pradesh, with newly appointed Madhya Pradesh Textbook Corporation chairperson Saubhagya Singh Thakur being served a show-cause notice and barred from all official activities until further orders. The action comes after India Today highlighted how Thakur allegedly ignored Prime Minister Narendra Modi's public appeal for fuel conservation by travelling from Ujjain to Bhopal with a convoy of nearly 50 vehicles to assume charge of his new post. Following the controversy, Chief Minister Dr Mohan Yadav had earlier issued directions discouraging rallies and public processions linked to assumption of office ceremonies. The matter has now escalated further, with strict restrictions imposed on Thakur for allegedly failing to follow appeals and directives issued in the national interest.

According to the order, Saubhagya Singh Thakur has been prohibited from entering the Madhya Pradesh Textbook Corporation office or premises until further instructions. He has also been barred from using any corporation facility, vehicle, staff or office

Delhi's draft EV policy gets 700 responses

New Delhi: The draft policy remained in the public domain for 30 days till May 10. During this period, the Delhi Transport Department invited suggestions and objections through online and offline submissions. The department also held a series of stakeholder consultation conferences with players linked to the electric mobility sector, including original equipment manufacturers across two-wheelers, three-wheelers, four-wheelers, goods vehicles and e-rickshaws, besides charge point operators, battery swapping operators, DISCOMs, fleet aggregators, battery recyclers and vehicle scrappers. According to the government, around 400 responses came from the general public. These included residents, vehicle owners, commuters, RWAs, students, delivery riders and gig workers. Another 200 submissions were received from industry stakeholders such as OEMs, OEM associations, charge point operators, battery swapping opera-

tors, vehicle scrappers, battery recyclers, DISCOMs and fleet aggregators. More than 50 responses were submitted by schools, NGOs, think tanks, universities, environmental groups, research institutions, consulting organisations, policy advisory bodies, trade associations and civil society organisations. Around a dozen submissions came from government departments, ministries and statutory authorities. Sharing details of the exercise, Delhi Transport Minister Pankaj Kumar Singh said the scale of participation reflected Delhi's growing interest in cleaner and future-ready transport systems. "The response received from citizens, industry stakeholders, institutions and experts reflects Delhi's collective aspiration towards a cleaner, greener and future-ready mobility ecosystem. Under the CM's leadership, the government is committed to formulating a progressive and implementation-oriented EV policy that accelerates clean mobility adoption while safeguarding environmental and public health inter-

ests," he said. The minister said several suggestions received during the consultation process were being examined and suitable recommendations would be incorporated wherever found practical and appropriate. He said many stakeholders had supported the government's proposed measures to accelerate EV adoption in the national capital. The government said the final Delhi EV Policy 2026 is

being prepared as a comprehensive framework aimed at strengthening sustainable urban mobility and creating a model that could serve as an example for other cities.

India saw lowest increase globally: BJP defends fuel price hike amid Opposition attack

BJP leader Amit Malviya argued that India recorded the lowest increase in petrol and diesel prices among major economies despite a global crude oil surge.

New Delhi.(Agency)

The BJP on Thursday mounted a strong defence of the Rs 3 per litre hike in petrol and diesel prices, arguing that India recorded the lowest increase among major economies despite a sharp surge in global crude oil prices triggered by the West Asia conflict and the closure of the Strait of Hormuz.

BJP IT cell convenor Amit Malviya, in a detailed post comparing fuel prices across countries, argued that India recorded the smallest increase among major economies, while nations such as the US, UK and UAE witnessed steep hikes. The response comes after opposition parties launched a sharp attack on the Centre, accusing it of burdening the common man with the fuel price hike and calling it a predictable move after the polls.

"... Across the world, consumers have felt the impact directly at fuel stations. But India stands out as a striking exception," Malviya wrote on X. "Between 23 February and 15 May 2026, nearly every major economy saw sharp increases in petrol and diesel prices. In several countries, the rise has been staggering India recorded the smallest material increase among all major economies," the BJP leader added.

Oil marketing companies on Friday hiked petrol and diesel prices by Rs 3 per litre each, marking the first increase in more than four years. The hike came amid soaring global oil prices triggered by the war in West Asia and was announced days after the Assembly elections concluded. According to the price chart shared by Malviya, Myanmar recorded the highest jump in fuel prices, with petrol prices rising

by 89.7 per cent and diesel by 112 per cent. In Pakistan, petrol and diesel prices increased by 54.9 per cent and 44.9 per cent, respectively.

Major economies such as the US witnessed a 44.5 per cent rise in petrol prices and a 48.1 per cent increase in diesel prices. The UK saw hikes of 19.2 per cent in petrol and 34.2 per cent in diesel. Even a major oil producer, the UAE, recorded increases of 52.4 per cent in petrol and 86.1 per cent in diesel, he argued. India's increase, by comparison, was limited to 3.2 per cent for petrol and 3.4 per cent for diesel, Malviya underscored. "Among major market economies, India has effectively



experienced the lowest increase. This did not happen by accident," Malviya argued, saying that India's public sector oil marketing companies kept prices largely unchanged despite rising global crude

costs.

"Instead of immediately passing on the burden to citizens, they absorbed substantial under-recoveries at the refinery gate," despite daily losses soaring nearly Rs 1,000 crore," he added. The Opposition, led by Congress, meanwhile launched a sharp attack on the Centre, alleging that the public was now being forced to bear the burden.

"Welcome to Amrit Kaal, mitron! When global crude oil prices plummeted, the Modi Government pocketed billions in profits, and now - 3 months after a completely predictable crisis - the public is being forced to absorb the pain," Congress general secretary KC Venugopal wrote.

Delhi Gets Its First Hydrogen Bus: Better Alternative Than CNG?

Delhi Metro Rail Corporation has begun operating the first hydrogen-powered shuttle bus service in the Central Vista area, with services starting on 15 May. The announcement from the organisation comes following an appeal from Prime Minister Narendra Modi to curb fuel consumption amid rising global tension. The shuttle services will provide last-mile connectivity between Central Secretariat and Seva Teerth metro stations and offer a cleaner alternative to fossil fuel-powered vehicles. The bus has been provided to DMRC by IOCL and is a product of Tata Motors. It was delivered to the oil company in 2023 as part of a fleet of buses to be assessed as a potential mass-transport solution.

DMRC's Hydrogen-Powered Bus

The hydrogen-powered bus, now operated by the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation, uses hydrogen-powered PEM fuel cell technology. It features a 350-bar hydrogen storage system and a 70 kW fuel cell stack, providing it with the necessary power. The list of safety features on the bus includes an electronic braking system and stability control, an intelligent transport system, and a new-generation telematics for efficient maintenance. With all of this, it is capable of seating 35 passengers with a length of 12 meters.

Over 30 Trains To Shift From New Delhi Railway Station: Which Train Will Move To Which Station?

New Delhi.(Agency)

Passengers travelling through New Delhi Railway Station may soon need to check their boarding stations carefully as Indian Railways prepares a large-scale train shifting exercise linked to the station's mega redevelopment project. The redevelopment work, expected to continue till around 2030, aims to develop NDLS into an airport-style multi-modal transport hub with higher passenger capacity, underground subways, expanded parking and modern waiting areas.

To reduce crowding and inconvenience during construction, several trains, as per a report by , are likely to be shifted to stations including Anand Vihar Terminal, Hazrat Nizamuddin Railway Station, Shakur Basti Railway Station, and Delhi Safdarjung Railway Station.



Around 30 trains are expected to be shifted in the next two months, while nearly 100 trains may eventually operate from alternate stations during the phased redevelopment work. Railway officials, as quoted by , are also considering shifting more east-bound trains towards Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand to Anand Vihar Terminal. The Shatabdi services are expected to be among the most prominent trains moved during the exercise. Three-Phase Redevelopment Plan At NDLS The redevelopment work has already started near Platform Number 1 at New Delhi Railway Station. The modernisation project is expected to take three to four years and will be completed in phases.

Dilapidated buildings, no toilets for girls: Audit flags safety concerns at Delhi's CM SHRI school

With plaster peeling off its walls, exposed brickwork visible across old blocks, and a 'Danger/No Entry' warning painted on one of the buildings, a CM SHRI school in Northwest Delhi's Daryapur Kalan presents a stark contrast to its model school tag.

Dilapidated school blocks, inadequate infrastructure for Children with Special Needs (CWSN), fire-safety gaps, and no toilets for girl students — these are among the key concerns flagged in an internal structural audit of the school submitted to the Directorate of Education (DoE) and accessed by The Indian Express. The report has also recommended immediate remedial action.

The findings assume significance as the Capital's 75 CM SHRI schools

were designated as 'Specified Category' institutions under Section 2 of the Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009, with the aim of promoting excellence and equity in public schooling through modern



infrastructure and advanced teaching methods aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The report comes against the backdrop of the Delhi government initiating a wider review of school

infrastructure, with DoE officials saying the exercise will cover structural safety, sanitation, drinking water, fire preparedness, and other basic facilities across government schools.

According to data made available by the school, there are 13 blocks on the campus, of which six are marked good, six dilapidated and one under construction. The audit report, however, flagged that only four blocks — 1, 2, 3 and 12 — were structurally adequate, while the remaining were assessed as dilapidated or structurally inadequate. The report has also recommended immediate corrective measures, including repair, rehabilitation, retrofitting, or demolition, based on further test analysis.

Delhi rape: Bus halted near Nangloi police station for 1.5 hrs before woman got off

New Delhi.(Agency)

The woman who was allegedly raped by two men in a sleeper bus had boarded the vehicle at Saraswati Vihar bus stand in Outer Delhi, police said. The Saraswati Vihar bus stand is under the sweep of several CCTV cameras. A PCR van was parked nearby at the time the woman boarded the bus around midnight.

There are CCTV cameras all along the 7-km route the bus took before the woman was dropped off near Nangloi railway station.

According to the police, the bus was caught on camera travelling towards Deepali Chowk Metro station from Saraswati Vihar and then taking the Mangolpuri flyover. It then turned right towards Peeragarhi, and passed the Peeragarhi and Udyog Nagar Metro stations,

police said. The bus took about 45 minutes to travel to Nangloi railway road near the Nangloi railway station. It remained stationary there for more than an hour-and-a-half, according to CCTV footage, police said. It was



during this time that the woman was allegedly raped.

The Nangloi railway station is located at a distance of around 700 m from Nangloi police station and the office

of the DCP (Outer North). Around 2.30 am, the woman was captured on CCTV cameras getting off the bus.

"The women then called the PCR helpline, and a police team arrived. She was taken to the Nangloi police station, where she filed a complaint," said a senior officer. Reacting to the incident, AAP leader Saurabh Bharadwaj questioned why the police did not disclose the case earlier. "We want to ask the police commissioner how a bus kept moving for hours in a central area like Rani Bagh while a woman was allegedly gangraped and later thrown out," he told mediapersons.

"We learned nothing from Nirbhaya. This incident is a stain on the entire society," AAP national convenor and former Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal said on X.

When IIMs took to academic roasting with paper-leak questions after CAT cancellation

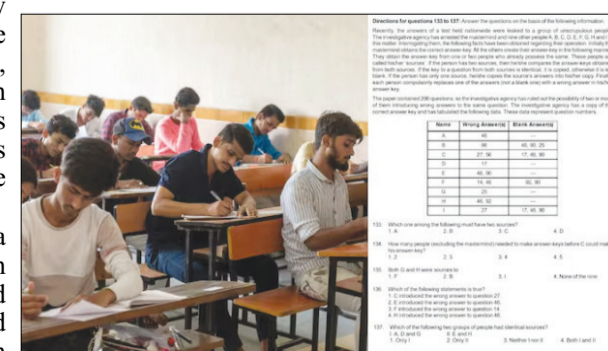
Months after the 2003 CAT question paper's leak forced the cancellation of the premier exam, the IIMs returned with a re-test featuring questions that mirrored the mechanics of the scandal itself. The now-legendary 'mastermind' CAT question is remembered by CAT aspirants as a rare moment which many call 'academic roasting'.

Through India's countless competitive exams, paper leaks leave behind outrage, cancellations, announcement of new ones, and broken trust. But in 2004, the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs), which conducts the Common Admission Test (CAT), responded to one of India's most infamous entrance exam scandals with something few would have expected.

Months after CAT was rocked by a massive paper leak scandal in November 2003, the IIMs responded with difficult Logical Reasoning and Data Interpretation (LRDI) questions in the February 2004 re-test, which directly mirrored the mechanics of the 2003 leak itself.

Decades later, as debates around the sanctity of competitive exams have returned to the national spotlight amid reports of alleged

irregularities in the May 3 NEET-UG 2026 exam, the 2003 CAT paper leak and the subsequent questions by the IIMs, offer a



lesson in institutional wit. Chandigarh-based UPSC mentor and founder of Sleepy Classes, Shekhar Dutt, said this is what "academic roasting literally means". "Such was the heartbreak that they even included a question on the Mastermind and

the process it followed to make the leak undiscoverable," Dutt said on X.

The CAT scandal of 2003 had shaken the credibility of India's premier management entrance examination after the paper was leaked and sold across the country. Over 1.27 lakh aspirants were affected, forcing the IIMs to cancel the exam for the first time in their history. A re-test was conducted months later in February 2004.

And, what made the 2004 CAT re-test legendary was the LRDI questions built around the "mastermind" who leaked the answer keys through a network of accomplices.

Over the years, CAT preparation communities have begun calling it "academic roasting". Coaching institutes, YouTube explainers and CAT aspirant forums still discuss the set as one of the toughest and most creative LRDI questions ever asked in CAT history.

Sanju Samson next India T20I captain? Ravi Shastri gives his seal of approval for CSK star

Kylian Mbappe captain, Camavinga out as France announce FIFA World Cup 2026 squad

Didier Deschamps has named France's 2026 World Cup squad with Kylian Mbappe as captain and Eduardo Camavinga omitted. It sharpens the focus on France's depth ahead of what is expected to be Deschamps' final World Cup in charge.

France unveiled a talent-packed squad for the upcoming World Cup on Thursday, though one major name was missing from Didier Deschamps' final selection — Real Madrid midfielder Eduardo Camavinga. Ranked No. 1 in the latest FIFA Men's World Rankings, France head into the tournament as one of the strongest contenders.

FIFA WORLD CUP 2026 COVERAGE

Captain Kylian Mbappe headlines the squad alongside attacking stars Ousmane Dembele and Michael Olise. The midfield will feature Aurelien Tchouameni and veteran N'Golo Kante, while the defence includes William Saliba, Jules Kounde and Theo Hernandez. Mike Maignan will serve as the team's first-choice goalkeeper. Despite being part of France's runner-up squad at the 2022 World Cup and featuring in the March international fixtures, Camavinga failed to make the final 26-man list. At club level, he has recently fallen behind Thiago Pitarch in Real Madrid's midfield pecking order.

"He had a difficult season for him where he played less. He also had injuries," Deschamps said, as quoted by Reuters. "It's true that he's a player who came very early with us. He is still a young player." "Because I have choices to make the squad structure also has to be even

among the defenders, the midfielders and the forwards. But I understand and I imagine his enormous disappointment this evening." Deschamps selected Brice Samba and Robin Rissis as Maignan's understudies,



with the latter earning recognition after an impressive Ligue 1 campaign. Their inclusion meant there was no place for Lucas Chevalier, who lost his starting role at Paris Saint-Germain earlier this year to Matvei

Safonov. Before heading to their World Cup training base in Boston, France are scheduled to play warm-up matches against Ivory Coast and Northern Ireland. Their Group I campaign begins against Senegal on June 16, followed by fixtures against Iraq on June 22 and Norway on June 26. Other high-profile omissions included Tottenham forward Randal Kolo Muani and Rennes striker Esteban Lepaul, who finished as Ligue 1's top scorer this season. Meanwhile, Jean-Philippe Mateta earned a recall despite missing the March friendlies while recovering from a knee injury. He is expected to help cover for the absence of Hugo Ekitike, who has been ruled out with a ruptured Achilles tendon.

The tournament is also expected to mark Deschamps' final World Cup in charge of France. The manager guided Les Bleus to World Cup glory in 2018 and is widely tipped to hand over the reins to French icon Zinedine Zidane after the competition. France previously lifted the trophy on home soil in 1998 as well.

Why has BCCI picked Vaibhav Sooryavanshi for India A and not India

For months, Indian cricket has been locked in one debate: is Vaibhav Sooryavanshi ready for the senior team? Some believe throwing a 15-year-old into international cricket is a risk not worth taking. Others feel the Bihar prodigy has already shown the temperament and fearlessness that most senior players spend careers chasing. Either way, the debate itself speaks to the extraordinary impact Sooryavanshi has made in so little time. Robin Uthappa had wondered aloud whether Sooryavanshi's stunning IPL 2025 campaign was a one-season burst. The teenager came back in 2026 and lit up the tournament all over again. The doubters went quiet. The question grew louder. Now, Indian cricket has dropped its biggest hint yet. On Thursday, Sooryavanshi earned his maiden India A call-up for the upcoming tri-series in Sri Lanka — a clear sign that the BCCI sees him as a serious long-term prospect, but is unwilling to fast-track him recklessly into senior cricket just yet. The Sri Lanka



assignment, scheduled between June 9 and 21, gives the youngster a platform to don the India colours without the crushing weight of senior international expectations. It also, on the surface, appears to keep Sooryavanshi away from India's tour of the United Kingdom — seven T20Is across Ireland and

England. But here is the thing: the UK series does not begin until June 28. Sri Lanka ends June 21. The window exists, and the BCCI knows it. If Sooryavanshi lights up the tri-series the way he has lit up everything else he has touched, the selectors may find the argument for leaving him behind increasingly difficult to make. THE SMOOTH PATHWAY

Let's get one thing straight: not everyone is Sachin Tendulkar. More importantly, just because one pathway worked for Tendulkar does not mean it will work for everyone else. Prithvi Shaw, once hailed as the next Tendulkar, is currently struggling to find a place even in an IPL playing XI.

That is precisely why the BCCI deserves credit for the measured approach it has taken with Sooryavanshi. Instead of getting swept away by the hype surrounding the teenager, Indian cricket's decision-makers have chosen to move him through the system gradually, step one, then step two, rather than throwing him straight into level five.

Sreejesh was insulted: Former captain Jude Felix tears into Hockey India

It was March 27 at the Hockey India Awards. Every Indian team and coaching staff member was present under one roof. It was a day of celebration, with players and coaches freely interacting with the media. Yet one man seemed detached from it all, unusually withdrawn for someone known for his warmth and energy around the media. The often talkative PR Sreejesh stayed away from the spotlight, avoiding questions throughout the evening. When we finally got a brief chance to speak to him, the legendary goalkeeper politely said he did not wish to interact with the media that day. There was a quiet sense that something was simmering beneath the surface. But the event moved on, and so did everyone else. And then May 13 arrived. The storm that had been building inside Sreejesh finally broke over Indian hockey. In an explosive social media post, the 38-year-

old revealed that he was no longer the head coach of the Indian junior men's hockey team — a role he had taken up immediately after India's emotional bronze medal



triumph at the Paris Olympics. Despite delivering five medals, including a podium finish at the FIH Junior Men's Hockey World Cup, Sreejesh was suddenly out. He slammed Hockey India, claiming the

federation had removed him in favour of a foreign coach, later revealed to be Frederic Soye. Hockey India quickly attempted damage control, insisting Sreejesh had not been "sacked" and had instead been offered the role of coaching the development squad — a position they described as crucial to preparations for the Los Angeles Olympics in 2028. Sreejesh explained his reasons behind not accepting the role in another explosive tweet. The federation also argued that it was time for greater experience to come into the junior setup, suggesting Sreejesh still needed more exposure as a coach. Another point Hockey India highlighted was their focus on fostering grassroots and homegrown coaches, claiming they already had over 600 such talents within their coaching pathway system.

MI batting coach Pollard cops hefty fine after outburst at umpire in PBKS clash

PBKS vs MI: Mumbai Indians batting coach Kieron Pollard has been fined 15 per cent of his match fee for using abusive language towards the fourth umpire. The penalty came during a tense six-wicket victory over Punjab Kings in Dharamsala.

Mumbai Indians batting coach Kieron Pollard has been fined 15 per cent of his applicable match fee for breaching the IPL Code of Conduct by using abusive language for the fourth umpire. The legendary former West Indies all-rounder also accumulated one demerit point for the Level 1 offence. According to an IPL press release issued on Friday morning, Pollard was found to have breached article 2.3 of the Code of Conduct, which relates to the use of an audible

obscurity during a match. The flashpoint occurred in the 19th over of the second innings during Mumbai Indians' match against Punjab Kings on Thursday night. Pollard admitted to the offence and accepted the sanction imposed by match referee Pankaj Dharami. This is not the first time the long-time associate of Mumbai Indians has been penalised for breaching the code of conduct in the past.

Tilak Varma Stars in Last-Ball Thriller The disciplinary incident took place during a dramatic last-ball thriller in the hill town of Dharamsala, where Mumbai Indians emerged winners by six wickets. The defeat severely dented the playoff hopes of Punjab Kings, who have now slumped to their fifth straight defeat and must win both of their remaining matches to stay in contention for a top-four finish. Chasing a competitive target of 201, Ryan Rickleton came out blazing for Mumbai Indians. He single-handedly propelled his side to 59 for no loss during an

explosive 23-ball 48, tearing into the attack despite Rohit Sharma's scratchy 25 at the other end. Arshdeep Singh delivered two outstanding overs with the new ball for



Punjab, conceding just eight runs, but lacked support as Rickleton took toll of Azmatullah Omarzai, Marco Jansen, and Xavier Bartlett. Punjab Kings fought back with three wickets for 57 runs between the seventh and 13th overs, with Yuzvendra Chahal bowling a

superb spell to pull things back and castle Rohit. However, Tilak Varma anchored the chase superbly with an unbeaten 33-ball 75. Varma first stitched a 61-run stand off 42 balls with Sherfane Rutherford and later combined with Will Jacks to steer Mumbai home in 19.5 overs, hitting two sixes in the final over to knock off the winning runs. Shardul's Four-Wicket Haul Limits PBKS

Earlier in the evening, Punjab Kings were asked to bat first and crossed the 200-run mark for the eighth time this season. Prabhsimran Singh smashed 57, adding a 33-ball 50-run opening stand with Priyansh Arya and a further 57 runs with Cooper Connolly to take Punjab past the 100-run mark in the 12th over. Shardul Thakur brought Mumbai Indians back into the game with a four-wicket burst, finishing with figures of 4 for 39. Shardul struck twice in three balls to remove the well-set Prabhsimran and stand-in skipper Shreyas Iyer.

Oil rises after Trump says he is losing patience with Iran

In incidents around the Strait of Hormuz, a ship was reported seized by Iranian personnel off the United Arab Emirates and headed for Iranian waters on Thursday, and an Indian cargo vessel carrying livestock from Africa to the UAE was sunk on Wednesday in waters off the coast of Oman. The White House said Trump and Xi had agreed on the need to keep the shipping lane open.

Iran's Revolutionary Guards said 30 vessels had crossed the Strait of Hormuz since Wednesday evening, still far short of 140 that were typical daily before the war, but a substantial increase if confirmed.

Rupee falls 30 paise to 95.94 against US dollar in early trade

MUMBAI (Agency)

The rupee opened on a weaker note and fell 30 paise to 95.94 on Friday after hitting new lows over three straight sessions, as elevated crude oil prices, a strong dollar, and concerns over the West Asia crisis weighed on investor sentiment. Forex traders said USDINR is under pressure and hovering very close to the 96 mark as dollar buying continues amid upside in oil prices. Moreover, the Summit between US President Trump and Chinese President Xi did not yield any fruitful results, particularly on the US-Iran front, denting investor sentiments further.

The USD/INR pair, which had slumped to 95.96 against the American currency on Thursday, recovered sharply after reports surfaced that India is considering a major cut in taxes paid by foreign investors on Indian bonds. On Friday, the government hiked the petrol and diesel prices by Rs 3 per liter in the latest move to curb the demand of these fuels. At the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee opened at 95.86, then fell further to 95.94 against the US dollar, registering a fall of 30 paise from its previous close.

The rupee weakened to a fresh record low of 95.96 before closing with a marginal gain of 2 paise at 95.64 against the US dollar on Thursday. Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading at 99.05, higher by 0.24 per cent.

Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, was trading up 1.30 per cent at USD 107.09 per barrel in futures trade. On the domestic equity market front, Sensex rose 239.14 points to 75,637.86 in early trade, while the Nifty was trading 78.30 points higher at 23,767.90.

US agrees to drop criminal fraud case against Gautam Adani after settlement deal

The US government has agreed to settle a lawsuit filed against Billionaire Gautam Adani, who is accused of duping investors by concealing that his company's huge solar energy project in India was being facilitated by an alleged bribery scheme, according to court filings published Thursday.

In the lawsuit filed in late 2024, the Securities and Exchange Commission accused Indian billionaire Gautam Adani and his nephew Sagar Adani, both leaders of the energy company Adani Green Energy Limited of promising to pay Indian government officials the equivalent of hundreds of millions of dollars in exchange for government contracts to purchase energy at inflated rates.

At the same time, the company secured several billions of dollars from Wall Street investors who were allegedly assured that the company had a robust anti-bribery compliance program and were given promises from senior management that no bribery would take place.

Those actions, the SEC said at the time, violated antifraud provisions of U.S. securities laws. Court documents show that Gautam Adani agreed to pay civil penalties of \$6 million while his nephew agreed to pay \$12 million. The proposed settlement doesn't include an admission of guilt. The Adani Group denied the allegations at the time, calling them baseless. Messages left with both the Adanis' attorneys were not returned on Thursday.

Beyond the petrol pump: How higher fuel prices could hit India's economy

The Rs 3-per-litre petrol and diesel price hike may only be the start of a new cycle of fuel price increases as crude oil prices remain high, with economists warning of wider pressure on inflation, growth, household budgets and the rupee

New Delhi, (Agency)

The Rs 3-per-litre hike in fuel prices announced on Friday may be only the beginning if global crude oil prices remain elevated. Economists warn that sustained fuel price increases could ripple across India's economy through higher inflation, weaker consumer spending, pressure on the rupee and slower growth. Petrol and diesel prices were hiked on May 15, marking the first major fuel price increase in nearly four

years as global crude oil prices surged amid ongoing tensions in West Asia. Brent crude prices were trading around \$107 per barrel on Friday, and analysts warn petrol and diesel prices in India could rise further in the coming weeks if global crude oil prices remain elevated. The hike comes at a particularly sensitive time for India, which imports nearly 85% of its crude oil requirements. That makes the country highly vulnerable to global energy shocks, especially when geopolitical tensions threaten key oil supply routes such as the Strait of Hormuz. Higher retail fuel prices may also help moderate domestic fuel demand and reduce some pressure on India's import bill, economists say. "This was a long-anticipated move in light of the sharp rally in global crude prices and the rising burden on domestic oil marketing companies as well as fiscal books," said Radhika Rao, Senior Economist and Executive Director at

DBS Bank.

Experts say if crude oil prices remain elevated for an extended period, the consequences could include higher inflation, weaker consumer spending,



pressure on the rupee, rising import costs and slower economic growth. Beyond the petrol pump, fuel prices play an unusually important role in India's economy because transportation costs feed into nearly every sector. Diesel powers trucks transporting vegetables, fruits, grains, medicines and consumer goods across the country. It is also widely used in

agriculture, logistics, mining and industrial activity. When diesel prices rise, businesses often face higher transportation and operating costs. These additional expenses are eventually passed on to consumers through higher prices. "The hike will raise inflation by increasing transportation and production costs, thereby increasing prices of essential goods," Dr Manoranjan Sharma, Chief Economist at Infomeries Ratings, told IndiaToday.in. Economists say fuel inflation tends to spread quickly because logistics sits at the centre of supply chains. Even sectors not directly linked to fuel consumption eventually feel the pressure through higher freight and input costs. How higher fuel prices can affect inflation

One of the biggest risks from rising fuel prices is inflation. As transportation and production become more expensive, companies often raise prices to protect margins.

Sensex, Nifty open higher despite rise in fuel prices; IT stocks lead gains

New Delhi, (Agency)

Benchmark stock market indices opened higher on Friday, despite the government raising petrol and diesel prices amid an energy crisis arising due to the West Asia war. The S&P BSE Sensex was up 292.55 points to 75,691.27, while the NSE Nifty50 gained 83.70 points to 23,773.30 as of 9:34 am. Dr. VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Investments Limited, said that the 789 point rise in Sensex yesterday was mainly triggered by short covering.

"FIIs were positioned heavily on the short side. There are rumours of measures to shore up the rupee and attract capital into the economy. We will have to wait for clarity on this," he added.

After the opening bell, Infosys Ltd led the Sensex gainers, rising 2.87%. It was followed by Tech Mahindra Ltd, which gained 2.77%. Tata Consultancy Services Ltd moved up 2.14%, while

HCL Technologies Ltd added 1.87%. Kotak Mahindra Bank Ltd also opened higher, rising 1.57%. Reliance Industries Ltd saw the sharpest fall, dropping 1.34%. Eternal Ltd declined 1.30%, State Bank of India Ltd was



down 1.10%, Trent Ltd slipped 0.78%, and Bharat Electronics Ltd fell 0.70% in early trade. The market did not see any negative effect in early trade of the petrol, diesel prices rising by Rs 3 per litre. The decision to increase the price

of petrol and diesel by Rs 3 a litre and CNG by Rs 2 a kg indicate that the government is playing it safe through small increases, perhaps stage by stage, without triggering a sharp spike in cost-push inflation. This is a welcome step,"

said Vijaykumar. "There are some trends in the market which investors have to watch. The market is responding hugely positively to good Q4 results with double-digit price rises in some cases, and punishing poor results with double digit price crashes in some cases. This reflects the gap in market expectations and actual results," he added. Another important trend is the continuing weakness in IT stocks and sustaining strength in pharmaceuticals stocks. This reflects the market perception of the prospects of these sectors in the present challenging environment," concluded Vijaykumar.

8th Pay Commission: What happened at the Cabinet Secretary-led NCJCM meeting

The 49th meeting of the National Council-Joint Consultative Machinery (NCJCM) was held on May 11, 2026 under the chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary TV Somanathan, where employee unions and government officials discussed a wide range of issues related to salaries, pensions, recruitment, promotions, allowances and service conditions of central government employees.

IndiaToday.in has been continuously reporting on developments linked to the 8th Pay Commission, including employee demands, union consultations and salary-related discussions. The meeting assumes significance as it comes in the middle of ongoing consultations under the 8th Pay Commission, which has already begun discussions with employee unions and staff associations across

the country. According to documents shared by the Staff Side of the NCJCM, senior officials present at the meeting included the Chairman of the Railway Board, Secretary Expenditure, Secretary Personnel, Secretary Department of Posts, Secretary Education, Secretary Health and officials from multiple ministries and departments. The Staff Side was represented by leaders including Shiva Gopal Mishra, Secretary Staff Side, M. Raghavaiah, Dr N Kanniah, Guman Singh, J.R. Bhosle, C. Srikanth and several other employee representatives.

The meeting also coincided with the Diamond Jubilee year of the JCM Scheme, which completed 60 years in 2026. STAFF SIDE FLAGS IRREGULAR NCJCM MEETINGS Before discussions on agenda items began, employee representatives

raised concerns regarding the functioning of the NCJCM mechanism itself. The Staff Side pointed out that under the JCM framework, three ordinary meetings are supposed to be held every year. However, it said only 49 meetings had taken place in 60 years. "After 2016 no meeting of the Department Council JCM of Ministry of Defence has taken place," the Staff Side said in the document.

Employee representatives urged the Cabinet Secretary to ensure that regular meetings are held so that staff grievances can be resolved in a time-bound manner. The Staff Side also raised concerns over increasing court cases on service matters and alleged that several ministries continue to file appeals and review petitions even after court rulings, leading to delays and employee hardship.

India's fuel crisis could push a long-overdue rethink of how cities move

PM Modi's seven appeals are the right signal at the right time. But fuel security and clean air require infrastructure, not just intention, and that demands a place in every state and central budget.

New Delhi, (Agency)

In the 1970s, an oil shock forced European nations to reimagine how their cities moved. The Netherlands built cycling networks that remain the envy of the world. Norway began its long journey toward elective vehicle (EV) adoption — a journey that today sees nearly 96% of new car sales being electric. Those emergency decisions became the foundations of healthier, more productive cities half a century later. India now stands at a strikingly similar crossroads. With Brent crude above \$100 a barrel and the Strait of Hormuz in crisis, Prime Minister

Modi addressed the nation in Hyderabad on May 10 with seven appeals: work from home, use public transport and carpooling, adopt EVs and railways, avoid foreign travel, cut gold purchases, reduce cooking oil and fertiliser use.

He framed these as acts of national duty, "Nation First." While this is a welcome call, as someone who has spent years working on the streets of Indian cities trying to make them walkable, breathable, and safe for a child to cross, I must say plainly: citizens cannot be asked to use public transport that does not exist, or walk safely on footpaths that have never been built. More than 50,000 pedestrians die on Indian roads every year and another 50,000 die due to accidents associated with two-wheelers. This is not a transport failure alone — it is a public health crisis, an urban planning failure, and a question of social equity, as per MoRTH Road Accidents in India Report 2023 and 2024. Take Gurugram, Noida, or most Indian cities. How does a worker, a student, or a child get from A to B without a private vehicle? In most of

our cities, the honest answer is: they cannot. Not safely. Not reliably. Not with dignity.

DATA GAP WE REFUSE TO CONFRONT

Delhi is our most transit-served city. The



Metro handled 235.8 crore passenger journeys in 2025, an average of 64.6 lakh riders every single day, with a peak of 81.87 lakh on a single day in August 202, as per DMRC Annual Statement, March 2026. Combined with DTC and cluster buses serving over 40 lakh passengers daily, Delhi's public transport system moves well over one crore people each day. Yet bus ridership has fallen nearly

20% since 2019-20, even as the fleet grew, as per Delhi Economic Survey 2025-26.

The reason is straightforward: buses are slow, unsafe, and unreliable when they have to fight the same congested roads as private vehicles. If as the capital, Delhi, struggles to retain public transport users, the challenge everywhere else is orders of magnitude harder. This is the context in which the PM's appeal lands: a country that has over 87 lakh vehicles registered in Delhi alone, as per the Delhi Economic Survey 2025-26, where 50,000 pedestrians are killed on roads each year, and where most cities have no continuous footpath infrastructure at all. WHAT THE WORLD IS ALREADY DOING Other nations did not wait for a crisis to move. Norway began its EV push in the 1990s; today, nearly 96% of new car sales are electric, as per the IEA Global EV Outlook 2025. China sold 13.2 million electric vehicles in 2025 (53% of its new car market) powered by government fleet mandates and industrial policy that made EVs cheaper than petrol alternatives.

As we drove closer to Sarrahiri, a hamlet near Karmajhiri gate of Pench National Park, thick grassy lands surrounded us on both sides. The bright green landscape, peppered with tile-roofed mud huts, made for a beautiful pastoral terrain. We checked into our tree lodge, perched on top of a mahua tree and the next few minutes were spent gazing at the deciduous forest from our balcony.

Feeling alive



Having grown up reading *The Jungle Book*, I was excited to traverse the national park, the land of the famed characters - Bagheera, Balloo and Shere Khan.

The guide suggested we also take in the other little pleasures of the jungle while looking for wild cats on our safaris, which are not difficult to spot in the peak summer season. So, we decided to make the most of the open-jeep jaunt by breathing in fresh air, soaking up the sun, the musty smells of the earth, cacophony of the birds and much more.

Into the wild

Unlike other forests like Kanha and Bandhavgarh, Pench is a lot drier and sparse, allowing you to take a sneak peek into the intimate moments of the resident birds and animals. At the same time, it is refreshingly

diverse in its topography - undulating scrublands, bamboo patches, stunningly large water bodies, hills and jungle valleys form a beautiful landscape. With more than 200 species of birds, including wagtails, horn bills, kingfisher, barbets and minivets, and rich fauna, the jungle is a treat for anyone keen on photography. Watch out for the Indian Ghost Tree, a beautiful tree with a white trunk and peeling paper-thin skin. It eerily stands out, and yes, it does glow in the dark!

Man is an outsider

While you are likely to spot a tiger with her cubs by following the alert calls from deer and langurs, leopards and sloth bears are the elusive creatures here. The closest we got to Collarwali (the celebrity tigress of the forest), were fresh pugmarks, but what exhilarated us more was the 15-minute intense jeep chase where our naturalist and the forest guide managed to create a tale full of mystery and suspense.

How to get there

Fly to Nagpur and drive for about two hours or more to your hotel or take a train to

Nagpur railway station (94 km) followed by a two-and-a-half hour drive. Since the roads here aren't in great condition, avoid a road trip.

When to go

The best months to visit are between Nov and June. Visit during the winter season to enjoy pleasant days and cold mornings and evenings. Summer is sweltering hot, but chances of spotting a tiger are higher. Plus, this is also the time when chitals shed their antlers.

Did you know?

The character Mowgli originated in Pench National Park, but his creator Rudyard Kipling never actually visited the park. It is believed that a 19th century British official wrote about a wolf-boy he found in the jungle. Kipling read his journal and got inspired to pen *The Jungle Book*.



Miami Beyond the beaches

Wynwood Art District is for those who wish to step out of comfortable galleries and experience the maniacal thoughts that reside in the head of artists, who literally use the world as their canvas. Here you will find art in every imaginable form. From abstract art to geometric patterns that can only be created once your mind is pushed into an overdrive... Wynwood has it all. The entire district is a massive canvas - you won't find a single wall or street that's not covered.

Tripping on art

Museums is something I am happy to give a miss. But when my charming tour guide



suggested a quick stop at the Perez Art Museum, we obliged, albeit grudgingly. What we expected: an hour-long snooze fest. The reality: a mind-blowing experience. This haven for modern and contemporary international art of the 20th and 21st centuries is unlike any other museum. From the first exhibit to the final one, there was not a single piece that didn't transfix us. From using light to mirrors and sound to miniatures, the works at Perez are such that they take you on a trip that's parallel to this universe, and yet not from our realm. Sounds absolutely bonkers, but Perez is a sensory overload that's a must-do in Miami.

The Wild Zone

Like most cities, Miami too has its own little paradise for animal lovers. The Jungle Island is a place that both kids and adults would love to visit. Built about 80 years ago, most of the

animals are kept in massive enclosures that mimic their natural habitats. You also get to spend quality one-on-one time with certain four-legged friends. Your head can be a dance floor for the a bunch of lemurs or you can get some much-needed TLC from a baby Capuchin monkey (the same breed that Ross had in *Friends*) - all-in-all a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

Fun detour

If you have a couple of days to spare, do visit Orlando. It might not have the glitz and glamour of Miami, but what it scores high on is a strong dose of testosterone in the form of some crazy simulation rides at Universal Studios. Also, if you have grown up binge watching cartoons, a trip to the Walt Disney World will rake up some memories.

Nordic adventure

My summer adventure in Iceland had a big plus point, the travel part apart. For company, I had a local writer, poet, social activist and a political adviser - all rolled into one! My friend Halla Gunnarsdottir is a brilliant multi-tasker, like most Icelanders, and she made sure I saw her country not like a tourist but as an insider. So, armed with hiking boots and our driving licences, we designed a road trip that was to begin in Reykjavik in the west and take us to Borgarfjorour Eystri on the eastern side.

In a loop

Iceland has one main road called Route 1, or the ring road which goes around the island - with inroads leading to fjords, towns, peninsulas and highlands. Over the next two weeks, Iceland revealed itself to me in a series of arresting visions, untouched by man, as it has existed for scores of centuries. I also got the chance to mingle with the natives, experience their culture (two weddings and a ceremony accepting me as an honorary Viking) and try some of Iceland's unique culinary treats like fermented shark, minke whale, puffin and, of course, Iceland's famous hot dogs.

Gushing start

Two hours from Reykjavik, is one of Iceland's most magnificent waterfalls - Seljalandsfoss - that drops down from a height of 60 metres. Keep your rubber boots and raincoat handy if you want to walk to the big cave behind the falls. (If you are warm enough, you'll never want to leave this picturesque icy cold wonder.) Another 30 minutes of driving got us to another impressive waterfall, Skogafoss. Most tourists attempt a one-day hike from here to reach the famous Eyjafjallajokull volcano.

Blacked-out

When Halla mentioned a visit to a black beach called Reynisfjara, I didn't take her seriously. Not even after I was standing in the middle of this vast blackness! The black escapade continued with a hike to Svartifoss aka Black Waterfall. Why black? Because of the dark basalt columns here.

Eastern Fjords

Iceland's eastern coastline is full of numerous mountains, beaches and countless majestic fjords (long, narrow inlets created by glacial erosion), which are home to the country's diverse wildlife - wild reindeer, seal colonies, birds. The jagged, snow-capped profile of the



Eastern Fjords provides the first glimpse of Iceland. Each fjord looks more amazing than the last one, so take a deep breath and enjoy the ride. We were lucky enough to get to see a couple of swans strut around the Swan Fjord, as it is known.

The last stop was Borgarfjorour Eystri, a quaint little town that ended the trip on a high note - literally. The Daler Mehendi-crazy crowd here (yes!) threw a party for their "friend from India" and we danced all night to paaji's bhangra beats. In the end, words like beautiful, amazing, must-visit fail to describe my Iceland experience. Life altering comes close... perhaps.
