Amid Middle East War, PM Modi Tells Ministers To Explore Alternative Energy Sources

At Prime Minister Narendra Modi's four-hour-long meeting with his Council of Ministers on Thursday evening, energy crisis triggered by the Middle East war loomed large. The Prime Minister urged his ministers to urgently explore alternative energy sources. The US-Israel war on Iran and the continued blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has disrupted India's fuel supplies from the Gulf. In this context the Prime Minister has called for looking at energy alternatives beyond the conventional ones. The Prime Minister also pushed for biogas as a substitute for LPG cooking gas. The Prime Minister also called upon his ministers to implement reforms with vigour, underlining that Viksit Bharat 2047 was not merely a promise but a commitment. The meeting of the Council of Ministers took place as the Prime Minister returned from his five-



nation tour, the first stop of which was United Arab Emirates (UAE). India and UAE signed a key agreement on the petroleum reserve where UAE's Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) will boost India's petroleum reserves. Apart from this, there was also an agreement on LPG supply.

The Middle East crisis has finally hit the Indian consumers directly with petrol and diesel prices being raised by around Rs 3 a litre to cover up for the losses of the Oil Marketing companies. The Prime Minister Modi has been emphasising on cutting down on fuel use, appealing citizens to switch to electric vehicle and public transport as much as possible. He has also appealed to the citizens to cut down of spendings on gold and foreign travels to preserve India's foreign exchange reserves. Nine departments made presentations before the Prime Minister and the Council of Ministers. These included Agriculture, Forestry, Labour, Road Transport, Corporate Affairs, External Affairs, Commerce and Power, sources told.

Ask caste, then fire: Bihar CM's swipe at Tejashwi Yadav over police encounters

Politics over police encounters in Bihar intensified after Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary hit back at Leader of Opposition Tejashwi Yadav over allegations related to recent police action against criminals in the state. The controversy erupted after Tejashwi Yadav alleged that "caste-based encounters" were being carried out in Bihar and claimed that criminals were being targeted after their caste identities were determined.

Responding to the allegations, Samrat Choudhary took a sarcastic swipe at the RJD leader and questioned the logic behind the remarks.



"Some people are now saying that if a police encounter happens, the police should first ask about the caste of the criminal. I would tell the police personnel -- fine, ask their caste first and then fire," the Chief Minister said. Continuing his attack, Choudhary, who holds the Home department portfolio, said such statements lacked "common sense" and asserted that maintaining good governance in Bihar remained the government's top priority.

Punjab Governor Kataria, Ravneet Bittu lay stone for Baltana RUB

Chandigarh: Punjab Governor and Chandigarh Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria, along with Union Minister of State for Railways Ravneet Singh Bittu, today laid the foundation stone for the road under bridge (RUB) at the Baltana level crossing. Addressing the gathering, Kataria said rail travel served not merely as a means to commute from one place to another but also as a powerful medium to experience the country's rich cultural diversity. Bittu said the RUB



was being constructed at a cost of Rs 12.80 crore and executed on a 50:50 cost-sharing basis between the Indian Railways and the Chandigarh Administration. Bittu said, "Previously, whenever a railway over bridge (ROB) was constructed at a specific location, the corresponding level crossing was automatically closed down. This caused considerable inconvenience to nearby shopkeepers, local residents and small-scale traders. The Railways has now adopted a more public-centric policy. Provided it is technically and operationally feasible, a level crossing may be kept operational even after the construction of an ROB. This will safeguard the livelihoods of local residents and ensure continued convenience for the general public."

June 21 NEET-UG re-test to be 100% error-free:

Education Minister Pradhan

New Delhi: Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Friday said the government had to take "tough decisions" after irregularities were detected in the conduct of the NEET-UG, asserting that the authorities did not want even a single deserving student to lose their rightful seat because of the "examination mafia". He also asserted that the government is committed to ensuring that the re-test scheduled to be held on June 21 remains "100 per cent error-free". Addressing the Jagran Bharat Education Conclave 2026, Pradhan said around 22 lakh students have suffered "mental anguish" due to the controversy surrounding the medical-entrance exam and the government is committed to fixing the system. "Twenty-two lakh children have gone through immense mental anguish. Understanding that anguish and taking responsibility, I am saying this today, we had to take some tough decisions," he said. The National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (Undergraduate) for admissions in medical courses held on May 3 was cancelled by the National Testing Agency (NTA) recently amid allegations of paper leak. The matter is being probed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and a re-test is scheduled to be held on June 21. Pradhan said the government decided to cancel the examination after finding that "some assessments had been compromised".

Delhi-NCR strike has little impact on daily commuters as cabs & autos run

GURGAON.(Agency)

Cabs and autorickshaws operated normally on Thursday despite the chakka jam, a three-day strike, called by All India Motor Transport Congress (AIMTC) over the environmental compensation charge (ECC) in Delhi-NCR. Commuters reported no trouble finding rides, both on the ground or through mobile apps, with services continuing as usual. Swati Sharma, a regular cab user, said she was unaware that a strike had been announced. "There was no issue in finding a ride on the app, no surge pricing, no shortage of cabs," she said.

Prashant Kumar, who relies on shared autos and e-rickshaws to reach the metro station, also reported no disruption. "There was no impact in Gurgaon. The number of autos and cabs on the roads and at metro stations was just like any other day," he said.

Auto driver Santosh said they were not involved in the protest. "The strike was by the truck association. We were not involved," he said. He added that fares remain unchanged for now, though the situation may be reviewed in the coming weeks. Cab drivers shared a similar view. "We are not part of the strike. It's business as usual for us," said Aatif, who is associated with a cab aggregator. He said such protests do not benefit individual operators, many of whom rely on daily earnings, unlike large transport companies that can sustain longer agitations.

Car with black film, ?1-lakh unpaid challans impounded in Gurgaon

Ghaziabad.(Agency)

When traffic inspector Mahavir and his team flagged down a Volkswagen Polo near Signature Towers on Thursday, they were in for a surprise. What seemed like the use of illegal black films turned out to be a much bigger case of traffic violations. The vehicle had unpaid challans amounting to Rs 1.17 lakh. Out of 13 challans, 11 were for the very black film they were looking at. And to make matters worse, the police found that the front number plate had been tampered with. The car was impounded.

The 2022-registered vehicle is owned by Nitin Verma, a resident of Hisar, who was driving the car. According to police, each black film violation carries a penalty of Rs 10,000, taking the total fine for this offence alone to Rs 1.10 lakh. A senior officer said a fresh challan was also issued for the use of black film and the tampered number plate. The driver's licence was seized. "The vehicle was impounded and sent to the Rajiv Chowk impound yard. It will be released only after payment of the pending fines. The driver has no criminal background, and he has been instructed to follow traffic rules in future," Mahavir said. Police said special drives against violations such as illegal black film, tampered number plates and repeated traffic offences will continue across the city. "Motorists are being advised to regularly check and clear pending challans to avoid impounding of vehicles," traffic police spokesperson Vikas Verma said.

Discom sets up camps to fix billing, smart meter glitches till June 30

Noida.(Agency)

Paschimanchal Vidyut Vitran Nigam Limited is holding consumer camps across Noida and Ghaziabad until June 30 to resolve billing discrepancies, smart meter malfunctions, app glitches and KYC updates. Around 500 complaints have been resolved in Noida till Thursday, while 1,400 issues have been addressed in Ghaziabad already. Both districts serve over 15 lakh consumers. In Noida, camps are set up at Jewar, Dadri, Dankaur and Sector 18 offices. In Ghaziabad, camps have come up at 10 locations across three zones. In Zone 1, camps have been set up at Nehru Nagar, Pratap Vihar, Kamla Nehru and Lal Kuan. Camps have been set up at Loni, Lalbagh, Indrapuri, Chaman Vihar, Pavi and Mandola under Zone 2, and in Zone 3, another camp has been set up in the trans Hindon area at the Sector 16 substation in Vasundhara. Services available at these camps include on-site resolution of smart meter complaints, bill correction or revision, 1912 complaint



registration and resolution, mobile number update facility, Uttar Pradesh Power Corporation Limited Smart App information, smart meter usage and awareness assistance. The move comes following a directive from the discom's managing director, Ravish Gupta. He said, "Officials have been directed to provide better facilities and ensure the prompt resolution of issues faced by consumers."

The discom's executive engineer, Shivam Tripathi, said, "Out of the 500 resolved complaints in Noida, billing and smart meter-related issues dominated. Other queries addressed include contact detail updates and app usage information." In Ghaziabad, the executive engineer of Zone 3, Amit Jha, said 764 complaints have been resolved at the mega camp set up at Trans Hindon Sector 16 substation in Vasundhara. Zone 1's executive engineer, Avinash Agrhari, told TOI that a total of 705 complaints were resolved till Thursday across four camps held at Nehru Nagar, Pratap Vihar, Kamla Nehru and Lal Kuan. Of these, the majority of 301 complaints were related to bills, while 289 issues were related to mobile number updates. Also, 56 complaints were related to UPPCL Smart App operations and 59 were other complaints. In Zone 2 in Ghaziabad, the discom's superintending engineer told TOI that out of 34 complaints, 28 were resolved on the spot and the remaining 6 will be resolved in a couple of days.

Manesar waste pickup stopped after row over inspection by mayor's husband

Doorstep waste collection across Manesar came to a halt on Thursday after the private agency handling the work suspended operations, alleging intimidation, harassment and political interference during an official vehicle verification drive. The controversy erupted when drivers and company staff accused Manesar mayor Inderjeet Kaur Yadav's husband, Rakesh Yadav — who holds no official position in Municipal Corporation of Manesar (MCM) — of conducting an unauthorised inspection of the agency's waste collection vehicles. Drivers alleged they were threatened, humiliated and warned their vehicles would not be allowed to operate. According to the company, MCM officials had directed the agency to bring all 184 vehicles deployed for door-to-door collection to Kankrola on Wednesday evening for verification, with the joint commissioner's office and the mayor expected to oversee the process.

The firm complied, stationing all vehicles at the site, but the mayor did not show up. Instead, her husband arrived with two councillors and began questioning drivers about GPS installations, vehicle ownership and rental agreements. The questioning quickly turned hostile.

"The drivers clearly informed them that the vehicles had been hired as per the agreement with the civic body, but they were then told the vehicles would not be allowed to operate," a company official said. The agency further alleged that an unauthorised group misbehaved with staff, threatened workers with jail and used police presence to intimidate drivers and helpers. Gaurav Joshi, business head of Pooja Consultancy — the firm awarded the five-year doorstep waste collection contract by MCM five months ago — said the company had no objection to genuine inspections. "We strongly question under what authority the mayor's husband interfered and why our drivers were threatened. This raises serious concerns of misuse of influence

and violation of worker dignity," he said. The firm has demanded the return of seized mobile phones, action against those involved and assurances of a safe working environment. MCM



commissioner Pradeep Singh confirmed the civic body had received an email from the mayor requesting a vehicle inspection, but acknowledged the

drivers' complaints of intimidation. "I have called a coordination meeting of elected representatives and the agency to resolve the matter and resume doorstep collection at the earliest," he said.

Manesar senior deputy mayor Praveen Yadav said: "The mayor's husband is not authorised to carry out such an inspection. Family members of elected representatives have no right to conduct the business of a municipal corporation."

An MCM official, speaking anonymously said the contractor was recently paid Rs 2 crore after a delay of four months. "It was 40% short of the contracted amount. The mayor, the official said, has since sought a probe into the payment, objecting that it was released without her signature.

Nowhere in Haryana does such a provision exist mandating the mayor's consent for releasing payment to a contractor," the official said.

Minor caught riding bike without licence: FIR after JJB questions police inaction

An FIR has been registered against an unknown person under the Motor Vehicles Act in connection with a traffic challan case involving a minor, after Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) pulled up police for failing to act against the vehicle's owner or the juvenile's guardian despite clear legal provisions holding them accountable.

The case stems from an incident on Feb 3, when a 16-year-old boy was intercepted near Fawara Chowk in Sohna after officers noticed the loud noise from a modified silencer on the Bullet motorcycle he was riding with a pillion passenger. The teenager failed to produce a driving licence and abandoned the bike at the spot. His father, an advocate, arrived shortly after.

The matter was taken up before the JJB, where the minor was declared a child in conflict with law by the area magistrate on April 17. During proceedings in the challan case, principal magistrate Jyoti Grover questioned challanning officer SI Rajbir on whether any investigation had been conducted against the vehicle owner or guardian of the juvenile, and why neither was made an accused in the case. The officer failed to provide satisfactory answers. The board directed police to register an FIR against the father of the juvenile within 24 hours and submit a final police report before the area magistrate following investigation. Accordingly, Sohna City police registered FIR No. 215 on May 20 — a day after the board's directions of May 19 — under Section 199A(1) of the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2019, which holds the guardian or owner of a vehicle liable for offences committed by a juvenile and provides for punishment accordingly.

No one has been named in the FIR. A senior police officer said the investigation is now focused on establishing legal responsibility. "We have registered the FIR against an unknown person because the registered owner of the bike is one Krishan, while the minor's father's name is different. Notices will be sent to both. The concerned person will be nominated during the course of the investigation,"

Mercury stays above 40°C in Gurgaon, high night temperature adds to blazing heat

The city continued to reel under intense heat on Thursday with little relief despite a slight dip in daytime temperatures. IMD has warned that heatwave to severe heatwave conditions are likely to persist across Haryana, including in the city, till May 25. The city recorded a maximum temperature of 42 degrees Celsius on Thursday, down from 44 degrees Celsius a day earlier. However, the temperature remained one notch above normal for this time of year. Across monitoring stations, temperatures showed a marginal decline but continued to remain above the 40-degree mark. Gurgaon KVK recorded a maximum temperature of 42 degrees Celsius, down from 42.8 degrees Celsius on Wednesday. At NorthCap University station, the maximum temperature settled at 42.6 degrees Celsius against 44.5 degrees Celsius a day earlier. Gurgaon AWS recorded 41.7 degrees Celsius,

lower than the 42.8 degrees Celsius logged on Wednesday. Night temperatures also remained high across several parts of the city, adding to discomfort and limiting overnight cooling. The city recorded a minimum temperature of 25.5 degrees Celsius on Thursday, down from 28 degrees Celsius a day earlier. It remained near normal for this time of year. However, some monitoring stations continued to record unusually high night-time temperatures. NorthCap University station recorded a minimum temperature of 32.6 degrees Celsius, a sharp increase of 5.6 degrees Celsius within 24 hours. Gurgaon KVK logged 30.9 degrees Celsius. Gurgaon AWS recorded a comparatively lower minimum temperature of 27.5 degrees Celsius. Strong surface winds during the day further worsened outdoor conditions for commuters, delivery workers and labourers exposed to direct heat.

Weather officials said multiple systems over northwest India are influencing the prevailing weather conditions. An upper air cyclonic circulation over Punjab and adjoining Pakistan now lies over Punjab and neighbourhood, while another cyclonic circulation persists over north Haryana and adjoining areas. A western disturbance, as a trough in westerlies, also remains active over the region.

"Though a marginal dip has been observed in daytime temperature, no significant change is expected in the coming days. The influence of western disturbances and associated weather systems over northwest India has slightly altered atmospheric conditions, including wind patterns. However, these changes are not strong enough to bring substantial cooling over the plains. Hot and uncomfortable conditions are likely to persist across the state over the next few days," an IMD official said.

Cabbie molests passenger, lands in police net after 90-min chase in Gurgaon

Noida.(Agency)

A 23-year-old cab driver was arrested on Thursday for allegedly molesting a woman passenger during a ride from Sector 47 to Cyber Hub. Police said the accused, Vijay Kumar (23), a BTech graduate from Prayagraj, was driving his personal car when he allegedly made obscene gestures and behaved inappropriately with the woman during the journey. According to the complaint, the woman, who works at a private company, had booked the cab from her residence in Sector 47 on May 21 morning. During the ride, the driver allegedly continued his behaviour despite her objections. She recorded a video on her mobile phone and repeatedly asked him to stop the vehicle. Station house officer (SHO), Sector 51 women police station, Suman, said the woman remained inside the cab for around 10-15 minutes during the incident. "The driver refused to

stop initially despite repeated requests. He stopped only after she warned him, after which she got down and immediately informed the police control room (112),"



the SHO said.

Based on the complaint, a case was registered under sections 74 (assault or the use of criminal force against a woman with the intent to outrage her modesty),

75(2) (sexual harassment) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita at Sadar police station. Multiple teams traced the accused to Bhandsi using technical surveillance and local inputs, where he was arrested within 90 minutes of the complaint. Police said the car used in the incident has been seized. During interrogation, the accused admitted he was operating the cab using his personal vehicle. The woman's prompt recording of the incident and quick alert to police helped in the swift arrest, officials said. "Gurgaon Police remains vigilant in cases involving crimes against women, and the public should immediately contact emergency helpline number 112 or approach the nearest police station in case of harassment or suspicious activity," the SHO added.

Four arrested in vehicle robbery while selling chhole kulche, paratha on streets of Noida

A gang of inter-state vehicle thieves used a novel modus operandi, setting up food stalls at busy commercial and office areas where some of their targets may have also been their customers, snacking unsuspectingly on chhole-kulche and paratha, while giving away a handy titbit or two of information about the neighbourhood. 15 stolen motorcycles and scooters were recovered from four men identified as Pushpendra, Raju, Brajesh and Lokesh. The accused were picked up near a Hanuman temple in Sector 60 during a vehicle-checking drive based on local intelligence inputs on Wednesday. Two knives were also recovered from the men, who had been living in rented rooms after coming to NCR from Sambhal, Uttar Pradesh, some months ago, additional DCP Manisha Singh said. During interrogation, the accused revealed that Pushpendra and Lokesh operated food carts in crowded markets and outside office complexes, using the cover to identify motorcycles and scooters that could be stolen later. They would take photographs of targeted vehicles and share them on WhatsApp with accomplices. "The stolen vehicles would be hidden in isolated locations that saw little public movement, and



eventually sold to buyers to fund their lifestyle and drug addiction," Singh said. Reportedly, one bike would fetch around Rs 10,000 to 15,000. Recovered stolen motorcycles and scooters according to the information given by police, the gang conducted reconnaissance across busy commercial areas in Noida, Delhi and Ghaziabad, striking during both day and night hours. The 15 recovered

motorcycles and scooters, including several Hero Splendor bikes, a Passion Pro and a Jupiter scooter, are linked to theft cases registered at police stations across New Ashok Nagar, GTB Enclave, Kaushambi along with sectors 24 and 39. Police said another accused, Shripal, also from Sambhal, is believed to be the gang's mastermind and is currently absconding. Station House Officer (SHO)

Amit Tomar of Sector 58 police station said Shripal had previously.

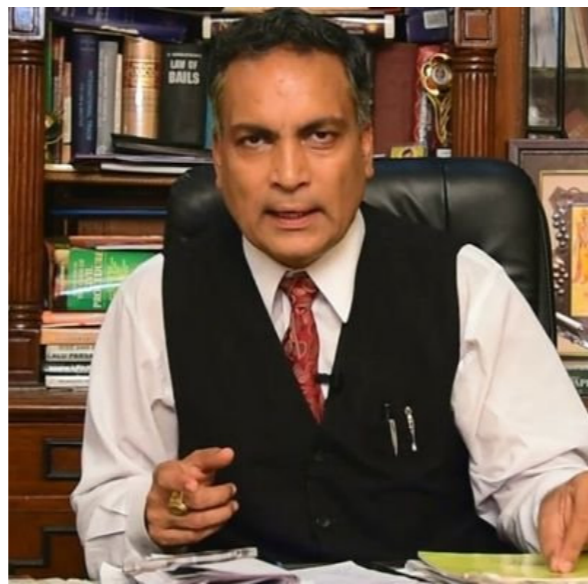
Justice for Twisha Sharma Cannot Wait Any Longer

New Delhi: On the night of May 12, 2026, Twisha Sharma called home from Bhopal. She was mid-conversation with her mother when the line went dead. Her father called back for nearly two hours. Nobody answered. When the phone was finally picked up, Giribala Singh, her mother-in-law, said three words: "She is no more." Twisha was 33. She had been married to Samarth Singh, a Bhopal-based lawyer, for just five months. Her family says the taunts started almost immediately after the wedding, that she was pressured into terminating a pregnancy in the first week of May, and that her WhatsApp messages say it plainly: "My life is a living hell."

The Post-Mortem Problem
Here is where things get deeply troubling. Twisha's post-mortem was conducted at AIIMS Bhopal. The report records her cause of death as antemortem hanging, meaning she was alive when it occurred. But the ligature, the belt that was allegedly used, was never

submitted for the first post-mortem examination. The family and their counsel have said this clearly on record: a post-mortem was completed and a cause of death was recorded, without the actual instrument allegedly used for the hanging being present on the table. How do you document injuries consistent with hanging without examining what caused them? The belt was handed to the hospital two full days after the autopsy. Commissioner Sanjay Kumar called it a lapse. Navnidhi Sharma, Twisha's father, called it what it is: tampering with evidence. This is not a minor procedural gap. In a case where the very cause of death is disputed, the absence of the ligature from the post-mortem leaves a gaping hole in the medical record. Any forensic expert will tell you that correlating the ligature with the injuries is not optional. It is fundamental. Without it, the findings are, at best, incomplete, and at worst, misleading. This is exactly why the five-doctor AIIMS team matters so much. These are not doctors working

under local pressure. These are specialists from India's top medical institu-



tion, going in with fresh eyes and, crucially, with the evidence that was missing the first time. If the belt shows markings inconsistent with the injuries recorded in the first post-mortem, or if a fresh examination raises questions the original report could not, the family will finally have something concrete to stand on. The first post-mortem raised questions that were never answered. The sec-

ond one has to answer them. Giribala Singh held a press conference and

The CBI has been approved to take over. This matters more than people realise. Local investigations carry local pressures, and when one of the accused is a retired district judge with institutional knowledge of how the system works, that pressure is not theoretical. It is structural. The CBI brings the kind of distance and authority this case has always needed. Samarth Singh, who has been absconding since the day his wife died, has now withdrawn his anticipatory bail application and will surrender before the police. A Bhopal court had already rejected his plea. A lookout notice was out. A reward had been announced. He claimed in his High Court plea that the WhatsApp messages presented by Twisha's family were "edited and incomplete." The very messages in which Twisha wrote, in her own words, that her life had become hell. Now he will have to say all of that directly in front of the law.

What Still Needs to Happen
The CBI investigation must be thorough, not symbolic. Every message, every call log, every med-

MCD to elect ward committee chairpersons, deputy chairpersons on May 23

New Delhi: The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) will conduct elections for the chairpersons and deputy chairpersons of its 12 ward committees on Saturday, May 23, 2026, the civic body announced on Tuesday.

Issued by the MCD's Commissioner Secretary Office, the notice invokes Section 47 read with Section 51 of the Delhi Municipal Corporation Act, 1957 (amended 2022), under which each ward committee is required to elect one councillor as chairperson and another as deputy chairperson at its first meeting every year. The elections will be held across two halls

at the Civic Centre. Six ward committees — South, Keshavpuram, Rohini, Narela, Central and West, will meet at the Hansraj Gupta with sessions staggered from 10 am to 4 pm. Oil market risks 'red zone' by summer, IEA chief warns

LONDON. (Agency)

The world oil market risks entering a "red zone" by the upcoming summer season should there be no progress on ending the West Asia war, the head of the International Energy Agency warned Thursday.

"We may be entering the red zone (on supplies) in July or August if we don't see that there are some improvements in the (war) situation," Fatih Birol said at the Chatham House think tank in London.

Iran has effectively halted tanker traffic through the Strait of Hormuz in retaliation for US and Israeli strikes launched in late February, choking off oil and gas traffic and sending prices soaring.

While a surplus of oil in the market before the war has helped absorb the energy shock, "stocks are eroding", Birol said. He warned that it will take "a lot of time" for production and refining capacity to return to pre-war levels. Birol previously said that commercial oil stocks are falling "very fast", even with the release of strategic reserves by governments worldwide.

The IEA has coordinated the release of 426 million barrels from emergency stocks by its 32 member countries, and said this month that around 164 million barrels have already been drawn. A ceasefire on April 8 halted the war, but negotiation efforts have so far failed to yield a lasting peace agreement, weighing on the world economy.

Farmers Turn to Human Urine After Fertiliser Crunch From Iran War

After the Iran war disrupted supplies of conventional nitrogen fertilizers, the English farmer began scouring the Yorkshire countryside for substitutes to keep his crops growing. That led Mills to the poultry shed of a relative's friend, whose chicken manure is suddenly so sought after that he now has a long list of buyers. "Everyone is doing the same, looking for alternatives," said Mills, who harvests wheat, barley and oats on a farm dotted with sheep.

Farmers worldwide are under pressure. About a third of traded urea, a widely used nitrogen fertilizer, comes from the Gulf region. With the Strait of Hormuz effectively shut, prices have jumped to multi-year highs. That's forcing growers to improvise ahead of the fall planting season or risk lower yields, profit losses and disruptions to global food supply.

Some are turning to age-old solutions like manure. Others are experimenting with newer technologies. These range from waste-based inputs, including materials like ground almond shells, to microbial products designed to boost plant growth and reduce reliance on chemical fertilizers.

"The war situation is, sadly, a good thing for us," said Francois Gerard of French startup Toopi Organics, which converts human urine collected from schools and festivals into a bacteria feed that helps plants grow. Since late February, sales have jumped about a quarter, he said, with prices holding steady thanks to abundant supply. With no end in sight to rival US and Iranian blockades in Hormuz, fertilizer disruptions are expected to persist. A prolonged conflict could mean weaker harvests and higher grocery prices. The United Nations has warned that an additional 45 million people may face acute food insecurity. Because farmers plan months ahead, the effects risk rippling into yields as far out as 2027, according to the UN's Food and Agriculture Organization. The World Bank expects fertilizer prices to rise by nearly a third this year, pushing affordability to its worst level since 2022, when Russia invaded Ukraine.

A 'Band Of Brothers' Is Running Iran With Mojtaba Khamenei: Report

When Ali Khamenei, Iran's supreme leader for 37 years, was assassinated in an Israeli strike on February 28, it created a vacuum at the top and changed the power corridors of Tehran. His son, Mojtaba Khamenei, was appointed his successor, but reports have suggested that the 56-year-old cleric does not wield the same level of influence as his father did. Instead, a small, elite band of men in senior positions, most of whom are current or former senior Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC) commanders, are guiding decision-making in Iran, according to a New York Times (NYT) report.

"Senior Iranian officials maintain that all key matters are run by the 56-year-old heir. Decision making, however, extends beyond one man," the report said, adding that a "hardened band of brothers" whose "seminal experience was the brutal, eight-year war between Iran and Iraq that began in 1980."

The Band Of Brotherhood Founded in 1979 to protect the Islamic revolution and its leader, the Guards promoted some of these commanders to the rank of general while they were still in their late 20s or early 30s. The West's support for Iraq in the war convinced Tehran that Iran had to forge its own way, no matter the cost. After the war with Iraq was over, these commanders went on to control intelligence or security services. Experts point out that their shared backgrounds, careers and ideological outlook are the reasons why neither the war nor the collapse of the government and assassinations of around 50 top political and military leaders could paralyse Tehran. How these leaders operate and share power remains largely opaque. Some have been out of the limelight long before the war started, and now remain hidden out of fear of being targeted. But now, they have joined forces and become "a brotherhood running the country," Saeid Golkar, a Guards expert who is a political science professor at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, told NYT.

Ebola case confirmed in rebel-held Congo's South Kivu area

DR CONGO. (Agency)

An Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo has spread to eastern South Kivu province in an area under the control of the Rwanda-backed M23 militia, the group's spokesman said Thursday, heightening fears of the deadly disease's growing reach. Efforts to get a grip on the latest outbreak of the highly contagious haemorrhagic fever, which the World Health Organization has declared an international emergency, have been hampered by the DRC's long-running conflicts, including between the Congolese army and the M23. Having seized swathes of land in the mineral-rich east with Rwanda's help, the M23 has installed a parallel administration in areas under its control. But the armed group has never had to manage the response to a serious epidemic of a disease like Ebola, which has killed more than 15,000 people in Africa in the past half-century. The virus is expected to have claimed 160 lives out of nearly 671 probable cases, according to figures

published by the National Institute of Public Health (INSP) on Thursday. There are 64 confirmed Ebola cases and six confirmed deaths, INSP said. Tests "confirm a new positive case" in Kabare territory in South Kivu, M23 spokesman Lawrence Kanyuka said in a statement. Parts of South Kivu, including the provincial capital Bukavu, fell to the M23 in February 2025 after fierce clashes. The case involved a "person coming from Kisangani", a major city in the eastern Tshopo province, where no Ebola infections from the current outbreak have so far been recorded. Congolese authorities, in a statement on Thursday, reported two cases identified in South Kivu province -- one suspected case and one confirmed. Riot at hospital The outbreak's epicentre is in northeastern Ituri province, with many cases in hard-to-access areas plagued by the Congolese east's litany of armed groups and where measures to respond to the crisis have been slow to get off the ground. "We have no sanitary facilities at all, not even a handwashing

station, for 16,000 displaced people," said Desire Grodya, an official at a site for displaced people in Kigonze, on the outskirts of Bunia, Ituri's provincial capital.



"We're really crammed in here; it's total overcrowding... If the outbreak starts on the site, it will be catastrophic," he warned.

On Thursday, a brief riot erupted at the hospital in Rwampara, one of the outbreak's focal points located about 12 kilometres (seven miles) from Bunia.

Young people who "wanted to retrieve the body" of a deceased patient "entered the hospital and burned down the two isolation tents", a hospital official told AFP.

healthcare worker was also injured by stone-throwing before law enforcement intervened, the official said. The isolation tents had only just been put up at the hospital. Cases have also been recorded in North Kivu province and neighbouring Uganda, where one person has died. Split by front lines

Both North and South Kivu are split in two by the front lines dividing the Congolese army from the M23 armed group and its Rwandan allies. No vaccine or clinical treatment exists for the Bundibugyo strain of the Ebola virus responsible for the current epidemic. "Every passage who arrives here, whether at the airport entry point or elsewhere, is subject to a temperature check," said Aime Prospere, head of border hygiene at Bunia airport, in a statement. Tons of equipment have been delivered at the airport by the WHO and NGOs since Monday. In the city "we're not allowed to carry two people on the same motorcycle", Paulin Kibondo, a motorcycle taxi driver, said.

US pins hopes on mediator Pakistan in push to end Iran war

TUS Secretary of State Marco Rubio voiced hope of progress on ending the war with Iran, as he looked to Pakistani mediators to help advance efforts to strike an agreement.

Previous comments by President Donald Trump had suggested weeks of stop-start negotiations to strike a permanent end to the war were teetering on the "borderline" between a deal and renewed attacks. "I believe the Pakistanis will be travelling to Tehran today. So hopefully that'll advance this further," Rubio told reporters on Thursday. A ceasefire on April 8 halted the war launched weeks earlier by the United States and Israel, but negotiation efforts, including historic face-to-face talks hosted in Islamabad have so far failed to yield a lasting agreement. Pakistan's interior minister Mohsin Naqvi, who is widely considered close to Pakistan's powerful army chief Asim Munir, visited Iran for the second time in a week on Wednesday. Iranian media,

including the ISNA news agency, had reported based on unnamed sources that Munir could himself visit Tehran as early as Thursday, but there was no



comment from Pakistan authorities about any travel plan for the army chief. Beijing did however, announce that Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will travel on Saturday to China, which has also been involved in mediation efforts to end the war. Borderline Though open warfare and strikes across the Gulf have reduced, the impasse continues to

weigh on the world economy. In April, Pakistan hosted the only direct negotiations, which Munir helped mediate, between US and Iranian officials to take place since February 28, when the war began. But the talks ultimately failed, with Tehran accusing Washington of making "excessive demands". Since then, the two sides have exchanged multiple proposals, with the threat of renewed conflict looming all along. "It's right on the borderline, believe me," Trump told reporters Wednesday. "If we don't get the right answers, it goes very quickly. We're all ready to go." He said a deal could come "very quickly" or "in a few days", but warned Tehran would have to provide "100 percent good answers". Rubio also criticised NATO allies for their refusal to help in the war against Iran. "He's not asking them to commit troops. He's not asking them to send their fighter jets in. But they refuse to do anything," he said. "We were very upset about that."

Gunmen open fire in two separate attacks in Honduras, killing at least 25 people

TEGUCIGALPA. (Agency)

Gunmen opened fire in two separate attacks Thursday on the Honduran coast, killing at least 25 people, including six police officers, authorities said. The first incident took place at a plantation in the municipality of Trujillo in northern Honduras, where at least 19 workers were shot and killed, according to Public Prosecutor's Office spokesperson Yuri Mora. The resource-rich region has been the site of a decades-long agrarian conflict. The Inter-American Commission on Human Rights has previously issued precautionary measures to some activists in the region who have been threatened, surveilled and intimidated for their work defending the environment and land rights. The 2024 killing of environmental leader Juan López highlighted the dangers of defending

natural resources in this highly militarised area of Honduras. The Central American nation regularly ranks as one of the most dangerous for environmentalists, with five killed in 2024 and 18 the year before, according to nongovernmental organisation Global Witness. Three people were recently arrested for masterminding López's killing, providing a rare glimpse of justice in a country with high rates of impunity. In the second attack, assailants opened fire on police in the municipality of Omoa in the Cortes department near the Guatemalan border, killing six officers, including a senior officer, police said. The officers were assigned to an anti-gang mission and were attacked while traveling to Omoa from the capital, Tegucigalpa, police said. National Police spokesperson Edgardo Barahona said earlier

Thursday that determining the death toll in Trujillo was complicated partly because relatives of the victims have removed bodies of their loved ones. Investigators have been sent to the scene, he said. The National Police and armed forces will respond to both of the areas where attacks took place, and teams including forensic specialists and prosecutors will be formed to investigate, the Security Ministry said. Honduras has struggled with high rates of crime linked to gangs and the transnational drug trade, although its homicide rate has decreased significantly in recent years since a 2011 peak of 83 murders per 100,000 residents, according to the World Bank. International human rights organisations have criticised Honduras for its militarised approach to fighting crime, which they say has led to human rights abuses including torture.

President Donald Trump on Thursday said the US will send an additional 5,000 troops to Poland, stirring confusion following weeks of changing statements from Trump and his administration about reducing — not increasing — the American military footprint in Europe. The Trump administration has said it was reducing levels in Europe by about 5,000 troops, and US officials confirmed about 4,000 service members were no longer deploying to Poland. Trump's social media

announcement raises more uncertainty for European allies that have been blindsided by the changes as the administration has complained about NATO members not shouldering enough of the burden of their own defense and failing to do more to support the Iran war. "Based on the successful Election of the now President of Poland, Karol Nawrocki, who I was proud to endorse, and our relationship with him, I am pleased to announce that the United States will be sending an additional 5,000 Troops to Poland," Trump said on Truth Social. Trump and the Pentagon have said in recent weeks that they were drawing down at least 5,000 troops in Germany after Chancellor Friedrich Merz said the US was being "humiliated" by the Iranian leadership and criticized what he called a lack of strategy in the war.

Trump then told reporters at the beginning of the month that the US would be "cutting a lot further than 5,000." As of last week, some 4,000 troops from the Army's 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division were no longer en route to Poland. The Associated Press reported

that the canceled deployment was part of an effort to comply with Trump's order to



reduce the number of troops in Europe. A deployment to Germany of personnel trained to fire long-range missiles also was halted. Democratic and Republican lawmakers alike criticised the reductions as sending the wrong signal both to allies and Russian President Vladimir Putin during the 4-year-old war in Ukraine. Republican Rep. Don Bacon of Nebraska said during a congressional hearing that he spoke with Polish officials and they were "blindsided." He called the decision "reprehensible" and said it was "an embarrassment to our country what we

just did to Poland." Chief Pentagon spokesman Sean Parnell said Tuesday that it was "a temporary delay" of the deployment of US forces to Poland, which he called a "model US ally." He said it was a result of the US reducing the number of brigade combat teams assigned to Europe from four to three and indicated the Pentagon still needed to decide which troops to station where. It was not clear whether that meant the brigade would resume its deployment to Poland, if additional troops on top of that rotational deployment could be added, or whether there would still be a drawdown of US troops in Europe but from a different country. The Pentagon referred requests for comment to the White House, which did not immediately respond to messages seeking clarity. Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth and Defense Undersecretary Elbridge Colby both spoke with their Polish counterparts this week. Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk had said Wednesday that he was happy to hear "Washington's declaration that Poland will be treated as it deserves."

Telangana Government Doctors' Association raises concern over delay in transfer process

HYDERABAD.(Agency)

The Telangana Government Doctors' Association (TGGDA) on Thursday expressed serious concern over the delay in the ongoing transfer process in the Medical & Health department. They also opposed the attempts to introduce separate guidelines contrary to GO Ms No 38. Addressing the media at the DME office in Koti, the association pointed out that the transfer process should be conducted strictly in accordance with the existing government order without any



alterations, selective implementation, or deviation from the notified guidelines. They strongly objected to proposed changes in the definitions of focal and non-focal areas, stating that such modifications could create dissatisfaction, suspicion, and a sense of discrimination among doctors across the state.

TGGDA founder Dr B Ramesh stressed that many doctors who have been waiting for transfers for several years were already facing disappointment and uncertainty. He also urged senior officials of the Health department not to delay the process further by introducing new interpretations and additional conditions beyond the existing guidelines.

Punjab University B.Tech student found dead in hostel room; probe on: police

PATIALA.(Agency)

A B.Tech student of Punjab University has been found dead inside one of the hostel rooms, police said.

Police have identified as Varunpreet Singh (24) and was from Tarn Taran's Kang village. Although, Varunpreet was staying in a rented accommodation outside the university campus, he had come to room 340 of Baba Banda Singh Bahadur hostel of the university on Wednesday, they said. The students were studying in different hostel rooms in various study groups for the ongoing university examinations, officials said. However, Varunpreet was reportedly alone in one of the rooms.

One of the students found Varunpreet lying unconscious when he accidentally entered the room. Following this, he was immediately shifted to the university dispensary in an ambulance, but the doctors declared him brought dead.

The family members of the deceased had not arrived till the time of filing this report and therefore the postmortem examination could not be conducted on Thursday.

SSP Patiala Varun Sharma told The Indian Express, "Postmortem will be conducted Friday morning only afterwards we will get to know the cause of death."

Search expands to Dubai in Kochi modelling scam

KOCHI.(Agency)

The investigation into the human trafficking and sex racket that allegedly operated under the guise of the modelling industry has expanded internationally, with police now searching for two key suspects believed to be hiding in Dubai. The absconding accused, identified as Shamla and Rahmath, are suspected to have links with an international human trafficking and sex trafficking network.

According to the remand report submitted before the Judicial First Class Magistrate Court on Thursday, Sindhu, 56, the main accused who was arrested from Mumbai, allegedly maintained links with an international trafficking and prostitution racket.

Police said Shamla and Rahmath coordinated the racket's operations in Dubai under Sindhu's direction. Investigators have also found indications that Sindhu had connections with criminal gangs. So far, three persons have been arrested in the case - Sindhu, Manjima and Aleena Abraham.

Investigators said the racket of luring young women to Dubai and allegedly handing them over to sex trafficking networks had been operating since 2022. The revelation reportedly emerged from Sindhu's confession statement.

The probe team further discovered financial transactions allegedly made by Sindhu to Aurangzeb, a friend of fourth accused Aleena and a person facing multiple criminal cases. Two mobile phones were recovered from Sindhu, and the investigators are analysing.

Parking dispute turns fatal: Mohali youth jumps into Bhakra canal, family alleges harassment

MOHALI.(Agency)

A 21-year-old youth allegedly died by suicide after jumping into the Bhakra canal following a dispute over parking in Mohali's Phase 4 area. The deceased, identified as Pawan, was undergoing police recruitment training and was staying in a PG accommodation at House No. 636 in Phase 4. Divers later recovered the body from the canal. The body has been kept in the mortuary for postmortem examination.

The deceased's father, Prem Kumar, a resident of Nihal Khara village in Abohar, alleged that his son took the extreme step after being "harassed" by a municipal corporation election candidate of a political party, his son and the police. He claimed that before the incident, Pawan had sent video and audio recordings to one of his friends.

According to information, the dispute began over parking a vehicle outside the residence of an MC election candidate in Phase 4.



Allegedly, the candidate, contesting from Ward No. 8, and his son asked Pawan, who lived in another locality, to remove the vehicle parked there, leading to a heated argument.

The family alleged that Pawan and his friend, Madhav Shah, were later assaulted and taken to the police station after police were called to the spot. Prem Kumar said he was in Ganganagar to purchase medicines when he received a phone call from his son. "My son

told me that he was badly beaten by the MC candidate and his son at the spot and was humiliated at the police station as well," he alleged.

According to the father, Pawan told him over the phone: "Papa, first I was beaten at the spot, then taken to the police station and humiliated badly. Now I am going to die." Pawan's friend, Madhav Shah, a national-level baseball player, also alleged that both of them were assaulted and later harassed at the police station. He further claimed that they were falsely accused of consuming and selling drugs.

The incident triggered tension in the area, with the family demanding strict action against the accused. Police said an investigation is underway. DSP City-1 Gurcharan Singh said no suicide note had been recovered so far. "Statements of the family members are being recorded and all aspects are being examined. Further action will be taken based on the findings of the investigation," he said.

Manipur: 3 yrs after peace deal, insurgent group found selling weapons

GUWAHATI.(Agency)

Security forces in Manipur recovered 67 weapons, including ones looted from state armouries, from the United National Liberation Front (Pambei), a valley-based insurgent group that the Centre had signed a peace agreement with in 2023. According to police, cadres of the group were engaged in selling these weapons.

Over the course of two days, which included a cordon and search operation at an unauthorised UNLF(P) camp at Lamding in Imphal West, joint security forces comprising Manipur Police, Assam Rifles and the CRPF recovered these weapons, said a statement from the Manipur Police. A breakup of these weapons included 27 AK-series weapons, 11 M-series rifles, four 9-mm pistols, and one RPG-7.

According to a senior police officer, this weapons haul includes weapons that had been looted from state armouries during the course of the ongoing conflict in the state.



Around 6,000 weapons had been looted from state armouries during the conflict that began in May 2023.

According to police, they launched a special

operation in Lamshang on Wednesday based on "credible information regarding the selling of looted arms and ammunition", during which they apprehended two active cadres of the UNLF(P) with one INSAS LMG and three magazines, as well as fourteen live rounds. "While the arrest was going on, associates of the cadres opened fire at the security forces, resulting in a brief exchange of fire," said a police statement, adding that two more cadres who had fired at the security forces were apprehended as well.

"On preliminary interrogation of the arrested cadres, they disclosed that they had come to sell the seized weapons on the instruction of self-styled Lance Corporal Naorem Bijoy, alias Macha, of UNLF(P). They further admitted to earlier sale of looted arms and ammunition," said police.

Bhubaneswar sweats through season's first heatwave day

BHUBANESWAR.(Agency)

Normal life was thrown out of gear as Bhubaneswar recorded its first official heatwave day of the season on Thursday, with maximum day temperature touching 42.2 degree Celsius. As the state capital saw mercury soar past the normal by 4.5 degree C, people complained of uneasiness and heat stress as high levels of humidity made life miserable. During the peak hours, road wore a deserted look as denizens chose to stay indoors.

"Today's conditions were almost unprecedented as I had not witnessed such a combination of heat and humidity," said Prasanta Sahu, an online delivery agent of the city. While the sweltering conditions affected the people, for stray animals such as dogs and cattle, it was equally unbearable.

The intense heat surged in the state capital by about 5.4 deg C in the last 24

hours. Bhubaneswar had recorded 36.8 deg C on Wednesday. People expected respite as overcast conditions developed later in the day but only to be left disappointed. Neighbouring



Cuttack too sweated under intense heat and recorded 40.2 deg C on the day but citizens were in for a much-needed respite as nor'wester rains lashed the city in the evening. Keonjhar, which recorded 41.3 deg C on the day, too experienced thunderstorm activity. Besides, parts of Khurda district also

witnessed rains and strong winds.

Before a nor'wester hit some parts of Odisha on Thursday afternoon, large parts of the state reeled under a gruelling heatwave. At least 24 places reported above 40 degree C temperature on the day.

While Jharsuguda experienced heatwave conditions for the second consecutive day and sizzled at 45.5 degree C, six other places recorded more than 44 degree C on the day. Sambalpur and Balangir recorded 44.6 degree C each, Hirkud and Titilagarh 44.5 degree C each, Sonepur 44.3 degree C and Boudh 44.2 degree C. However, there is no immediate relief in sight as the India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast heatwave over the next four days. Heatwave to severe heatwave may prevail in Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Balangir and Nayagarh districts on Friday, said the regional met office.

Chennai to continue recording 41-42 degree celsius for next two days

CHENNAI.(Agency)

Heat wave-like conditions intensified across several parts of the state on Thursday, with Chennai and northern districts recording temperatures soaring above 40°C. The Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC) has forecast isolated heavy rainfall and thunderstorms in parts of the state in the coming days.

According to RMC, Chennai Airport recorded the highest maximum temperature in the state at 41.6°C on Thursday, while Nungambakkam registered 40.4°C. Vellore emerged as the hottest station with 42.5°C, followed by Tiruttani at 42.1°C. Karur Paramathi and Madurai city also touched the 40°C mark.

Meteorologists said maximum temperatures rose by 2-4°C at isolated places in Tamil Nadu during the last 24 hours, with several stations recording temperatures above normal levels. Heat wave conditions are likely to continue in isolated pockets of coastal Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry and Karaikal on till Friday.

RMC has forecast no significant change in temperatures in interior Tamil Nadu for the next five days. However, coastal districts are likely to witness a further rise of 3-4°C above normal levels and increasing discomfort due to high humidity. For Chennai, the weather office has forecast maximum temperatures of 41-42°C over the next two days with partly cloudy skies. Warm nights with minimum temperatures around 30-31°C are also expected, adding to the heat stress in the city. Officials warned that the combination of high day temperatures and humidity could cause severe discomfort in coastal areas from May 23 onwards.

Headless body in Lucknow: 16-year-old girl 'killed' by family over relationship

The mystery behind the headless torso and limbs found stuffed in a bag on a train at a Lucknow railway station has been solved — the victim was a 16-year-old girl, allegedly murdered by her family after she refused to end her relationship with a man.

The Government Railway Police has arrested her 48-year-old father along with two relatives for allegedly killing her in an "honour" crime.

The shocking discovery was made on May 16, on the Chhapra-Gomti Nagar Express that travels from Bihar to Lucknow via Gorakhpur. Once passengers had boarded the train, the railway staff started a routine check of the



compartments and found a trunk and a bag near a washroom in one of the sleeper coaches.

Those arrested include the girl's father, Viggan, an e-rickshaw driver; his elder sister Noorjahan (55), and her husband

Mojibullah (53), Superintendent of Police (Railways) Rohit Mishra said. Police claimed the accused killed the girl with a gadasa — a sharp-edged agricultural weapon — at their home in Kushinagar district, dismembered the body and stuffed the parts in a bag and a steel trunk.

Police said they went to the railway station, boarded the train arriving from Chhapra, and dumped the trunk and bag near the washroom inside a sleeper coach.

Police said the accused, during questioning, admitted that they thought abandoning the body parts on a train would make it difficult for police to identify the victim or solve the case. "We are still searching for

the victim's head. The accused had claimed they threw it into a pond; we conducted a search there, but could not recover it," Mishra said.

CCTV provided key clue

Mishra said during investigation, they examined CCTV footage from railway stations where the train had halted. "At Kushinagar station, we spotted people placing a trunk and a bag inside the train. A team was sent to the area to trace those seen in the footage. With the help of local residents, police later identified the victim's father," said Mishra. The officer said the father was detained for questioning and subsequently admitted to the crime. "We will seek police remand of the accused for further questioning

Telangana hikes minimum wages for 1.11 crore workers

HYDERABAD.(Agency)

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Thursday announced a hike in minimum wages for workers in Telangana, a move that the government said would benefit nearly 1.11 crore workers across the state.

Making the announcement at the Secretariat along with Labour Minister G Vivek Venkatswamy, Revanth said the government had categorised workers into four groups — unskilled, semi-skilled, skilled and highly skilled — before revising the wages based on the recommendations of a Cabinet sub-committee that held extensive consultations with stakeholders. Under the revised structure, the minimum wage for unskilled workers has been increased from Rs 12,750 to Rs 16,000, for semi-skilled workers from Rs 13,452 to Rs 17,000, for skilled workers from Rs 13,772 to Rs 18,500 and for highly skilled workers from Rs 14,607 to Rs 20,000. The revised wages will come into effect from June 1.

Revanth said the revised wages were determined after taking into account inflation, rising prices of essential commodities, house rents and other living expenses.

Criticising the BRS government for not revising wages during its decade in power, the chief minister said the Congress government was committed to workers' welfare and encouraging industries to prioritise Telangana youth in recruitment.

Need to shift focus towards blue-collar jobs: Revanth

The chief minister further stressed the need to shift focus towards blue-collar employment, warning that the rapid rise of artificial intelligence was reshaping global job markets and threatening traditional white-collar careers. "The government is focusing on blue-collar jobs because AI is increasingly affecting white-collar employment.

Can't keep failing our students

The cancellation of NEET-Undergraduate 2026 has pushed nearly 23 lakh students across India into uncertainty, anxiety and emotional distress. These candidates undertook months and years of disciplined preparation, believing that the Union government would at least ensure a fair and secure examination process. Instead, in one stroke, the system has pushed them into confusion and instability. What should have been a transparent and merit-based gateway to medical education has instead become a symbol of institutional failure, administrative negligence and the dangerous collapse of public trust in our exam systems. NEET is not simply a competitive exam. It represents aspiration, social mobility, economic hope and years of personal sacrifice. Parents invest heavily, exhausting savings, taking loans and stretching their finances to the limit to support their children's dreams of entering the medical profession. The collapse of exam integrity, therefore, becomes not merely an academic disruption, but a major social and economic crisis.

The most serious consequence of repeated exam controversies is the erosion of public confidence in our institutional systems. High-stake national exams derive their legitimacy from trust. The moment students begin to believe that merit can be compromised through organised malpractice, impersonation, paper leaks or corrupt networks, the credibility of the entire system weakens.

The NEET-UG 2024 controversy had already shaken public confidence after allegations of paper leaks, suspicious score inflation, grace marks and procedural irregularities triggered nationwide protests. Eventually, a re-exam had to be conducted for 1,563 candidates who were awarded grace marks due to alleged loss of exam time. Yet, the lessons were evidently ignored. Instead of structural reform, the country witnessed routine assurances and temporary damage control. The recent cancellation demonstrates that the crisis is not accidental, but systemic. Since the introduction of NEET, allegations of irregularities, impersonation, organised cheating and paper leaks have repeatedly surfaced across multiple states. Nor is the problem confined to NEET alone. In 2024, UGC's National Eligibility Test was cancelled within a day over suspected leaks, while the joint Council of Scientific and Industrial Research-UGC NET and NEET-Postgraduate were postponed amid allegations of security breaches and procedural failures. These incidents collectively indicate the existence of a deep-rooted nexus involving coaching mafias, organised cheating syndicates, corrupt intermediaries an institutional negligence.

The psychological consequences are enormous. Students preparing for exams like NEET endure extraordinary academic pressure for one or two years, often sacrificing social life, recreation, emotional well-being and extracurricular growth. When the integrity of the exam collapses, the resulting uncertainty creates anxiety, helplessness, frustration, humiliation and loss of confidence. The National Testing Agency (NTA), entrusted with conducting some of the country's most critical exams, has repeatedly failed

Dog menace : SC balances public safety with animal welfare

India recorded over 30 lakh dog-bite cases in 2023, followed by more than 37 lakh cases in 2024

THE Supreme Court's refusal to dilute its directions on removing stray dogs from public institutions is a necessary intervention in a worsening public safety crisis. For years, civic authorities across India have failed to address the alarming rise in dog-bite incidents, forcing courts to step into what is essentially an administrative vacuum. As per the National Centre for Disease Control, India recorded over 30 lakh dog-bite cases in 2023, followed by more than 37 lakh cases in 2024 — averaging over 10,000 incidents every day. Several states and cities are witnessing an unprecedented surge. Kerala recently reported more than 3.6 lakh dog-bite cases within a year, while Noida identified dozens of dog-bite hotspots after tens of thousands of complaints in just a few months. Behind these statistics are children attacked near schools, elderly citizens unable to walk safely and residents living in fear of aggressive stray packs. At the



same time, the crisis reflects a deeper failure in how society and institutions treat animals. A couple of days

ago, a shocking incident emerged from Chandigarh, where a puppy was reportedly thrown into a tandoor by an unidentified person. Such acts expose the disturbing cruelty that often exists beneath public debate. Equally troubling is the condition of many dog pounds and shelters. Reports from Chandigarh have highlighted deplorable conditions, including instances of dogs allegedly eating their own young due to neglect.

The SC has rightly held that humane treatment of animals cannot mean ignoring human safety, but neither can public safety become a justification for neglecting animal welfare. The SC's emphasis on lawful relocation must now be matched by investments in shelters, sterilisation centres, vaccination drives and veterinary facilities. The challenge is to build a humane, accountable and effective stray management system that protects both citizens and canines.

Xi has the measure of Trump

Clearly, the Chinese see the scales tilting increasingly in their favour

IF the summit between US President Donald Trump and his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping in Beijing last week was expected to bring the world closer to peace in West Asia, that was a bar set too high already. The two sides certainly "exchanged views on major international and regional issues, such as the Middle East situation, the Ukraine crisis and the Korean Peninsula", but the record shows that they have diametrically opposite views on what the outcome of each conflict ought to be.

On the Korean Peninsula, the Chinese are strenuously opposed to the presence of American troops in South Korea, but despite their misgivings about North Korea's nuclear programme, are not about to press Pyongyang too hard on the issue if it keeps the Americans on tenterhooks. Plus, the regime is a bulwark against American troops on China's borders.

On the Ukraine crisis, China has committed to a 'no limits' partnership with the Russians. While Beijing perhaps expected a quick Russian victory, the stalemate also suits it just fine with Russia on the ropes and dependent on China's financial system, military supplies and diplomatic support, and trans-Atlantic unity fraying under US pressure on the Europeans to increase their defence budgets. The US-Israeli attack on Iran has perhaps affected the Chinese the most over the short term at least with rising energy prices. China has the largest strategic oil reserves of any country on the planet and can be expected to bear the pain longer than most countries — even so, prolonged economic distress in the Global South has consequences for China that has

tried in recent years to diversify its export markets away from the US. There is also, perhaps, not a little pressure on China as a purported leader of the Global South to contribute its mite to the resolution of the conflict.

Advertisement But if there is one constant about Chinese



foreign policy, it is that whatever the diplomatic rhetoric, Beijing has always acted only in its own interest. Its markets in the Global South are not so large or important right now as to cause it to veer from a larger interest — seeing the US dragged into another morass of its own making and distracted from focusing its full attention on

China. At a recent conference in Berlin that this author attended, at least one Chinese participant suggested that the Iran conflict was a good thing for China in the short term because it had diverted US military resources from the Indo-Pacific to the Arabian Gulf. With a limited number of US aircraft carriers in East Asian waters — there is just one currently according to the US Navy — the implication was that China fancied its chances in a Taiwan scenario. While this might have simply been kite-flying, the larger logic of the US being too involved in other theatres to focus on China still holds.

It is no surprise then that the Chinese have done their bit to bolster Iran's capabilities. There is no mention of any Chinese commitment whatsoever to helping the US end the Iran conflict, even though the readout from the White House stated, "Both countries agreed that Iran can never have a nuclear weapon." But China does not necessarily disagree with this proposition nor the need to keep the Strait of Hormuz open for the free flow of energy — it is just that it does not feel the need to actively work to these ends if the US finds these objectives more important. Higher prices for domestic consumers have more political consequences for Trump than they do for Xi.

Indeed, this Chinese view extends to the larger economic relationship and outcomes of the Trump visit. Several economic agreements have been concluded, but the Chinese official media reportage is interesting. It quotes Trump as saying to Xi "that the world's top companies all wanted to come to China" and that he "actively encouraged them to expand their cooperation with China". The message that the Chinese

will take from this is that the Americans need the Chinese market more than the other way round, even if for Chinese manufacturers, too, it is the American market that matters more than anything in the Global South. As the Chinese see it though, "In the blink of an eye, US-China relations have evolved into what the United States views as a relationship between nearly equal nations." But in language redolent of hierarchy and imperialism, the Chinese Foreign Ministry also stated that "President Trump asked each of the [American] business leaders who were travelling with him to present themselves to President Xi." Clearly, the Chinese see the scales tilting increasingly in their favour.

It is this confidence that allowed China to push the US more strongly than it has ever done on the issue of Taiwan. Calling it "the most important issue in China-US relations", Xi threatened "clashes and even conflicts" if the issue was not "handled properly". But there is only one way that this can be done, which is for the Americans to unequivocally support the Chinese position on Taiwan. Despite China's multitud of internal problems, including the hit its manufacturing sector has taken from the US-Iran conflict and rising fuel prices, the language coming out of Beijing suggested a greater degree of confidence that it ever did before.

While Trump was a wild card in his first term that the Chinese took time to figure out how to deal with, they did figure him out as they ignored much of the deals cut with him during that time.

This time round, with Trump clearly under external and domestic pressure from the continuing conflict with Iran, Xi appeared to have the measure of his guest and was willing also to engage in more direct language alongside the diplomatic pomp and ceremony.

The 'burden' of proof: As chargesheets surge in volume and data, accused seek access to computers

In 2006, some of the accused in the Mumbai serial train blasts case had to approach the court for permission to keep their over 10,000-page chargesheet in their barracks; the overcrowded Arthur Road Jail barrack barely had space for its prisoners. Twenty years later, the jail still remains crowded, chargesheets have only got longer, and the struggle for space has gone digital. Undertrials across jails are seeking access to computers or laptops to read the electronic evidence against them. From accused in the now-concluded Malegaon 2008 blast case to those booked in the Elgaar Parishad case of 2017-18, several accused have been given permission to use computers, with curbs.

While jail authorities oppose such pleas, citing lack of adequate staff to monitor usage and apprehensions of misuse, courts have been receptive on the grounds that the accused need to access e-data against them. In the terror scare case involving the Ambani residence Antilia, for example, the NIA submitted in court that it had collected 1,000 terabytes of e-data — equivalent to roughly 10 billion pages of text — including about 39,000 clips of CCTV footage, apart from emails and call data dumps. One of the accused, the dismissed cop, Sachin Waze, sought access to a laptop to go through the same. In jail since 2021, he told the court that he was ready to pay for electricity and Internet charges.

Jail authorities opposed the plea arguing that if Waze was given access, others would make similar demands, which would be "dangerous". Granting Waze's request, the court said in a May 2024 order: "Admittedly, the data of e-evidence is huge. To go through it, the help of a device like a computer or laptop is necessary." As regards Internet access, the court said the prison need not provide the same. Consequently, Waze was allowed to use a laptop between 11 am and 4 pm daily, under the supervision of jail authorities.

Elgaar Parishad accused Surendra Gadling and Arun Ferreira, who are themselves lawyers, moved court for the use of computers in Talaja Jail, citing the



evidence submitted by the NIA against them on a hard disk. While jail authorities opposed the pleas saying there was no provision for this in the prison manual, the court permitted them to use a computer for an hour twice a week, along with necessary software. Similarly, in 2011, Lieutenant Colonel Prasad Purohit,

acquitted in the Malegaon 2008 blast case, was given permission to use a laptop in jail. In 2008, an orthopaedic surgeon called Dr L Prakash, who was serving time in Puzhal Central Jail in Chennai for alleged cyber porn, invoked habeas corpus while seeking access to a laptop in jail for him and all others who applied for it. Prakash said that while the prison had about a dozen devices in its computer lab for training, he wanted a personal computer. The Madras HC looked into precedents on inmate rights and considered if the use of computers was a fundamental right falling under Article 19. It held Prakash could not be given a personal laptop but directed the jail to allow him access to a computer.

UP woman found murdered in Surat flat

Ahmedabad. (Agency)

In what police suspected to be a case of murder, a 20-year-old woman from Uttar Pradesh's Ambedkar Nagar was found dead at her rented accommodation in Palsana near here, police said, adding a team had left for the UP district to look for the man who lived with her. Mehviz Khatun Afzal Ali died due to strangulation, police said, citing the postmortem report. Her body was found by police in the house located in Mahaveer Apartments in Palsana's Bagumura on Sunday afternoon. Mehviz hailed from Ambedkar Nagar's Shivpal village. Citing neighbors, the police said Mehviz and Shiv Singh Ranjeet Singh (25) had been living together for three months. Shiv Singh, also from UP, worked at a textile factory at Parab village in Kamrej taluka. Palasana S-I N N N Gamit registered an offence of murder at the Palsana police station.

Palsana police inspector Bhagwanbhai Zilariya said, "The two stayed together in a flat in Palsana. Shiv Singh is the primary suspect, and his whereabouts are unknown. We have sent a team to Ambedkar Nagar to catch him."

"Mehviz and Shiv Singh first eloped three years ago. Shiv Singh contacted Mehviz again after she turned legal age, and the two eloped again a year ago."

Severe heatwave grips Andhra as mercury touches 48.1 degree celsius

VIJAYAWADA. (Agency)

The Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA) has issued a fresh advisory warning of record-breaking heatwave conditions across the State, urging citizens to remain vigilant.

APSDMA MD Prakhar Jain said the heatwave is expected to continue until Monday, with maximum caution advised between 11 am and 4 pm. On Thursday, Piduguralla in Palnadu district recorded 48.1°C, the highest so far this season. Officials reported that 18 districts crossed 45°C, while 200 mandals across 20 districts registered above 44°C.

The impact was noted in Palnadu (26 mandals), Prakasam (23), Krishna (22), Eluru (21), Bapatla (20), NTR (15), Guntur (14), and Markapuram (11).

Forecasts indicate that on Friday (May 22), 15 mandals may face severe heatwave conditions, while 219 mandals are likely to experience hot winds.

Similar conditions are expected on Saturday (May 23), with temperatures ranging between 45-47°C in coastal and central districts, 43-45°C in parts of Kakinada and Nellore, and 40-43°C in northern and Rayalaseema districts.

The APSDMA has advised elderly persons, pregnant women, and patients with heart disease, diabetes or hypertension to avoid exposure.

Protective measures like hats and sunglasses are recommended when stepping outdoors.

'People are addicted to tea': Milk price hike leaves vendors, customers worried

Ahmedabad. (Agency)

The first blow came with the LPG shortage amid the West Asia crisis and now a milk price hike. When Amul raised the price of milk last week followed by other milk marketing companies, the tea vendors were a worried lot. A cup of 'cutting chai' — about 100 millilitres of the steaming brew sold on every street corner in Ahmedabad city — costs anywhere between Rs 10 to Rs 30. While the Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation, which owns Amul, raised all milk prices by Rs 2 per litre, the price of the T special milk, meant for tea, saw a Rs 3 hike for a one-litre pouch. Mohanbhai, who runs a makeshift tea stall on a sidewalk in Ramdevnagar, a largely residential area, for almost 15 years, said he cannot

increase the price of his tea, with the price hike effected by popular milk brands. This, he believes, would drive the customers away. The business has already been slow,



he reasoned. "I use about 15 litres of milk in a month, and that monthly cost has gone up by 35-40 rupees. I sell a cup for 10 rupees, so I can't afford it," he said. "I can't

use any alternatives either, whether it's watering down the tea or reducing the size of the glasses; my customers will know if anything has been changed," he added.

In Nehrunagar, an area lined with shops, offices and educational institutions, the Iyer Tea Stall is crowded throughout the day. It has its own set of loyal customers as well as a decent footfall of passers-by.

Kanchi Mehta, a student, said, "My friends and I come here often, and we see all sorts of people frequenting the stall. They have increased their prices recently, not just for the tea but the muska bun as well." The tea is now costlier by 5 rupees. The owner, Vishwa Lakshmanan, said it was not only the milk that caused them to hike their prices but also the gas (LPG).

10,226 documents missing in BMC fake birth certificate scam, vigilance probe finds

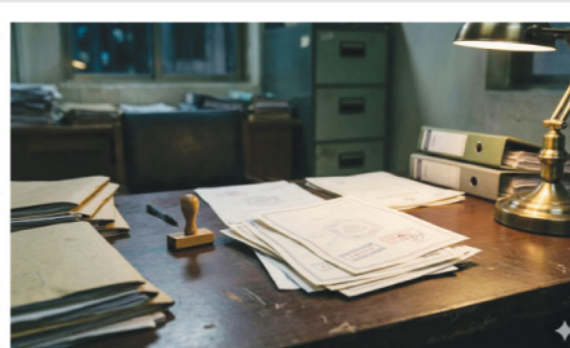
A fresh inquiry by the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation's (BMC) vigilance department has found that supporting documents linked to 10,226 allegedly fake birth certificates issued to illegal foreign nationals are missing, deepening concerns over irregularities in the civic administration.

The development comes weeks after an internal probe revealed that 87,347 fake birth certificates had been issued between 2024 and 2026. Civic officials said the missing records include government-approved identity documents required for the issuance of birth certificates.

Earlier this month, the Mumbai Police constituted a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe the alleged racket. Alongside the police investigation, the

BMC vigilance department has also begun scrutinising records linked to the certificates.

"As part of the scrutiny, we are tracing the supporting documents of each of the 87,000 fake birth certificates that were issued by BMC to various beneficiaries. During the process, it has been found out that supporting documents of 10,000 such certificates couldn't be found and for the past three weeks the documents have remained untraceable," an official told The Indian Express on Thursday. Bharatiya Janata Party MP Kirit Somaiya, who has repeatedly flagged the issue with the civic administration, said the BMC had shared the data with him. Speaking to , Somaiya said the certificates



issued without supporting documents were largely traced to the L ward (Kurla), E ward (Byculla), M East ward (Govandi) and K North ward (Jogeshwari) offices. "All these certificates were issued from the SAP based software system, which the BMC was using illegally despite the Civil Registration System (CRS) being in

function. The fact that 10,000 certificates were issued without any valid document clearly shows that a section of the administration was hand in glove with this issue. The investigation is currently ongoing and in the days to come the numbers are only going to increase," Somaiya said. According to civic records, of the 87,347 allegedly forged certificates issued through the SAP system, 30,507 were generated in 2024, 49,705 in 2025 and 7,135 in 2026. In contrast, only 33,700 certificates were issued through the officially approved CRS system during the same period. A senior civic official, however, said the BMC had continued operating both systems simultaneously because the CRS platform was facing technical glitches at the time.

Over 1.15 crore Telangana voters yet to be mapped ahead of electoral roll revision

HYDERABAD. (Agency)

More than 1.15 crore electors across Telangana are yet to be mapped ahead of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls. While rural districts have shown good progress, urban areas remain a concern.

Data accessed by showed that 65.95% of the state's 3.39 crore electors had been mapped with the last SIR conducted in 2002. Of the total electors, around 2.23 crore have been mapped, while over 1.15 crore remain unmapped as of May 20. The pre-SIR mapping exercise involves linking each elector with the 2002 electoral rolls using their own registration or those of close relatives, including parents and grandparents.

Officials warned that if the pace remains slow in urban areas, completing the actual SIR exercise scheduled between June 25 and July 24 could become difficult.

Hyderabad district, which has 15 Assembly constituencies, recorded only 42.84% mapping. Of the district's 47.10 lakh electors, around 20.17 lakh have been mapped. Medchal-Malkajgiri recorded even lower progress at 35.85%, while Rangareddy stood at 51.59%. Among Assembly constituencies in Hyderabad, Musheerabad recorded the lowest mapping percentage at 34.33%, followed by Nampally (37.59%), Jubilee Hills (38.09%), Sanathnagar (39.80%) and Secunderabad (40.12%). In contrast, several rural and semi-urban districts reported significantly better performance. Jangaon topped the list with 91.07% mapping, followed by Mahbubabad (90.83%), Yadadri-Bhuvanagiri (86.82%), Sangareddy (85.86%), Narayanpet (83.91%), Medak (82.02%) and Mulugu (81.47%).

Officials said voters successfully linked through the mapping process would not need to submit documents at this stage. Those who remain unlinked would later receive notices seeking proof from a prescribed list. The Chief Electoral Officer has said BLOs would conduct house-to-house verification from June 25 to July 24 by distributing pre-filled Enumeration Forms and making at least three visits to each household.

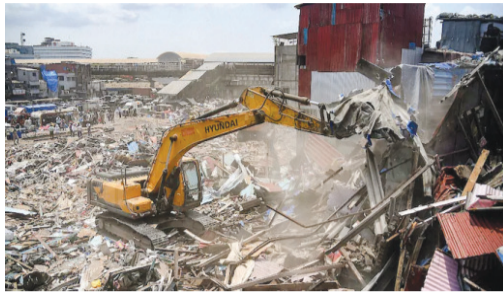
Bandra slums demolition was decades overdue. But has Railways got the timing wrong?

Western Railway demolished hundreds of houses and shops in Bandra's Garib Nagar after a court-backed clearance drive. A section of people backed the drive as long-overdue for safety and growing infrastructure needs. Others have criticised the timing as the displaced families will have no roof over their head during the monsoon.

"I have never liked the sight of slums right outside Bandra station. Nobody does. The area was filthy, crime was rampant, and it was common to see drug addicts on the foot overbridges despite the presence of the Government Railway Police (GRP). But watching school-going girls in their uniforms sitting on the road, barely metres away from the homes they grew up in, holding on to just a bag of belongings they could save, is a heartbreaking sight," said Devesh Kamble, a software engineer who commutes daily from Bandra East to Kalanagar. As he shared this experience with India Today Digital, bulldozers reduced homes to rubble in Mumbai's Garib Nagar slum outside Bandra station's eastern side. The ongoing demolition drive

by Western Railway in Bandra East has cleared over 400 unauthorised structures, including homes and shops, on railway land hugging the tracks. The Bombay High Court backed the action to reclaim about 5,200-5,300 square metres for railway expansion, including new lines, better connectivity between Bandra Terminus and suburban stations, and support for projects like improved access to the Bandra Kurla Complex (BKC). The land, long encroached upon, holds an estimated value of around Rs 600 crores. Though the anti-encroachment drive and cleanup were long overdue, the reality has two sides to it.

SLUM DWELLERS LEFT WITHOUT A ROOF JUST AHEAD OF MONSOONS
Garib Nagar, one of Mumbai's older and



denser slum pockets, featured multi-storey structures. Many of them were two or three storeys high, built directly beside railway tracks. Residents and commuters have long described these areas as among the filthiest and dingiest in the city, with poor sanitation, waste dumping, safety hazards, and high crime. For decades, they blocked

infrastructure upgrades and posed risks to train operations.

Yet these slums housed thousands who form the backbone of Mumbai's workforce — daily wagers, service staff, and essential workers keeping the city running. Many had lived here for 40 years or more.

"This slum, inhabited nearly two hundred years ago, now lies abandoned. Residents, along with their wives and children, sat in an open field, carrying household items, watching their homes collapse," social activist and journalist Siraj Noorani said in a post on X. Families pleaded with officials amid the rubble to not demolish the house, or at least let them take their household items out, only for the bulldozers to silence their pleadings. One viral video showed an elderly woman distressed over the rubble,

saying she could not even retrieve a religious scripture from her house.

Officials arrived at the site in Garib Nagar on Tuesday (May 19) with heavy earthmovers and bulldozers, police, and RPF personnel, giving little time for residents to salvage belongings.

Over 60% of the demolitions happened in a matter of just 48 hours. With thousands displaced right ahead of monsoon, the footage of belongings piled on roads is going viral now. The timing of Western Railway carrying out the eviction has sparked criticism. The southwest monsoon is expected to hit the Kerala coast around May 26 — nearly a week early — and reach Mumbai by early June. With rains just weeks away, displaced families are left without any shelter.

Higher rates, low availability: Protest disrupts commuter mobility in capital

Auto-rickshaw and commercial vehicle unions across Delhi-NCR kicked off their three-day strike on Thursday, citing rising fuel prices, increasing operational costs, and unsustainable commission structures imposed by ride-hailing platforms such as Uber, Ola, and Rapido. The travel across several parts of the capital was apparently disrupted, leaving office-goers and college students struggling to secure rides, particularly during peak hours. Many commuters reported longer wait times, reduced availability of autos and cabs booked via app-based aggregators, and inconsistent fares. "A ride from Chanakyapuri to Satya Niketan cost me Rs 100 today. Usually, even during peak hours, I pay around Rs 70," said Aayushi, a college student in Delhi University's South Campus area. Shivin Bhargava faced a steeper increase. "I paid Rs 160 for an auto to travel from South Campus to Saket, whereas the same route usually costs me about Rs 80," he said.

For others, the issue wasn't just the pricing but availability. "Ever since the protest was announced, getting an auto has become extremely difficult, even for very short distances," said Harsh Malhotra from Faridabad. "The fares are still high despite the shortage, and most drivers are refusing shorter routes altogether." Saba Taherypour from Gurgaon also reported facing similar issues with ride availability and fluctuating prices during the day. Even the Uber and Ola cabs, which were available with much waiting, showed extra prices. From ITO to Mayur Vihar, which generally costs Rs 150-180, the charges on Thursday went up to as high as Rs 200-245.

Transport unions argued that the strike has become necessary due to mounting fuel costs and declining earnings for drivers working through app-based services.

DDA gives 15-day relief to Yamuna Bazaar residents

Two weeks after the Delhi Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) issued an eviction notice to residents of 310 dwellings of Delhi's Yamuna Bazar, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) has also issued another public notice directing all "unauthorised occupants/encroachers" living along Yamuna Bazaar to vacate the area within 15 days. They also warned that failure to comply could lead to demolition and removal action without further notice.

On Tuesday, the High Court dismissed a plea challenging the eviction notices issued to the families in the Yamuna Bazar area. The DDA notice was issued three days before the HC order, which is on May 15.

Earlier, the DDMA notice which was issued on May 7 gave 15 days of time to the residents, which will be over on May 22. However, with the latest notice from the DDA, the residents have time till May 30.

The notice has been addressed to occupants residing between Ghat No. 2 and Ghat No. 32 near Yamuna Bazaar and concerns land identified as part of the Yamuna floodplain and O-Zone area.

According to the notice, authorities have reported that certain persons are in unauthorised possession of government land falling within the Yamuna floodplain in Revenue Estate Bela. The land has been described as government land under DDA jurisdiction.

Meanwhile, on the ground there is not much panic visible as residents continue to live their lives normally without any signs of packing bags and belongings.

Seven days to submit objections

The notice said that occupants seeking to challenge the action have been given seven days to submit objections or representations before the office. The notice also mentioned that the floodplain area is an ecologically sensitive zone and should remain free of encroachment in accordance with planning provisions and directions issued by courts.

Three children flee home in Gujarat after father takes away mobile phone

According to the complaint, the father had travelled to his native village late last month and had accidentally left his phone at home. During his absence, the children allegedly spent long hours playing games on the device. When he returned, the children's mother expressed concern that the siblings had become excessively dependent on mobile gaming. In an attempt to curb the habit, the father reportedly removed the SIM card from the phone

three days before the incident and locked the device inside a cupboard. Police said the restriction angered the children, who then allegedly decided to leave home. The siblings,

who belong to a labourer's family engaged in Surat's textile industry, are also suspected of taking around Rs 15,000 in cash before fleeing.



After discovering the children missing, the family immediately approached the police and filed a complaint. "The complainant informed us that the children spent

most of their time playing mobile games and engaging in similar activities. Upset over this, the father had scolded and counselled them.

The children appear to have taken the matter seriously and left home with some belongings and cash," Police Inspector SD Rathod said.

He added that five police teams had been formed to trace the siblings, with assistance from senior officers and other police units. "Based on CCTV footage and preliminary investigation, we suspect

the children may have boarded a train to Mumbai. We have received some positive leads, and teams are actively working at all possible locations," Rathod said.

Fire scare on Air India flight triggers full emergency at Delhi airport

A Delhi-bound Air India flight from Bengaluru triggered a full emergency response at the capital's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport on Thursday night after the pilot reported a suspected smoke-related incident while landing, sources said. The incident involved flight AI2802 operating from Bengaluru to Delhi with 171 passengers onboard. Sources from Air India confirmed to India Today that during the landing procedure, the pilot announced that the engine had caught fire, prompting authorities to declare an emergency at Delhi airport as a precautionary measure.



Despite the scare, the aircraft landed safely, and no injuries were reported. The authorities said that the operations duty manager observed no

pilot also suggested pulling the aircraft off the runway.

In a statement, Air India said it is aware of the incident involving flight AI2802 on May 21, 2026, adding that the aircraft landed safely and there was no harm to passengers or crew.

"We are currently gathering additional information and are working closely with the relevant authorities. Further updates will be shared as more details become available," the airline said.

A full emergency at an airport is usually declared when there is a potential threat to aircraft safety, allowing emergency services including fire and rescue teams to be positioned in advance.

Bhojshala temple dispute reaches SC as Muslim side challenges High Court order

The decades-old dispute over the Bhojshala-Kamal Maula Mosque complex in Madhya Pradesh's Dhar has now reached the Supreme Court, with the Muslim side challenging a recent High Court verdict that recognised the site as a temple dedicated to Goddess Vagdevi Saraswati and barred Friday namaz at the premises. The petition has been filed by Qazi Moinuddin, the mosque's caretaker and one of the intervenors in the case, against the May 15 judgment delivered by the Indore bench of the Madhya Pradesh High Court.

The Intazamiya Committee Kamal Maula Masjid and the All India Muslim Personal Law Board were also among the parties contesting the matter before the High Court. Challenging the verdict before the Supreme Court, the Muslim

side has argued that the High Court ruling runs contrary to archaeological evidence and violates the spirit of the Places of Worship Act, 1991. Anticipating a challenge to the verdict, Hindu parties had already filed a caveat petition in the Supreme Court seeking that no ex parte order be passed without hearing them.

HIGH COURT ORDER

In its landmark ruling, the High Court held that the religious character of the disputed complex was that of Bhojshala, a temple associated with Goddess Saraswati and linked to Parmar ruler Raja Bhoj, who is credited with turning Dhar into a centre of Sanskrit learning.

A division bench of Justice Vijay Kumar Shukla and Justice Alok Awasthi

observed that historical records, archaeological material and literary evidence supported the Hindu claim

site over time.

The High Court also quashed the Archaeological Survey of India's 2003 arrangement that allowed Hindus to perform puja on Tuesdays and Muslims to offer namaz on Fridays at the protected monument. With the order being struck down, the weekly Friday prayers by the Muslim community at the complex stand discontinued.

"The historical literature of the place establishes it as a centre of Sanskrit learning associated with Raja Bhoj. It indicates the existence of a temple dedicated to Goddess Vagdevi Saraswati at Dhar. Therefore, the religious character of the area is held to be Bhojshala with temple of Goddess Vagdevi Saraswati," the court said in its ruling.

Why ED is chasing Kolkata cop as criminal links to TMC's 'golden boy' emerge

On Friday, even before dawn had fully broken, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) embarked on, perhaps, its most sweeping operations in Bengal in recent years. In fact, after the BJP's election win, central agencies have launched an aggressive crackdown on criminal syndicates and extortion gangs that the party claims were in cahoots with the TMC. At the heart of the probe lies a startling nexus - a senior Kolkata Police officer who was previously in charge of the area where Mamata Banerjee resides and notorious strongman Sona Pappu, often described as the TMC's 'golden boy'.

The ED believes Kolkata DCP Shantanu Sinha Biswas and Pappu, alias Biswajit Poddar, were central figures in an alleged racket involving land grabbing, extortion, illegal construction, and hawala dealings. Biswas and Pappu, who was on the run for over three months, were arrested by the ED last week, triggering a major stir in Bengal. It has led to speculation that the probe could lead to more high-profile names and explosive revelations.

ED CRACKDOWN ON SYNDICATES

On Friday, ED teams fanned out across nine locations in Kolkata and Murshidabad linked to Biswas and Pappu. One ED team landed at the former DCP's luxurious ancestral home in Murshidabad's Kandi town. However, the gates were locked. Drama ensued as the ED officers broke open the gates and barged in. Stunned locals watched in silence as the raid unfolded.

The image was a far cry from when ED officers were allegedly attacked by TMC goons during a raid at the residence of former TMC leader and strongman Sheikh Shahjahan in Sandeshkhali. On Friday, the ED officers spoke to locals outside the premises before breaking in. Biswas's sister, Gauri Sinha Biswas, who is the vice-chairperson of Kandi Municipality, was not present at the residence.

Gill once again led from the front with the bat on Thursday, smashing 64 off 37 balls as Gujarat Titans piled up a massive 229 against Chennai Super Kings in Ahmedabad. The GT skipper now has 616 runs from 13 matches this season and continues to combine captaincy with elite batting consistency. Gujarat eventually crushed CSK by 89 runs to bounce back strongly after their defeat to Kolkata Knight Riders. Sai Sudharsan's 84, Gill's fluent knock and Jos Buttler's explosive 57 powered GT to a huge first-innings total before the bowlers dismantled Chennai for just 140 in 13.4 overs. The defeat officially ended CSK's IPL 2026 campaign as they finished with 12 points from 14 matches. It also marked the third straight season where Chennai failed to qualify for the playoffs.

After 22 years of inherited heartbreak, corporate chaos, and near-misses, East Bengal's dramatic ISL title triumph has revived a sleeping giant. The moshal burns bright again; Kolkata's red-and-gold half has finally reclaimed its soul.

When a child is born in a Bengali household, one of the earliest loyalty tests that he or she needs to take is not political, not cultural, not even cinematic. It is football. Whether they will grow up eating Ilish in red-and-gold or Chingri in green-and-maroon, whether their heart will belong to East Bengal or Mohun Bagan. A grandfather still emotionally talks about PK Banerjee, a father remembers Bhaichung Bhutia carrying East Bengal on his shoulders, and now a son debates Cleiton Silva versus Dimitrios Petratos on Instagram

Reels and X threads. But for the last 22 years, that emotion has often hurt far more for East Bengal supporters.

The rivalry itself never lost its intensity, but slowly the balance of success drifted heavily towards the green-and-maroon side of the city. Mohun Bagan kept collecting league titles, ISL finals and continental nights while East Bengal fans were left surviving mostly on memories, nostalgia and endless reminders of "kobe abar champion hobe?" That is why on May 21, 2026, when the final whistle blew at Kishore Bharati Kriangan after East Bengal's dramatic 2-1 win over Inter Kashi, years of pain disappeared in seconds.

Fans flooded onto the pitch almost immediately. Oscar Bruzon and Youssef Ezzejjari were lifted onto supporters' shoulders and tossed into the Kolkata night as moshals lit up again. Social media instantly became a flood of red-and-gold emotion. One East Bengal supporter uploaded a video looking at the sky saying, "Baba, amra abar champion holam" — "Father, we are champions again." His father

had passed away years ago without seeing East Bengal win another national league title after the 2003-04 National Football League



triumph under Subhash Bhowmick. Another elderly supporter, probably in his seventies, stood outside the stadium crying uncontrollably while saying, "Jibon-e shob deklam, kintu eta aar dekho bhabini" — "I have seen everything in life, but I never thought I would see this again." That is what these 22 years really were. An entire generation growing older while carrying football heartbreak almost like inherited

trauma. Kids who last saw East Bengal as champions in 2004 are now full-grown adults. Some finished school, college, jobs, marriages and even became parents before finally watching East Bengal lift another major national league title again. Indian football itself moved through entire eras during this wait, from the Bhaichung Bhutia-Mike Okoro days under the chest-thumping intensity of Subhash Bhowmick to an ISL generation raised on transfer rumours, meme pages and yearly derby meltdowns online.

Indian football itself completely changed during that period. The National Football League disappeared and the I-League arrived. Then came the chaos and glamour of the ISL era. Yet somehow, East Bengal's pain survived every single era.

Trevor Morgan's side gave supporters genuine hope during those early 2010s years with magical AFC Cup nights and aggressive football that made fans dream again. Then came the near misses in 2010-11 and 2013-14 before the particularly painful 2014-15 collapse when Mohun Bagan edged them to the title.

Season ends, enigma endures: CSK deliver final word on MS Dhoni's IPL future

The great theatre of Indian cricket rolled on at the Narendra Modi Stadium, but as the dust settled on Chennai Super Kings' crushing 89-run defeat to Gujarat Titans, the post-match conversation inevitably pivoted away from the scorecard. CSK were officially knocked out of the IPL 2026 playoffs race, and with their campaign brought to a grinding halt, the single most enduring question in modern sport resurfaced: What happens next to MS Dhoni? For months, the franchise had operated under a veil of intense secrecy. Dhoni did not play a single fixture this season, nor did he travel with the team for most of their away games, remaining a looming, legendary shadow over the transition era. Minutes after a dejected skipper Rituraj Gaikwad told reporters that the world would "know next year," it was bowling coach Eric Simons who stepped into the press room to provide the most candid, insightful update yet on the enigma of No. 7. When asked point-blank about whether this was the definitive end of the road for Dhoni, Simons couldn't help but chuckle at the predictability of the

inquiry. Are you seriously asking me that question?" Simons smiled.

"Honestly, he has hit the ball so well. He had a leg injury which made it very difficult for him to run. So that's why he couldn't play. But, in terms of hitting the ball in the nets, he



is hitting it as well as I have ever seen him hit it." Simons' words shed crucial light on Dhoni's mindset: the desire to compete was fully intact, and he was actively priming himself to take the field, but his body simply refused to cooperate. To make matters worse, a fresh thumb injury put an end to any late-season cameos. Dhoni didn't even

travel to Ahmedabad for this final fixture, having already flown back to Ranchi to nurse the blow. Even earlier, during CSK's emotional lap of honour to tribute the fans at Chepauk, eagle-eyed observers noticed his thumb heavily taped.

IT WILL BE DHONI'S CALL

Yet, Simons made it clear that while physical setbacks currently dictate terms, the final decision remains entirely in the hands of the mastermind himself. "But, I keep saying this. MS will know and he will only make the decision about when he is ready," Simons explained. "If he knows it is not right, he won't play. But, if he feels it's right, he will. He will make a decision in the best interest of the team and not for himself as an individual." That selfless approach has defined Dhoni's entire career. Even in a purely dugout-bound, net-bound avatar, his value to a transitioning Chennai side remains immeasurable. "It would be great to have him playing," Simons admitted. "It has been great having him around the unit and have the opportunity to tap into all the knowledge and calmness."

After roasting GT fielding, Shubman Gill leads by example with stunning CSK display

desperately wants at this stage of the tournament. The strongest feature of Bengaluru's campaign has been the composure with which they have handled pressure. There have been very few off days, no extended slump and hardly any visible panic during difficult moments. Rajat Patidar has captained with calm assurance, creating an environment where experienced names and younger players have thrived together. At the centre of it all has been Virat Kohli. There is something almost expected now about Kohli producing another big IPL season, but familiarity should not take away from the level he continues to maintain. His 542 runs have once again given RCB strong foundations, whether in steep run chases or on slower surfaces where patience mattered as much as aggression. Devdutt Padikkal has looked far more settled this season and has complemented Kohli beautifully at the top. Patidar has brought stability.

Sensex, Nifty open higher as crude stays near \$105; banks, financials lead gains

Benchmark stock market indices opened higher on Friday as investors tracked crude oil prices and developments in the ongoing US-Iran talks, while banking and financial stocks led gains in early trade. The BSE Sensex was up 336.46 points at 75,519.82 around 9:26 am, while the NSE Nifty50 gained 86.30 points to trade at 23,741.00. Markets opened with positive momentum after global crude oil prices remained below the \$105-per-barrel mark despite continuing tensions in West Asia. As of around 9:25 am, Brent crude was trading at \$104.25 per barrel, up 1.63%, WTI crude stood at \$97.44 per barrel, up 1.13%.

OIL, IRAN TALKS REMAIN IN FOCUS

Investors are closely watching developments in the US-Iran peace discussions, which continue to influence global oil prices and market sentiment. The two sides remained divided on issues related to Iran's uranium stockpile and control over the Strait of Hormuz, although US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said there had been "some good signs" in the negotiations. The Iran conflict has remained one of the biggest triggers for global markets over the past few months, especially for oil-importing countries like India.

BANKING SHARES LEAD MARKET GAINS

Most major sectors traded in the green during early trade. Nifty Financial Services rose 0.76%, while Nifty Private Bank gained 0.93% and PSU Bank index climbed 0.47%. IndiGo shares also rose more than 0.8%, while UltraTech Cement, Asian Paints and Axis Bank traded higher. However, IT stocks remained under pressure, with Tech Mahindra, Infosys and TCS slipping in early trade.

LIC stock in focus: Q4 profit surges 23%, board announces Rs 10 dividend

LIC Q4 results which were announced after market hours on May 21 beat market expectations on most core performance parameters. LIC announced a 23% surge in its Q4FY26 net profit figure, which jumped to Rs 23,467 (on a year-on-year basis) against Rs 19,039 crore in Q4FY25. The company's board of directors spiced up the robust results with a dividend of Rs 10 per share for shareholders. It is expected that LIC shares will see significant movement today, May 22. LIC's assets under management (AUM) increased 5.1% year-on-year to touch Rs 57.3 lakh crore. The value of new business (VNB) also saw a significant jump and in the Jan-March quarter, it surged 41.63% to reach Rs 14,179 crore, which signalled improved profitability in generating new business.

Improvement in solvency ratio

LIC's solvency ratio increased to 2.35% during the Q4 period compared to 2.11% in the same period last year. It stood at 2.19% in the Q3FY26 period. The solvency ratio of an insurer reflects its financial strength. However, the company's 13-month persistency ratio declined to 67.77% compared to 68.62% last year and 69.36% in Q3FY26 period.

Preparations for IndAS implementation

LIC said that the company is preparing to implement Indian Accounting Standards (IndAS) as per regulatory guidance and is confident of implementing it within the stipulated time frame.

Capital Group builds \$2 billion bet in Adani Group in pivot from Reliance

The Capital Group, one of the world's largest investment management firms, has been increasing its exposure to Adani Group companies while steadily paring holdings in Reliance Industries Ltd., marking a shift in foreign investor preference between India's biggest conglomerates.

The Los Angeles-based money manager has acquired stakes worth more than \$2 billion across three Adani Group companies in recent weeks, according to people familiar with the matter. On May 5, Capital Group bought nearly a 2 per cent stake in Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone Ltd. for \$74.86 billion (\$776 million) through open-market transactions, according to BSE block-deal data.

The investor, which oversees more than \$3.3 trillion in assets globally, has also accumulated between 1.5 per cent and 2 per cent stakes in Adani Power Ltd. and Adani Green Energy Ltd. through market purchases, the people said, asking not to be identified because the information is private.

In a market that's fallen out of favor with some investors because of its lack of companies tied to the global artificial intelligence buildout, Adani companies are increasingly viewed as rare leveraged plays on India's infrastructure development, energy transition and manufacturing push. That shift is also emblematic of a broader transition toward bets on the next phase of India's economic expansion. Adani Power, Adani Green and Adani Ports shares surged 94 per cent, 35 per cent and 25 per cent, respectively, in one year. A Capital Group spokeswoman said she's unable to comment on individual stocks or shareholdings. A representative for Adani Group didn't respond to a request for comment.

Rupee at 100 against US dollar? Why experts say India shouldn't panic

As crude oil prices stay elevated and the rupee weakens further, a growing number of experts now argue India's real risk is not crossing 100 against the dollar, but rising inflation and slowing growth.

New Delhi, (Agency)

The rupee has been on a roller-coaster ride in recent months, sliding sharply against the US dollar as the global oil shock deepens and tensions in West Asia continue to disrupt energy markets.

With crude oil prices remanding above \$100 per barrel amid the ongoing West Asia conflict, many economists now believe the rupee touching 100 against the dollar may no longer be unthinkable. And interestingly, a growing number of experts also argue that the real risk for India may not be the rupee touching 100 itself, but what happens to inflation, jobs and economic stability alongside it. Former IMF Deputy

Managing Director and Harvard University professor Gita Gopinath recently captured this shift in thinking when she argued that policymakers should focus less on the symbolic exchange-rate level and more on the broader economy. "The relevant number is not the actual value of the exchange rate," Gopinath said in a recent interview. "What matters is jobs, inflation and output," she said.

That view is increasingly finding support among economists and market experts as India navigates a worsening global energy crisis.

A WEAKER RUPEE IS NOT ALWAYS BAD

For years, rupee weakness was often viewed almost entirely as a sign of economic stress. But economists say currency depreciation during a major external shock is not automatically a bad thing. In fact, a weaker rupee can sometimes help economies adjust.

When the rupee falls, imports become more expensive. That naturally reduces

demand for foreign goods, lowers pressure on India's foreign exchange reserves and can improve export competitiveness by making Indian



products cheaper globally.

"Rupee depreciation is partly a problem and partly a solution to the problem," said Dr. VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Investments Limited.

"Rupee depreciation boosts exports and at the same reduces foreign exchange

expenditure. Expensive dollar can curtail forex expenditure more than austerity appeals. That way it is a solution to the problem," he added. This logic becomes especially important during oil shocks.

India imports the majority of its crude oil requirements. With tensions around the Strait of Hormuz disrupting global energy flows, elevated oil prices are already increasing pressure on India's import bill and dollar demand. In such situations, economists argue that allowing the currency to weaken gradually can help absorb part of the shock instead of forcing the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to aggressively burn through forex reserves defending a symbolic exchange-rate level.

'100 IS JUST A NUMBER'

The growing argument against aggressively defending the rupee has also found support from former NITI Aayog Vice Chairman and Chairman of the 16th Finance Commission Arvind Panagariya.

Why is Indian rupee slipping nonstop? Here are three triggers behind the fall and risks ahead

New Delhi, (Agency)

India's economy continues to grow at a healthy pace, but the rupee has been under depreciation for years. The currency has now moved close to the 97-per-dollar mark, and it has fallen by nearly 7.5 percent in the first months of 2026. This leads to a question about why a fast-growing economy is witnessing a weaker currency. Currency strength usually moves in line with economic performance. In simple terms, stronger growth tends to support a stronger currency. But in India's case, the pattern has not followed that rule in recent years. Since 2018, the rupee has shown a gradual weakening trend almost every year, even though growth numbers have held up relatively strong. Back in 2013, when Narendra Modi was projected as the prime ministerial candidate by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the falling rupee was a major political talking point. At that time, the exchange rate had crossed the 60-per-dollar level and it was debated in public forums. If the

currency crosses the psychologically important 100 mark, economists say it could create added pressure for policymakers, especially the government and the Reserve Bank of



India (RBI). Import costs, oil prices and daily impact

A weaker rupee directly increases India's import bill. Since the country depends on imports for crude oil, cooking gas, fertilisers and electronics, a fall in the currency makes these essential goods more expensive in rupee terms. This eventually feeds into inflation and raises costs for households. At the same time, there is another side to the story.

Families dependent on remittances benefit when the rupee weakens because they receive more rupees for every dollar sent from abroad. India is among the largest recipients of remittances across the world. In the financial year ending March 2025, overseas Indians sent more than \$135 billion back home. However, this inflow could face disruption due to geopolitical tensions, especially military confrontations in the Middle East that affect Indian workers in Gulf countries. Rising concerns over the currency. The present weakness of the rupee is also driven by international and domestic factors. Oil prices have risen after attacks on Iran by the United States and Israel. It increased India's trade deficit. Since the country imports around 90 percent of its crude oil requirement, higher international prices directly increase dollar demand. Foreign investors have also been pulling money out of Indian markets. Reports suggest that around \$23 billion have been withdrawn from Indian equities this year.

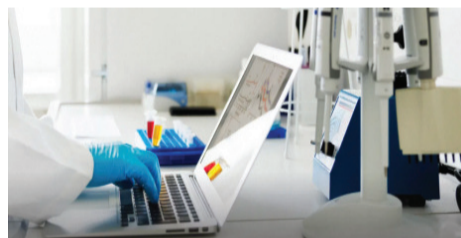
Pharma stocks regain health amid geopolitical tension: Gain up to 31% in a month

New Delhi, (Agency)

Pharma stocks have scripted rare success in the stock market in the past one month despite the dangerous and wide ramifications of the US-Iran tensions and global uncertainties arising thereof. Pharma stocks have performed remarkably and attracted investor attention since many stocks have recorded a strong rally even when the broader was in turmoil. In the past one month, the Nifty Pharma index has risen by about 11% while in the same period the benchmark Nifty 50 index has gone down by about 2.98%.

Gland Pharma records the biggest gains. In the rally of the past month, Gland Pharma has emerged as the top performer. Its shares have surged more than 31% in the past month. Laurus Labs and Biocon also recorded gains of 19.44% and 19.54%. Stocks such as Ajanta Pharma, Cipla, Mankind Pharma, Granules India, Sun Pharmaceutical Industries, and Zydus

Lifesciences have seen gains ranging from 10% to 15%. Some quarterly earnings have beaten market estimates. Q4 results to dollar revenues



Analysts have attributed a few reasons to this surge in some pharmaceutical sector stocks. One, Q4FY26 results have been better than expected. Two, the weakening rupee has actually benefitted some export-oriented pharma companies, whose dollar revenues are raising their bottom lines and revenues. Three, the pharma sector is considered a defensive defensive

sector, which means that demand for medicines and healthcare services remains strong during economic crises or wartime situations. Therefore, many investors are flocking to pharma stocks in a volatile market. Another point to note is that some Indian pharma companies are benefiting from a robust pipeline of specialty drugs and upcoming biologics patents in the US markets, providing long-term growth visibility in highly regulated markets. "Pharma is one sector that has been performing well for quite some time. Over the past one month, we have witnessed strong buying interest in the sector. Most of these companies have reported reasonably well quarterly numbers. Export is one part which is completely benefiting. Depreciating rupee against the dollar is an advantageous position for pharma as well as for industries involved in export-oriented business.

THE BIG CONFUSION

However, Melody toffees are actually made by Parle Products, which is an unlisted company and not traded on the stock market. Parle Industries, whose shares have been rallying sharply over the past few sessions, is a completely separate listed entity and has no known business connection with Melody chocolates. The incident has once again highlighted how viral social media trends and brand-name confusion can sometimes trigger sharp moves in small-cap and penny stocks.

STOCK EXTENDS GAINS DESPITE CLARITY. Even after the confusion became widely known, buying interest in the stock continued.

Market observers say low-priced stocks with small market capitalisations often witness sharp price swings when retail trading activity spikes. The stock has now hit upper circuits for three straight sessions as traders continue to chase momentum. Interestingly, despite the recent rally, the stock still remains sharply lower over the longer term down over 40% in the last three months, lower by nearly 46% over six months, and down more than 68% over the past year.

Venezuela became India's third-largest crude supplier in May, overtaking Saudi Arabia and the United States. The shift shows how lower prices and regional supply disruptions are reshaping India's crude sourcing.

New Delhi, (Agency)

Venezuela has emerged as India's third-largest crude oil supplier in May, overtaking traditional heavyweights Saudi Arabia and the United States, as Indian refiners increased purchases of cheaper Venezuelan crude amid ongoing disruptions in global oil markets. According to data from energy cargo tracker Kpler, Venezuela supplied around 417,000 barrels per day (bpd) of crude oil to India so far this month, sharply higher than 283,000 bpd in April. The South American country had supplied

no crude to India during the previous nine months. The jump comes at a time when India is reshuffling its crude oil sourcing strategy due to the ongoing West Asia conflict, disruptions around the Strait of Hormuz and changing global supply dynamics. Only Russia and the United Arab Emirates supplied more crude oil to India than Venezuela in May.

WHY INDIA IS BUYING MORE OIL FROM VENEZUELA

The main reason behind the surge is price.

Venezuelan crude is currently cheaper than many other global oil grades, making it attractive for Indian refiners dealing with elevated crude prices and geopolitical uncertainty. "Indian buyers have historically shown strong interest in Venezuelan barrels due to their attractive economics and compatibility with complex refining systems," Nikhil Dubey, Lead Analyst-Refining at Kpler, said, as quoted by The Economic Times (ET). Indian refiners, especially Reliance

Industries, are among the biggest buyers because Venezuela's heavy and high-sulphur crude suits complex refinery systems such as Reliance's Jamnagar



refinery in Gujarat. Most Indian refiners can process Venezuelan crude only in limited quantities, but Reliance's advanced refining infrastructure makes it one of the biggest beneficiaries.

INDIA'S OIL IMPORTS RISE, BUT STILL BELOW PRE-WAR LEVELS. India's overall crude oil imports rose 8% month-on-month to around 4.9 million barrels per day in May, according to Kpler data. However, imports still remain below

the 5.2 million barrels per day recorded in February, before the Iran war disrupted energy shipments from West Asia.

The near closure of the Strait of Hormuz had severely impacted oil shipments from key Middle East suppliers earlier this year.

Although some Iraqi crude cargoes resumed this month, volumes remain sharply lower. India received only around 51,000 bpd from Iraq so far in May, compared to nearly 969,000 bpd in February. IRAN SUPPLIES HALTED AGAIN.

India had briefly resumed crude imports from Iran in April after the US eased sanctions restrictions earlier this year.

That marked the first Iranian oil imports into India in nearly seven years. However, those shipments have once again stopped. No Iranian cargoes have arrived in India this month following the US naval blockade around Iranian ports amid the ongoing conflict. The disruption forced Indian refiners to look for alternative sources, benefiting suppliers such as Venezuela and the UAE.

Kusha Kapila Says 'Actors Are Right' To Question Influencers Getting Films 'Because Of Followers'



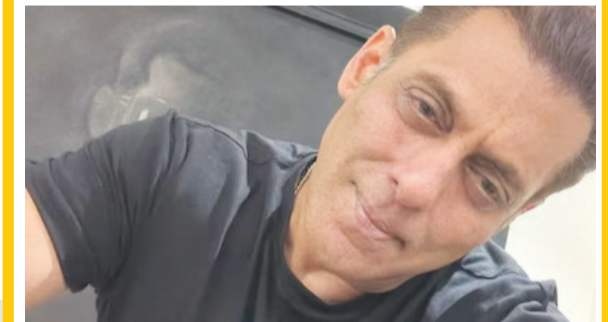
Kusha Kapila's shift from influencing to acting reflects a larger change in the Indian entertainment industry, where digital creators are increasingly crossing over into mainstream cinema and OTT storytelling. As certain studios continue prioritising internet-savvy audiences, influencers with built-in fan bases have become attractive casting choices.

However, Bollywood actors have often called out this practice, saying that casting a role based on followers is a disservice to the craft. Shares In-Flight Glimpse Of Daughter Saraayah Ahead Of Vacation With Sidharth Malhotra

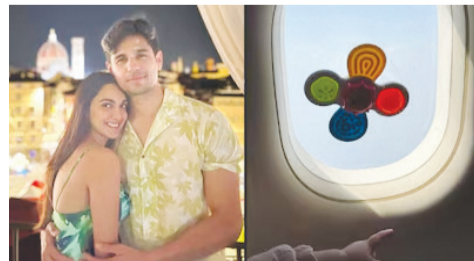

Most of the tourists also know that it is one of the New7Wonders of the World, but they usually don't know the full details of what visiting involves and hence, it's always good to read up on these things ahead of time so that you can really enjoy the site rather than worry about things you were unprepared for. Petra is a true 'once in a lifetime' place to visit, so read up to learn what you need to know ahead of time!

Getting there

It takes two and half hours to get to Petra

m Amman Queen Alia International Airport, without traffic on the main highway. Keep in mind that it's often better to take the King's Highway which is a slow, hilly, winding, scenic highway, even if it means at least an hour longer journey! There are many places to stop for photos and this area is often called the 'Grand Canyon of Jordan'.

Where to stay?

There are many guest houses in Petra but the most famous hotel is Movenpick which is right outside the entrance gate and is reasonably priced for a 5 star hotel. There is also a pool. Do keep in mind that the taxes on food here are higher, so consider exploring Petra town for dinner.

Tickets and tours

If you're on a tight time frame, you can visit Petra in just one day. However, most travellers whom we met were spending at least two days there, so if you can squeeze in an extra day for sightseeing, do so.

take you to and from the entrance and the Treasury. There are some places you can't visit like the Monastery unless you can ride comfortably on a donkey for about 20 minutes. You can negotiate the

prices a bit but they are mostly set. There are places to stop, take breaks, have tea and buy water en route. You can even buy souvenirs here.

Timings

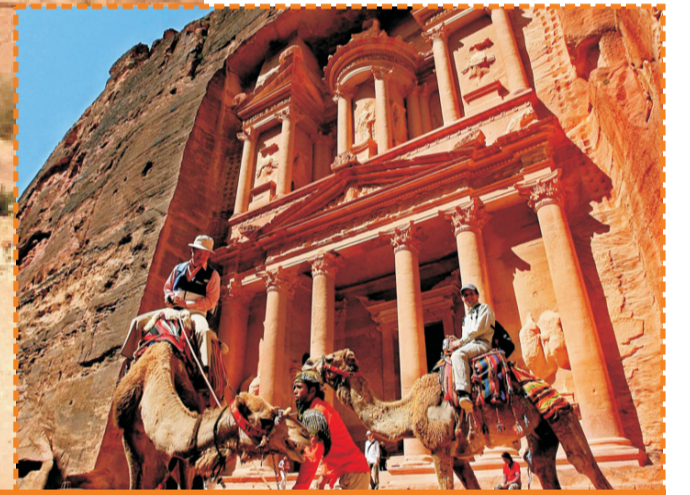
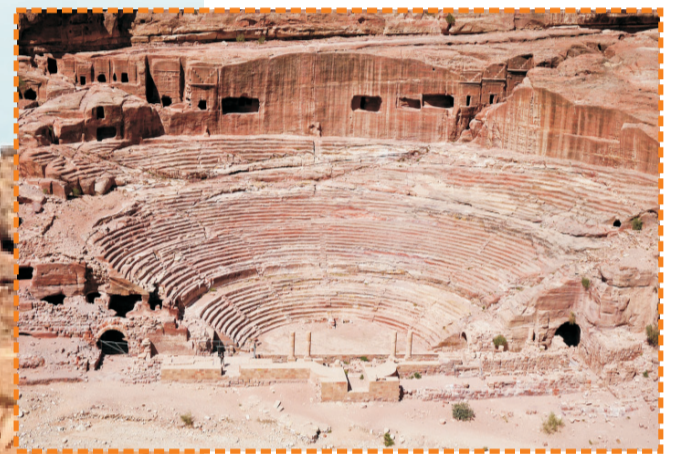
Wake up early! The early bird catches the worm here, and by that I mean, great photo opportunities with fewer people crowding around awesome shots. You will need about 7 hours to walk around comfortably and go all the way to the Monastery and back.

How much walking is it really?

Well, to see it all, as mentioned, would take about 7 hours comfortably. You can do it in 5, which we did, if you walk very fast and take a donkey ride up to the Monastery. You can also come to Petra and just walk to the Treasury (30 minutes) and then return to your hotel. There are many ways to see the sites and it's up to you to decide what you want to see. The Monastery, Petra's largest monument, is more impressive than the Treasury and I think if you've come all this way you should go ahead and see it.

What to wear?

You do have to cover up here, although many tourists were not and some even had on denim shorts. I recommend breezy trousers or leggings and a thin T-shirt. As long as your legs and shoulders are covered, you are okay. Bring a hat, sunscreen and sunglasses. Wear comfortable walking shoes, but hiking shoes are not necessary.



By the end of the Middle Ages, St Andrews boasted of Scotland's first university and was the country's undisputed ecclesiastical and intellectual capital. The medieval street plan remains virtually intact. The oldest surviving buildings are sandstone. The "Auld Grey Toon" is one of cloister garths, courtyards, "yetts" (gates of latticed wrought iron bars), "wynds (narrow lanes), "pends" (streets leading to courtyards), Renaissance arcades, masonic porches, villas, staired turrets, balustrade parapets, slate or clay pantile, Flemish crow-stepped or corbie roofs, moulded windows, porticos, old archdeacon's mansions and walled gardens.

St Salvator's Chapel

Locals and students are all familiar with Agnes, Annie, Elizabeth, Margaret, Katherine and George. These are the church bells of the university chapel on North Street. The six bells are contained in the tower and are hung for full circle ringing. The oldest is Elizabeth, recast in 1940. Agnes is named after the sister of one of the university's chairs of Greek, George after a student, Margaret after a Scottish medieval queen and Annie after the university's first female student, Agnes Forbes Blackadder (MA, 1895).

A rare example of Late Gothic architecture, the chapel was founded in 1450. The adjacent 1933 halls of residence were once described as "a rambling Gothic dormitory". The oldest hall is St Regulus (1868). The modern halls are in the "brutalist" style of architecture.

St Salvator's College

Established in 1450 by Bishop Kennedy, this is now a university residential hall. The tower, to which the present spire was added in 1550, contains the original bells—Katharine and Kate Kennedy. The butts date from the 1860s. The entrance archway originally formed part of the old cloister court. In the vestry is a 1461 college mace. In 1747, St Salvator's College became the seat of the United College.

St Salvator's Quad contains lecture and exam halls, and was for many years the scene of the annual Raisin Weekend mass shaving foam fight every October. This

commemorates the tradition of giving raisins to academic parents or mentors who look after freshers, first year students or "beasants" (fledglings). Now, their services are rewarded usually by alcohol! Outside the Quad are the letters PH in the cobble marking the site where the Protestant martyr Patrick Hamilton was burned at the stake in 1528, and it is considered bad luck to walk on the letters. Students who walk across these letters will fail their degree but can remove the 'curse' by bathing in the sea at dawn on 1st May

St Andrews Castle

Once one of the most important strongholds of the kingdom, the castle was founded around 1200, reconstructed in the 14th century and repaired in the 16th century. The structure forms an irregular pentagon enclosing a courtyard with towers or blockhouses which are now long gone, along with the original square Fore Tower. What remains is the work of Archbishop Hamilton, following the siege of 1546-7. Still standing is the Kitchen tower and Sea Tower with its bottle dungeon.

St Rules Tower

The place to sightsee, St Rules Tower in St Andrews Cathedral has the best view in town. Its name derives from the town's

claim to be the final resting place of the apostle Andrew and the patron saint of Scotland, whose bones were brought under divine guidance from Patras, Greece by St Regulus (St Rule) to Kilrymont. St Andrews was also called Kilrule.

The Priory of Canons Regular of the Order of St Augustine was founded in 1127. The community were for a while associated with the Church of St Regulus or St Rule, of which the 33 m Romanesque tower and choir (1080) still stands to the east of the later Cathedral. It is the oldest surviving building in St Andrews. It was the first place of worship for arriving St Augustine canons. The establishment of the present town began around 1140 by Bishop Robert. The burgh of St Andrews was first represented at the great council at Scone Palace in 1357 and granted a royal charter by King James VI, who used the area around the nearby Falkland Palace for hunting.

St Andrews Cathedral

This Cathedral was founded in 1160 by Bishop Arnold and consecrated in the presence of King Bruce in 1318. Construction started at the east end, where the detail is Romanesque but later work is Gothic. The nave consisted of 12 bays, a

crossing with a central tower, north and south transepts, a choir and shrine. At 109 m (357') it was by far the longest and largest cathedral in Scotland.

The vaulted calefactory and refectory undercroft were restored at the end of the 19th century. Parts of the Great Hall remain, as well as the re-built gateway of the New Inns or royal guest house on Pends Road. The whole area is a half-a-mile in length with 13 towers and three gateways. The Cathedral was abandoned during the Reformation (1559). The lead on the roofs was used for ammunition in the Wars of Religion. The central tower collapsed and the ruins were used as a quarry. Many buildings around town are made from the Cathedral stone.

Used as a place of worship since the 8th century, the cathedral became the headquarters of the medieval Scottish church and dominated religion until the Protestant Reformation in 1560. It was the seat of Scotland's leading bishops, and from 1472 of the archbishops. In 1559, John Knox preached a passionate sermon in the parish church and, as a result, the church was cleansed. In 1561, it was abandoned and left to fall into ruin.

The Cathedral graveyard contains the

graves of Scottish diplomat and prelate Andrew Forman, Scottish Presbyterian and museum curator James Bell Pettigrew and famous golfing pioneers, Old Tom Morris and his son, Young Tom who won the British Open Championship four times and died at the age of 24.

There is also the grave of golfer Allan Robertson to whom Old Tom was an apprentice. He is considered to be the first professional golfer club and ball maker. Robertson was never beaten and was first to break 80 over the Old Course, the year before he died in 1859. He exported his clubs and balls worldwide. An authentic Robertson "feathery" ball is a collector's item today. Along with Morris, he also designed Carnoustie in 1842. His epitaph reads: "Allan Robertson—who died 1st Sept. 1859 aged 44 years old. He was greatly esteemed for his personal worth and for many years was esteemed as the champion golfer of Scotland."

The British Open is due to his death. The members of Prestwick Golf Club on the west coast of Scotland held the competition in 1860, to decide who would succeed him as the "Champion Golfer". The Open, continuing annually ever since except for the war years, is the longest-running golf championship, and the oldest of the four "Majors"—the US Open, US Masters and US PGA Championship.

Queen Mary's House

On South Street, which is like all the streets a processional avenue to the St Andrews Cathedral, there is the three-storey frontage of the house and its later extension, "Priorsgate". The most striking design element is the western wing's stair tower and corner oriel of brownstone. The house was begun in 1523 by merchant Hew Scrymgeour and became known as Queen Mary's House when she stayed there in 1564 on one of her many visits. The building was renovated in 1927 for use as a library by St Leonards School.
