Rahul Gandhi to lead NEET paper leak protest in Kota, BJP calls it toolkit move

Arvind Kejriwal slams Telegram ban, accuses Centre of failing to curb paper leak racket amid NEET-UG retest curbs

As Rahul Gandhi prepares to address thousands of students in Kota over alleged exam irregularities and paper leaks, the BJP has accused Congress of politicising the issue, setting the stage for a high-voltage showdown.

New Delhi .(Agency) With the NEET paper leak controversy once again at the centre of national debate, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is set to hold a major student convention in Rajasthan's Kota on today evening, positioning the event as a platform to amplify concerns over examination irregularities, paper leaks and youth unemployment.



privatisation and scams." "My young and Gen Z friends, one thing is clear to me, and I want you to engrain this in your heart as well: securing the future of every young Indian is the government's responsibility. Yet, both responsibility and integrity are concepts alien to the Modi government," Gandhi wrote on X.

"Paper leaks, exam mismanagement, cancelled recruitments, skyrocketing fees, privatisation, and scams — these are the very tools with which they are shattering crores of dreams every day," he said, adding that he wanted to discuss these issues directly with students. The Congress has projected the Kota programme as the first in a nationwide series of student conventions focused on issues affecting young people, particularly alleged paper leaks and examination-related controversies.

CONGRESS GEARS UP FOR STUDENT OUTREACH Ahead of Gandhi's visit, Congress leaders intensified preparations in Kota. A meeting of the Mahila Congress was held at the party office in Gumanpura, where leaders discussed mobilisation efforts and assigned ward-level responsibilities to ensure strong participation.

AP national convener Arvind Kejriwal on Wednesday criticised the Centre's decision to temporarily restrict access to the Telegram messaging app ahead of the NEET-UG 2026 re-examination, calling the move "absurd" and alleging that the government has no genuine intent to stop paper leaks.

NTA Director General Abhishek Singh said the measure formed part of efforts to ensure the re-exam is conducted fairly and without malpractice. In a post on X in Hindi, Kejriwal alleged that the Centre "has no intention of stopping paper leaks", claiming that such actions were merely symbolic.

"That's why such absurd steps are being taken — transporting papers by Army aircraft and shutting down Telegram. Will these steps stop paper leaks? Absolutely not," he said. He further alleged that the paper leak system is a "multi-billion-rupee racket" and suggested that the proceeds benefit those in power, including being used to influence elected representatives.

The government has also directed Google and Apple to remove Telegram from their app stores temporarily as part of the restrictions. NEET-UG was originally conducted on May 3 but was later cancelled on May 12 by the NTA following allegations of irregularities, leaving lakhs of candidates affected.

'It is our responsibility to ensure the safety of seafarers': Modi at G7, days after Indian mariners killed in US strike

NEW DELHI.(Agency) Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday, while addressing a gathering of G7 leaders, including US President Donald Trump, raised the issue of the safety of seafarers.

All countries must ensure that maritime routes remain secure and that seafarers can perform their duties without fear, said Modi days after three Indian mariners were killed in a US military strike in the Gulf of Oman.

The prime minister, addressing an outreach session of the G7 summit, said India firmly believes lasting solutions to conflicts can only be found through dialogue, diplomacy and international cooperation.

Modi said disruptions to maritime trade in the Strait of Hormuz have harmed the global economy and that many Indian citizens have lost their lives in the conflict. Modi's comments on underlining the importance of ensuring the safety of seafarers came against the backdrop of growing anger in India over the killing of the three Indian crew members in a US military attack on a merchant ship off the coast of Oman last week.

NTA cautions parents against scammers, insists no leak of NEET-UG reexamination

NEW DELHI.(Agency) In an unprecedented move, the National Testing Agency on Tuesday night put out two videos warning parents and students taking up the upcoming NEET-UG retest on June 21 not to believe any kind of message that advance questions were available for a price.

There is absolutely no leak of the re-exam, and anyone saying anything to the contrary is a scamster, it said. NTA Director General Abhishek Singh, who has never come out in public since he assumed office, put out a video defending the decision of the agency to ban Telegram in the interests of 22-lakh-plus genuine students.

Fraudsters used edited chats and used the platform to sell fake question papers and misled students, he said. "Channels demanding Rs 14,000 to Rs 25,000, some even Rs 10 lakh, claimed they will send the re-exam paper. They won't. There is no leaked paper for the re-exam. The money is gone the moment you transfer it. Your admit card and WhatsApp number, if you sent them, become the tools they use to scam the next student," Singh said in a broadcast made public. Fake-proof videos show chats before the exam. "The trick is that on Telegram, whoever runs a channel can edit any old message and change what's inside it, while the date on the message stays the same. So a message edited on the fourth can be made to look exactly like it was sent on the first," he explained.

I run a recycling business: TVK leader's relative approaches cops over DMK mix-up

TVK leader Aadhav Arjuna's relative, John Britto, was accused by the DMK of being the person recently arrested in a drug smuggling case. While the party has now deleted the tweets, Britto has filed a police complaint and Arjuna has sued ex-CM MK Stalin.

Chennai.(Agency) The Enforcement Directorate arrested one John Britto in a drug smuggling case. The DMK took to X and shamed TVK leader Aadhav Arjuna for his relative's connection with the matter. But both are different people, and now the mistaken Britto, has filed a complaint with the police. "False news about me and my relatives are being released. That John Britto is different," he told reporters on Wednesday. Aadhav Arjuna's mother-in-law Leena Rose Martin, an AIADMK MLA from Lalgudi, is the sister of John Britto.



My name is John Britto and I run a plastic recycling business in Coimbatore. My sister is Lalgudi with the commissioner's office," Arjuna's relative, Britto, told reporters. Arjuna, meanwhile, has sued former CM MK Stalin and the DMK's IT wing, demanding a public apology within 48 hours along with Rs 1 crore over allegations linking the TVK leader to the drug smuggling case. The legal notice has accused the DMK and its online machinery of making "false and defamatory" claims connecting Arjuna to Jon Britto, who was arrested by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence.

Centre brokers six-state deal on Kishau dam

NEW DELHI.(Agency)

In a significant breakthrough for interstate water cooperation and river basin management, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Rajasthan have reached a consensus on the long-pending Kishau Multipurpose Dam Project during a meeting chaired by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday, officials said.

The meeting marked a major step forward in the implementation of one of the most important water infrastructure projects in northern India, which has remained under discussion for several decades due to issues related to cost-sharing, water allocation and coordination among participating states, they said. The consensus was achieved after the participating states agreed to sign a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for the implementation of the project. Following the signing of the MoU, the project will be placed before the Union Cabinet for final approval, the officials said. The Kishau Multipurpose Dam Project is planned on the Tons River, the largest tributary of the Yamuna, along the border of Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. The project has long been viewed as a critical intervention for augmenting water availability in the Yamuna basin, improving drinking.

JDS moves its MLAs to resort amid cross-voting fears before today's MLC polls

Janata Dal (Secular) will shift their MLAs to a resort on the outskirts of Bengaluru near Devanahalli later in the evening, with senior party leaders likely to hold briefings and sessions for during the legislators' stay.

Bengaluru.(Agency) After the Congress, now HD Kumaraswamy-headed JD(S), has also begun resort politics ahead of tomorrow's Legislative Council elections. According to party sources, amid fears of cross-voting, the party has decided to move its MLAs to a resort on the outskirts of Bengaluru. Sources added that the MLAs will be shifted to the Prestige Golf Club Resort near Devanahalli later in the evening. Besides, senior party leaders are expected to conduct briefings and sessions for the legislators during their stay. Congress also moved its MLAs to the Terrea Resort on Mysuru Road yesterday. It is located within the Wonderla amusement park premises, nearly 28 km from Bengaluru.



The decision to shift the legislators came after yesterday's Congress Legislature Party (CLP) meeting. The MLAs will remain there until being transported directly to the Assembly to cast their votes. Legislative Assembly members will vote in

the election at Vidhana Soudha where there are eight candidates for seven seats. The Congress is eyeing five of seven seats.

Each candidate requires a minimum of 28 votes to win. The Congress and the BJP are expected to comfortably win four and two seats, respectively, on the basis of their strength in the Assembly, officials said. But, a contest is likely for the seventh seat, as both the Congress and the JD(S) have fielded candidates despite lacking adequate strength to win it on their own, the officials added. Congress's Thippannappa Kamknor, Shivanna BS, Vinay Karthik Prakash, PV Mohan, and KPCC President BK Hariprasad; BJP's Lingaraj Patil and Raghur R; and JD(S) leader Govindaraju, are the candidates running for the seats.

Sanjay Raut abuses rebel Sena UBT MPs on camera, says do not beep it out

New Delhi.(Agency)

Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut launched a profanity-laced attack on the rebel MPs reportedly eyeing a switch from the Uddhav Thackeray camp, vowing that the party would not spare "backstabbers" and challenging them to resign and openly join the NDA.



After unleashing a string of expletives and describing the rebel MPs as beimaan (betrayers), Raut, while addressing the media, urged reporters not to beep out his abuses. "These s*** bh**** should leave...don't cut," he said, adding that "betrayal is in their blood." He challenged any dissidents to resign first and said those elected on the party's ticket had no right to betray the mandate. Defending his

abusive remarks at the press conference, Sanjay Raut said he had not said anything wrong, as such expressions are commonly used in Maharashtra and the Marathi language. He clarified that he had not made any such remarks in Parliament, but argued that wrongdoing or corruption should not be met with praise. "If someone does something

wrong or commits corruption, will we shower flowers on them?" he asked.

He also went on to allege that some MPs from the Uddhav Sena camp were being offered Rs 50 crore to switch sides, as speculation grew over a possible split in the Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (UBT). Raut said the party had no official information about any split and was learning of reports about some MPs breaking away through the media. He said Shiv Sena (UBT) had begun legal steps, issued a whip ahead of its parliamentary party meeting scheduled for Thursday, and written to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla asking him to act strictly in line with constitutional provisions. Of the party's nine Lok Sabha MPs, only Arvind Sawant, Anil Desai and Rajabhau Waje were present at the press conference.

Out of 9 Lok Sabha MPs, only Arvind Sawant, Anil Desai and Rajabhau Waje attended

Sanjay Raut's press conference in Delhi. He claimed that an "important person" had informed him that attempts were being made to bribe MPs, alleging Rs 50 crore deals with Rs 15 crore as advance, and that some MPs refused to travel without payment.

NHAI earmarks land for two flyovers planned At Rajiv Chowk in Gurgaon

Gurgaon.(Agency)

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has prepared a preliminary land acquisition plan for two proposed flyovers at Rajiv Chowk as part of efforts to ease congestion at one of the city's busiest intersections. According to the plan, around 3.05 hectares of land will be required from various govt agencies and departments for the project, which is aimed at improving traffic flow between Delhi-Gurgaon Expressway and Sohna Highway. The proposal includes construction of two new flyovers. One right-turn flyover is planned for vehicles coming from the Sohna side, allowing direct access to Delhi-Gurgaon Expressway towards Sector 15 without stopping at the Rajiv Chowk traffic signal. The second flyover will facilitate uninterrupted movement from the Sector 32 side towards Sohna Highway. According to the preliminary plan, land has been identified from six agencies, including department of animal husbandry, Air Force, Tau Devi Lal stadium, department of telecommunications (DoT), green belts and other govt-owned plots. The largest share, around 0.89 hectares, has been identified from DoT land, followed by nearly 0.83 hectares from the stadium and about 0.73 hectares from Air Force land. Smaller parcels have been earmarked from green belts, govt plots and land belonging to department of animal husbandry. An NHAI official said discussions with the concerned agencies would be initiated to address land availability issues. "A meeting with GMDA officials will be held soon to resolve matters related to land under its administration. Simultaneously, the issue concerning DoT land will be taken up at the ministerial level," the official said. The project is part of a broader plan to redesign Rajiv Chowk and improve traffic flow and road safety. Last year, NHAI was tasked with conducting a feasibility study to assess traffic patterns and recommend long-term decongestion measures.

Rain, cloud cover bring relief across Haryana, IMD forecasts more thunderstorms

Rain, thunderstorms and persistent cloud cover brought relief across Haryana on Tuesday, with temperatures falling sharply below normal in several districts. IMD has forecast continued thunderstorm activity accompanied by lightning and gusty winds over the next few days.

Gurgaon AWS recorded 3.5 mm of rain during the day, while NorthCap University AWS in Gurgaon reported 6.5 mm. The maximum temperature at Gurgaon AWS settled at 32.4 degrees Celsius, nearly 3.8 degrees below the previous day's level, while Gurgaon KVK recorded a maximum temperature of 32.3 degrees Celsius, registering a fall of 4 degrees Celsius. Gurgaon AWS recorded a minimum temperature of 21.7°C, the lowest in the district, followed by 23.7°C at Gurgaon KVK AWS and 25.4°C at NorthCap University AWS. All three stations recorded lower temperatures than the previous day, with the drop attributed to widespread cloud cover, rainfall and increased moisture. IMD has placed most districts under a yellow alert for thunderstorms, lightning and gusty winds of 40 to 50 kmph on June 17 and June 19. A temporary reduction in weather activity is expected on June 18, when no major warning has been issued. However, another spell of thunderstorms and gusty winds is likely to affect large parts of the state thereafter. For Gurgaon, the forecast suggests partly to generally cloudy skies over the next few days, with the possibility of light to moderate rain or thundershowers at isolated places.

Daytime temperatures are expected to remain below normal, ensuring continued relief from heatwave conditions. Weather experts attribute the cooler conditions to active pre-monsoon weather systems over northwest India and believe that recurring spells of rain and cloud cover will help maintain comfortable weather across Haryana through the remainder of the week.

Share the ride, split the bill: Sector 105 RWA launches carpool initiative

Gurgaon.(Agency)

As fuel prices squeeze household budgets, the Sector 105 residents' welfare association has urged residents to carpool to Delhi, Gurgaon, Faridabad and Greater Noida. A dedicated WhatsApp group will be floated to facilitate direct coordination, where residents can share travel routes, timings and contact details.

RWA president Deepak Sharma said it is a voluntary, not for profit initiative. "If the number of cars leaving Sector 105 daily could be reduced from approximately 100 to just 35-50, it would lead to



significant decreases in both traffic congestion and pollution levels. Also, it will foster a sense of community and help tackle both the financial burden of rising fuel prices and help the environment," said Sharma. The residents are receiving the campaign with great enthusiasm. A resident also demanded an e-rickshaw shuttle service to Botanical Garden metro station — similar to arrangements in neighbouring sectors — with trips every two hours.

Ever since the US-Iran war had begun, fuel prices have been hiked for four times, with the latest increase announced last month. Petrol in Delhi-NCR costs Rs 102.12 per litre and diesel Rs 95.20 litre.

Faridabad to halt waste dumping at Bandhwari from next week

Municipal Corporation of Faridabad (MCF) has assured Municipal Corporation of Gurgaon (MCG) that it will stop dumping fresh waste at the Bandhwari landfill from next Tuesday, which could temporarily ease pressure on the overburdened dump. According to MCG officials, Faridabad currently sends around 9,000 tonnes of fresh waste every day to Bandhwari, accounting for nearly 38% of the total waste dumped there every month. The landfill has long been at the centre of environmental and public health concerns because of the tonnes of legacy waste that has been collecting at the site. Now, MCG is searching for an alternative location for dumping and processing of waste on a war footing. MCG officials said the move will significantly help clear the dump — an order that was given by the union housing and urban affairs minister Manohar Lal



Khattar last month. "Faridabad stopping its waste disposal at Bandhwari will reduce the burden significantly. We have received a verbal assurance from the MCF stating that they will stop fresh waste dumping from next week," he said. MCF

commissioner Dharendra Khadgata was not available for a comment despite repeated attempts to contact him. While MCG earlier also directed the MCF to stop fresh waste dumping at Bandhwari, the practice, however, has not stopped.

However, some environmentalists said Faridabad stopping waste dumping would not make much difference to the landfill's condition. "Faridabad will create a new landfill for their waste, which will only aggravate the issue. Besides, Gurgaon itself dumps around 1,500 tonnes of waste per day, which is more than the clearance they have got," said Vaishali Rana, an activist. On May 28, Khattar ordered MCG officials to clear Bandhwari within one year and submit daily progress reports. The landfill continues to hold an estimated 18 lakh MT of accumulated legacy waste. Two agencies are currently engaged in treating the waste. He also directed that regular drone surveys be conducted during the meeting to ensure transparent and effective monitoring of the work being carried out. He directed officials to monitor the pace and quality of work through modern technology.

'May tamper with witnesses': Bail denied to Punjab minister Sanjeev Arora

A special court on Monday rejected the bail of Punjab industries minister, who was arrested by the ED in May for a GST billing and money laundering racket worth Rs 100 crore. While rejecting the application, the court said the accused had already attempted to influence one witness by paying him Rs 35,000 and asking him to retract his statement, and is likely to do so again if he is not in custody. After his arrest, the minister's counsel had said the ED had found no incriminating evidence that linked him to the case but was still incarcerated for over a month. He also alleged the FIR was registered with "malafide intentions" mainly due to political reasons.

However, ED argued that Arora was arrested according to the law and the



investigating agency has the right to seek remand for the purpose of investigation up to 40 days from the date of arrest. It also

said granting Arora bail would hamper the investigation. "It is now on record that the petitioner tried to tamper with the evidence as has been disclosed by one of the witnesses and in case of grant of bail at this stage, the petitioner may influence the other witnesses," special public prosecutor Simon Benjamin said. The case pertains to alleged fake GST bills generated through shell companies involved in phone trading, with suspected laundering of over Rs 100 crore. ED has alleged that firms linked to Arora carried out suspicious transactions through bogus entities in Delhi.

Judge Narendra Sura, in the order, said he is well acquainted with the persons having knowledge of the company/firm's affairs, alleged dealings and transactions, which would help him with his attempts of witness tampering.

Demolition drive against illegal commercial bldgs begins on Galleria Road after SC order

Noida.(Agency)

The enforcement wing of the department of town and country planning (DTCP) on Tuesday demolished 13 unauthorised commercial structures built on land marked for residential use in Chakkarpur near Hamilton Court Society on Galleria Road. The demolition drive was carried out under tight security arrangements, with assistance from personnel of the Sector 29 police station. A chemist shop, a pet shop, and a scrap dealer unit were among the structures that were razed. District town planner (enforcement) Amit Madholia supervised the operation on the ground along with duty magistrate and assistant town planner Naveen Barua, assistant town planner Divya Dahiya and enforcement staff.

The anti-encroachment drive brought to an end a two-decade-long legal battle. According to DTCP records, the licence to build commercial establishments on the land expired in July 2006, and no building plans were ever sanctioned for the structures there. Cases of land acquisition

and exchange deeds involving the land parcel were also pending before the Punjab and Haryana High Court as well as the Supreme Court. Officials said portions of the land were acquired by Haryana Shetri



Vikas Pradhikaran and later exchanged with a private entity, triggering ownership disputes. Complaints regarding unauthorised construction had resulted in show-cause notices, restoration orders and an earlier demolition exercise in 2023. Residents of nearby housing societies had also repeatedly raised concerns over traffic congestion, safety issues and commercial

activity on residential land. Officials said the demolition drive was preceded by a series of enforcement measures undertaken by the department over the past several months. According to the town and country planning department, a detailed speaking order had earlier been issued to the concerned parties, directing them to remove all unauthorised structures and restore the land to its original condition. The order had warned that failure to comply would invite departmental action and recovery of demolition expenses from the violators as arrears of land revenue.

On May 14, the Supreme Court directed district town planner (enforcement) Amit Madholia to proceed in accordance with sections 3B and 10 of the Haryana Development and Regulation of Urban Areas Act, 1975 (regulating the use of land in order to prevent ill-planned and haphazard urbanisation), observing that arbitration proceedings between private parties could not stall statutory action against unauthorised constructions.

Police find 13 Bangladeshis at building sites across NCR in drive to spot illegals, to send them back

Gurgaon.(Agency)

Thirteen Bangladeshi nationals who allegedly entered India illegally through the West Bengal border and spent the past few years working at construction sites across the NCR city have been detained during a special police verification drive and are now set to be sent back to their country. The men, picked up from construction sites and settlements in sectors 69, 70 and 104, are currently undergoing legal procedures that will eventually see them handed over to Bangladeshi authorities through the Border Security Force (BSF). Police said the action was part of an ongoing campaign aimed at identifying foreign nationals living in the city without valid documents.

The detainees were identified as Arif, Sumon Ali, Sabir Hussain, Rubal, Sakib, Robiul, Gulzar Hussain, Naeem, Mehboob, Hamidur Islam, Atiyar Rahman and Mohammad Hesam. Most are in the 20-30 age group and were working as labourers at different construction sites.

The operation was carried out by the Sector 39 crime branch under the supervision of DCP (crime) Hitesh Yadav after specific intelligence inputs about suspected illegal migrants. Teams conducted searches over the past two days at labour colonies, slum clusters and construction sites. "During verification, documents linked to their



Bangladeshi citizenship were recovered. They were staying here illegally and working at multiple construction sites," a police officer said. According to police, several detainees admitted during questioning that they had crossed into India through the Kaliaganj border in West Bengal with the help of "agents" before

travelling to Gurgaon in search of work. Sumon Ali told TOI he entered India in 2022 and had been living and working in the city since then. "Yes, I am a Bangladeshi citizen and was staying here for the past four years. Police detained me from a construction site," he said. Another detainee, Arif, said he entered India in 2024

for employment and was picked up from a construction site near Tulip Chowk in Sector 70. According to police, the next stage will involve legal proceedings. After medical examinations conducted on Tuesday, the 13 men are expected.

Lift operator assaulted after elevator stalls in society

Gurugram: A lift operator at Signature Orchard Society in Sector 93 was allegedly assaulted by a group of six young men after an elevator malfunction left them briefly trapped, resulting in serious injuries including permanent damage to one eye, according to officials and witnesses. The incident took place on June 9

in the society's 'L Tower', when a sudden technical glitch caused the lift to stall while four young men — identified as Chandrashekhar, Bharat, Vivek and Sanjay — were inside. The group remained trapped for around seven minutes, leaving them angered. Following an alert from the control room, lift operator Gaurav rushed to the site to resolve the issue. However, just before his arrival, the lift reportedly

restarted on its own, descended to the ground floor and opened. As the four men stepped out, they allegedly confronted Gaurav, hurling verbal abuse and behaving aggressively. Sensing the situation escalating, Gaurav moved away to ensure his safety. It is alleged that the group's anger persisted and, after going downstairs, they called two associates to the spot. The six individuals then intercepted

Gaurav and attacked him with sticks and clubs, inflicting severe injuries across his body and causing heavy bleeding from his eye. In a critical condition, stepped out, they allegedly confronted Gaurav, hurling verbal abuse and behaving aggressively. Sensing the situation escalating, Gaurav moved away to ensure his safety. Trump to wrap G7 summit facing skepticism at home and jitters overseas over his plan to end Iran war

U.S. President Donald Trump wraps up talks with world leaders at the Group of Seven summit on Wednesday where he's been trying to sell his tentative agreement with Iran as a pact that will ensure the Islamic Republic never develops a nuclear weapon — even though he's offered scant specificity about how that would be implemented. Trump and his fellow leaders are closing the formal talks of the leading industrial nations at a lakeside resort in the French Alps on Wednesday with sessions on the future of artificial intelligence and fostering economic growth.

The U.S. leader also plans to make a stop for a glitzy dinner at the Palace of Versailles outside of Paris before he jets back to Washington. But first, Trump finds himself trying to quell skepticism about the Iran agreement, a difficult task given that neither the White House nor Iran have released the text of the deal. He also faces jitteriness from key ally Israel about ending the conflict under these terms. "It's a great document," Trump said of the memorandum that has yet to be revealed, even though U.S. and Iranian officials are set to formally sign it at a ceremony on Friday at a stunning resort on Switzerland's Lake Lucerne. "Here's what it says: Iran will never have a nuclear weapon. It won't have one to buy, to develop — it will not have a nuclear weapon. And I would say that's about 99.9% of what I wanted," he said. But Trump will continue to have to do a sales job. Some members of his own party are doubtful that the deal he's agreed to is strong enough to defang Iran's nuclear program. At the same time, he faces an anxious international community looking for him to follow through on his promise that the deal will reopen the Strait of Hormuz to oil tanker traffic, and keep it open.

Society needs 'new social norms' in the age of AI: Nvidia's Jensen Huang

Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang — whose work helped propel artificial intelligence — stressed in an Associated Press interview Tuesday that society needs to change with the advent of AI, arguing that a fuller embrace of the technology would improve people's lives.

Huang has been optimistic about AI's potential to rapidly transform society, creating faster economic growth and more scientific breakthroughs. But as the head of a computer chip company now developing AI systems, he and others are confronting a public increasingly concerned about the potential harm the technology might bring. Huang has felt obligated to respond to critics who warn of job losses and threats to humanity itself. "We need to create new social norms," Huang said in an interview. "I would advocate that everybody use AI. Just go engage it." Huang made his case as AI has emerged as a political flashpoint, with objections to plans to build more data centers and fears that the speed with which it's being adopted could spur the layoffs of workers who might not have a safety net. Such questions have threatened public support of the technology at a time when a race has kicked off with China, a contest Huang believes can best be won by a U.S. that is open to competing globally in AI.

His close relationship with President Donald Trump also has been a source of criticism among Democrats, even as he emphasized that the computing power created by AI is vital to adding the factory jobs that have been promised for decades without much enduring success. It was an argument delivered by a 63-year-old man who has watched the technology develop and described himself as "boring" because his own life revolves mainly around work and his family.

US To Give Iran \$300 Billion "Reconstruction Fund"? What JD Vance Said

US Vice President JD Vance has shut down reports claiming the United States is giving \$300 billion to Iran as part of a reconstruction fund under their interim trade deal. Vance said that, instead, Washington plans to allow other countries to invest in Iran if it adheres to the terms of the US-Iran deal. The clarification came as reports claimed that Iran could have access to a \$300 billion reconstruction fund as part of the peace agreement brokered by President Donald Trump's administration. When confronted about the fund by Megyn Kelly on "The Megyn Kelly Show", Vance explained that under the deal, if Iran adheres to the terms of the deal, it will lift sanctions on the Islamic Republic to encourage investment in the country, enabling cash flow. "Let's say, for example, that the United Arab Emirates, who's been one of the best allies that we've had in the region. Let's say that they want to invest in a nuclear power plant in Iran. They really can't do that without us lifting some of the sanctions that exist in the global financial system to make that possible," Vance said. "Now, are the Emiratis going to invest in Iran, or is America going to let the Emiratis invest in Iran? Unless the Iranians change their behaviour? No. So all these people say, "Well, you know, you're giving Iran money." No, no, no. We're saying that if the Iranians change their behaviour, we're going to let some of these other countries invest in rebuilding their country and creating some prosperity for their people," he added.

The \$300 Billion Investment Fund

Earlier, news agency Reuters reported that a \$300 billion private fund designed to trigger investment into Iran is outlined in the US-Iran framework agreement. Citing a source with direct knowledge of the deal, the report also claimed that more than half that sum has already been committed. The fund is designed to give both sides an economic incentive to conclude a final deal, a source told the agency on condition of anonymity because the plan has not yet been announced.

Iranian tankers exit US blockade zone in Strait of Hormuz after two-month standoff

The first tankers carrying Iranian oil exited a US blockade in the Strait of Hormuz, a tracking website said on Wednesday, two days before Washington and Tehran launch talks on an agreed peace deal still scant on details, including Iran's nuclear programme and the lifting of sanctions. The talks on a final settlement are set to begin Friday at Switzerland's Burgenstock mountain resort, as news that the Hormuz Strait will reopen sent world oil prices tumbling. Optimism that the war triggered by the February 28 US-Israeli strikes on Tehran might be coming to an end was dented, however, by fresh Israeli strikes on south Lebanon.

The TankerTrackers website, which monitors oil shipments and storage, marked Iran's "first crude oil exports in two months", citing digital tracking data corroborated by satellite imagery. "At least two National Iranian Tanker Company (NITC) VLCC supertankers named DIONA (9569695) and HERO2 (9362073) have exited the US Navy blockade perimeter carrying a combined

total of 3.8 million barrels of Iranian crude oil between them," TankerTrackers said on X, later adding that a third tanker had exited. Negotiations over a final deal are to start immediately after the Swiss signing ceremony and continue during a 60-day window, leading to decisions on the fate of Iran's nuclear programme and a plan for the lifting of international economic sanctions, officials said. The United States will allow Iran to immediately begin selling oil and fuel under the deal to end the war, the Wall Street Journal reported on Tuesday, citing unnamed people familiar with the agreement. A waiver of sanctions on oil sales will take effect immediately after the signing, the Journal added, also covering services such as banking, transportation and insurance. Some conservatives have expressed concern over the peace deal, with Senate Republicans reportedly requesting the text of the agreement and briefings from the Trump administration. "Let's look at it and see what it actually is," Senate Majority Leader John Thune was quoted as saying in

the Journal. Oil prices tumble despite the deal announcement, the Israeli military said it conducted a strike in south Lebanon after it "identified a suspicious vehicle" near where



its soldiers were operating, and its forces intercepted rockets and carried out an air strike against a launcher. Iran's central military command warned Israel should "await a harsh response" to the strikes, which Lebanon's state news agency said targeted two vehicles in the town of Mayfadoun and another in nearby Shukeen, killing four. According to a senior US

official, speaking on condition of anonymity, the framework agreement has already been signed electronically by President Donald Trump, Vice President JD Vance, Iran's deputy foreign minister Majid Takht-Ravanchi and top negotiator Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf.

"Likely on Friday... a new round of negotiations between Iran and the United States to reach a final agreement will begin," Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said. "In the final agreement, decisions will be made on the nuclear issues and the lifting of sanctions." Optimism over the reopening of Hormuz has sent the price of the international benchmark Brent North Sea crude down to \$78.74 a barrel in Wednesday trading. The main US oil contract, West Texas Intermediate, was \$75.85 a barrel. Broken commitments weeks of indirect negotiations mediated by Pakistan and Qatar have built momentum for an interim deal, but a comprehensive agreement on Iran's nuclear ambitions and Western sanctions remains elusive.

The suspect in a fatal shooting Tuesday inside a Delaware hospital has been taken into custody in Philadelphia, officials said. The 23-year-old man is expected to be charged in the shooting at Wilmington Hospital and extradited to Delaware, the city of Wilmington said in a statement. Officials have declined to release information about the identities of the victims or the condition of a person who was shot and survived. The

city said the shooting is believed to have been targeted and isolated. ChristianaCare, which operates the hospital, said in an emailed statement it had diverted patients from its emergency department and was "taking all appropriate steps to ensure the safety of our patients, caregivers and visitors." A lockdown at the hospital had been lifted by Tuesday night. At the news conference, Wilmington Mayor John Carney acknowledged the victims

and hospital workers who hid as law enforcement went from room to room, clearing the building. If ever there is a place that should be a sanctuary for such violence, that is the place," Carney said.

Kristen Lackford was recovering from feeding tube surgery when her hospital room door was suddenly kicked open by law enforcement with large guns and helmets, she said. Lackford said it was scary watching the team search under her bed and in her bathroom before marking her door with a large letter "C" and never explaining why they were there. When she finally learned what had happened and that the shooter could still be in the building, Lackford said she felt like "a sitting duck." "There was absolutely nothing that I could do to make myself feel safe," she said. Violence has been a persistent problem at hospitals across the U.S. Wilmington, which has about 71,000 residents and is Delaware's largest city, is about 25 miles (40 km) south of Philadelphia.

Germany and Poland to sign a new defense deal as balance of power in Europe shifts

Germany and Poland were set to sign a new defense agreement Wednesday, putting aside their complicated past to strengthen European military cooperation at a time of heightened tension with Russia and growing uncertainty over U.S. engagement in Europe. Relations between the two neighbors in recent years have become more pragmatic in the wake of Russia's full-scale war on Ukraine in 2022 and the coming to power of a liberal government in Poland in 2023.

As the U.S. weighs a partial drawdown of its military presence in Europe, Poland is keen to ensure that major European allies take a greater role in defending the continent's eastern flank. Germany is seeking partners as it moves to revitalize its military, the Bundeswehr, after decades of neglect with ambitions to build the strongest conventional army on NATO's

European side — an effort that will make it a central pillar of European defense in the years ahead. Poland's importance as a logistics hub for



Ukraine, alongside its growing economy and heavy defense investment, has made it a compelling partner for Germany and other core European countries. "We Germans need a strong Poland as an equal partner," German Chancellor Friedrich Merz said in

Berlin after meeting with liberal Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk in December. "This is in our fundamental interest." Germany has a key role in securing Europe's eastern borders

The defense agreement is set to include plans for protecting the Baltic Sea region and details about cooperation on military mobility and infrastructure, cyber defense and new technologies.

The two countries are irreversibly tied by NATO's defense plans, which give Germany a key role in the defense of the Baltic region, together with Poland and other countries in the central and eastern European region, said Justyna Gotkowska, deputy director of the Warsaw-based think tank Center for Eastern Studies. "Germany is largely responsible for the defense of the Baltic states and without cooperation with Poland, that will not happen," Gotkowska said.

Elon Musk's AI tool Grok was used in strikes against Iran: US government

Elon Musk's artificial intelligence tool Grok was used in strikes against Iran, the United States government revealed in a legal briefing seen Tuesday by AFP.

The June 15 brief defends the gas turbines used by a giant data center belonging to the trillionaire's company xAI, which are the target of an environmental lawsuit.

In the brief, the US Department of Justice argued that the lawsuit "threatens American national, economic, and energy security by seeking to shut off the power supply for artificial intelligence innovation that supports the Department of War's military operations."

To support the argument, federal prosecutors presented testimony from Pentagon AI chief Cameron Stanley in which he states, under oath, that Grok is already in use within Project Maven, the US military's AI-assisted targeting program that was initially powered by Anthropic's Claude model. The project's Maven Smart Systems (MSS) "enabled US forces to deploy over 2,000 munitions to 2,000 distinct targets within 96 hours during Operation Epic Fury," Stanley's statement said.

Stanley praised Musk's technology and "the greatly increased operational efficiency made possible by the Grok Gov Model." The NAACP, a civil rights



organization defending Black Americans' rights, is suing xAI and accusing it of operating dozens of turbines without permits in violation of the Clean Air Act.

The rights group says they pollute majority Black neighborhoods, but xAI says the turbines are temporary and mobile, and therefore not subject to regulation.

At the end of February, the government terminated its contracts with Anthropic after it refused to allow its tools to be used for fully automated strikes or the mass surveillance of Americans. The Pentagon then turned to Anthropic's competitors, like Google, OpenAI and xAI, to continue its pursuit of AI. At Google, more than 600 employees demanded the company not provide AI to the military for classified operations. Others have raised broad concerns about AI's threats. The US military's transition to AI is taking time, and in March the government had to acknowledge that Claude was still being used for the war in Iran.

South Korea president urges Trump to help make peace with North Korea

Trump asked Lee about developments in inter-Korean relations during an exchange at the G7 summit in France, Seoul's presidential office said in a statement Wednesday.

South Korea's president has urged US President Donald Trump to help him make peace with North Korea, "just as he has resolved the conflict in the Middle East", Lee Jae Myung's office said on Wednesday. The United States and Iran are set to sign a memorandum of understanding on Friday to end their war, and there has been speculation that the Trump administration may then turn

its attention to North Korea. Trump fuelled that interest shortly after announcing the Iran deal, posting on social media an uncaptioned photograph of himself with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un at their 2018 Singapore summit. Trump asked Lee about developments in inter-Korean relations during an exchange at the G7 summit in France, Seoul's presidential office said in a statement Wednesday. During the conversation, "President Lee requested that he (Trump) take the lead in achieving a peaceful resolution to the North Korean issue, just as he has resolved the conflict in the Middle East", it added.

"President Trump expressed his commitment to working toward a resolution of the North Korean issue." Lee has taken a dovish approach towards North Korea, in contrast to his more hardline



predecessor Yoon Suk Yeol. But Pyongyang has rejected his overtures, formally labelling Seoul its "most hostile" enemy and repeatedly declaring itself an "irreversible"

nuclear state. North Korea experts say the chances of a meeting between Kim and Trump is low.

"From North Korea's perspective, there is virtually no reason to meet the United States," Yang Moo-jin, former president of the University of North Korean Studies in Seoul, told AFP. Kim has sought to enhance his standing with his other neighbours, for example sending troops and munitions to aid Russia's war against Ukraine.

He also recently hosted China's President Xi Jinping in Pyongyang, soon after Xi had held back-to-back summits in Beijing with Trump and Russia's Vladimir Putin. Neither Pyongyang's nor Beijing's official statements mentioned the issue of getting North Korea to give up its nuclear weapons, an outcome that experts said indicated China's tacit acceptance of them.

Wadhwan city to get bird atlas, first in Saurashtra region & second in Gujarat

After Ahmedabad, Wadhwan in Surendranagar district is all set to get its bird atlas. A group of birders from Gujarat and other parts of the country, last week, completed the summer phase of The Wadhwan City Bird Atlas (WCBA) project to study the diversity, distribution, abundance and mobility pattern of birds in the 44 square kilometre area of the city which is known for its rich avian diversity. The first-of-its-kind project for the Saurashtra region is a joint long-term, not-for-profit, volunteer-driven initiative to study the birds of Wadhwan. The project is being initiated and executed by the Collective Systems Lab for Animal Behaviour (CoLAB) and Ecology, Evolution, and Climate Change Research Cluster at Ahmedabad University, in collaboration with the Bird Conservation Society, Gujarat (BCSG), Gujarat Forest Department, Bird Count India, eBird India and Surendranagar Municipal Corporation. One of the lead organisers of the initiative and an ornithologist at Ahmedabad University Devvratsinh Mori said that once completed, this will be the first bird atlas of Saurashtra region and second for Gujarat. Mori is also a member of the Gujarat State Board for Wildlife (GSBW) headed by Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel. Speaking about the project, Mori, who belongs to Wadhwan city, said, "I already have good data of avian diversity of Wadhwan and the surrounding periphery. The presence of 259 bird species is recorded in Wadhwan which is around 42% of the total 621 bird species found in Gujarat.

FIR fears, academic disruption: Unaided schools challenge BLO duty orders for SIR exercise in Bombay HC

Private unaided schools and their teachers have approached the Bombay High Court challenging show-cause notices issued by the Election Commission for not reporting for duty as Booth Level Officers (BLOs) as part of the third phase of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise of the voter list, with the publication of the final electoral roll scheduled for October 7. The petitioners claimed that BLO duties are primarily restricted to government and semi-government employees. They further contended that such duties "adversely affect the functioning of the schools, education of the students, and teachers' obligations towards the school."

They also apprehended "serious coercive steps" through FIRs, as lodged in other cases in the city. The election authorities orally assured the court that nothing would be done at their instance until the matter is heard next. Earlier this month, at least three FIRs were registered by Mumbai Police against several teachers belonging to aided schools under Section 32 (breach of official duty related to preparation of electoral rolls) of the Representation of the People Act (RPA) and Section 223 (disobedience to order by a public servant) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) for failing to report for BLO duties.

'Respond to calls on official numbers, keep phones active all the time': DGP to on-field officials

"If a call cannot be attended, public representatives, mediapersons, and members of the public should be given a callback at the earliest so that public relations and communication remain effective," he said.

Lucknow.(Agency)

Amid regular complaints that police officers do not respond to calls on their official numbers, Uttar Pradesh Director General of Police (DGP) Rajeev Krishna directed that all on-field officials should keep such phones active all the time and ensure calls made on these numbers are attended.

The DGP said this while chairing a crime review meeting at the police headquarters in Lucknow. The meeting was attended by additional directors general (ADGs) of zones, inspector general (IGs), DIGs of ranges, commissioners, senior superintendents of police (SSPs), SPs, ASPs and DSPs through video conferencing.

"If a call cannot be attended, public representatives, mediapersons, and members of the public should be given a callback at the earliest so that public relations and communication remain effective," he said. A detailed review was conducted on the effective use of E-Sakshya (evidence), increase

in the number of e-summons, disposal of IGRS cases, campaign for quality and speedy disposal of pending investigations, action taken under the Yaksh App, interaction with public



representatives and media, the Zero Fatality District (ZFD) campaign and other law-and-order-related subjects.

The DGP said full implementation of the new criminal laws has to be ensured from January 2028, after which E-Sakshya (electronic

evidence) will become completely mandatory along with conventional evidence. "Therefore, it is necessary to motivate and train all police officers and investigating officers to collect adequate and quality electronic evidence," he added.

The DGP directed the circle officers to thoroughly understand the functioning and technical aspects of the monitoring dashboard and ensure its effective implementation in police stations under their jurisdiction so that continuous improvement in the quality of E-Sakshya collection can be made. It was claimed that the overall percentage of e-summons in the state has increased to 28%. If a criminal commits an offence outside his native area, the monitoring and verification carried out by his native district should also be reviewed through the Yaksh App, and accountability should be fixed wherever necessary, he said.

Vande Bharat, public buses and car pooling: Gujarat takes austerity steps for annual school enrolment drive

The Gujarat government has issued a directive asking officials to use public transport including Vande Bharat train service, state transport buses and car pooling for travelling as part of its annual school enrolment drive—Shala Praveshotsav and Kanya Kelavani — to be organised between June 23 and 25.

The 24th edition of Shala Praveshotsav and Kanya Kelavani, to be organised simultaneously in rural and urban areas across Balvatikas, government and grant-in aid primary, secondary and higher secondary schools, Gyan Shakti residential schools and Raksha Shakti residential schools, is focussed on tracking and enrolling 6.41 lakh drop-out students from Class 1 to X in the state in the 2025-26 academic year.

As a part of the enrolment drive, Cabinet Ministers, IAS, IPS and IFS officers, local administrators, elected members and nearly 2

lakh government teachers fan out across the state ensuring children are enrolled to government schools.

"In view of the current global circumstances, it



is requested to use Vande Bharat trains in the districts where the services are available and public transport system in other districts as far as possible," the circular issued by the education department to all the additional chief

secretaries, principal secretaries and secretaries across departments stated.

"The officials going to the same district will be able to use car pooling. The arrangements for car pooling will have to be made by the respective departments. When the officials reach the allotted district, the District Collector, District Development Officer or the Commissioner will make arrangements for transportation and other ancillary matters as per the allotted route," the directive read.

Kanya Kelavani Mahotsav and Shala Praveshotsav was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2003-04 when he was the Chief Minister of Gujarat. 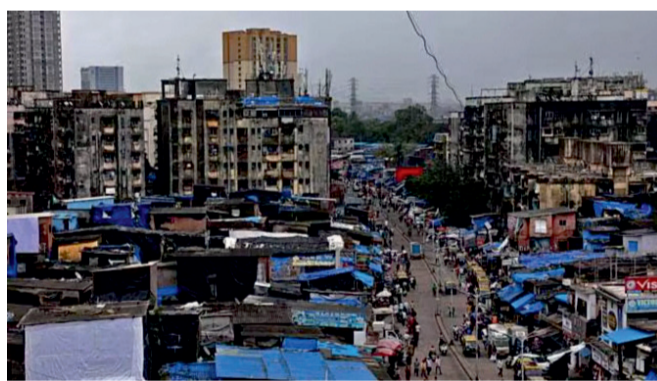

A 65-year-old man died during treatment after the accident near Press Square, where an electric car hit pedestrians and vehicles before crashing into a tree.

BHUBANESWAR: The shocking car crash claimed its third victim after a 65-year-old injured man succumbed during treatment at AIIMS-Bhubaneswar even as police arrested the EV driver on Tuesday.

The deceased was identified as Laxmidhar Toppo. Jeyrom Ekka (55), husband of an IAS officer, and Santosh Behera (55) of New Government Colony had died on the spot in the accident that occurred at 8 pm on Monday.

The other injured, Sankarlal Sharma (50) from Unit-III and Sulagna Dey (26) from Acharya Vihar, are undergoing treatment, while Subrat Mishra (35) from Shri Vihar in Patia was discharged after necessary medical care. Sharma's condition, however, is stated to be critical. Meanwhile, police arrested driver of the car Anil Kumar Gouda and produced him before a court. Police said Gouda worked as a driver for a coal transport businessman. As per initial investigation, he was found driving recklessly near

Press Square, leading to the deadly road accident. Eyewitnesses had claimed that the electric car flew a few feet into air after hitting the speed breaker, following which the driver lost control. It then hit the pedestrians standing in front of a tea stall near the New Government Colony. The car also rammed into parked motorcycles and an autorickshaw and came to a halt only after hitting a tree. Four vehicles including the car Gouda was driving have been seized by police.

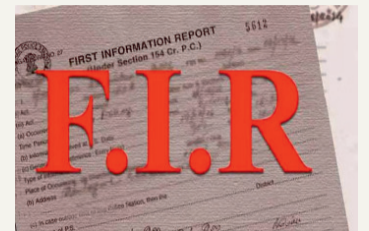


File FIRs immediately in Karnataka sextortion cases: DG&IGP

Director General & Inspector General of Police (DG & IGP) MA Saleem has issued standing instructions to all police stations across Karnataka to register FIRs immediately in complaints involving non-consensual dissemination of private or intimate images/videos, including cases commonly known as "revenge pornography," "sextortion," or blackmail through intimate content.

In the circular issued on Tuesday, Saleem mentioned that it has come to the notice of the authorities that, in some cases, police stations are either refusing to register complaints or



delaying the registration of complaints related to the publication or circulation of private/intimate photographs and videos without the consent of the person concerned. In certain instances, complaints have been rejected on the ground that the victim had initially consented to the recording of the images or videos.

The following directions have been issued: Legal position on consent: All cops must note that consent to recording is not the same as consent to publication or sharing. No refusal based on prior consent: Police shall not refuse or delay registration of FIRs merely because the victim had previously consented to the recording of the images or videos.

Blackmail and sextortion: Where intimate content is used to extort money, sexual favours, or any other benefit, relevant provisions relating to extortion and criminal intimidation under the BNS, 2023, in addition to the IT Act, should be invoked.

Abandoned vehicles in front of Chennai school turn tiptplers' den

For students at the government aided school on 86th street at the backside of Mathias church in Ashok Nagar, the day begins with an unpleasant ritual: covering their nose to escape the overpowering stench of alcohol and urine outside the campus.

The school authorities say a stretch of parked and abandoned vehicles outside the campus has become a haven for drunkards, creating hygiene and safety concerns for nearly 2,500 students, and the staff across four educational institutions and a convent inside the school compound.

According to the school administration, men consume liquor outside the campus, using the parked vehicles as cover, and urinate and defecate in the area.

Speaking to , headmistress Sister Shanthi Amalora P of the school said every morning scores of empty liquor bottles will be strewn both inside and outside the campus. Last year, the school had to keep classroom windows of its primary school shut to prevent foul smell from entering, forcing students to sit in poorly ventilated rooms.

"As the sisters stay in the convent on the campus, they also have to endure sleepless nights due to late-night drinking sessions, birthday celebrations and the use of foul language," she said, adding though repeated complaints have been raised, the authorities are yet to take a permanent solution. The headmistress further said the line up of parked vehicles is often secluded and that some of the covered vehicles have remained parked there for more than a decade.

It's 43°C in Delhi-NCR, and the mind turns to holiday encounters as a diversion. I remember a chatty pavement bookseller I met in Bali. "I think democracy is rubbish," declared the spike-haired, sharp-eyed young man without a preamble. "Oh God," I muttered distractedly, looking to choose a secondhand book for holiday reading, since I'd already raced through the ones I'd brought along. "Talk to me!" he said, pulling out a plastic chair and offering me a clove-scented 'Sampoorna' cigarette that I politely declined, which he then lit for himself. "Do you have an attention problem?" I said mildly. "Please talk to the Australian tourists, I'd just like to buy a book." "Talk to me!" he insisted. "You're from India, aren't you? I don't meet many Indians. What do you think about democracy? What do you think about God? I'm Muslim, what are you?" Clearly there was no escape except to leave, and I so wanted to look at the books. I extracted a yet-unread Joanna Trollope title lurking between the best-sellers and was pleased to spot Vikram Seth, Amitav Ghosh and, God bless us all, Malgudi Days. Also, something promisingly titled, The Revenge of the Middle-aged Woman, except that I wasn't interested. Not when I'd gone snorkelling, explored Borobudur, scampered up and down green Indonesian hillsides and cooled off in boulder-strewn rivers that looked like our Betwa and Shipra. "I'm from Sumatra," he announced, which got my attention because of Rajendra Chola's navy going there to school King Vijayatunga, who was harassing the Chettians in their China trade. So I set the book aside, sat down, and really looked at him. "Why do you have a long, straight nose?" he demanded. "Why is mine flat?" "I don't know those answers," I said. "Why do you think of democracy badly?" "Does it make life better for the poor?" he said belligerently, but I was not in the mood to argue. "Why do you want to know my religion?" I asked in return. "Everybody is fighting about religion. What do you think?" he said. "I think it's stupid to fight," I replied. "I'm sure God doesn't approve of it." He shot me a keen look. "And you're Hindu?" he asked. "Yes. Do you think Almighty God dislikes me for a different way of praying?" I laughed. "Certainly not!" he exclaimed and I rose to leave. "Twenty thousand rupiah only," he grinned (around ₹100), handing back The Best of Friends by Joanna Trollope with a flourish. "Suksma," I said, Balinese for "thank you". "Om Swasti Astu," he said, palms together, meaning "May God keep you well", which is actually the Balinese greeting, not goodbye, and we parted cordially in a haze of clove that rang with shared ancestral echoes. I got another jolt of awareness about ambivalence in faith while holidaying in Goa. Strolling around Mapusa, I passed a church dedicated to the Madonna and was told she was a 'miracle lady', as Hindus speak of Kanchi Kamakshi. But in the next breath, my local informant spoke disparagingly of some religious practices as 'superstition'. A memory kicked in of someone else's words, from Shakespeare's 'Henry IV', Part One, Act Three, Scene One: Hotspur: "I cannot choose/sometimes he angers me,/With telling me of the mould warp and the ant./Of the dreamer Merlin and his prophecies./And of a dragon and a finless fish./A clip-wing'd griffin and a moulten raven,/A couching lion and a ramping cat,/And such a deal of skumble-skamble stuff/As puts me from my faith." And by and by, the counterargument goes like this: Mortimer: "In faith, he is a worthy gentleman/Exceedingly well read and profited/In strange concealments, valiant as a lion/And as wondrous affable and as bountiful /As the mines of India." Don't these medieval words put it rather well that even if beliefs differ, it's character that counts? Moreover, cultural adherence coded by centuries is hard to eliminate and why should we, when there are many inspiring stories to learn from? Of course, we have to understand them first.

Failed saga of India-Pak talks

It would be wise for Delhi to stay the course rather than try to go down the same rabbit hole all over again

ON June 10, 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi hosted the delegations that had travelled around the world in the wake of the May 7-10 hostilities between India and Pakistan. Their brief was to expose Pakistan's five-and-a-half-decade-old proxy war against India. These multi-party and cross-disciplinary delegations that rose above the partisan political divide underscored a rare politico-strategic national consensus. It was a unique one-off moment in an otherwise bitterly contested political landscape. Their very composition underlined the spirit of the unanimous parliamentary resolutions of February 22, 1994, and March 15, 2013, that described Pakistan as a sponsor of terrorism. These missions had carried a three-point message for their global interlocutors regarding Pakistan — terror and talks cannot go together; blood and water cannot flow together; and India will not make a distinction between terrorists and their state sponsors. This consensus echoed in the parliamentary debate during the Monsoon Session of 2025. Eleven months later, a senior functionary of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), the ideological mentor of the BJP, gave a rather perplexing statement in an interview to a wire service. Dattatreya Hosabale said, "If Pakistan is like a pinprick trying to create incidents like Pulwama, we have to answer appropriately according to the situation because the security and self-respect of a country have to be protected, and the government of the day should take note of it and take care of it... But at the same time, we should not close the doors. We should always be ready to engage in dialogue. That is why diplomatic relations are maintained, trade and commerce continue, and visas are being given. So we should not stop these, because there should always be a window for dialogue... This is the one hope I think, because I believe strongly that ultimately the civil society relations [will work]. Because we have a cultural relation and we have been one nation." On the face of it, Hosabale's averment was a reasonable and fair articulation, but why it is unworkable in the case of Pakistan needs to be both understood and explained. It's the military, not any democratic dispensation and least of all civil society, that calls the shots in Pakistan. That nation does not have a military; conversely, it is a military that has a nation. This has been the case from Field Marshal Ayub Khan to Field Marshal Asim Munir over the past seven decades. The Pakistani military has an institutional obsession with retribution against India for having created Bangladesh. In the aftermath of

Pakistan's dismemberment, Zulfikar Ali Bhutto convened a conference in Multan on January 24, 1972. Two seminal decisions were taken. The first was to acquire nuclear weapons to safeguard what remained of the rump of a moth-eaten Pakistan, and the second to bleed India with a thousand cuts.

It was the second conclusion that led to 15 years of terrorism in Punjab from 1980 to 1995. This campaign of terror was upscaled to Jammu & Kashmir and the rest of India from 1989 onwards.

The Mumbai bombings (1993), the Kargil War and IC-



814 hijacking (1999), J&K Assembly attack and an assault on the Indian Parliament (2001), 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks (2008), the strikes on the Uri Army camp and the Pathankot airbase (2016), Pulwama suicide bombing (2019) and the Pahalgam massacre (2025) are just some of the milestones of this bloody journey that commenced five-and-a-half decades ago.

Concurrently, India tried its best to engage with Pakistan over the years. In the phase beginning with the Gujral Doctrine conceptualised in 1996 and underpinned by its five principles to the Composite Dialogue (1997 to 2008), the Resumed Dialogue (2011-14) and the Comprehensive Bilateral Dialogue (2015 onwards). However, each effort and every initiative was derailed by a major terror attack perpetrated by Pakistan-based/trained terrorists. Then there were three backchannels established at the level of the Indian Prime Minister and Pakistan's military dictator or Army Chief, who was represented by his civilian proxies for over a decade and a half. It commenced with the RK Mishra-

Niaz Naik conversations in 1998-99 that were interrupted by the Kargil War. The threads were picked up by then NSA Brajesh Mishra and his Pakistani counterpart after the winding down of Operation Parakram between November 2002 and May 2004. This was followed by talks between former Ambassador Satinder Lambah and his Pakistani counterparts Tariq Aziz (2005-08), Riaz Mohammad Khan (2009-12) and Sharyar Khan (2013-14). Subsequently, there have been conversations between the respective NSAs that reportedly led to the ceasefire agreement of February 25, 2021. There is the DGMOs' hotline that is supposed to be activated every Tuesday. Then there was Aman Ki Asha and Track 1.5, 2, 3 and 4 conferences on establishing civil society interfaces, music and culture exchanges, tourism and religious pilgrimage initiatives, parliamentary and media confabulations, to list a few.

Unfortunately, nothing worked. Despite all these efforts, the spectre of Pakistan-sponsored terror continues to haunt the Indo-Pak dynamic. The question that India needs to answer is: what does it want from Pakistan? The answer is nothing except the cessation of state-sponsored terror. An exceptional politico-strategic consensus today exists in India vis-a-vis Pakistan. It would be wise for New Delhi to stay the course rather than try to go down the same rabbit hole all over again, notwithstanding Western prodding and pressure.

These days, Pakistan's duplicity is on full display on its western border. On the one hand, it is playing the role of a broker between the US-Israel and Iran, but on the other, it is relentlessly bombing civilian areas and hospitals in Afghanistan, a fact confirmed by UNAMA (UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan). Paradoxically, the same Taliban who rule Afghanistan today were Pakistan's spearhead as it sought strategic heft on its western front decades after the loss of Bangladesh. In January 2024, Pakistan had carried out retaliatory airstrikes against Iran.

Pakistan has been on a high since May 2025, thanks to its "rediscovery" by the Trump administration. However, the fact remains that Pakistan is structurally a failed state that can implode or go into a meltdown at any time.

The only area where a conversation is perhaps imperative is nuclear security and stability, given the inherently unstable nature of Pakistan's nuclear command-and-control system and hierarchy. This is perhaps the only track worth exploring.

Canal breaches : Faridkot's flooded fields expose deeper flaws

Punjab a long-term strategy that integrates infrastructure modernisation, crop diversification and institutional responsiveness

THE twin canal breaches in Faridkot district, which flooded thousands of acres of farmland at the onset of the paddy transplantation season, are more than an unfortunate accident. They expose the fragility of Punjab's agricultural model and the cost of postponing structural reforms. For affected farmers, the immediate concern is obvious: damaged crops, wasted inputs and fresh financial losses. Seeds, fertilisers, labour and land preparation require significant investment, much of it financed through loans. When fields are inundated overnight, compensation often arrives late and rarely covers the actual losses incurred. The incident also highlights a deeper contradiction in Punjab's water policy. For years, experts have urged farmers to reduce dependence on groundwater by shifting towards canal irrigation. Yet confidence in that transition will erode if the canal network itself proves unreliable. Farmers cannot be expected to alter cultivation practices

without assurance that public infrastructure is dependable. The crisis should also revive the debate on



Punjab's paddy-centric agriculture. Water-intensive rice cultivation, encouraged through assured procurement,

has depleted aquifers and placed enormous pressure on irrigation systems. Diversification into less water-consuming crops has remained confined to policy speeches, with few incentives strong enough to change behaviour on the ground. Another concern is administrative preparedness. Pre-monsoon vulnerability assessments, emergency response protocols and rapid compensation mechanisms should be standard practice in an agrarian state where millions depend on predictable water supply. Preventive governance is invariably cheaper than post-disaster relief. As climate variability increases, isolated failures can quickly become systemic crises. Punjab requires not only repairs to breached canals but also a long-term strategy that integrates infrastructure modernisation, crop diversification and institutional responsiveness. The Faridkot episode is a reminder that agricultural sustainability depends much on sound public policy.

As their core political strategy, the Opposition Parties such as the Congress, Samajwadi Party, TMC, etc., have engaged with the Muslim community around emotional identity politics, with no genuine concern for their real progress, reducing them to a mere vote bank. An example in this case is the madrasa education system in Uttar Pradesh. Trapped in rigid myopic theology and producing generations of students ill-equipped for modern society, no serious effort was ever undertaken by past regimes to reform or equip Muslim boys and girls with contemporary education and skills.

In contrast, the BJP's development centric vision of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas" is committed to uplifting the poor and vulnerable sections, irrespective of religion, caste, or creed. Implementing this vision, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath undertook the sensitive challenge of modernising the madrasa education system through reforms focused on ensuring transparency, quality, and employability, thereby enabling Muslim students to participate meaningfully in the state's progress. From vote-bank to real progress

Opposition parties have pursued appeasement and rigid identity politics in their approach towards Muslims, while sidelining substantive concerns like education, healthcare, poverty alleviation, and employment. Instead of addressing these issues, they have turned to invoking emotional identity debates around the topics of Uniform Civil Code, triple talaq, and the Shah Bano case.

In fact, opposition parties' rule has always been marked by riots and unrest, claiming Muslim lives, such as in Hashimpura, Meerut, Bhagalpur, etc (under Congress rule), exposing the hollowness of their politics. In Uttar Pradesh too, successive regimes before 2017 employed

this approach of keeping Muslims uneducated, isolated and confined within narrow traditions and rigid mindsets. In contrast, BJP ruled states have shown better outcomes for Muslim upliftment, whether addressing the encephalitis crisis through improved hygiene and living standards in UP, raising economic standards for Gujarati Muslims compared to Bengali Muslims, or providing security to all, which helps explain the difference between identity driven appeasement politics and development centred governance.

The madrasa education system became one of the starkest symbols of deliberate neglect of the appeasement ecosystem. Over 12,300 recognised institutions with over 13 lakh students are trapped in rigid theology, inadequate infrastructure, opaque teacher appointments, outdated curricula, often taught with non civic values and separatist tendencies rather than integration with mainstream society. The Supreme Court's rejection of Kamil and Fazil degrees and reports of several madrasas functioning only on paper underscored systemic flaws and irregularities. In the political arena, community reform in education is seldom treated as a pressing priority. However, in line with the Modi government's development agenda, rooted in "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas" and the vision of "Quran in one hand and computer in the other", Yogi Adityanath's administration has moved with courage and determination in overhauling the madrasa education system.

His government has mandated alignment with NCERT and SCERT and made subjects including Mathematics,

Science, English, and Hindi compulsory under the New Education Policy 2020. The Madrasa Modernisation Scheme, which had been largely dormant until 2017, is now operational, and thousands of teachers have been trained under it. Accountability is enforced through audits, scrutiny of foreign funding, and digitalisation of



records and processes. The launch of the Madrasa Portal in 2017 digitalised exams, certification and records, while proposed amendments to the 2004 Act aim to integrate madrasas with national standards under rigorous oversight.

Through sincere efforts to modernise the Madrasa system, Yogi Adityanath's government also seeks to embed constitutional values, broaden horizons, integrate

with the mainstream, and dismantle the shackles of orthodoxy that have long plagued Muslim society in UP. Crucially, these reforms preserve the Islamic core of the education system, reflecting Yogi Adityanath's honesty and genuine statesmanship. Data celebrates achievements

Yogi Adityanath's overhaul represents balanced and effective progress, yielding impressive results. More than 18,000 staff within government-aided madrasas now receive salaries under the Seventh Pay Commission, while infrastructure has been upgraded for over 7,000 madrasas. Chandigarh Administration denies RTI plea seeking basis for Master Plan amendments

Chandigarh. (Agency)

The Chandigarh Administration has declined to disclose details of the proposed amendments to the city's Master Plan, citing provisions of the Right to Information (RTI) Act that exempt disclosure of records related to an ongoing decision-making process. The proposed amendments to the Chandigarh Master Plan 2031 — including a higher Floor Area Ratio (FAR), increased population density, mixed land use, and high-rise development — have come under scrutiny following an RTI application seeking to know the studies and assessments that formed the basis of the proposed changes.

In response to an RTI application filed by city resident Ram Kumar Garg, the Urban Planning Department said the draft amendments had been placed in the public domain for inviting objections and suggestions from residents, but the proposal was still under consideration and had not

attained finality.

"The Draft Amendments in the Chandigarh Master Plan have been placed in the public domain for inviting objections/suggestions from the general public, and the proposal is presently under consideration, and not attained finality from the Competent Authority," the department said in its response dated June 16. The department further said the information sought was exempt from disclosure under Section 8(1)(I) of the RTI Act, 2005, and could be disclosed after the matter is finalised, subject to the provisions of the law.

The response came after Garg sought details relating to the proposed changes in the Master Plan, the key planning document that guides Chandigarh's land use, housing, commercial development, transport infrastructure and future urban growth.

The applicant had sought copies of all

studies, consultant reports, technical assessments, and official records relied upon while preparing the proposed amendments. The request aimed to ascertain whether the



city's infrastructure is equipped to handle the additional burden that may arise from denser development.

Specifically, the RTI application sought utility augmentation, detailed project reports, population impact projections,

carrying-capacity studies, infrastructure impact assessments, traffic studies, utility load assessments and environmental impact assessments related to the proposed amendments. It also sought records indicating whether funds had been earmarked for upgrading civic infrastructure and whether timelines or implementation plans had been prepared before the proposed planning changes are implemented.

In addition, the applicant sought file notings, inter-departmental correspondence, minutes of meetings and records relating to any expert committee constituted to examine or recommend the amendments. Copies of approvals, recommendations, observations and reports relied upon by the administration while framing the amendments were also sought.

The applicant further requested that if any of the studies or assessments sought did not

exist, the administration should state so specifically. An inspection of all relevant files was also sought under the RTI Act.

Officials maintained that since the amendment process is ongoing, disclosure of the information at this stage is barred under the RTI Act. They, however, pointed out that information relating to the draft amendments already available in the public domain can be accessed through the department's website.

The refusal is significant as the proposed amendments, which have attracted criticism from several quarters, could have a bearing on future development patterns in the city. Urban planners, resident welfare associations and other stakeholders have been closely tracking the exercise, with several groups seeking greater transparency regarding the proposed changes and their likely impact on land-use norms and development controls. The RTI application was disposed of by the Urban Planning Department on June 16.

Delhi Police arrest absconding accused in multi-crore Greater Faridabad housing fraud

New Delhi: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of Delhi Police arrested an absconding proclaimed offender allegedly involved in a multi-crore real estate fraud linked to a housing project in Greater Faridabad, officials said on Saturday. According to the police, Shiv Nandan Singh Yadav was arrested on June 12 from Faridabad, Haryana, after sustained surveillance and technical analysis by an EOW team. He had been evading arrest since 2019 and was declared a proclaimed offender by a Delhi court in 2023 in connection with nine criminal cases. The cases stem from separate complaints filed by multiple victims, following which nine FIRs were registered in 2019 on the directions of the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Shahdara District, Karkardooma Courts. Investigators found that the complaints shared a common pattern and involved the same accused persons and company. Police alleged that the accused, operating through M/s GRPL Globe Reality Pvt Ltd., launched a housing project called "Krishan Kunj Township" in Village Tilor Khadar, Greater Faridabad, in 2013. The project was advertised as a well-developed residential township comprising 496 plots spread across approximately 10.26 acres. According to the investigation, prospective buyers were lured through attractive advertisements and assurances regarding the development. However, the company and its directors allegedly misrepresented material facts and did not possess sufficient lawful land required for the proposed township.

NIA arrests key accused in Shambhu DFC blast case; gets 8-day custody

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has made a significant breakthrough in its probe into the explosion on the Dedicated Freight Corridor (DFC) railway track near Shambhu, arresting a key suspect allegedly involved in the conspiracy. The accused, Gurjinder Singh alias Baba Beant, was produced before a special NIA court in Mohali on Tuesday, which remanded him in eight days of police custody for further interrogation.

According to officials, Gurjinder Singh was already lodged in Patiala Jail in connection with another case. The NIA secured his custody through a production warrant and sought 14 days of remand to question him about his alleged role in the railway track blast. After hearing arguments from both sides, the court granted an eight-day remand. Sources said investigators will now examine the accused's alleged links with foreign-based handlers, particularly those operating from Pakistan and Malaysia. The agency is also

probing the larger conspiracy behind the blast, including funding channels, logistical support, procurement of explosives, and the involvement of other associates.

The explosion occurred on the night of April 27 near Shambhu on the DFC railway track. Preliminary investigations suggested that an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) may have detonated while it was being planted on the track, foiling a possible attempt to target railway infrastructure.

The incident claimed the life of Jagroop Singh alias Jupa, a resident of Panjwar village in Tarn Taran district. Investigators believe he was part of the alleged plot and had an active role in the operation. The NIA is now working to identify other individuals linked to the conspiracy and determine how the explosive material was sourced. Investigators are also examining whether a larger network was involved in attempts to damage critical railway infrastructure.



Proposed Gadkhal bypass to ease Kasauli traffic chaos: HC seeks status report

The Himachal Pradesh High Court has taken suo motu cognisance of chronic traffic congestion and the deteriorating condition of the Gadkhal-Kasauli road, directing the state government to submit a detailed status report on the proposed Gadkhal bypass aimed at easing traffic on the busy tourist route.

A Division Bench comprising Chief Justice GS Sandhawalia and Justice Bipin Chander Negi observed that the road linking Gadkhal with the popular hill station of Kasauli has become a major source of inconvenience for tourists and local residents due to persistent traffic jams, particularly during the peak tourist season.

The approximately 3.02-km link road branching off the Kalka-Shimla National Highway-5 towards Kasauli is narrow and

heavily congested. The Lawrence School, Sanawar, is also located along the stretch. Traffic snarls are particularly severe during weekends and summer vacations.



In its order, the court noted that despite recurring bottlenecks, no effective measures appeared to have been taken to address the problem. The Bench said it had been informed about a proposal to construct

an alternate route bypassing the congested stretch and sought details of the progress made so far.

"It has come to the notice of this Court that the stretch from Gadkhal to Kasauli has become a nightmare for tourists and local residents, as there is constant traffic congestion, especially during the tourist season, and no efforts have been made to address the issue," the court observed.

The Bench directed the state government to file instructions on the steps taken towards construction of the proposed bypass. The matter has been listed for further hearing on July 2. Expressing concern over the condition of the road, the court also directed the Secretary, District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Solan, to conduct an on-site inspection of the Gadkhal-Kasauli road as well as the Dharampur-Gadkhal stretch and submit a report before the next hearing.

Head shaved, starved, abused: Maharashtra woman alleges torture over dowry demands

A woman from Kalyan has alleged her husband and in-laws shaved her head, confined her and abused her over dowry demands. Police have booked five relatives and launched an investigation after her hospital admission.

A woman in Maharashtra's Kalyan has accused her husband and in-laws of forcibly shaving her head and subjecting her to months of physical and mental abuse after her family failed to meet alleged dowry demands. The woman, who is undergoing treatment at a hospital in Ulhasnagar, has also alleged that she was assaulted during pregnancy, denied adequate food and burned with hot water. Police have registered a case against five members of her husband's family and launched an investigation.

According to the complaint, Afsana, a resident of Ulhasnagar, married Sameer Ansari, a resident of Kalyan's Waldhuni area, in November 2025. Her family alleged that they had informed the groom's family before the marriage about their financial constraints and inability to provide dowry. Despite this, the woman's relatives claimed that soon after

the wedding, she began facing pressure over demands for money and other items. Afsana alleged that the harassment continued even during her pregnancy. She claimed that she was often denied adequate food and was repeatedly assaulted by her husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law and sister-in-law. She further alleged that hot water was poured on her hands, causing burn injuries. According to the complaint, she was also denied money for basic day-to-day needs.

The woman alleged that on June 7, her in-laws forcibly shaved her head under the pretext that she had lice. She claimed that her husband, mother-in-law, sister-in-law and aunt-in-law were involved in the act. Afterward, she was allegedly confined to a room for nearly a week and subjected to further harassment.

According to the complaint, Afsana eventually managed to escape from her



husband's home and reached her sister's residence, where she informed her family about the alleged abuse. Her relatives then

admitted her to Ulhasnagar's Central Hospital, where she remains under treatment. The victim's brother has appealed

to the Maharashtra government and Chief Minister for intervention and strict action against the accused. The incident has triggered outrage among local residents.

Senior Police Inspector Baliram Pardeshi of Mahatma Phule Police Station said police received information that the woman had been admitted to the hospital, following which a team was sent to record her statement.

"According to the complaint, the husband, mother-in-law, father-in-law, sister-in-law and aunt-in-law had been demanding money and other items since the marriage. On June 7, the woman's hair was cut after she was told it could otherwise cause breathing problems for the child. Following the incident, she became mentally distressed," Pardeshi said. Based on the complaint, police have registered a case under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and further investigation is underway.

Parliamentary panel flags continuing irregularities in NTA exams despite reforms

A parliamentary panel has flagged continuing irregularities in examinations conducted by the NTA. It has asked for a time-bound reform plan as repeated disruptions deepen student anxiety and erode trust.

A Parliamentary Standing Committee headed by Congress leader Digvijaya Singh has expressed concern over continuing irregularities in examinations conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA), despite a series of reforms introduced following the

2024 examination controversy.

In its latest report, the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Education, Women, Children, Youth and Sports noted that disruptions, cancellations and allegations of irregularities in national-level competitive examinations continue to surface, causing anxiety and uncertainty among lakhs of students and their families. The committee said that while the government had initiated corrective measures and accepted several recommendations of the high-level committee chaired by former ISRO chief K. Radhakrishnan, the pace of implementation remained a matter of concern.

CALLS FOR TIME-BOUND REFORM ROADMAP

The panel urged the Ministry of Education



to publicly release a clear and time-bound implementation plan for the recommendations made by the Radhakrishnan Committee. It said

transparent timelines and periodic public disclosures would help build confidence among students and stakeholders regarding the reform process. The committee stressed that the NTA overhaul should be expedited and accompanied by measurable milestones to ensure accountability and effective monitoring.

STUDENT ANXIETY OVER EXAM CANCELLATIONS

The report highlighted that repeated exam disruptions and cancellations have had a significant psychological impact on students preparing for highly competitive entrance tests.

According to the panel, uncertainties surrounding examination schedules and allegations of malpractice have increased stress levels among candidates, making it imperative for authorities to

establish robust and foolproof systems for conducting nationwide examinations.

S E E K S G R E A T E R ACCOUNTABILITY

The committee reiterated the need for stronger safeguards, improved oversight mechanisms and wider stakeholder consultations while implementing examination reforms.

Echoing Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan's earlier observation that the NTA still requires significant improvement, the panel said examination integrity must remain the top priority and called for urgent action to strengthen the agency's functioning. The committee concluded that national competitive examinations require reliable, transparent and foolproof protocols to restore public trust and ensure that students are not adversely affected by administrative lapses or irregularities.

Red Fort blast accused planned network bigger than Indian Mujahideen: Intel

Intelligence agencies unravelling the Red Fort blast on November 10, 2025, have uncovered the accused's plan to establish a nationwide terror outfit aimed to surpass the operational capabilities of the banned Indian Mujahideen, sources said on Tuesday.

Umar Un Nabi, the prime accused in the Delhi blast, was killed in the explosion. These findings have emerged after six months of interrogation, technical analysis and extensive investigations.

In its probe, the NIA has linked the accused in the chargesheet filed before the court with the offshoot of global terrorist outfit al-Qaida. The federal probing agency found that the accused had also made rocket-improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and tested them in the Qazigund forest in J&K's Anantnag district.

These findings are part of a 7,500-page chargesheet filed by the NIA on May 14 in connection with the high-intensity vehicle-borne IED blast that rocked the national capital on November 10 last year. During follow-up investigations, the intelligence agencies have found that the "highly educated accused" were in the process of making armed drones and had planned attacks across the country. "The probe has unravelled a complex structure involving individuals from diverse educational and professional backgrounds, including doctors and engineers," said intelligence sleuths, adding, "The focus appeared to be on sustainability. There were references to recruitment pipelines, ideological indoctrination, fundraising mechanisms and technological capabilities."

The agency said that IM emerged in the early 2000s as one of the country's homegrown terror outfits. It evolved from radical elements associated with the banned SIMI.

Bhatkal module

The Indian Mujahideen came into prominence after a series of bomb blasts across cities between 2005 and 2013. A large number of IM's founding members hailed from the coastal Karnataka town of Bhatkal, which gave rise to the widely used term "Bhatkal module".

Delhi to restore eight Grade I heritage structures following Supreme Court

Delhi agencies will begin a phased restoration and preservation exercise for eight Grade I heritage structures, with conservation work expected to start next month. The Grade I category denotes monuments classified as being of the highest historical importance. The first phase will cover eight heritage structures, including four tombs in Zamrudpur village in south Delhi, the Mahavir Library in Greater Kailash I, a gumbi (small tomb) in Humayunpur village, a tomb in the LSR village area and Maharaja Agrasen Park on Boulevard Road.

The other identified sites included the historic Town Hall building in Chandni Chowk and Company Bagh. These two properties are presently being looked after by the Delhi Tourism and Transportation Development Corporation (DTTDC).

Sources said that a meeting was held on Monday between agencies concerned, including MCD and experts from the School of Planning and Architecture, Jamia Millia Islamia, Indira Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women and the Aga Khan Foundation to discuss the restoration roadmap. The initiative comes after directions from the Supreme Court to restore heritage monuments under the civic body's ownership, they said.

"The MCD does not have an in-house conservation team. Since Grade-I monuments require specialised treatment and cannot be altered, we are taking support from institutions and conservation experts to ensure the structures are restored to their original shape," sources said, adding that the Aga Khan Foundation has already submitted a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for the project.

"Tenders inviting agencies and organisations to participate in the project were issued last week. Agencies with prior experience working on Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) projects will be eligible to undertake the restoration work, sources further said. The challenge in the restoration project is the crowded surroundings and encroachments around these monuments, sources added.

India's defence production hits all-time high of Rs 1.78 lakh crore in 2025-26

India's annual defence production hit an all-time high of Rs 1.78 lakh crore in the 2025-2026 financial year, the defence ministry said on Wednesday. This represents a 15.6 per cent growth over the previous fiscal's output of Rs 1.54 lakh crore and a massive 110 per cent increase since 2020-2021 when the figure was Rs 84,643 crore.

The indigenous defence production has grown nearly four times from Rs 43,746 crore in financial year 2013-2014. Undertakings and other PSUs accounted for approximately 76 per

cent of total production, while the private sector contributed 24 per cent, which is a rise from 22 per cent in fiscal 2024 to 25.



The share of the private sector also hit its all-time high of around Rs 42,000 crore in 2025-2026.

Taking to X, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh credited the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and the "collective efforts" of the Department

of Defence Production and all other stakeholders for the staggering growth in defence production. "This upward trajectory is a clear indicator of the country's expanding defence industrial base. With sustained policy support, several new initiatives, increased private sector participation, and growing export capabilities, the defence production sector is poised for continued acceleration in the years ahead," Rajnath Singh tweeted.

From mine blasts to wins: Behind wheelchair premier league

The journey to the Indian Wheelchair Premier League (IWPL) begins long before the players enter the cricket field. For many of the athletes participating in the tournament, it starts with years of personal challenges, life-changing setbacks and a constant struggle to prove that disability does not define ability. Players competing in the ongoing IWPL in New Delhi, being held from June 14 to 21, come from different parts of the country. Some players were born with disabilities, while others acquired them through illness or accidents. Yet despite their different journeys, many found a common identity through wheelchair cricket.

For 28-year-old Romaisar Wani, captain of the J&K Jaguars, that journey took an unexpected turn after a mine blast near the Line of Control resulted in the amputation of one of his

legs. While the incident changed the course of his life, it did not end his association with sport. Wheelchair cricket eventually provided him with a platform to



continue competing, helping him rebuild confidence and go on to represent India at the international level. Wani is entering his third IWPL season this year, and is regarded as one of the leading names in Indian wheelchair cricket. Stories such as Wani's highlight how wheelchair

cricket has evolved into more than just a sport. For many athletes, it has become a space where they are recognised for their performance rather than their disability.

A very different journey brought 34-year-old Dharamveer Pal. Affected by polio, the captain of the MP Mavericks grew up facing barriers that often restricted access to mainstream sporting opportunities. Through wheelchair cricket, he found a platform and established himself as one of the recognised players. Having represented MP and India at various levels, Pal has become an inspiration for aspiring para-athletes. This year marks his first appearance in the IWPL. Similar determination can be seen in 32-year-old Naresh Ariya, captain of the Rajasthan Rajwade. Affected by polio at a young age, Ariya turned to sport as a way of challenging expectations often associated with disability.

Pre-wedding party, stolen keys, Rs 3 crore theft: Inside Tanishq showroom heist

On the night of June 11, Tanishq showroom employee Nitin Verma threw a party for his colleagues to celebrate his 'upcoming marriage'. The 24-year-old plied the guests with alcohol, especially cashier Gautam Raj, the employee responsible for the showroom keys. Playing the good host, he dropped Gautam off at home and allegedly stole the keys from his bag.

At 7 am the next day, Nitin and an associate used the keys to enter the showroom in Ghaziabad's Kavi Nagar and allegedly made off with jewellery and cash worth more than Rs 3 crore. This, police said, is how Nitin and his associates pulled off the high-profile theft. Police claimed to have cracked the case within days, arresting Nitin; a woman accomplice, Kajal; who police

said was his girlfriend, and his father, Sanjay Verma (52).

The complaint

According to police officers, the theft came to light after a Tanishq showroom representative named Rohit Arora filed a complaint on June 12 alleging that Nitin, Kajal and an unidentified associate had stolen jewellery after gaining access to the premises. A special investigation involving five police teams was launched. Using CCTV footage, local intelligence, and information from informants,

the City Zone SWAT Team and Kavi Nagar Police traced and arrested the trio from the Sai Gate area of Chiranjeev Vihar on June 16.

During questioning, police said Nitin allegedly admitted to masterminding the theft after being tempted by the large



quantity of gold jewellery stored at the showroom. Police said he conspired with his father, Kajal, and two other associates to execute the plan.

"Investigations revealed that on June 11, Nitin hosted a party for showroom staff under the pretext of celebrating his

upcoming marriage. During the gathering, he allegedly ensured that cashier Gautam Raj, who was responsible for the showroom keys, consumed excessive alcohol. Later, while escorting him home, Nitin is accused of stealing the keys from Gautam's bag," DCP Dhawal Jaiswal said.

The theft

The following morning, Nitin and an accomplice identified as Chintu alias Chitranjan used the stolen keys to enter the showroom.

While Chintu kept watch outside, Nitin entered the premises and stole a large quantity of jewellery before they fled, Jaiswal said.

ED raids 11 locations in Rs 155 crore scam linked to AAP Goa leader, others

The agency searched 11 locations linked to Mahesh Timber case, alleging forged trade documents and fraudulent transactions involving bank losses of over 155 crore.

The Enforcement Directorate on Tuesday carried out raids at 11 premises in Karnal, Delhi and Goa linked to Ashok Mittal, Sourabh Dhingra, Bharat Bhushan Mittal, Raman Singhal and others in connection with a Rs 155 crore money laundering probe, the agency said.

The case under PMLA has been registered against Mahesh Timber Pvt Ltd in which Deepak Singla, the Aam Aadmi Party's Goa in-charge, was named as accused. The case is based on an FIR registered by the CBI under the Prevention of



Corruption Act and involves an alleged fraud causing a loss of approximately '155.21 crore to Oriental Bank of Commerce and its consortium banks.

According to the ED, Singla, his brother Raman Singhal and their maternal uncle Ashok Kumar Mittal ran a network of interconnected firms in India and Singapore to execute fraudulent transactions. The total value of Foreign Letters of Credit originally sanctioned for Mahesh Timber was '21.48 crore; investigators allege the amount was fraudulently enhanced to '173.04 crore through forged Bills of Lading, Bills of Entry, contracts and other trade documents submitted to banks.

The federal agency has alleged that no actual import of timber ever took place. The ED told a Panchkula court during Singla's remand proceedings that investigations by the CBI and the Directorate General of Systems and Data Management of the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs had established that a majority of the import documents were fake, forged and fabricated.

The agency has further alleged that a senior OBC branch manager, Surender Kumar Ranga, who has since been terminated, allegedly verbally agreed to enhance the Letters of Credit to an unlimited amount after Mittal allegedly promised to settle him in Singapore.

Kylian Mbappe vows to make history after record-breaking night for France

Kylian Mbappe said he wants to leave a lasting mark on French football after becoming his country's all-time leading goalscorer in France's 3-1 victory over Senegal at the FIFA World Cup 2026. The France captain scored twice in New Jersey, including a stunning stoppage-time strike, to move past Olivier Giroud's long-standing record.

The milestone came on a night when France had to overcome a spirited Senegal side that troubled them for much of the first half. Speaking after the match, Mbappe made it clear that personal records are secondary to his ultimate ambition of helping France win another World Cup. "I play to leave a mark on my country's history and to help my team win the World Cup," Mbappe told reporters. "I don't think we're fully up and running yet. But it's always good to start a tournament with a win. It gives you a bit more peace of mind, even



though you're never really relaxed at a World Cup." Mbappe's brace took him to 58 international goals for France, while also moving him onto 14 World Cup goals overall. The tally sees him move ahead of Lionel Messi and French great Just Fontaine in the tournament's scoring charts and level with Germany legend Gerd Muller, with only Miroslav Klose ahead of him.

HOW DID MBAPPE BREAK THE RECORD?

The record-breaking evening did not begin smoothly for the France captain. Senegal were the brighter side in the opening half and created the better opportunities through Nicolas Jackson and Ismaila Sarr. Jackson struck the post after a rapid counter-attack, while Sarr squandered a golden chance just before the break with the goal at his mercy.

Mbappe, meanwhile, found little joy against Senegal's disciplined defensive setup and was largely kept quiet during the opening 45 minutes.

The game changed after the interval.

Michael Olise unlocked the Senegal defence with a perfectly weighted pass in the 66th minute and Mbappe timed his run brilliantly before finishing beyond Edouard Mendy to break the deadlock.

FIFA World Cup: Thomas Partey loses visa appeal, to miss Ghana opener after Canada entry ban

New Delhi, (Agency)

Ghana will be without midfielder Thomas Partey for their opening match of the 2026 FIFA World Cup after a Canadian federal court upheld a decision denying him entry into the country. Justice Roger Lafreniere rejected Partey's appeal on Tuesday, ending the midfielder's hopes of joining the Black Stars in Toronto for their Group L opener against Panama at BMO Field on Wednesday. The ruling came after Partey's legal team sought emergency relief from a visa refusal that had prevented the former Arsenal player from traveling to Canada with the rest of the Ghana squad. Lafreniere ruled that Partey had failed to demonstrate sufficient grounds for such relief. The Canadian government denied Partey's visa application because of ongoing criminal proceedings in the United Kingdom.



The 32-year-old faces seven charges of rape and one count of sexual assault relating to allegations made by four women between 2020 and 2022. He has pleaded not guilty to all charges, and a trial is scheduled for later this year. During the hearing, Canadian authorities argued that hosting the World Cup did not warrant exemptions to the country's immigration laws and that Partey should not receive special treatment because of his status as a professional footballer. In a statement submitted as part of the appeal, Partey stressed that he remained presumed innocent under the law. "I have not been convicted of any offense. I have pleaded not guilty, and I remain presumed innocent," Partey said. Despite being unable to travel to Canada, Partey has remained with the Ghana squad at their World Cup base in Providence, Rhode Island, where he has taken part in training and preparations. The decision is a setback for Ghana on the eve of their World Cup campaign, with head coach Carlos Queiroz forced to begin the tournament without one of his most experienced players.

Semifinal spot assured, India look to continue winning run against Uruguay in FIH Nations Cup

The Indian women's hockey team, already through to the semifinals, aims to finish unbeaten in the pool stage by defeating lower-ranked Uruguay at the FIH Nations Cup.

A semifinal spot already sealed, a relaxed Indian women's hockey team would look to end the pool engagements undefeated to bolster its confidence against a lower-ranked Uruguay in the FIH Nations Cup here on Thursday. Unbeaten India are atop Pool A with six points from two games and have already qualified for the last four, having defeated USA 3-2 and Japan 2-1 in their first two matches. India are determined to win the FIH Nations Cup to get their place back in next season's elite FIH Pro League, from which they got relegated last year. The Indian women's team was relegated from the elite FIH Pro League to the second-tier FIH



Hockey Nations Cup, following its last-place finish in the 2024-25 season, after managing only 10 points from 16 matches.

The winner of the eight-nation FIH Nations Cup will progress to next year's FIH Pro League. Going into their final pool game against a relatively easy opponent, India

would take heart from their fighting wins in the opening two games. Ranked ninth in the world, the Salima Tete-led India will definitely start as favourites against world no. 17 Uruguay, who have lost both their opening two matches. India scored all their five goals in the two matches through penalty

corners. Deepika is joint second in the goal scorers list with two strikes, while Navneet Kaurn Salima and Lalremsiami found the net once each. But going into the business end of the tournament, India's chief coach Sjoerd Marijne would expect heavy effort from his strikers and would want them to find the net from field efforts and Uruguay provides them the best opportunity to do that. With two important tournaments lined up this year -- World Cup and the Asian Games -- Marijne would also be tempted to try out new combinations in the remaining matches of the FIH Nations Cup, which is part of the team's preparations for the big ticket events.

AC Milan have turned to Ruben Amorim in a bid to revive the club's fortunes, appointing the former Manchester United boss as their new head coach on Tuesday following a disappointing Serie A campaign that ended without Champions League qualification. The Portuguese tactician succeeds Massimiliano Allegri, who was dismissed after Milan could only manage a fifth-place



finish in the league. While the club did not disclose the terms of the agreement, reports in the Italian media suggest the 41-year-old has signed a two-year deal. Milan endured a miserable end to the season, wrapping up their campaign with a 2-1 defeat at home to Cagliari. They won only one of their final four league games, with supporters at San Siro voicing their frustration at the final

whistle as the Rossoneri missed out on Europe's premier club competition for a second straight year. "I know exactly what this club means: history, prestige and an extraordinary fanbase around the world. It is a challenge I embrace with pride and enthusiasm, fully aware of what these colours represent," Amorim said in a statement. "I can't wait to get started and to experience every day the passion that drives AC Milan." Amorim arrives in Italy after an underwhelming 14-month stint at Manchester United. 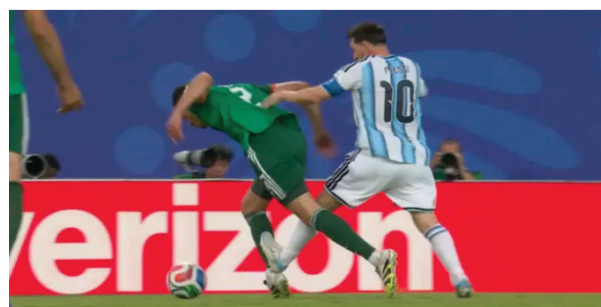

As the LED board flashed the number 10 in the 79th minute at Kansas City Stadium on Wednesday, June 17, the crowd rose to its feet to salute one of the greatest players of all time after a truly iconic performance. But even on a historic night, Lionel Messi couldn't escape controversy. What was meant to be a celebration of another masterclass on the World Cup stage — but instead, much of the post-match discussion centred on a

controversial first-half incident. Argentina ultimately cruised to a 3-0 win over Algeria in their World Cup opener, with Messi scoring a historic hat-trick at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium. The result also marked Argentina's first successful defence of a World Cup title opening match in their history. But the spotlight briefly shifted away from his first goal, when in the 32nd minute Messi was involved in a contentious challenge with Algeria captain Aissa Mandi.

As he attempted to reach a loose ball, Algeria captain Mandi stepped across to block his path. In the ensuing challenge, Messi appeared to catch Mandi on his trailing leg, precisely on the calf from behind, with the defender going down in visible discomfort. The referee, however, opted not to award a foul, and VAR did not intervene. The decision immediately split opinion, both inside the stadium and across social media platforms. Many fans argued the challenge could have been punished more harshly,

suggesting it warranted at least a yellow card. Others went further, debating whether the contact could have been interpreted as dangerous play that might justify a red card



review in a different refereeing context. The incident quickly became one of the most discussed moments of the match online. Comments circulated widely questioning how the challenge went unpunished, while others defended the decision, suggesting it was

incidental contact in a high-speed duel for the ball. The lack of on-field sanction ensured the debate continued well beyond the final whistle. "Messi steps on Mandi's calf, but since it's Messi and Argentina, no sanction against him," one user wrote. Another questioned the decision more directly.

ARGENTINA START TITLE DEFENCE WITH WIN

Despite the controversy, Messi's response was emphatic. The Argentina captain went on to produce one of the defining World Cup performances of his career. He opened the scoring with a brilliant strike from distance after initially having a goal already ruled out for offside. He then struck again after the break, reacting quickest to a loose ball after an attempt was spilled, before completing his hat-trick late in the second half with another trademark finish from outside the area.

Telegram CEO Pavel Durov blames Reliance, WhatsApp for alleged role in bid to ban Telegram in India

New Delhi, (Agency)

Telegram founder and CEO Pavel Durov has alleged that Reliance Group and WhatsApp may be linked to efforts to ban the messaging platform in India, while also accusing an Indian telecom operator of disrupting Telegram access for users outside the country.

In a post on X, Durov claimed that Reliance Communications was responsible for interfering with Telegram's connectivity through a technique known as BGP hijacking. "Indian telecom Reliance is sabotaging access to Telegram for millions of users OUTSIDE India (including the UAE) via a rogue method called BGP hijacking. The sabotage seems intentional, as Reliance has ignored multiple reports.

This may be part of a competitive war, as Reliance is partially owned by Meta, the company behind WhatsApp," Durov said. He further alleged that the same entities could be behind recent moves against Telegram in India. "Such abuse of global Internet routing is alarming. I wouldn't be surprised if Reliance/WhatsApp were also behind the recent lobbying effort to ban Telegram in India," he said.

However, a senior telecom industry source dismissed the allegations as "fake news," saying Durov had confused Reliance Communications (RCOM) with Reliance Industries Ltd's digital arm, Jio.

While Meta holds a minority stake in Jio, the source pointed out that subsea cable operations are managed by Reliance Communications, a separate entity that is not part of Reliance Industries Ltd. "The allegations he is making regarding Meta, however, relate to an entirely different company -- Jio. These are separate entities. Meta is only a minority investor in Jio and has no role in its day-to-day operations or management. Conflating the two demonstrates either a lack of understanding of the sector or a deliberate attempt to spread misinformation," the source said.

TNPCC closes proceedings against Tata Electronics after Hosur facility clears water quality tests

CHENNAI, (Agency)

The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCC) has closed proceedings against Tata Electronics after concluding that its manufacturing facility at Hosur complied with environmental norms and that water quality tests showed no evidence of contamination. The development follows an earlier show-cause notice issued by the pollution watchdog as part of its regulatory oversight of the facility. According to the company, the TNPCC has now dropped further proceedings after reviewing its response and the findings of water sample analyses.

In its assessment, the regulator's tests of water samples collected from the Hosur plant found that key environmental indicators, including Total Dissolved Solids (TDS), Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD) and Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD), were within permissible limits. Tata Electronics said the results did not indicate any contamination. The company added that it had responded promptly to the notice by commissioning an independent assessment through an accredited laboratory. The study also concluded that all measured parameters were within prescribed standards.

Tata Electronics subsequently submitted the findings along with its explanation on compliance with environmental regulations to the TNPCC.

The episode had drawn attention amid heightened scrutiny of environmental practices across large manufacturing projects in Tamil Nadu, particularly as the state seeks to attract substantial investments in electronics and semiconductor-related industries.

The company said it had cooperated fully with the regulator throughout the review process and independently verified its environmental performance. It reiterated its commitment to maintaining compliance with statutory standards through continuous monitoring of its infrastructure, operational processes and environmental safeguards.

Rupee rises 31 paise to 94.29 against US dollar in early trade

MUMBAI, (Agency)

The rupee appreciated 31 paise to 94.29 against the US dollar in early trade on Wednesday as Brent crude oil prices and the US dollar index retreated further from their elevated levels. Forex traders said the rupee opened on a positive note as Brent crude has fallen to near USD 79 per barrel -- a three-month low -- as markets price in the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz following the US-Iran framework. At the interbank foreign exchange market the rupee opened at 94.46, then touched 94.29, registering a gain of 31 paise from its previous close. On Tuesday, the rupee ended 2 paise lower at 94.60 against the US dollar.

In the last three sessions the rupee has recovered 130 paise since the US-Iran deal framework emerged.

"The rupee's bias has shifted. On the upside, 95.00-95.30 is now a strong resistance zone for USDINR.

With expectations of strong foreign capital inflows and USDINR having decisively broken below the 94.80 level, the pair could gradually move towards the 94.93-80 zone in the coming days," CR Forex Advisors MD Amit Pabari said. Pabari further added that the signing of the US-Iran agreement in Geneva on June 19 remains the event to watch. "Until then, the recovery is real but the ground is not yet firm," he said.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading at 0.01 per cent down at 99.52.

Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, was trading lower by 0.37 per cent at USD 78.67 per barrel in futures trade. On the domestic equity market front, Sensex was up 271.61 points to 77,080.09 in opening trade; Nifty advances 55.35 points to 24,044.50. Foreign institutional investors offloaded equities worth Rs 749.18 crore on a net basis on Tuesday, according to exchange data.

India isn't facing a 1991 crisis. But another challenge is taking shape

India has built a formidable forex cushion. But in an increasingly unpredictable world, will that be enough if foreign money starts drying up?

A weaker rupee. Rising oil prices. Volatile foreign capital flows. The combination has prompted some market commentators and social media users to draw parallels with 1991, when India was forced to pledge gold and seek emergency assistance to avert a balance-of-payments crisis.

But India in 2026 is a very different economy. Foreign exchange reserves are hovering around the \$700-billion mark, enough to cover nearly 11 months of imports. Oil prices have eased from recent

highs. Services exports and remittances continue to bring billions of dollars into the country every year. So why are economists still keeping a close eye on foreign capital?

The answer lies in a subtle but important shift in India's economic vulnerabilities. Three decades ago, the concern was whether India had enough dollars. Today, the bigger question is whether enough dollars will continue flowing into the country if global conditions turn adverse.

"The current account deficit at 1.3% of GDP in Q3FY26 is not the problem -- it never really was. The problem is what is financing it," said Nikunj Saraf, CEO of Choice Wealth.

That distinction lies at the heart of India's external-sector debate. Not about dollars, but about the flow of dollars.

Think of India as a household. Every year, the country spends billions of dollars importing crude oil, electronics, machinery, chemicals and gold. To pay

those bills, it needs dollars. Some of those dollars come from exports. Some come from remittances sent home by Indians



working overseas. Others come from foreign investors who bring money into the country. For decades, economists focused on whether India was spending more dollars than it was earning. When a country's dollar spending exceeds its dollar earnings, it runs what economists call a

current account deficit or CAD.

Today, many economists believe the bigger question is not the size of that deficit but how it is financed. Or, as Saraf said, "The problem is what is financing it." In simple terms, India is not struggling because it is running out of dollars. The bigger question is where the replacement dollars are coming from. That is where foreign capital enters the picture. "The capital account is the more fragile variable today," Saraf told India Today Digital. What does that mean?

It means economists are less worried about the dollars India spends and more worried about whether foreign investors will continue bringing dollars into the country.

To understand why, it helps to understand the two main kinds of foreign investment India receives. The first is foreign direct investment, or FDI. This is long-term money. It comes when a foreign company builds a factory, opens a technology centre, sets up a manufacturing unit or buys a stake in an Indian business.

Stock market opens higher for fourth day as Brent crude slips below \$79

Benchmark indices opened higher on Wednesday, extending their winning streak for a fourth straight session as crude oil prices continued to slide following the US-Iran peace agreement, easing concerns over inflation and India's external balances. The S&P BSE Sensex was up 179.03 points, or 0.23%, at 76,987.51 in early trade, while the NSE Nifty50 gained 46.45 points, or 0.19%, to trade at 24,035.60. The Nifty once again remained above the psychologically important 24,000 mark. The rally comes after strong gains over the last three sessions, during which

the Sensex surged 4% and the Nifty climbed 3.6%. The biggest support for markets continues to be the sharp correction in oil prices. Brent crude fell another 0.65% to \$78.45 per barrel,



while WTI crude slipped 0.84% to \$75.41. Brent crude has now fallen about 16% in the last five trading sessions after the preliminary peace deal between the United States and Iran reduced fears of supply disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz. For India, a major importer of crude oil, lower prices are positive as they help reduce inflationary pressures, support the rupee and improve the country's current account position.

Dr VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment

Strategist at Geojit Investments Limited, said the sharp decline in crude prices has removed one of the biggest macro concerns facing the Indian economy. The positive factor is the steady and sharp decline in crude prices. Brent crude has declined steeply by around 16% in the last five days to about \$79, thereby removing the major macro concern of a rising BoP deficit in India," he said.

Among sectoral indices, Nifty IT emerged as the top performer, rising 1.33%. Nifty Media gained 0.57%, Nifty FMCG advanced 0.32%, while Nifty Financial Services added 0.07%.

Metal stocks remained under pressure, with Nifty Metal falling 0.54%. Nifty Realty declined 0.97%, making it the biggest sectoral loser in early trade.

Among Sensex stocks, Trent led the gains with a 3.64% jump. Infosys rose 1.65%, Tech Mahindra gained 1.61%, TCS climbed 1.28%, HCLTech advanced 1.18%, while Eternal added nearly 1%. Hindustan Unileve, Sun Pharma, IndiGo and ICICI Bank were also trading in positive territory.

Air India introduces no-meal economy fare on select domestic routes to attract budget travellers

New Delhi, (Agency)

Air India has introduced a new economy-class fare category on select domestic routes that does not include complimentary meals, marking a shift in its fare structure as the airline looks to cater to cost-conscious travellers and manage increasing operational expenses. The new "Basic" fare is being rolled out on a pilot basis and will be offered alongside the airline's existing Value, Classic and Flex fare categories, all of which continue to include complimentary meals and additional bundled benefits. New option for budget-conscious flyers

According to the airline, the Basic fare has been designed for passengers who prioritise lower ticket prices over additional onboard services. While complimentary meals will not be provided, travellers will still receive a 15 kg checked baggage allowance, a 7 kg

cabin baggage allowance and complimentary tea or coffee during the flight. Air India said the move is intended to provide customers with more choice by allowing them to pay only for services



they wish to use. Passengers who opt for the Basic fare can still purchase meals separately up to 24 hours before departure. Meal options will include vegetarian, non-vegetarian, Jain and diabetic selections.

Pilot programme under review

The airline said customer feedback and booking trends during the trial phase will

determine whether the fare category is expanded or made permanent. Industry observers note that full-service carriers typically include meals within ticket prices, while low-cost airlines generally charge separately for onboard food. The introduction of the Basic fare therefore represents a more flexible pricing model within Air India's full-service framework.

Rising costs add pressure

The development comes at a time when airlines are facing higher fuel expenses and operational challenges linked to airspace restrictions and route disruptions. Air India has already implemented several cost-control measures, including temporary adjustments to flight schedules.

According to PTI, Air India reported a loss of more than SGD 3.56 billion (over Rs 26,700 crore) in the financial year ended March 2026.

Pizza Hut sold for \$2.7 billion: The pizza chain many grew up with gets a new owner

For many Indians who grew up in the 1990s and early 2000s, Pizza Hut was more than just a place to grab a slice of pizza. It was where birthday parties were celebrated, school achievements were rewarded, and family outings often ended with a pan pizza and a pitcher of soft drinks. Now, one of the world's most recognisable restaurant brands is entering a new chapter.

Yum Brands, the parent company of Pizza Hut, KFC and Taco Bell, has agreed to sell the global pizza chain in a deal worth \$2.7 billion as the business grapples with intense competition, changing consumer habits and weaker spending. The deal will split Pizza Hut into two parts. Yum China Holdings will acquire the Pizza Hut business in mainland China for \$1.2 billion, while private equity firm LongRange Capital will buy the rest of the global business for \$1.5 billion, according to news agency Reuters. The transaction is expected to close in the third quarter of 2026, subject to regulatory approvals.

WHY IS YUM BRANDS SELLING PIZZA HUT?

Pizza Hut has struggled for several years to

keep pace with changing consumer preferences and fierce competition in the fast-food industry. Rising inflation and higher commodity costs have hurt pizza chains at a time when consumers are becoming more careful about spending. At the same time, the growing popularity of GLP-1 weight-loss drugs has encouraged some consumers to shift towards healthier eating habits. Pizza Hut has also faced pressure from delivery-focused rivals and local pizza brands in several markets.

Last year, Yum Brands said it was exploring strategic options for Pizza Hut after several quarters of declining sales. Reuters reported that the company entered exclusive talks with LongRange Capital in May this year.

Yum Brands CEO Chris Turner said the sale would allow the company to focus more sharply on its remaining businesses. "These transactions enable Yum! to be a more focused company," Turner said. After the sale, Yum Brands will primarily be left with KFC and Taco Bell, two brands that have delivered stronger growth in recent years. **A BRAND WITH A LONG HISTORY**

Pizza Hut is one of the most recognisable names in the global restaurant industry.

The chain was acquired by PepsiCo in 1977 and later spun off in 1997 along with KFC and Taco Bell to form Tricon Global Restaurants, which eventually became



Yum Brands in 2002, Reuters reported.

Over the decades, Pizza Hut expanded across the world and became one of the pioneers of organised pizza dining. In India, the brand helped introduce many consumers to Western-style casual dining at a time when international restaurant chains were just beginning to enter the country. However, the pizza business has changed dramatically over the past decade as online ordering, food delivery apps and

Leases Out Luxury Khar West Home At Rs 2.85 Lakh A Month

While Disha Patani keeps busy with films and brand commitments, one of her Mumbai properties has quietly landed a new occupant. The actor has leased out her plush apartment in the city's upscale Khar West area, adding her name to the long list of Bollywood celebrities earning through Mumbai's booming rental market. According to property registration documents accessed via Zapkey, Disha has rented out her apartment at Rustomjee Paramount, a premium residential tower in Khar West. The leave-and-license agreement was registered on June 1, 2026, and will remain in effect for 24 months.

The apartment, located on one of the higher floors of the building, spans more than 1,000 sq ft and has been leased to Kamalaben Mangalbai Gujjar. The rental agreement begins at a monthly rent of ₹2.85 lakh. Documents further reveal that the tenant has paid a security deposit of ₹8.55 lakh, which is equal to three months' rent. There's also a 5% rent hike built into the agreement after the



first year. This means the monthly rent will increase to around ₹2.99 lakh during the second year. Going by the rental terms, the deal is expected to bring in close to ₹71 lakh for Disha over the two-year period.

Neither Disha Patani nor the tenant could be reached for comment. Disha isn't the only Bollywood star putting real estate to work. Over the past few years, celebrities including Amitabh Bachchan, Kartik Aaryan, Shahid Kapoor and Salman Khan have grabbed attention for renting out both residential and commercial properties across Mumbai.

The apartment is part of Rustomjee Paramount, a luxury project developed by Keystone Realtors Private Limited, popularly known as the Rustomjee Group. The development offers 3BHK and 4BHK residences and comes packed with high-end amenities such as a mini theatre, spa and salon, banquet hall, business centre and a sky lounge. The project has also attracted celebrity homeowners over the years. In 2021, Rani Mukerji purchased a 1,485 sq ft apartment in the complex for ₹7.12 crore, along with two parking spaces.

Solah Shringar

The science behind it



'I adore wearing gems, but not because they are mine. You can't possess radiance. You can only admire it,' said Elizabeth Taylor, my favourite actor. The radiance of ornaments, jewels, pearls or gems have always been fascinating. But here in India, we don't just admire the radiance. Here it is a belief through the ages that it is wise to embellish ourselves with ornaments. Excavations revealed and cave paintings depict that during the early historical periods both men and women favoured wearing ornaments. Indian literature is replete with descriptions of women arraying themselves with ornaments while shringar rasa is a significant motif in all Indian classical dance forms. In Bhanushinger Padavali beautifying herself for a tryst with Krishna, Tagore's Radha says: Dress me with pearls and jewels Decorate my forehead with mantika My hair is spilling to the ground Bind it with garlands of champak Given that Shringar is interwoven into all Indian arts, shouldn't we pause to ask why wearing ornaments, throughout the vast and diverse India, has become

almost ritualistic? Ancient Vedic texts mention Solah Shringar with which they proclaim a woman must adorn herself. Solah Shringar or sixteen embellishments comprise the bindi, necklaces, earrings, flowers in the hair, finger rings, bangles, armlets, waistbands, ankle-bells, kajal, toe-rings, henna, perfume, sandal wood paste, the upper garment and lower garment. Though some of these have been discarded by the modern Indian woman for practical reasons, much of this list is still in vogue. The texts also claim a scientific basis to the use of Solah Shringar. Though garments are for modesty and some adornments like perfumes are to allure, the belief is many of the sixteen embellishments aid in good health and well being of the wearer. To Hindus, women are embodiments of Shakti. So traditionally, ornaments are worn to protect orifices and extremities and thus control the power that can emanate from these parts of the body. Let's trawl through some interesting hypotheses. The bindi, an ornamental dot placed on the forehead between the eyebrows signifies the mystical third eye, the invisible organ of spiritual perception and second sight.

It's worth a thought that the two eyes are regarded as the sun and the moon capable of seeing the past and the present. The symbolic third eye represents fire with the perceptive powers to see into the future. Women who get their nose pierced for the nose ring are said to experience less pain during childbirth. Some say that it prevents the woman from being hypnotized as it controls brain wavelength. Bangles are said to increase a woman's blood circulation and revert back to her the cosmic energy that is passing through her body due to their circular shape. Toe rings supposedly regularize the woman's menstrual cycle. Apparently nerves in the second toe, where rings are worn, are connected to the uterus and friction with the rings help to revitalize the reproductive organ.
