

UP eyes 10 lakh new entrepreneurs in 10 years, offers interest-free loan to youngsters

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has outlined a plan to back young entrepreneurs across Uttar Pradesh. The push aims to reshape the state economy by building a large base of self-reliant businesses.

New Delhi.(Agency)

In a major push to strengthen Uttar Pradesh's economy through entrepreneurship, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's government is expanding opportunities for young people under the Mukhyamantri Yuva Udyami Vikas Abhiyan (MYUVA). The flagship initiative seeks to make young people self-reliant by providing interest-free, collateral-free loans of up to Rs 5 lakh for starting businesses.

With a target of creating one lakh new entrepreneurs every year, the government has drawn up a long-term roadmap to nurture 10 lakh self-reliant entrepreneurs over the next decade, placing the state's youth at the centre of its economic growth strategy. Conceived as an ambitious entrepreneurship programme, MYUVA addresses one of the biggest challenges faced by aspiring entrepreneurs—access to finance.



Unlike conventional lending, the scheme enables eligible applicants to secure loans without furnishing property as collateral or arranging third-party guarantees. In addition, beneficiaries receive a 10 per cent margin money subsidy on the project cost, reducing the financial burden during the initial stages of establishing a business. ELIGIBILITY TO APPLY

The scheme is open to permanent residents of Uttar Pradesh aged between 21 and 40 years who have passed at least Class 8.

Applicants must also possess a technical diploma or degree from a recognised institution or hold a government-recognised skill certification, including those issued under programmes such as OPOP, Vishwakarma Shram Samman Yojana or ITI.

MYUVA'S TWO-PHASE DEVELOPMENT MODEL

To simplify access, applications are processed online through the Directorate of Industries and Enterprise Promotion's UPMSME portal and the official MYUVA portal. The UP government has also instructed banks to speed up loan approvals and improve the state's Credit-Deposit (CD) ratio to ensure timely credit support for eligible entrepreneurs. Officials believe the initiative will encourage innovation, expand self-employment

Will you compensate? Kejriwal slams Centre on E20 fuel, reduced mileage concerns

Arvind Kejriwal accused the Centre of misleading the public over reported claims that E20 was termed an "experiment" in the Supreme Court, questioning its nationwide rollout amid consumer concerns.

Former Delhi Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener Arvind Kejriwal on Friday demanded that the Centre immediately halt the nationwide rollout of 20 per cent ethanol-blended petrol (E20), alleging that the government had imposed the policy despite growing public concerns over fuel efficiency and the impact on vehicles.

He also accused the Centre of misleading people over reports that the programme had been described as an "experiment" before the Supreme Court.

In a video message released on Friday, Kejriwal claimed there was widespread dissatisfaction among vehicle owners and questioned the rationale behind implementing E20 across the country if its long-term impact was still under evaluation. "There is huge public anger regarding 20% ethanol-blended petrol.



DMK MLA Radhakrishnan arrested over defamatory remarks against CM Vijay

DMK MLA Anitha R Radhakrishnan was arrested by Tamil Nadu Police on Friday after the Madras High Court dismissed his anticipatory bail petition in connection with a case over his objectionable remarks against TVK president and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister Vijay.

According to police, the case relates to a speech delivered by Radhakrishnan at a public meeting in Athur near Tiruchendur on June 20 during celebrations marking the birth anniversary of former Chief Minister M Karunanidhi.

Police said that the DMK legislator made



inflammatory remarks against CM Vijay during the event, following which a case was registered against him. Soon after the High Court declined to grant him anticipatory bail, police arrested Radhakrishnan.

The complaint pertains to remarks in which Radhakrishnan mocked Vijay's appearance and his transition from the film industry to politics. Referring to a recent confrontation between DMK MLA S Austin and the Chief Minister in the Assembly during a discussion on law and order, Radhakrishnan said, "Brother Austin pointed his finger at CM and asked him, 'Won't you open your mouth and speak?' He looked trapped. It was like, 'How did I get stuck here? How happy I was at home with an actress. Now I'm trapped here.'"

'Nation First, Keep Yatra Clean': PM Modi's Letter To Amarnath Pilgrims

Ahead of this year's Amarnath Yatra, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has written a special letter to devotees, describing the annual pilgrimage as "a great blessing" and calling upon pilgrims to transform their spiritual journey into a collective commitment towards cleanliness, safety, local livelihoods, environmental conservation, and nation-building.

In the two-page message titled "A Letter from the Hon'ble Prime Minister to the Pilgrims", PM Modi greeted devotees with "Har Har Mahadev" and "Jai Baba Barfani", saying the sacred pilgrimage to the Amarnath cave shrine in Jammu and Kashmir represents India's



enduring spiritual and cultural traditions. "Participating in the sacred Amarnath Yatra in Jammu & Kashmir is, in itself, a great blessing," the Prime Minister wrote, adding that every year devotees from across the country eagerly

await the opportunity to undertake the pilgrimage.

Calling the Yatra an "enduring chapter in India's spiritual tradition", PM Modi said it reflects the country's unity in diversity as devotees from different regions, languages, and traditions come together with a shared devotion to Lord Shiva.

"People from different states, speaking different languages and following diverse traditions, complete this journey united by their devotion to Mahadev," he wrote.

The Prime Minister also acknowledged the role played by the Shri Amarnathji Shrine Board, the Jammu and Kashmir administration and security agencies in ensuring the smooth conduct of the pilgrimage.

Lucknow, July 3: Under the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, Uttar Pradesh, under the leadership of Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, has created a new history in the residential rooftop solar sector. In June 2026, the state secured the top position in the country by installing 71,888 residential rooftop solar plants. This is not only Uttar Pradesh's best-ever monthly performance, but also a new national record for the highest number of residential rooftop solar installations carried out by any state in a single month. So far, Uttar Pradesh has received 10,89,716 applications, and the installation of 6,36,745 residential rooftop solar plants has been completed. For several consecutive months, Uttar Pradesh has been



installations in the country and has emerged as the fastest-growing state in India's residential rooftop solar sector. Considering the current trends, it is estimated that by the end of July 2026, Uttar Pradesh may surpass Maharashtra in the

solar installations and become the country's second-largest residential rooftop solar state. Thereafter, the state's next target is to surpass Gujarat and become India's number one state in terms of total residential rooftop solar installations.

Uttar Pradesh's achievements in the residential rooftop solar sector have also been unprecedented. BJP vs Prashant Kishor: Why Bankipur is more than just a bypoll in Bihar

The upcoming Bankipur Assembly by-election is shaping up to be one of Bihar's most closely watched political contests, with the BJP and Jan Suraj preparing for a direct showdown in a constituency long considered a saffron stronghold. The focus of the contest has shifted to whether Jan Suraj founder Prashant Kishor will enter the fray and who the BJP will field to defend the seat vacated by Nitin Nabin after he became the party's national president.

While Jan Suraj is yet to formally announce its candidate, it is widely expected that Kishor will contest the bypoll. He has already announced his willingness to fight to wrest the BJP's strong bastion, calling it a referendum on the Samrat Choudhary-led NDA government. The party is scheduled to take a final decision at its core committee meeting on July 5, with an official announcement likely the same day.

If Kishor enters the fray, the contest is expected to acquire significance beyond a routine Assembly bypoll. The election is being viewed as a test of Jan Suraj's political strength and the BJP's hold over one of its strongest urban constituencies. Following Jan Suraj's poor performance in the 2025 Bihar Assembly election, Kishor is looking to revive the party through the Bankipur bypoll.

Bankipur has remained a BJP stronghold for more than four decades, with the party winning the seat continuously for many years. The bypoll was necessitated after Nitin Nabin became the BJP's national president and vacated the constituency. The BJP is unlikely to want to lose what is considered a prestigious seat.

A completely urban Assembly constituency, Bankipur has a sizeable population of educated, middle-class and business-community voters.

Jharkhand will host a two-day national consultation in New Delhi on July 8 for its Vision 2050 agenda. The exercise aims to refine new policies, secure investment and deepen global partnerships for jobs and growth.

Jharkhand to host 2-day Vision 2050 investment summit in Delhi next week

The Jharkhand government will hold a two-day national stakeholders consultation in New Delhi from July 8 to push its 'Vision 2050' goals, according to an official statement issued on Friday. The state government said it expects the initiative to help attract quality investment, encourage innovation and create new jobs for people in Jharkhand.

The event will be organised by the departments of information technology, industries and tourism under the leadership of Chief Minister Hemant Soren. It will bring together policymakers, industry leaders, investors, technology experts and development partners from India and abroad to discuss Jharkhand's long-term growth agenda and prepare a roadmap for sustainable



industrial, technological and tourism-led growth.

As part of the consultation, the government will release several draft policy frameworks and seek feedback from industrialists and other stakeholders. These draft policies will cover artificial intelligence, investment promotion, tourism, textile, JIADA regulations, public-

private partnership and a concept paper on the Jharkhand foundation, along with other draft policy initiatives.

"The event will mark a significant step towards positioning Jharkhand as a preferred destination for investment in information technology, artificial intelligence, digital governance, industrial investment and tourism, while advancing the state's vision - Explore Infinite Opportunities," the statement said. The statement said the consultation will build on Jharkhand's participation at the World Economic Forum in Davos and the state's subsequent visit to the United Kingdom, with the aim of strengthening momentum for global partnerships and investment in line with its long-term 'Vision 2050' objectives. The first day of the event will have a high-level

session on digital governance and IT infrastructure, followed by Business-to-Government interactions between government officials and representatives from the IT, AI and digital technology sectors. The second day will focus on investment, inclusive development and tourism, with the government presenting Jharkhand's industrial strengths, cultural heritage and tourism potential to domestic and international investors.

The programme will also see the signing of several strategic MoUs with leading industrial houses to speed up investment and economic development in the state. Overall, the consultation is intended to bring together policy discussions, stakeholder feedback and investment outreach to support Jharkhand's broader Vision 2050 plan.

Electoral roll revision faces friction in societies, BLOs allege rude behaviour from residents

Booth level officers (BLOs) conducting the special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Gurgaon say they are facing rude behaviour and non-cooperation from residents of several housing societies. A few BLOs told TOI that many residents make mistakes while filling enumeration forms, then blame field staff when asked to correct them. "They are more educated than us, yet they vent their anger on us for their own errors," said a BLO posted on Golf Course Road. Officers said residents often expect frontline staff to resolve every query on the spot. "We are only responsible for distributing forms, collecting them and verifying details. If someone has a query, we have to consult our supervisors. Many residents mistake that for incompetence and become rude," another BLO said, adding that some residents turn aggressive over even minor delays.

Under Election Commission's SIR exercise, BLOs — most of them anganwadi workers and other non-teaching govt staff carrying out election duties alongside their regular jobs — are required to distribute enumeration forms, collect completed applications and digitise voter details. Officials said the process becomes considerably simpler when residents submit forms online, since the information uploads directly to the system and only needs verification, cutting down on manual data entry. District authorities have repeatedly appealed to residents, particularly in urban housing societies, to use this route. "It will take just a few minutes to complete the process. People can fill the form from the comfort of their home or office," said SDM Sanjeev Singla.

Officials acknowledged that many BLOs initially struggled with the digitisation process and have since deployed additional computer operators to assist with data entry and uploads.

Youth stabbed to death by friends during birthday party

A 22-year-old man was stabbed to death by his friends at a birthday party in the Shanti Nagar area of Crossings Republik in what is believed to be the third attempt to kill him, police said. An FIR was registered against six persons, an officer said, three of whom — Gaurav, Dev and Hari — were detained. The deceased, Mohit Sharma, was an autorickshaw driver. According to Mohit's elder brother, Mohit and Gaurav had a dispute about two weeks ago after which Gaurav threatened to kill him. However, a compromise was reached between them and Mohit's family believed the matter was resolved, he said. "But on June 25, all of the accused took my brother to Rajasthan's Khatuashyam town and there, the dispute between them flared up again. Fearing an attack, Mohit made a video call to his cousin and told him that he was with his friends and they would be responsible if something untoward happened to him," Mohit's brother told TOI. A similar incident happened a few days later when the accused took Mohit to Haridwar and the latter made a phone call to his cousin to let him know his whereabouts and who he was there with, he added. "I suspect the accused had planned to kill my brother in Haridwar and Khatuashyam but they did not make an attempt because of the video calls," Mohit's brother said.

Around 11.30pm on Wednesday, Dev called Mohit to his house — only 100 metres away — for his birthday party. There, Dev, Gaurav and Hari forced him to drink a large amount of alcohol after which he fell unconscious. Following this, the accused stabbed him more than five times. Mohit managed to escape Dev's house and call his family. His family rushed him to a hospital where doctors declared him dead.

Jogging tracks, concrete barricades: Ghaziabad footpaths set for a makeover

Ghaziabad Municipal Corporation is upgrading pedestrian infrastructure across three major stretches in the city, with renewed focus on safety and accessibility. The project covers a 7-km stretch from Hindon IAF roundabout to UP Gate, the stretch from Hapur Chungi to Diamond Flyover, and CISF Road to Kanawani Culvert. The revamp, to be taken up at a cost of Rs 10 crore, includes seating spaces with pergolas, green landscaping, light fixtures, jogging tracks and designated vending zones. On June 19, the Supreme Court ruled that walking on well-maintained, demarcated footpaths is a fundamental right. The ruling gives pedestrians priority over vehicles. GMC officials, however, said that a plan to develop these pathways was already in the works prior to the SC ruling. "As per the SC order, if local municipal authorities or govts fail to provide these pathways, citizens can move to court and are entitled to constitutional compensation for safety infringements. It is binding on us not only to develop pathways for pedestrians but also enforce it, and we have already taken steps in that direction," said GMC chief engineer NK Choudhary. According to Choudhary, cemented barricades will be placed to bar vehicles from pedestrian pathways, which will be landscaped and evened. Walkways will get proper seating arrangements, pergolas, green landscaping with light fixtures, a jogging track, and an organised vendor zone under the plan.

The stretches will also get parking facilities on roadsides and stormwater drains to prevent waterlogging. Underground electrical lines at these spots will be relocated so that no excavation work needs to be conducted here in the future.

Cons use bank data to cheat cardholders, six land in Gurgaon police

Six people have been arrested for allegedly posing as Axis Bank officials and cheating credit card holders on the pretext of redeeming reward points. Police said details of 180 Axis Bank credit card holders were found from the accused during the investigation. The case came to light after a complaint was lodged at Cyber Crime Police Station (West) on March 6. The complainant alleged that he received a call from a person posing as an Axis Bank employee. "The caller claimed that reward points had accumulated on the complainant's credit card and sent him a link to redeem them. After the complainant entered his credit card number, name and expiry date, the page closed without any confirmation. He later discovered that an iPhone 17 worth Rs 83,305 had been purchased using his credit card and delivered to an address in Delhi," an officer said. Based on the complaint, police registered a case under sections 318 (cheating) and 319 (cheating by personation) of BNS and launched an investigation. During the probe, police



analysed the mobile number used to contact the complainant and found it was registered in the name of Farman. He was arrested in Delhi on June 28. "During questioning, Farman disclosed that he had obtained the SIM card from Satya Prakash, a point-of-sale agent in Sangam Vihar," ACP (Cyber) Gaurav Fogat said. Police

arrested Satya Prakash the same day. During interrogation, he allegedly revealed that three SIM cards procured in Farman's name had been handed over to Narendra Singh, Vinod, Arvind Kumar and Asif. The four were arrested in Delhi's Govindpuri on June 30. According to police, the accused used the SIM cards to

impersonate bank officials and contact credit card holders with false promises of redeeming reward points. "Victims were persuaded to enter their card details on phishing links, after which the accused used the stolen information to make fraudulent online purchases," Fogat said.

Police said they have so far identified three more victims from different parts of the country who were allegedly cheated by the group. Police seized 10 mobile phones, three Motorola walkie-talkie sets, two pages containing scripts allegedly used to convince customers to share their credit card details, and documents containing details of 180 Axis Bank credit card holders. "The seized records included customers' names, mobile numbers, PAN details, credit card limits and PIN-related information. The accused have been taken on police remand," the ACP said.

Investigators are examining how the accused obtained the customer data and whether a larger network or any insider was involved. The possible role of the accused in other cyber fraud cases is also being investigated.

Light rain cools Gurgaon, minimum temperature drops over 4°C

Light rain and cloudy conditions brought relief from the humid weather in the city on Thursday, pulling the maximum temperature down to 30°C, nearly 8°C below normal. India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast more widespread rainfall and thunderstorm activity across Haryana over the next few days. The showers brought a sharp drop in temperatures. IMD's Sohna Road observatory recorded the city's maximum temperature at 30°C, 7.9°C below normal, while the minimum temperature was recorded at 22.7°C, 4.2°C below the previous day. Rainfall remained uneven across the district during the 24-hour period ending at 8am. Wazirabad recorded the highest rainfall at 9mm, followed by Manesar (5mm). Gurgaon, Kadipur and Harsaru received 3mm each, Badshahpur

recorded 2mm, while Pataudi and Farrukhnagar received 1mm each. Sohna did not receive any rainfall. Across Haryana, the average minimum



temperature fell by 4.5°C compared with the previous day and remained 3.7°C below normal. Narnaul recorded the state's lowest

minimum temperature at 18°C.

The IMD has issued a yellow alert for Haryana, warning of thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds of 40-50kmph, gusting up to 60kmph, at some places. The department has forecast light to moderate rainfall at many places across the state from July 2 to July 7, with heavy rainfall likely at isolated locations during the period. An IMD official said, "Conditions remain favourable for further advancement of the southwest monsoon over adjoining parts of northwest India. A low-pressure area over the northwest Bay of Bengal and adjoining north Odisha-West Bengal coasts is likely to keep the monsoon active over central India during the next five days, supporting continued rainfall activity over northwestern parts of the country, including Haryana."

Haryana teacher transfer policy challenged over experience marks rule

Haryana govt is set to launch a long-awaited general teacher transfer drive based on the Haryana Teacher Transfer Policy-2026 within the next two weeks. Director of Secondary Education Jitendra Dahiya said during an online meeting that the department is targeting completion of the entire exercise in about 75 days so that teachers can join their new schools by October. According to officials, the process will begin with the rationalisation of 256 Model, 250 PM SHRI and 250 CM SHRI schools before the general transfer drive is rolled out through the MIS portal. The transfer process involves updating a teacher's personal and service details on the portal, release of cadre- and category-wise merit lists, followed by a window for filing objections and release of the merit list. Thereafter, regular teachers will then be allowed to exercise their choice of schools in two phases. Guest teachers will be given an opportunity after the regular teachers.

Schools will be allotted on the basis of merit, and after approval by the competent authority, transfer orders will be issued. Teachers who fail to participate in counselling can be posted anywhere within the district or the state. As the govt prepares to implement the policy, a major legal controversy has emerged over the merit calculation mechanism. The discontent centres around the policy's 120-point transfer system, under which 30 marks are reserved for "Experience in Cadre". Only service rendered in the current cadre is counted. Consequently, teachers promoted from JBT or TGT to the PGT cadre receive no credit for the years spent in their previous cadres, affecting their position in the merit list. Teachers argue that the provision violates Article 14 of the Constitution, which guarantees equality before the law, because it differentiates between directly recruited PGTs and teachers promoted within the department. While direct recruits begin earning

experience marks in the PGT cadre from the date of appointment, promoted teachers lose credit for years — sometimes decades — of regular govt service. The teachers also cite the Punjab and Haryana High Court's observations made in May and June 2026 in petitions related to cadre restructuring and service benefits to legally ground their argument.

They claim that the present policy runs contrary to the spirit of the High Court's directions to frame the new policy after considering the impact on seniority, promotional prospects and service-related benefits. Teacher organisations have argued that the policy violates the principle of natural justice, saying promotions meant to reward experience should not become a disadvantage during transfers. For instance, a JBT or TGT teacher who is promoted to PGT after 15 years of service would receive no experience marks in the new cadre and could rank below a newly recruited PGT with only a short period of service.

9 get life term for gunning down cousins over land row

A district sessions court has sentenced nine members of an extended family to life imprisonment for gunning down two of their cousins during a dispute over an 18ft-wide passage in Badalpur in 2021.

The court held that the killings were the result of an armed attack triggered by a long-running land feud and said the prosecution had proved the charges beyond reasonable doubt. Additional sessions judge Somprabha Mishra convicted the nine men of murder, attempt to murder, rioting and armed rioting, and imposed a cumulative fine of Rs 81,000 on each. The court ruled that while the case did not fall in the "rarest of rare" category, the evidence clearly established their role in the killings. Those convicted included five brothers — Devendra, Ravindra, Satendra, Dharmendra and Jitendra, sons of Harishchandra alias Hariya; Bhopal and Mahipal, sons of Jaipal; and Amarjeet and Amit, sons of Sevaram Bansal. All were handed two life terms under sections 302 (murder) and 307 (attempt to murder) of IPC, along with punishment under sections 147 (rioting), 148 (armed rioting), 504 (intentional insult to provoke breach of peace), and Section 7 of the Criminal Law Amendment Act. The case dates back to Feb 8, 2021, when a long-simmering family dispute over a shared passage in Girdharpur village under Badalpur police station spiralled into bloodshed. According to the prosecution, the accused had encroached on eight feet of land belonging to their uncle Narendra, leading to repeated confrontations. The matter was eventually taken to a village panchayat, and both sides were called for a settlement.

But instead of attending the panchayat office, Devendra allegedly asked his cousins and panchayat members to gather at the disputed plot, where an excavator had already been brought in to mark the stretch he claimed belonged to him.

50 of 54 infants abandoned in Noida over last 5 years have found homes

Booth level officers (BLOs) She was barely hours old when she was left alone on the terrace of a house in Greater Noida in the winter of 2024, crying as ants swarmed over her body. By the time rescuers found her, the insects had already eaten into her fingers. Today, the child is healthy, has been adopted by a family, and has just begun crawling around her new home. She is one of 50 abandoned children — 28 of them girls and 22 boys — who were rescued from roadsides, garbage dumps, drains, bushes, vacant plots or other deserted places and placed for adoption by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) since 2022.

Recalling the Dec 2024 rescue, chairperson of the CWC's Noida unit KC Veeramani said the newborn had been perfectly healthy at birth, but her parents did not want her. "Ants discovered her before people did. By the time we rescued her, parts of her fingers had already been eaten. We rushed her to the NICU. She recovered remarkably well, and today she has found a new home. She is healthy, playful and has even started crawling," he said. Another infant girl, rescued hours after allegedly being thrown from a height, had both legs completely fractured. "It was difficult to imagine how such a tiny child could survive those injuries," Veeramani said. She underwent treatment for months. "Today, she too is safe with

her adoptive parents and is growing up like any other child."

According to the CWC, parents unwilling to keep their newborns frequently abandon them, leaving them exposed to the elements and to animals. "In the past, we have rescued babies whose body parts had been eaten by rats or ants. There have also been cases where newborns were attacked by stray dogs before they could be found," Veeramani said.

In 2021, officials rescued a newborn boy suffering from gangrene in his left foot after he was abandoned. "He was first admitted to a govt hospital before being shifted to a private facility because of the severity of his condition. We were unsure whether he would survive. Today, he is eight years old, healthy, attending school and growing up with parents who adore him," Veeramani said. But not every child is as fortunate. Some infants die before they can be rescued, officials said, their abandonment driven by the fear of social shame surrounding their birth.

Hydroponic weed worth Rs 4.83 crore seized at Delhi airport; passenger arrested

New Delhi Customs officials at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport here have seized hydroponic weed worth about Rs 4.80 crore from an Indian passen-

ger arriving from Bangkok and arrested him under the NDPS Act, an official statement said. The passenger arrived from Bangkok on Air India flight AI 2335 on June 21

and was intercepted after crossing the Green Channel based on profiling, it said. A detailed examination of the baggage led to the recovery of hydroponic weed (ganja) weighing approximately 13.84 kg. "Further examina-

tion of baggage resulted in the recovery of hydroponic weed having a total gross weight of 13,840 grams approx. The estimated value of the seized contraband is

around Rs 4.83 crore," the statement said. Hydroponic weed is a high-potency form of cannabis cultivated using water-based nutrient solutions rather than soil and often commands a higher price in the illicit market. "Accordingly, the passenger was arrested under the provisions of the NDPS Act, 1985

Florida Woman's Driveway Stolen As Part Of Nigerian Scam

World.(Agency)

A US woman has caught social media's attention after becoming an unwanted victim of a scam that originated in Nigeria, after she returned home to find her driveway ripped up and hauled away. In February earlier this year, Luz Lenzi came back to her house in Sanford, Florida, about 30 miles north of Orlando, to discover a pile of rubble where her driveway used to be, which she had got repaired for a minor crack a few weeks earlier. According to police, someone posing as a representative of a real estate company hired a contractor to redo Lenzi's driveway. The job stopped abruptly when a \$15,000 check meant to cover the work bounced. That check had been issued by a company called SOIL Realty LLC, listed in New Mexico, but investigators eventually traced it back to Nigeria. "I didn't hire them, I didn't need to have my driveway redone," Lenzi was quoted as saying by News 6. Police said the contractor never actually met the client and never filed a permit before starting the work. Investigators pieced together the scam's true origin by following bank transactions and Google records connected to an email address used in the deal, which led them to internet addresses in Nigeria.

"I said, Nigeria, like in Africa? And he said, yes," Lenzi said. "I said, how? I was shocked."

'I Was A Loser'

It remains unclear exactly how the scammer stood to profit. Investigators suspect the goal may have been to extort money from the contractor. They also believe Lenzi's house was targeted because it was listed for sale at the time.

Nearly 3,000 Evacuated As Wildfires Sweep Across France

Washington.(Agency)

Nearly 3,000 people have been evacuated in southern France and water-bombing helicopters deployed to battle wildfires after a record-breaking heatwave last month, officials said Thursday.

Tourists and local residents had to be moved after a wildfire broke out in the town of Sainte-Marie-la-Mer and spread to Canet-en-Roussillon on Thursday. Firefighters said nearly 3,000 people were evacuated with half of them from three campsites in the affected area. Two firefighters suffered minor injuries, said Pierre Regnault de La Mothe, the top regional official for the southern department of Pyrenees-Orientales.

Two hundred firefighters and four water-bombing aircraft were deployed to put out the blazes. "We are mobilising a large network of volunteers," said the prefect. In June, France experienced a record-breaking heatwave which lasted 11 days and saw temperatures climb above 40C in many places.

Apart from having "major impacts" on human health, ecosystems, agriculture, and infrastructure, the extraordinary heatwave worsened the risk of wildfires, the World Meteorological Organisation said last week. Interior Minister Laurent Nunez said 1,200 firefighters had been mobilised since Wednesday to battle forest fires. "Weather conditions remain particularly unfavorable," he said on X.

The Meteo-France weather agency said a new spell of elevated temperatures would hit the country next week, although they are not expected to be extreme like in June. Some French politicians have denounced what they call the authorities' inadequate measures to help France face rising temperatures, and the Greens on Thursday filed a no-confidence motion against the government.

How A 100-Hour Mission By 8 Countries Saved Venezuelan Man After Earthquake

For eight days, 43-year-old security guard Hernan Alberto Gil Flores lay trapped beneath the rubble of a collapsed building in Venezuela, unsure if he would survive. When rescuers finally reached him, his first request was heartbreaking: "He asked not to tell his wife that he was alive, just in case he wouldn't make it." Early Thursday, Gil Flores emerged from the ruins covered in dust, lying on a stretcher and surrounded by helmet-clad rescue workers. His rescue brought a rare moment of hope after a devastating earthquake disaster that has killed more than 2,200 people across northern Venezuela.

Trapped Beneath A Collapsed Building

Gil Flores, a night-shift security guard, was inside his small security cabin at the Galerias Playa Grande shopping centre in Catia La Mar, in La Guaira state, when two powerful earthquakes struck on June 24. The back-to-back earthquakes, measuring magnitudes 7.2 and 7.5, brought down a seven-storey building and damaged tens of thousands of structures across northern Venezuela. More than 11,000 people were injured, with La Guaira among the worst-hit areas. While the concrete structure collapsed around him, Gil Flores's security cabin remained intact, shielding him from falling debris and creating a small pocket of air that helped keep him alive. A specialised team from the Costa Rican Red Cross first detected signs of life and established contact with him on Sunday. His wife, Gusbimar Gonzalez, said she had struggled with despair before learning rescuers had found him alive.

Supreme leader's body arrives at Tehran religious complex for funeral

Khamenei's body will be taken to the Iraqi holy cities of Najaf and Karbala before his burial on July 9 at the shrine of Imam Reza in the northeastern Iranian city of Mashhad, his birthplace.

TEHRAN.(Agency)

The body of Iran's supreme leader who was killed in US-Israeli strikes that triggered the Middle East war arrived at Tehran's Grand Mosalla on Friday ahead of his funeral, state media reported. Millions of people and a coterie of foreign dignitaries were expected to attend Saturday's official ceremony for Ali Khamenei, with Tehran's chief negotiator calling for a massive turnout to

avenge his death. Photos showed mourners carrying Khamenei's coffin, emblazoned with Iran's tricolour flag, into the Grand Mosalla, one of the Islamic republic's most important ceremonial venues. Others show crowds at a pre-funeral ceremony clad in black, as the coffin is set down against a backdrop of red flowers and white butterflies hanging in the air. Preparations for Khamenei's public funeral, initially delayed at the height of the war, are taking place as Iran and the United States observe a fragile ceasefire after signing a preliminary deal to halt the conflict. Pakistan, a key mediator in the US-Iran talks, said its Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif would be attending the ceremony.

China, Afghanistan and Iran's neighbours in the Caucasus region said they would also be sending representatives. Workers were readying the Grand Mosalla on Thursday, while security teams stopped passing cars and curious bystanders looked on. "We are planting flowers and watering the shrubs for

the farewell ceremony of our martyred guide," said worker Hossein Moghadassi, clad in a hat and a scarf to cover his face as the temperature soared.



"People will come from all over Iran. There will be huge crowds." Tehran's chief negotiator Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf had called on Thursday for "all the Iranian people...to write a glorious page in the history of Islamic Iran through your presence." "The nation's call for vengeance must ring in the ears of the whole world," Ghalibaf, who is also Iran's parliament

speaker, added in a statement.

Khamenei, a spiritual figure for many Shias, was killed at the age of 86 in strikes on his compound in the centre of the Iranian capital. He will lie in state for three days at the colossal Grand Mosalla, which has been draped in banners featuring images and quotes of Khamenei. Multi-city commemorations The ceremonies are expected to draw between 15 and 20 million mourners, according to officials, which would make it the biggest state funeral in the country's history.

Ghalibaf called it "one of the most significant moments" in Iran's history.

Tehran, as well as the holy cities of Qom and Mashhad, which will host later stages of the funeral and burial ceremonies, will observe public holidays while the events are underway. Authorities have ordered public and private offices in Tehran to close from Saturday through Monday, while traffic restrictions will make much of the city centre inaccessible to private vehicles.

Mojtaba Khamenei to skip father Ali Khamenei's funeral due to Israeli threats, security risks

Iran's Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei, will skip the funeral ceremonies of his father, former Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, citing security concerns, said his representative in India, Ayatollah Hakim Elahi. Elahi attributed the decision to Israeli threats and surveillance risks that would make public attendance dangerous, ANI reported. Earlier on Wednesday, Iran's Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi issued a sharp warning to the United States, urging President Donald Trump to "muzzle its pets" in Israel after Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz said that Iran's Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei was "marked for death". In a post on X, Araghchi said the United States had committed itself under the terms of the 14-point memorandum of understanding (MoU) reached to end the hostilities in West Asia, as well as restraining Israel, warning that any threat against Iran's

leadership would draw an immediate response. "The terms of the Islamabad MoU are crystal clear and public for all to see. POTUS has committed the US to muzzling its pets in Tel Aviv. If they



ignore their master, Iran will school them. Any threat against our People and Leadership will receive Immediate Powerful Response," Araghchi said in the post while sharing the text of Katz's remarks from a report. His remarks came after Israeli Defence Minister Katz on Monday reportedly referred to Iran's Supreme Leader Khamenei and

said he was "marked for death".

Katz also called the Iranians "good merchants", attempting to extract concessions during negotiations and reiterated that Israel would not allow Iran to develop nuclear weapons.

"If they do it through an agreement, all the better," Katz said, as per the text shared by Araghchi. Earlier on July 1, Qatar and Pakistan concluded separate meetings with US and Iranian negotiators in Doha, with "positive progress" reported on issues related to the 14-point Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

In a post on X, Majed Al Ansari, adviser to Qatar's prime minister and official spokesperson for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, said that the parties agreed to continue discussions over the coming period, with the next meeting to be scheduled at the earliest possible time following the funeral processions of the former Iranian Supreme Leader.

US feared Israel could target Iran's top negotiators, warned West Asian nations of possible attack

WASHINGTON.(Agency)

The US has reportedly asked countries in West Asia to warn Iran about a possible attack by Israel targeting Tehran's top negotiators during the ceasefire negotiations that began in April. According to a New York Times report, Washington was concerned about the targeting of two officials -- Abbas Araghchi, Iran's foreign minister, and Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf, the speaker of the Parliament.

The US was afraid that an Israeli assassination effort would doom the negotiations to reach an interim peace deal and lead to renewed fighting in the Gulf region, the New York Times reported, citing current and former American officials. Killing senior Iranian leaders had been part of Israel's strategy from the start of the war. The war started on February 28 with an Israeli strike that killed Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and other top officials. The officials acknowledged that during the intense phase of the war,

Araghchi and Ghalibaf could have been considered legitimate targets for Israel, which was intent on toppling Iran's hard-line government. But after the negotiations started in April, American officials believed that any attempt to kill the Iranian leaders would end the talks and reignite the fighting, the report said. While US strikes were primarily aimed at Iran's naval and missile capabilities, Israel focused its early military campaign on targeting Iran's leadership, seeking to eliminate as many high-ranking officials as it could. Among those killed in Israeli airstrikes were Iran's top national security official, Ali Larjani, and former foreign minister Kamal Kharazi, both considered relatively pragmatic figures whom the Trump administration had hoped to engage in negotiations. The two were involved in US-Iran talks at the time of their deaths.

The Trump administration's concerns over a possible Israeli plot to assassinate the two lead negotiators underscored

how US and Israeli war objectives, initially closely aligned, rapidly diverged. While Washington pushed for a peace agreement, Israel remained sceptical even after the initial cessation of hostilities in April.

The initial two-week ceasefire in April received reluctant backing from Israeli officials, while many in Israel feared the United States was ending the war prematurely. Instead of weakening the Iranian leadership, the conflict hardened the country's theocratic establishment, with the Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps further tightening its grip on power. Araghchi and Ghalibaf have led Iran's diplomatic efforts with countries to secure a ceasefire and work towards a broader peace agreement with the US. In June, Washington and Tehran reached a framework deal aimed at reopening the Strait of Hormuz and laying the groundwork for subsequent negotiations on Iran's nuclear programme.

Death toll from massive strikes on Kyiv rises to 30

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said his forces would "definitely" retaliate for the Wednesday to Thursday overnight pummeling, as he inspected an apartment block that was partially destroyed.

KYIV.(Agency)

Ukraine said on Friday that the death toll from a massive barrage on its capital had risen to at least 30 people, as both Kyiv and Moscow vowed fresh assaults.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said his forces would "definitely" retaliate for the Wednesday to Thursday overnight pummeling, as he inspected an apartment block that was partially destroyed. The European Union's top diplomat proposed new sanctions on Moscow, as Zelensky pressed the United States for licences to manufacture Patriot air-defence missiles. UN chief Secretary-General Antonio Guterres condemned Russia's barrage and repeated a

ceasefire call. "Attacks against civilians and civilian infrastructure wherever they occur are a clear violation of international humanitarian law and must stop immediately," said his spokesman Stephane Dujarric. But the Kremlin vowed to further ramp up "pressure" on Kyiv, sticking to its no-compromise rhetoric. "Most massive attack"

Russia has routinely launched waves of missiles and drones during its invasion, Europe's deadliest conflict since World War II. AFP journalists in central and eastern Kyiv heard more than a dozen explosions and saw residents rushing to shelter in metro stations. In the morning, locals stood on the rubble of destroyed apartment blocks ripped apart by the barrage, as smoke poured over the Kyiv skyline. Blasts started echoing out late on Wednesday, lasting into the early hours of Thursday as Russian missiles and drones rained down on residential areas in the city centre. Mayor Vitali Klitschko described it as the "enemy's most massive attack on the capital". Ukraine's state emergency service

said that the strikes had killed 30 people, increasing an earlier toll after three more bodies were pulled from the rubble. The head of the city's military administration Tymur Tkachenko said 91 people were



wounded. The Ukrainian branch of the Red Cross said its key warehouse had been destroyed and around USD 2 million worth of humanitarian aid lost. Debris also damaged a building "hosting a number of diplomats", EU spokeswoman Anitta Hipper told AFP, adding that the EU diplomats were safe. And in Kryvyi Rig, two people were

wounded when a missile struck a densely populated area, the head of the central city's military administration said early Friday.

Kyiv urged its allies to send more air defence. "We also very much count on a decision by the United States regarding licences for Patriots," Zelensky said in a post on Facebook on Thursday. Later, after talks with Finland's President Alexander Stubb, he added: "Defending against ballistic missiles is impossible without a sufficient number of missiles for Patriot systems." Ukraine wants to manufacture munitions for the US-made missile interceptor system, but defence experts say it would take time to set up production domestically. A US official told AFP President Donald Trump wanted a peace deal to end the "senseless killing" in Ukraine.

Struggling to sleep Russia fired 496 drones and 74 missiles, including hard-to-intercept ballistic projectiles, Ukraine's air force said.

It said it shot down 48 of the missiles and 476 drones. AFP reporters met several Kyiv residents outside an apartment building largely destroyed in the attack.

Heavy rain batters Mumbai; orange alert in city, red alert for Thane

Heavy rain continued to lash Mumbai and its neighbouring districts of Thane, Raigad, and Palghar Friday morning, with waterlogging reported in low-lying areas of the city, slowing traffic, with an orange alert in place across the region.

The unabated showers also triggered waterlogging across several pockets of the Mumbai Metropolitan region. According to the weather bureau, rainfall is expected to intensify from Friday, when a low-pressure system is forecast to develop along the upper-air circulation.

IMD has stated the possibility of heavy to extremely heavy rain in Mumbai till July 5, while issuing an orange alert in the region and placing Thane district under a red alert starting July 4. An orange alert is issued in the likelihood of 115.6 mm to 204.4 mm of rainfall within 24 hours, while a red alert is sounded amid the possibility of extremely heavy rainfall above 204.4 mm within a day. Several areas in Mumbai received over 100 mm of rainfall within 24 hours on Friday, the fifth consecutive day. While the city remained relatively dry, receiving only 18 mm of rainfall between 8.30 am and 5.30 pm as recorded by IMD observatories, showers gathered pace after evening.

Data issued by the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) showed that between 8 am Thursday and 6 am Friday, Mandavi received 150 mm of rainfall, followed by Malabar Hill (145 mm), Fort (140 mm), Andheri (136 mm), Versova (129 mm), Powai (124 mm), and Bhandup (117 mm).

Court awards life-term to nine cops for custodial death

Mumbai.(Agency)

A special court in Washim on Thursday sentenced nine policemen to life imprisonment for the custodial death of a man belonging to a denotified tribe in 2011. The court found the men guilty of the murder of Begya Nainu Pawar, who had died in custody after suffering 44 injuries including multiple fractures on May 10, 2011 in Risod in Washim district of Maharashtra. The men were also found guilty of attempting to murder Raju Pawar, who was also assaulted in custody. The court said that the two men, who worked as labourers, were tortured for a confession and were beaten brutally. The court also convicted some of the accused under charges including the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (Prevention of Atrocities) Act as the victims belong to the Pardhi community, a denotified tribe.

"In this case, ample evidence of prosecution witnesses shows that Begya Pawar was brutally beaten while taking his custody and during interrogation in the police station. The interrogation in the police station was within four corners of police station. Hence, there was no eyewitness to the beating. Evidence of some witnesses shows that when Begya Pawar was taken in the custody his health was good. But post-mortem report...shows that there were 44 multiple injuries, contusions and multiple fractures on the dead body of Begya Pawar," special judge JP Zapate said.

The prosecution led by S N Kaloo had said that between May 9 and May 10, 2011, the accused policemen went to the home of Begya around 3 am, while he was sleeping, with his wife and children, aged 11 and 7, in the house with him. The policemen beat Begya up and also assaulted other members of the community, including Raju.

Bengaluru-based company tests 700kg e-aircraft

City-based Sarla Aviation completed a flight-test campaign for Sylla, its half-scale electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) technology demonstrator, on July 1. The demonstrator logged more than 500 tests and over 18 hours of flight testing across six months, making the 700 kg-class, 7.5-metre-wingspan aircraft the heaviest electric aircraft ever to take off in India.

The first version - Sylla 1.0 - is built to validate aircraft-level and system-level integration under real operating conditions. The time elapsed from design to flight was under 12 months, which was conducted within a budget of less than USD 13 million. "Sylla has given us the data we set out to



capture, and those learnings are already shaping our next-gen aircraft as we move towards transition and sustained wing-borne flight on our journey to our 6+1 air taxi Shunya," said co-founder and chief technology officer Rakesh Gaonkar.

The company is India's first to: build and fly a 700 kg-class electric aircraft capable of vertical take-off; fly a 400-volt electric power-train architecture; demonstrate a distributed-propulsion wing system; complete full-stack ground testing in accordance with airworthiness regulations.

Ram Temple accused's wife gets notice over 'illegal construction', bulldozer action looms

Ayodhya Police get 24-hour remand of key accused, say fresh searches at his home led to recovery of Rs 20.39 lakh

Ayodhya Police on Thursday got 24-hour custody of Avinash Shukla, one of the eight arrested accused in the Ram temple donation theft case, a day after he was questioned in jail following the alleged seizure of cash and incriminating documents from his home. Seeking two-day custody of Shukla, the police told the court that they want to take him to some of the places for the recovery of cash.

Sources said that fresh searches at his home had led to the recovery of Rs 20.39 lakh in denominations of Rs 500, 200, 100, 50, 20, and 10; and USD 1,121 in the denominations of 100, 50, 20, 10, 5, and 1.

The maximum cash was in Rs 500 denomination - over 3000 currency notes. "The court had earlier granted permission to interrogate Shukla inside the jail to corroborate the recovery of the cash

from him earlier by the trustees and verify the details about his duty in the temple. Following the verification along with his questioning inside the jail, we filed the



application in the court on Wednesday seeking his custody for recovery of cash," said a senior police officer involved in the probe. The police are believed to be taking Shukla to his native village, Babupur, in the

Maheshganj area of Pratapgarh district, and later to Kaushalpur locality in Ayodhya city, where he used to live with his elder brother Amit, who is a teacher.

Police have so far arrested eight people, including Shukla, in connection with the alleged embezzlement of donation money. The other seven are Lavkush Mishra, Anukalp Mishra, Manish Kumar Yadav, Karunesh Pandey, Ramashankar Mishra, Ram Shankar Yadav alias Tinnu Yadav, and Subhash Srivastav. Ramshankar Yadav alias Tinnu, considered to be close to the general secretary of the Temple Trust, Champat Rai, had exercised his influence to recruit his nephew Manish in the counting job, while Lavkush Mishra, Anukalp Mishra, Ramashankar Mishra, Karunesh Pandey, and Subhash Srivastav allegedly got the help of trustee Anil Mishra to get the job of counting cash.

Advocate fee paid by accused client not 'proceeds of crime': Allahabad HC

The Allahabad High Court has come down heavily on the Uttar Pradesh Police's cyber cell for freezing the bank account of a lawyer on the ground that the fee paid to him by his client might be part of the amount the accused was charged with siphoning off, and directed the state government to file an affidavit so as not to interfere with the "dispensation of justice in courts".

The division bench of Justices JJ Munir and Arun Kumar, in its order dated June 25, observed, "The petitioner is an Advocate. He can be paid his fee by the Government, by a respectable man or a man who is not so respectable. An Advocate could be defending an accused who is indeed involved in a big scam or fraud but when fee is remitted

by such an accused to his learned Counsel in account the money cannot be said to be proceeds of crime." "It is the lawful



remuneration of the learned counsel which would be duly earned after the engagement is discharged. If for the remittance of any sum of

money, an Advocate's account is frozen describing it as a cyber fraud or the money as proceeds of a cyber fraud or other crime it could become very difficult for Advocates to discharge their professional duties under the Advocates Act. The functioning of the Court itself would be embarrassed," the bench further noted. The court directed the Additional Chief Secretary (Home) to file an affidavit within two weeks, clarifying how seizure of an "advocate's account, made by sundry officers of the police, is to be dealt with so as not to interfere with dispensation of justice itself in Courts". The bench stated, "It would be quite a different matter, if an advocate is himself involved in a criminal offence and has credits of money to his account that are proceeds of his own crime."

School van, tanker slip into 'holes' as Surat roads break down after 1st showers

The first bouts of rain on Tuesday and Wednesday have taken a toll on the city's roads, at least six of which have given way to potholes and cave-ins that caused several accidents, but no injuries, luckily.

These six roads were re-carpeted in the last six months. Flooded with complaints, Surat Municipal Corporation (SMC) has issued notices to the four contractors who had won tenders for the six roads.

Cave-ins were noticed at three locations on a freshly laid 400-metre road in Mota Varachha, trapping a truck and a car. A van carrying schoolchildren fell into a sinkhole in Limbayat on Wednesday. Locals rushed to the scene and rescued the kids. No one was hurt.

On Thursday, a water tanker found itself trapped at a caved-in road portion in Dindoli; in Udhna, a truck's wheels slipped into a pit. The Dindoli incident saw a traffic jam since the hole was in the middle of the road. It took a few

hours for officials to remove the tanker. The roads that suffered damages were reworked after the completion of a Surat Municipal Corporation project to lay water supply pipelines for newly added areas



and where drainage lines were laid.

SMC's hydraulic wing issued the notices to contractors Hindustan Fabrication (Udhna Zone), SVR Construction Company (Rander), P. Das Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd (Sarhathana), A V Patel (Athwa), for the alleged substandard work, directing them to repair the roads or bear the expense if the corporation carries out the repairs.

SMC hydraulic department executive engineer SC Vasava said: "The work to lay drinking water distribution pipeline for the newly added areas started in October 2025 and was completed in the first week of June this

year. A total of 83,293 metre of the water distribution line was laid by roadside, and 11.99 km of water distribution line was laid with a trench beneath the existing roads in the city. We have noticed and received complaints about cave-ins at portions where the trench in the stormwater drainage and drinking water networks collapsed."

Meanwhile, SMC standing committee chairman Rajan Patel noted, "We received complaints from citizens about cave-ins, and issued notices to four contractors. They should bear the expenses incurred.

In the notice, we have told the contractors to stay alert and ready with materials to repair such cave-ins should they appear."

A five-minute drive from Nariman Point to Cuffe Parade? Mumbai's next sea link is back

Three years after it was shelved following opposition from local fishermen, the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) has revived its proposed coastal bridge linking Nariman Point and Cuffe Parade, a project expected to dramatically alter connectivity in south Mumbai's business district.

The 1.869-km, Rs 588-crore bridge, which promises to reduce peak-hour travel time between the two neighbourhoods from nearly 25 minutes to just five, has entered the environmental clearance stage. After securing the Maharashtra government's approval for a revised alignment in December last year, the MMRDA has now approached the Maharashtra Coastal Zone Management Authority (MCZMA) for permission to build the project in the Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ).

The proposed bridge will begin from Dorabji Tata Road at Nariman Point, run along reclaimed land for a short stretch before extending over the sea on stilts in a double-decker configuration, and terminate at Captain Prakash Pethe Marg in Cuffe Parade.

The project was originally tendered in 2022, with Larsen & Toubro awarded the contract the following year. However, work was abandoned in 2023 after residents and fishermen objected to the alignment, saying it would pass through one of the city's last remaining traditional fishing bunds.

One of the six Gujarat police officials appointed into the Indian Police Service (IPS) on Thursday is a respondent in a petition in the Gujarat High Court filed by the people displaced by the demolition of over shanties in Surat's Nasir Nagar on May 30. Rajdeepsinh Nakum is currently posted as the deputy commissioner of police of Special Operations Group (SOG) in Surat. Along with Nakum, three more police officers, including new Ahmedabad police chief Anupam Singh Gahlaut, have been named as respondents in the case.

Twenty-six Nasir Nagar residents who moved the court have alleged that SOG personnel were at the site when the demolitions were being carried out.

While Nakum refused to comment on the demolitions, stating that the matter was sub

judice, he said he was "very happy" about his promotion. A native of Wadhwan in Surendranagar district, Nakum's father was a drawing teacher in a government school in Lakhtar taluka. Nakum has studied English literature at the Gujarat University and worked as a teacher at a government school for three years. Later, he was employed as a deputy section officer at the Gujarat High Court, where he served from 2006 to 2011. After first assuming the role of a police officer, he was made a probationary officer in Anand district in 2013. He then worked with the State CID Crime in Veraval. He was also posted in Dang (from 2016 to 2018) and Botad. He was appointed to his current role in 2022. He is the father of three children. The promotions of five other DCPs along with Nakum were cleared to be

inducted into the IPS as per the July 2 notification signed by Sanjeev Kumar, Under Secretary



to the Union government. Along with Nakum, DCPs Bharatkumar Rathod (posted in Ahmedabad), Praful Vania, Rajeshkumar Parmar, Kalpeshkumar Chavda and Rakesh Desai (posted in Rajkot) were also cleared for promotion to the IPS by the Centre. A

notification to this effect was issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on Thursday.

These officials will remain on probation for a year. The notification says, "Under sub-section (1) of Rule 9 of the Indian Police Service (Appointment by Promotion) Regulation, 1955. Six police officers of Gujarat holding Deputy Commissioner of police rank in the Gujarat Police Service have been appointed into the Indian Police Service on probation, and they have been allocated to the Gujarat cadre under sub-rule 1 of rule 5 of the Indian Police Service (Cadre) Rules, 1954, as mentioned in the notification. The officials will remain on probation for one year and will also be inducted into training for the Indian Police Service..."

IIT Gandhinagar to develop country's first own cooling tech for EVs, AI infra, trains

An Indian Institute of Technology Gandhinagar (IITGN) research team has won a Rs 20 lakh seed grant to develop the country's first indigenous cooling technology for electric vehicles (EVs), trains, high-performance electronics, and artificial intelligence infrastructure. The technology can address two major issues: cooling of the fast-growing AI-driven data centres, and safety concerns around EV battery thermal management, IITGN stated.

The researchers won the grant on Tuesday at 'MATRIx (Materials Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship Expo) 2026', organised by the Indian Institute of Metals (IIM), the professional body for metallurgists.

"This indigenous manufacturing technology could help address industrial thermal management through a new generation of liquid cold plates. Titled 'Advanced Chill Tech,' this innovation rethinks how liquid cold plates are manufactured, creating an avenue for an affordable, scalable and sustainable innovation," the research team claimed.

The team has also filed a patent application jointly with its industry partner, Epsilon Engineering Pvt. Ltd. The technology has also reached Technology Readiness Level (TRL) 7, with prototypes successfully validated in an operational environment. The largest prototype can withstand pressure of more than 35 bars (well above industry requirements) and has passed fatigue and tensile testing.

The project was led by Amit Arora, an associate professor at IITGN's Department of Materials Engineering, together with Prachi Sharma and Rizwan Qureshi, a final-year doctoral student in the department.

Dangerous shift in the onus to prove citizenship

The ministry of external affairs says that a passport issued to a person by the Republic of India is only a travel document, not a proof of citizenship. That it is also a travel document is not in doubt. Neither Aadhaar, nor an Elector's Photo Identity Card (EPIC) or, for that matter, a birth certificate—all issued by statutory authorities—provides proof of the holder's citizenship. Clearly, no document issued by the government of India or a statutory authority can be considered to be proof of a person's citizenship. There are two aspects of this matter that need our attention. First, nothing stated in a document is proof of a fact stated therein. Such facts, when challenged, have to be proved through evidence, either direct or circumstantial, before a statutory authority or a court of law. That is a fundamental principle of law.

However, there is a presumption in law that the statements of fact found in each of such documents are true unless proved otherwise. The burden of doing so is on the person challenging the authenticity of such facts. Absent that, the facts stated in these documents will be deemed to be true. However, a passport issued by the Republic of India is of special significance. It is never issued unless the person is a citizen of India. Issuance of a passport involves an elaborate investigative procedure that is required to be followed. The authorities are required to confirm the veracity of facts stated in the application including the applicant's date and place of birth.

Such a travel document, once issued, is recognised by other member States of multilateral organisations as a valid document. The document itself reflects the fact that such a person is a citizen of India based on which the immigration authorities of member States allow entry to such a person. There are several countries in the world which allow entry to an Indian passport holder even without a visa. This dispensation is solely based on the statutory presumption that the person to whom the document is issued is a citizen of India. For the MEA to say that a passport is only a travel document is playing truant with the law. Such a statutory presumption can certainly be rebutted. The person who seeks to rebut that presumption may be a third person or the authority itself which issued the passport, on the basis of perhaps a fresh discovery of facts or for multifarious other reasons. It is in that context that the facts will have to be established to either confirm that the person is a citizen of India and holds a valid passport, or that the passport be revoked for the authority then to decide upon the legal status of the person.

The statutory presumption arising from a person holding an Indian passport is also significant in the context of the many rights a citizen enjoys in the Republic of India, including those guaranteed under Part III (fundamental rights) and Part IV (directive principles of state policy) of the Constitution. Such a person is also entitled to benefits available under several schemes, both of the Union government and of the state in which the individual resides. The same should hold true of any such document, like Aadhaar or EPIC, issued by any other statutory authority under a law made by Parliament. The debate should not be centred on the fact that a person holding an Aadhaar card or a passport is not a citizen of India. In fact, he or she is presumed to be a citizen of India unless it is rebutted through a process of law. A matter of fundamental rights

There is another aspect that needs attention. The Indian Constitution does not permit dual citizenship. A person acquiring the citizenship of another country will lose his or her status as a citizen of India, and such a person's passport will be revoked forthwith. Such a consequence proves that a passport is not merely a travel document but also proof of citizenship.

The kill switch of citizenship

Amid the passport row, it's evident that voter deletion unplugs the citizen from the State

IN Punjab, the passport is not really a document. It is a lifeline. No state in India holds them in such numbers. The rate at which Punjab issues passports per head of population is among the highest in the country. By common reckoning, more than one in five Punjabis carries one. The reason is plain. Almost every family in the state has someone abroad. Someone has a son in Brampton, another a brother in Southall or in Surrey. The passport is the thread that ties the pind to Canada, the United States, England, Australia and the Gulf. Haryana lives much the same way. The northwestern plains have sent their young across the seas for a century, since the Ghadar men first sailed to America.

So, the recent statement from New Delhi was heard with particular unease in this part of the country. On Passport Seva Divas (June 24), the Ministry of External Affairs told the nation that a passport is a travel document and not a document of citizenship. As a matter of strict law, the ministry was right. The passport is issued under the Passports Act. Citizenship is governed by the Citizenship Act of 1955. One law regulates a document; the other regulates a status. But the law and the street do not always speak the same language. What is technically legal is not the common understanding of how things work. For most Indians, the passport is the most authoritative thing the Republic has ever given them. It bears the name of the country. It carries their face. It is honoured at every border in the world because foreign governments trust that India checked before issuing it. The State does not hand out passports to all and sundry. It issues one only after it has satisfied itself that the holder belongs. So, when a citizen is told that the document proves nothing about belonging, the natural question follows: if the passport is not proof, then what is? The word itself carries the older meaning. "Passport" comes from passing through a port or a gate. It began as a letter from a sovereign, a safe conduct, the State's blessing on a traveller who wished to leave and return. The sovereign vouched for the bearer because the bearer was his own. A passport was an authorisation to leave a country with that country's blessing. A State does not bless a stranger out into the world. It blesses oMany Indians knew this in their bones. India does not allow dual citizenship. To keep an Indian passport is to refuse every other. Many an Indian achiever finds that passports of the West are theirs for the asking, as a recognition of their talent. Some, however, prefer to keep the Indian one. For them, as for the Punjabi woman flying out to her grandchild's wedding, the passport was never merely a travel paper. It was a

statement of who they were.

So, the timing was cruel. Passport Seva Divas marks the day the Passports Act came into force. It is meant to be a day of quiet pride. Instead, the spokesman made more people anxious than proud. He spoke a legal truth and left a public bruise. Call it the demonetisation effect, applied to passports. In November 2016, the citizen woke up to find that the currency notes that were legal last night were now to be doubted. The notes were still the Republic's. The promise was still printed on them. Yet people stood in queues, unsure whether what they held was good. The passport statement did the same to belonging. It took a thing nobody questioned and taught a nation to question



it. But the real machinery is not in the passport office. It is in the electoral rolls. We have already seen it work. In West Bengal, the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) struck off 63 lakh names from the rolls. The new government has now ordered that the ration cards of deleted voters be switched off. Strike a name off the voter list and you do not merely remove a vote. You unplug the citizen from the State. The deletion is the kill switch of citizenship.

Now, carry that machinery to Punjab. The Assembly election is due in early 2027. The house-to-house enumeration for the SIR has begun. The revision works by matching names across the old rolls and the new, and flagging what it calls logical discrepancies. Consider what that means for a Sikh name written in English by one clerk, in Punjabi by another, and back into English by a third. Amreek Singh on one roll becomes Amrik Singh on the next. Jasvinder turns into Jusvinder or Jaswinder. Gurmeet and Gurmit are the same man. So are Harpreet and Harprit, Kuldeep and Kuldeep. None of this is fraud. It is the ordinary friction of carrying a Gurmukhi name through three scripts and four clerks. To a matching machine, it is a discrepancy. To the citizen, it is a

summons to prove that he is himself.

Imagine then the Punjabi household. The vote goes first. Then the ration card. Then the passport will not be renewed, because the police verification leans on the rolls. The thread to Brampton and California is cut, not by any court that found the man a foreigner, but by a misplaced vowel. Why should a proud border state, which has sent its sons to fight the country's wars and its children to build lives across the world, be put through the wringer of proving its citizenship merely to keep the passports that hold its families together?

Here the Supreme Court was petitioned, and it has so far faltered. In Association for Democratic Reforms v. Election Commission of India, decided this year, the Court upheld the SIR of Bihar. Nearly 47 lakh names had been struck off there. The Court found the exercise proportionate and lawful. It held that a place on the rolls raises only a rebuttable presumption of citizenship, and that asking a citizen to prove himself afresh does not offend the Constitution. Thus, the Court tacitly drew a line through the people. On one side stand the voter citizens, secure in their papers. On the other stand the non-voter doubtful inhabitants, the man with the misspelt name, upon whom administrative vengeance may be wreaked at leisure. Article 14 promises equal protection of the laws. A court that lets the State quietly raise two classes of inhabitants, and protect only one, has not kept that promise. It has failed in its duty as a sentinel on the qui vive. Fifty years ago, in the ADM Jabalpur case, the Court held that even the right to life could be suspended in an Emergency. The judiciary never lived down that judgment and Justice Chandrachud the younger was among those who specifically overruled Justice Chandrachud the elder's concurrence in the habeas corpus judgment. The Bihar judgment has now taken away, in ordinary times and with no Emergency declared, the right to vote, and with it the ration card and the passport. In the ADM Jabalpur case, the judiciary at least had the excuse of the Emergency. This judgment has none. Yet the account is not closed. The challenge to the SIR in West Bengal is still pending before the Court, because the judgment has not been delivered. One may still hope that when the Court turns to Bengal, it will see what it failed to see in Bihar. A citizen long on the rolls ought not to be struck off on proof demanded from him, but only on proof brought against him. That the vote, the ration card and the passport are not favours to be switched off by a clerk or an electoral officer; they are the inalienable rights of an inhabitant of the Republic. So, the country still keeps a question open. Do we have an occasionally fallible Supreme Court or one that repeatedly fails its citizens? When the Bengal judgment comes, Punjab will be listening to its own.

Takht vs govt : Constitutional supremacy must guide stakeholders

The ultimate test of the Jaagat Jot Sri Guru Granth Sahib Satkar (Amendment) Act will not be the stamp of religious approval but its consistency with the Constitution

THE Akal Takht's directive to the Punjab Government to amend the anti-sacrilege law has brought into sharp focus the complex interplay between religion and the State in India. Even as the Akal Takht is the supreme temporal seat of the Sikhs, there are constitutional boundaries separating religious institutions from elected governments. The Constitution guarantees every religious denomination the freedom to manage its affairs under Article 26. These rights, however, coexist with the principles of secular governance and the rule of law. Legislative authority rests with democratically elected legislatures, and governments are accountable to the Constitution rather than to any religious body. The Supreme Court's landmark ruling in the SR Bommai case (1994) affirmed that secularism The intervention by the Akal Takht reflects an unsettling overreach. In a vibrant democracy, religious bodies, civil



society organisations and citizens are entitled to express their views on public policy. Governments may consider such opinions alongside those of other stakeholders.

However, constitutional legitimacy requires that legislative decisions should emerge through democratic deliberation, public consultation and judicially reviewable processes — not through religious directives. While the State is duty-bound to preserve public order and prevent communal tensions, criminal provisions must satisfy the constitutional tests of equality, reasonableness and protection of free speech. Any law that is vague or selectively enforced cannot withstand scrutiny. There is a need for carefully drafted legislation that punishes deliberate acts of incitement without stifling legitimate debate, scholarship or artistic expression. The ultimate test of the Jaagat Jot Sri Guru Granth Sahib Satkar (Amendment) Act will not be the stamp of religious approval but its consistency with the Constitution, which remains the supreme law of the land and the common framework governing a diverse society's part of the Constitution's basic structure.

Education, the other Shinkansen track

Military reforms are about developing leaders capable of navigating the intersection of warfare, technology and organisational change

Little did India imagine that the Shinkansen high-speed rail network launched in Tokyo in 1964 would one day carry a million passengers a day. Even farther would have been the thought that one day the technology could be used to connect Mumbai and Ahmedabad. Yet today this signals the beginning of a fresh collaborative journey between India and Japan, going by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's call for building more high-speed rail (HSR) routes.

If history remembers the partnership only for the HSR, both would have settled for far less. For the Shinkansen, which literally means 'new trunk line', is not just about tracks for trains, but the starting point of new journeys too. Education is another track on which this journey can take both nations towards a mutually rewarding destination.

The strategic trust between India and Japan has a legacy that is not driven just by trade and geopolitics. There is also a strong undercurrent of their shared social values, civilisational commons and, more importantly, the contrarian demographic crossroads that bestow on them a rare complementarity. Over half of India's population today is below the age of 30. Every year, lakhs of young Indians graduate from universities to seek meaningful opportunities. On the other hand, Japan's ageing population is threatening its might as one of the world's foremost technological powers. It is the solution to this demographic conundrum that the coming together of the two nations through an educational-civilisational mix can achieve. For this, higher education offers perhaps the biggest untapped opportunity to blend both STEM knowledge and non-STEM aspects such as culture and values. The imbalance between the global mobility of Indian students westwards, to North America and Europe, and eastwards, especially to Japan, needs to be addressed.



The deafening silence of the Indian diaspora in business and higher education that I heard during a recent visit to Japan convinced me that a clarion call is needed at the policy level to pivot eastwards. There may be exceptional outliers in both nations, but India-Japan collaboration in such strategically complimentary areas needs a futuristic outlook. While looking forward, we can learn from traditions too. One way Japanese industries have demonstrated their global competitiveness is through kaizen, the idea of continuous improvement, and monozukuri, the spirit of craftsmanship. Together, they lead to uncompromising quality standards.

Introducing Japanese standards of safety, precision and civic discipline to Indians would not be a one-way street. We can infuse the best of Japanese ways to fuel India's progress towards a Viksit Bharat by 2047. India's manufacturing ambition can soar with Japanese participation to build globally competitive industries in sectors as crucial as semiconductors, electric vehicles, batteries, renewable energy, machine tools, medical devices, aerospace and defence. Civilisational connections between the two have been forged for over a thousand years through the spread of ideas linked to Hinduism and Buddhism. Today, yoga,

ayurveda, Indian classical arts, cuisine and cinema attract huge audiences in Japan. Equally popular among Indians is Japanese anime, manga, martial arts, architecture, cuisine and design. The three-day bilateral summit between Prime Minister Modi and his Japanese counterpart Sanae Takaichi starting today solidifies the Modi-Shinzo Abe friendship that brought the two democracies closer for engaging in stronger collaborations. The relationship can be further cemented through catalysing agents such as higher education institutions and industry partners. Universities are comprehensive canopies for students, artists, entrepreneurs, researchers, innovators and cultural ambassadors. Corporate houses can also be bilateral evangelists capable of accelerating educational-cultural ties. It would require a tripartite coalition of government agencies, universities and companies in India and Japan to uncork the synergies. Increasing two-way student mobility between Indian and Japanese universities, regular staging of cultural festivals, youth policy and social leadership programmes, language learning initiatives, heritage conservation projects, industry-academia collaborations, endowed schemes for cross-border employability and innovation can effectively strengthen people-to-people bonds.

Given the excellent diplomatic ties but widening trade and social deficits, stronger multidimensional connections can improve regional stability and global economic resilience at a fraught geopolitical moment. India and Japan can today think of 'bullet trains' to promote collaborative learning, innovations and investment in people. The challenge is to convert goodwill into a comprehensive partnership that transforms education, research, manufacturing, innovation, culture, trade and human capital. While India strives to be a developed nation, Japan, the first Asian nation to earn the tag, can offer deep learning. t.

Woman found dead in Delhi, murder angle being probed

New Delhi: A young married woman was found dead under suspicious circumstances at her residence in Phase III of Madanpur Khadar under the Sarita Vihar police station limits in south-east Delhi, officials said on Friday. According to the police, a PCR call reported the suspected hanging death of the woman, wife of Ankit, at the house in the locality. On receiving the information, local police reached the spot and secured the scene. Investigators said the woman had been married for about a year and was living with her husband, Ankit, at the same residence where the incident took place. Police officials said preliminary inquiries and the condition of the scene have raised certain aspects that require closer examination. Crime team and Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) experts inspected the premises and collected evidence for scientific analysis. Sources said investigators are not ruling out any angle, including homicide, and are awaiting forensic reports and the post-mortem examination before reaching any conclusion. The couple, according to police sources, belonged to different religions and had a love marriage. Investigators are also probing reports of frequent disputes between them. "There were regular arguments between the husband and wife. We are questioning the husband and trying to piece together the sequence of events leading up to the woman's death," a police officer said.

Tripura to expand mango cultivation to scale up production for export

Agartala. (Agency)

To boost the livelihoods of mango growers and enhance their economic condition in Tripura, the Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Department has decided to expand mango cultivation by an additional 180 hectares of land in the Dhalai district, considering its export potential.

The Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister, Ratan Lal Nath, after inaugurating the Monsoon Mango Festival at Narikelkunjia last evening, said that mango imports from other states have reduced substantially over the past few years, and Tripura has become self-sufficient in mango cultivation.

"The mango varieties found in Tripura are truly remarkable—not only Indian varieties, but also a wide variety of American, European, and Asian varieties of mangoes are cultivated on a large scale in Tripura now. The state government intends to promote the Mango Festival further to the global stage," Nath stated.

To further support mango growers, the government has been providing financial assistance to rejuvenate old orchards. The drip irrigation for mango growers was introduced, and plans to set up cold storage facilities to benefit farmers and double their income were made, said the minister.

He advised the farmers to focus on mangoes, pineapples, ginger, bird's eye chilli, and bananas and be sure not to leave land vacant and added, "We have diverse varieties of mango; soil and climate conditions are so favourable, it can easily be scaled up multiple times." Nath pointed out that as soon as the BJP-led government came to power in 2018, agriculture and horticulture became the focal points of the administration, and extensive projects and subsequent support have been extended to the farmers, which has now positioned Tripura on the global map.

Women in Haryana more financially independent, yet 1 in 7 wives still faces domestic violence

The definition of farmer in the Maharashtra Women Farmers Empowerment Bill, 2026, says that any woman resident of Maharashtra engaged in agriculture, irrespective of the nature of the land.

While Haryana women are witnessing greater financial independence, increased participation in household decision-making, and improved digital access, a sobering reality also holds true—one in seven married women still faces domestic violence, according to the latest National Family Health Survey (NFHS-6, 2023-24). According to the survey, the prevalence of spousal violence among ever-married women aged 18-49 in Haryana has declined from 17.9 per cent in NFHS-5 (2019-21) to 13.6 per cent in NFHS-6, indicating progress but also highlighting that domestic violence remains a significant concern. Of this, 16.1 per cent of women experienced such kind of violence in the urban belt while 12.1 per cent witnessed in the rural belt. Physical

violence during pregnancy has increased from 1.6 per cent in the last survey to 2.6 per cent, while the proportion of young women aged 18-29 who experienced



sexual violence before the age of 18 has reduced from 0.4 per cent to 0.1 per cent in the state.

Financial independence improves The share of married women in Haryana

participating in household decisions has increased from 87.5 per cent in NFHS-5 to 91.1 per cent in NFHS-6, suggesting a stronger voice within families. Financial independence has also improved, with women receiving cash payment for work rising from 18.8 per cent to 25.1 per cent.

The proportion of women operating their own bank accounts in the state has jumped from 73.6 per cent to 85.2 per cent, while mobile phone ownership has increased sharply from 50.4 per cent to 64.9 per cent, enabling greater access to information, services and opportunities. The use of hygienic menstrual protection methods among young women has also inched up from 93.5 per cent to 94.3 per cent, reflecting continued improvements in awareness and access.

No-pocket gowns, loo break checks: How Ayodhya Ram temple is guarding cash

Ayodhya. (Agency)

Uniforms, repeated frisking, and monitored breaks for counting agents: Several security measures have been introduced at the 'Pilgrim Facilitation Centre (PFC)' inside the Ram Temple in Ayodhya after allegations of theft and embezzlement of donated funds and valuables blew up last month.

Located 200 metres from the main temple, the PFC holds a counting room in the basement where collections from the 35-odd donation boxes from across the shrine premises are brought and counted. Counting is done in two shifts—roughly

8 am to 2 pm, and 2 pm to 8 pm—by about 20 tellers each.

Eight men—Avinash Shukla, Lavkush Mishra, Anukul Mishra, Manish Kumar Yadav, Karunesh Pandey, Ramashankar Mishra, Ram Shankar Yadav alias Tinnu Yadav, and Subhash Srivastav—have been arrested so far. Tinnu used to work as a driver for Champat Rai, general secretary of the Shri Ram Jambhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust. Srivastav, a retired bank employee, was in charge of the donation counting shifts while

the other six were involved in counting work. The most visible change is the new



protocol for counting agents. They now have uniforms: a sky-blue, pocketless gown with a chain around the neck to be worn only inside the

counting area. A dedicated changing room has been set up, where agents can change before entry and before heading home. An official, on condition of anonymity, said counting agents from both shifts have to undergo frisking and security checks and then change into the uniform. Before entering the counting room, they undergo another security check. The same protocol applies if an agent needs to take a washroom break during duty.

Interstate mule account syndicate busted in Delhi; 4 arrested in Paharganj raid

New Delhi: Delhi Police has busted an inter-state cybercrime infrastructure syndicate allegedly supplying shell bank accounts, banking kits and POS terminals to fraudsters across the country, arresting four operatives from Paharganj area, officials said on Monday. The accused were identified as Sanjay, 30, and Kuldeep Goley, 32, both residents of Delhi, Nirdosh Bidlan, 24, from Haryana's Sonapat; and Deepak Bishnoi, 20, from Rajasthan's Hanumangarh. According to police, the syndicate played a key role in facilitating online frauds by arranging "mule accounts"—bank accounts opened in the names of shell firms or recruited individuals—which were later used to route and layer money generated through cybercrimes such as fake investment schemes, job frauds and "digital arrest" scams. The police raided a hotel in Paharganj and apprehended the four

accused while they were allegedly preparing banking infrastructure for further deployment, a senior police officer said. An FIR under relevant sections of the BNS has been registered and an investigation launched. During interrogation, it was revealed that the racket operated through a structured network of outstation suppliers, local coordinators and end-users. The outstation operatives allegedly created shell partnership firms using forged rent agreements and opened commercial current accounts in their names. These banking kits, including cheque

books, passbooks and debit cards, were then transported to Delhi where local handlers managed logistics and facilitated deployment of POS terminals and merchant UPI QR codes to disguise illicit proceeds as legitimate business transactions, they said. Investigators said the account holders were allegedly paid around eight per cent commission, while intermediaries earned an additional two to four per cent. During the raid, police recovered an active bank POS terminal, a merchant UPI QR code scanner, five cheque books and passbooks linked to com-

mercial current accounts, six debit cards, three original partnership deeds, corporate stamps, PAN cards, a commercial rent agreement and four mobile phones containing banking-related records. Technical analysis showed the seized bank accounts were linked to multiple cyber fraud complaints registered on the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (NCRP), including cases reported from Karnataka and Maharashtra. Several accounts were also found flagged in at least five separate fraud complaints, police said.

Two Nigerians arrested for evading court proceedings

New Delhi: The Delhi Police has arrested two Nigerian nationals for allegedly evading court proceedings in criminal cases. One of the accused had been declared a proclaimed offender in a commercial quantity heroin case, officials said on Monday. According to police, the arrests were made during a verification drive launched to trace habitual narcotics offenders released on bail but failing to appear before the courts. Somadina Hilary Augustin of Anambra State in Nigeria, one of the accused, had been booked under the provisions of the NDPS Act, IPC and the Foreigners Act at the Vikaspuri police station. The police said the case involved the seizure of a commercial quantity of heroin. He had been declared a proclaimed offender by a Delhi court on April 6, after he allegedly failed to appear during trial.

Security forces recover arms, arrest militants, destroy bunkers in Manipur

Imphal. (Agency)

Security forces and Manipur Police carried out a series of coordinated operations across the state, recovering a large cache of arms, ammunition and explosives, arresting two active militant cadres, apprehending a burglary suspect, and destroying four bunkers in separate operations, Manipur Police said on Friday.

In Bishnupur district, security forces recovered an M-16 rifle with a magazine, a 9mm pistol with a magazine, three single-barrel guns, one pompi, five pompi bombs, four No. 36 HE hand grenades, 32 live rounds of ammunition, three INSAS magazines and other miscellaneous items from the foothills of Kumbi Setupur near Kumbi Sagolpat under Kumbi Police Station.

In Chandel district, another operation at the general area of Chaljang village in Joupur under Molcham Police Station led to the recovery of one AK-56 assault rifle, five magazines, 10 single-bore rifles, five Baofeng radio sets with chargers and two 12-gauge shotguns.

Meanwhile, Manipur Police recovered two .32 pistols, one 12-bore pump-action gun, one double-barrel gun, one single-barrel gun, five hand grenades, three grenade detonators, one Lathode shell, two 2-inch mortar HE bombs, five tube launchers, two pistol magazines, 86 live rounds of ammunition, 20 barrel cartridges, nine empty 7.62 mm cartridge cases and military fatigues, including jackets and boots, from Wakha Ching under Porompat Police Station in Imphal East district.

In separate operations on July 1, security forces arrested an active cadre of PREPAK from Nagamapal Kangjabi Leirak in Imphal West district and an active cadre of RPF/PLA from Sanjenbam Khullen under Lamlai Police Station in Imphal East district.

Manipur Police also arrested a suspect in connection with a house-breaking and theft case involving 15 bags of rice from the Keishamthong High School godown. The accused was apprehended in the Keishampat area, and police said investigations are underway to ascertain his involvement in other burglary cases and to recover the stolen property.

In the Ukhrul district, security forces destroyed two bunkers each at Thoyee village/Mahadev Top and Jalenbung village under Litan Police Station as part of ongoing counter-insurgency operations yesterday.

9 dead, roads damaged, power snapped as Himachal battles monsoon fury

New Delhi.(Agency)

Incessant rain triggered flash floods and landslides in many parts of Himachal Pradesh, resulting in at least nine deaths and extensive damage to roads, public infrastructure and other properties, as the southwest monsoon covered the northern state.

The monsoon-related fatalities included one death each in Chamba, Kullu and Mandi districts, three in Kangra district and two in Shimla district. Besides these, two rain-related road accidents were reported from Kangra and Lahaul and Spiti districts. As per the latest estimate, the total losses amount to Rs 69.65 lakh.

The continuous rain triggered multiple incidents of landslides, flash floods and other rain-related hazards, resulting in

more than 50 roads being blocked, over 180 electricity transformers becoming non-functional and 27 drinking water supply schemes being disrupted across the state, according to an official bulletin. Transportation was worst affected in Kullu district, with at least 18 roads damaged. Three stretches of NH-13 near Potin and Hoj were also blocked by landslides, leaving several people stranded.

In Keyi Panyor district, five people, including a 13-year-old boy, went missing after a landslide, which also injured 17 others and damaged at least 18 residential units, according to officials. Search and rescue operations are currently underway and those critically injured have been shifted to hospitals. In the same district, an under-

construction retaining wall collapsed due to the heavy downpour, leading to waterlogging in low-lying residential areas in and around the colony. At least 18 residential units were damaged in the incident.

According to senior police officers, six districts such as Keyi Panyor, Kra Daadi, Kurung Kumey, Lower Subansiri, Kamle and Upper Subansiri have been cut off due to monsoon-related disruptions triggered by heavy rain. Major landslides were reported along the Kimin-Ziro route, while damage assessment is underway. The Border Roads Organisation (BRO) has intensified restoration work and connectivity through the Kimin route is expected to be restored by Thursday afternoon, Mehta said.



The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) has been deployed and rescue efforts are underway along with the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), police and other agencies. All available reserve personnel and vehicles within the Yazali jurisdiction have been mobilised and ex-servicemen have also been called in to support emergency operations. As a precautionary measure,

the North Eastern Electric Power Corporation (Neepeco) has begun releasing water from the reservoir of the Panyor Lower Hydropower Project. Power generation at the project has been temporarily suspended.

Meanwhile, weather officials said the southwest monsoon has now covered the entire state of Himachal Pradesh and is expected to remain active over the coming weeks, with intermittent spells of heavy rain likely across several districts.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) further stated that the monsoon is expected to remain active over the state for nearly the next 45 days, although rain activity may witness a brief weakening on July 4 before intensifying again thereafter.

Delhi orders CAG audit of private power discoms over Rs 38,500 crore in unrecovered regulatory assets

The Delhi government has ordered a CAG audit of the capital's three private power distribution companies to examine how regulatory assets worth nearly Rs 38,500 crore accumulated over the years without being recovered from consumers.

The power department on Wednesday directed the CAG to conduct a "strict and intensive" audit into the circumstances under which BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd (BRPL), BSES Yamuna Power Ltd (BYPL) and Tata Power Delhi Distribution Ltd (TPDDL) continued to

carry the mounting regulatory assets on their books.

According to the order, all concerned authorities, including the

distribution firms, have been asked to extend full cooperation and provide all records, information and assistance required by the CAG and its authorised officers for the audit.

The audit must be completed, preferably within three months of the order date, although the CAG may extend the timeline depending on the scope and complexity of the exercise.

Calling it a victory for electricity consumers and honest taxpayers, Delhi Power Minister Ashish Sood alleged that after the privatisation of the city's power sector, several financial decisions, special arrangements and rising liabilities escaped public scrutiny.

He also targeted the previous AAP government, accusing it of protecting the system instead of examining it. "What they failed to do in 10 years, our government has initiated within a few months," he said.

Sood said people have a right to know how regulatory assets kept increasing and who benefited while the financial burden continued for consumers.

Monsoon hits Delhi five days late

New Delhi.(Agency)

After days of heat wave and humidity, monsoon finally arrived in the national capital on Thursday, five days after its normal onset date. Parts of Delhi received rainfall in the morning and witnessed cloudy skies, while temperatures dropped. Experts said the capital will experience monsoon-like rains by July 5 after the seasonal trough moves northwards again, resulting in another spell of rain over Delhi and other parts of northwest India.

The weather office has issued a yellow alert for Friday, predicting a generally cloudy sky with moderate rain, while the minimum and maximum temperatures are expected to hover at 22 and 32 degrees Celsius, respectively. This also marked the first July onset of monsoon in Delhi since 2021, when rains arrived in the capital on July 13.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) declared the onset of monsoon over the region after favourable atmospheric conditions developed.

According to the IMD, Delhi's base weather monitoring station in Safdarjung recorded a maximum temperature of 33 degrees Celsius on Thursday, 4.4 degrees below normal. The minimum temperature was recorded at 22.8 degrees Celsius, 5.1 degrees below normal. The capital also recorded its lowest minimum temperature since July 21, 2021, when it stood at 22.4 degrees Celsius at the base station.

Palam recorded a maximum temperature of 33 degrees Celsius, 4.8 degrees below normal, and a minimum of 21.2 degrees Celsius, 6.6 degrees below normal. Lodi Road recorded a maximum temperature of 33 degrees Celsius, 3 degrees below normal, and a minimum temperature of 23.6 degrees Celsius, 3.4 degrees below normal. The Ridge station recorded a maximum temperature of 33.8 degrees Celsius, 2.9 degrees below normal, while the minimum settled at 21 degrees Celsius, 4.5 degrees below normal. Ayanagar recorded a maximum temperature of 32.4 degrees Celsius, 5.7 degrees below normal, and a minimum of 22.6 degrees Celsius, 4.2 degrees below normal.

Dhruv Rathee's video on Ram, Sita: Court sets 15-day deadline to decide on removal

New Delhi.(Agency)

The Delhi High Court on Friday directed the government's Grievance Appellate Committee (GAC) to decide within 15 days on an appeal seeking the removal of a YouTube video uploaded by Dhruv Rathee, where he claimed Hindu deities Lord Ram, Sita and Lord Krishna consumed meat and alcohol.

The GAC under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) allows appeals against decisions made by digital platforms on complaints related to online content or accounts, including cases where a platform rejects a request, fails to respond or issues a decision that the user is dissatisfied with.

The court also warned that any non-compliance with its order would be viewed seriously. During the hearing,

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) Chetan Sharma, appearing for the centre, argued that YouTube ought to have exercised due diligence and immediately removed the allegedly



"objectionable and hate-inciting content". Rathee, a popular YouTuber with 32.4 million subscribers on the video platform, had argued in a video titled 'Can Hindus Eat Beef? | Kerala Story 2 Exposed' that Lord Ram, Sita, and Lord Krishna consumed meat

and alcohol.

ASG Sharma told the court that the content uploaded by Rathee was "harmful and divisive". He argued that Google should either state before the court that it would comply and remove the video or the court could proceed on the basis of observations made by the division bench.

He further argued that Google's counsel should undertake to remove the content and ensure that material which allegedly creates social discord and hurts the sentiments of the majority community is not allowed on the platform.

Google's counsel informed the High Court that the company had already submitted its response to petitioner advocate Amita Sachdeva and that an appeal had been filed before the GAC.

Stubborn as mountain, Ghazipur keeps waiting to kiss the ground

As the capital continues to face a structural challenge in terms of its waste management capabilities despite huge plans of infrastructure expansion, a ground check by TMS exposes the status of one of the three landfills in the city and the conditions of the people living around the site.

A 12-year-old Shajia walks barefoot in front of her house near the Ghazipur landfill with an ever-radiant smile on her face. She aims to be a mathematics teacher when she grows up, but her parents give her a reality check that it is a far-fetched dream.

The physical health of most children in the area shows signs of weakness. Her uncle said that like Shajia, many children in this locality have been physically weak since childhood;



many also suffer from breathing problems. Years of biomining and repeated promises to reclaim the garbage mountain continue, and so do foul odour, dust and respiratory discomfort in the lives of residents around the Ghazipur landfill. For the residents, the foul smell has become a usual phenomenon. It doesn't bother them, but when an outsider steps into the locality, the smell compels them to put on a mask.

Even as authorities push ahead with

remediation, the landfill still holds around 67 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) of legacy waste, making it the city's biggest unfinished waste challenge and a stark reminder that the capital's garbage crisis continues to be a public health concern for communities living in its shadow. The Ghazipur landfill is one among the three legacy waste sites that the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) has been attempting to flatten through biomining. Even as the civic body continues to make progress at all three landfill sites, official figures show that millions of tonnes of legacy waste still remain to be processed before Delhi can finally get rid of its garbage mountains. Unlike Bhalswa and Okhla, which are expected to be flattened this year, Ghazipur needs an additional.

Meghalaya honeymoon murder accused Sonam Raghuvanshi will remain out on bail for now after the Supreme Court on Tuesday declined to interfere with the bail granted to her by the High Court, even as it issued notice on the Meghalaya Police's plea seeking cancellation of her bail.

Sonam, a resident of Indore in Madhya Pradesh, was arrested in June last year in connection with the murder of her businessman husband, Raja Raghuvanshi. Police have alleged that she conspired with hired assailants to kill him for financial gains.

The couple had gone missing while vacationing in Meghalaya's Sohra area on May 23 last year. Raja's body was later found in a deep gorge on June 2, 2025.

The top court said the allegations against Sonam were "quite serious" and agreed to examine the Meghalaya Police's challenge to the bail order in detail on Thursday. However, after being informed that Sonam had already been released, the bench said it did not wish to interfere at this stage.

"If she is released already, we would not want to interfere," the bench observed. Earlier during the hearing, the court had indicated that it was inclined to stay the bail order before learning that Sonam had already been released.

Appearing for the Meghalaya Police, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta submitted that Sonam's earlier

applications had been rejected and argued that the case did not involve a failure to communicate the grounds of

to respond to the police's plea. During the hearing, Sonam's lawyer argued that she had not even been provided legal representation when she was arrested and produced for transit remand. The counsel contended that she had not been informed of the grounds of her arrest and had only been served with a blank proforma.

The bench, however, questioned why the issue had not been raised earlier.

"The question comes that when you didn't raise this issue earlier, can you be allowed to raise it at this stage?" the court asked.

The court also asked whether, even if bail had been granted on such a technical ground, the law would prevent the authorities from arresting her again.

India series win boosts Ireland's status in international cricket: O'Donnell

New Delhi, (Agency)

Cricket Ireland president Bryan O'Donnell believes Ireland's historic T20I series victory over India has transformed the team's standing in world cricket, saying the breakthrough will make the side a more attractive opponent for leading nations and pave the way for bigger international opportunities.

Ireland stunned reigning T20 world champions India 2-0 in Belfast to register their first-ever bilateral series victory over India in any format. O'Donnell believes the landmark triumph will have an immediate impact on Irish cricket, both on and off the field. "It is going to be fairly instantaneous because it is a huge lift for our players and on that basis, they will probably become available in other areas of the game," O'Donnell was quoted as saying by PTI.

"It has a huge impact because it elevates the players. It lifts the potential performance of Irish cricket hugely," he added. According to O'Donnell, the biggest gain from defeating a powerhouse like India will be the shift in how Ireland are perceived internationally.

"I think we would be more acceptable as opposition than we may have been heretofore. It is a moving elevation.

"It is showing a return on the level of input that Cricket Ireland are willing to put into the game in this country with the help of the ICC. At present, a large investment is going on into the infrastructure surrounding Irish cricket," he said.

O'Donnell also expects Ireland's participation in the upcoming European T20 Premier League to accelerate the team's growth while providing players with valuable financial opportunities.

"Absolutely. Providing the opposition is of a certain level, it has to be beneficial. It is also opening potential for other income streams for the players at the higher end of the game," he said.

He believes Irish players stand to gain significantly from the presence of cricket greats Steve Waugh, Rahul Dravid and R Ashwin, who will be involved with the tournament.

"They will learn from observation. They will learn from meeting these legends and picking their brains and possibly pick up tips for the benefit of our players." They are very anxious to move with the game and bring Irish cricket up to speed. If that carries through to players across the system, then I think we're on the right path," he said.

Indian-born fast bowler Jai Moondra emerged as the star of Ireland's series win over Shreyas Iyer's side, and O'Donnell reiterated that Cricket Ireland remains open to players who qualify through residency or ancestry.

"We're open to all talent, provided they qualify either through living in Ireland or through grandparents or other family connections. We're an open book.

Algeria captain Riyad Mahrez was sent into international retirement after Switzerland knocked his side out of the FIFA World Cup 2026 on Friday, July 3. Playing at BC Place in Vancouver, the Swiss dominated large spells of the game, sealing a clinical victory over the Atlas Lions. Facing a technically gifted Algerian side, Switzerland survived the early pressure and struck through Breel Embolo in the 10th minute. The goal, created by Johan Manzambi after a dazzling solo run, completely changed the complexion of the contest. Manzambi picked up the ball in the centre of the pitch and dribbled past multiple Algerian players before entering the box from



the left. He then squared a low cross from the byline to Embolo, who was perfectly positioned in front of goal. With Luca Zidane rushing out to close down Manzambi, Embolo simply tapped the ball into an empty net to give Switzerland the lead. Switzerland

doubled their advantage in the opening minute of the second half after Algeria defender Rafik Belghali's attempted clearance fell straight to Dan Ndoye. Stationed on the edge of the box, the winger wasted no time in unleashing a powerful low drive into the bottom-right

corner beyond Luca Zidane, making it 2-0. The early second-half goal took much of the momentum out of Algeria, who struggled to create clear-cut chances in response.

Switzerland had the opportunity to extend their lead in the 81st minute when Denis Zakaria's cross evaded a sliding Embolo and reached an unmarked Fabian Rieder at the far post. However, despite having an open goal in front of him, Rieder could only make weak contact with his left heel, allowing Zidane to recover and make the save. Algeria's best chance arrived in the 88th minute when Anis Hadj Moussa unleashed a left-footed effort from outside the box. Gregor Kobel parried the shot away, but the move was eventually ruled out for offside. Speaking after the game, one of Algeria's greatest-ever players, Riyad Mahrez, announced his retirement from international football. The captain started the match but was unable to make a significant impact. Although he delivered a couple of dangerous crosses into the penalty area, Algeria's forwards failed to capitalise as his international career came to an end with a Round of 32 exit.

Wimbledon Day 5 schedule: Full order of play featuring Novak Djokovic and Naomi Osaka

The third round of Wimbledon begins on Friday, July 3, with Novak Djokovic, Naomi Osaka and Aryna Sabalenka leading the day's action, while defending champion Jannik Sinner is set for a surprise switch from Centre Court to No. 1 Court for his third-round clash.

New Delhi, (Agency)

Third-round action takes centre stage at Wimbledon on Friday, July 3, with 24-time Grand Slam champion Novak Djokovic, former World No. 1 Naomi Osaka and defending men's champion Jannik Sinner among the biggest names in action at the All England Club. For viewers in India, play on the outside courts begins at 3:30 PM IST, while Centre Court action starts at 7:00 PM IST. Matches on No. 1 Court are scheduled to begin at 6:30 PM IST. The headline act on Centre Court is Djokovic, who opens the day's play against France's Arthur Rinderknech as the seven-time Wimbledon champion continues his pursuit of a record-extending 25th Grand Slam singles title.

World No. 1 Sabalenka follows against Latvia's Jelena Ostapenko before Canada's Felix Auger-Aliassime takes on American Michael Zheng. However, one of the biggest talking points ahead of Day 5 is Sinner's



absence from Centre Court. The defending champion, who traditionally opened the Championships on Centre Court on Monday, has been moved to No. 1 Court for his third-round clash against American Jenson Brooksby. Sinner also played his second-round match on Centre Court, defeating Portugal's Nuno Borges in straight sets after surviving a five-set scare against Miomir Kecmanovic in the opening round.

The decision to schedule the World No. 1 away from Wimbledon's premier court has raised eyebrows, especially given his status as defending champion. Instead, No. 1 Court will begin with a high-profile women's singles clash between Osaka and Australia's Daria Kasatkina before Sinner takes to the court. The Italian enters the match in formidable form, carrying a 40-3 record in 2026 as he continues his bid for a fifth Grand Slam title. The final singles match on No. 1 Court will see American stars Coco Gauff and Claire Liu face off for a place in the fourth round. Court No. 2 also boasts a strong line-up. Brazilian teenager Joo Fonseca opens against Roman Safiullin before Jessica Pegula meets Spain's Jessica Bouzas Maneiro. The day's play concludes with an all-seeded clash between Hubert Hurkacz and Tommy Paul.

On Court No. 3, Belinda Bencic faces Anna Kalinskaya before Daniil Medvedev takes on Germany's Jan-Lennard Struff in a match scheduled not before 5:00 PM IST. Karolina Muchova then rounds off the singles action against Thailand's Mananchaya Sawangkaew.

World Cup: Ronaldo consoles Modric as Portugal knock Croatia out in late VAR drama

New York, (Agency)

Cristiano Ronaldo embraced a tearful Luka Modric after Portugal ended Croatia's FIFA World Cup campaign with a dramatic 2-1 victory in the Round of 32 on Thursday. Moments after a lengthy VAR review denied Croatia a stoppage-time equaliser, Ronaldo walked across to comfort his former Real Madrid teammate as Modric acknowledged the traveling fans in what could prove to be his final World Cup appearance. "I played many years with Modric. It's great to see him still playing at the top level," Ronaldo said after the match. "I told him: Congrats, Luka. Good luck for the future of your career."

The emotional scenes followed a dramatic



finish in Toronto, where substitute Goncalo Ramos headed home Rafael Leao's cross in the fourth minute of added time to send Portugal into the Round of 16.

Croatia believed they had forced extra time when Josko Gvardiol found the net deep into stoppage time, but VAR ruled the goal out after Mario Pasalic was adjudged offside when Igor Matanovic flicked the ball on. Portugal will now face Spain in the Round of 16 after the European champions beat Austria 3-0 earlier on Thursday. Croatia had taken the lead in the 53rd minute through Ivan Perisic, who finished after Josip Stanisic's cross took a deflection off Ruben Dias. The goal saw Perisic move past Davor Suker as Croatia's highest scorer in World Cup history. Portugal dominated possession for long periods but struggled to find a breakthrough until VAR awarded a penalty for Nikola Vlasic's foul on Renato Veiga. Ronaldo stepped up in the 68th minute and calmly converted, becoming the oldest player to score in a men's World Cup knockout match at the age of 41. It was also the first knockout-stage goal of his World Cup career.

Were Croatia robbed? Why VAR disallowed dramatic equaliser vs Ronaldo's Portugal

New Delhi, (Agency)

Croatia's FIFA World Cup campaign ended in heartbreaking fashion after a dramatic stoppage-time equaliser against Portugal was ruled out following a VAR review in their Round of 32 clash on Thursday.

Josko Gvardiol thought he had rescued Croatia in the 103rd minute when he turned the ball home from close range, sparking jubilant celebrations among the players and fans. But moments later, the referee was sent to the pitchside monitor before overturning the goal for offside, allowing Portugal to hold on for a 2-1 victory and book a Round of 16 meeting with Spain. Earlier, Ivan Perisic had handed Croatia the lead by converting Josip Stanisic's cross at the back post. Cristiano Ronaldo responded from the penalty spot, calmly sending the goalkeeper the wrong way to score his first-ever goal in a World Cup knockout match across six editions of the tournament.



With the match heading towards extra time, Portugal coach Roberto Martinez made the bold decision to replace Ronaldo with Ruben Neves. The move paid immediate dividends as Rafael Leao delivered an inch-perfect cross for Goncalo Ramos, who powered a header past the goalkeeper to restore Portugal's lead. Croatia threw everything forward in search of another equaliser and believed they had found it in the dying seconds. Instead, they were left stunned by one of the most debated VAR interventions of

the tournament.

CROATIA'S EQUALISER DISALLOWED

Croatia thought they had forced extra time when Gvardiol bundled the ball into the net after Ivan Perisic whipped a dangerous cross into the penalty area. Initially, there appeared to be nothing wrong with the move. The assistant referee kept the flag down and Croatia's players celebrated what they believed was a dramatic equaliser. However, VAR immediately began reviewing the attacking phase. Officials concluded that striker Igor Matanovic had made a slight touch on Perisic's cross before it reached Mario Pasalic. While the touch was barely noticeable on the available television angles, it fundamentally changed the offside decision. Once Matanovic redirected the ball, Pasalic was in an offside position when he received it.



BAI General Secretary Sanjay Mishra highlighted the necessity of this transition: "This decision has been taken to ensure that players across all age groups develop familiarity and competitive adaptability to the revised scoring format, thereby ensuring a smooth transition when the system is adopted internationally."

THE RULE SHIFT EXPLAINED: 21 DOWN TO 15

While matches remain a best-of-three, rally-point affair, the internal mechanics have significantly tightened: The Cap: Games are won at 15 points instead of 21. The Setting: A two-point margin is required from 14-all. If a stalemate occurs, sudden death kicks in at 20-all, capping the game at 21. The Intervals: Mid-game structural breaks drop from 11 points to 8 points (accompanied by a 60-second interval and a change of ends in the deciding third game).

Nagelsmann quits Germany job after World Cup disaster, Klopp favourite to take over

Julian Nagelsmann has stepped down as Germany's head coach after the four-time world champions crashed out of the FIFA World Cup 2026 in the Round of 32, ending his nearly three-year tenure in charge.

New Delhi, (Agency)

Julian Nagelsmann has resigned as Germany head coach following the team's shock exit from the FIFA World Cup 2026, ending his nearly three-year spell in charge. The decision comes just days after Germany were knocked out by Paraguay in a penalty shootout in the Round of 32, with former Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp now the favourite to take over. Nagelsmann, who took charge in September 2023, had a contract until Euro 2028. However, Germany's disappointing World Cup campaign put his future under serious doubt. Reports said the German Football

Association (DFB) asked the 38-year-old to consider stepping down after the defeat to Paraguay or risk being sacked. The former Bayern Munich and RB Leipzig coach has now chosen to resign. By leaving on his own, Nagelsmann is expected to receive around £5 million in compensation instead of being dismissed. His departure ends a tenure that began with high expectations. Germany appointed Nagelsmann to rebuild the national team after a series of poor performances at major tournaments. Instead, another early World Cup exit has raised fresh questions about the team's direction and the DFB's long-term plans. Speaking after Germany's elimination, Nagelsmann admitted his team had fallen well below the standard expected of a four-time world champion. "If you are eliminated by Paraguay, you are just not a first-class football team. I am very disappointed," Nagelsmann said. Despite the criticism, he had made it clear that

he wanted to continue if the DFB backed him. "If the DFB wants me to continue I am going to continue. I know the mechanics of



football, I know how the industry works," he said. "I know a lot of people will want me to leave but I would love to continue if the football association wants me to." Attention has now turned to Jurgen Klopp,

who has long been linked with the Germany job. Klopp stepped down as Liverpool manager in 2024 and has been working as a television pundit for German broadcaster Magenta during the World Cup.

Earlier in the tournament, Klopp said he would be willing to coach Germany if the opportunity came. "I am available. If the DFB wants it, then I will do the Euro 2028, and if not then they have to tell me. I'm not someone who runs away," Klopp said. After Germany's exit, however, he refused to discuss the vacancy in detail. "I understand that my name is being mentioned. But this isn't the moment to talk about it, and certainly not with me," Klopp said. Klopp was one of Germany's strongest critics during the tournament. He questioned the team's performances and said they failed to show the quality expected from a side with players such as Florian Wirtz and Jamal Musiala.

Rupee up 18 paise at 95.21; Sensex rises 480 points, Nifty tops 24,300

New Delhi.(Agency)

Indian markets opened on a firm note on Friday, supported by a stronger rupee and improved global sentiment after weaker-than-expected US jobs data reduced expectations of aggressive interest rate hikes by the US Federal Reserve.

The rupee opened 18 paise higher at 95.21 against the US dollar, compared with its previous close of 95.39.

Equity benchmarks also started the day in the green. The Nifty 50 opened above the 24,300 mark, while the Sensex gained around 480 points in early trade despite mixed global cues. Earlier, GIFT Nifty futures had signalled a positive start, rising 150 points to 24,414 as of 7:43 am IST. Domestic sentiment has been aided by sustained institutional buying and easing crude oil prices. Domestic institutional investors (DIIs) remained net buyers for an eighth consecutive session on Thursday, helping the Nifty 50 and Sensex gain 1.3 per cent over the previous two sessions.

Foreign portfolio investors (FPIs), however, continued to offload Indian equities, selling shares worth Rs 3.12 billion on Thursday, according to provisional data. FPIs have sold a record \$29.46 billion worth of Indian stocks so far this year. Global markets took cues from a softer US labour market report released overnight. Data showed US job growth slowed sharply in June, while payroll figures for the previous two months were revised lower, signalling a cooling economy. Following the report, traders lowered expectations of a September rate hike by the Federal Reserve. Market-implied odds of a hike fell to around 53 per cent from nearly 75 per cent before the data release. In Asia, Japan's Nikkei 225 rose 0.74 per cent to 69,243.68 by the midday break, although it remained on track for a marginal weekly decline. Other regional markets traded mixed as investors weighed signs of slowing US growth against the prospect of a less hawkish Federal Reserve.

Centre removes BAT-BMS-linked apps from app stores after e-rickshaw remote shutdown reports

NEW DELHI.(Agency)

The government on Friday said two smartphone applications linked to reports of remotely disabling e-rickshaws have been removed from app stores after they came to the authorities' notice.

Speaking on the sidelines of a CII Cybersecurity Summit, IT secretary S Krishnan confirmed that action had been taken after reports emerged that some e-rickshaws could be rendered inoperable through the Chinese smartphone application BAT-BMS. "That is right...there are a couple of apps, which came to our notice yesterday and both of them have been taken down from the app stores," Krishnan said, according to news agency PTI.

Govt asks app stores to exercise greater scrutiny

He also stressed that app stores must exercise due diligence before allowing applications on their platforms and said the government would take up the issue with them to ensure potentially harmful apps are not made available.

Earlier, the issue gained widespread attention after videos circulated on social media claiming that some e-rickshaws were being remotely shut down through a feature linked to the BAT-BMS application.

The videos raised concerns over the cybersecurity risks associated with internet-connected vehicle management systems. The Delhi government has asked its transport department to verify the authenticity of the BAT-BMS application and investigate claims that it can remotely disable e-rickshaws through Bluetooth connectivity.

Transport minister Pankaj Singh said officials had been directed to examine the matter after receiving complaints, although no formal written complaint had been submitted.

High income, upper middle income, lower middle income or low income -- Decoding the World Bank's economic positioning of India

All five major Southeast Asian economies, including Singapore, Malaysia and Thailand, are now at the upper-middle income tier and above, a release from the World Bank has showed.

The World Bank has moved Vietnam and the Philippines into the upper-middle income group as these countries have implemented the export-led growth model and broad-based expansion which reflects "an economy-wide shift." Growth due to gains across all major industries according to the World Bank, Vietnam achieved development through an export-led growth strategy while the Philippines experienced broad-based expansion, "reflecting gains across all major industries, not a single sector boom, but an economy-wide shift." The gross national income per capita of these countries reached \$4,970 and \$4,850



in 2025, respectively, both exceeding the World Bank's \$4,636 threshold for the upper-middle income group category. The economic progress has potentially strengthened investor confidence in both the countries. All five major Southeast Asian economies, including Singapore, Malaysia and Thailand, are now at the upper-middle income tier and above, a release from the World Bank said on Wednesday. Vietnam had been in the lower-

middle income since 2009 while the Philippines had remained there since the late 1980s, the data showed. Jordan, Micronesia and Sri Lanka also moved to the upper-middle income category while Togo was reclassified to lower-middle income from low income. The World Bank also said that the share of low-income economies has fallen to 11 percent from 30 percent since 1987.

Position of India

India continues to be classified as a lower-middle-income country, a category it has remained in since 2007. The World Bank estimates India's Gross National Income or GNI per capita at around \$2,500 to \$2,700 which is well below the upper middle income threshold of \$4,496.

World Bank's classification of countries

The World Bank classifies economies into four income groups: high income, upper middle income, lower middle income and low income. The rankings are based on Gross National Income or GNI per capita estimates from the previous calendar year. Countries with a GNI per capita between \$1,136 and \$4,495 are classified as lower-middle-income economies while those with incomes between \$4,496 and \$13,935 fall into the upper middle income category. This year's assessment covered 218 countries and will be used as the global reference until the end of June 2027. GNI measures the total income earned by a country's people and businesses regardless of where that income is generated, unlike Gross Domestic Product or GDP which measures the value of goods and services produced within a country's borders.

Air India cuts fuel surcharge on North America, Europe flights as oil eases

Air India has rolled back a part of the temporary fuel surcharge it had imposed during the West Asia conflict, reducing charges on flights to North America, Australia, Europe and the United Kingdom after global oil prices eased in recent weeks, reported. The revised surcharge came into effect from July 1. The airline had introduced the fuel surcharge on April 7, with the revised charges taking effect from April 10, after the conflict in West Asia sent crude oil and jet fuel prices soaring. Airspace restrictions during the conflict had also increased operating costs for airlines. As per the report, the fuel surcharge for

flights to North America and Australia has been reduced to USD 200 per ticket from USD 280 earlier. For services to Europe and the UK, the surcharge has



been cut to USD 125 from USD 205. However, fuel surcharges on domestic flights and other international routes remain unchanged. There was no immediate comment from Air India on the latest revision.

WHEN WAS THE SURCHARGE IMPOSED?

The Air India Group, which comprises Air India and Air India Express, had announced fuel surcharges ranging from

USD 24 to USD 280 on international flights, excluding certain routes, and between Rs 299 and Rs 899 on domestic flights in April as airlines grappled with surging fuel costs. At the time, the airline had said it was adopting a calibrated approach after the government capped the increase in domestic Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) prices at 25%, shifting from a flat domestic surcharge to a distance-based pricing grid.

WHY IS AIR INDIA CUTTING THE SURCHARGE?

The latest reduction comes after crude oil prices retreated sharply from the highs seen during the West Asia conflict, easing pressure on airline operating costs. Earlier, citing data from the International Air Transport Association (IATA), Air India had said the global average jet fuel price had surged to USD 195.19 per barrel for the week ended March 27 from USD 99.40 per barrel at the end of February, marking an increase of nearly 100%.

Reliance on coal soars as weak rains drag hydro output by 19.5%

India's shares in the ship recycling industry rose from 30.1% in 2024 to 35.4% in 2025, which indicates that more and more vessels are being sent to India for dismantling. The country recycled 2.99 million gross tons of ships in 2025, marking almost 60% surge compared to 1.86 million tons recycled in 2024.

The country is leaning more heavily on coal to meet surging electricity demand this summer, as rainfall deficit has squeezed hydropower output. Hydro generation fell 19.5% year-on-year (y-o-y) to 13,361.96 million units (MU) in June, down from 16,593.07 MU a year earlier, according to data from the National Power Portal.

At the same time, coal-fired generation climbed to 117,677.69 MU in June 2026, the highest for the month in the past three years. That was 13.9% higher than June

2025, 3.9% above June 2024, and 14% higher than June 2023. Coal-fired generation increased amid a 40% rainfall deficit in June, while the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast below-normal rainfall for July as well. The weak monsoon has also kept electricity demand elevated for cooling and irrigation, pushing peak power demand to 264.76 gigawatts (GW) in June.

This year's situation stands in contrast to last year, when hydroelectric power played a crucial role in meeting evening peak demand during summer when solar output drops. However, rainfall deficit has altered the equation. With hydro generators prioritising reservoir conservation, grid operators are relying more on thermal sources in providing flexible peak-hour generation.

Stress on coal power

Throughout the April-June period this year, coal-fired generation has remained elevated, with output climbing to 352,725.38 MU — the highest for the

period since 2023. The sustained reliance on thermal power also pushed coal consumption at power plants above supplies during the first two months of the quarter. Latest data from the Central Electricity Authority shows the country's

rainfall deficit, a senior official said. However, coal supplies to the power sector gathered some pace in June, with dispatches by Coal India Ltd (CIL) — the country's largest coal miner — rising 7.5% y-o-y, according to company data.



223 GW thermal fleet consumed 156.8 million tonnes (mt) of coal during April-May 2026, against supplies of 147.2 mt, resulting in a drawdown in inventories.

The higher thermal generation reflected the need to meet sustained demand from elevated night-time temperatures and agricultural consumption amid a monsoon

That marked a sharp acceleration from the 2.2% growth recorded in May, indicating stronger coal movement to power plants as thermal generation remained elevated. Notably, CIL accounts for about 83% of the coal supplied to the power sector in India, while nearly 80% of its total offtake goes to power utilities.

Grid operators turn to gas-based power

The sluggish progress of southwest monsoon has also prompted the country's top grid operator to turn to expensive gas-based power this summer. On June 29, Grid Controller of India (Grid India) issued an advisory asking gas-based power stations to plan fuel procurement arrangements, anticipating the need for additional gas-fired generation for 10-15 days in July.

The misty Meghamalai, is a perfect weekend getaway to unwind. We explore the surprises in store for us.

As the dusk falls and city lights up on Friday, people with wanderlust break their heads over a weekend getaway. All one wants is a change from the week routine. One of the ideal weekend spots near the city is Meghamalai in Theni district where one can spend some quality time and re-connect with nature.

Land of greens and blues

Meghamalai is a misty mountain range located in Theni district (part of Western Ghats) at 1,500 metres above sea level. The place is more popular for the tea estates where access is restricted. However, one can still enjoy the sight of the lush green forests and valleys. Sivaraman, a tourist says, "Till now, we assumed Kodaikanal to be the only weekend spot. However, after visiting Meghamalai, we are happy to have found an alternative place to unwind." If you choose to travel via Chinnamanur, you cannot miss the scenic beauty along the way. "The main

attractions include tea estates, forest, dams and water falls. If you are planning a day's trip, then you can reach by morning and spend the rest of the hours relaxing in waters and scouting for elephants and bison. If you're lucky, then you can catch a glimpse of the jumbos quenching their thirst in the water," adds Sivaraman.

Bird's eye view

Meghamalai hills are the originating point of river Suruli. Hence, the twin waterfalls located at its course is perennial throughout the year. Karthikeyan, a tourist guide explains, "The tourism officials help tourists get a better view of the wildlife in this area. Due to the presence of water throughout the year, some of the wild animals like the spotted deer and gaur hit the spot frequently during sunrise and sunset." Apart from the waterfalls and the tea estates, the main attraction of Meghamalai is the Vellimalai (the silver mountain). Vellimalai is 1,650 metres above sea level. "This is the place from where the River Vaigai originates. The hills are also home

to six dams, including the Manalar dam from where one can view the Cumbam valley. A weekend of fascinating facts is only a hours away our monotonous life," adds the excited tourist guide.

A haven for rare species

"Wild animals are spotted near the foothills," says Kamala Devi, a student who has returned from a recent visit to the hills of Meghamalai.

"The hills opens up to a huge expanse of the tea and coffee plantations that is enveloped by the aroma of the spices. But the road narrows down as we approach the top of the hill and paves way for the dense forests that is least disturbed. Also, this place is a perfect spot for bird watching as different species of birds including the great Indian hornbills can be spotted here. The most adventurous part of the tour would be to spot a leopard or a tiger in the area." An endangered species of squirrel (flying

squirrels) are found flying between the trees of the forest. However the major gripe tourists have is that the place lacks hotels for accommodation. Although the Panchayat rest houses and forest lodges can be booked much in advance to secure a perfect stay for an entire family, informs Kamala. Meghamalai is a place of natural beauty dotted with cardamom plantations and tea estates. With all this and more it's definitely a perfect weekend spot especially for summer.
